## Section 4. Furniture, furnishings and household equipment and upkeep

Beds, chairs, tables, sofas etc.

Carpets, mats, linoleum, vinyl tiles

**Section 5. Medical care and health expenses**

Include here all payments made on drugs and items such as elastoplast and other first aid equipment. Also spectacles, hearing aids etc. Doctor and dentist fees should be entered here, as well as for hospital treatment. Premiums for health insurance are also to be recorded in this section. (see foot of page)

Communication covers expenditure on postal, telephone and telegraph services.
