

Description of household data (aggregated information)

I will send three different files with aggregated information for each quarter from the years 1996-1998. These files include only household numbers who filled the income and expenditure diaries. The first of them PERETMP.DBF describes the household structure. The second HINCOME.DBF gives information about household income and the third HEXPEND.DBF about household expenditure. These data does not include saving items-revenues (sales of securities, credits and loans taken, sales of immovable property, fixed assets) and saving items – outgoings (purchase of securities, credits and loans repaid, purchase of immovable property, fixed assets).

You can use household *weights* to calculate averages per household and per household member. You can link these data with “Household picture” (PEREPILT.DBF) and make different household groups to analyze income or expenditure in these groups using household *weights* from PERETMP.DBF.
