I. Objectives

This survey was designed to assist the World Bank Group (WBG) in gaining a better understanding of how stakeholders in Bulgaria perceive the WBG. The survey explored:

- *General Issues facing Bulgaria*
- *Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group*
- *World Bank Group's Effectiveness and Results*
- *The World Bank Group's Knowledge Work and Activities*
- *Working with the World Bank Group*
- *The Future Role of the World Bank Group in Bulgaria*
- *Communication and Information Sharing*
- *Background Information*

II. Methodology

From May to June 2015, 495 stakeholders of the WBG in Bulgaria were invited to provide their opinions on the WBG's work in the country by participating in a Country Opinion Survey. Participants were drawn from the office of the President/Prime Minister, office of a Minister, office of a Parliamentarian, employees of ministries/ministerial departments/implementation agencies, Project Management Units (PMUs) overseeing implementation of a project or consultants working on WBG-supported projects, local governments, bilateral/multilateral agencies, private sector organizations, private foundations, the financial sector/private banks, NGOs/community-based organizations (CBOs), the media, independent government institutions, trade unions, faith-based groups, youth groups, academia/research institutes/think tanks, and the judiciary branch. A total of 183 stakeholders participated in the survey (37% response rate).

Respondents were asked to complete the questionnaire online (429 potential respondents) or received the questionnaire via post (66 potential respondents). Respondents were asked about: general issues facing Bulgaria; their overall attitudes toward the WBG; the WBG's effectiveness and results; the WBG's knowledge work and activities; working with the WBG; the WBG's future role in Bulgaria; and the WBG's communication and information sharing.

Every country that engages in the Country Opinion Survey must include specific indicator questions that will be aggregated for the World Bank Group's annual Corporate Scorecard. These questions are identified throughout the survey report.


The results in this year's Country Survey were compared to the Country Survey conducted in FY '12 (response rate was 43%, N=173). The data were weighted to reach similar stakeholder compositions across the two survey years, allowing for more statistically reliable comparisons. Stakeholder groups which were not present in both fiscal years were not included in these comparisons, nor were respondents who identified themselves as "other" in the stakeholder category options. As a result, mean ratings, percentages of respondents, and the total number of respondents in both years are slightly different from those of the original data reported in the FY '12 COS report and the non-weighted data presented in this report. III. Demographics of the Sample

Current Position

- For all further analyses, the small number of respondents from the financial sector/private banks were combined with those from private sector organizations. The few respondents from the office of a Parliamentarian, PMUs/Consultants on WBG projects, local government, private foundations, and trade unions were included in the “Other” category. Note that there were no respondents from faith-based groups, youth groups, or the judiciary branch.




“Which of the following best describes your current position? (Select only ONE response)”

Area of Primary Specialization






Geographic Location

Exposure to Agencies within the World Bank Group




"Which of the following agencies of the World Bank Group do you primarily engage with in Bulgaria? (Select only ONE response)" (Respondents choose from a list)


Collaboration with the WBG

- For all further analyses, respondents who indicated that they had previously collaborated with the WBG were combined with those who had never collaborated to make one group of those not currently collaborating with the WBG, and those who indicated both (that they currently collaborate and had collaborated in the past) were combined with those who currently collaborate to create one group of those currently collaborating.

Exposure to the WBG in Bulgaria





Familiarity with the World Bank Group

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey had significantly *lower* ratings of familiarity with the WBG (weighted mean = 5.7) compared to respondents from the FY '12 Country Survey (weighted mean = 6.8)¹.
- **Stakeholders:** As shown in the chart below, respondents from government institutions had significantly higher ratings of familiarity with the WBG compared to respondents from those outside of government.
- **Impact of Familiarity:** Respondents' levels of familiarity with the WBG were significantly, moderately correlated with their perceptions of the WBG's overall effectiveness in Bulgaria, the extent to which the WBG achieves development results in Bulgaria, and agreement that the WBG plays a relevant role in development in Bulgaria.

(1 - "Not familiar at all", 10 - "Extremely familiar")



IV. General Issues Facing Bulgaria

Headed in the Right Direction

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey were significantly *less* likely to indicate that Bulgaria is headed in the right direction (weighted percentage of respondents = 58%) compared to respondents from the FY '12 Country Survey (weighted percentage of respondents = 76%)².



"In general, would you say that Bulgaria is headed in ... ?" (Respondents chose from a list.)



IV. General Issues Facing Bulgaria (continued)

Development Priority

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY'12 Country Survey indicated that the most important development priority in Bulgaria was economic growth (70%), followed by education (41%), convergence with EU living standards (28%), business environment and private sector development (26%), law and justice (23%), and health (20%).
- **Education sector:** Respondents from the education sector were significantly more likely to indicate that education was the most important development priority in Bulgaria (89%) compared to respondents from all other sectors (46%). Respondents from all other sectors were more likely to indicate economic growth (54%) and law and justice (49%) as the most important development priorities for Bulgaria.





What Would Contribute Most to Reducing Poverty

- **Education sector:** Respondents from the education sector were more likely to indicate that education would contribute most to reducing poverty in Bulgaria (68%) compared to respondents from all other sectors (49%); however, this difference did not reach statistical significance and respondents from other sectors were still most likely to indicate education as contributing most to reducing poverty in Bulgaria.





Factors Contributing to “Shared Prosperity”

- **Education sector:** Respondents from the education sector were significantly more likely to indicate that education and training that better ensure job opportunity would contribute most to “Shared Prosperity” in Bulgaria (71%) compared to respondents from all other sectors (51%). Respondents from all other sectors were more likely to indicate that consistent economic growth would contribute most (50%) compared to respondents from the education sector (36%), but this difference did not reach statistical significance.









V. Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group

Attributing Failed/Slow Reform Efforts

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY'12 Country Survey indicated that they most often attributed failed or slow World Bank assisted reform efforts to reforms not being well thought out in light of country challenges (35%), inadequate government capacity (32%), the government working inefficiently (32%), or an inadequate level of citizen/civil society participation (29%).



The World Bank Group’s Overall Effectiveness (*Indicator Question*)


- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year’s Country Survey had statistically similar ratings for the WBG’s overall effectiveness in Bulgaria compared to respondents from the FY ’12 Country Survey.
- **Stakeholders:** Respondents from the office of a Minister had the highest ratings for the WBG’s overall effectiveness in Bulgaria whereas respondents from NGOs/CBOS and academia had significantly lower ratings.


"To what extent does the World Bank Group’s work help to achieve development results in Bulgaria?" (1 - "To no degree at all", 10 - "To a very significant degree")

WBG Staff Preparedness



World Bank and IFC Working Together

- **Stakeholders:** Respondents from the office of the President/Prime Minister were the only stakeholder groups to indicate that the World Bank and IFC do not work well together. The full breakdown of stakeholder group responding to this question can be found in Appendix B (see page 67).

Overall Ratings for Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups

- **Stakeholders:** Although there was a strong trend that respondents from the office of a Minister had the highest mean rating for the aggregated responses to the twenty-five COS indicator questions and respondents from academia, NGOs/CBOs, private sector/financial sector/private banks, and other organizations had the lowest mean ratings, this difference did not reach statistical significance. Responses for individual indicator questions by stakeholder groups can be found in Appendix G (see page 122).
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who are currently collaborating with the WBG had significantly higher ratings across the aggregated responses to the twenty-five COS indicator questions (mean rating = 7.3) compared to respondents who are not collaborating with the WBG (mean rating = 6.5). Responses for individual indicator questions by collaboration can be found in Appendix F (see page 121).




Mean Ratings for All Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups on a Scale from 1 to 10

Greatest Value

- **Year comparison:** Over half of all respondents in the FY '12 Country Survey indicated that the World Bank's greatest value to Bulgaria was its knowledge and advisory services (52%). The Bank's financial resources were also considered of great value (44%).









Greatest Weakness

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY '12 Country Survey indicated that the World Bank's greatest weaknesses in its work in Bulgaria were not enough public disclosure of its work (23%), being too influenced by developed countries (23%), and imposing technocratic solutions without regard to political realities (22%).





VI. Sectoral Importance and Effectiveness

Importance of WBG's Support in Sectoral Areas

- **Stakeholders:** Respondents from the office of the President/Prime Minister had significantly lower ratings of importance for the WBG's involvement in agricultural development, trade and exports, and rural development compared to respondents from other stakeholder groups.
- **Education sector:** Respondents from the education sector had higher ratings of importance for the WBG's involvement in education (mean rating = 9.3) compared to respondents from all other sectors (mean rating = 8.6); however, this difference did not reach statistical significance.





Effectiveness of WBG's Support in Sectoral Areas³

- **Stakeholders:** There were significant stakeholder group differences across several development areas. For the most part, respondents from bilateral/multilateral agencies tended to have the highest ratings for the WBG's effectiveness across these areas whereas respondents from the office of the President/Prime Minister tended to have significantly lower ratings. Comparisons of stakeholder groups' effectiveness ratings by can be found in Appendix B (see page 67).
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who are collaborating with the WBG had significantly higher ratings for the WBG's effectiveness in basic infrastructure/transport and water supply/sanitation compared to respondents who are not collaborating with the WBG. A full breakdown of ratings by collaboration can be found in Appendix C (see page 87).







Drivers of Effectiveness

To determine the key drivers of respondents' ratings of the World Bank Group's overall effectiveness and ratings of its ability to help achieve development results in Bulgaria, bivariate correlational analyses were conducted using respondents' ratings of the twenty specific areas of effectiveness.

Correlational analyses, however, are not able to tell us exactly what is causing respondents' ratings of the World Bank Group's overall effectiveness or ratings of its ability to help achieve development results. Rather, these analyses tell us that as ratings of effectiveness in one area increase, respondents' ratings of the Bank Group's overall effectiveness increase, or as ratings of effectiveness in one area increase, ratings of the WBG's ability to help achieve development results increase. Thus, it can be inferred that respondents' perceptions of effectiveness in one specific area are related to, or drive, respondents' perceptions of the Bank Group's overall effectiveness or perceptions of the WBG's ability to help achieve development results.

- Overall Effectiveness: Those specific areas with the highest Pearson Product-Moment correlations were determined to be the most closely related to perceptions of the Bank Group's overall effectiveness, suggesting that ratings of effectiveness in those specific areas are drivers of perceptions of the Bank Group's overall effectiveness in Bulgaria. The areas determined to be key drivers from these analyses were:
 - The WBG's effectiveness at energy and energy efficiency;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at water supply and sanitation;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at basic infrastructure and transport; and
 - The WBG's effectiveness at public financial management.


- Achieving Development Results: Those specific areas with the highest Pearson Product-Moment correlations were determined to be the most closely related to perceptions of the WBG's ability to help achieve development results in Bulgaria, suggesting that ratings of effectiveness in those specific areas are drivers of perceptions of the WBG's ability to help achieve development results. The areas determined to be key drivers from these analyses were:
 - The WBG's effectiveness at energy and energy efficiency;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at economic growth;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at social protection;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at public financial management; and
 - The WBG's effectiveness at education.

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY'12 Country Survey and this year's Country Survey had statistically similar levels of agreement regarding these aspects of the WBG's work in Bulgaria.
- **Stakeholders:** Respondents from media had the highest levels of agreement that the WBG currently plays a relevant role in development work in Bulgaria whereas respondents from NGOs/CBOs had significantly lower levels of agreement.
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who collaborate with the WBG had significantly higher levels of agreement across these aspects of the WBG's work in Bulgaria compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG.



- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY'12 Country Survey and this year's Country Survey had statistically similar levels of agreement regarding these aspects of how the WBG operates in Bulgaria.
- **Stakeholders:** Respondents from media and office of a Minister had the highest levels of agreement that the WBG takes decisions quickly in Bulgaria whereas respondents from private sector/financial sector/private banks had significantly lower levels of agreement.




"To what extent do you agree/disagree with the following statements?"

The WBG as an Effective Development Partner

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY'12 Country Survey and this year's Country Survey had statistically similar ratings regarding these aspects of the WBG as an effective development partner in Bulgaria.
- **Stakeholders:** Employees of ministries and respondents from the office of a Minister and the media had the highest ratings for the WBG's responsiveness whereas respondents from the office of the President/Prime Minister, bilateral/multilateral agencies, academia, and other organizations had significantly lower ratings. Employees of ministries and respondents from the office of a Minister and the media had the highest ratings for the WBG's institutional flexibility whereas respondents from the office of the President/Prime Minister, private sector/financial sector/private banks, and NGOs/CBOs had significantly lower ratings.







The WBG's Approach to Risk in Bulgaria




"Which of the following best describes the way the World Bank Group operates in Bulgaria? (Select only ONE response)" (Respondents chose from a list.)




VIII. World Bank Group's Knowledge and Instruments

Frequency of Consulting WBG Knowledge Work/Activities

- **Stakeholders:** Respondents the office of the President/Prime Minister, the office of a Minister, and independent government institutions indicated the most frequent usage of the WBG's knowledge work and activities whereas respondents from the media indicated significantly less frequent usage.
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who are currently collaborating with the WBG indicated significantly most frequent usage of the WBG's knowledge work and activities (27% weekly/monthly) than respondents who are not collaborating with the WBG (52% rarely/never).



- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY'12 Country Survey and this year's Country Survey had statistically similar levels of agreement that the WBG meets Bulgaria's needs for knowledge services.
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who collaborate with the WBG had significantly higher levels of agreement that the WBG meets Bulgaria's needs for knowledge services (mean rating = 7.6) compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 6.3).


"Overall, how would you rate the technical quality of the World Bank Group's knowledge work and activities?" (1-"Very low technical quality", 10-"Very high technical quality")




"The World Bank Group's financial instruments meet the needs of Bulgaria."



Selectivity of the World Bank Group's Support








"In addition to the regular relations with the national government, which TWO of the following groups should the World Bank Group collaborate with more in your country? (Choose no more than TWO)"






"How do you get most of your information about economic and social development issues in Bulgaria? (Choose no more than TWO)" (Respondents chose from a list. Responses combined.)


"How would you prefer to receive information from the World Bank Group?



"Have you requested information from the World Bank Group on its activities in the past year?"






