For example, a person that hasn't completed primary school earns 260,000 KHR per month on average. With completed primary school that person can expect to earn 330,000 KHR per month. With 9 years of school the expected income is around 410,000 KHR higher. Being educated for 12 years or longer increases income even more. On average, they can expect an income of 680,00 KHR. If your child goes to preschool regularly, it can help him/her to stay in school longer and to do well in his/her future. Please have a look at this graph to see how important school education can be for creating a better future.
