23.	<u>Diploma 10+3:-</u> Those graduated from colleges /universities & received their diploma & related educational level look the list in annex 2.	
24.	<u>Degree:-</u> For those graduated with (Medical degree, BA, BSC, BED, LLB) & Related educational status. (Look the list in annex 2.)	
25.	<u>Post Graduates:-</u> For all graduates of first degree & joined their second degree/ doctorate degree & attended at least a year.	
95.	<u>Literacy campaign:-</u> For all who can read & write by literacy campaign programs & do not get formal education.	
96.	<u>Non formal education:-</u> For all who can read & write through Sunday schools, (Religious teachings) other form of experience (i.e. education which can not be interpreted in a formal educational curriculum).
