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I. Objectives

This survey was designed to achieve the following objectives:

- Assist the World Bank Group in gaining a better understanding of how stakeholders in El Salvador perceive the Bank Group;
- Obtain systematic feedback from stakeholders in El Salvador regarding:
 - Their views regarding the general environment in El Salvador;
 - Their overall attitudes toward the World Bank Group in El Salvador;
 - Overall impressions of the World Bank Group's effectiveness and results, knowledge work and activities, and communication and information sharing in El Salvador;
 - Perceptions of the World Bank Group's future role in El Salvador.
- Use data to help inform El Salvador country team's strategy.

II. Methodology

In March-April 2014, 135 stakeholders of the World Bank Group in El Salvador were invited to provide their opinions on the WBG's work in the country by participating in a country opinion survey. Participants were drawn from the office of the President; the office of the Prime Minister; office of a minister; office of a parliamentarian; ministries, ministerial departments, or implementation agencies; consultants/contractors working on WBG-supported projects/programs; project management units (PMUs) overseeing implementation of a project; local government officials; bilateral and multilateral agencies; private sector organizations; private foundations; the financial sector/private banks; NGOs; community based organizations; the media; independent government institutions; trade unions; faith-based groups; academia/research institutes/think tanks; judiciary branch; and other organizations. A total of 97 stakeholders participated in the survey (72% response rate).

Respondents received questionnaires via courier and returned them accordingly. Respondents were asked about: general issues facing El Salvador; their overall attitudes toward the WBG; the WBG's effectiveness and results; the WBG's knowledge work and activities; working with the WBG; the WBG's future role in El Salvador; and the WBG's communication and information sharing in El Salvador.

Every country that engages in the Country Opinion Survey must include specific indicator questions that will be aggregated for the World Bank Group's annual Corporate Scorecard. These questions are identified throughout the survey report.

- A. General Issues Facing El Salvador: Respondents were asked to indicate whether El Salvador is headed in the right direction, what they thought were the top three most important development priorities in the country, which areas would contribute most to reducing poverty and generating economic growth in El Salvador, and how "shared prosperity" would be best achieved.
- B. Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group (WBG): Respondents were asked to rate their familiarity with the WBG and other regional development banks, their effectiveness in El Salvador, WBG staff preparedness to help El Salvador solve its development challenges, , their agreement with various statements regarding the WBG's work, and the extent to which the WBG is an effective development partner.

II. Methodology (continued)

B. Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group (WBG) (continued):

Respondents were asked to indicate the WBG's greatest values and weaknesses, the most effective instruments in helping reduce poverty in El Salvador, in which sectoral areas the WBG should focus most of its resources (financial and knowledge services), and to what reasons respondents attributed failed or slow reform efforts. Respondents were also asked to respond to a few questions about capacity building and whether they believe the World Bank Group should have more or less local presence.

C. World Bank Group's Effectiveness and Results: Respondents were asked to rate the extent to which the WBG's work helps achieve development results in El Salvador, the extent to which the WBG meets El Salvador's needs for knowledge services and financial instruments, the importance for the WBG to be involved in thirty one development areas, and the WBG's level of effectiveness across twenty-eight development areas, such as education, crime and violence, public sector governance/reform, poverty reduction, and economic growth.

D. The World Bank Group's Knowledge Work and Activities: Respondents were asked to indicate how frequently they consult WBG's knowledge work and activities and to rate the effectiveness and quality of the WBG's knowledge work and activities, including how significant of a contribution it makes to development results and its technical quality. Respondents were also asked about the WBG reports, including if they read/consulted the most recent LAC Flagship Report, whether they raised substantive new information, and whether they provided them with useful information in terms of work they do.

E. Working with the World Bank Group: Respondents were asked to rate WBG's technical assistance/advisory work's contribution to solving development challenges and their level of agreement with a series of statements regarding working with the WBG, such as the WBG's "Safeguard Policy" requirements being reasonable, and disbursing funds promptly. They were also asked to indicate whether they think the World Bank Group takes enough risks.

F. The Future Role of the World Bank Group in El Salvador: Respondents were asked to indicate what the WBG should do to make itself of greater value in El Salvador, and which services the Bank should offer more of in the country. They were asked whether WBG has moved to the right direction, and the future role international development cooperation should play in El Salvador.

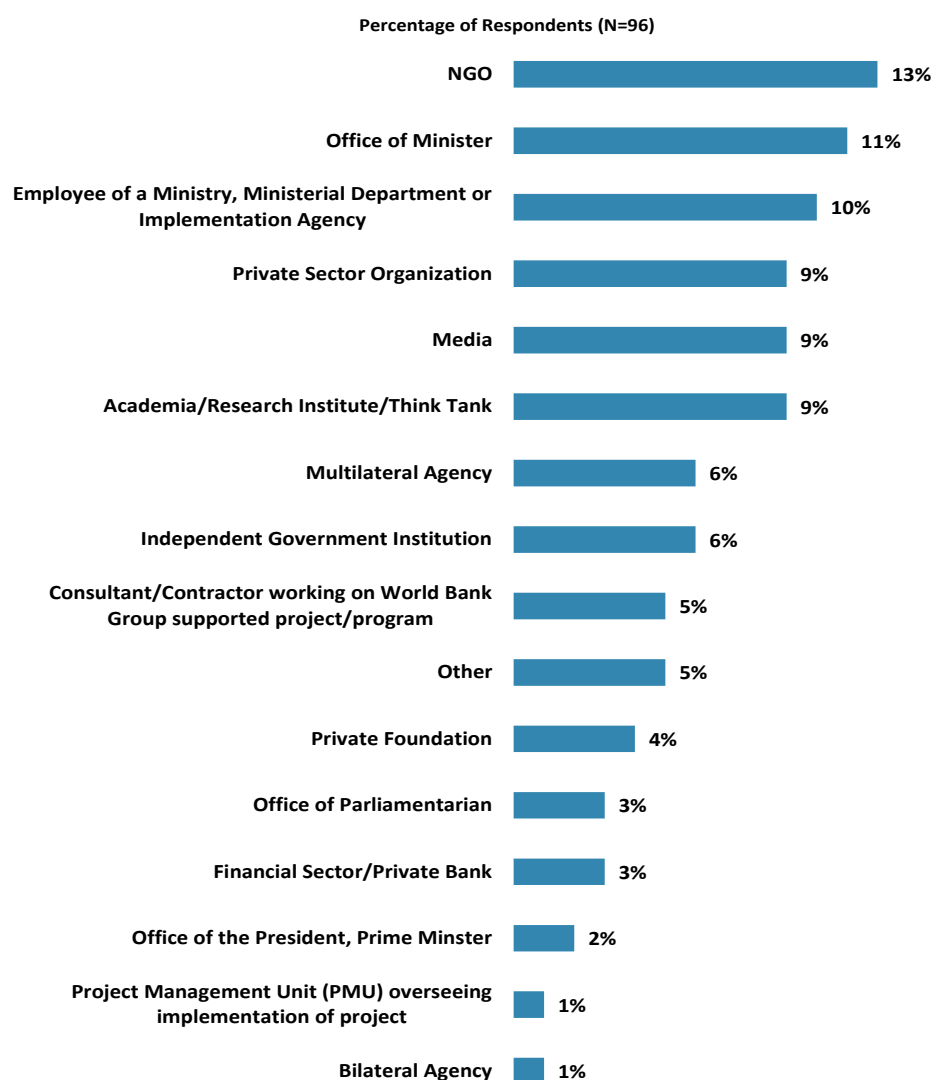
G. Communication and Information Sharing: Respondents were asked to indicate how they get information about economic and social development issues, how they prefer to receive information from the WBG, and their usage and evaluation of the WBG's websites. Respondents were also asked about their awareness of the WBG's Access to Information policy. Respondents were asked to rate WBG's responsiveness to information requests, value of its social media channels, and levels of easiness to find information they needed.

H. Background Information: Respondents were asked to indicate their current position, specialization, whether they professionally collaborate with the WBG, their exposure to the WBG in El Salvador, which WBG agencies they work with, whether IFC and the Bank work well together, and their geographic location.

III. Demographics of the Sample

Current Position

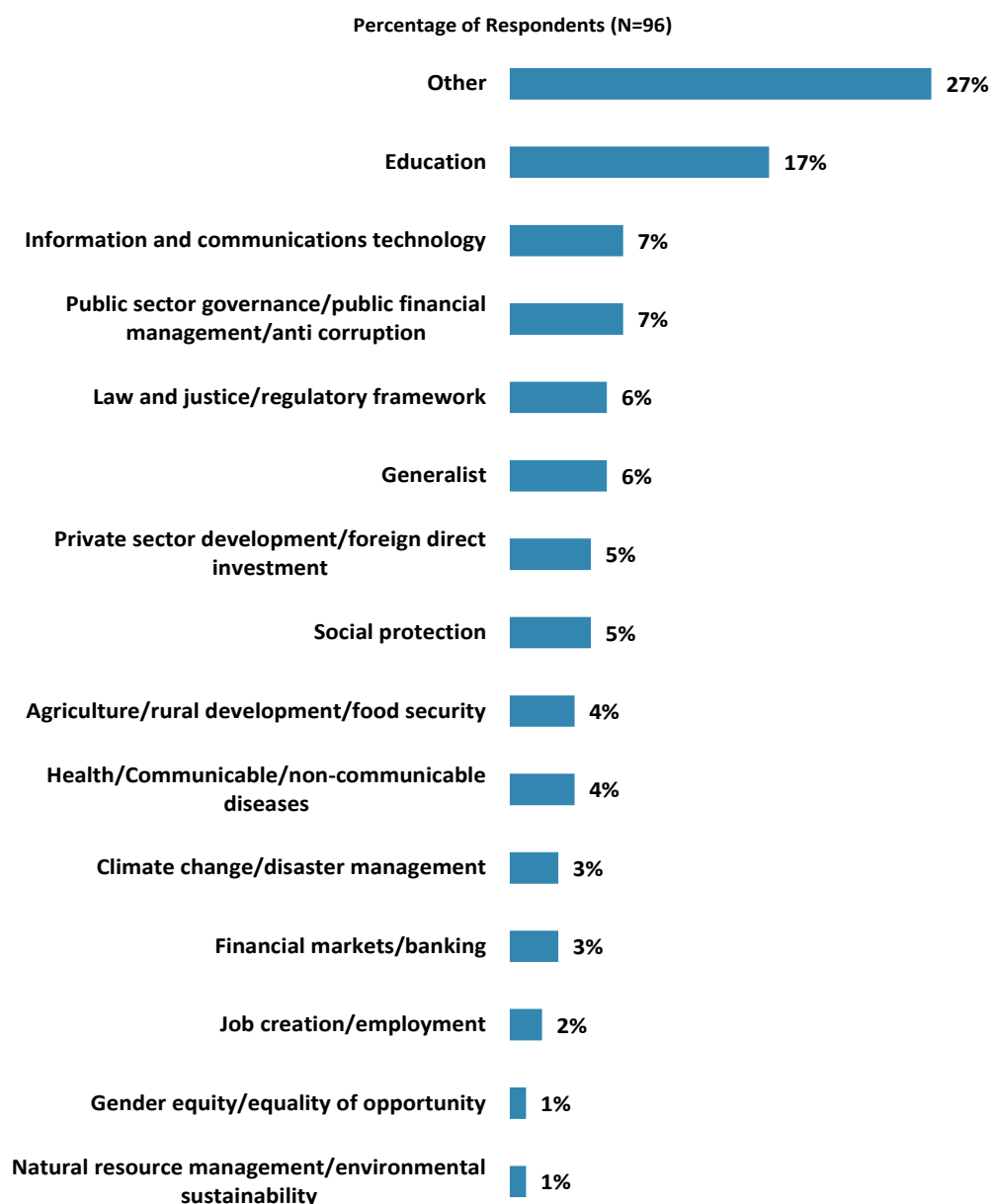
- For further analyses, respondents from the Office of President/Prime minister were combined with those from the office of ministers; respondents from consultants/contractors working on WBG projects were combined with those from PMUs, respondents from bilateral agencies were combined with those from multilateral agencies; respondents from the financial sector/private banks were combined with those from private sector organizations; Respondents from private foundations and NGOs were combined into “CSO.” Few respondents from the office of parliamentarian and other organizations were included in the “Other” category. There were no respondents from local governments, CBOs, trade unions, faith-based groups, or the judiciary branch.

Area of Primary Specialization

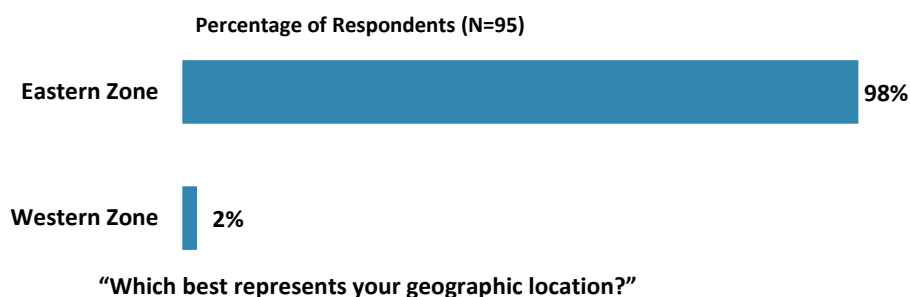


"Please identify the primary specialization of your work." (Respondents chose from a list.)

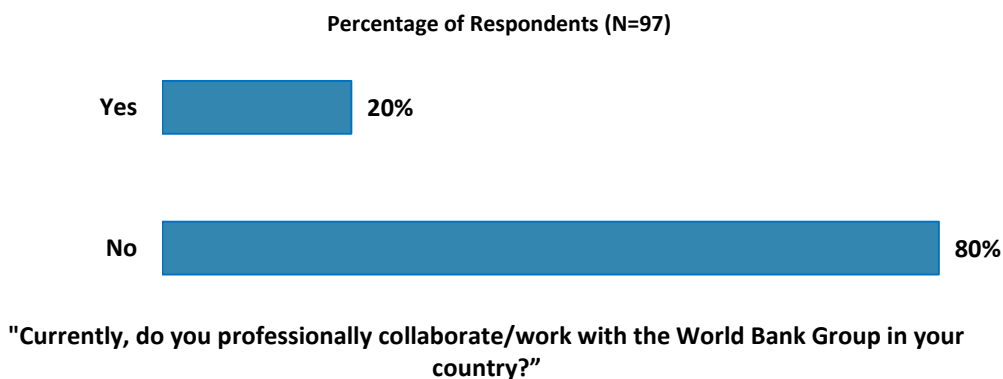
Geographic Location

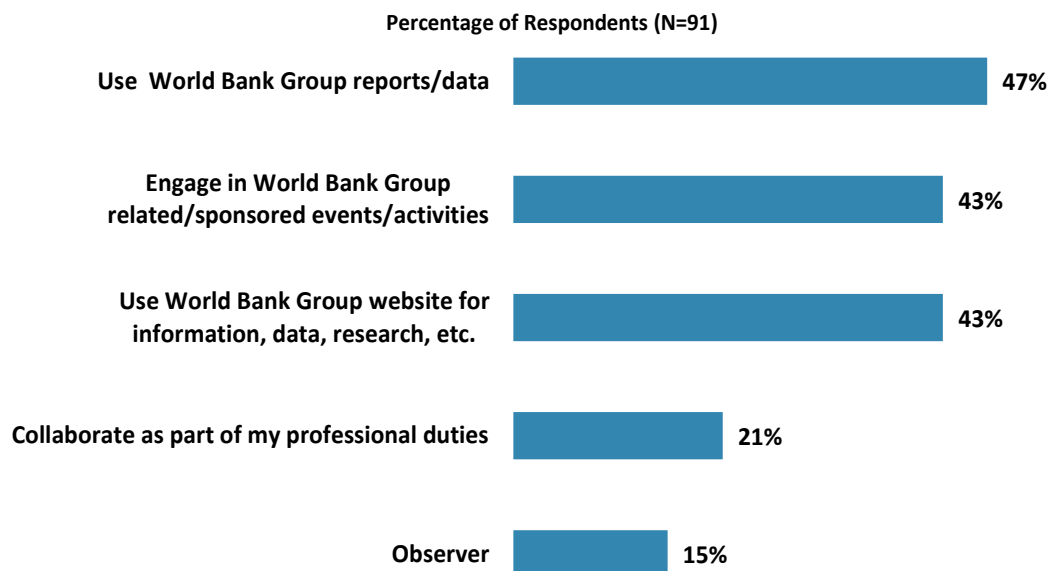
Collaboration with and Exposure to the World Bank Group

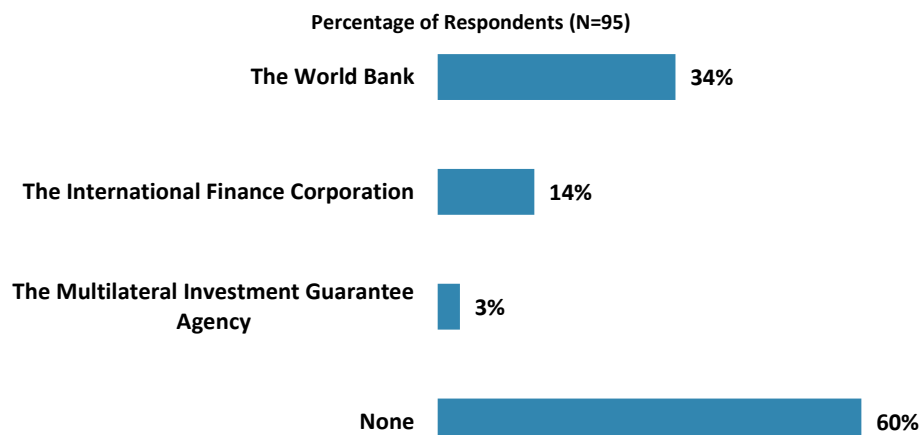

(Choose no more than TWO)" (Respondents chose from a list. Responses combined.)

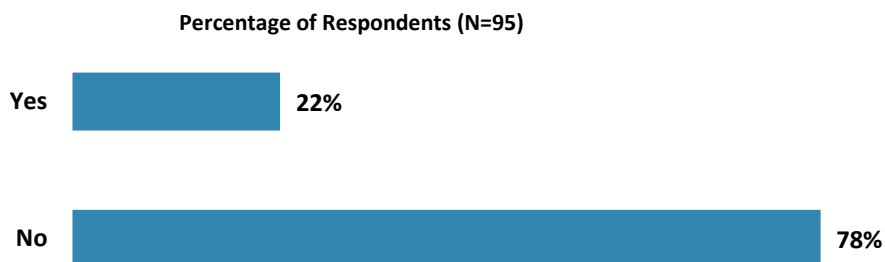

Exposure to the World Bank and IFC

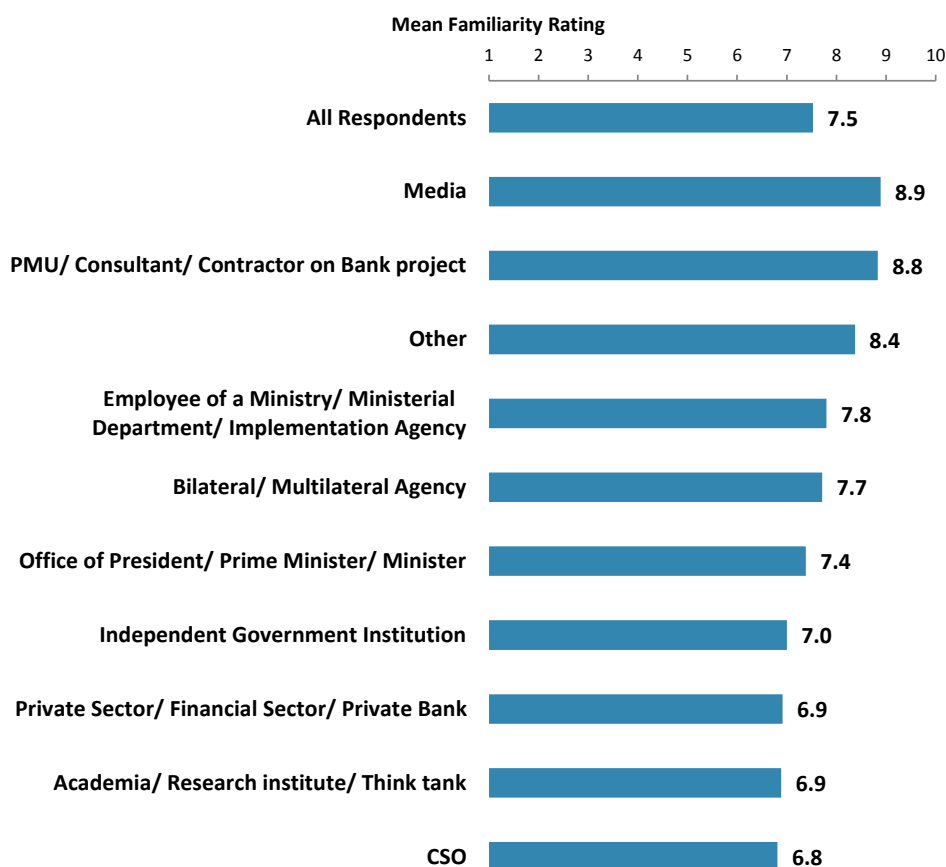


"Do your projects involve both the World Bank and IFC?"

III. Demographics of the Sample (continued)

Familiarity with the World Bank

- Respondents across stakeholder groups had statistically similar levels of familiarity with the World Bank in El Salvador.
- Respondents' ratings of familiarity with the World Bank were significantly, moderately correlated with their perceptions of the Bank's overall effectiveness in El Salvador, and their perceptions of the Bank's relevance to El Salvador's development. However, it is not significantly correlated with the Bank's ability to help achieve development results in El Salvador.

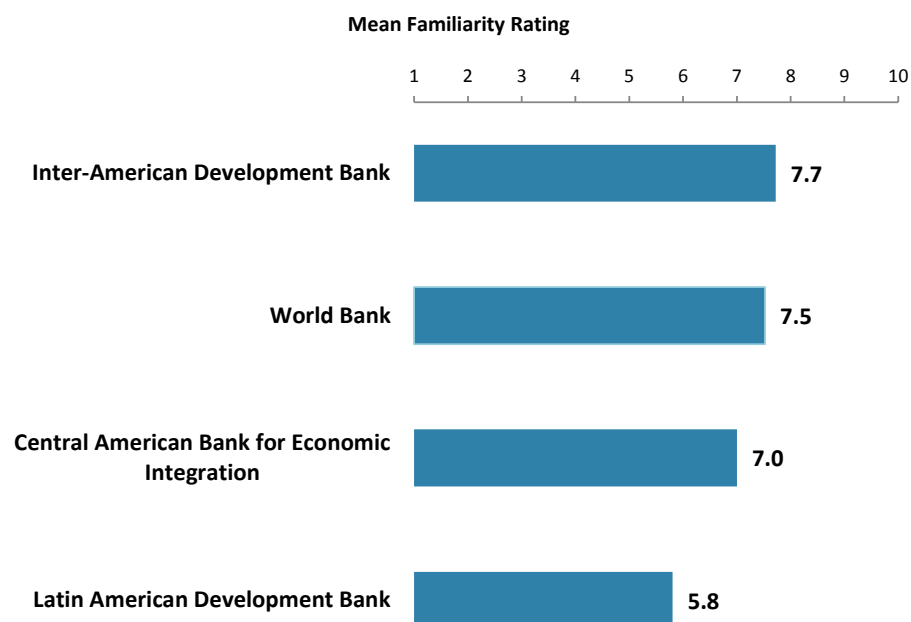


"How familiar are you with the work of the World Bank in El Salvador?"

Familiarity with Other Organizations

- Respondents had significantly *higher* levels of familiarity with the World Bank than the Latin American Development Bank and the Central American Bank for Economic Integration.
- Respondents had significantly *lower* levels of familiarity with the World Bank than the Inter-American Development Bank.

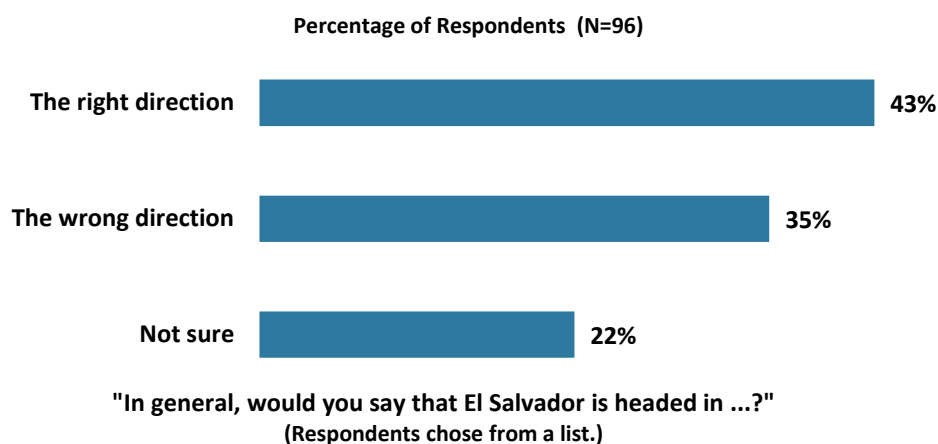


"How familiar are you with the work of these organizations in El Salvador?"

IV. General Issues Facing El Salvador

Headed in the Right Direction

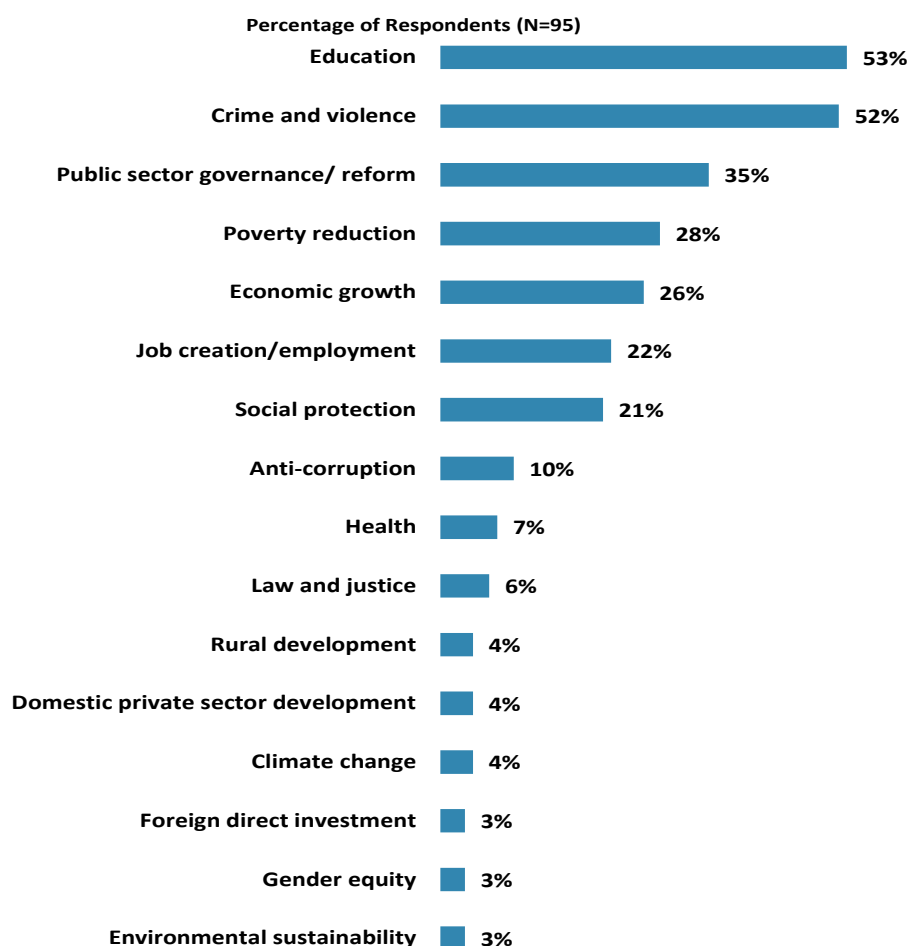
- There were significant stakeholder differences in their views of the country's direction. While a majority of respondents from the Office of President/Prime Minister/Minister, PMUs and consultants/contractors working on Bank projects believe that El Salvador is headed in the right direction, more than half of the respondents from private sector/financial sector/private banks, CSOs, academia/research institutes/think tanks and the media think that the country is moving in the wrong direction.



IV. General Issues Facing El Salvador (continued)

Development Priority

- Respondents who identified their primary specialization of work as “*education*” (17% of the sample) were significantly *more* likely to indicate that “*education*” and “*trade and exports*” were among the most important development priorities in El Salvador, compared to rest of respondents in other areas of work.
- However, respondents who identified their primary specialization of work as “*education*” were significantly *less* likely to indicate that “*poverty reduction*” was one of the most important development priorities in El Salvador, compared to the rest of respondents in other areas of work.



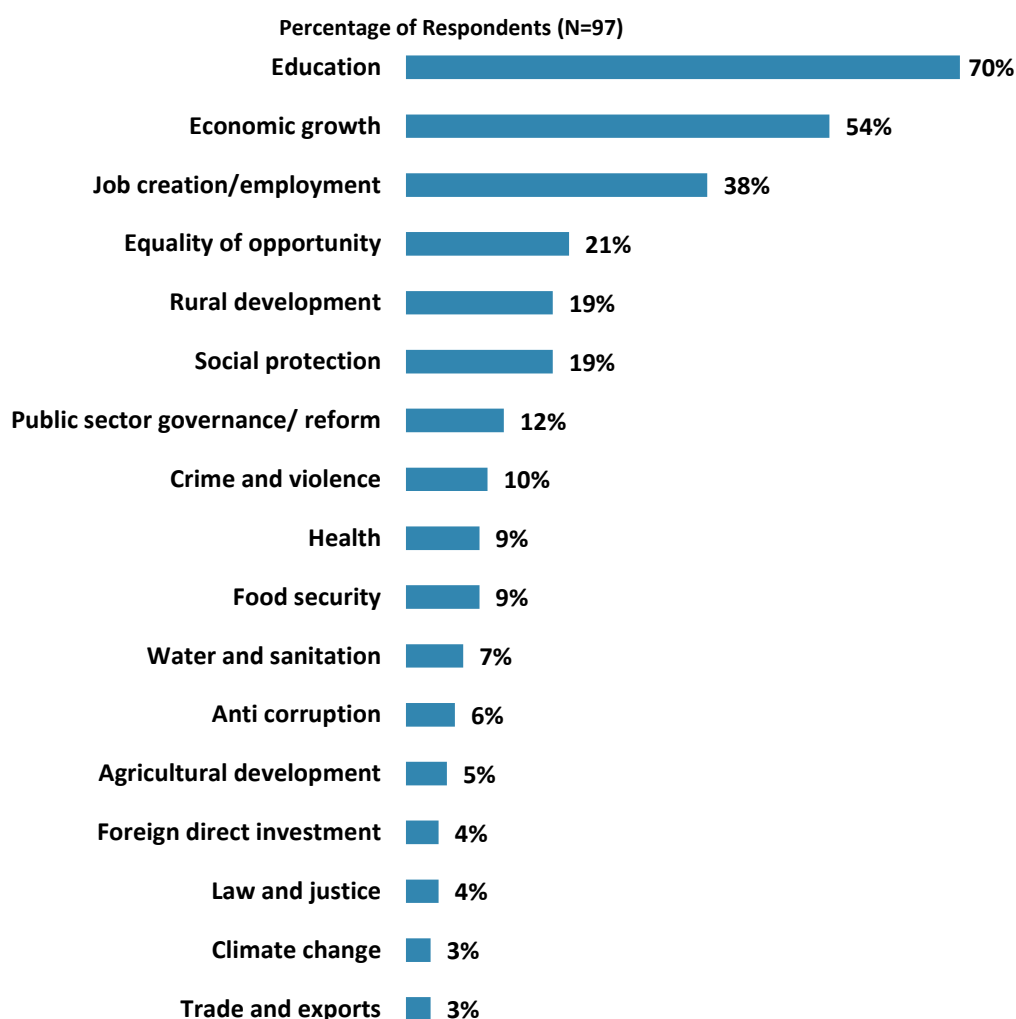

IV. General Issues Facing El Salvador (continued)

What Would Contribute Most to Reducing Poverty

- Respondents who identified their primary specialization of work as “*education*” (17% of the sample) were significantly *more* likely to consider “*foreign direct investment*” and “*environmental sustainability*” the biggest contributors to poverty reduction in El Salvador, as compared to the rest of respondents in other areas of work.

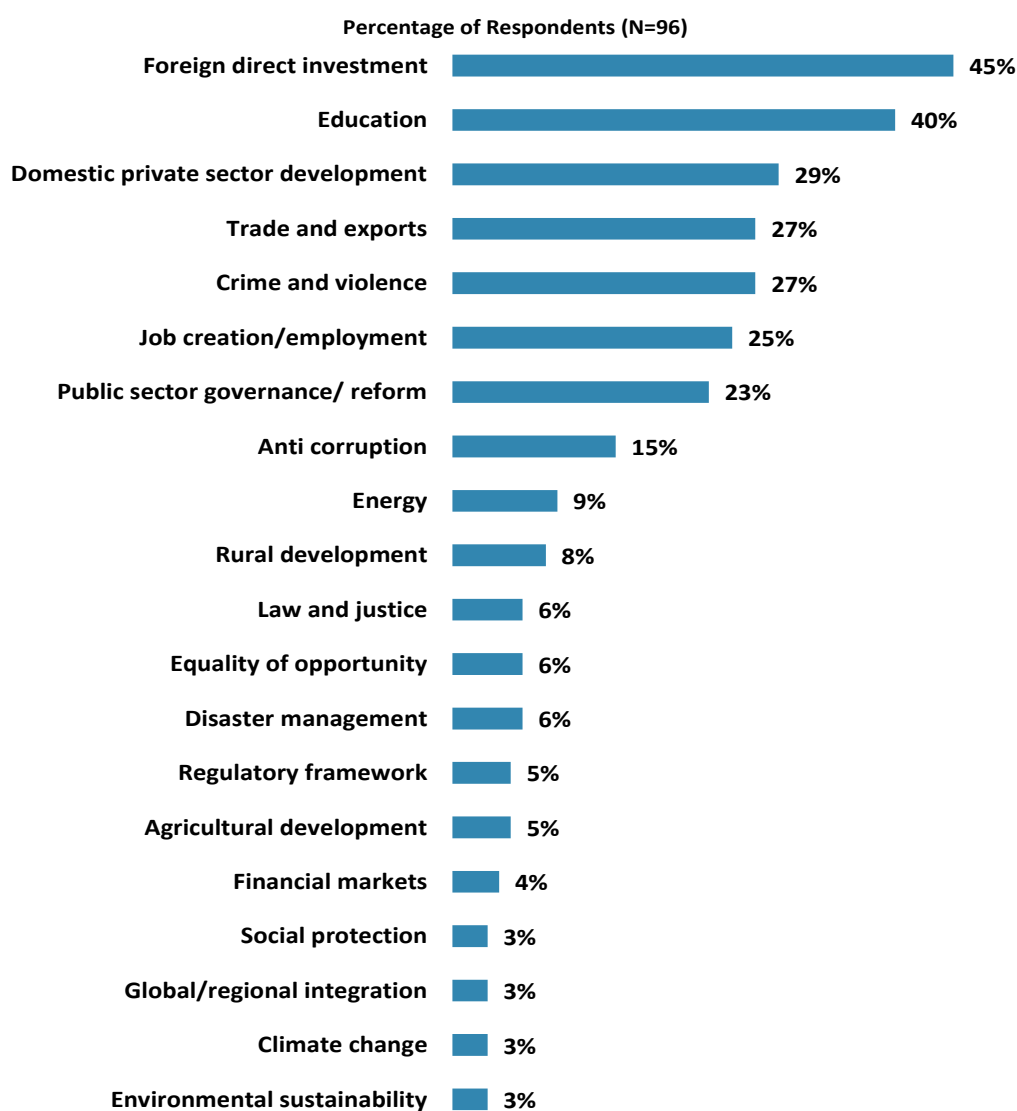

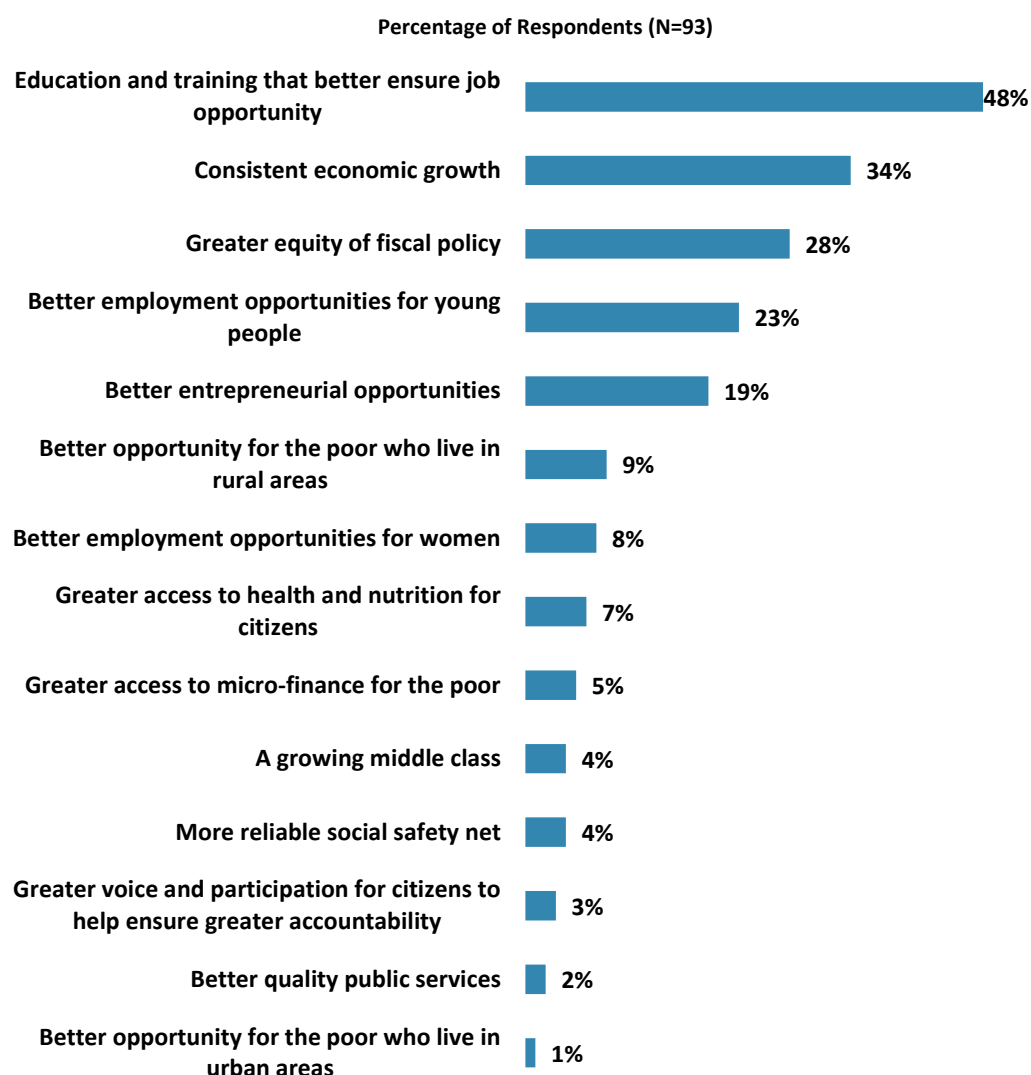
What Would Contribute Most to Generating Economic Growth

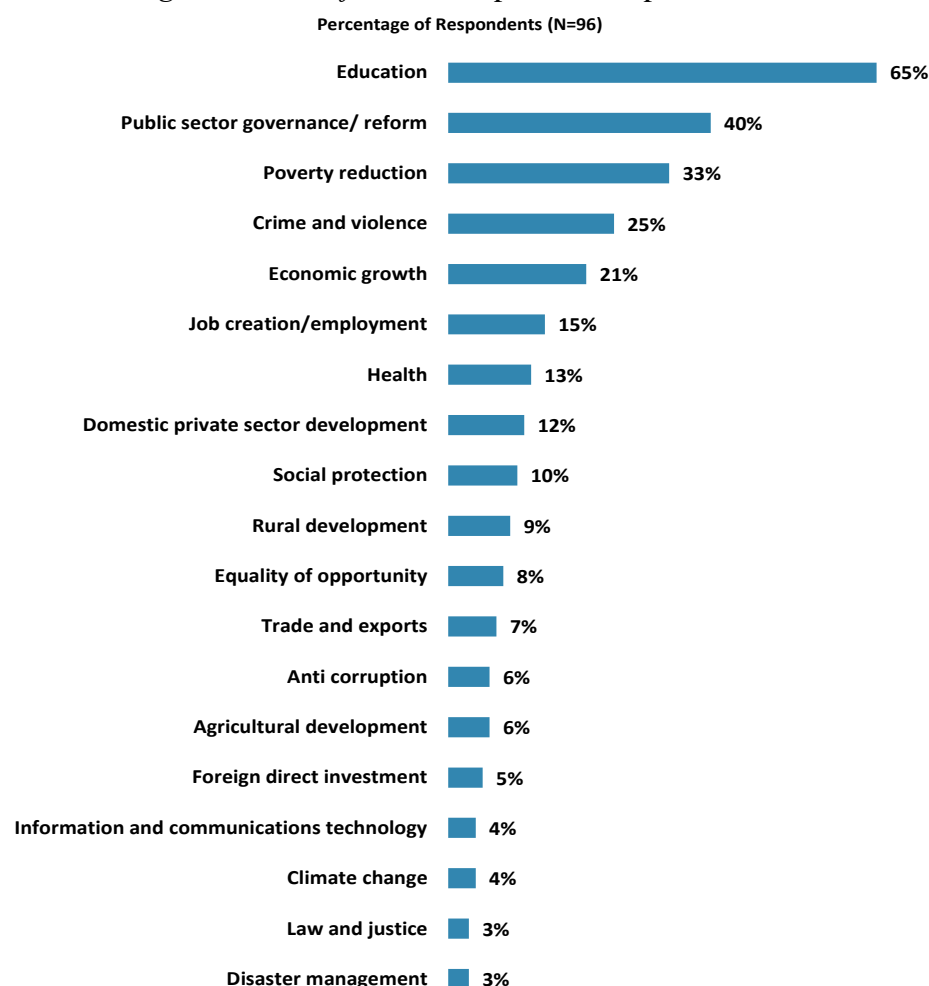


"When thinking about the idea of "shared prosperity" in your country, which of the following TWO best illustrate how this would be achieved in El Salvador?

V. Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group

Where the World Bank Group Should Focus its Resources

- Education emerges as not only a top development priority, but also the area where the Bank should focus most of its resources according to respondents.
- Respondents whose primary specialization of work is in “education” (17% of the sample) were significantly *more* likely to indicate that the WBG should focus its attention and resources on “education” and “economic growth,” compared to respondents in other areas of work.
- However, respondents whose primary specialization of work is in “education” were significantly *less* likely to indicate that the WBG should focus its attention and resources on “public sector governance/reform,” compared to respondents in other areas of work.

(Respondents chose from a list. Responses combined.)

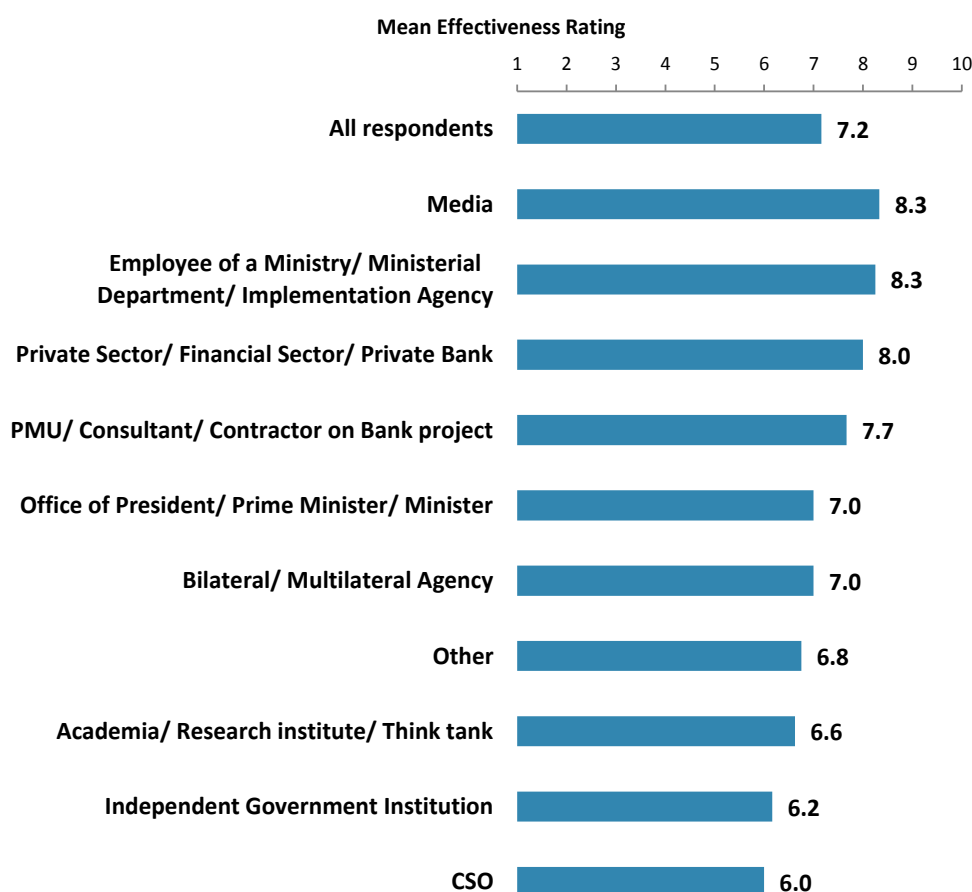
When more than 10% of the sample are respondents from a particular sector (see the full list of specialized areas in question H2 in Appendix F), analyses are done to see these respondents’ views about which areas the World Bank Group should focus its attention and resources on.

V. Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group (continued)

As noted in the “Methodology” section, the indicator questions referred to throughout the survey report are questions that are asked in every country that engages in the Country Opinion Survey. These will be aggregated for the World Bank Group’s annual Corporate Scorecard.

The World Bank’s Overall Effectiveness (*Indicator Question*)

- There were significant stakeholder differences in their ratings for the Bank’s overall effectiveness in El Salvador. Respondents from the media and employees of ministries/ministerial departments/implementation agencies had the highest ratings, whereas respondents from CSOs and independent government institutions tended to give significantly lower ratings for the Bank’s overall effectiveness.
- Respondents who professionally collaborate/work with the World Bank and those who do not gave statistically similar ratings for the Bank’s overall effectiveness.

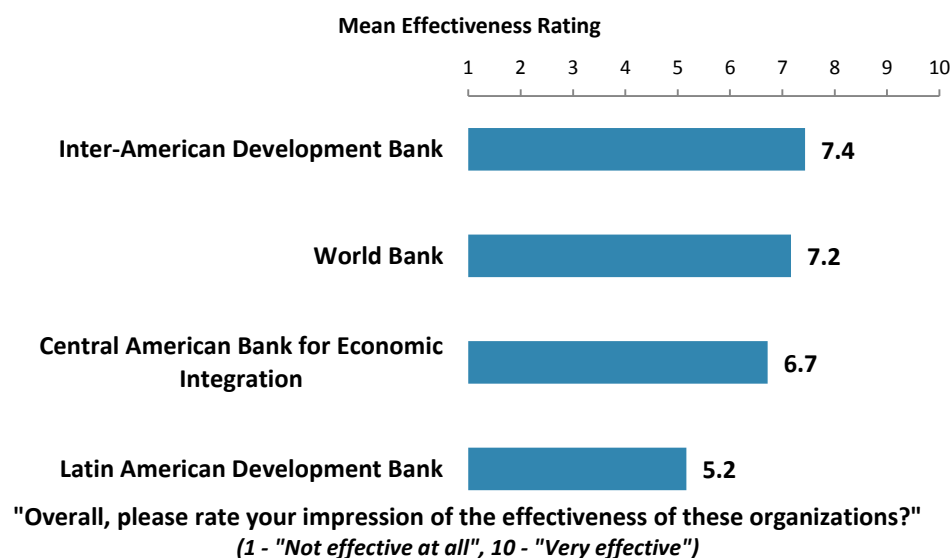


"Overall, please rate your impression of the World Bank's effectiveness in El Salvador?"

Overall Effectiveness of Other Organizations

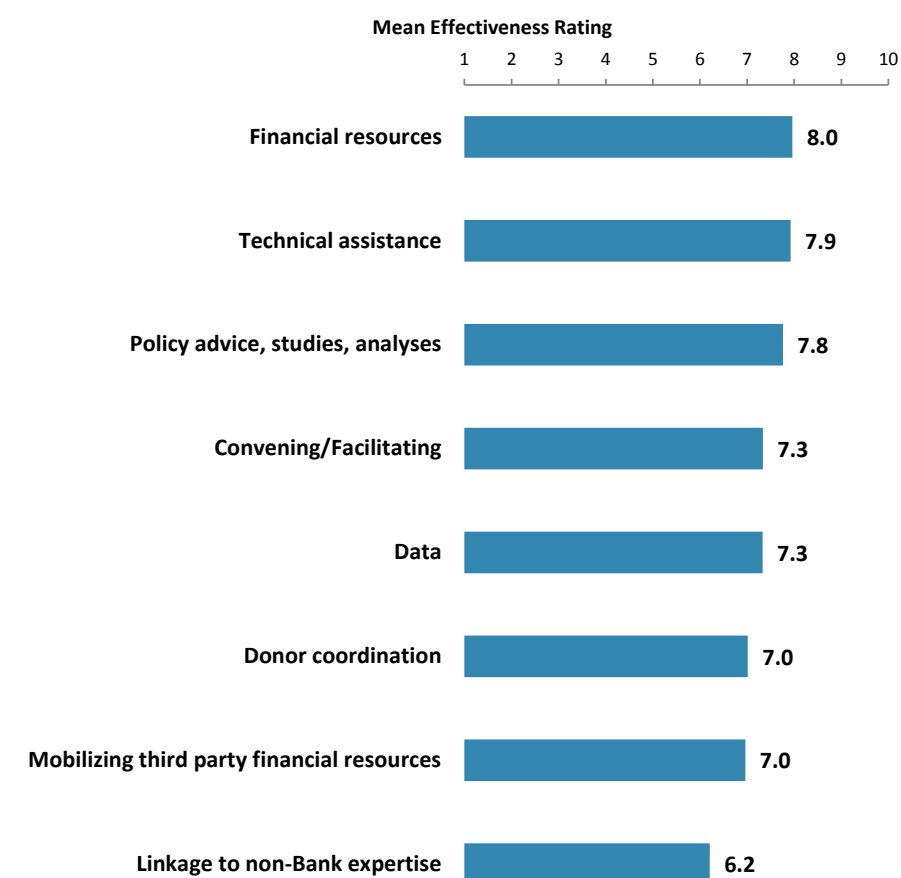
- Respondents gave significantly *higher* ratings for the World Bank's effectiveness than the effectiveness of Central American Bank for Economic Integration and Latin American Development Bank.
- Respondents gave significantly *lower* ratings for the effectiveness of the World Bank than the Inter-American Development Bank.



V. Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group (continued)

Effectiveness of the WBG Activities

- Employees of ministries/ministerial departments/implementation agencies and respondents from independent government institutions had the highest ratings for the effectiveness of the WBG activities in “*data*” and “*mobilizing third party financial resources*” in supporting El Salvador’s efforts to achieve development results, whereas respondents from bilateral/multilateral agencies had significantly lower ratings.
- Employees of ministries/ministerial departments/implementation agencies had the highest ratings for the effectiveness of the WBG activities in “*convening/facilitating*” in supporting El Salvador’s efforts to achieve development results, whereas respondents from CSOs and the media had significantly lower ratings.

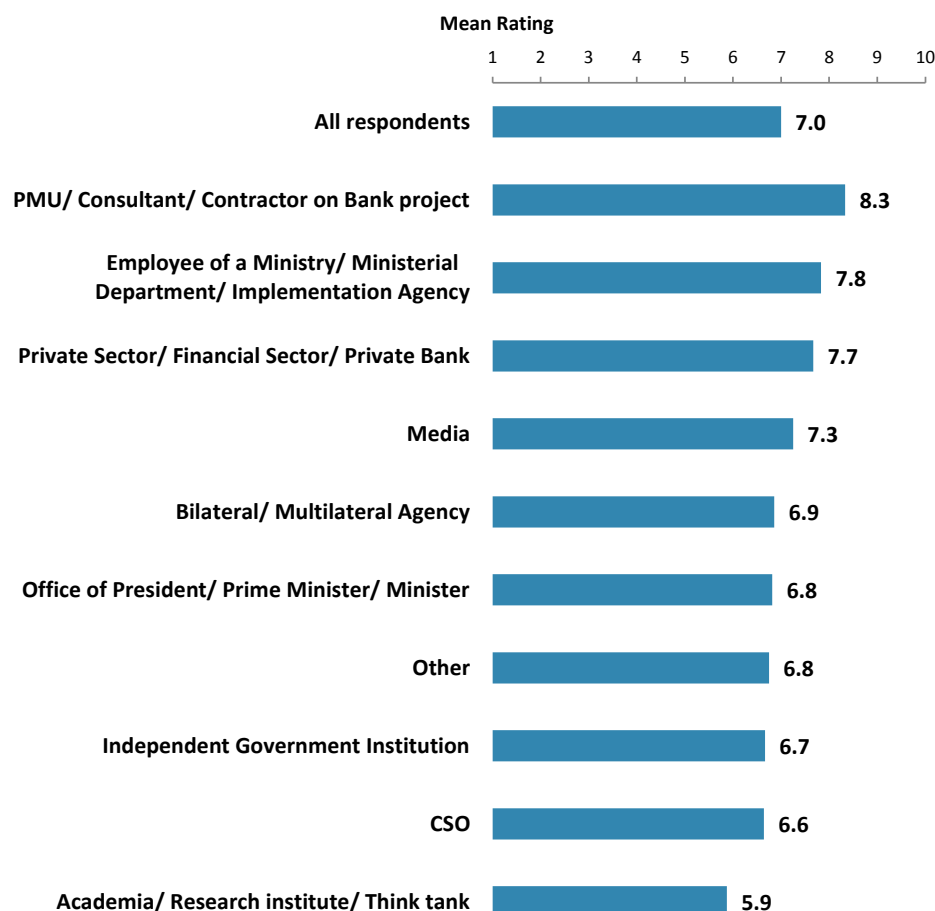


"How effective do the World Bank Group's activities below support El Salvador's efforts to achieve development results?"

Achieving Development Results (*Indicator Question*)

- Respondents from PMUs and consultants/contractors working on Bank projects had the highest ratings for the World Bank Group helping achieve development results in El Salvador, whereas respondents from CSOs and academia/research institutes/think tanks had significantly lower ratings.
- Respondents who professionally collaborate/work with the World Bank Group had statistically similar ratings for the WBG helping achieve development results in El Salvador as those who do not professionally collaborate/work with the WBG.



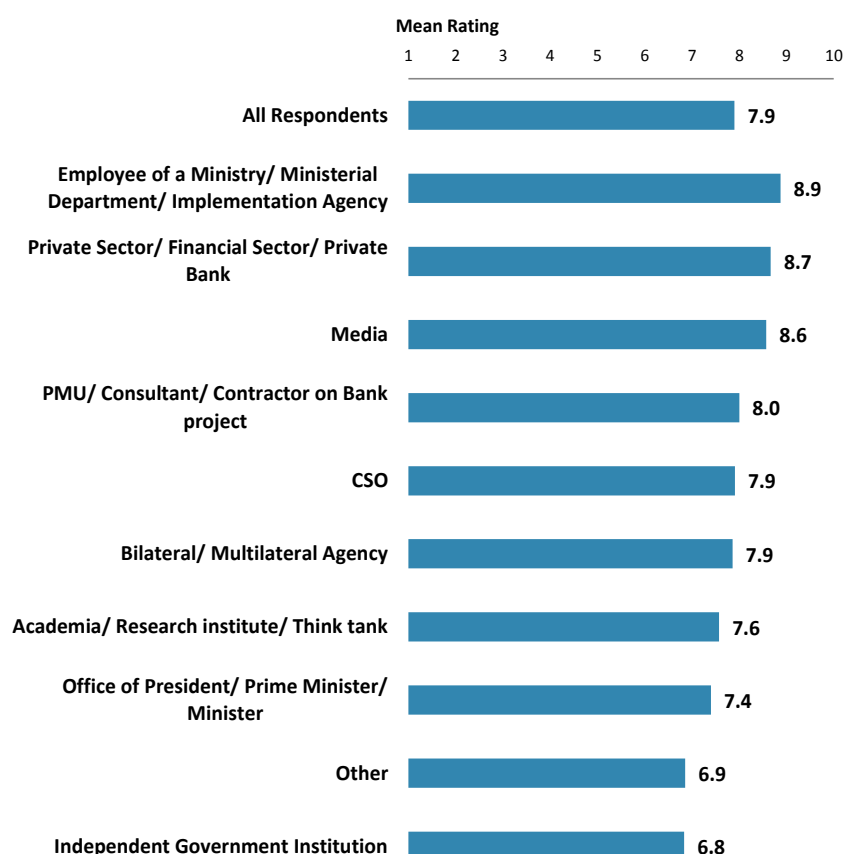
"To what extent does the World Bank Group's work help to achieve development results in El Salvador?"

Staff Preparedness (*Indicator Question*)

- Employees of ministries/ministerial departments/implementation agencies and respondents from private sector/financial sector/private banks had the highest ratings for the extent to which the WBG's staff is well prepared to help El Salvador solve its most complicated development challenges, whereas respondents from independent government institutions had significantly lower ratings.
- Respondents who professionally collaborate/work with the World Bank Group had statistically similar ratings for the extent to which the WBG's staff is well prepared to help El Salvador solve its most complicated development challenges as those who do not professionally collaborate/work with the WBG.

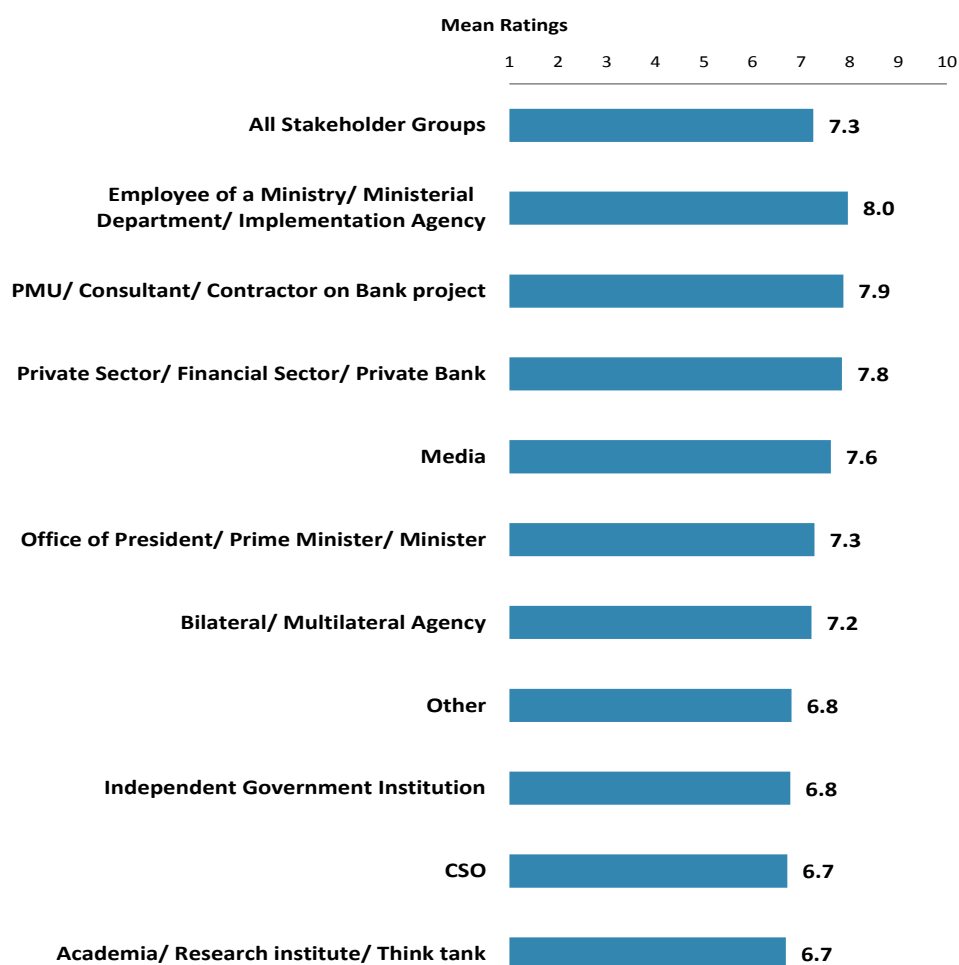


"To what extent do you believe the World Bank Group's staff is well prepared (e.g., skills and knowledge) to help El Salvador solve its most complicated development challenges?"

- Respondents across stakeholder groups gave statistically similar ratings for twenty six indicator questions.
- Respondents who professionally collaborate/work with the WBG gave statistically similar ratings for twenty six indicator questions as respondents who do not professionally collaborate/work with the WBG.

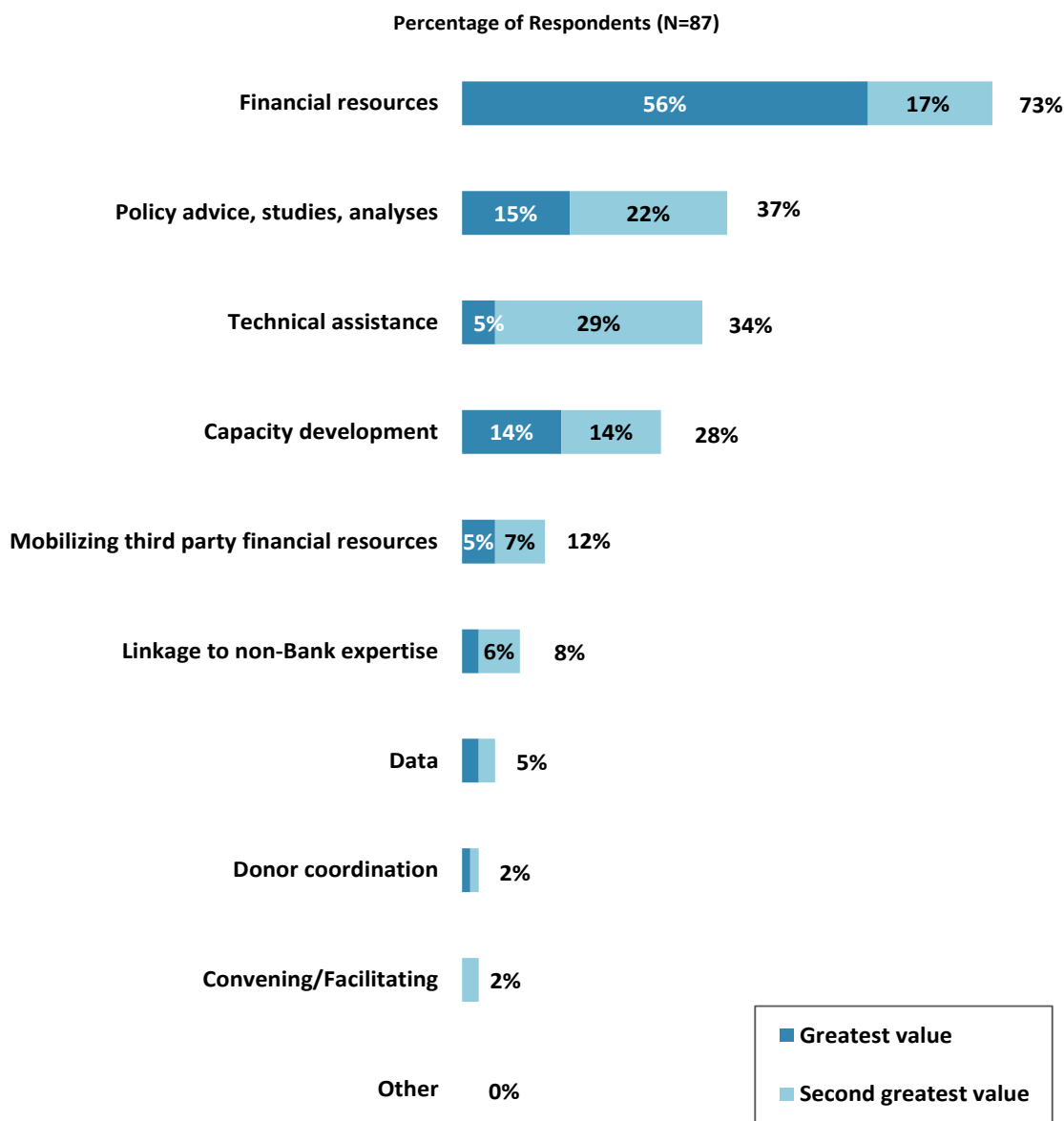


Mean Ratings for All Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups on a Scale from 1 to 10

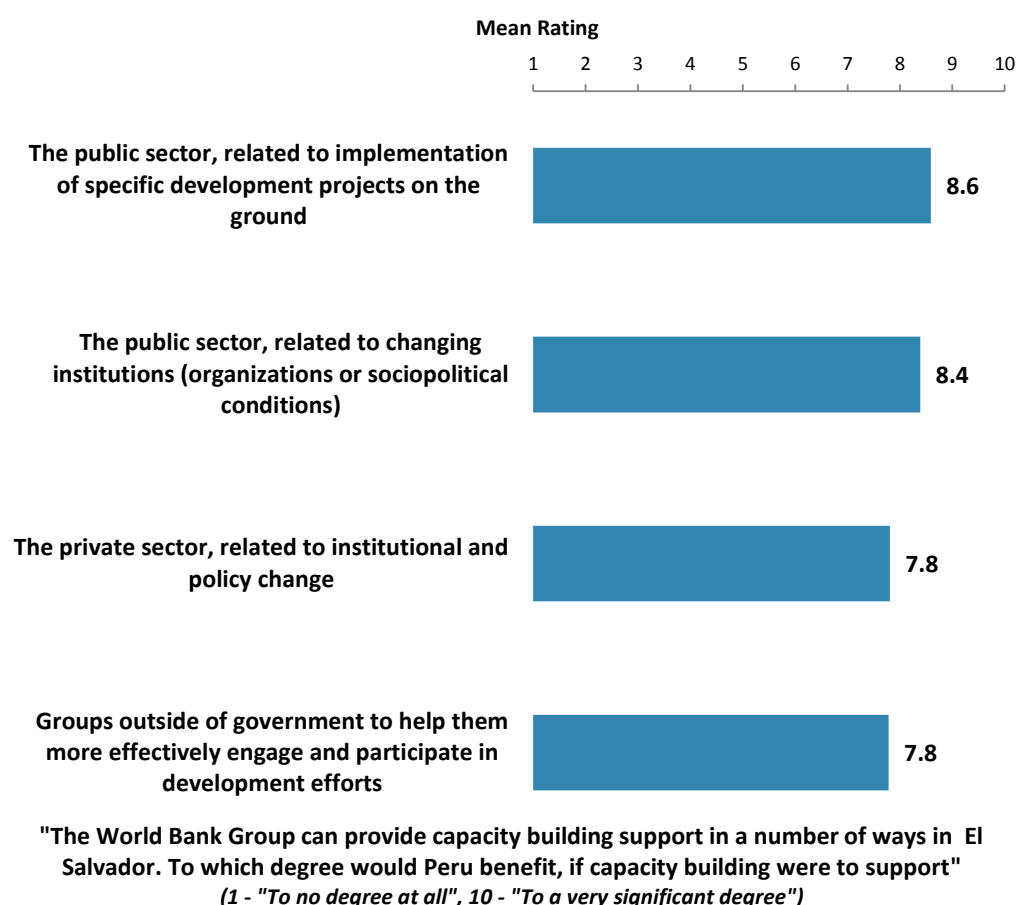


"When thinking about the World Bank Group's role, which activity do you believe is of greatest VALUE and which activity is of second greatest value in El Salvador?"

Ways of Capacity Building Support

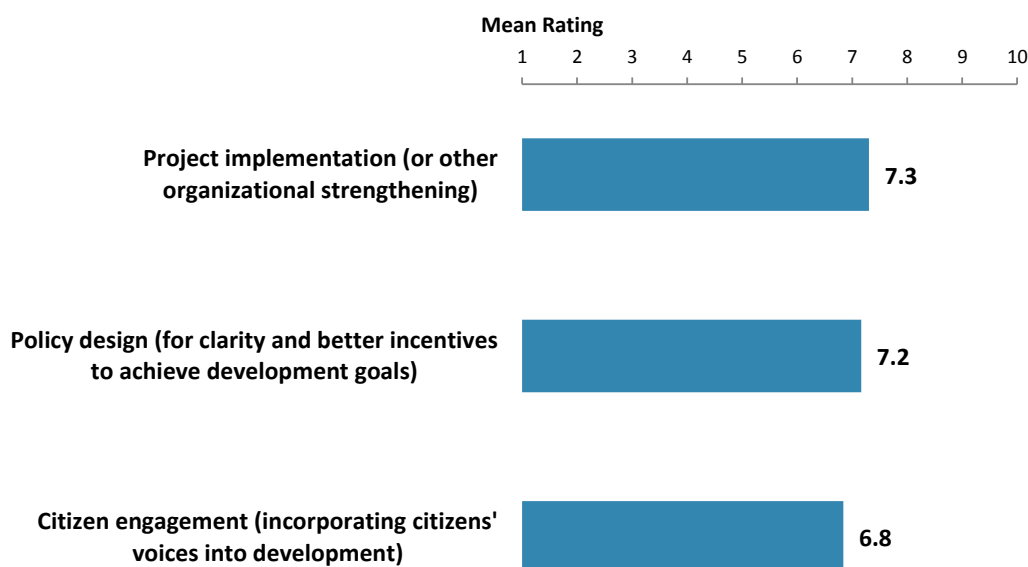
- Respondents from academia/research institutes/think tanks, the media, and CSOs gave the highest ratings for the extent to which El Salvador would benefit, if capacity building were to support “*groups outside government to help them more effectively engage and participate in development efforts*,” whereas respondents from independent government institutions and other organizations gave significantly lower ratings.
- Respondents across stakeholder groups gave statistically similar ratings for the extent to which El Salvador would benefit, if capacity building were to support the other three areas.

Effectiveness of WBG's Capacity Building Work

- Respondents from the private sector/financial sector/private banks and employees of ministries/ministerial departments/implementation agencies had the highest ratings for the effectiveness of WBG's capacity building work in *project implementation*, whereas respondents from independent government institutions and other organizations had significantly lower ratings.
- Employees of ministries/ministerial departments/implementation agencies had the highest ratings for the effectiveness of WBG's capacity building work in *citizen engagement*, whereas respondents from bilateral/multilateral agencies and other organizations had significantly lower ratings.
- Respondents from the media and private sector/financial sector/private banks had the highest ratings for the effectiveness of WBG's capacity building work in *policy design*, whereas respondents from the Office of President/Prime Minister/Ministers and other organizations had significantly lower ratings.

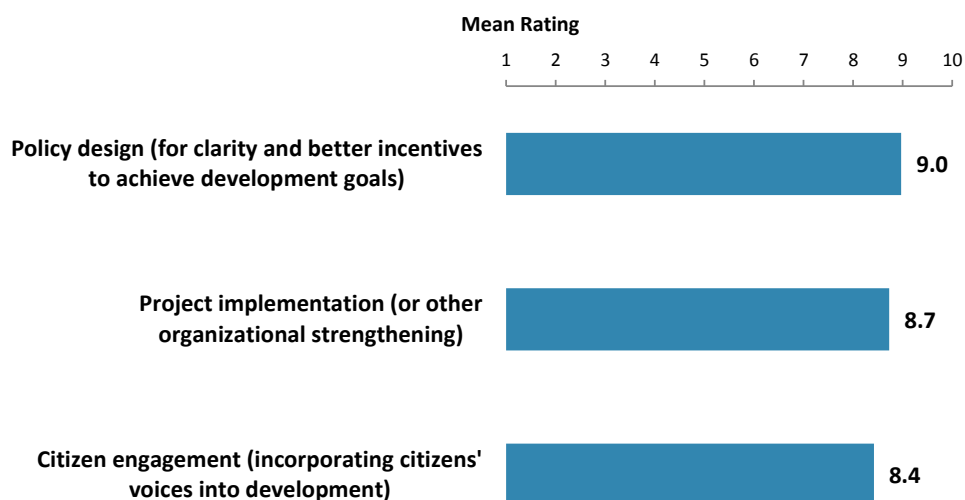


"How EFFECTIVE do you believe the World Bank Group is in terms of the capacity building work it does in each of the following areas in El Salvador?"

- Respondents across stakeholder groups had statistically similar ratings for the importance of the WBG's capacity building work in all three areas.



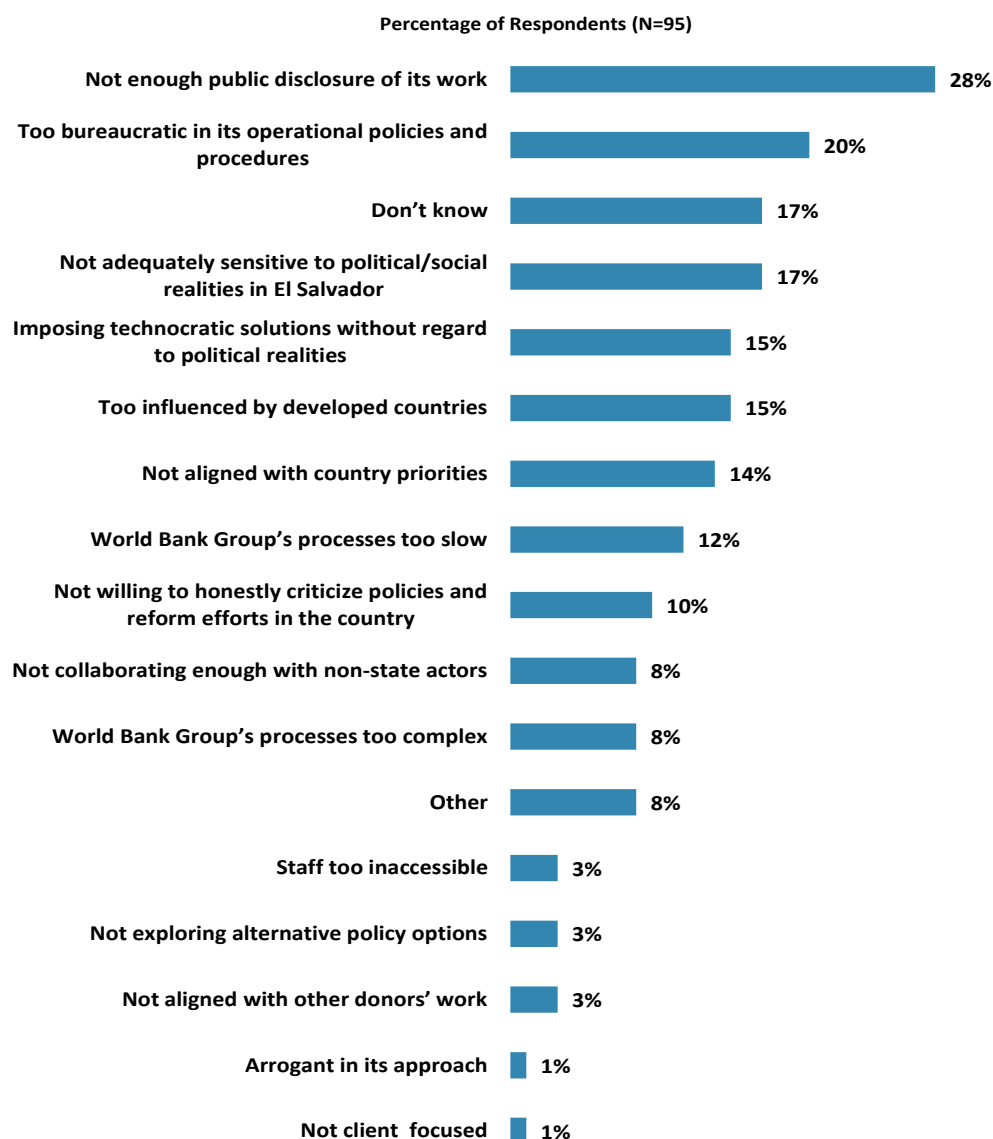

Greatest Weakness

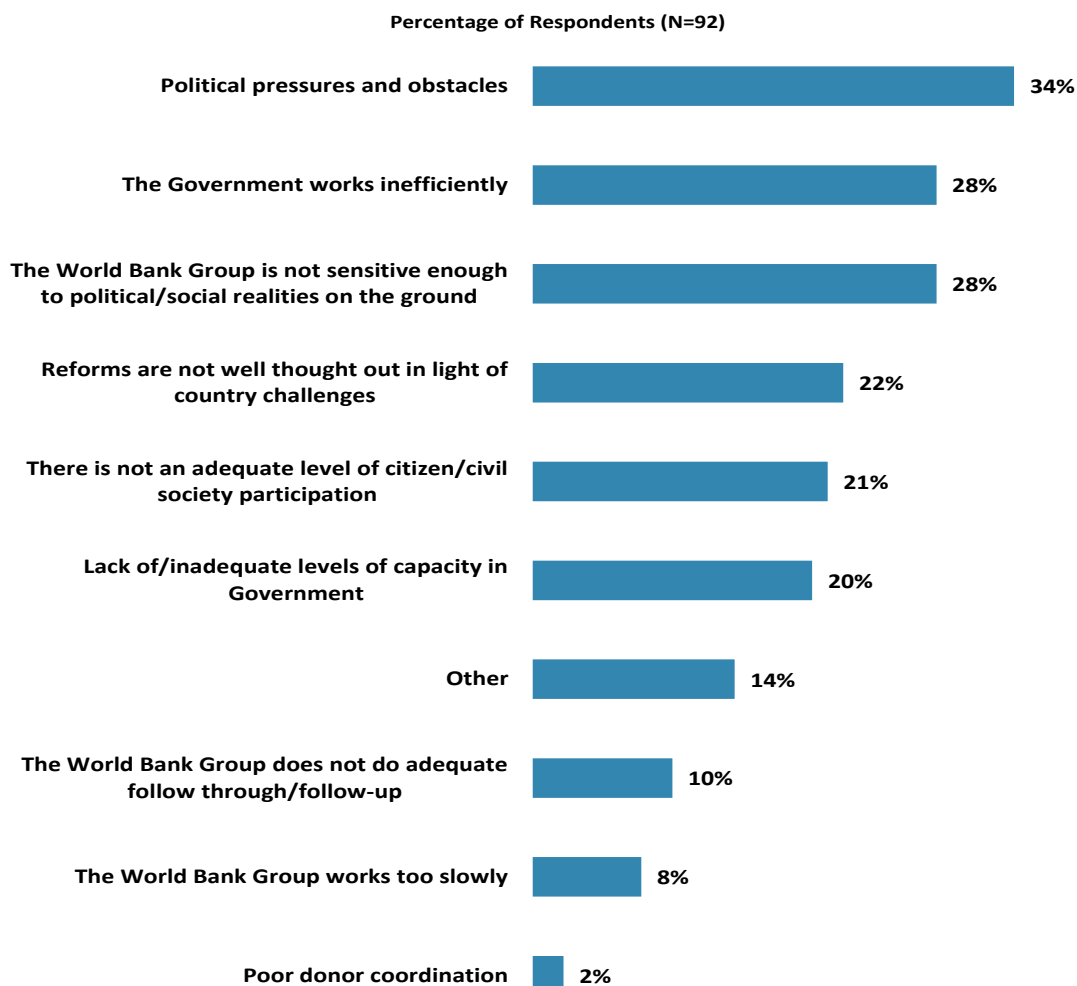
- Of all the respondents, those who are from academia/research institutes/think tanks (63%), CSOs (50%) and private sector/financial sector/private banks (50%) were mostly likely to indicate that “*not enough public disclosure of its work*” is the greatest weakness of the WBG, whereas respondents from independent government institutions, PMUs and consultants/contractors working on WBG projects were significantly less likely to indicate so.

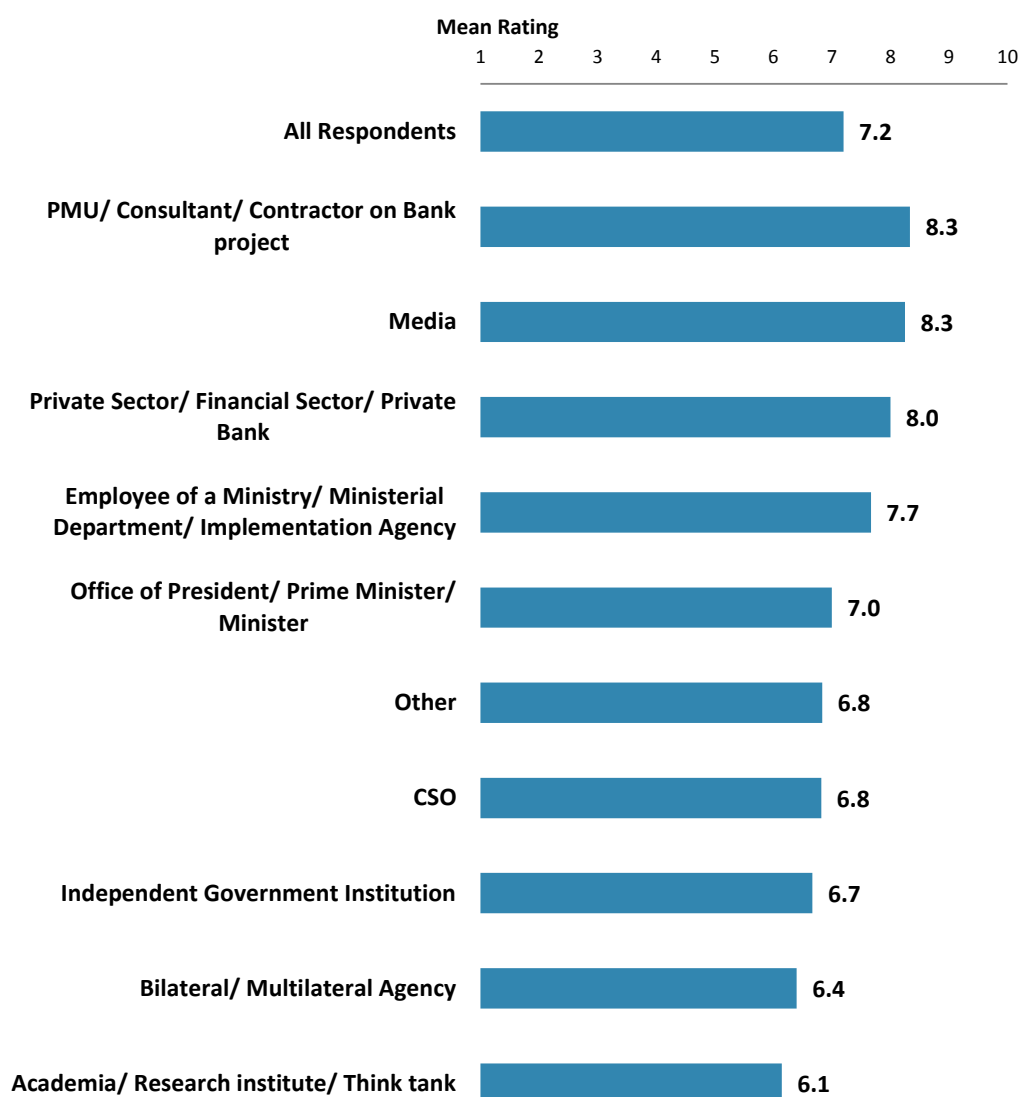


"When World Bank Group assisted reform efforts fail or are slow to take place, which of the following would you attribute this to? (Choose no more than TWO)"

World Bank Group Moving in the Right Direction

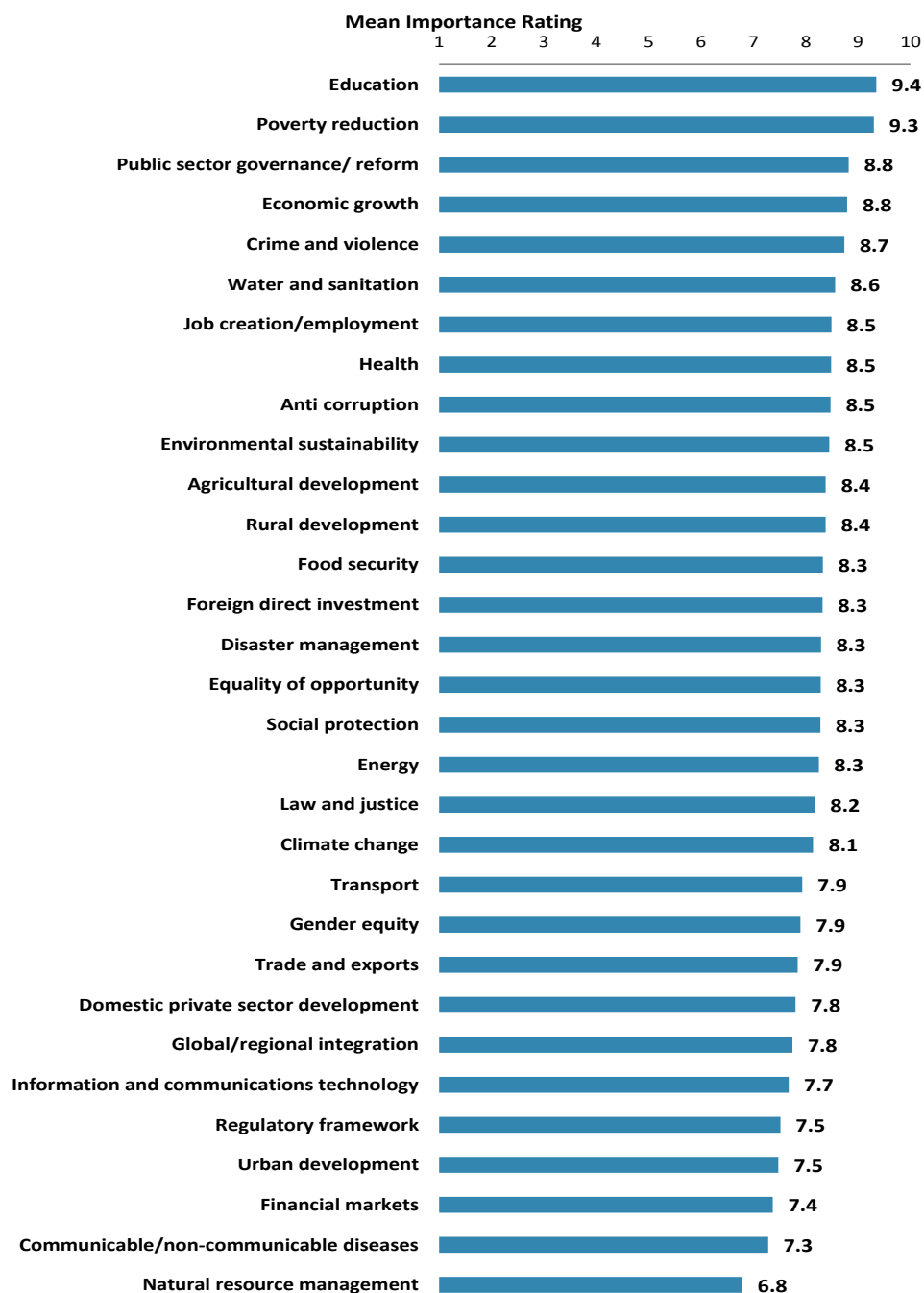
- Respondents from the media, PMUs and consultants/contractors working on WBG projects were mostly likely to indicate that the WBG has moved in the right direction in terms of the focus of its work in El Salvador in the last three years, whereas respondents from academia/research institutes/think tanks, and bilateral/multilateral agencies were significantly less likely to indicate so.

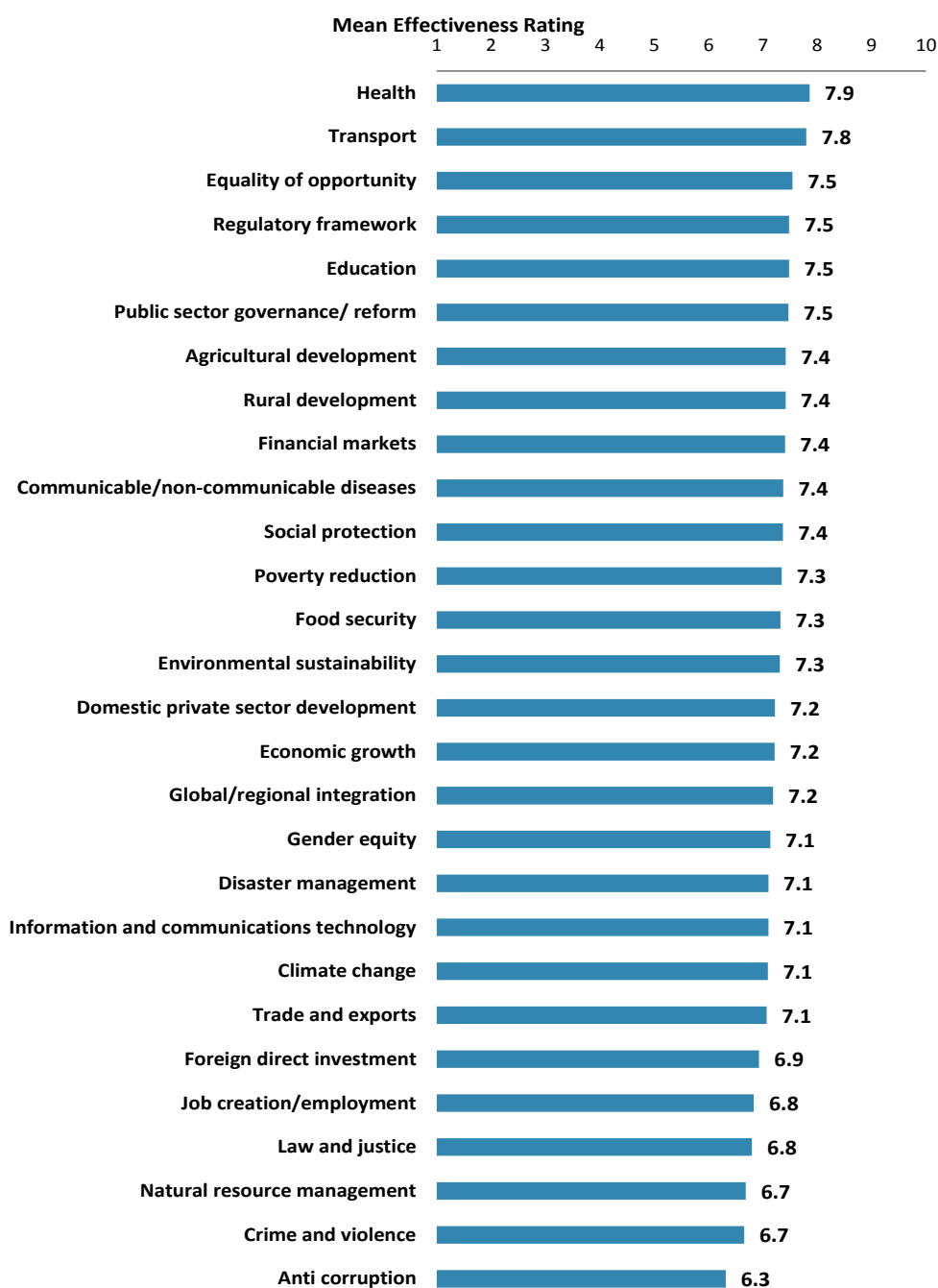
Importance of Sectoral Areas

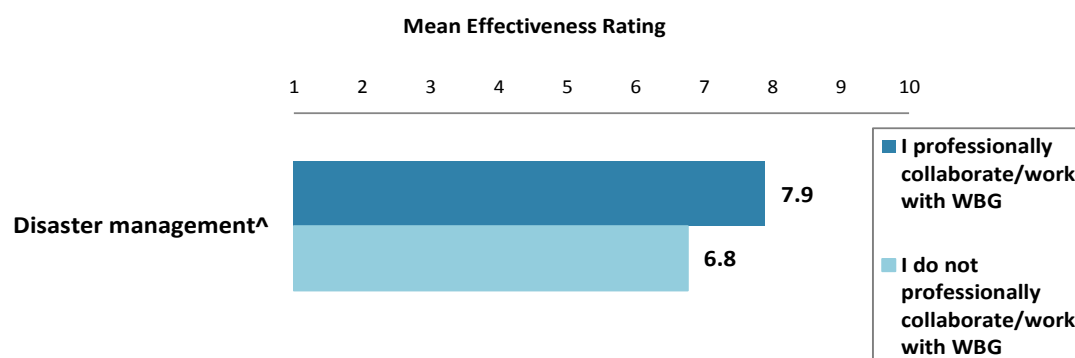
Effectiveness of Sectoral Areas (continued)

- There were significant stakeholder differences in their ratings for the WBG's effectiveness in several areas. In most cases, respondents from the private sector/financial sector/private sector and employees of ministries/ministerial departments/implantation agencies tended to give the highest ratings, whereas respondents from independent government institutions and academia/research institutes/think tanks tended to give significantly lower ratings. These areas of development included:
 - Information and communications technology;
 - Crime and violence;
 - Regulatory framework;
 - Domestic private sector development;
 - Disaster management;
 - Global/regional integration;
 - Food security; and
 - Social protection
- Respondents whose primary specialization of work is in “*education*” (17% of all respondents) gave significantly lower ratings for the WBG's effectiveness in the following areas, compared to respondents who specialize in other areas:
 - Environmental sustainability;
 - Regulatory framework;
 - Economic growth;
 - Disaster management;
 - Public sector governance/reform;
 - Health;
 - Rural development;
 - Global/regional integration;
 - Food security;
 - Social protection;
 - Climate change; and
 - Agricultural development
- Note in the Appendix on the sectoral effectiveness (Appendix A, page 62) that primarily informed stakeholders responded to this question.

Effectiveness of Sectoral Areas (continued)

- Respondents who professionally collaborate/work with the WBG gave significantly higher ratings for the WBG's effectiveness in "*disaster management*," compared to respondents who do not professionally collaborate/work with the WBG.
- Respondents who do and do not professionally collaborate/work with the WBG gave statistically similar ratings for the WBG's effectiveness in the remaining twenty-seven development areas.

VI. Sectoral Importance and Effectiveness (continued)

Drivers of Effectiveness

To determine the key drivers of respondents' ratings of the World Bank Group's overall effectiveness and ratings of its ability to help achieve development results in El Salvador, bivariate correlational analyses were conducted using respondents' ratings of the twenty eight specific areas of effectiveness.

Correlational analyses, however, are not able to tell us exactly what is causing respondents' ratings of the World Bank's overall effectiveness or ratings of its ability to help achieve development results. Rather, these analyses tell us that as ratings of effectiveness in one area increase, respondents' ratings of the Bank's overall effectiveness increase, or as ratings of effectiveness in one area increase, ratings of the WBG's ability to help achieve development results increase. Thus, it can be inferred that respondents' perceptions of effectiveness in one specific area are related to, or drive, respondents' perceptions of the Bank's overall effectiveness or perceptions of the WBG's ability to help achieve development results.

- Overall Effectiveness: Those specific areas with the highest Pearson Product-Moment correlations were determined to be the most closely related to perceptions of the Bank's overall effectiveness, suggesting that ratings of effectiveness in those specific areas are drivers of perceptions of the Bank's overall effectiveness in El Salvador. The areas determined to be key drivers from these analyses were:
 - The WBG's effectiveness at global/regional integration;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at food security;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at climate change;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at crime and violence;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at economic growth; and
 - The WBG's effectiveness at trade and exports.
- Achieving Development Results: Those specific areas with the highest Pearson Product-Moment correlations were determined to be the most closely related to perceptions of the WBG's ability to help achieve development results in El Salvador, suggesting that ratings of effectiveness in those specific areas are drivers of perceptions of the WBG's ability to help achieve development results. The areas determined to be key drivers from these analyses were:
 - The WBG's effectiveness at job creation/employment;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at law and justice;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at gender equity;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at anti-corruption
 - The WBG's effectiveness at equality of opportunity; and
 - The WBG's effectiveness at crime and violence.

VII. How the World Bank Group Operates

The World Bank Group's Work in El Salvador

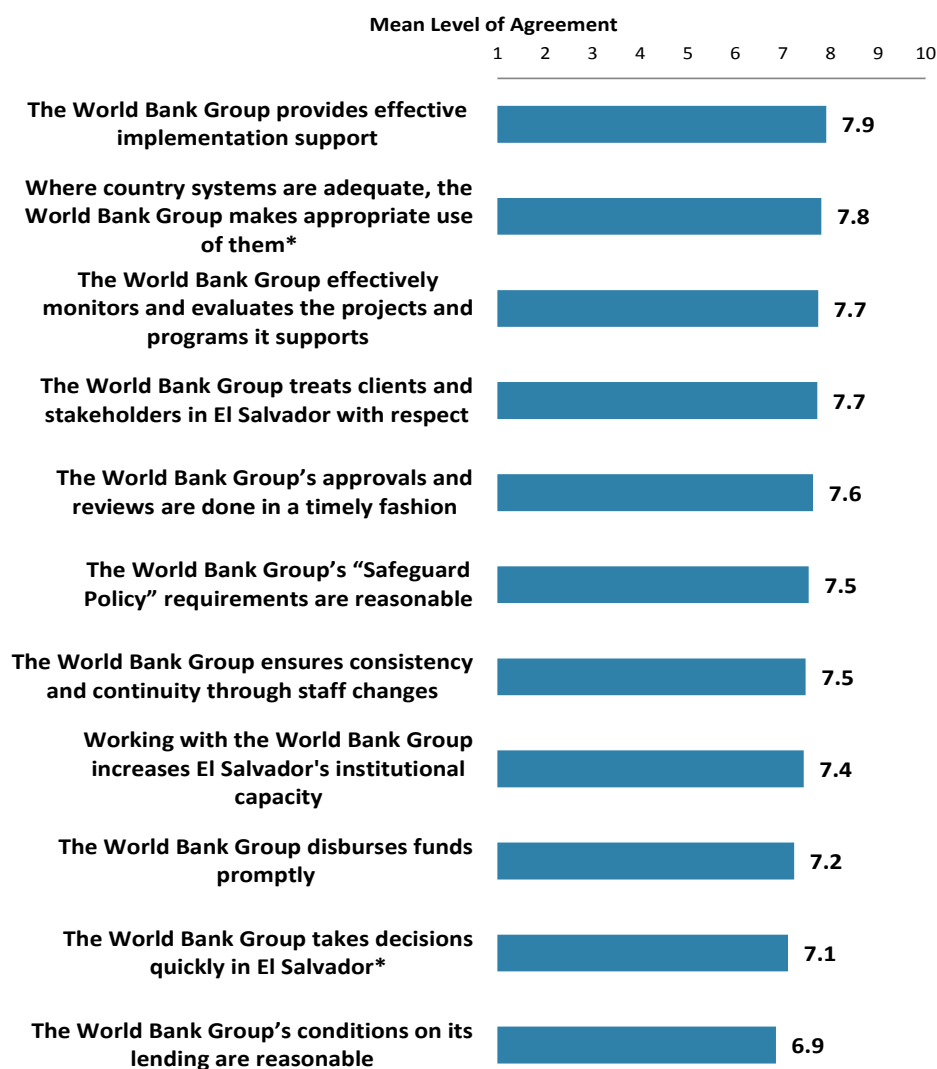

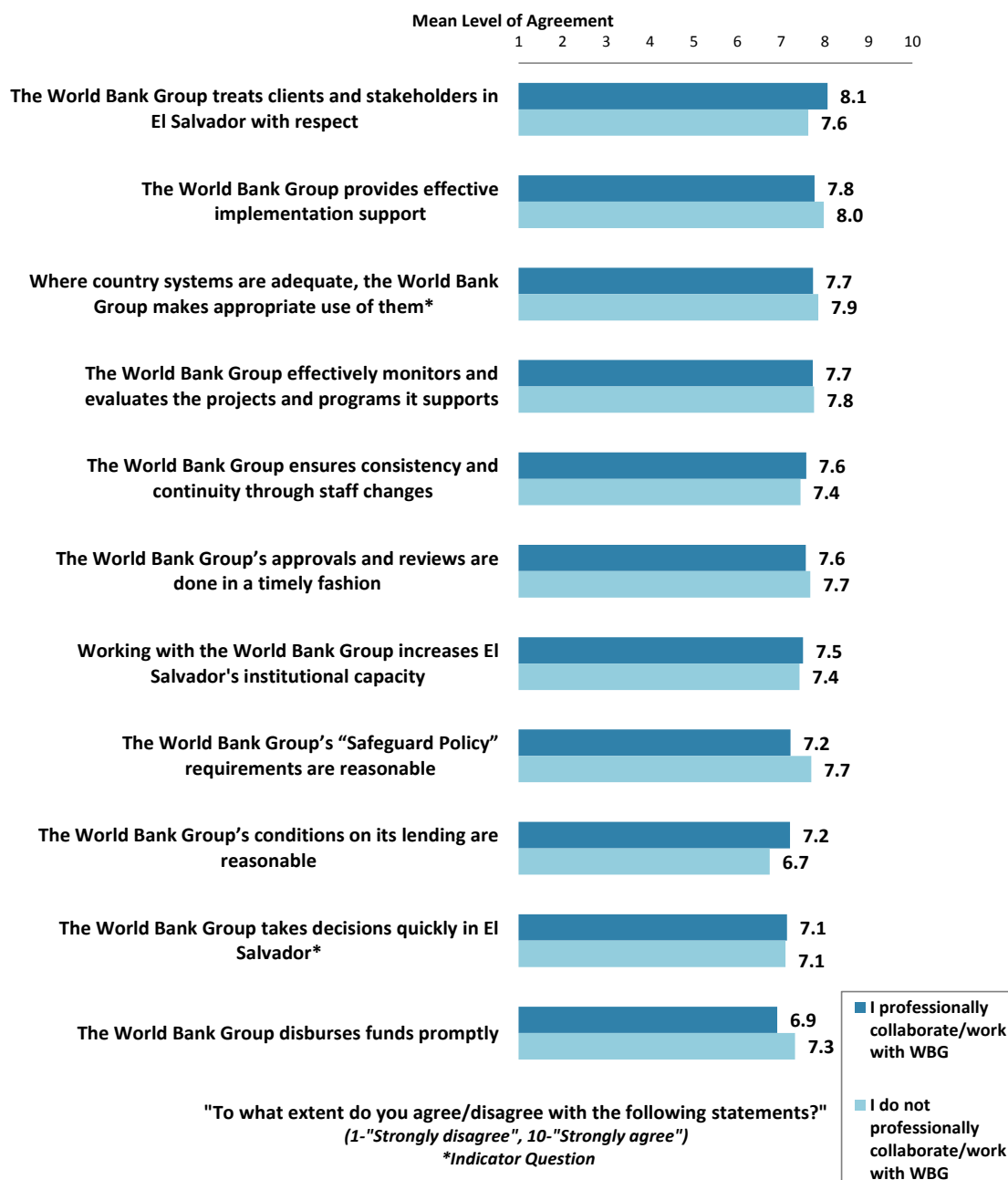
"To what extent do you agree/disagree with the following statements?"

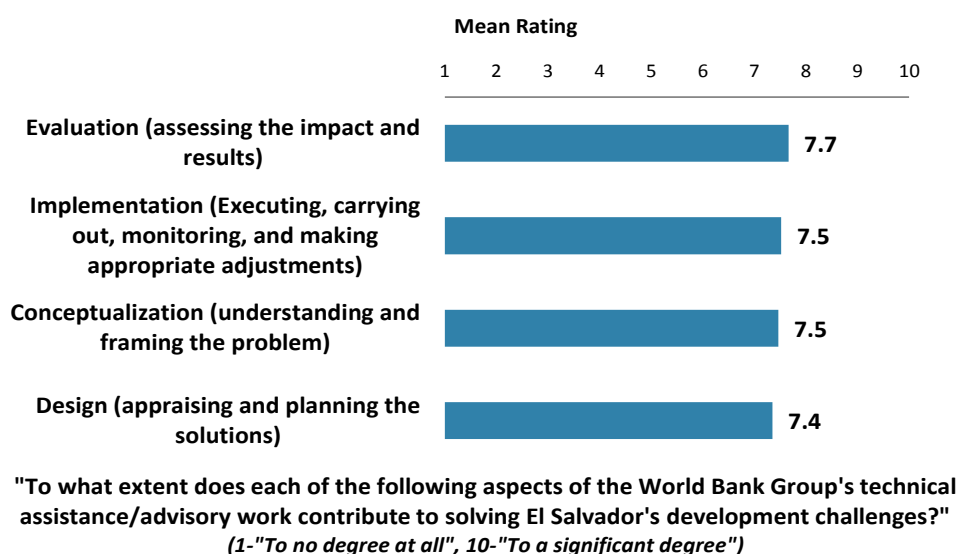

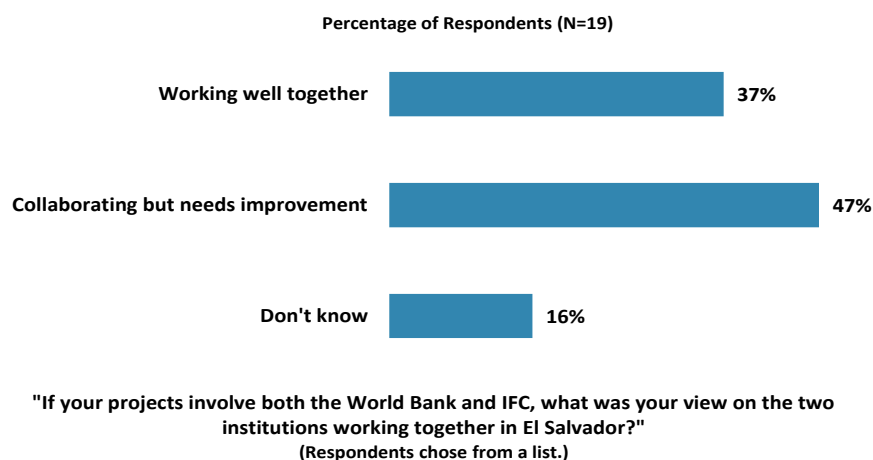

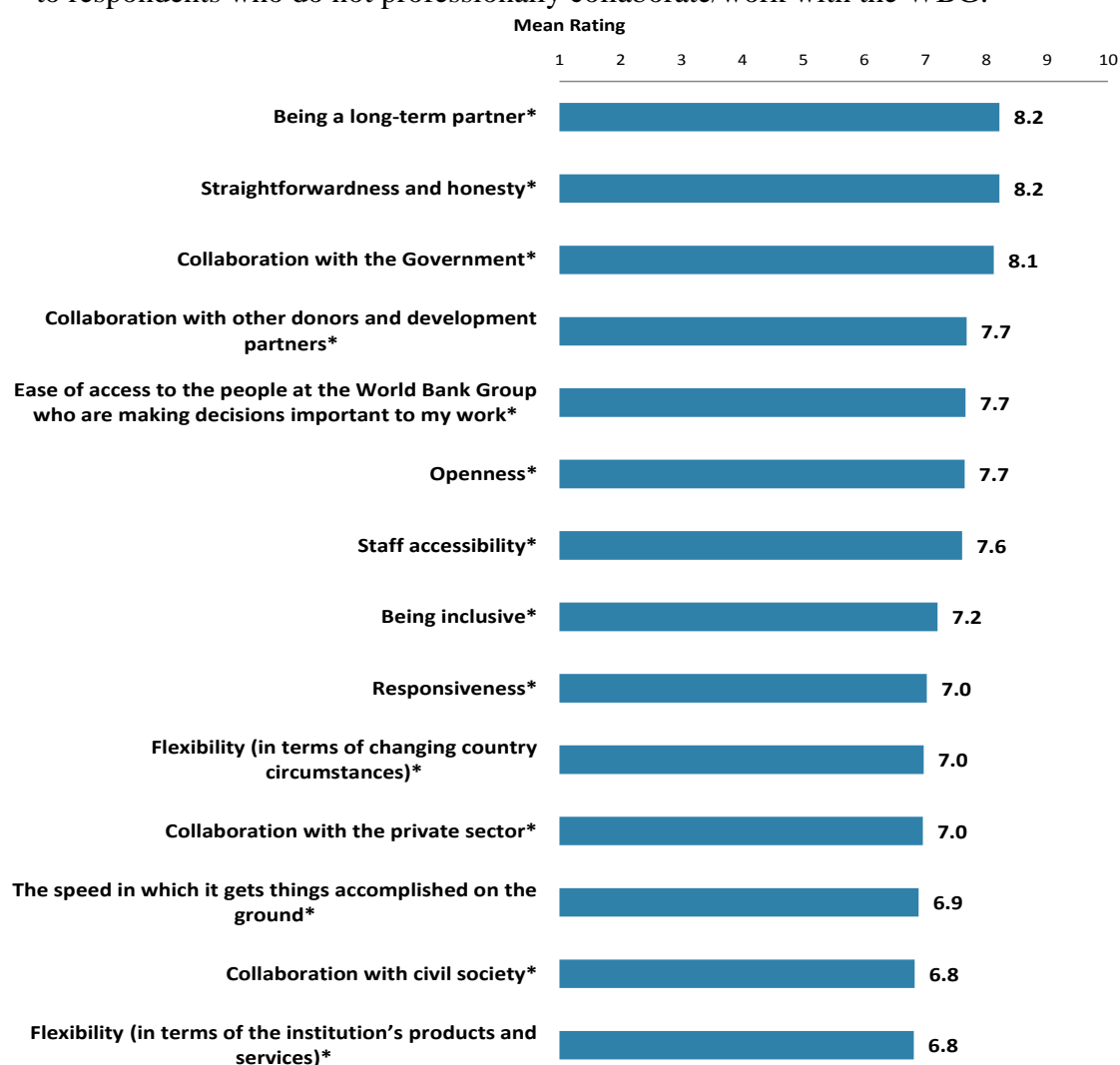
Collaboration between the World Bank and IFC

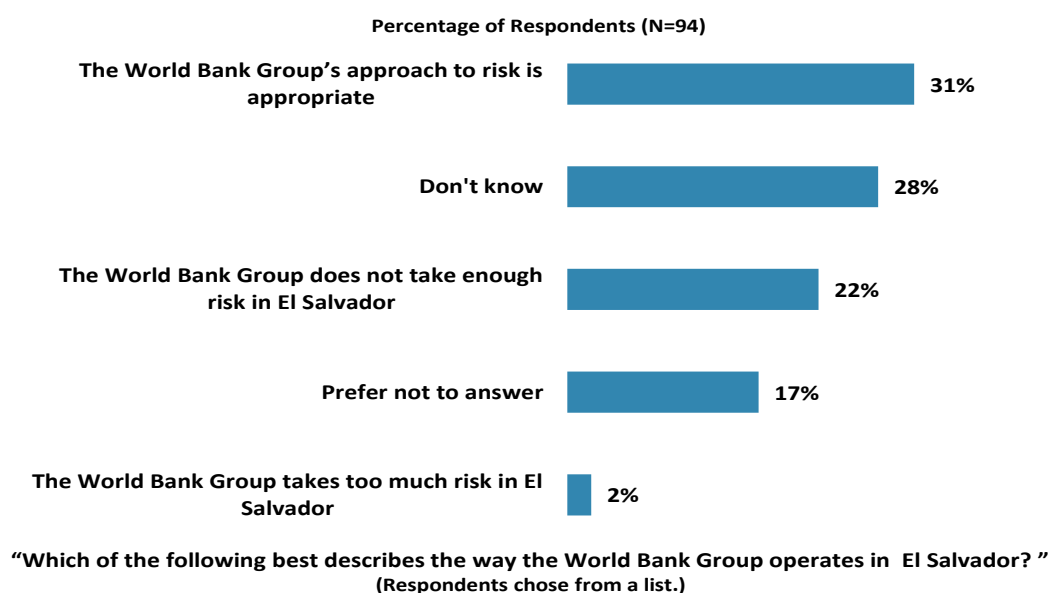


"To what extent is the World Bank Group an effective development partner in El Salvador, in terms of each of the following?" (1-"To no degree at all", 10-"To a very significant degree")

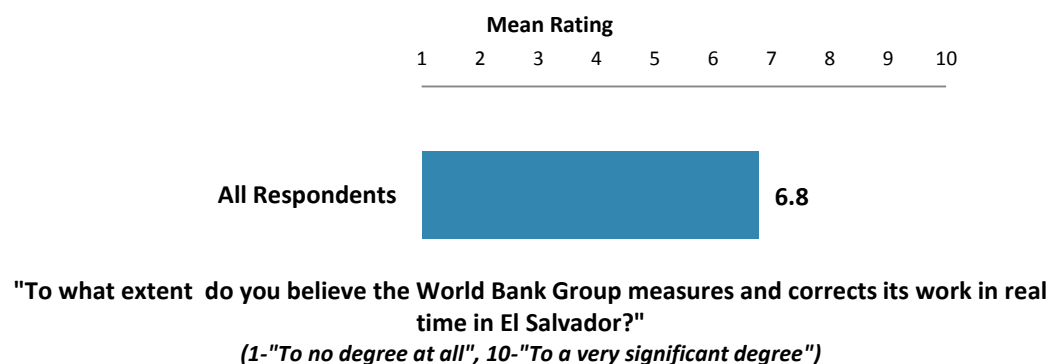

The World Bank Group's Approach to Risk in El Salvador

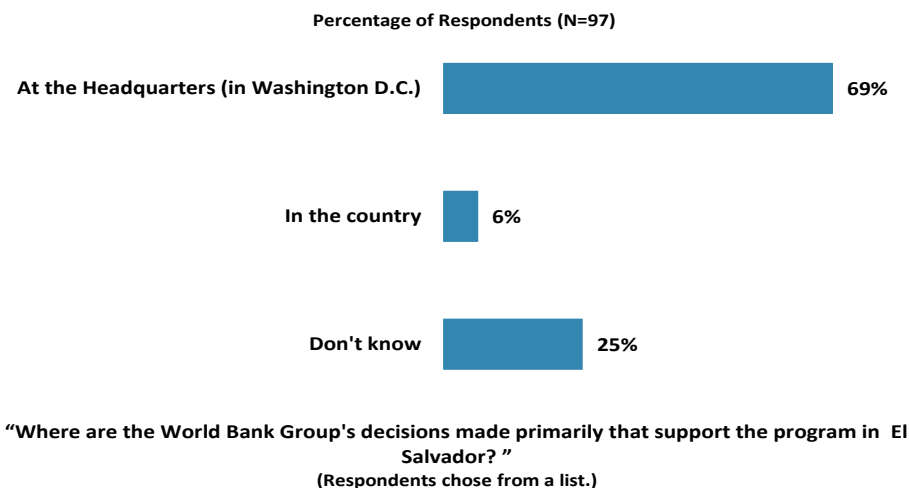


The World Bank Group's Internal Monitoring Mechanism

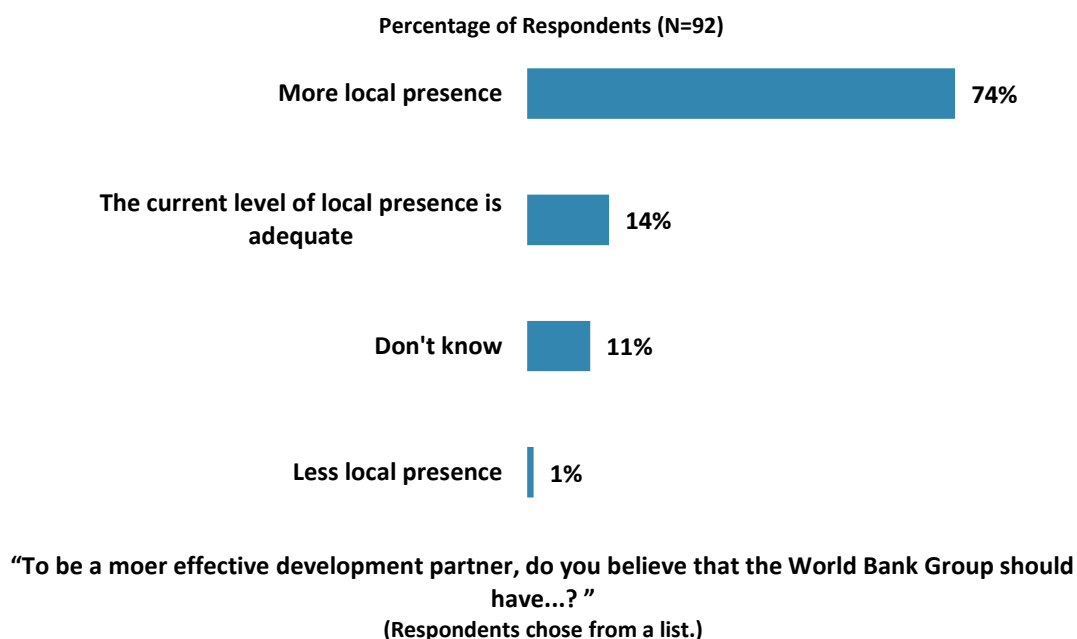

Making Decisions about the WBG Program in El Salvador



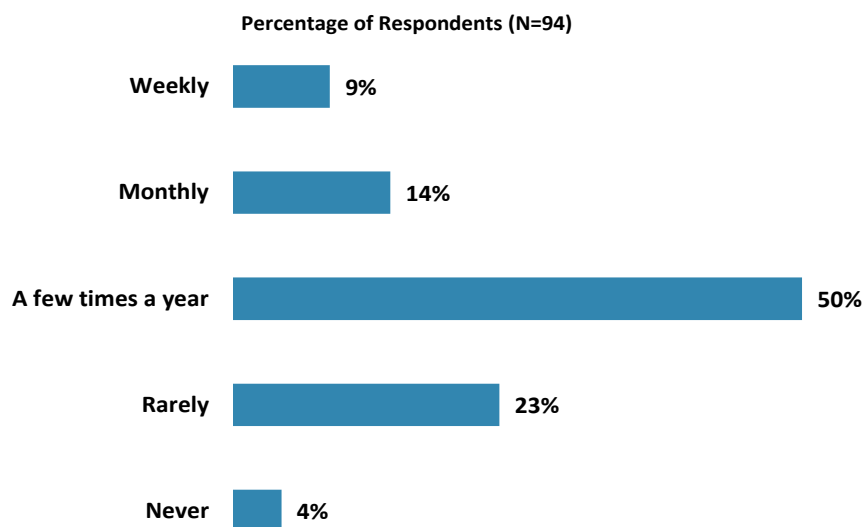
The World Bank Group’s Local Presence in El Salvador

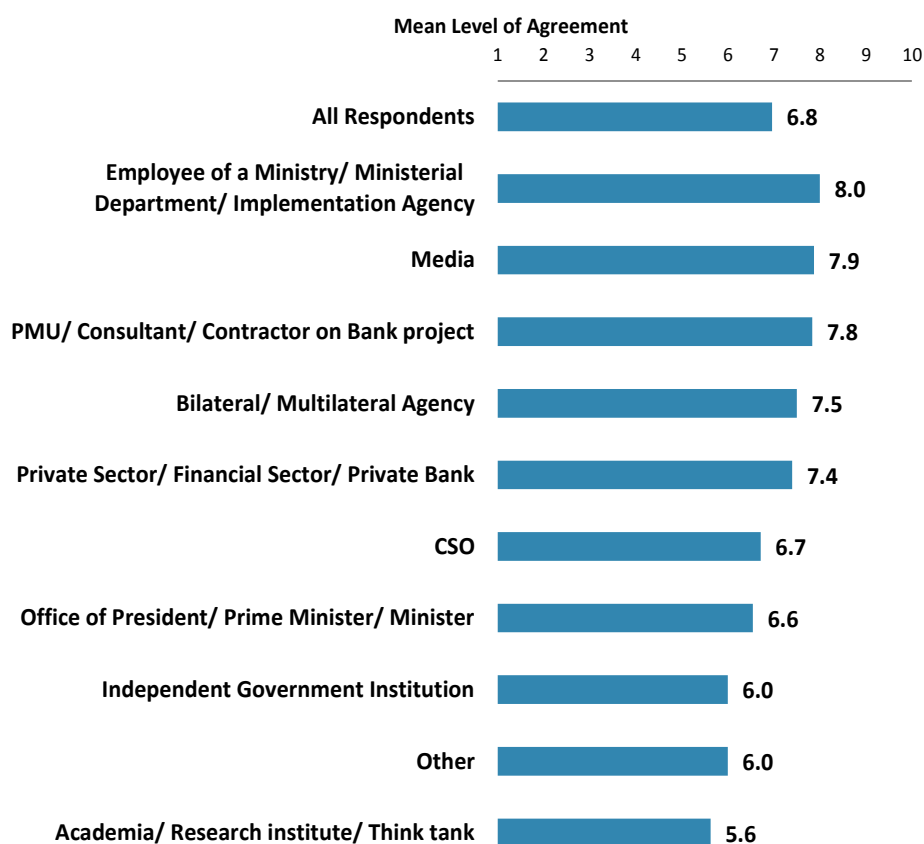


"How frequently do you consult World Bank Group knowledge work and activities in the work you do?" (Respondents chose from a list.)

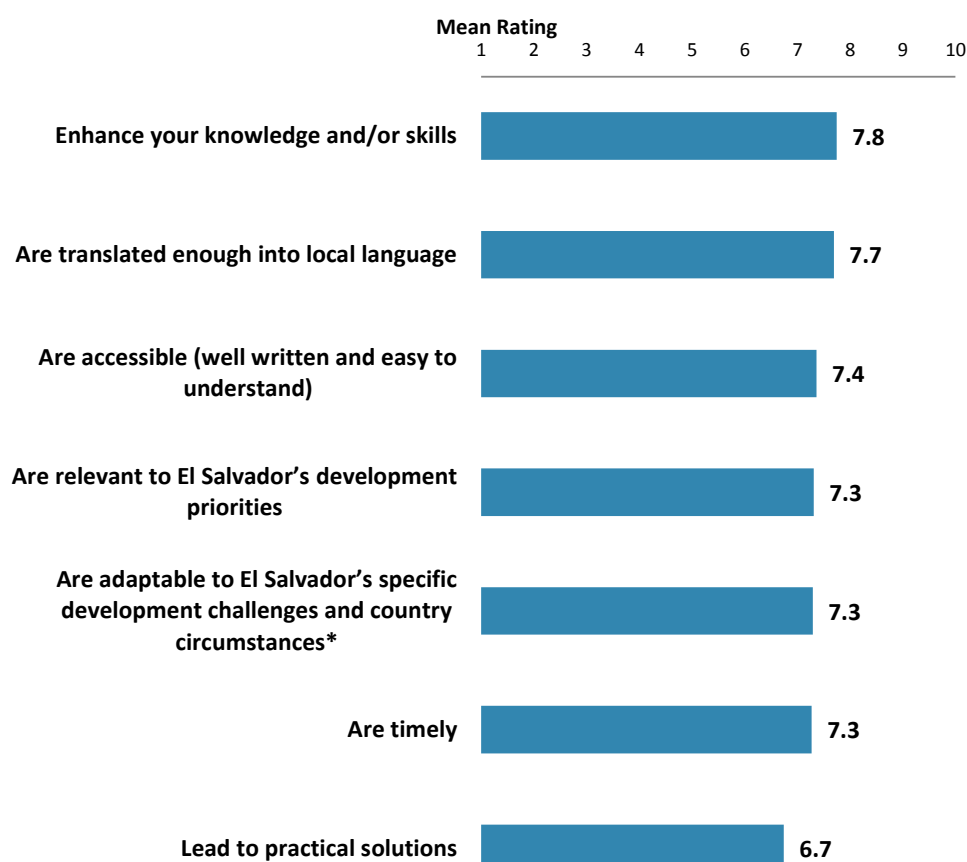


"The World Bank Group meets El Salvador's needs for knowledge services"

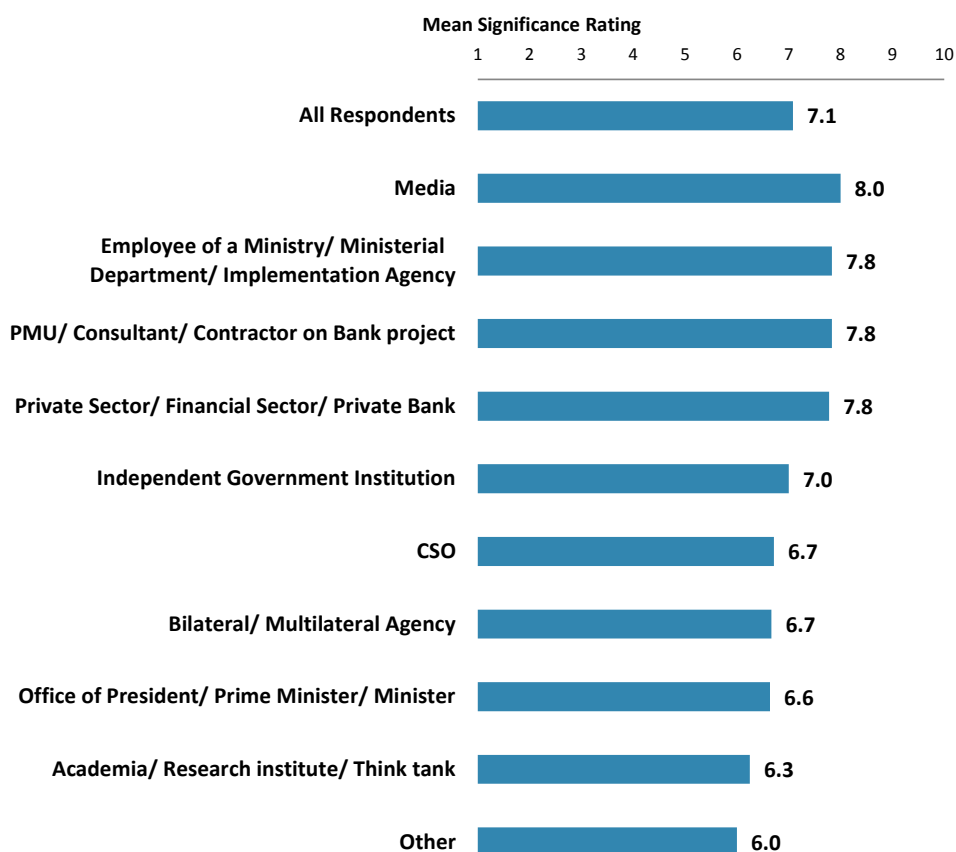
"In El Salvador, to what extent do you believe that the World Bank Group's knowledge work and activities:" (1-"To no degree at all", 10-"To a very significant degree")

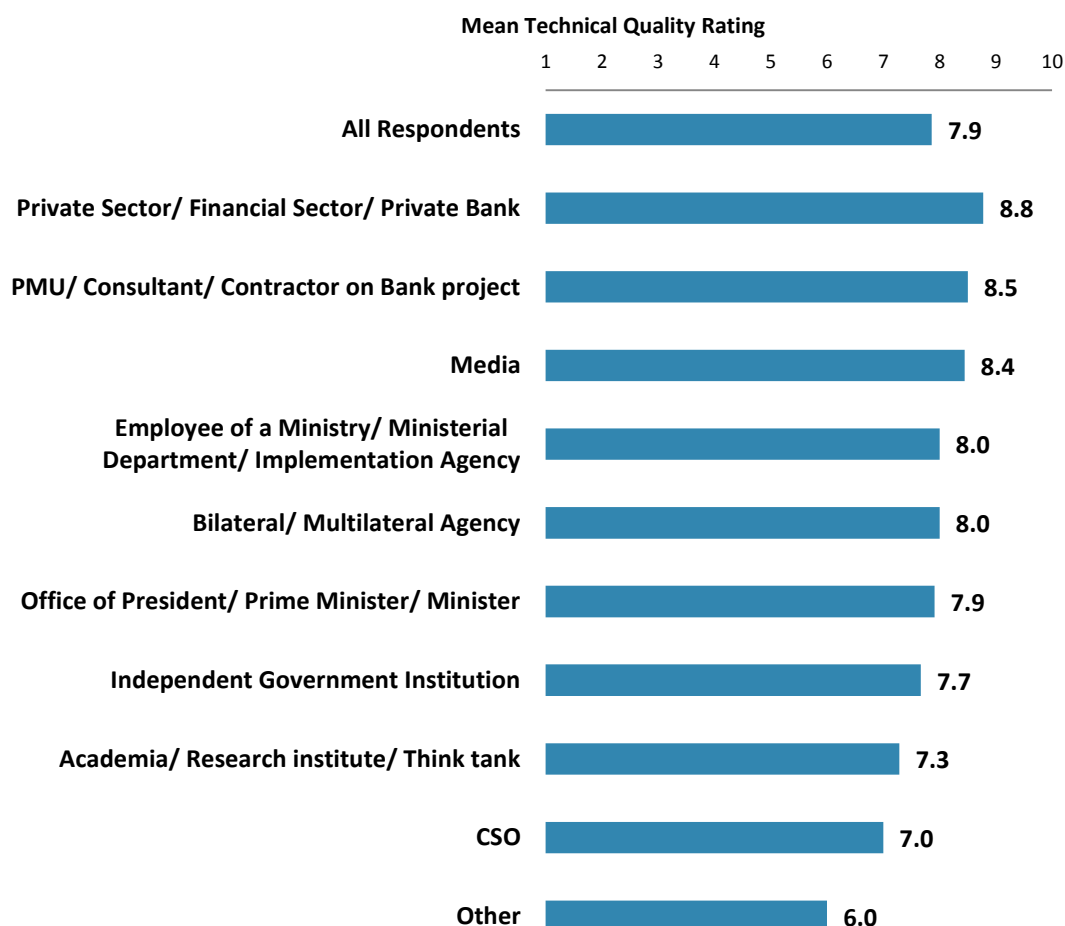


"Overall, how significant a contribution do you believe the World Bank Group's knowledge work and activities make to development results in your country?"

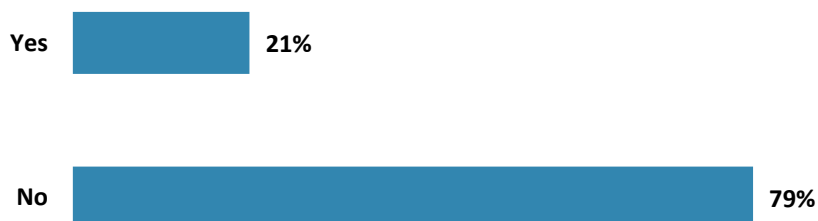
"Overall, how would you rate the technical quality of the World Bank Group's knowledge work and activities?"

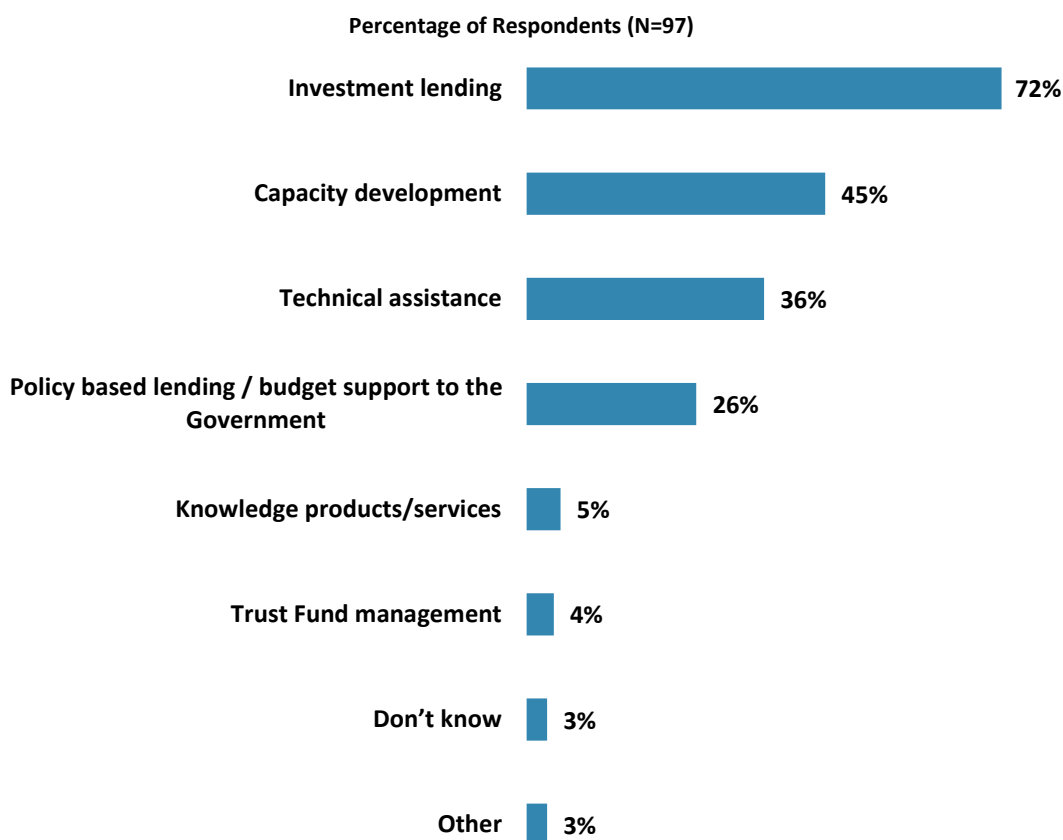

Most Effective Instruments in Reducing Poverty

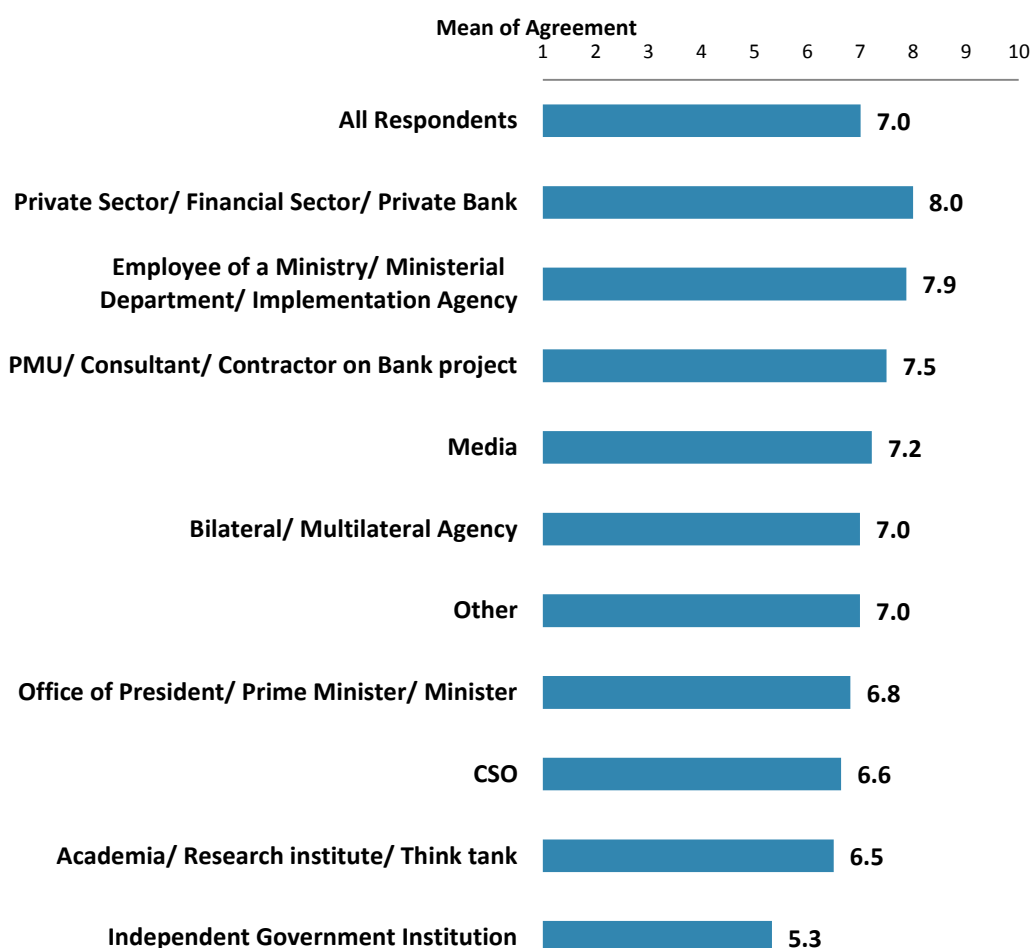


“Which World Bank Group instruments do you believe are the MOST effective in reducing poverty in El Salvador? (Choose no more than TWO)”

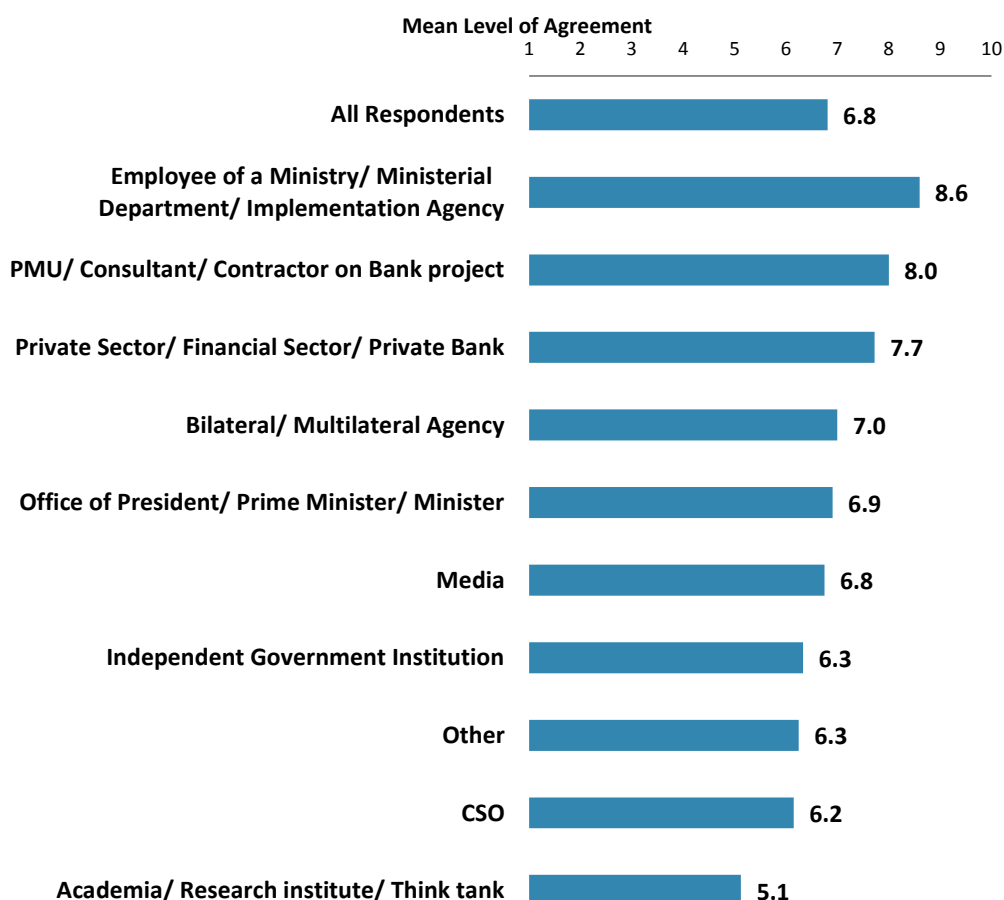

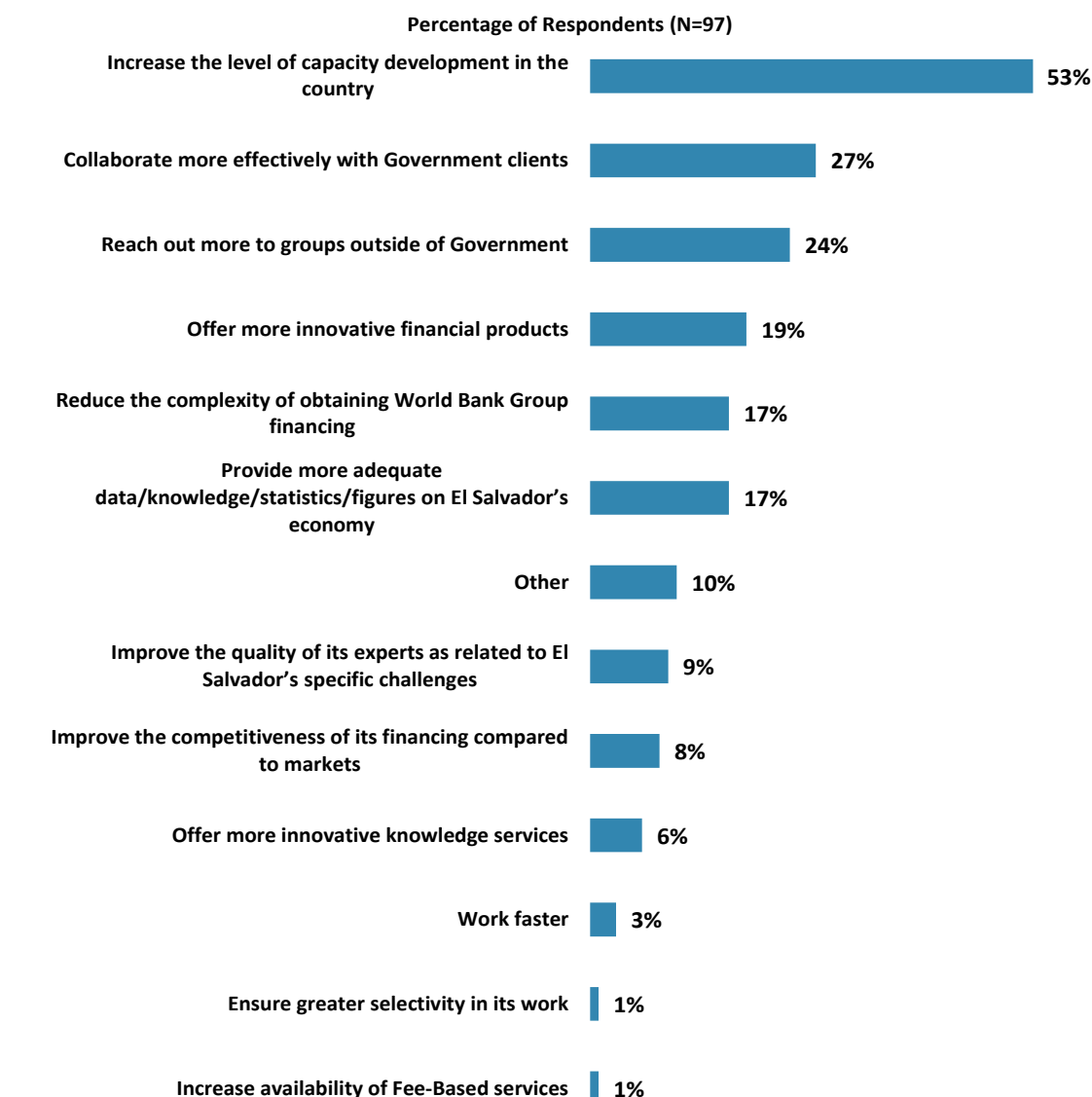

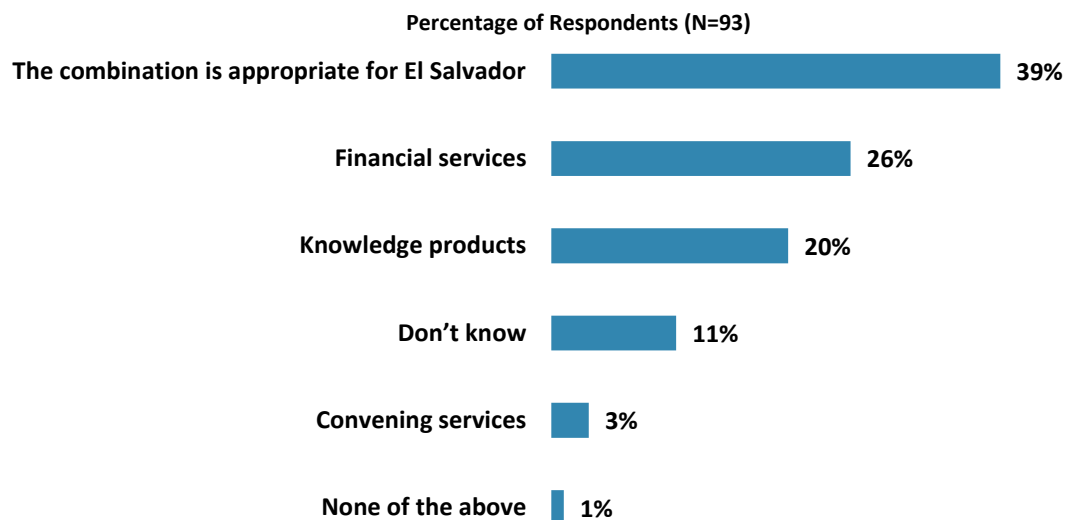
Making the World Bank Group of Greater Value

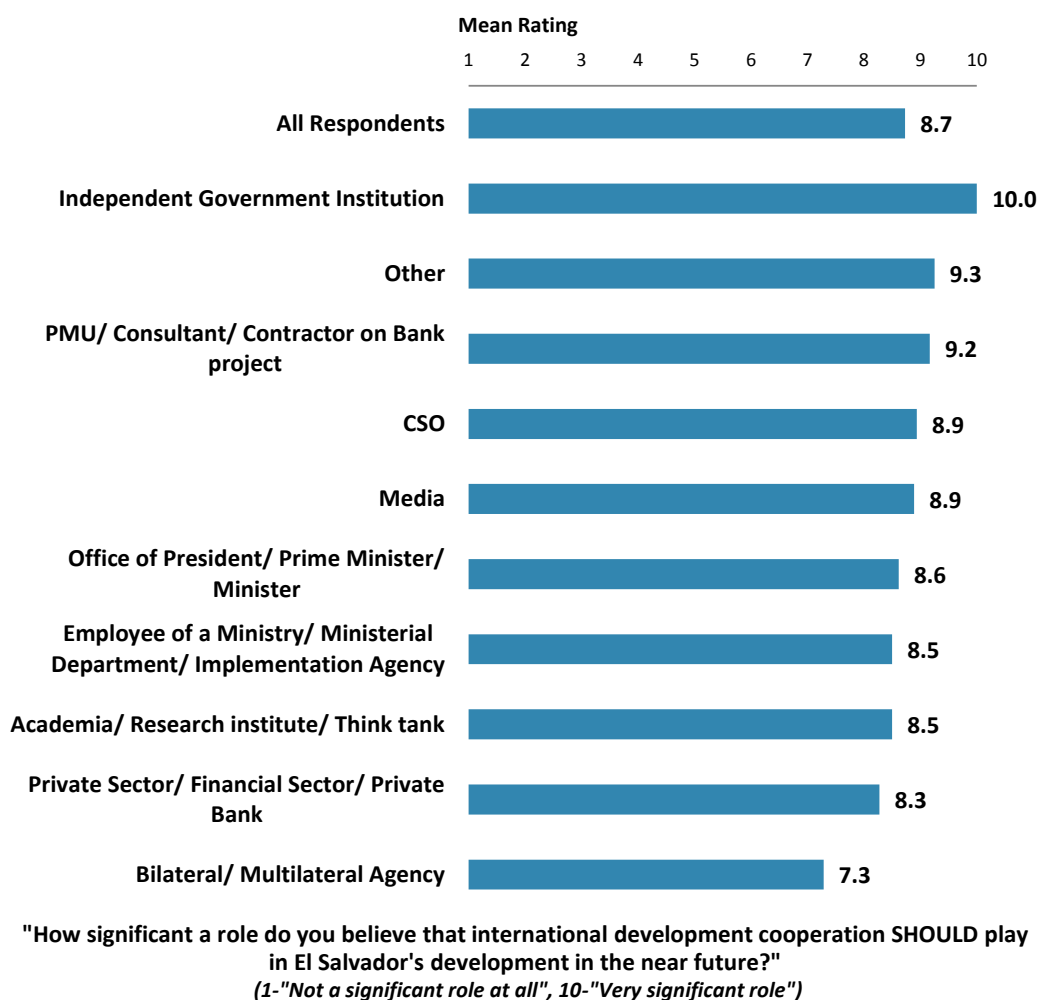

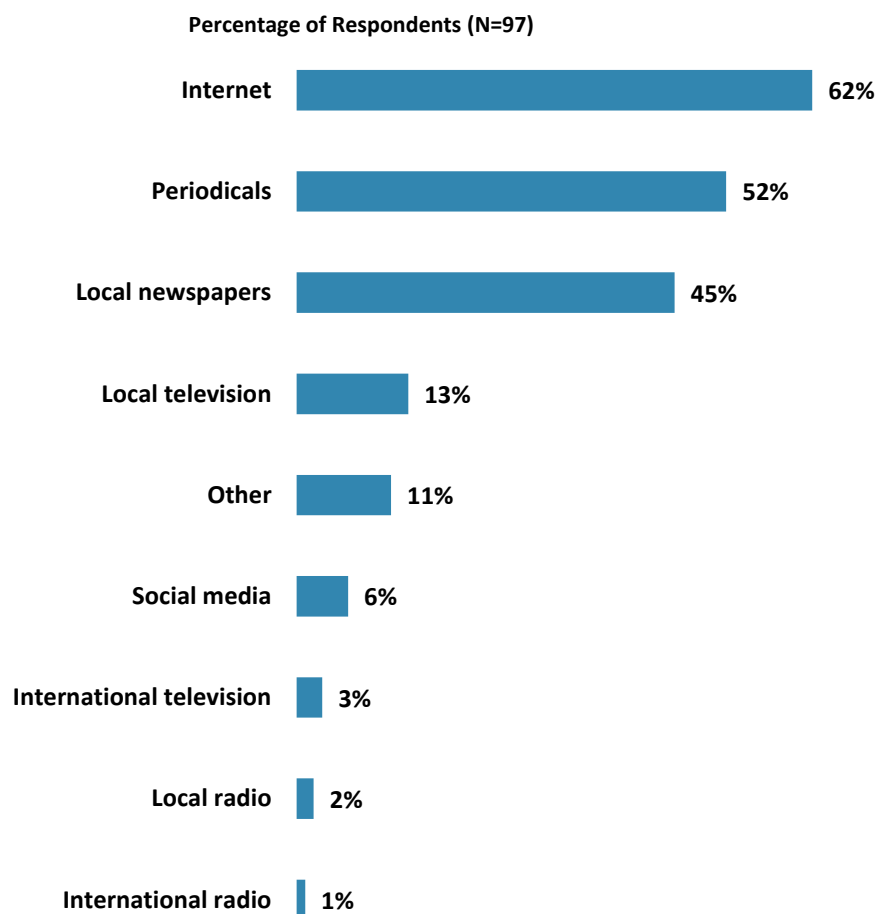
Future Role of International Development in El Salvador

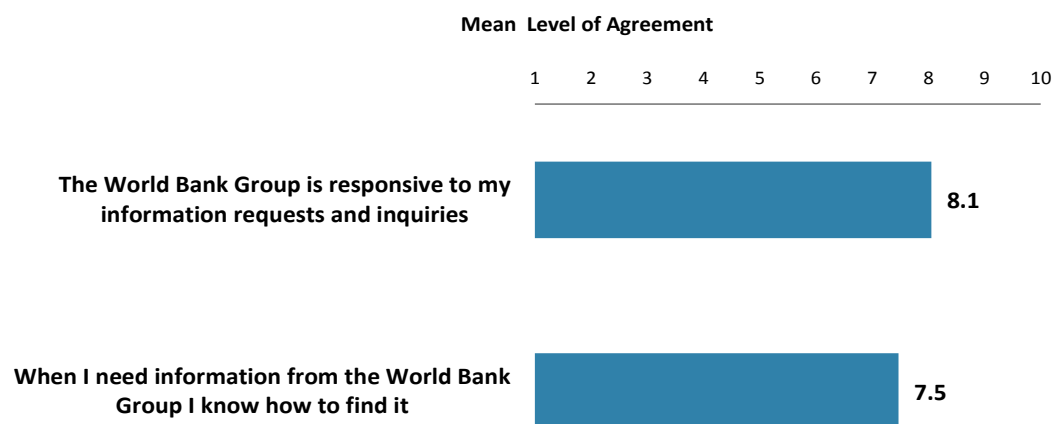
