

EDITING/VERIFYING AND CODING INSTRUCTIONS

FOR

2003 POPULATION AND HOUSING CENSUS

A. GENERAL

(i) PURPOSE OF EDITING/VERIFYING AND CODING

Editing/Verifying and Coding are key steps in data processing. They constitute the link between the raw data collected by the interviewers and the input for the computer programs through which the required statistical tables can be generated later.

The process of office editing/verifying is primarily aimed at cleaning the data for coding, keying and analysis. The outcome of editing/verifying can in fact be used to help minimise interview and response errors.

(ii) DEFINITIONS:

Editing/Verifying is a process to check whether the information or data in a questionnaire is complete, the answers are Consistent and are recorded in the Correct manner, and the appropriate action is taken when these conditions are not met.

Coding is a process by which questionnaire entries are assigned a numeric code for ease of tabulation.

(iii) MATERIALS NEEDED:

For doing the editing/verifying and coding, you need:

- a Completed questionnaire
- a set of editing and coding instructions
- lead pencil or red pen.

B. GENERAL GUIDELINES TO EDITORS/VERIFIERS AND CODERS:

When editing/verifying and coding the information entered in the household questionnaire (Form A), take the following points as guidelines to your work:

- Never assume an entry is Correct. The editor/verifier and coder should always look for errors due to wrong entries. The logical inconsistencies observed in the pattern of information recorded on the questionnaire could also give some indication of wrong entries.
- Do not erase what has been entered. Always strike out inaccurate or inappropriate Codes and write legible codes using your red pen or pencil above or besides the original entry.
- In cases where age determines the respondents who should answer Certain questions, verify that respondents with such age requirement were asked the right questions.
- Relate the age of children to those of their parents as a rough Consistency check procedure. For example, if a Son's age is reported as 35 years, it is obvious that the father's age cannot be 45 years or less. Similarly, the age difference between a mother and child should maintain the expected Consistency.
- The questionnaire does not call for blank entries nor should blanks appear in the Codes. There is a code number for each question or answer and this code should always be indicated in the appropriate place.
- More than One questionnaires may be Completed for some households - in this case, you should ensure that all the questionnaires filled for each household are coded before proceeding to another household. The arrangement of households according to serial numbering order is important. Also verify that all questionnaires handled belong to the same enumeration area and local government area.
- Always seek assistance from your supervisor whenever in doubt at any given stage of the editing/verifying and coding stage.

**THE HOUSEHOLD QUESTIONNAIRE (FORM A)
AND INSTITUTIONALISED POPULATION (FORM B)**

C. SPECIFICS OF FORM A

1. **Identification Particulars:**

The information required to identify each household is at the top of form A. Such information includes the following particulars:

- Local Government Area (L. G. A.), name and code
- District, name and code
- Village or Town name and code
- Enumeration Area (E.A.) code
- Compound number (within E.A.)
- Household number (within compound)

The above particulars are very important for ease of reference in the later stage of data processing and care must be taken to ensure that the correct codes are used. In cases where more than one questionnaires is completed for large households, at least one questionnaire must contain the required identification particulars.

- (ii) Village/town number should consist of a 5 digit entry code and these codes will be provided separately.
- (iii) Enumeration Area numbers would maintain 5-digit code indicated on each questionnaire.
- (iv) Compound number within an E.A. should be 3-digit entry code and it is the same as the serial No. of compound recorded on Form A and Form B.
- (v) Household number within a compound should be 2-digit entry code and it is the same as the Serial No. of household recorded on Form A.
- (vi) Within a household each person has a number marked against his name. This number (as a 2-digit entry) refers to the line on which the name of respondent appears. These line numbers run Serially in ascending order. Where a name already written is struck off, the numbering on the questionnaire should be changed to maintain Continuous sequence. For example if the respondent's name appear on serial No. 1 Code 01.

QUESTION 2 SEX

One of the codes below can be used for each person listed within a household.

If the **sex** of a person is not given, go through the following checks:

- either (i) Refer to GPC 3 or 4 of form A and check whether the sex of the person is stated.
- or (ii) Determine the person's sex by his or her given first name.
- or (iii) For person's aged 12 years and over, question 20 of the questionnaire should be for females, but this has to be matched with the person's name.

QUESTION 3 AGE

Always use 2-digit code, but the specifications below should be strictly followed:

- (i) Age reported as 6 years old should be coded as 06 etc.
- (ii) Age of infants less than one (1) year old has to be coded as 00.
- (iii) For persons aged 98 years or more, code as 98.
- (iv) If age is not stated or left blank, code 99.

QUESTION 4 RELATIONSHIP

The codes for relationship to the Head of Household are provided below. Note relationship can be by blood and marriage. Verify if the child/parent relationship is maternal, paternal or by ward.

Attempts to code responses on marital status should be restricted to the answers given in the completed questionnaire. Do not try to determine the marital status of a person based on the number of children the person has.

QUESTION 10 BIRTH PLACE

For birth place, the aim is to capture the district of birth and the type of residence, for the settlement of birth (urban, rural)

- (i) If a respondent states that he was born in a village/town in which he was enumerated - use code 00.
- (ii) If the respondent was born in a district different from in which he was enumerated (as indicated in the identification particulars) - use only the corresponding district code for his birth place. For example, if enumerated in Foni Bintang Karanai (district code 35) when he was born in Foni Bondali, use code 37.
- (iii) If the respondent was born in a village/town different from where He/she was enumerated, verify whether the place of enumeration falls on one of the following settlements. Use code 1 if so and 2 otherwise.

(iv) If the respondent was born outside the Gambia, but was enumerated in a district within Gambia, code the country given under nationality (see Code for question 7).

(v) If place of birth is left blank or "not stated", code 99.

EDITING OF ENTRIES IN QUESTION 10 OF FORMS A & B

IV. If district is given, and settlement not given. Write the code for the district and write code 2 for settlement.

- (a) **If DISTRICT in identification particulars is 10,11 or 12 (Banjul) AND the answer to Q10 is Banjul Central, North or South, THEN write the district code 00 (This town/village) and 1 for settlement code.**
- (b) **If DISTRICT in identification particulars is DIFFERENT from Banjul (NOT 10,11, or 12) AND the answer to Q10 is Banjul Central, North, South, THEN write the district code 12 (Banjul) and 1 for settlement code.**
- (c) **It is not necessary that BIRTH PLACE and PREVIOUS RESIDENCE should be the same. If BIRTH PLACE is given as ANOTHER TOWN/VILLAGE or COUNTRY. Previous Residence cannot be "00". In this case write name of BIRTH PLACE in PREVIOUS RESIDENCE for want of any other information.**

Q11-PREVIOUS RESIDENCE

- (a) **If DISTRICT in identification particulars is 10,11 or 12 (Banjul) AND the answer to Q10 is Banjul Central, North or South, THEN write the district code 00 (This town/village) and 1 for settlement code.**
- (b) **If DISTRICT in identification particulars is DIFFERENT from Banjul (NOT 10,11, or 12) AND the answer to Q10 is Banjul Central, North, South, THEN write the district code 12 (Banjul) and 1 for settlement code.**

QUESTION 11 PREVIOUS RESIDENCE

- (i) If a respondent states that he/she had always lived in this town/village use code 00.
- (ii) If the respondent's previous residence was another village/town, verify whether this falls on one of the settlements listed under Question 10. Use code 1 if so and 2 otherwise.

Example If respondent's previous residence is in other village/town use settlement code for that village/town (e.g Dankunku code --).

And also specify district of his/her previous residence by using district code. (e.g NIAMINA DANKUNKU DISTRICT code 60).

(In Q11 always specify the **district** followed by the **town/village**

code).

(iii) If respondent previous residence is outside Gambia, used country code use in Question 7.

QUESTION 12 DURATION OF STAY

State number of months the respondent had lived in his/her previous residence, eg less than one month, used 00; one month, use code 01; two months use code 02 etc; and more than 60 months use 60, Not applicable use code 97, not stated/blank use code 99. (Always convert and use in complete months for Q12).

QUESTION 13 LITERACY (FOR PERSONS AGED 10 YEARS AND OVER)

QUESTION 20 NUMBER OF CHILDREN EVER BORN ALIVE

Question 20 attempts to collect information on the number of children born Alive to **females aged 12 years and over** who were present in

different households on Census night. It is worth-noting that the number of children living in the Same household 20(c) and 20(d) with mother is different from those living elsewhere (column 20(e) and 20(f)).

QUESTION 20a and 20b TOTAL NUMBER OF CHILDREN HAVE BEEN BORN ALIVE TO YOU

This question aims at collecting information on the total number of children born alive and by sex. Make Sure **20(c) 20(e) and 20(g) add up to 20(a)** and also **20(d), 20(f) and 20(h) add up to 20(b)**. Please use 2-digit entry code for male children in 20(a) eg 01 for one male child; 02 for two male children etc. 20(b) is for female children, please use the same coding instruction as 20(a). **W0men without child code 00**, not applicable code 97, not stated/blank code 99.

QUESTION 20c and 20d LIVING IN THIS HOUSEHOLD

This question specifically aims at collecting information on the number of children born Alive and by sex who are living with their mothers **in the same household** on census night.

Number of children living in the same household with mother - state the total number of male and total number of female children in 20(c) and 20(d) respectively but use 2-digit entry code e.g 01 for one child; 02 for two male children 01 for one male child; 02 for two female children etc. For women who are without any child living with them in same household, code 00. If not applicable, code 97 and not stated/blank code 99.

QUESTION 20e and 20f LIVING ELSEWHERE OUTSIDE HOUSEHOLD

This question attempts to collect information on number of children born ALIVE but living in another household different from that of their mother.

Number of children living in another household is different from the mother's household - state the total number male and total number of female children in 20(e) and 20(f) respectively but use 2 digit entry code e.g 01 for one male child; 02 for two male children; 01 for one female child; 02 for two female children; 02 etc. **For women who are without any child living in another household code 00.** If not applicable, code 97 and not stated/blank, code 99.

QUESTION 20g and 20h CHILDREN DEAD

This question refers to children who were born Alive but died later.

Number of children born alive and died before census night - state the total number of male children and total number of female children, but use 2-digit entry code e.g. 01 for one male - child; 02 for two male children; 01 for one female child, 02 for two female children in 20(g) and 20(h) respectively, for a women who did not loose any of her children, code 00. If not applicable, code 97 and not stated/blank, code 99.

QUESTION 21 BIRTHS IN THE LAST 12 MONTHS

Only the date of birth and survival status of birth is required. Special attention should be made to ensure that the date of birth of the mother is not given.

QUESTION 21c AND 21d NUMBER OF CHILDREN BORN DURING THE LAST 12 MONTH

This question aims at collecting information on number of children born in the last 12 months. State total number of male and female children in 21(c) and 21(d) respectively, **use 1-digit entry code e.g 1 for one male child, 2 for two male children; 1 for one female child; 2 for two female children etc.** For a women who did not have a child in the last 12 months, code 00, if not applicable, code 7, and not stated/blank, code 9.

QUESTION 21e AND 21f BIRTH IN THE LAST 12 MONTHS, STILL ALIVE

Question 21(e), 21(f) attempts to collect information on the survival status of birth during the last 12 months. State number of male and number of female children still alive in 21(e) and 21(f) respectively. Use 1-digit code e.g 1 for one male child; 2 for two female children; 1 for one female child; 2 for two female children and **0 for no survival for male and female.** Use code 7 for not applicable and not stated/blank code 9.

QUESTION 22 SURVIVAL OF PARENTS

This question simply attempts to find out whether the mother and father of the respondent is still alive or not.

QUESTION 24 DEATHS IN THE HOUSEHOLD IN THE LAST 12 MONTHS

This question aims at collecting information on total number of deaths in household during the last 12 months by sex and age of the deceased (Age at Death)

SEX

State the sex of the deceased, use code 1 for male, 2 for female and 9 when sex is not stated.

AGE AT DEATH

State the age of the deceased using code 00 for less than one year; 01 for one year, 02 for two year; 03 for three years etc.

SPECIFICS OF GPC 3, GPC 4 AND GPC 5

When all the inside pages of form A are coded, you should return to front page where the summary forms (i.e. GPC3, GPC4 and GPC 5) are located. These forms were primarily designed to provide a complete list of usual members present in a household on Census night (i.e. GPC 3), their visitors present (i.e GPC 4) and usual members absent on Census night (GPC 5).

Attempts to Code these GPC Forms should adhere to the condition below:

- (i) Only the total number of persons is needed on GPC 3. Other information on sex and relationship has been already recorded in form A and should not be coded twice.
- (ii) The code assigned to variable in the inside pages of form A such as Sex, Age, Relationship to head of household, Town/Village and District, are also applicable to both GPC 4 and GPC 5.
- (iii) The duration of period absent (in months) by member(s) of household should be a 2-digit entry code.

SPECIFICS OF FORM B:

The household questionnaire (Form A) and Form B are very similar, and the codes assigned to the various answers given in Form A will also be utilised for Form B. In very few cases some questions asked in Form A were not covered in Form B and such questions include the following:-

- (i) The question on fertility and mortality were omitted in Form B. As a result, the codes for such questions should be ignored when coding form B.
- (ii) The codes for some of the identification particulars such as Compound and household numbers are also irrelevant when coding form B.

HOUSING CONDITIONS

The housing condition questionnaire collects information pertaining to the composition and facilities within Building(s)/ Structure(s) occupied by a Household.

ACCOMMODATION

Two questions were asked regarding one's present accommodation.
