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INTRODUCTION

One of the main tasks of LISGIS is to establish an Integrated Statistical System is to monitor the Economic and Social performances of population. This is one of the reason why LISGIS has undertaken to carry on the National Household Survey using the Core Welfare Indicators Questionnaire and the Income and Expenditure Questionnaire as the second module of the CWIQ.

This result will help the management of the country economic and civil society, this will also help to identify and classify the target groups and provide basic welfare Indicator for monitoring poverty alternation programmers and services to different population group.

OBJECTIVE

The over all objective for the CWIQ survey in Liberia is to provide information that will enable the preparation of a poverty profile which will lead to the preparation of the poverty Reduction strategy paper (PRSP) for the government of Liberia.

SPECIAL OBJECTIVES ARE:

- Indicators for social welfare and basic needs of the socio-Economic groups of population.
- To identify target groups for benefiting special action programmer designed and for decision markers to address their needs.
- Monitoring changes of happening in the household welfare overtime.
- To provide Database for social research.

- Housing numbers sector programmers aimed at improving the welfare of the population across the Country. In order to prepare these programmers, it is necessary to identify the problems to be addressed by the policies and to know the extend to which the population is effected by theses problems.

PROBLEM/CONSTRAINT

The problem we had on the field was people did not want to sit for one (1) hour answering question without given them a token, some were not willing for us to talk to them at all.

Our second problem was the identification of the houses. The houses were number in **CHALK** which was erased by most residents. Most of the names were written as Mr. Kamara no list name, some were not spelled rightly. We were able to get the last names of these peoples. Children names were taken down as household heads sample because the people believed that the NGO were going to share food with them.

One of our Interviewer had a serious problem out side; by this I means, the out side activities was too much that he have to be absent one or two times a week. Or come to work 12:00 PM every day or come during morning hour and leaves by 12:00 PM. This attitude went on for the whole forty day's period.

ACHIEVEMENT

The survey Started August 6, 2007 by team submitting the letter to the superintendent of Montserrado County, on the 7th September 2007, we started the actual Interviewed.

We were first given 6 clusters in rural Montserrado County. Upon completion of 6, Cluster, we were given 15 more Clusters. Out of
