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## Preface

Sri Lanka Labour force survey was designed to measure the levels and trends over time, on employment, unemployment and labour force in Sri Lanka. This survey is conducted quarterly, since the first quarter of 1990. A nationally representative annual sample of about 10,000 housing units is selected for the survey. The present report, which is the twenty third in the series, is based on a sample of 2000 housing units (excluding Northern and Eastern provinces) and gives national estimates with a stipulated standard error of labour force characteristics as reported in the reference period of the third quarter of 1995.

A different set of table formats have been used in presenting the data, taking the level of accuracy of data at certain levels of disaggregation in to consideration. Comments of the data users on this will therefore be appreciated. Furthermore, the sample design and the questionnaire have been subjected to change commencing 1996.

Planning and the execution of the survey was done by the staff of the Sample survey division under the guidance of Mrs. S. Vidyaratne, Additional Director and the direction of Mr. Gamini de Silva, Deputy Director and under the supervision of Mr. J.A.P. Balasuriya, Statistician.



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## SRI LANKA LABOUR FORCE SURVEY RESULTS

### Third Quarter 1995

The field work of the above survey conducted in the third quarter of 1995 was confined to seven provinces of the country excluding the Northern and the Eastern Provinces, due to the prevailing situation in those two provinces. Thus the national level estimates based on the information collected in the third quarter of 1995 do not cover the Northern and the Eastern Provinces. The field work of the survey in the third quarter of 1995 was done in July 1995 and the current Labour Force Status of persons was measured as in the reference week of July 1995. This survey covers only the persons living in housing units and it excludes the institutional population.

#### Economically Active Population :

The survey estimates the economically active population in Sri Lanka (excluding the Northern and the Eastern Provinces) at 6.12 million, of which 5.34 million are employed and 0.78 million unemployed. Accordingly, the unemployment rate in Sri Lanka in the third quarter of 1995 (excluding the Northern and the Eastern Provinces) is estimated at 12.7 percent.

The Labour Force Status was measured for all persons aged 10 years and over (for those who are in the working age) and 47.9 percent of the working age population is estimated to be economically active. Among females, the highest participation (53.0%) was shown within the age group of 25-29, while the males within the same age group have shown a participation of 94.6 percent [See Table (i)].

A higher participation in the Labour Force is reported for males (65.6%) as compared to the females (31.1%). Labour Force participation is comparatively higher in the rural sector than the urban sector [See Table (ii)].

#### Employed Population :

The survey conducted in the third quarter of 1995 estimates the employed population in Sri Lanka at 5.34 million. This number accounts for 87.3 percent of the total Labour Force. Of this number 3.70 million or 69.3 percent are males and 1.64 million or 30.7 percent are females. Of the employed, 1.01 million or 18.9 percent are residing in the urban sector and 4.33 million or 81.1 percent are residing in the rural sector.

#### Occupation:

Occupations under the major groups, "Skilled Agricultural and Fishery Workers" and "Elementary Occupations" account for nearly 59.4 percent of the occupations available in the rural sector. In other occupational categories the proportion of employed persons in each such category is higher in the urban sector as compared to the rural sector [See Table (iii)].

Industry :

The dominance of occupations in the major industrial group, "Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries" in the rural sector is apparent as shown in the above table [Table (iv)] with a figure of 44.1 percent of employed population. In the urban sector occupations in the industrial groups "Personal Services", and "Trade and Hotels" dominate with percentage figures of 30.6 and 25.5 respectively.

Distribution of employed persons by their employment status is given in table (v). Bulk of the employed persons (61.8%) work as "Employees". Nearly 28.0 percent of the employed persons work as "Own account workers" and the remaining 10.3 percent work as "Unpaid family workers" ( 8.3%) and as "Employers" (2.0%). Table (v) also shows that, the employed females who work as "Unpaid family workers" comprised a larger proportion (16.0%) as compared to males (5.0%).

"Own-account workers" and "Unpaid family workers" account for 59.6 percent of the total employment in the Agricultural Sector. over seventy five percent of persons employed in the Non-Agricultural sector are reported to be "Employees" [see table (vi)].

#### Unemployed Population :

The survey conducted in the third quarter of 1995 estimates the unemployed population in Sri Lanka (excluding the Northern and the Eastern Provinces) at 0.78 million of which 0.38 million are males and 0.40 million are females. Of the unemployed, 0.17 million are residing in the urban sector and 0.61 million are residing in the rural sector. Accordingly, the Unemployment Rate in Sri Lanka (excluding the Northern and the Eastern Provinces) in the third quarter of 1995 is estimated at 12.7 percent (See Table 1).

The highest unemployment rates have been reported in the age groups 15-19 years and 20-24 years [See Table (vii)]. A higher (All Ages) unemployment rate is reported in the urban sector as compared to the rural sector, the rates being 14.2 percent in the urban sector and 12.3 percent in the rural sector. A higher unemployment rate among females as compared to males is also apparent in the Table (viii).

Classification of the employed persons by educational attainments [Table (ix)] indicates that 27.5 percent of all employed persons possessed GCE (OL)/NCGE certificates or higher certificate While 21.7 percent has primary education (Grade 0-4/Year 1-5), 6.6 percent has not gone to school at all.

57.0 percent of the unemployed females falls into "GCE (OL)/NCGE and above" category, while the corresponding proportion for males is 41.6 percent indicating that unemployment is higher for females than for males among educated groups.

Out of those who were unemployed during the reference period of the survey, 71.6 percent of the males and about 84.1 percent of the females have been seeking work for a period exceeding one year or more [See Table (x)].

## Appendix - 1

### Technical Notes

#### A. Introduction

The data is derived from household interviews obtained from a sample survey of the population 10 years of age and older. The survey is conducted quarterly by the Department of Census and Statistics and provides comprehensive data on the Labour Force, the Employed, the Unemployed and includes such characteristics as age, sex, occupation, and industry attachment. The survey also provides information on hours worked, and reasons for unemployment and non-participation in the labour force. The survey is conducted by trained interviewers from a total annual sample of about 10,000 households. The data collected are based on the respondent's activity or status during the preceding week and previous 12 month period.

#### B. Collection and Coverage

Data are collected quarterly during a similar time period in each quarter through a scientifically selected sample designed to represent the non-institutional household population. About 2500 households are visited each quarter. Respondents are interviewed to obtain information about each member of the household, 10 years of age or older. The inquiry relates to the previous calendar week of the interview to obtain "current" information, and to the previous 12 calendar months to obtain "usual" activity information.

Inmates of institutions, military camps, and lodging places are not surveyed. Households with more than 5 lodgers and boarders are also excluded from the survey.

#### C. Concepts and Definitions :

The concepts and definitions underlying the labour force data from this survey differ somewhat from those in previous labour force surveys. Therefore comparisons of data should be made carefully taking into account the concepts and definitions that follow:

**Labour Force** : The Labour force is composed of the economically active population aged 10 years and over.

**Economically Active Population** : The economically active population is defined as those persons who are/were employed or unemployed during the reference period of the survey.

**Employed** : Employed persons are all household members who during the reference period worked as paid employees, employers, own account workers (self-employed) or unpaid family workers, in family enterprises. Also included are persons who had a job but were temporarily absent from work because of such things as vacation, illness, bad weather, and labour - management disputes etc. It should be noted that if a person has one or more jobs, that person is counted only once.

**Unemployed** : Persons who were available and/or looking for work, and had no employment during the reference period, are considered to be unemployed.

**Reference Period** : In this survey there are two reference periods, "current" and "usual". The "current" reference period is the week preceding the week of data collection, i.e. last

week. The "Usual" reference period is the preceding 12 months, i.e., the past 12 months.

**Currently Economically Active** : A person who was employed or unemployed is considered to be currently economically active.

**Usually Economically Active** : A person whose major activity during the past 12 months was employment and/or unemployment is considered to have been usually economically active. Twenty-six weeks or more is the measure that determines the major activity of the respondent for the year.

**Currently Employed** : A person who works for pay, profit, or unpaid family gain for one (1) hour or more during the past week is considered to have been employed during that period. This includes persons whether paid or not, with a job but not at work for the various reasons cited above.

**Usually Employed** : A person whose major economic activity during the past 12 months was employment is considered to have been usually employed.

**Currently Unemployed** : A person who did no work but who was looking or available for work during the past 4 weeks is considered to have been currently unemployed.

**Usually Unemployed** : A person who was available/looking for work during the major part of the economically active period of the past 12 months is said to have been usually unemployed.

**Not In Labour Force** (not economically active) : Persons who were neither working nor available/looking for work are classified as not in the labour force. This group includes persons engaged in own house work, going to school, unable to work because of long term infirmities, retired, and others. Others include persons voluntarily idle.

## **MEASURES OF THE LABOUR FORCE:**

**The working age population** is the total non-institutional household population aged 10 years or over.

**The participation rate** is the proportion of the labour force that is in the working age population.

**The labour force** is the number of persons classified as employed or unemployed according to the criterion described above.

**The unemployment rate** represents the number of unemployed persons as a percent of the labour force.

These measures can be computed for age, sex, educational attainment and other personal or economic characteristics.

**Occupation, Industry and Employment Status** : These apply to the job held by the currently employed during the survey week. For persons with more than one job, it is usually the main job that is described. However, classifications are also made for the secondary job. Occupations are classified according to the International Standard Classification of Occupations (ISCO), ILO, 1988. Industry is classified according to ILO's International Standard Industrial

**Classification.** The employment - status classification specifies employment in the public or private sectors, and further breaks down into employees (wage and salary workers), employers, own account workers (self-employed), and unpaid family workers.

**Hours of Work** refer to hours actually worked during the week. If the hours actually worked are less than the hours usually worked, respondents are asked the reasons for working fewer hours, which include the following: illness or injury, strike, vacation, reduction in economic activity, off season inactivity, bad weather, mechanical or electrical failure, and shortage of raw materials.

**A Household** consists of all persons, related or not, who occupy a housing unit, which covers a house, an apartment, a group of rooms, or a single room when occupied as separate living quarters. Domestic servants, boarders, and lodgers who live and have their meals or share other essentials of living with the family are also treated as members of the household. Households with more than 5 lodgers (non-family members paying rent) and boarders, are considered as institutional units and are excluded from the survey. Persons, who usually live here but are temporarily away are included as members of the household, but persons who have usual residence elsewhere, but are present at the time of the interview, are excluded.

**Geographic Data :** Data is available at national and provincial levels, and further broken down by urban and rural categories. URBAN areas are those that have an administrative structure of a Municipal Council, an Urban Council, or the 1981 Town Council. RURAL areas are those not classified as urban. ESTATES are subsectors of rural areas. Because of current sample size limitations, data cannot be published at the District level or for the Estate category.

#### **D. SAMPLE DESIGN**

The survey is conducted quarterly to produce estimates of employment, unemployment, labour force participation and basic demographic characteristics. The scope of coverage includes all households in Sri Lanka.

A stratified two-stage probability sample design is used with census blocks as primary sampling units (PSUs) and housing units as secondary and final sampling units (SSUs). There are three levels of stratification which increase the efficiency of the sample design. The first level consists of the 19 domains for which separate annual estimates are calculated; the nine provinces divided into urban and rural sectors, and the greater colombo area.

The total annual sample size is 10,080 housing units, distributed as 252 blocks (PSUs) per each quarter and 10 housing units (SSUs) per block. The allocation to the domains aims at ensuring approximately equal levels of reliability from domain to domain.

The 1,008 blocks were selected with probability proportional to size from the 1981 Census list of approximately 70,000 census blocks. A listing operation was conducted in each selected block to provide a frame for the second stage of selection. The selection of housing units within blocks was systematic with random start.
