### **TITLE PAGE**

1. Before starting the interview, make sure that you understand the meaning of the terms “Farming practice” and “farmer”

Learn the following definitions:

**FARMING PRACTICES: are the activities aimed at making the agricultural product.**

**FARMER: is a person actively involved in agricultural activity. In this survey it is also referred as WUA member, person who is interested in trainings, land user.**

2. Obtain the marz and cluster codes as well as the respondent ID from your field coordinator (FC). We recommend filling in the 2 first columns of the table before the start of the interview using the pencil and at the end marking with pen. Fill in the next 2 columns only when submitting the questionnaire to the FC, at his/her presence. After submitting the completed questionnaire to the FC, make sure that it is validated by the signature in the 5<sup>th</sup> column of the table.

3. Remember the opening paragraph. The success of the interview depends on your approach. Be kind and patient. Gain respondent’s cooperation, make him interested by emphasizing the importance of the information he provides.

CULTIVATED LAND: is the land which is allowed to use for agricultural purposes only.

KITCHEN PLOT: is the land on which you can also build a house.

LAND USE: is the use of land or kitchen plot for farming purposes during last agricultural season.

**B. ROSTER OF CROPS GROWN DURING THE LAST AGRICULTURAL SEASON AND CHANGES THEREIN**

**Make sure that you understand the term “last ag. Season.”**

**LAST AG. SEASON: the time period from the first óÝùÇó in 2007 (including greenhouses) until now.**

1. Note, that the question also refers to the kitchen plot. Fully familiarize yourself with Card 1 so as you easily find the appropriate codes for the crops. In case, if the plots are not cultivated during the last season, and there are no crops on the kitchen plot circle the code 66 and make a skip. If the lands are cultivated then start filling in from the “Item” column, recording the first code. Then fill in line by line for each crop item filling in the next columns.

Record the appropriate option code in the Column ”1“ next to the “Item” column.

In the column “how much was cultivated” record only the square meters. “Number of trees” should be recorded only in cases when very few fruit trees are reported. For the question “how much was

sold” fill in only the columns for tons and drams, do not leave empty any cell. The answer should be recorded in tons, even if it is provided in kilograms.

The last column is for “barter” cases, when one product is exchanged with a different product.

**C. WATER USE**

Note, that 1 ha = 1000 sm. If appropriate, round the numbers. The first three options imply that the respondent uses primarily one irrigation/watering method. The following two options imply that the respondent uses several main methods. If the watering is not performed by a give mean, but a hyphen. Do not leave any cell empty.

The 6<sup>th</sup> column refers to the last month only. The education index is defined as follows: (1). Non-educated: illiterate, (2). Incomplete primary: up to third grade (3). Primary: third grade completed (4.) incomplete general secondary: did not complete the 8<sup>th</sup> grade (5). General secondary: 8 year of schooling (6). Incomplete secondary: did not complete the full 10 years of schooling (7.) secondary (full) 10 years of schooling (8.) secondary vocational: some collage education (9.) incomplete higher: up to three year of study in an institution of higher education (10). Higher: 4 and more years of study in an institution of higher education or a graduation diploma/degree 11. Post graduate: has a scientific degree. Note, that the columns 5 to 9 should be filled in for the farmer, his wife and their children at age of 16 and more.
