Census definition:

- A population census is the total process of collecting, compiling, evaluating, analyzing and publishing or otherwise disseminating demographic, economic, and social data pertaining, at a specified time, to all persons in a country or in a well delimited part of a country.

Overall Census Objective

- Collect demographic and socio-economic data required for decision making

Specific Objectives

Ascertain:

- Size, composition and spatial distribution
- Levels of fertility, mortality and migration status
- Rate and pattern of urbanization
- Levels of education attained by the population
- Size and deployment of the labour force
- Size, types and distribution of persons with disabilities; and
- Housing conditions and availability of household amenities

CENSUS-TAKING IN KENYA

- Evolution from head-counts to complex inquiries:
 - 1897- 2.5m
 - 1948- 5.4m
 - 1962- 8.6m
 - 1969- 10.9m
 - 1979- 15.3m
 - 1989- 21.4m
 - 1999- 28.7m
 - 2009- To be revealed shortly

Overview of Enumeration Methodology

- Complete count of the population present on the census reference night (24th/25th August 2009)
- *De facto* method of counting adopted (people counted according to where they spent the reference night)
- Canvasser method used for data collection (questionnaire administered by pre-trained personnel)
- Additional question to capture information on *de jure* population (*usual* residents identified)
- Unit of enumeration is the individual
- Frameworks of identification: household, institutions, persons on transit, and out-door sleepers)

Methodology Cont'd

- Implementation done in three phases:
 - Pre-enumeration phase (Preparatory activities)
 - Enumeration phase

Data Collection

Reference date-24th/25th August, 2009

- Post Enumeration phase (Data capture, analysis, publication)

Methodology Cont'd

- Questionnaires: Main questionnaire and four (4) short questionnaires used (hotels/prisons/hospitals; travelers; vagrants; emigrants)
- Provision made to provide data for administrative and political units (districts, constituencies, counties)
- Data was captured via scanning technology. Technical Assistance provided by the US Census Bureau.

PREPARATIONS FOR 2009 CENSUS

- **Overview**

- **International standards observed:** 2009 Census guided by UN Principles & Recommendations for 2010 Round of Population and Housing Censuses
- **Legal Framework** provided through a gazette notice in August, 2008
- **Cartographic mapping** for the whole country created nearly 100,000 Enumeration areas
- **Pilot Census** conducted successfully in August 2008

RESOURCES FOR 2009 CENSUS

- Budget: Ksh. 8.4 billion; **Government funded 95%**
- More than half (Ksh.5.0 billion) paid to census personnel
- Field personnel
 - Senior Supervisors: 5,788
 - Supervisors: 22,323
 - Enumerators: 111,696
 - Village elders: 100,000
- Questionnaires: 12 million

CHALLENGES

- Competing national interests such as famine, drought, resettlement of IDPs
- Insecurity concerns
- Post-election violence disrupted mapping activities;
- Complex logistics for enumeration of Pastoralists communities required more resources
- Creation of new districts raised the census budget
- Cash-flow problems

- Vol. IA: Population Distribution by Administrative Units (sub-location, location, division, district, rural/urban)
- Vol. IB: Population Distribution by Political units (Constituencies, Counties)
- Vol. IC: Population Distribution by Age and Sex
- Vol. II: Population & Household Distribution by Socio-Economic Characteristics (Education, labour force, disability, livestock types, household assets, housing condition, and amenities, ethnic affiliation, religion)

DISTRICTS WITH INCONSISTENT FIGURES -OBSERVATIONS

- Rate of increase is higher than the population dynamics (birth and death rates) would support
- Age and sex profiles deviate from the norm;
- Significant growth is observed in household size without accompanying growth in number of households.
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DISTRICTS WITH INCONSISTENT FIGURES -OBSERVATIONS

- Government wanted to ensure the process was transparent and accountable. That is why all the results are announced for all the districts.
- However, in view of this the Government has decided to repeat the exercise in these areas at a date to be announced later.

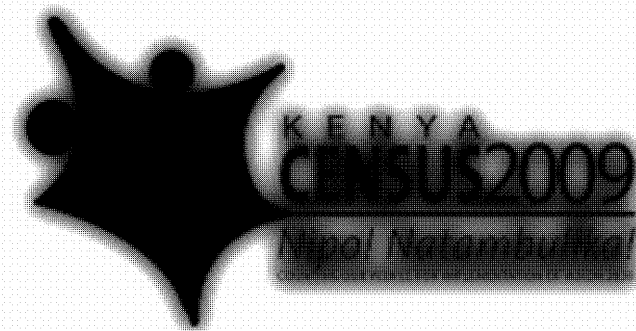
IMPLICATIONS

- Currently, Kenya is adding one million people yearly to its already high population. This high rate of population growth has adverse effects on spending in infrastructure, health, education, environment, water and other social and economic sectors.
- In order for the Government to achieve Vision 2030 goals, there is need to invest in education to meet the demands of the growing school age population and the demand for future manpower. In addition, critical investment will be required in family planning services, health and other social and economic sectors to improve the welfare of Kenyans.
