Notes and calculations

### 1340. Household monetary income for the given month

*Employment income* – estimated gross monetary income of the household as the total of all income of individual members of the household received for the given month, before withholding of income tax and mandatory social and health insurance contributions.

*Self-employment income* – monetary amount that a self-employed member of the household allotted for the needs of the household or estimated monetary value of goods and services that this self-employed member of the household provided for the needs of the household from his/her entrepreneurial activity.

*Social income* – all income that any member of the household received from social insurance, municipal / city authorities, labor, social affairs and family authorities (old-age pension, disability, widow's pension, sickness benefit, diet allowance, tax bonus, maternity benefits, unemployment etc.), incl. social support from different organizations.

*Investment income* – household income from the sale of tangible and intangible assets, interest income etc.

*Other income* – household income not included in other columns (organization-provided meal allowances, meal tickets, drawn advances or borrowings, insurance settlements etc.).

*Regular income* – usual monthly income of the household (salaries, wages, advances, pensions, social benefits, social assistance, annuities, organization-provided meal allowances etc.).

*Irregular income* – extraordinary household income – employment compensation, severance, non-recurring social assistance, dividends, interest, inheritance, sale, monetary borrowings / leasing, etc.
