Fieldwork dates: From 22 November 2006 to 20 December 2006

Sample type: The survey was based on a representative sample of the population; both male and female respondents aged 16 years and above and who are residents in South Africa.

Fieldwork Institute: Markinor

Fieldwork methods: A face-to-face personal interviewing technique was used in respondents' homes using a probability sampling method.

Sample size: 2,988

Language: The questionnaire was translated Afrikaans, Zulu, Xhosa, South Sotho, Tswana and North Sotho (Pedi).
