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I. Objectives

This survey was designed to achieve the following objectives:

- Assist the World Bank Group in gaining a better understanding of how stakeholders in Albania perceive the World Bank Group;
- Obtain systematic feedback from stakeholders in Albania regarding:
 - Their views regarding the general environment in Albania;
 - Their overall attitudes toward the World Bank Group in Albania;
 - Overall impressions of the World Bank Group's effectiveness and results, knowledge work and activities, and communication and information sharing in Albania;
 - Perceptions of the World Bank Group's future role in Albania.
- Use data to help inform Albania country team's strategy.

II. Methodology

In April—May 2014, 512 stakeholders of the World Bank Group in Albania were invited to provide their opinions on the World Bank Group's assistance to the country by participating in a country survey. Participants in the survey were drawn from the office of the President; the office of the Prime Minister; office of a minister; office of a parliamentarian; ministries, ministerial departments, or implementation agencies; consultants/contractors working on World Bank Group-supported projects/programs; project management units (PMUs) overseeing implementation of a project; local government officials; bilateral and multilateral agencies; private sector organizations; private foundations; the financial sector/private banks; NGOs; community based organizations; the media; independent government institutions; trade unions; academia/research institutes/think tanks; the judiciary branch; and other organizations. A total of 248 stakeholders participated in the survey (48% response rate).

Respondents received the questionnaire via post, courier or email and returned it accordingly. Respondents were asked about: general issues facing Albania; their overall attitudes toward the World Bank Group (WBG); the WBG's effectiveness and results; the WBG's knowledge work and activities; working with the WBG; the WBG's future role in Albania; and the WBG's communication and information sharing in Albania.

Every country that engages in the Country Opinion Survey must include specific indicator questions that will be aggregated for the World Bank Group's annual Corporate Scorecard. These questions are identified throughout the survey report.

- A. General Issues Facing Albania: Respondents were asked to indicate whether Albania is headed in the right direction, what they thought were the top three most important development priorities in the country, which areas would contribute most to reducing poverty and generating economic growth in Albania, and how "shared prosperity" would be best achieved in Albania.

II. Methodology (continued)

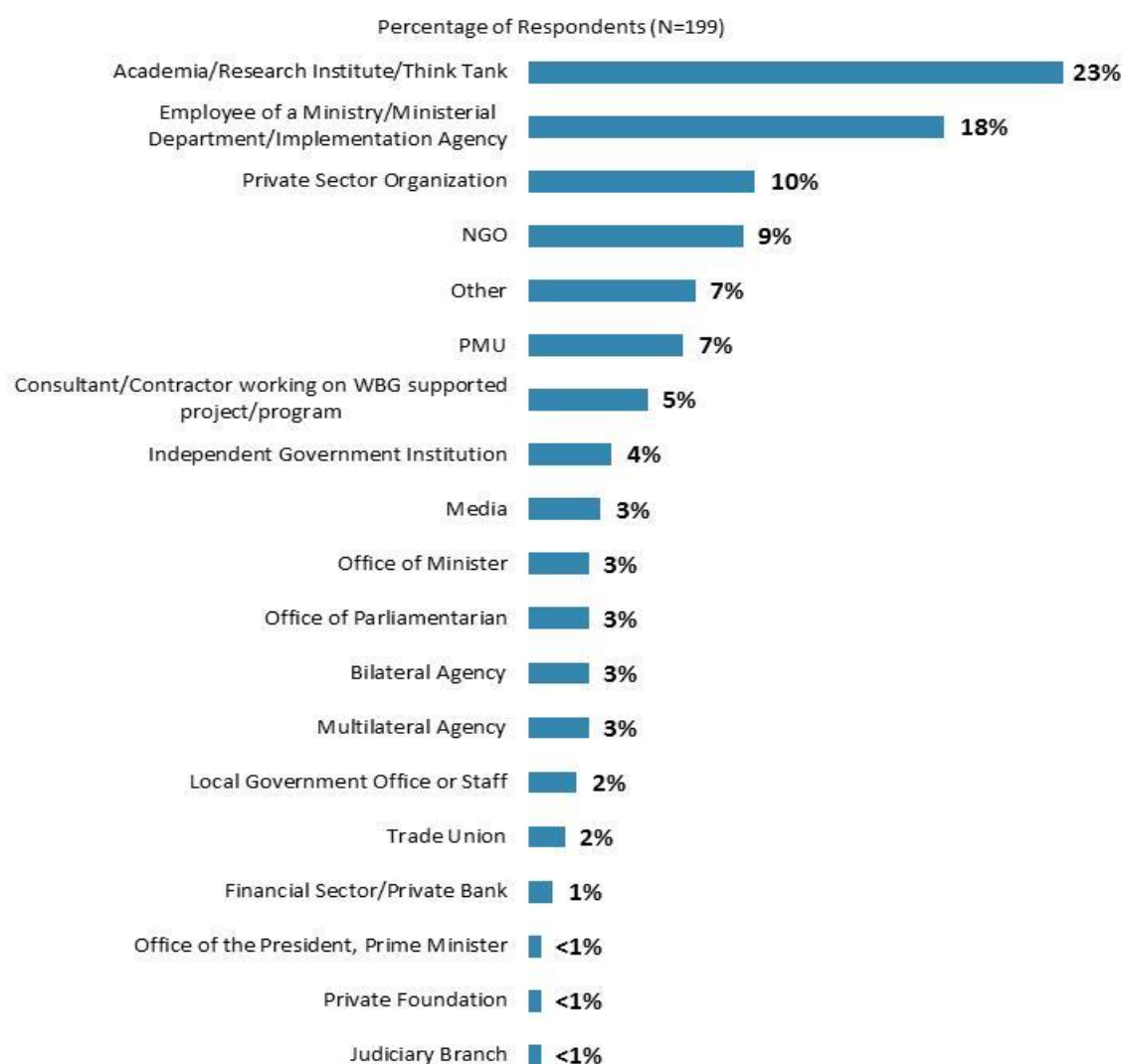
- B. Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group (WBG): Respondents were asked to rate their familiarity with the WBG, the WBG's effectiveness in Albania, WBG staff preparedness to help Albania solve its development challenges, their agreement with various statements regarding the WBG's work, and the extent to which the WBG is an effective development partner. Respondents were asked to indicate the WBG's greatest values and weaknesses, the most effective instruments in helping reduce poverty in Albania, with which stakeholder groups the WBG should collaborate more, in which sectoral areas the WBG should focus most of its resources (financial and knowledge services), and to what reasons respondents attributed failed or slow reform efforts.
- C. World Bank Group's Effectiveness and Results: Respondents were asked to rate the extent to which the WBG's work helps achieve development results in Albania, the extent to which the WBG meets Albania's needs for knowledge services and financial instruments, and the WBG's level of effectiveness across thirty development areas, such as economic growth, governance, private sector development, education, and job creation.
- D. The World Bank Group's Knowledge Work and Activities: Respondents were asked to indicate how frequently they consult WBG's knowledge work and activities and to rate the effectiveness and quality of the WBG's knowledge, including how significant of a contribution it makes to development results and its technical quality.
- E. Working with the World Bank Group: Respondents were asked to rate their level of agreement with a series of statements regarding working with the WBG, such as the WBG's "Safeguard Policy" requirements being reasonable, the WBG imposing reasonable conditions on its lending, disbursing funds promptly, and providing effective implementation support.
- F. The Future Role of the World Bank Group in Albania: Respondents were asked to rate how significant a role the WBG should play in Albania in the near future, to indicate what the WBG should do to make itself of greater value in Albania, and which services the WBG should offer more of in the country.
- G. Communication and Information Sharing: Respondents were asked to indicate how they get information about economic and social development issues, how they prefer to receive information from the WBG, and their usage and evaluation of the WBG's websites and social media channels. Respondents were also asked about their awareness of the WBG's Access to Information policy, past information requests from the WBG, and their level of agreement that they use more data from the WBG as a result of the WBG's Open Data policy.
- H. Background Information: Respondents were asked to indicate their current position, specialization, whether they professionally collaborate with the WBG, their exposure to the WBG in Albania, which WBG agencies they work with, and their geographic location.

When possible, responses from respondents completing this year's country survey were compared to responses from 198 respondents (58% response rate) who completed the survey in FY 2012 and 200 respondents (73% response rate) who completed the country survey in FY 2010. Notations and/or charts are included when these comparisons were possible.

III. Demographics of the Sample

Current Position

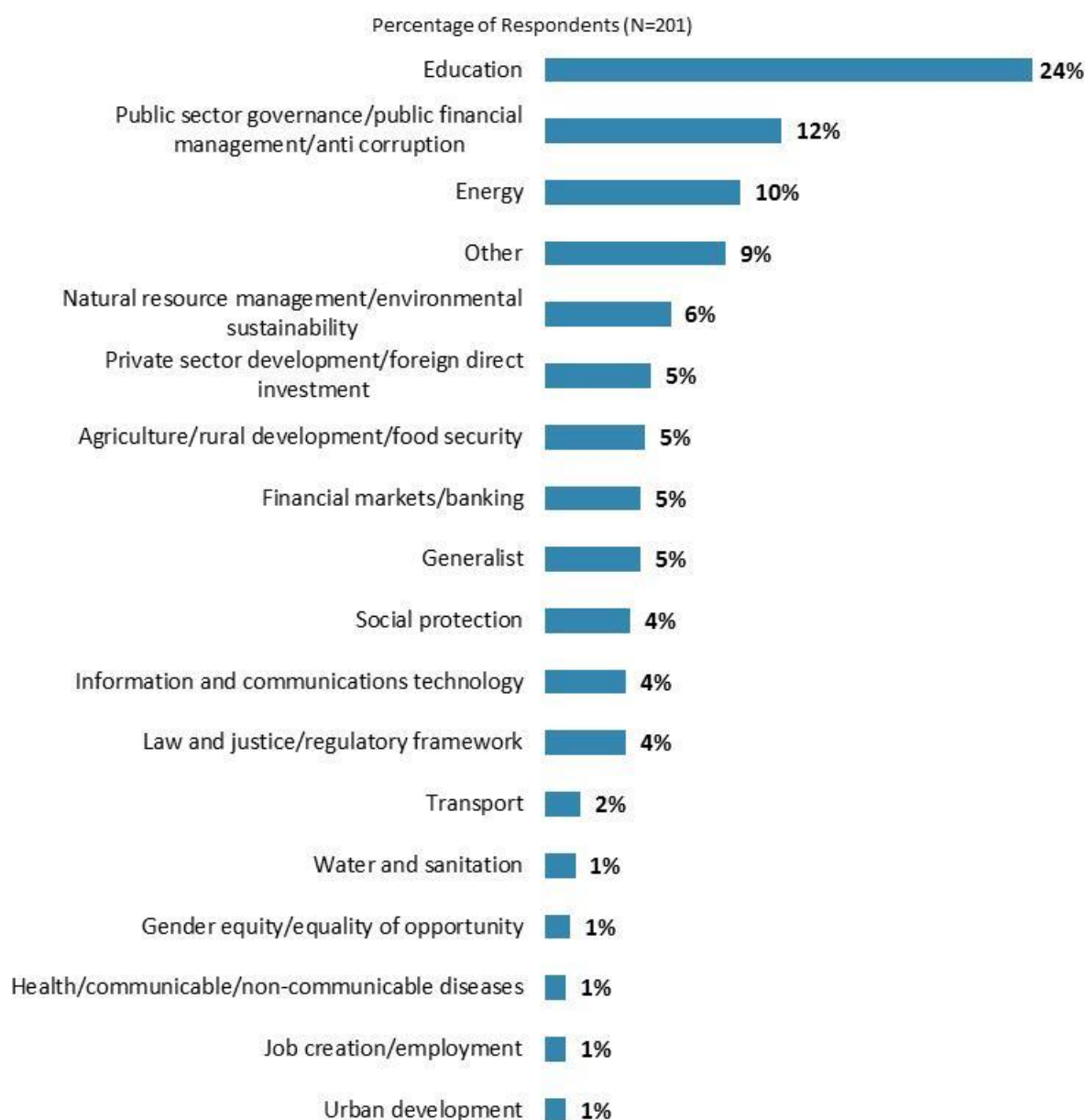
- For further analyses, a small number of respondents from the office of the President, Prime Minister were combined with respondents from the office of a minister; consultants/contractors working on World Bank Group-supported projects/programs were combined with respondents from PMUs; respondents from bilateral agencies were combined with those from multilateral agencies; respondents from the financial sector/private banks were combined with those from private sector organizations; respondents from NGOs, trade unions, and private foundations were combined into the “CSO” category; and the few respondents from the office of a parliamentarian, local government, and the judiciary branch were included in the “Other” category. There were no respondents from community based organizations.
- Note that the number of respondents from academia/research institutes/think tanks (39% in the original respondent base) was weighted for all analyses in order to reduce sampling bias and make FY14 and FY12 sample frames comparable (see Appendix F for details).

Area of Primary Specialization



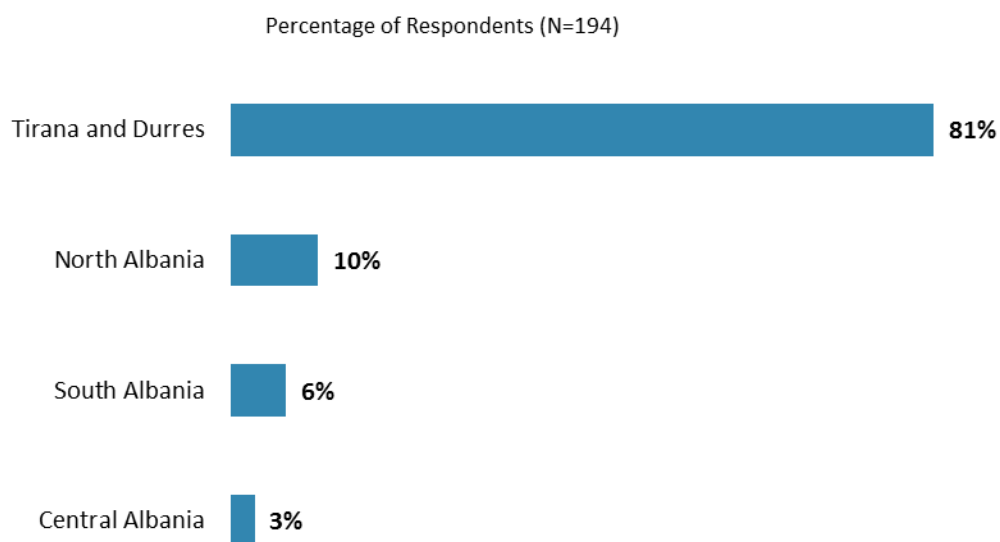
“Please identify the primary specialization of your work.” (Respondents chose from a list.)

When more than 15% of the sample are respondents from a particular sector (see the full list of specialized areas in question H2 in Appendix I), analyses are done to see these respondents' views about the development priorities in Albania, the areas of development that would contribute most to poverty reduction and economic growth, which areas the WBG should focus its attention and resources on, and importance and effectiveness of the WBG's work in specific sectors.

III. Demographics of the Sample (continued)

Geographic Location

- The majority of respondents indicated that they were located in Tirana and Durrës. Because of the small number of respondents from other areas, these locations were combined under the “Other” category for all further analyses.
- Responses across geographic locations for all country survey questions can be found in Appendix C (see page 92). Only significant differences between geographic locations in response to indicator questions will be discussed in the body of this report.

Collaboration with and Exposure to the World Bank Group

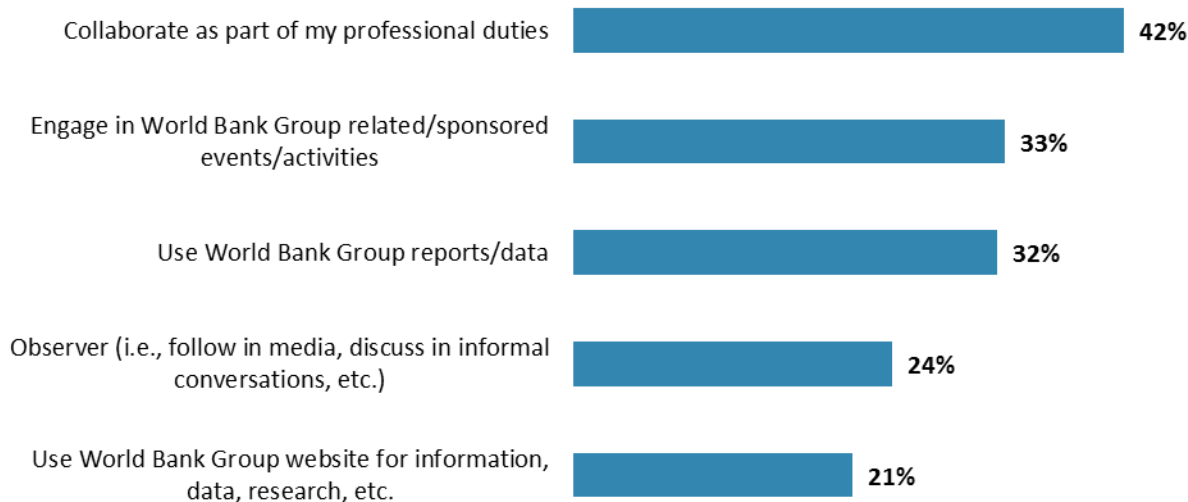

Percentage of Respondents (N=183)

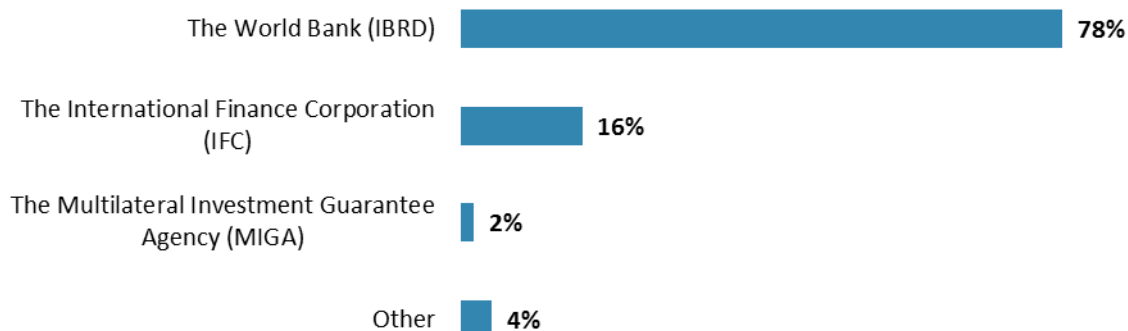


"Which of the following describes most of your exposure to the World Bank Group in Albania? (Choose no more than TWO)" (Respondents chose from a list. Responses combined.)

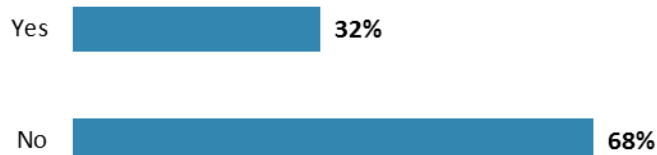
Exposure to Agencies and Collaboration within the World Bank Group

Percentage of Respondents (N=149)



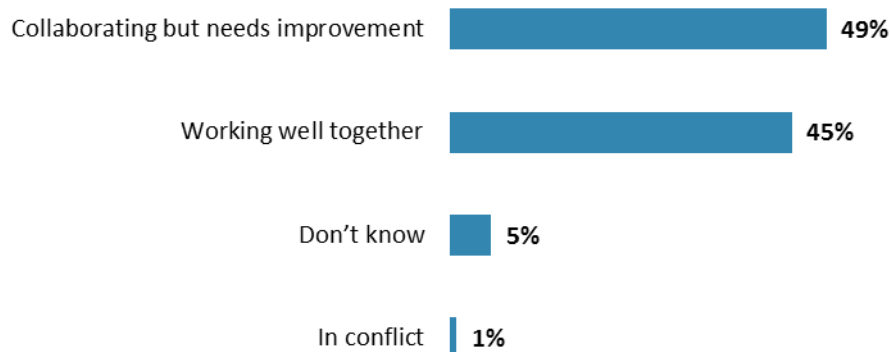
"Which of the following agencies of the World Bank Group do you primarily engage with in Albania?"

Percentage of Respondents (N=56)

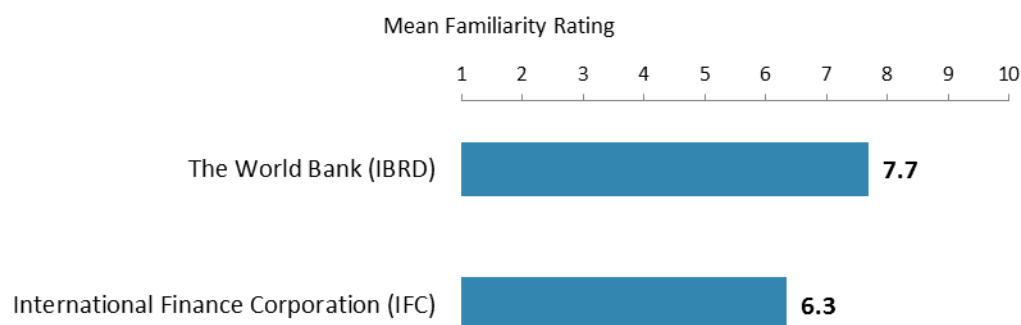


"If yes, what was your view on the two institutions working together in Albania?"

III. Demographics of the Sample (continued)

Familiarity with the World Bank Group

- Respondents who professionally collaborated/worked with the WBG had significantly higher levels of familiarity with the World Bank (IBRD) than respondents who indicated that they did not collaborate with the WBG.
- Respondents from Tirana and Durres had significantly higher levels of familiarity with the World Bank (IBRD) and the IFC than respondents from other geographic locations in Albania.
- Respondents in this year's country survey had significantly higher levels of familiarity with the World Bank (IBRD) in Albania compared to respondents from the FY '12 and FY '10 country surveys (6.7 and 7.2 respectively).¹
- Respondents' ratings of familiarity with the World Bank and the IFC were significantly, strongly correlated with their perceptions of the overall effectiveness of the World Bank and the IFC (respectively) in Albania, and significantly, moderately correlated with their perceptions of the WBG's relevance to Albania's development, and the WBG's ability to help achieve development results in Albania.



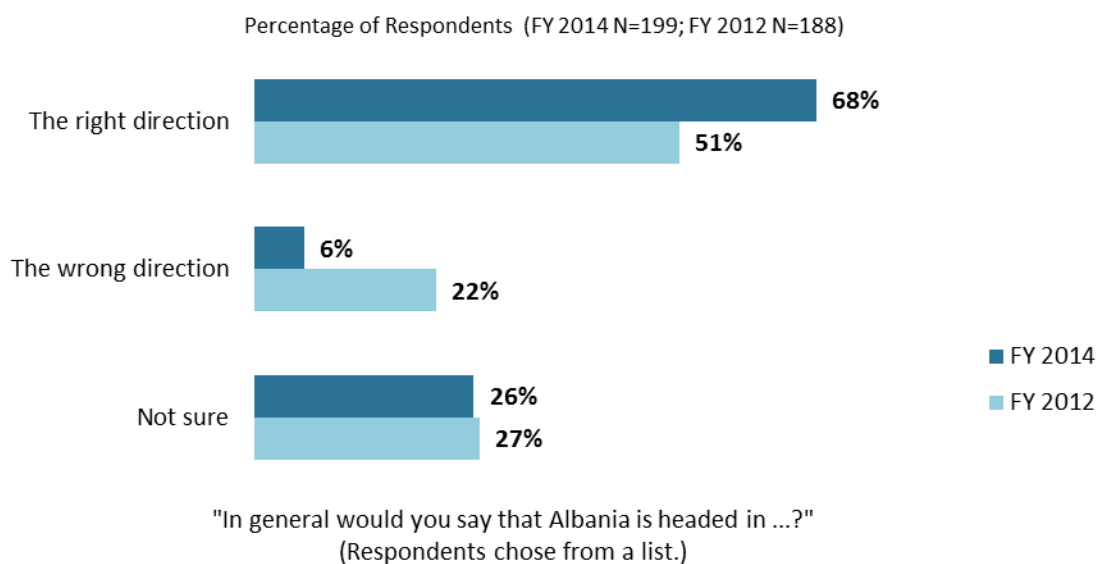
"There are several institutions in the World Bank Group that work in developing countries around the world. How familiar are you with their work in Albania?"

IV. General Issues Facing Albania

Headed in the Right Direction

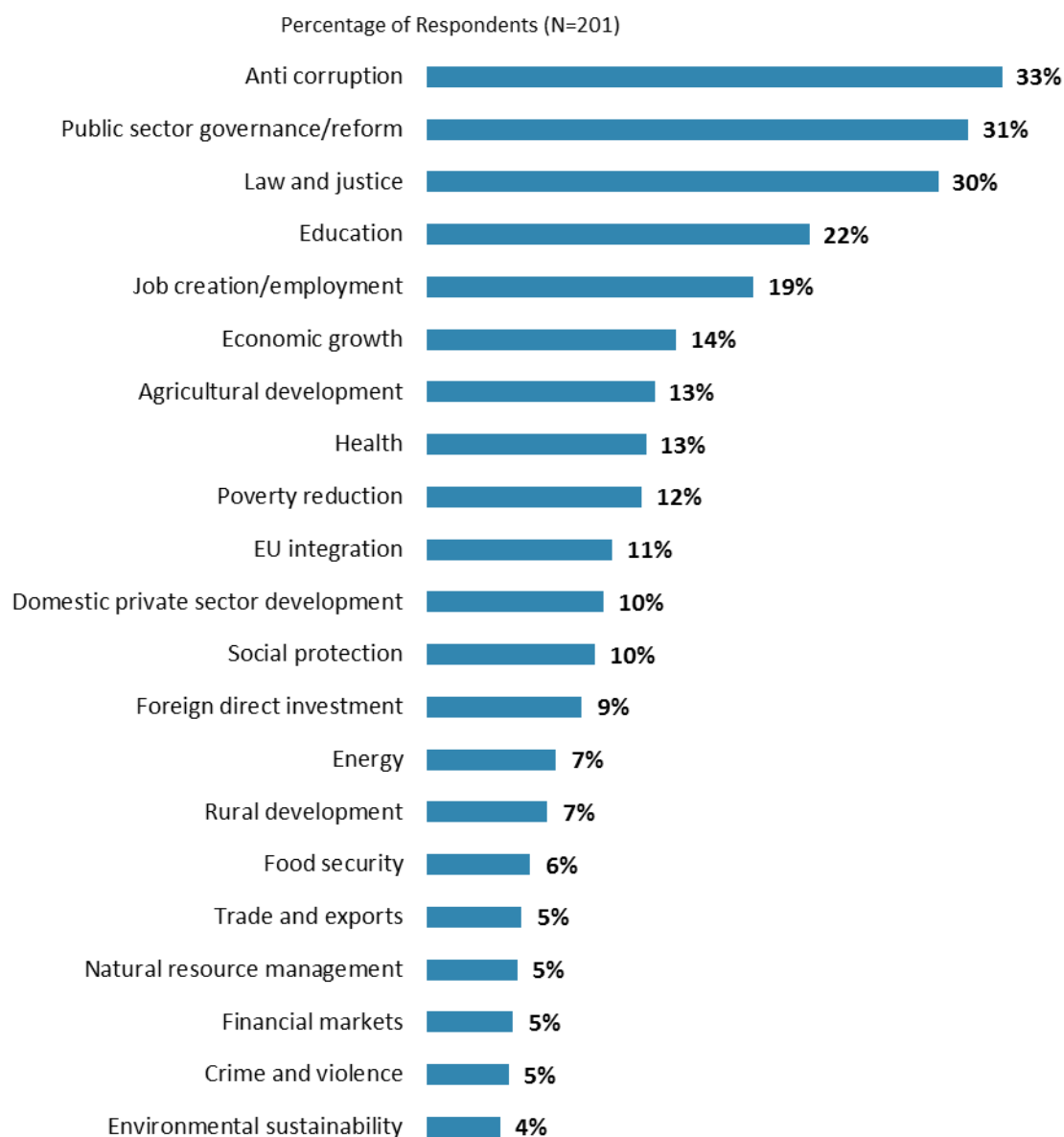
- Respondents in this year's country survey were significantly *more* likely to indicate that Albania is headed in the right direction compared to respondents from the FY '12 country survey.
- A majority of respondents across all stakeholder groups indicated that Albania is headed in the right direction.



IV. General Issues Facing Albania (continued)

Development Priority

- Respondents who collaborate with the WBG were significantly more likely to indicate public sector governance/reform as the most important development priority for Albania compared to those who do not collaborate with the WBG.
- In the FY'12 country survey*, education (36%) and law and justice (27%) were considered the most important development priorities for Albania.



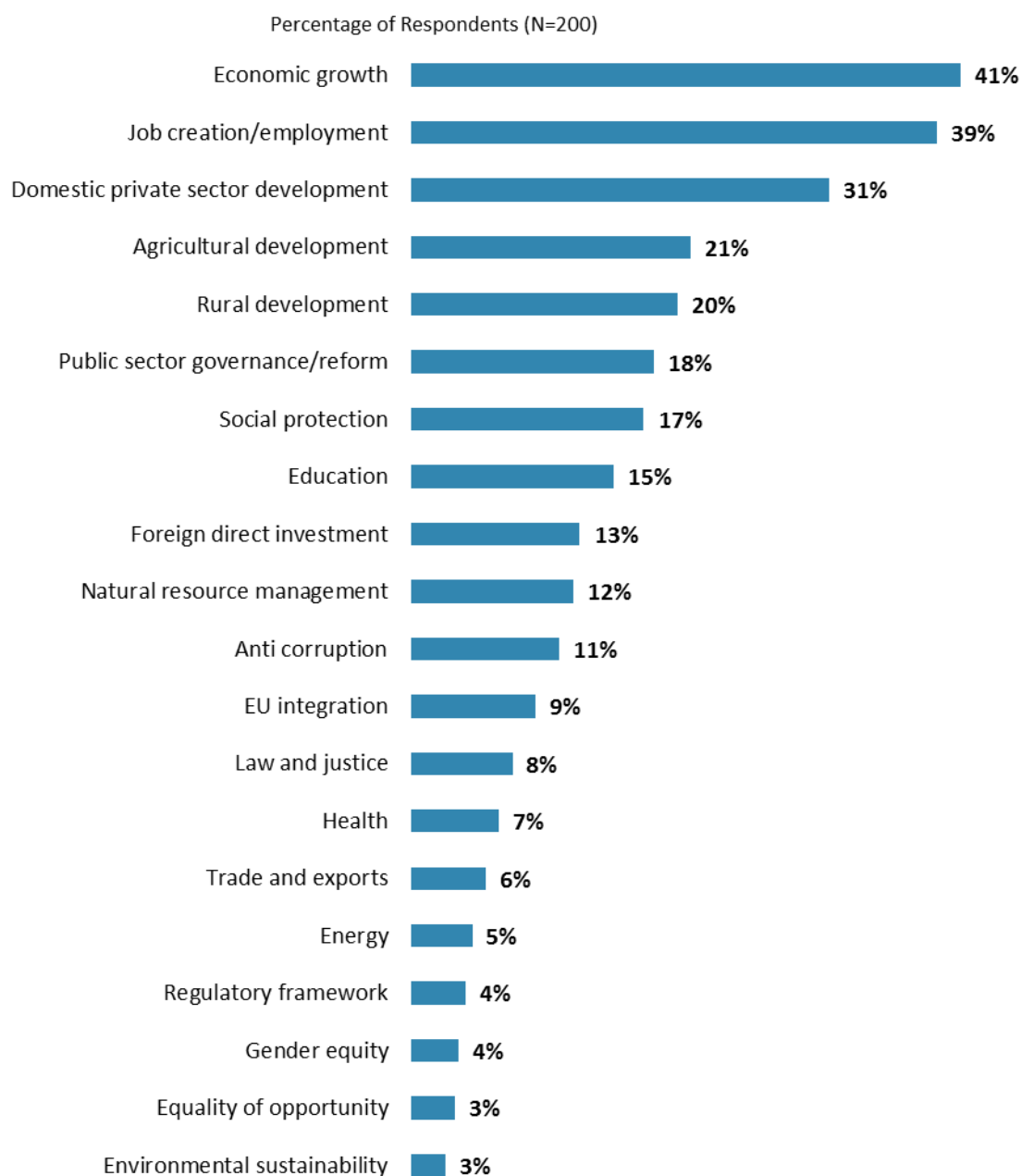
"Listed below are a number of development priorities in Albania. Please identify which of the following you consider the most important development priorities in Albania.

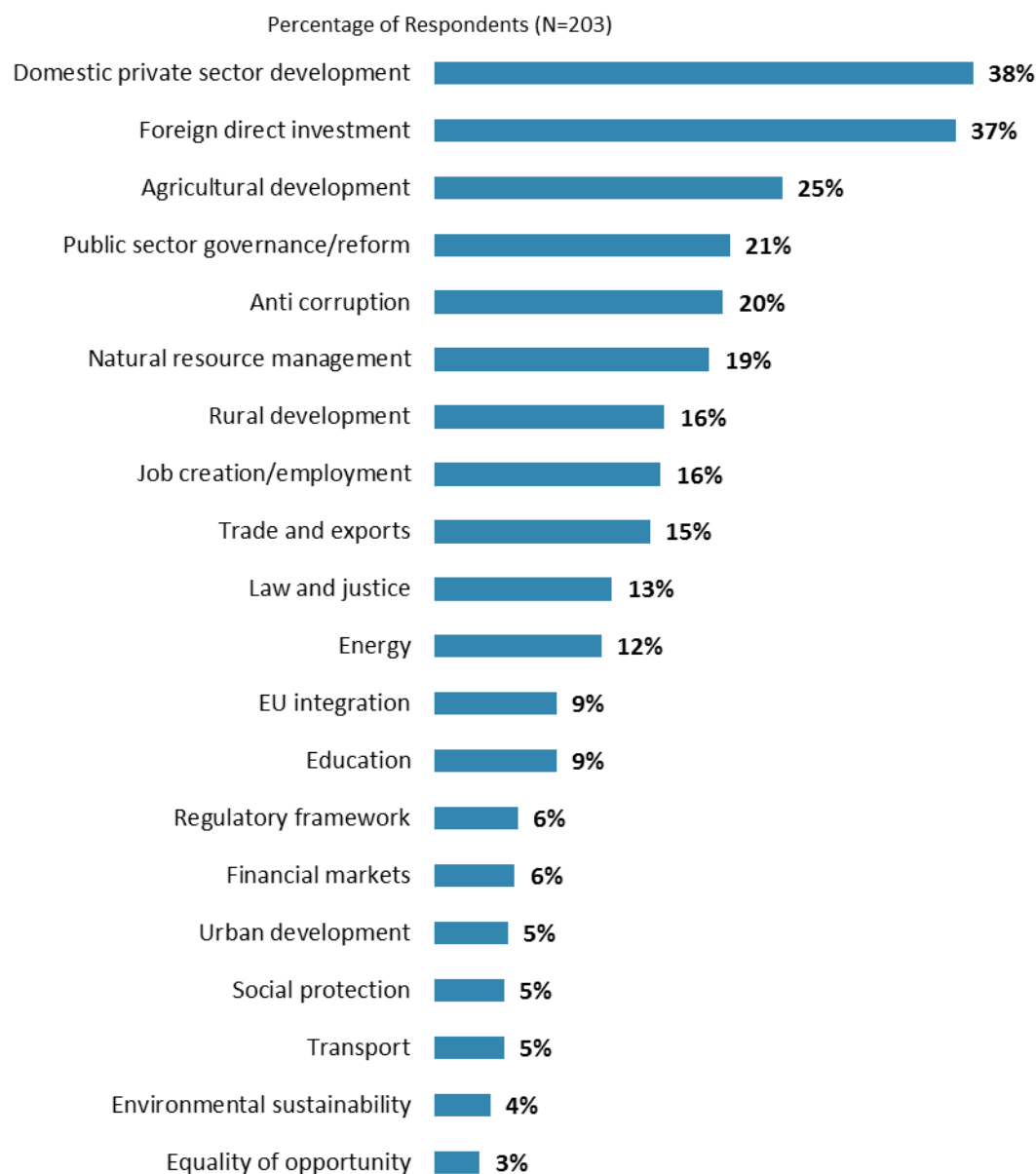

- In the FY '12 country survey*, respondents indicated that agriculture and rural development (33%) and foreign direct investment (27%) would contribute most to generating economic growth in Albania.

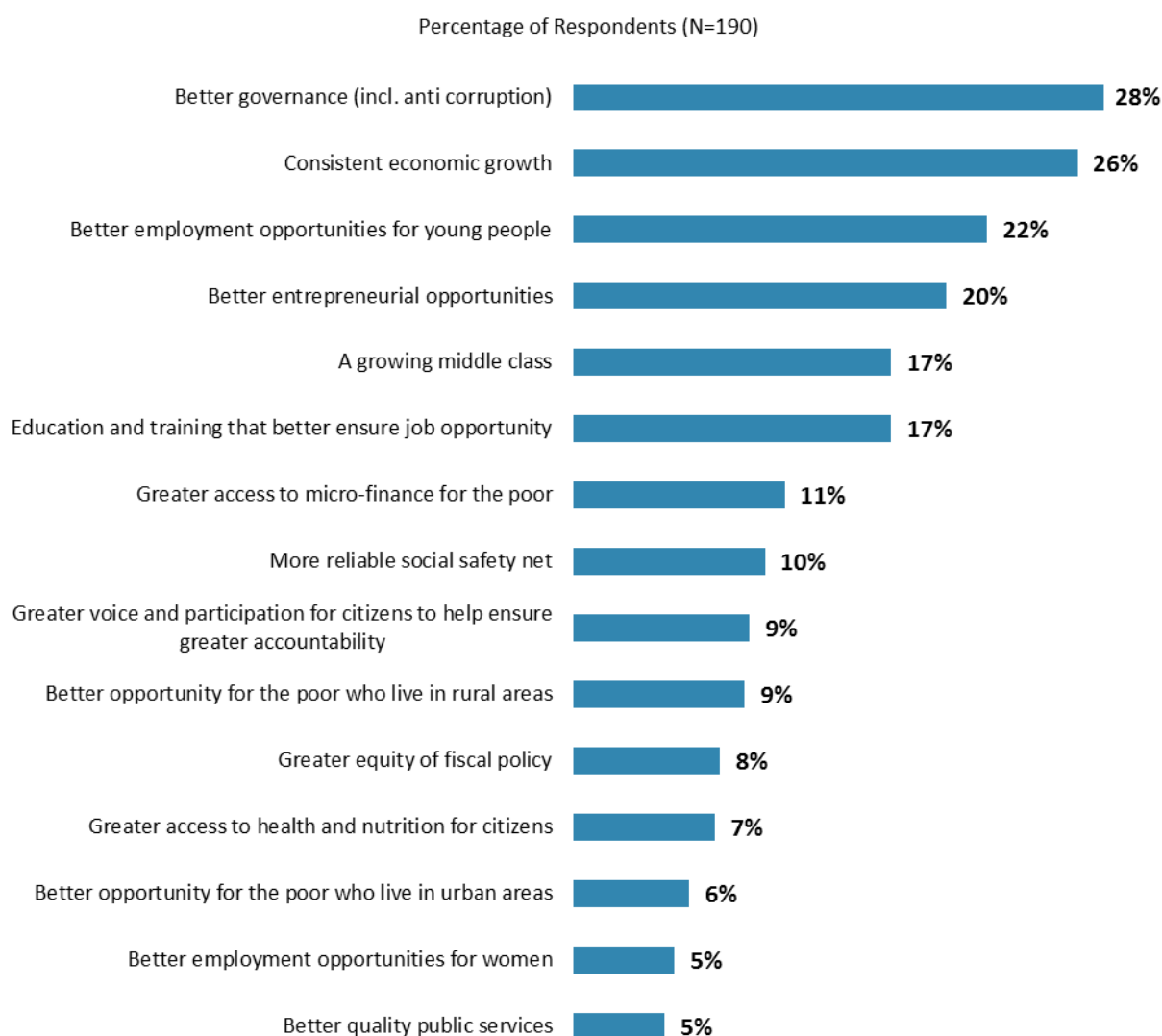


"Economic growth can be driven by a number of factors. Which THREE areas below do you believe would contribute most to generating economic growth in Albania? (Choose no more than THREE)"

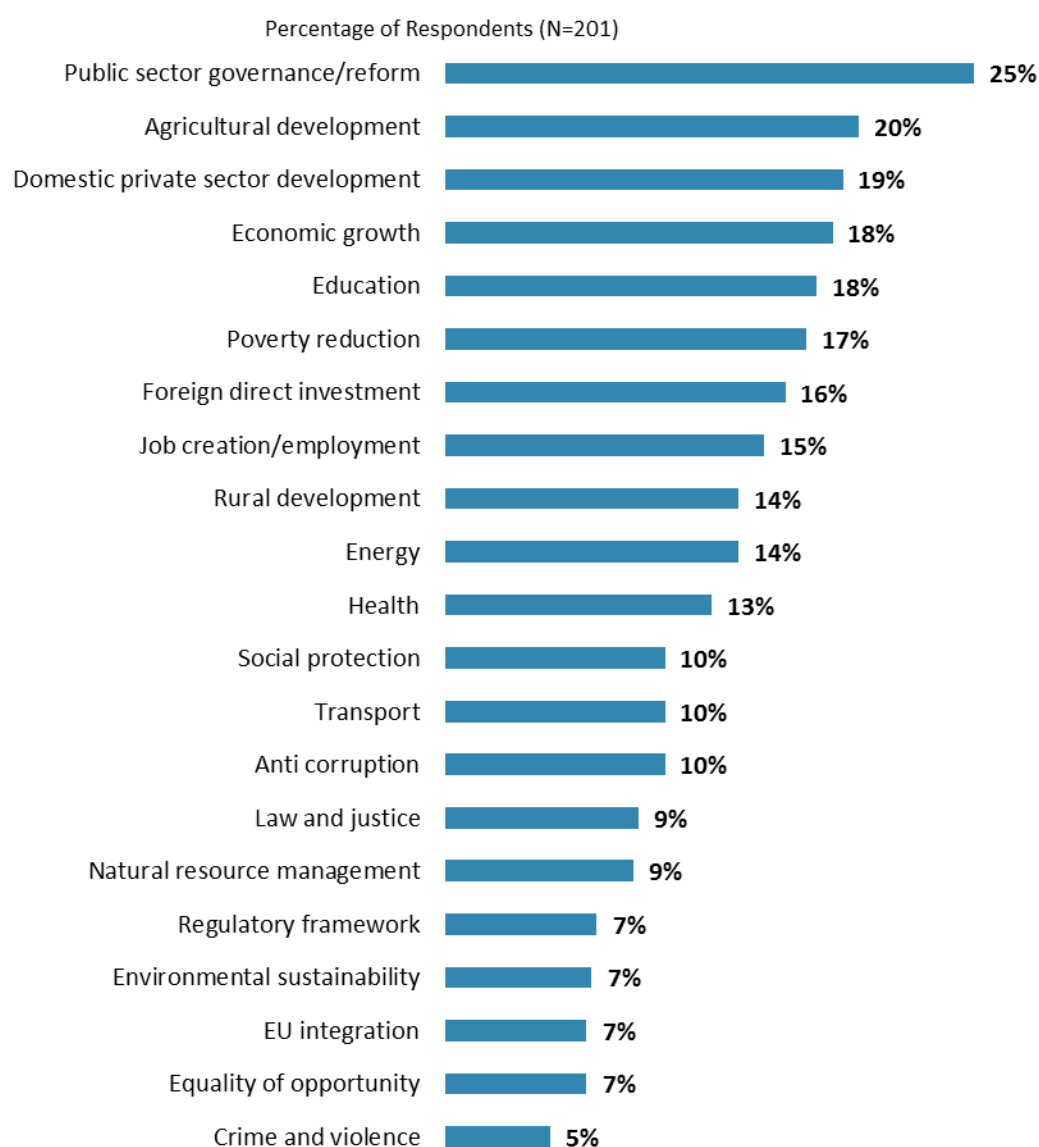


"When thinking about the idea of "shared prosperity" in your country, which of the following TWO best illustrate how this would be achieved in Albania? (Choose no more than TWO)"

Focusing World Bank Group Resources

- Respondents from the education sector were significantly more likely to indicate that the WBG should focus on education compared to respondents from other sectors.
- In the FY'12 country survey*, respondents indicated that the WBG should focus on agriculture and rural development (30%) and education (28%).

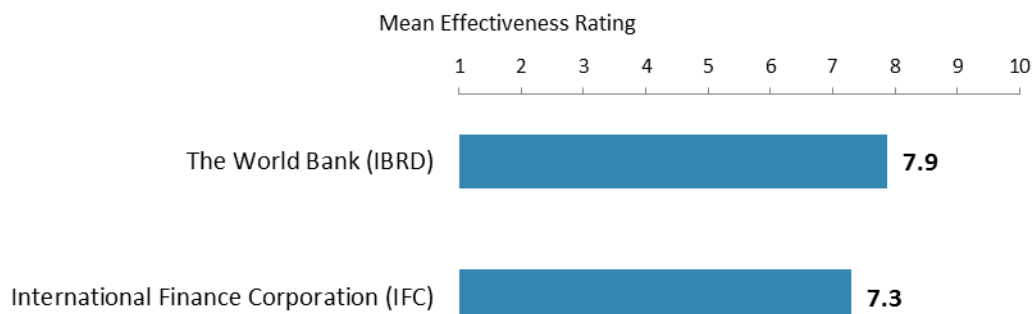

As noted in the “Methodology” section, the indicator questions referred to throughout the survey report are questions that are asked in every country that engages in the Country Opinion Survey. These will be aggregated for the World Bank Group’s annual Corporate Scorecard.

The World Bank Group’s Overall Effectiveness (*Indicator Question*)

- Respondents across all stakeholder groups gave statistically similar ratings for the World Bank’s (IBRD) overall effectiveness and the IFC’s overall effectiveness in Albania.
- Respondents from Tirana and Durres gave significantly higher ratings for the IFC’s overall effectiveness than respondents from other geographic locations in Albania.
- Respondents in this year’s country survey gave significantly higher ratings for the World Bank’s (IBRD) overall effectiveness in Albania compared to respondents from the FY’12 country survey (7.1).²



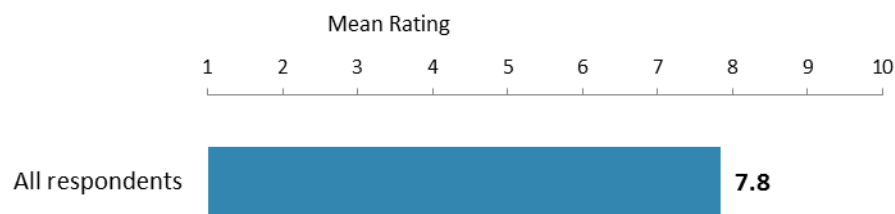
"Overall, please rate your impression of the World Bank Group member organization’s effectiveness in Albania?" (1 - "Not effective at all", 10 - "Very effective")

Achieving Development Results (*Indicator Question*)

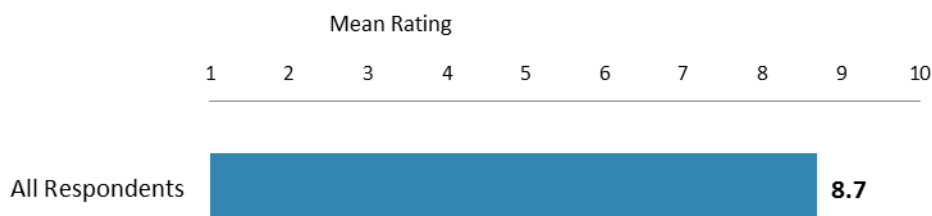
- Respondents in this year's country survey gave significantly higher ratings for the extent to which the WBG's work helps to achieve development results in Albania compared to respondents from the FY '12 country survey (7.1).
- Respondents from PMUs/consultants/contractors on WBG-supported projects gave the highest ratings for the extent to which the WBG's work helps to achieve development results in Albania, whereas respondents from the media gave significantly lower ratings.

Staff Preparedness (*Indicator Question*)

- Respondents in this year's country survey gave significantly higher ratings for the extent to which the WBG's staff is well prepared to help Albania solve its most complicated development challenges compared to respondents from the FY '12 country survey (7.8).
- Respondents across all stakeholder groups, geographic locations, and levels of collaboration with the WBG gave statistically similar ratings.

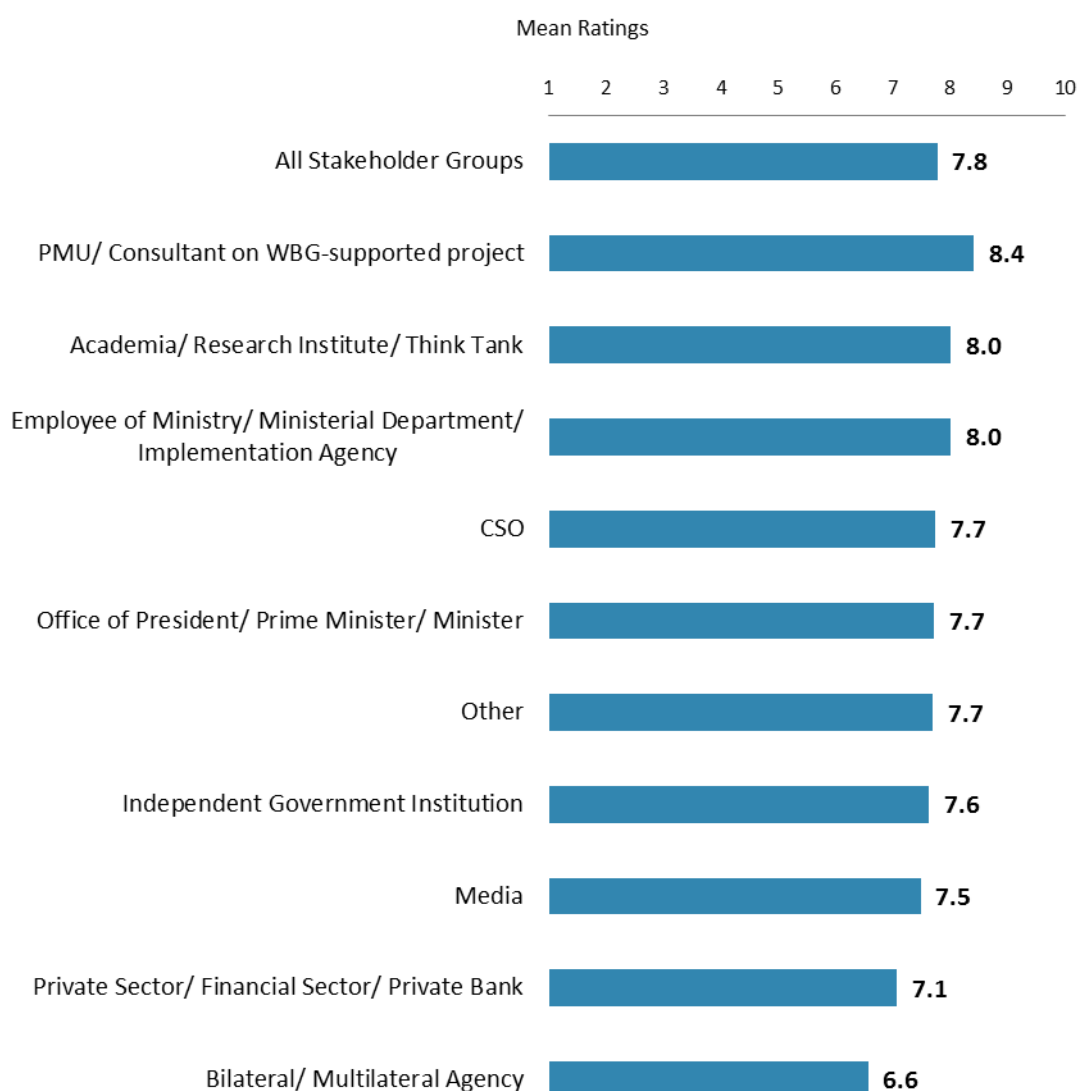


"To what extent do you believe the World Bank Group's staff is well prepared to help Albania solve its most complicated development challenges?"

Overall Ratings for Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups*

- There were significant differences across stakeholder groups in their aggregated responses to twenty seven indicator questions (responses to individual indicator questions across all stakeholder groups can be found in Appendix H, page 134).
- Respondents from PMUs/consultants/contractors on WBG-supported projects gave the highest ratings across all of the country survey indicator questions whereas respondents from bilateral/multilateral agencies gave significantly lower ratings.



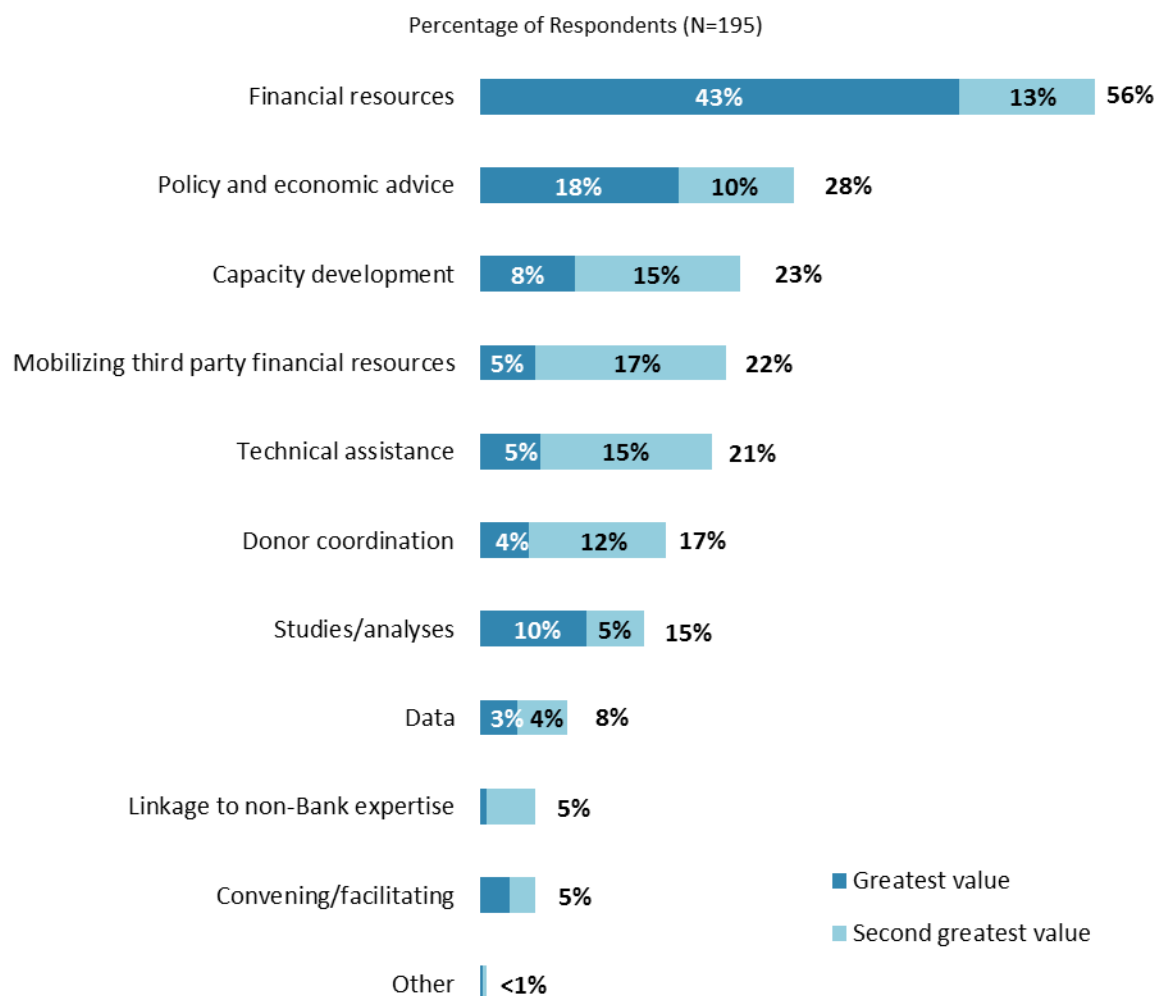
Mean Ratings for All Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups on a Scale from 1 to 10

WBG Activities: Greatest Value

- Respondents in the FY'12 country survey* indicated that the WBG's greatest values to Albania were the WBG's financial resources (59%) and its policy and economic advice (37%).



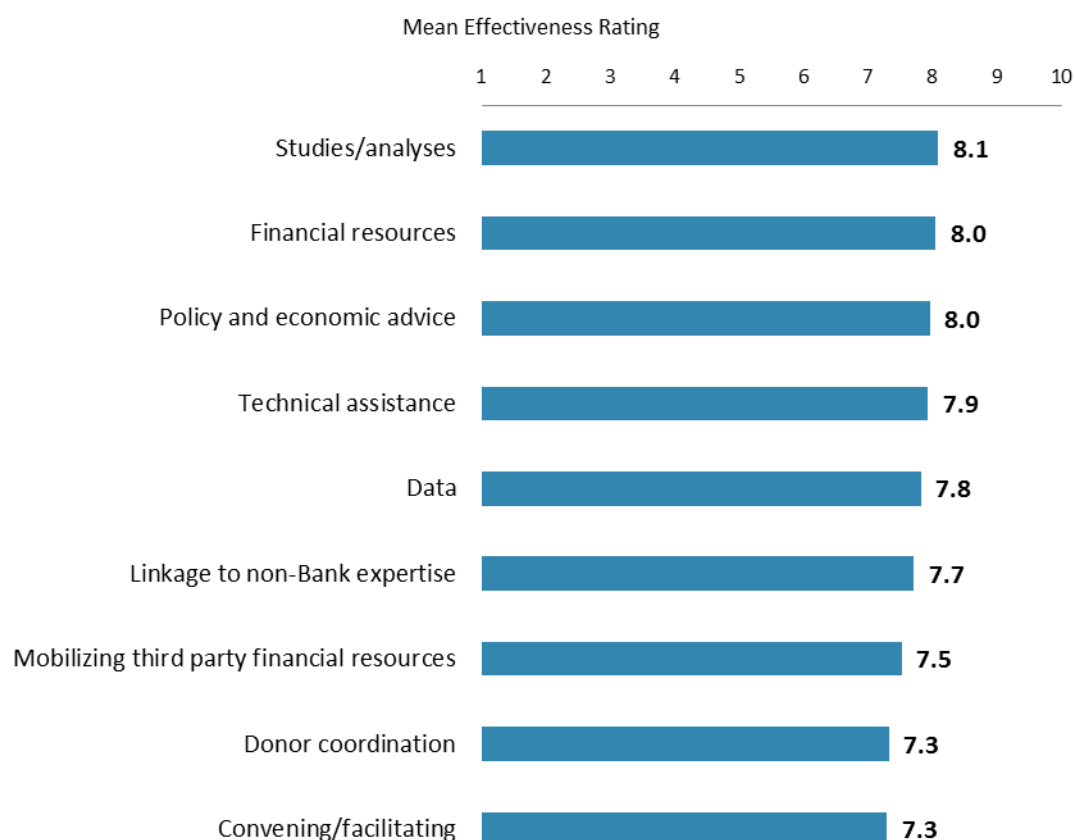

WBG Activities: Effectiveness

- There were significant differences across stakeholder groups in their ratings of effectiveness of the WBG's activities in Albania. For the most part, respondents from PMUs/consultants/contractors on WBG-supported projects tended to give the highest ratings, whereas respondents from bilateral/multilateral agencies and the media tended to give significantly lower ratings (see Appendix B for details).
- Respondents who professionally collaborate/work with the WBG gave significantly higher ratings for the effectiveness of the WBG's technical assistance than those respondents who do not collaborate.

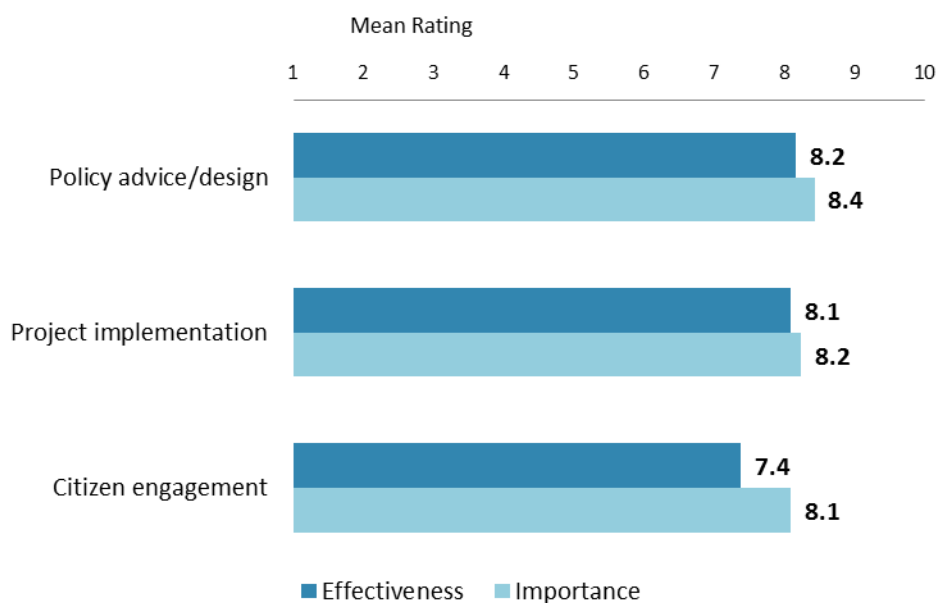


"How effectively do the World Bank Group's activities support Albania's efforts to achieve development results?" (1 - "Not effective at all", 10 - "Very effective")

V. Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group (continued)

WBG Activities: Capacity Building

- Respondents from PMUs/consultants/contractors on WBG-supported projects and CSOs gave the highest ratings for the effectiveness of the WBG's capacity building work in citizen engagement, whereas respondents from the office of President/Prime Minister/Minister gave significantly lower ratings.
- Respondents from the office of President/Prime Minister/Minister gave the highest ratings for the importance of the WBG being involved in project implementation capacity building, whereas respondents from bilateral/multilateral agencies gave significantly lower ratings. Employees of ministries/ministerial departments/implementation agencies gave the highest ratings for the importance of the WBG being involved in citizen engagement capacity building, whereas respondents from bilateral/multilateral agencies gave significantly lower ratings.

(1-"Not effective at all", 10-"Very effective")

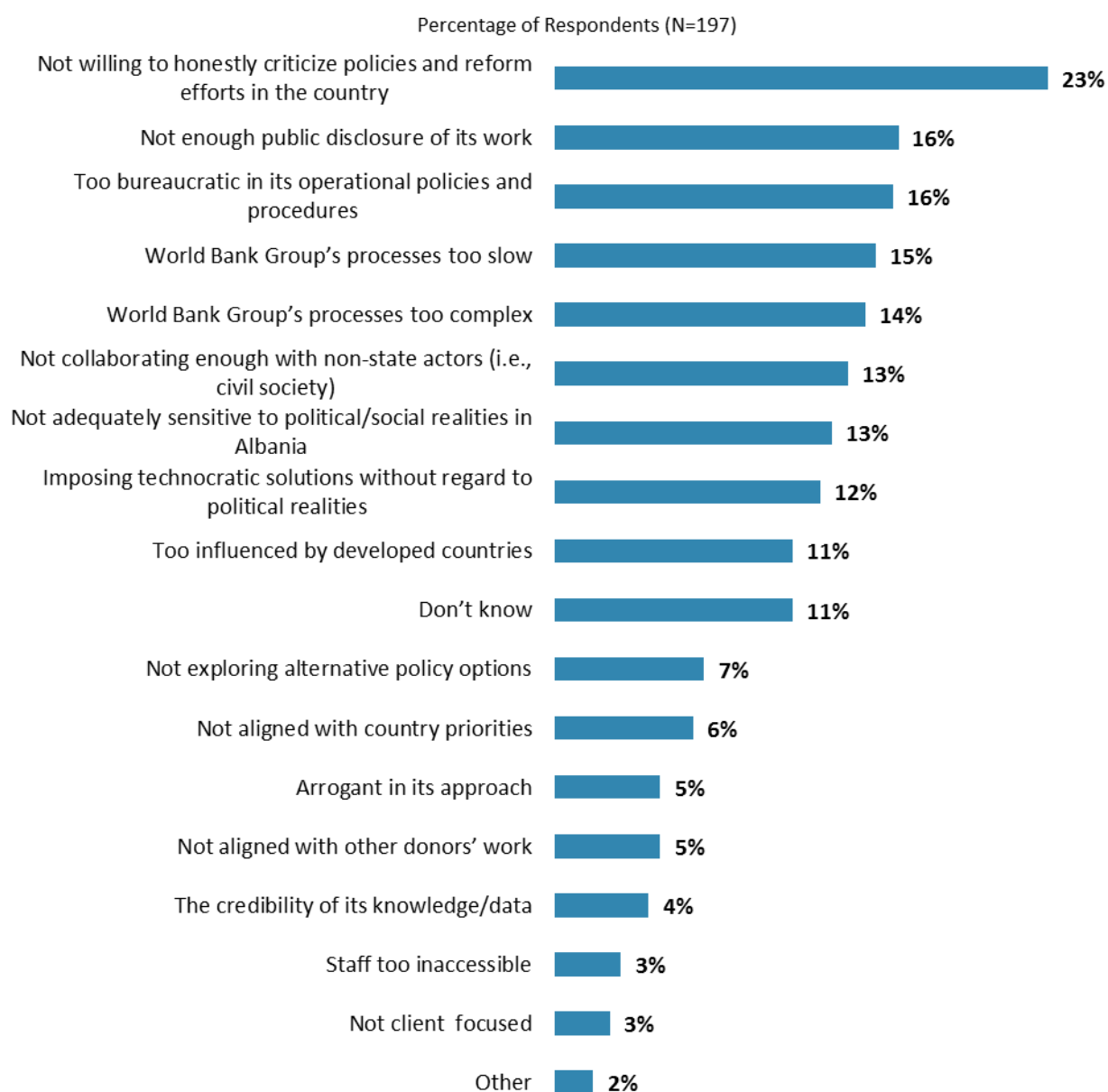

Greatest Weakness

- Respondents from independent government institutions and the media were significantly more likely to indicate that the WBG's greatest weakness was "not willing to honestly criticize policies and reform efforts in the country" compared to respondents from other stakeholder groups.
- Respondents in the FY'12 country survey* indicated that the WBG's greatest weaknesses were "not willing to honestly criticize policies and reform efforts in the country" (24%) and being "too bureaucratic in its operational policies and procedures" (24%).



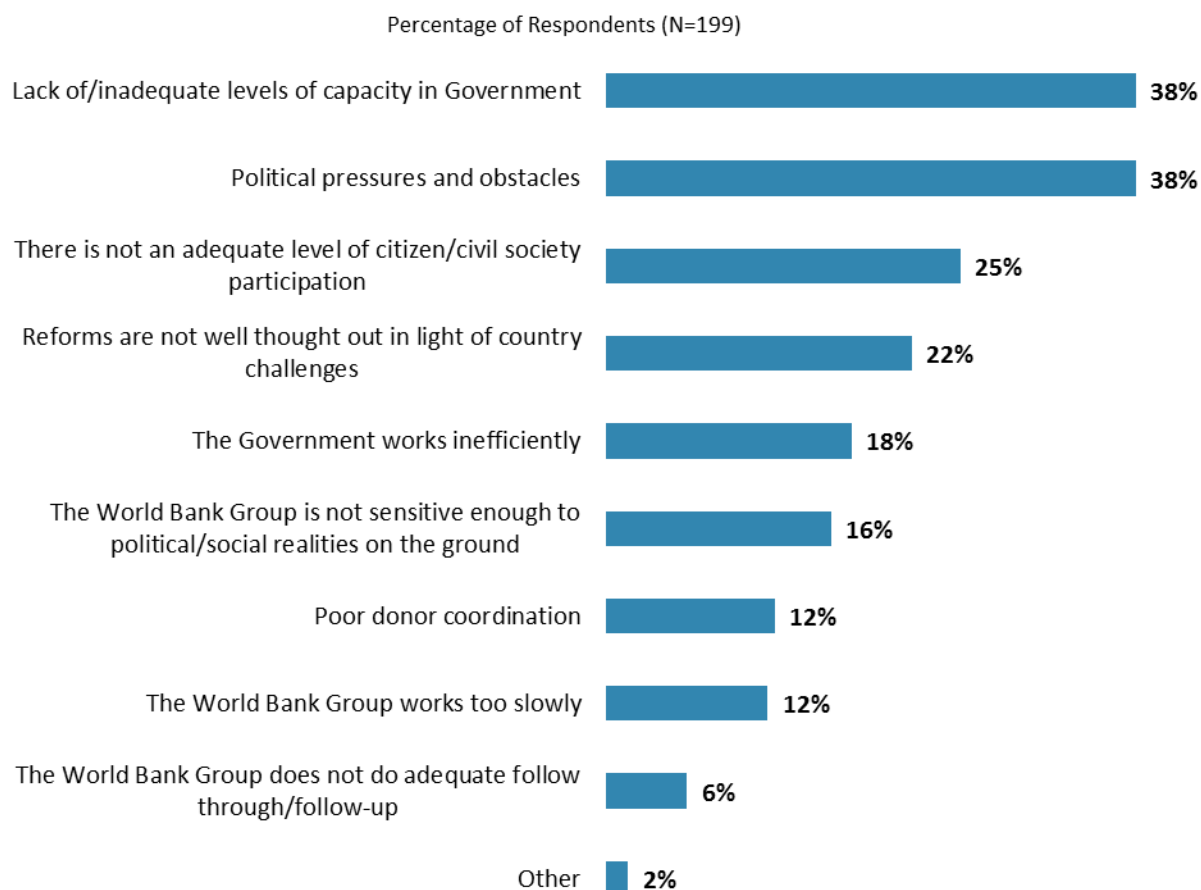

Attributing Slow or Failed Reform Efforts

- Respondents in the FY'12 country survey* attributed slow or failed reform efforts to political pressures and obstacles (42%) and to the Government working inefficiently (36%).

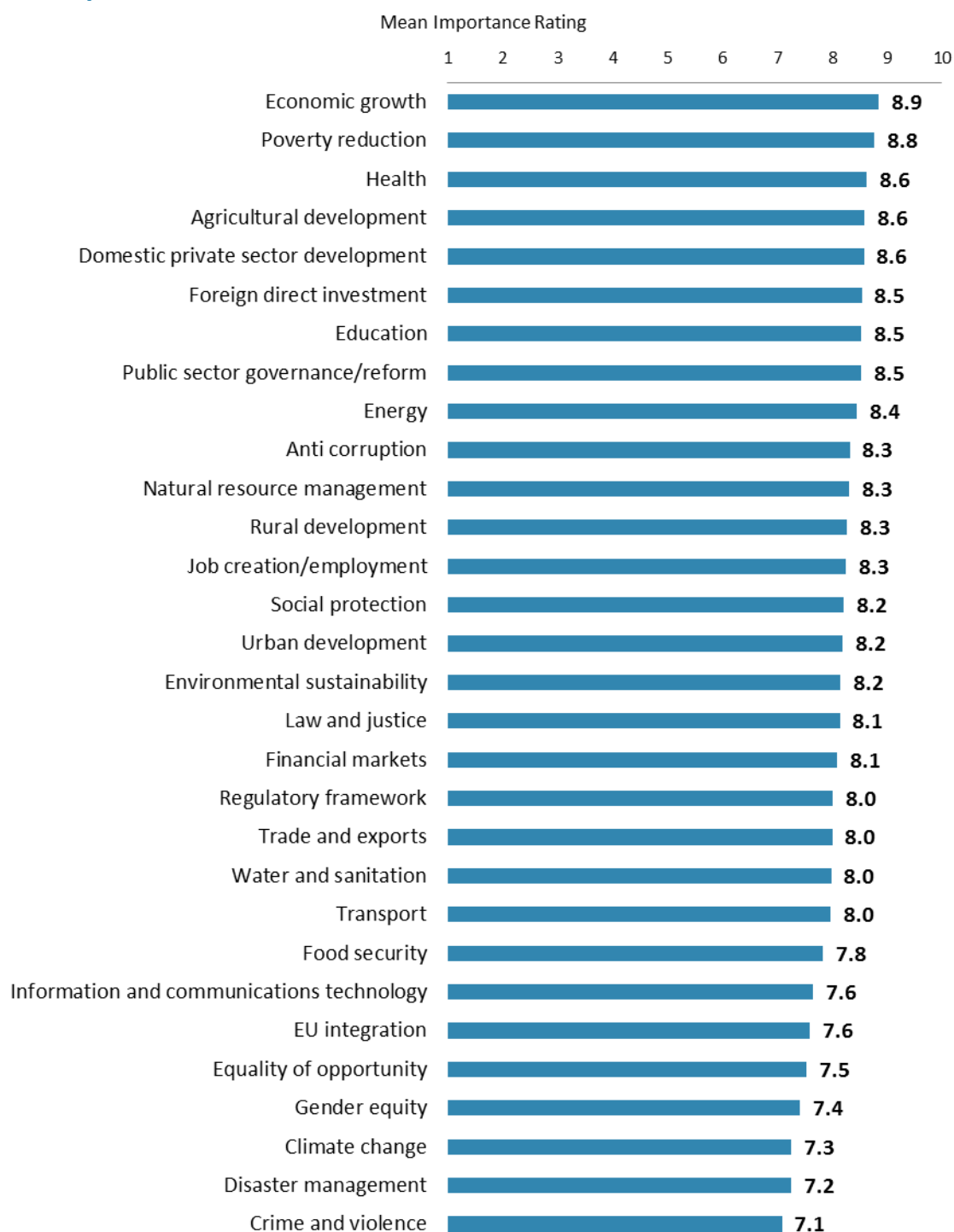

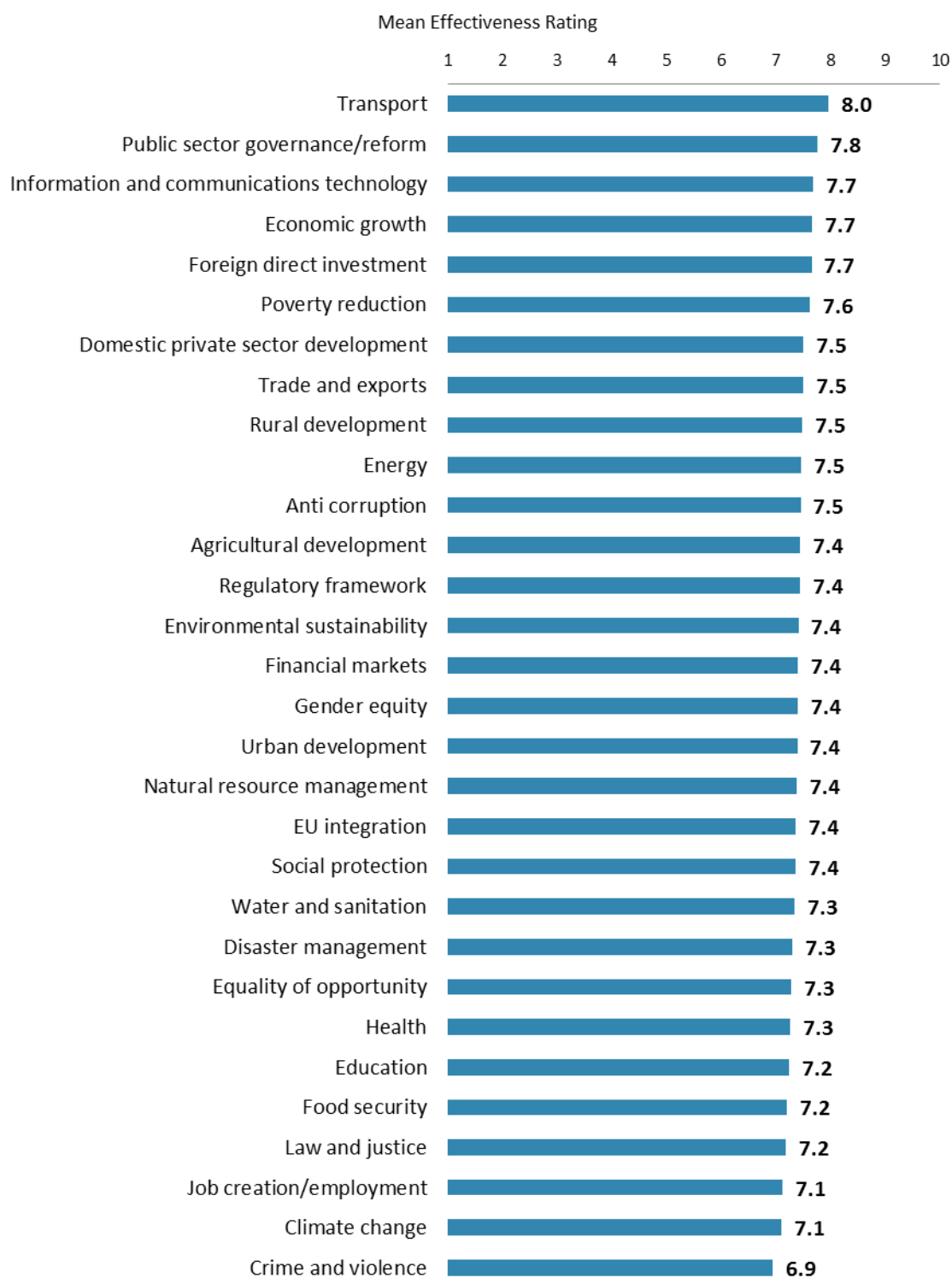

Sectoral Importance (continued)

- There were statistically significant stakeholder group differences among eight of these thirty areas of development. For the most part, respondents from independent government institutions tended to give the highest importance ratings across these areas, whereas respondents from bilateral/multilateral agencies tended to give significantly lower importance ratings. Ratings across all areas by stakeholder groups can be found in Appendix B (see page 71). Those areas with significant stakeholder group differences were:
 - “Crime and violence”;
 - “Law and justice”;
 - “Urban development”;
 - “Environmental sustainability”;
 - “Trade and exports”;
 - “Rural development”;
 - “EU integration”; and
 - “Food security”.
- Respondents who collaborate with the WBG gave significantly lower importance ratings for “Anti-corruption”, “Information and communications technology”, and “EU integration” compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG. Ratings across all areas by collaboration can be found in Appendix D (see page 107).
- Respondents from the education sector gave statistically similar importance ratings for “Education” compared to respondents from other sectors.

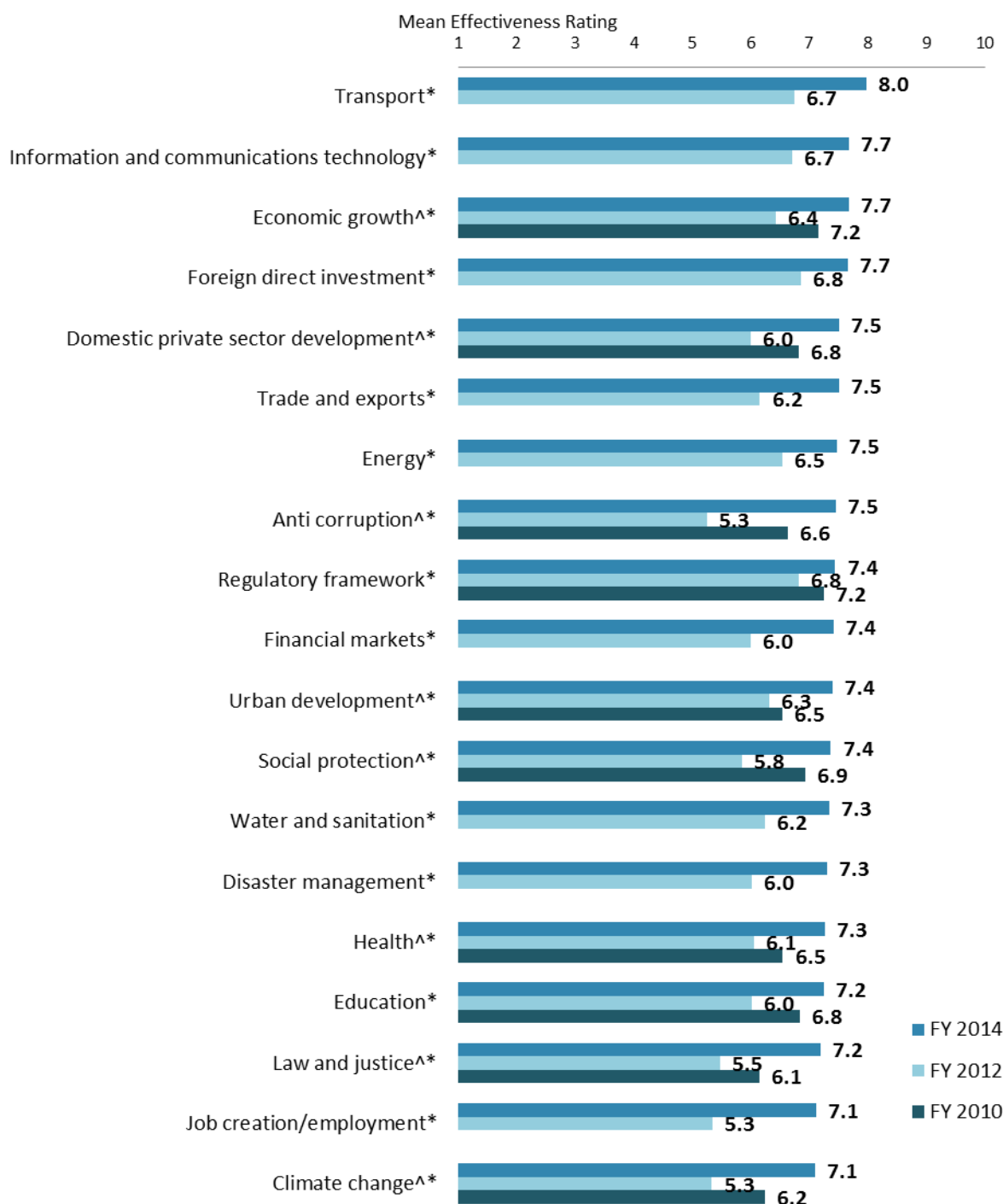
Specific Areas of Effectiveness (continued)

- There were statistically significant differences across stakeholder groups in their ratings of the WBG's effectiveness across eight of these thirty development areas in Albania. For the most part, respondents from CSOs tended to give the highest ratings for the WBG's effectiveness, whereas respondents from the media tended to give significantly lower ratings. Ratings across all areas by stakeholder groups can be found in Appendix B (see page 71). Those areas with significant stakeholder group differences were:
 - "Anti-corruption";
 - "Urban development";
 - "Domestic private sector development";
 - "Foreign direct investment";
 - "Trade and exports";
 - "Economic growth";
 - "Energy"; and
 - "Education".
- Respondents who collaborate with the WBG gave significantly lower effectiveness ratings for "Anti-corruption" and "Information and communications technology" compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG. Ratings across all areas by collaboration can be found in Appendix D (see page 107).
- Respondents from the education sector gave significantly higher effectiveness ratings for "Education" compared to respondents from other sectors. Ratings across all areas by sectors can be found in Appendix E (see page 122).
- Note in the Appendix on the sectoral effectiveness (Appendix A, page 63) that primarily informed stakeholders responded to this question.

VI. Sectoral Importance and Effectiveness (continued)

Specific Areas of Effectiveness (continued)

- Respondents in this year's country survey gave significantly higher ratings for the WBG's effectiveness across nearly all areas that could be compared to respondents from the FY'12 and FY'10 surveys. Statistically significant differences are noted in the chart.

Drivers of Effectiveness

To determine the key drivers of respondents' ratings of the World Bank Group's overall effectiveness and ratings of its ability to help achieve development results in Albania, bivariate correlational analyses were conducted using respondents' ratings of the thirty specific areas of effectiveness.

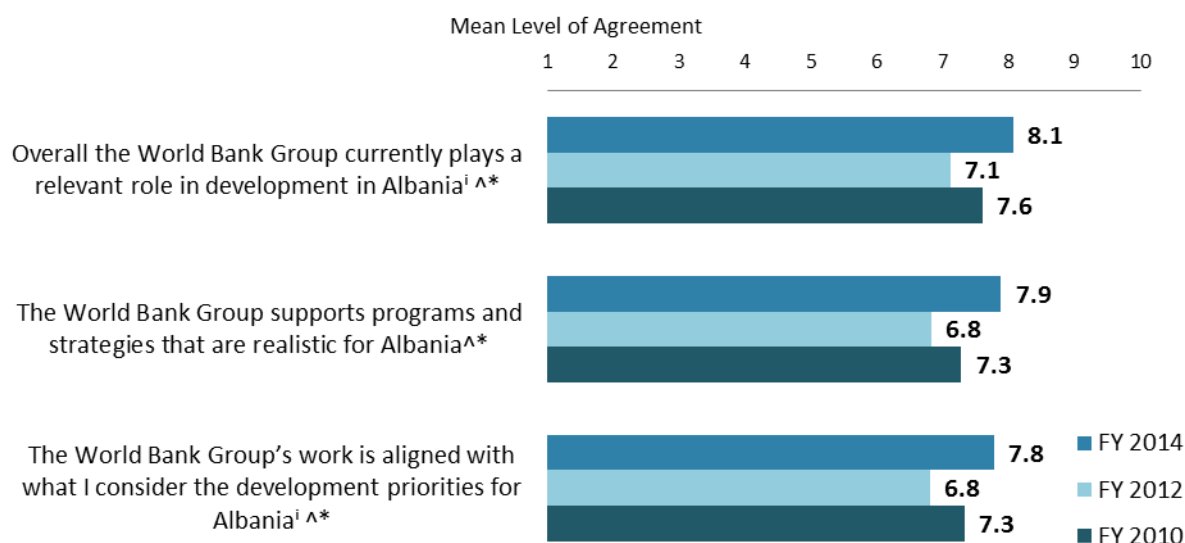
Correlational analyses, however, are not able to tell us exactly what is causing respondents' ratings of the WBG's overall effectiveness or ratings of its ability to help achieve development results. Rather, these analyses tell us that as ratings of effectiveness in one area increase, respondents' ratings of the WBG's overall effectiveness increase, or as ratings of effectiveness in one area increase, ratings of the WBG's ability to help achieve development results increase. Thus, it can be inferred that respondents' perceptions of effectiveness in one specific area are related to, or drive, respondents' perceptions of the WBG's overall effectiveness or perceptions of the WBG's ability to help achieve development results.

- Overall Effectiveness: Those specific areas with the highest Pearson Product-Moment correlations were determined to be the most closely related to perceptions of the overall effectiveness of the World Bank (IBRD) and the IFC, suggesting that ratings of effectiveness in those specific areas are drivers of perceptions of the World Bank's and IFC's overall effectiveness in Albania. The areas determined to be key drivers from these analyses were:
 - The World Bank's effectiveness at social protection;
 - The World Bank's effectiveness at food security;
 - The World Bank's effectiveness at equality of opportunity; and
 - The World Bank's effectiveness at anti-corruption.
 - The IFC's effectiveness at urban development;
 - The IFC's effectiveness at crime and violence; and
 - The IFC's effectiveness at trade and exports.
- Achieving Development Results: Those specific areas with the highest Pearson Product-Moment correlations were determined to be the most closely related to perceptions of the WBG's ability to help achieve development results in Albania, suggesting that ratings of effectiveness in those specific areas are drivers of perceptions of the WBG's ability to help achieve development results. The areas determined to be key drivers from these analyses were:
 - The WBG's effectiveness at equality of opportunity;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at health;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at foreign direct investment;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at education; and
 - The WBG's effectiveness at rural development.

VII. How the World Bank Group Operates

The World Bank Group's Work in Albania

- Respondents in this year's country survey had significantly *higher* levels of agreement with all three statements about the WBG's work in Albania compared to respondents in the FY'12 and FY'10 country surveys.
- Respondents across all stakeholder groups, geographic locations, and levels of collaboration with the WBG had statistically similar levels of agreement with these statements (including the indicator questions).



"To what extent do you agree with the following statements about the World Bank Group's work in Albania?" (1-"Strongly disagree", 10-"Strongly agree")

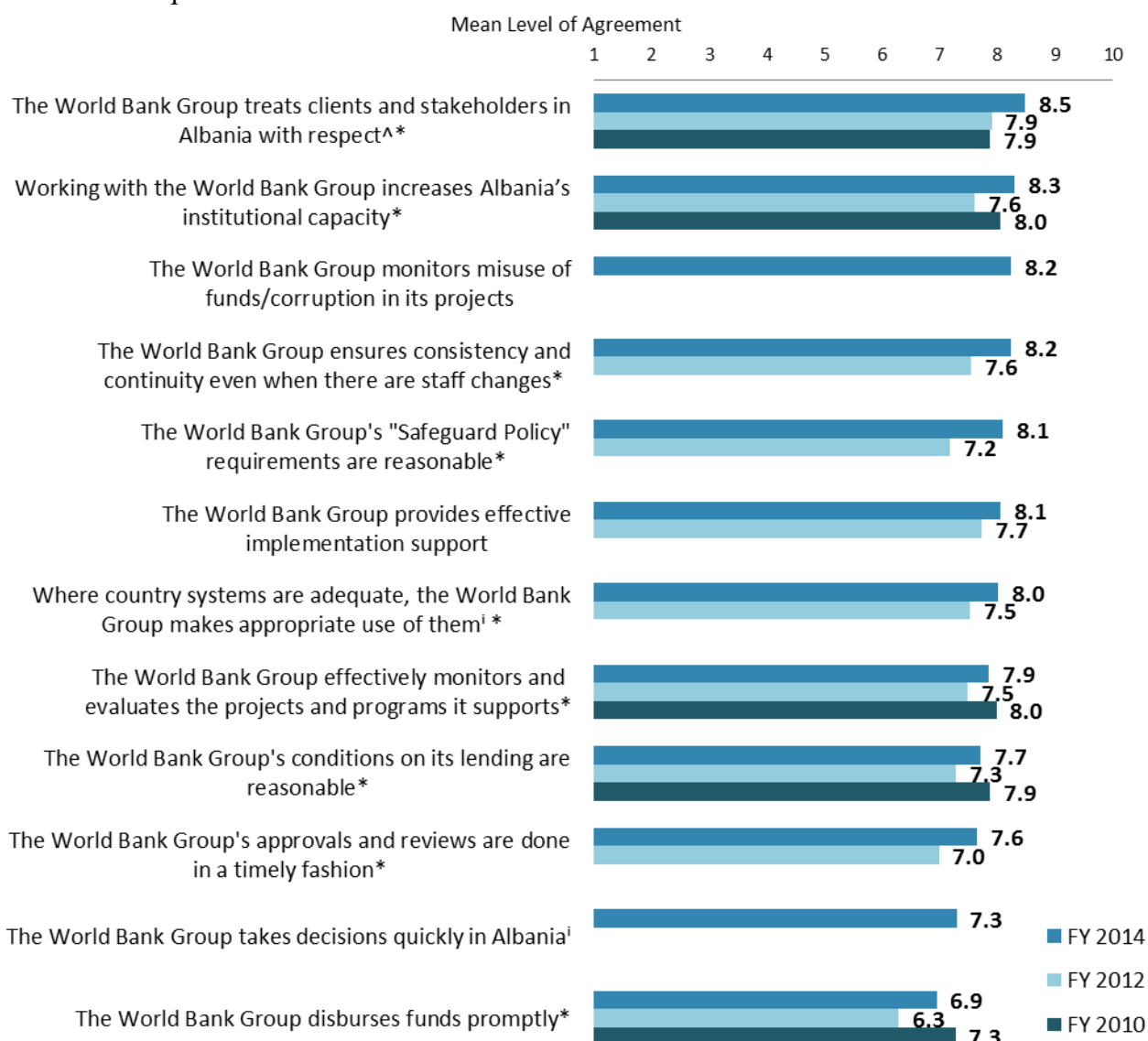

VII. How the World Bank Group Operates (continued)

Overall Perceptions

- Respondents in this year's country survey had significantly *higher* levels of agreement with nearly all statements that could be compared to respondents from the FY'12 country survey and some statements that could be compared to respondents from the FY'10 country survey. Statistically significant differences are noted in the chart.
- Respondents across all stakeholder groups, geographic locations, and levels of collaboration with the WBG had statistically similar levels of agreement with the indicator questions.

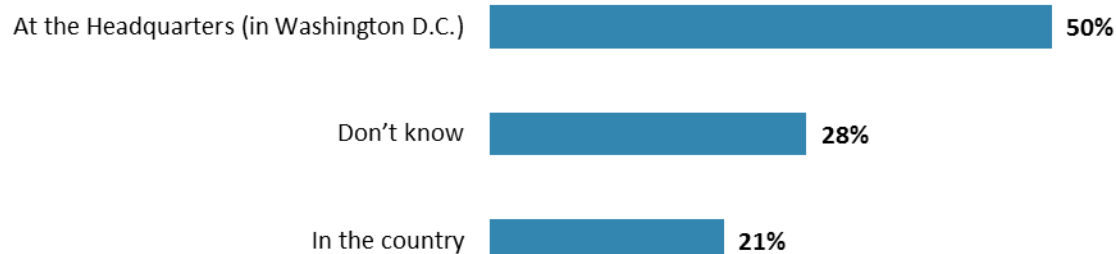

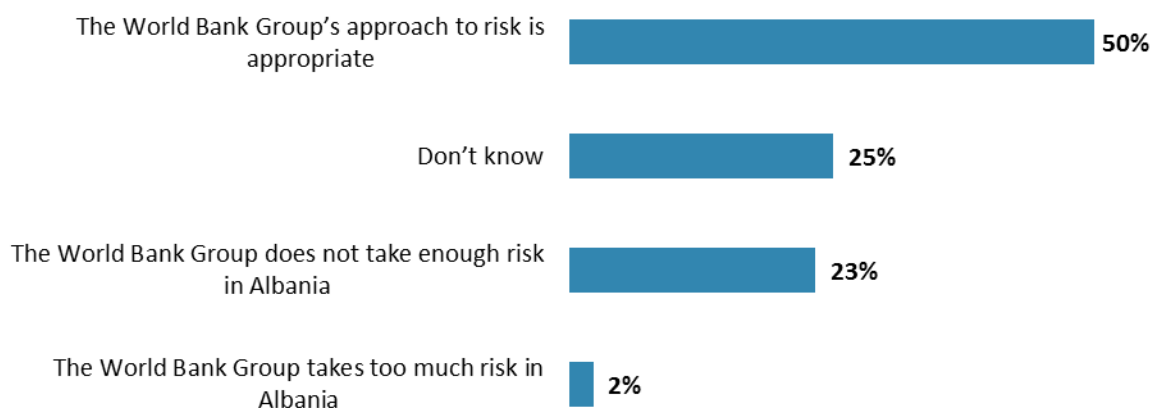
Percentage of Respondents (N=202)

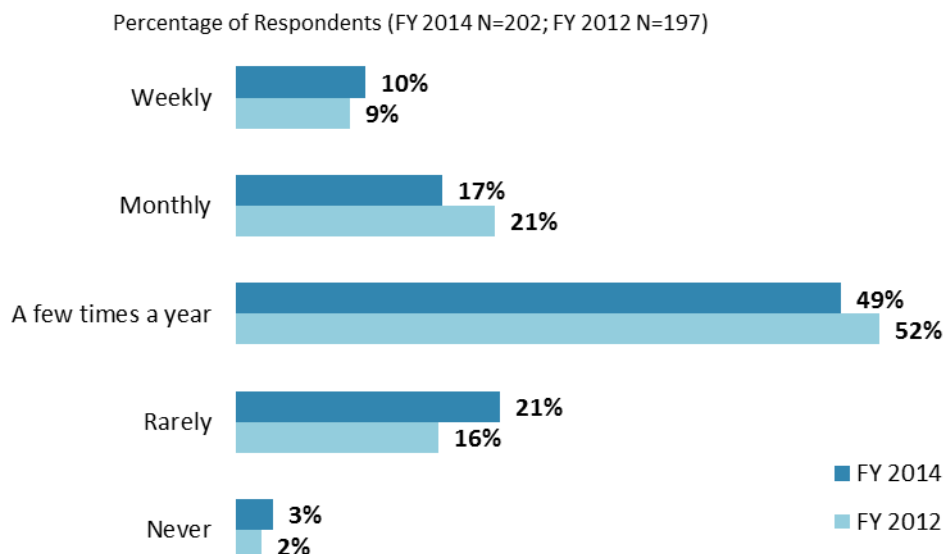

Frequency of Consulting World Bank Group's Knowledge Work and Activities

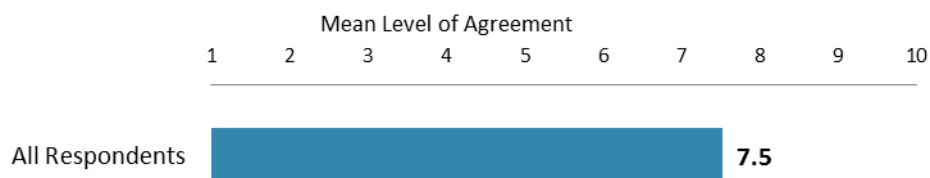

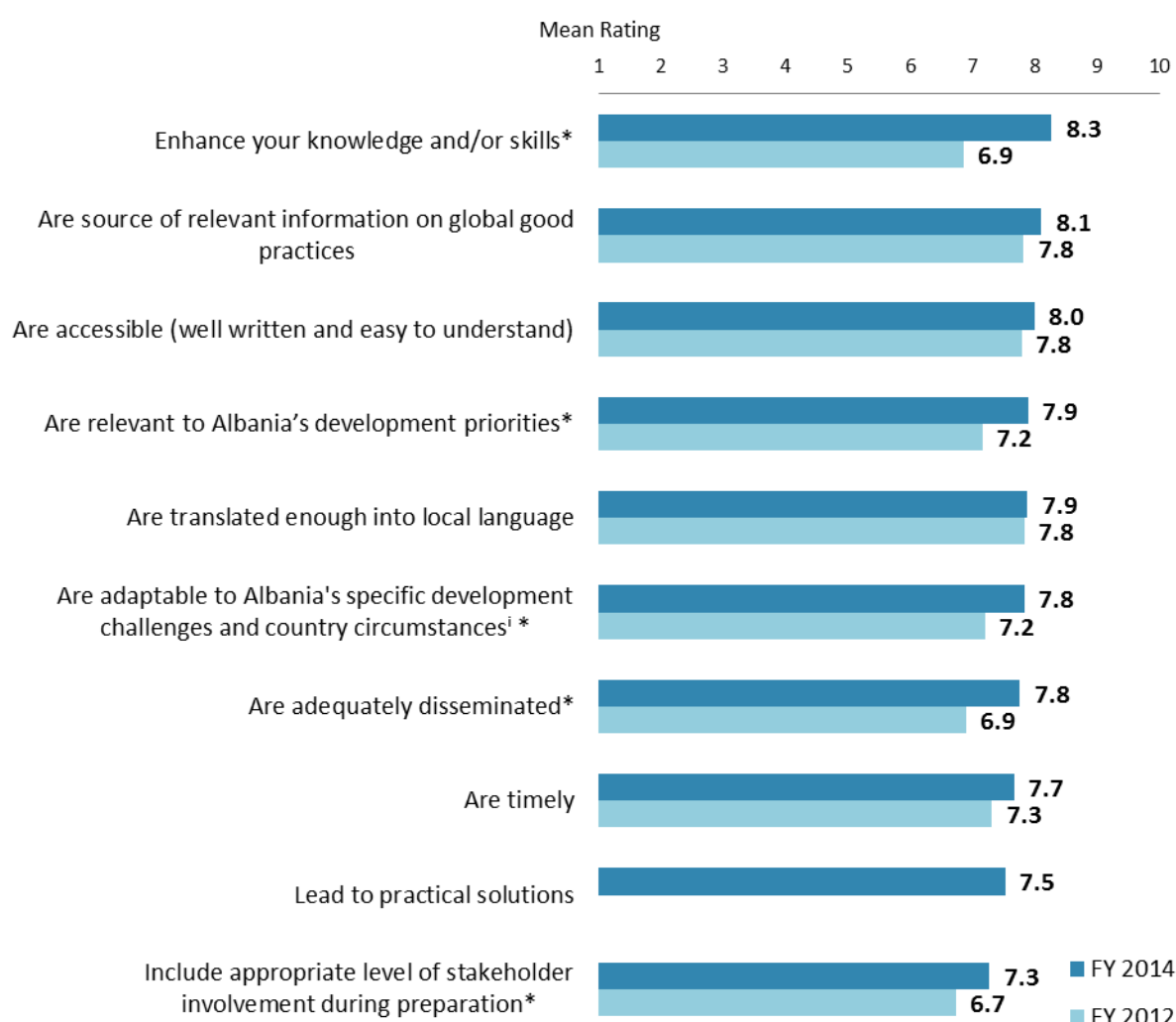

(1-"To no degree at all", 10-"To a very significant degree")

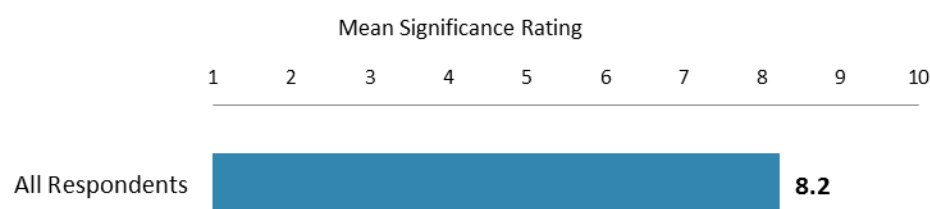

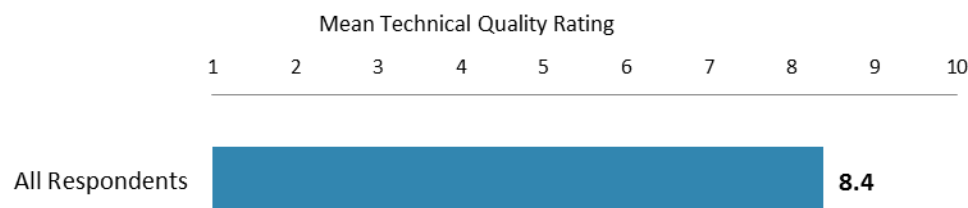

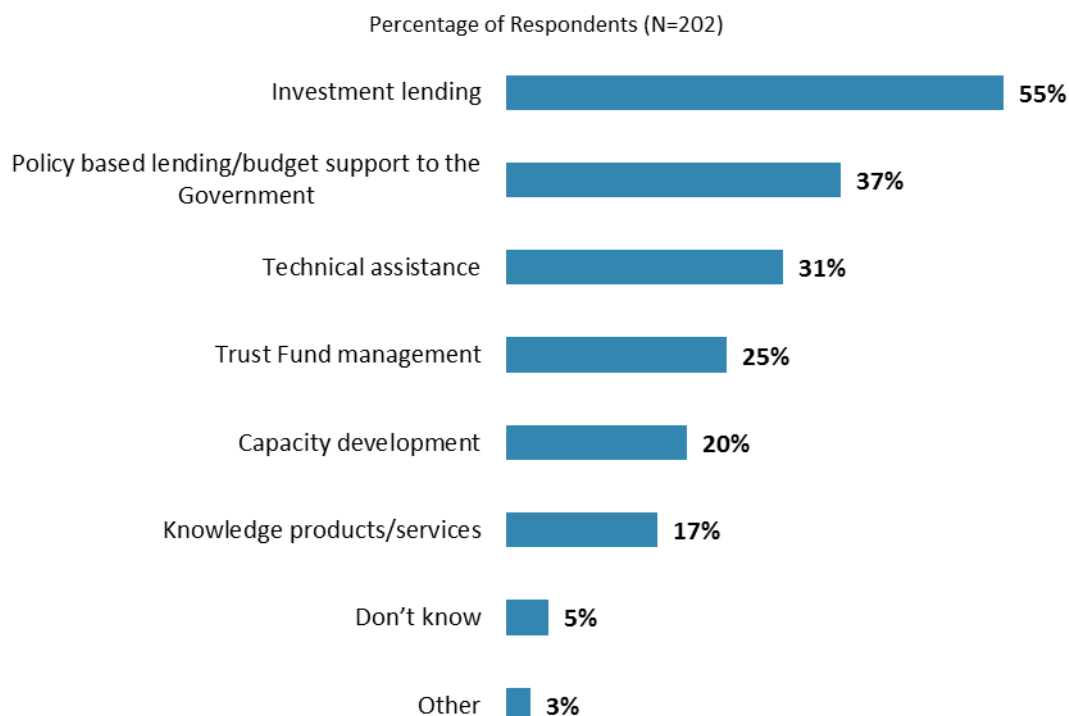


"Overall, how would you rate the technical quality of the World Bank Group's knowledge work and activities?" (1-"Very low technical quality", 10-"Very high technical quality")

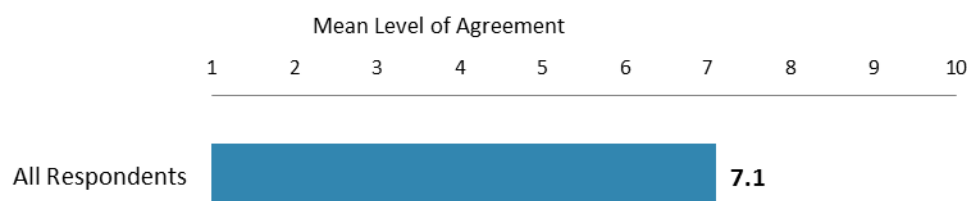


“Which World Bank Group's instruments do you believe are the MOST effective in reducing poverty in Albania? (Choose no more than TWO)”

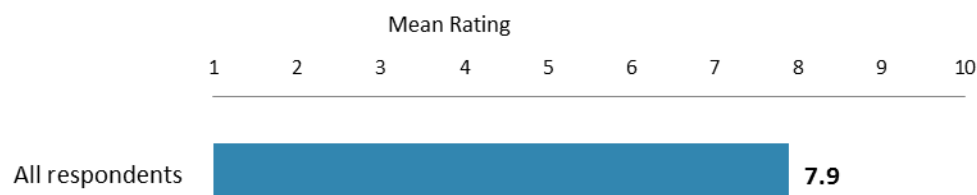

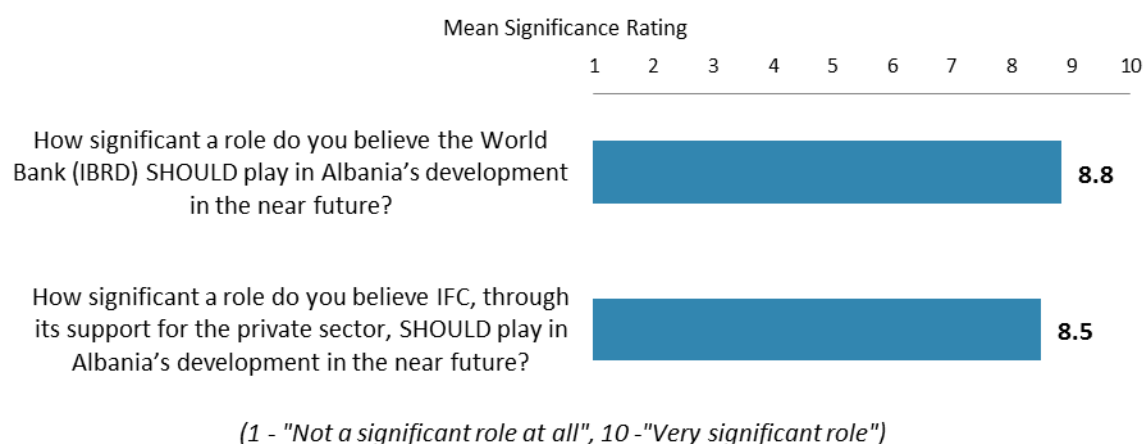


"To what extent do you believe the World Bank Group measures and corrects its work in real time in Albania?" (1-"To no degree at all", 10-"To a very significant degree")

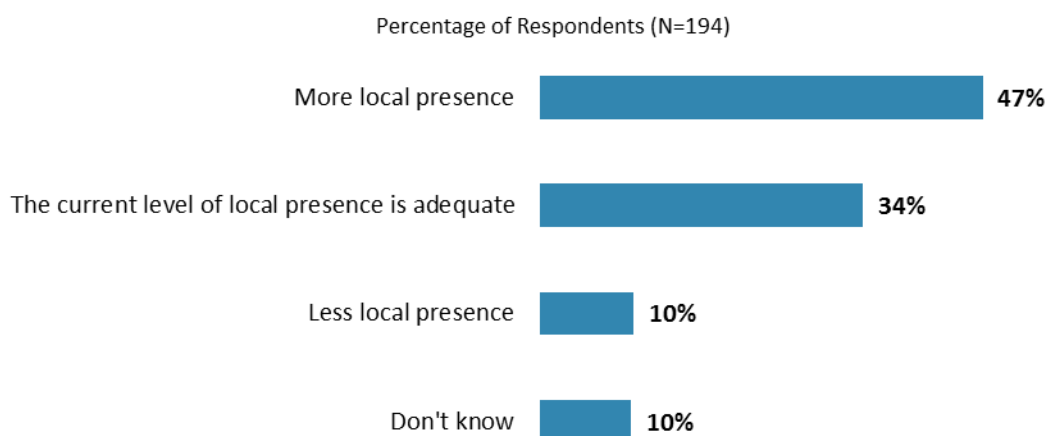

Role Significance

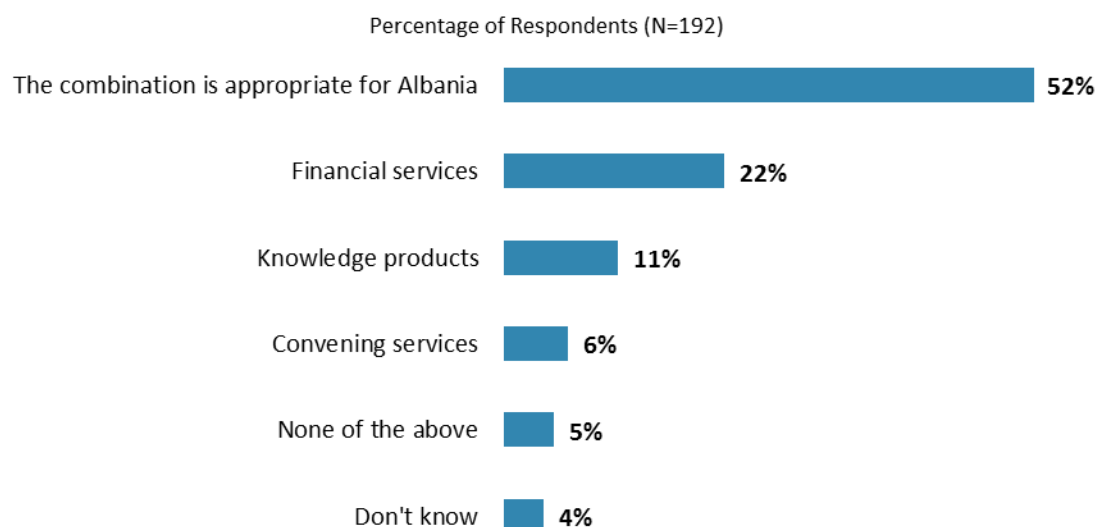

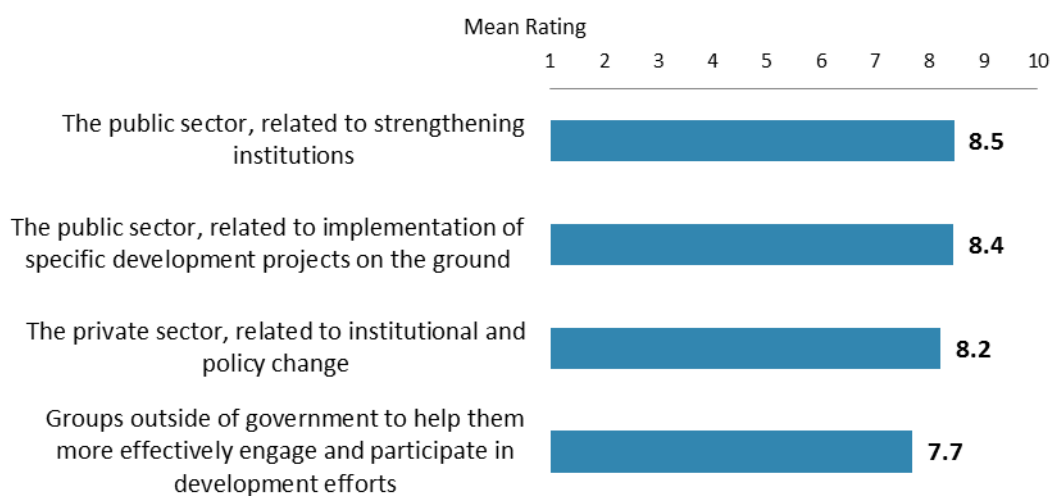

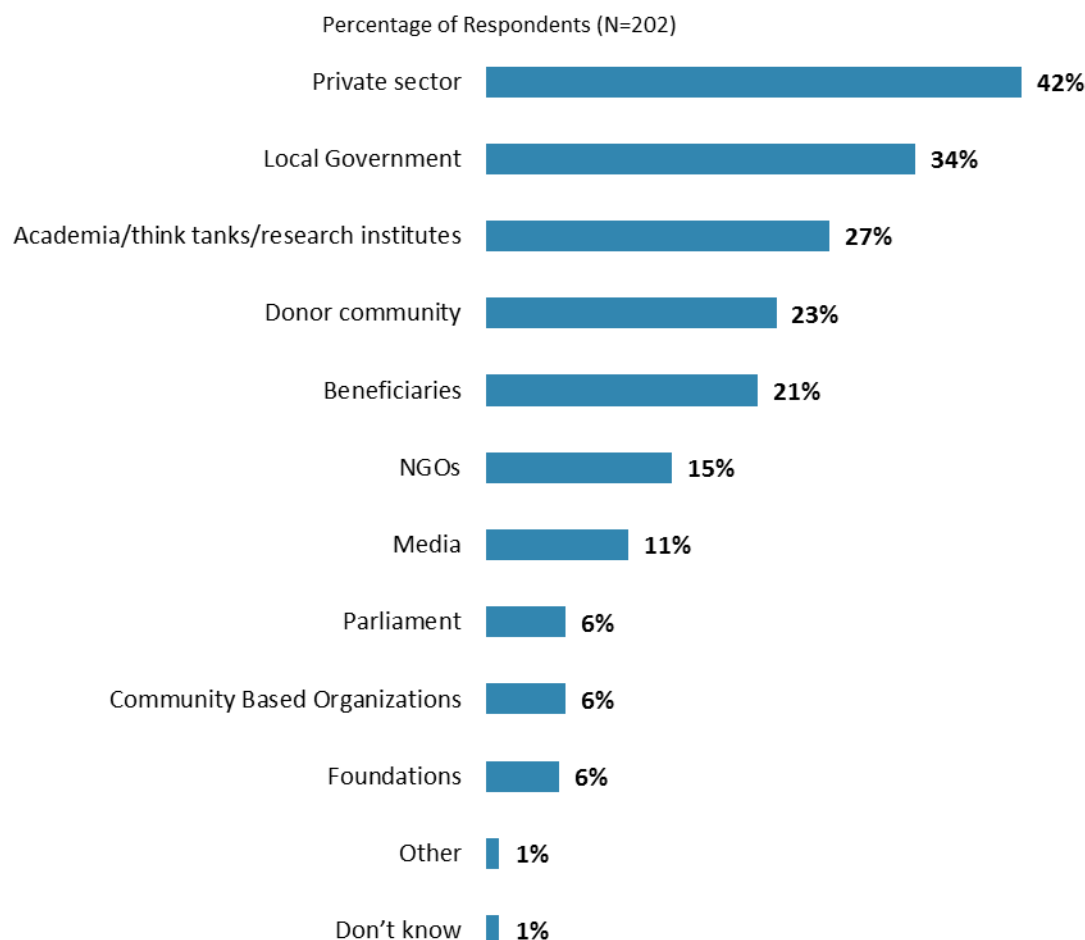


"The World Bank Group can provide capacity building support in a number of ways in Albania. To which degree would Albania benefit, if capacity building were to support...?"

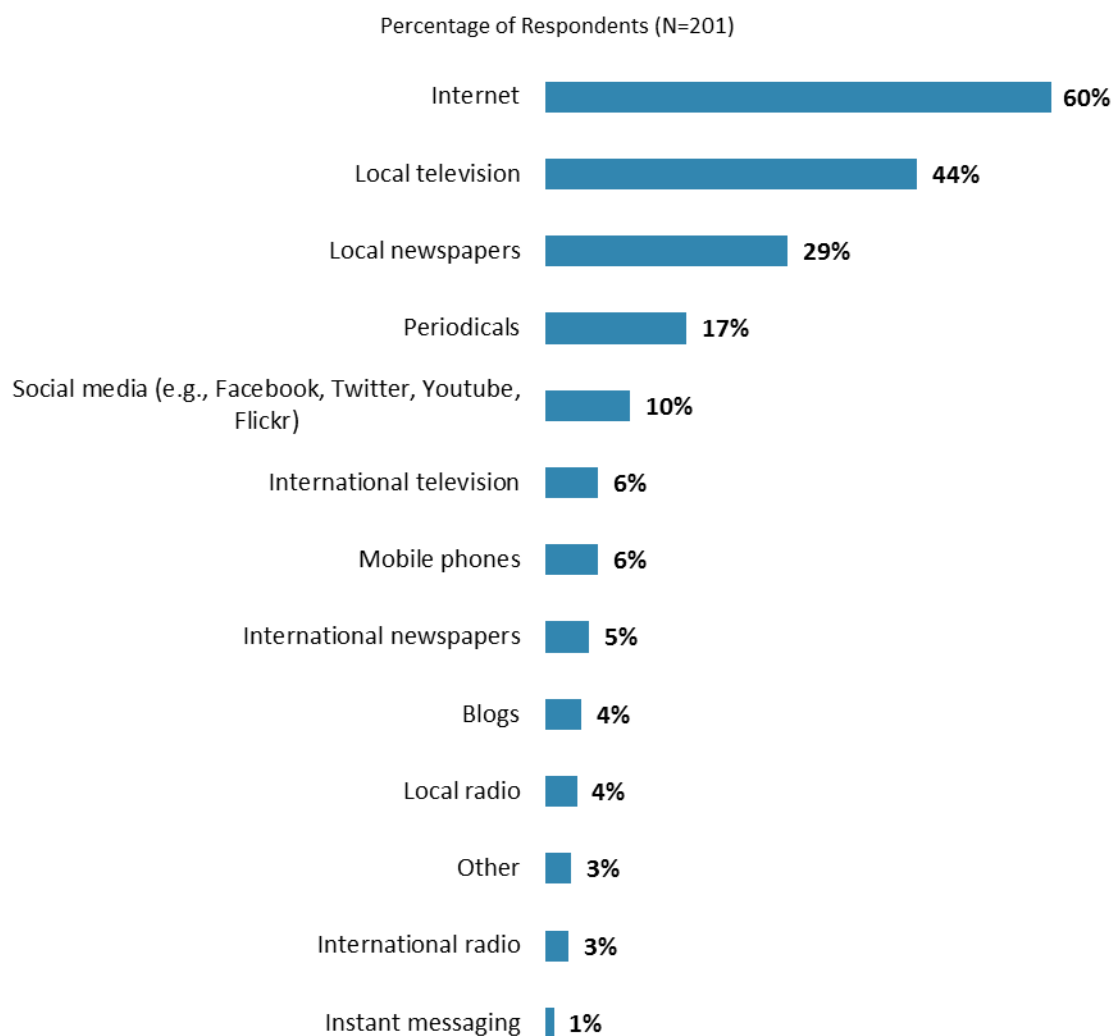

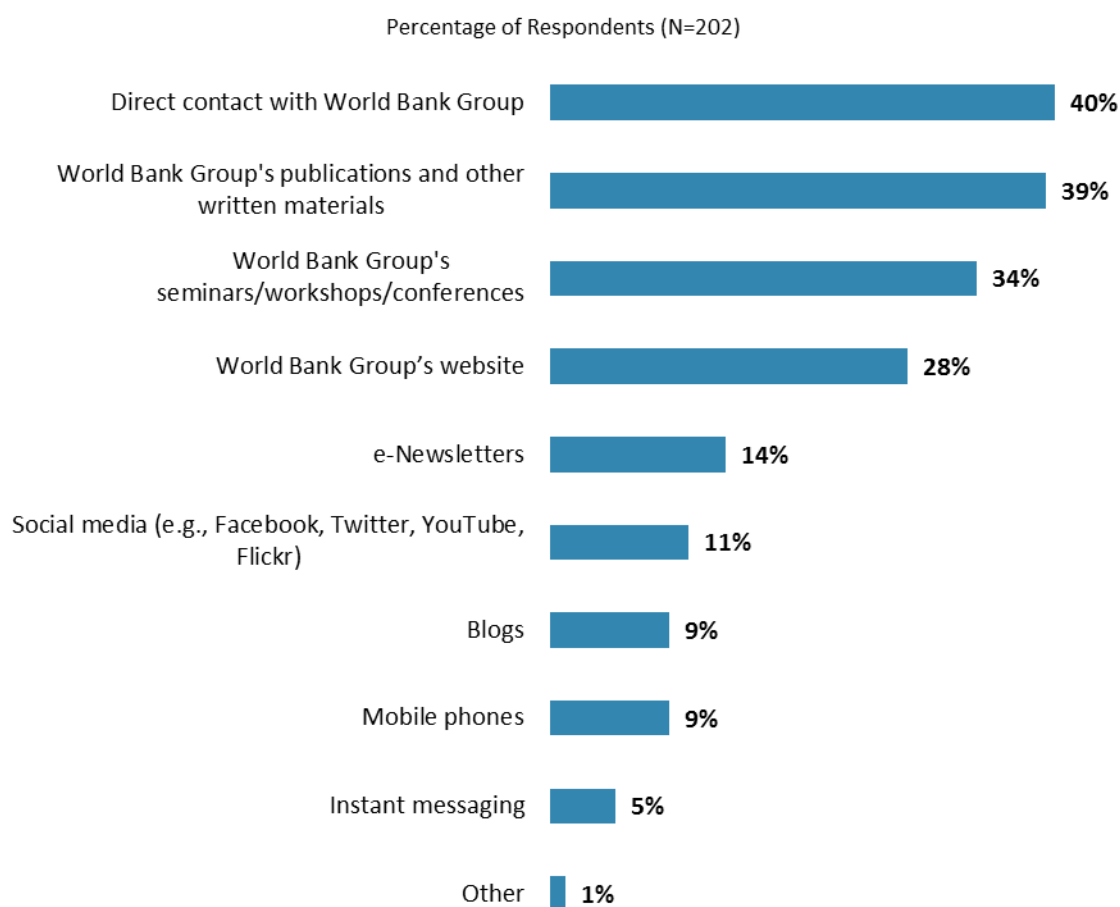
General Information Sources

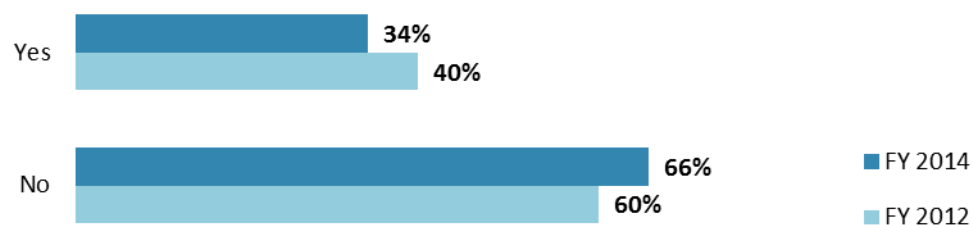


"How would you prefer to receive information from the World Bank Group?

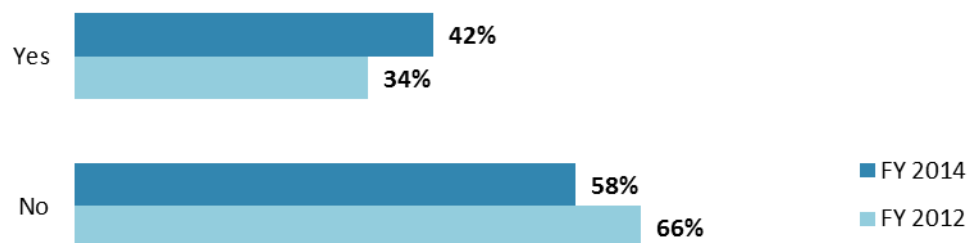

"Have you requested information from the World Bank Group on its activities in the past year?"

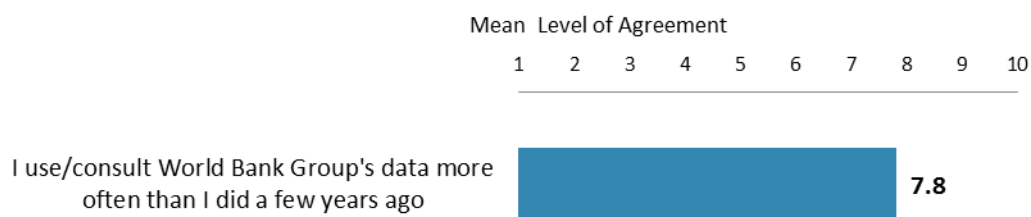

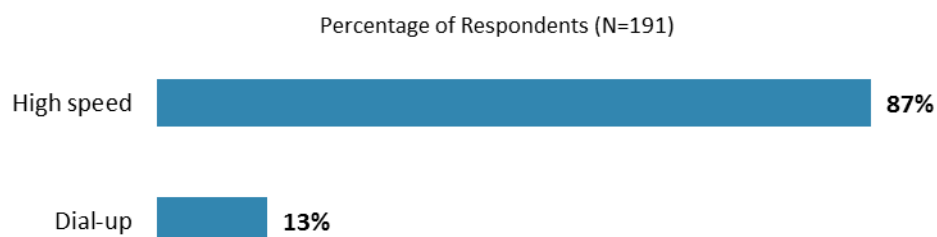
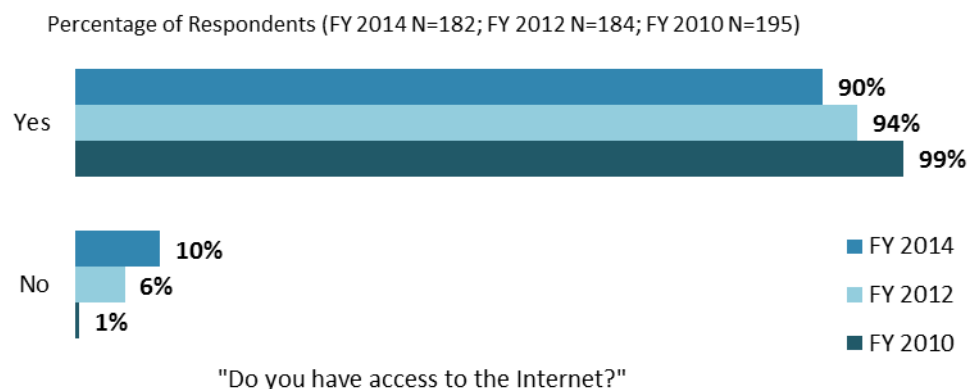

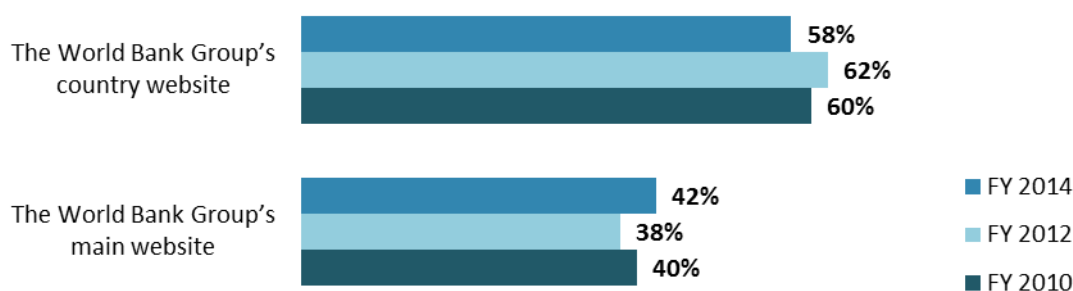
Website Usage

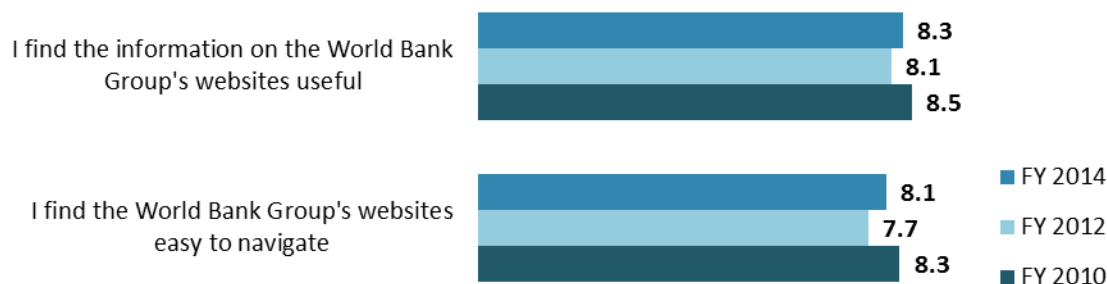

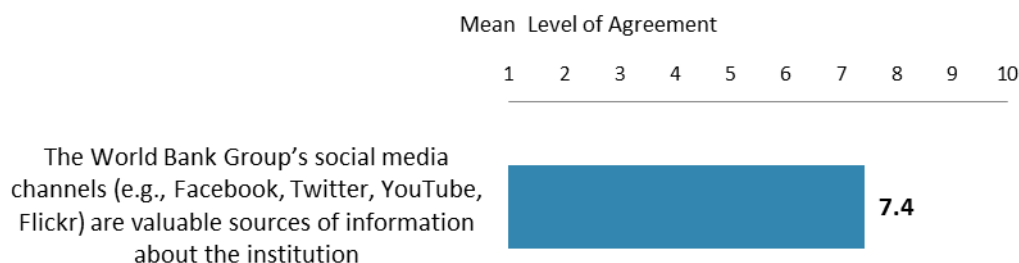

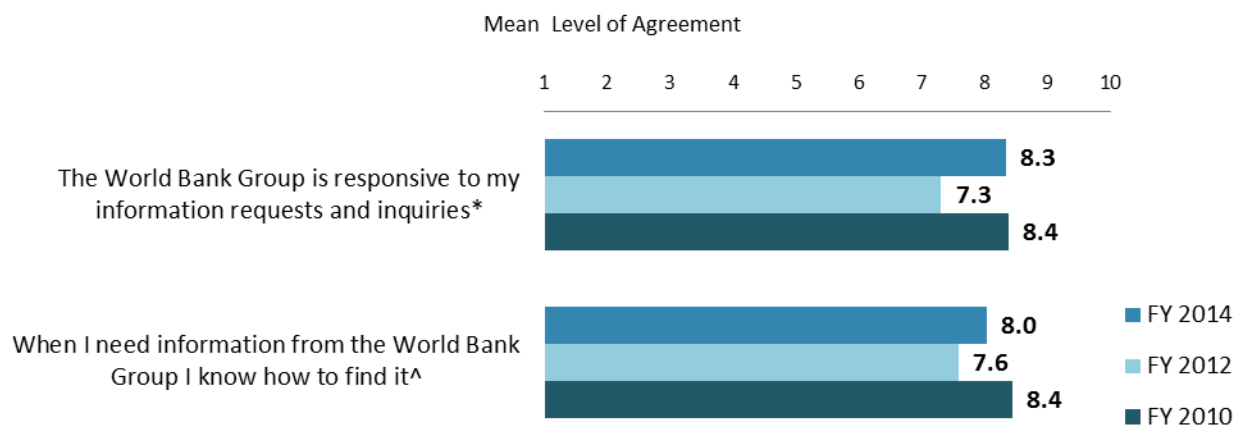
