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AFFIRMATION

1. In principle there is no household sample replacement. If the selected household is really missing during census, sample can be replaced to household in the physical/census building.
2. Block IV Column (2) of Household Member Structure followed the standardization of Household Member structure in SP 2010. Household Member names are sorted following the following standard:
 - a. First sequential number is name of the head of household and followed by the name of wife/husband (spouse)
 - b. Next sequential number are names of unmarried child, starting from the eldest
 - c. Next are names of married child, followed by the spouse and unmarried child, from the eldest, and so on. Child of the married household members are sorted with spouse and children
 - d. Next are household members other than child, who are married followed by spouse and unmarried child
 - e. Next are household members without spouse and child, from parents/parents-in-law, other family, housemaid/ driver/ gardener, and others.
3. Block V.C. R.15 option still in school (code 2) includes household members who are following Package A, B and C.
4. Block V.C. R.20, accessing the Internet in house/office/school is when household members accessed the Internet using PC/laptop which is connected by telephone line/PSTN (public switched telephone network) in house/office/ school.
5. Block V.C. R.20, accessing the Internet in cellphone is when household members accessed the Internet by using cellular phone, regardless of the location (whether in house, school, office and the like).
