Section 4. Furniture, furnishings and household equipment and upkeep

Beds, chairs, tables, sofas etc.

Carpets, mats, linoleum, vinyl tiles

Pictures, wall hanging, carved objects for decorative purposes

Repairs to furniture, fixtures, carpets etc.

Curtains, sheets, table cloths, napkins, towels, bedding

Ash-trays, candlesticks, mirrors, flower pots

Travelling rugs etc.

Washing machines, irons, sewing machines vacuum cleaners

Refrigerators, freezers, cold boxes A C. units

Electric cookers, toasters, electric fans, electric kettles and percolators

 also vehicle accessories and repairs, petrol
 and oil ,HP charges, insurance etc.

Also to be recorded are bus, taxi and air fares.

Communication covers expenditure on postal, telephone and telegraph services.
