Second, improving how people are dealt with when they receive health care, which means that people's rights to be treated with dignity, confidentially and clear communications are respected and the health system provides basic amenities, social support and allows people to choose their health care provider, and treats people equally in these ways.

Third, CHARGE PEOPLE WHAT THEY CAN AFFORD, which means that everyone pays their fair share of health care costs, so healthy people share costs for those who are ill and higher-income people pay for some of the health care costs for lower-income people.
