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I. Objectives

This survey was designed to assist the World Bank Group (WBG) in gaining a better understanding of how stakeholders in Croatia perceive the WBG. The survey explored:

- *General Issues facing Croatia*
- *Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group*
- *World Bank Group's Sectoral Effectiveness and Results*
- *The World Bank Group's Knowledge Work and Activities*
- *Working with the World Bank Group*
- *The Future Role of the World Bank Group in Croatia*
- *Communication and Information Sharing*
- *Background Information*

II. Methodology

From June to September 2015, 871 stakeholders of the WBG in Croatia were invited to provide their opinions on the WBG's work in the country by participating in a Country Opinion Survey. Participants were drawn from the office of the President/Prime Minister, office of a Minister, office of a Parliamentarian, employees of ministries/ministerial departments/implementation agencies, Project Management Units (PMUs) overseeing implementation of a project or consultants/contractors working on WBG-supported projects/programs, local governments, bilateral/multilateral agencies, private sector organizations, private foundations, the financial sector/private banks, NGOs/community-based organizations (CBOs), the media, independent government institutions, trade unions, faith-based groups, youth groups, academia/research institutes/think tanks, the judiciary branch, and the European Commission. A total of 175 stakeholders participated in the survey (20% response rate).

Respondents received an email invitation to take the questionnaire and completed the questionnaire via an online platform. Respondents were asked about: general issues facing Croatia, their overall attitudes toward the WBG, the WBG's effectiveness and results, WBG's knowledge work and activities, working with the WBG, the WBG's future role in Croatia, and the WBG's communication and information sharing.

Every country that engages in the Country Opinion Survey must include specific indicator questions that will be aggregated for the World Bank Group's annual Corporate Scorecard. These questions are identified throughout the survey report.

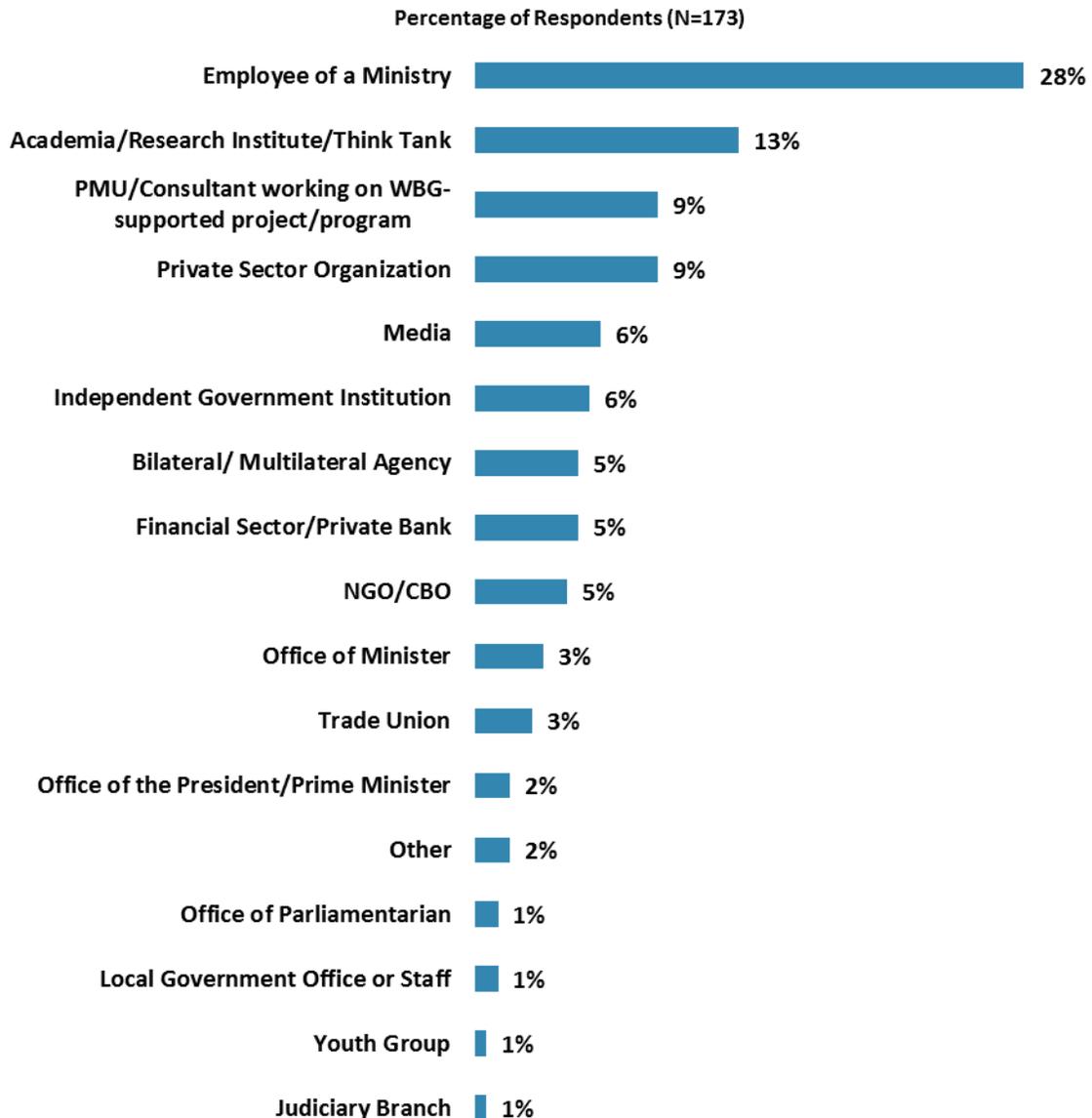
The results of this year's Country Survey were compared to the Country Survey conducted in FY '12 (response rate was 29%, N=198). The data were weighted to reach similar stakeholder compositions across the two survey years, allowing for more statistically reliable comparisons. Stakeholders who identified themselves as "other" in the stakeholder category options were not included in these comparisons. As a result, mean ratings, percentages of respondents, and the total number of respondents in both years are slightly different from those of the original data reported in the FY '12 COS report and the non-weighted data presented in this report. 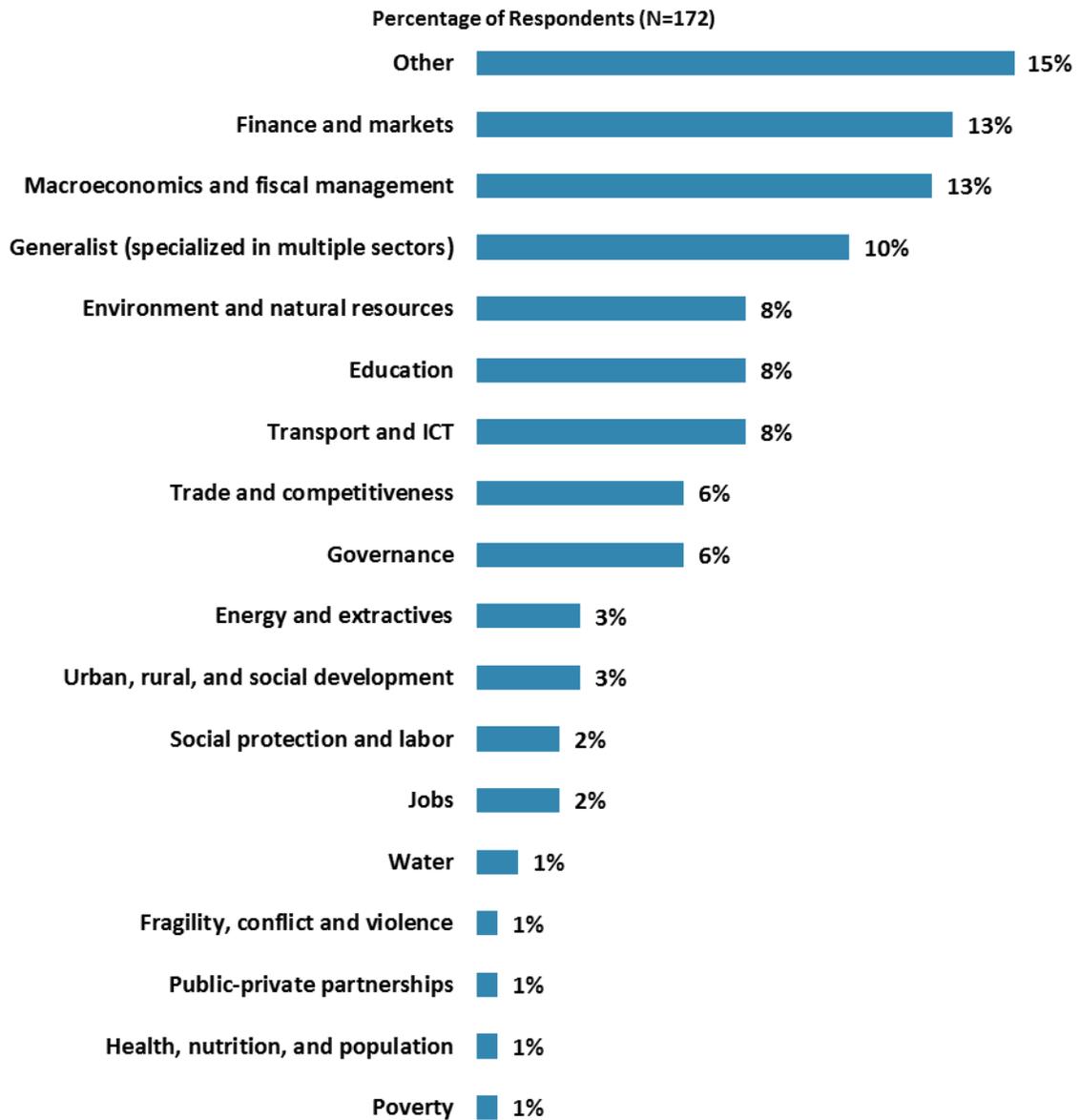


“Which of the following best describes your current position? (Select only ONE response)”

Area of Primary Specialization



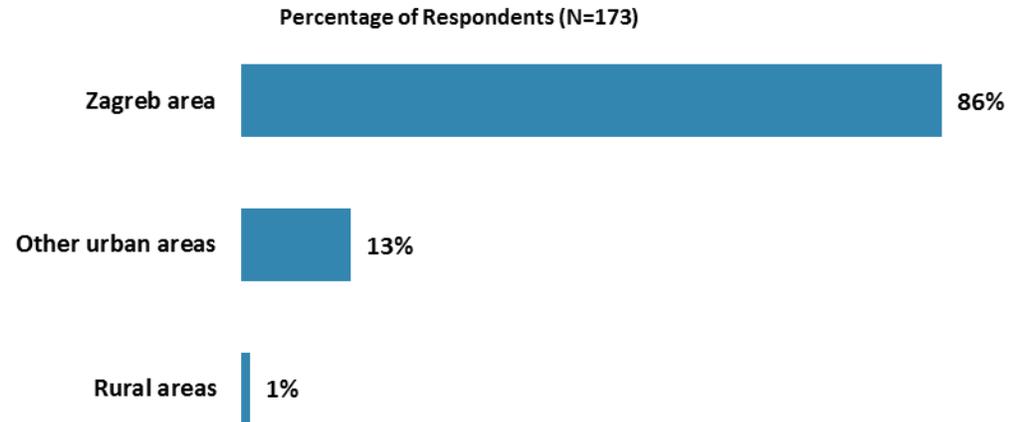

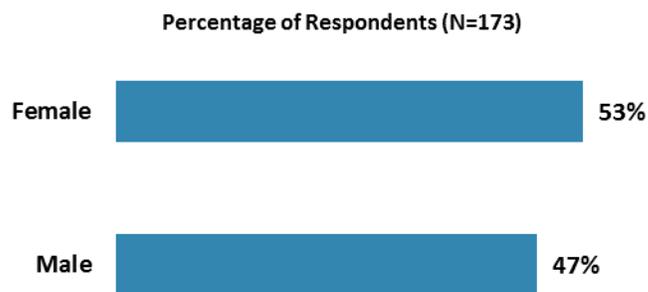

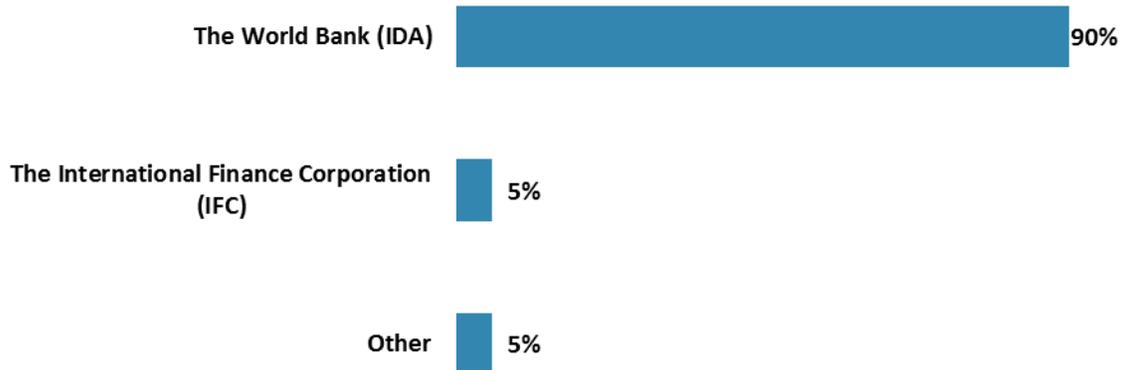
“What's your gender?” (Respondents chose from a list.)

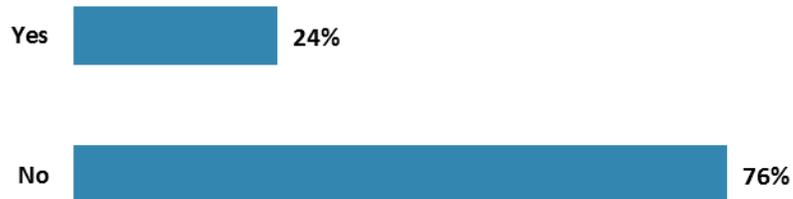
Exposure to Agencies within the World Bank Group

Percentage of Respondents (N=153)



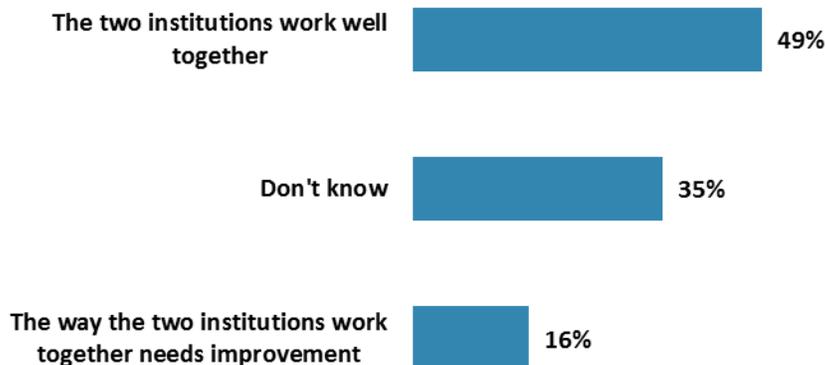
"Which of the following agencies of the World Bank Group do you primarily engage with in Croatia? (Select only ONE response)" (Respondents choose from a list)

Percentage of Respondents (N=43)



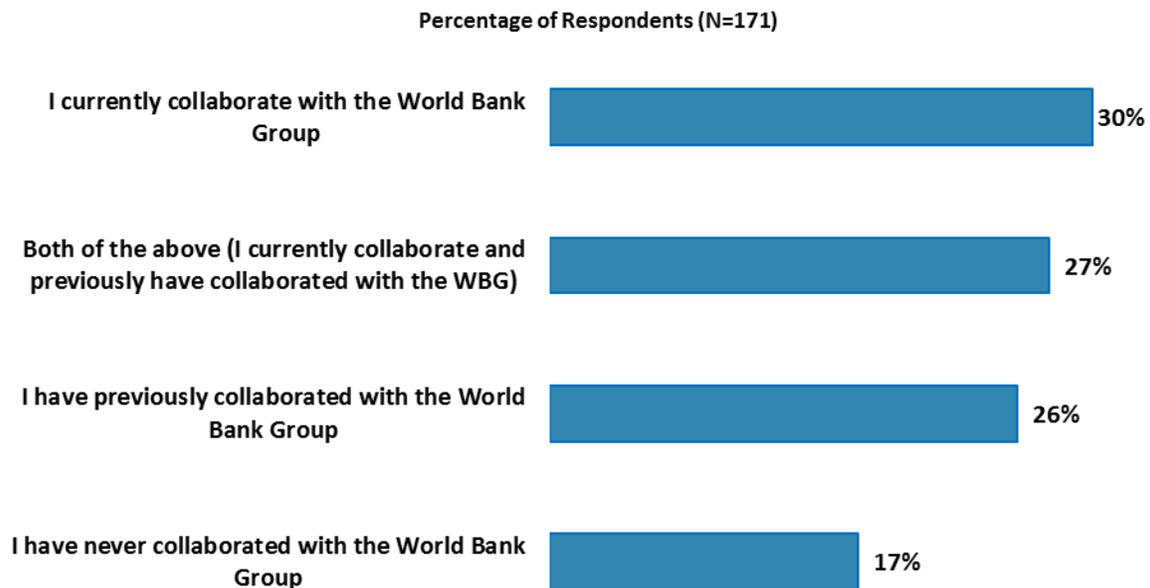
"If your projects involve both the World Bank and IFC, what was your view of how the two institutions work together in Croatia? (Select only ONE response)" (Respondents chose from a list.)

Collaboration with the WBG

- **Note:** For all further analyses, respondents who indicated that they had previously collaborated with the WBG were combined with those who had never collaborated to make one group of those not collaborating with the WBG. Those who indicated both (that they currently collaborate and had collaborated in the past) were combined with those who are currently collaborating to create one group of those collaborating with the WBG.
- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey were statistically just as likely to be currently collaborating with the WBG (weighted percentage of respondents collaborating = 57%) compared to respondents from the FY '12 Country Survey (weighted percentage of respondents collaborating = 56%)¹.

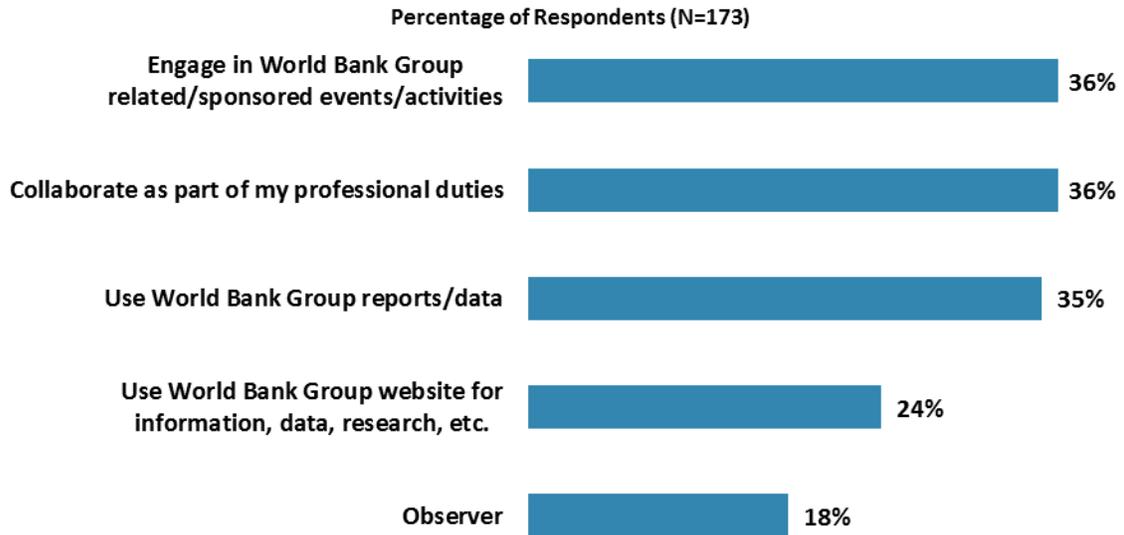

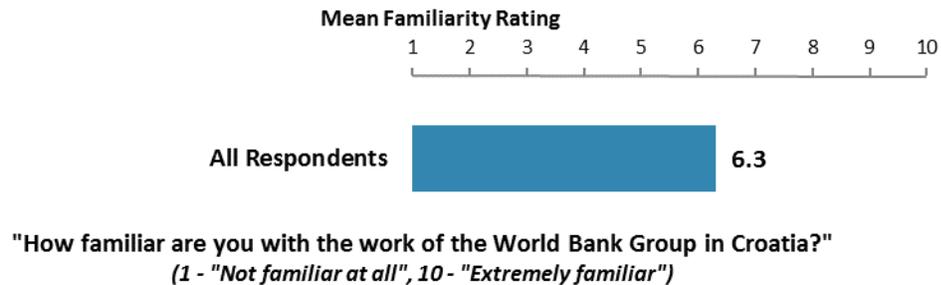
"Which of the following describes most of your exposure to the World Bank Group in Croatia?

Familiarity with the World Bank Group

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey had statistically similar ratings of familiarity with the WBG (weighted mean rating = 6.3) compared to respondents from the FY '12 Country Survey (weighted mean rating = 6.4)².
- **Impact of Familiarity:** Respondents' ratings of familiarity with the WBG were significantly, strongly correlated with their ratings of the WBG's overall effectiveness, and had significant, moderate correlations with the extent to which the WBG achieves development results in Croatia, and the extent to which the WBG plays a relevant role in development in Croatia.



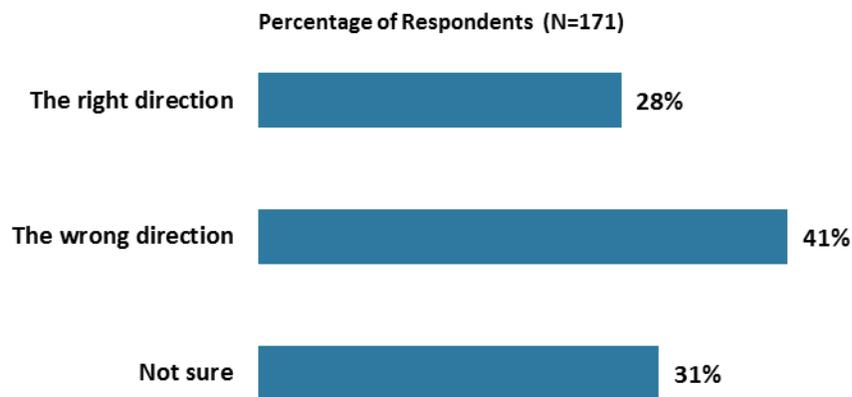

IV. General Issues Facing Croatia

Headed in the Right Direction

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey were significantly *less* likely to indicate that Croatia is headed in the right direction (weighted percentage of respondents = 27%) and significantly more likely to indicate that Croatia is headed in the wrong direction (weighted percentage of respondents = 42%) compared to respondents from the FY '12 Country Survey (weighted percentage of respondents = 38% and 22%, respectively)³.



"In general, would you say that Croatia is headed in ... ?" (Respondents chose from a list.)

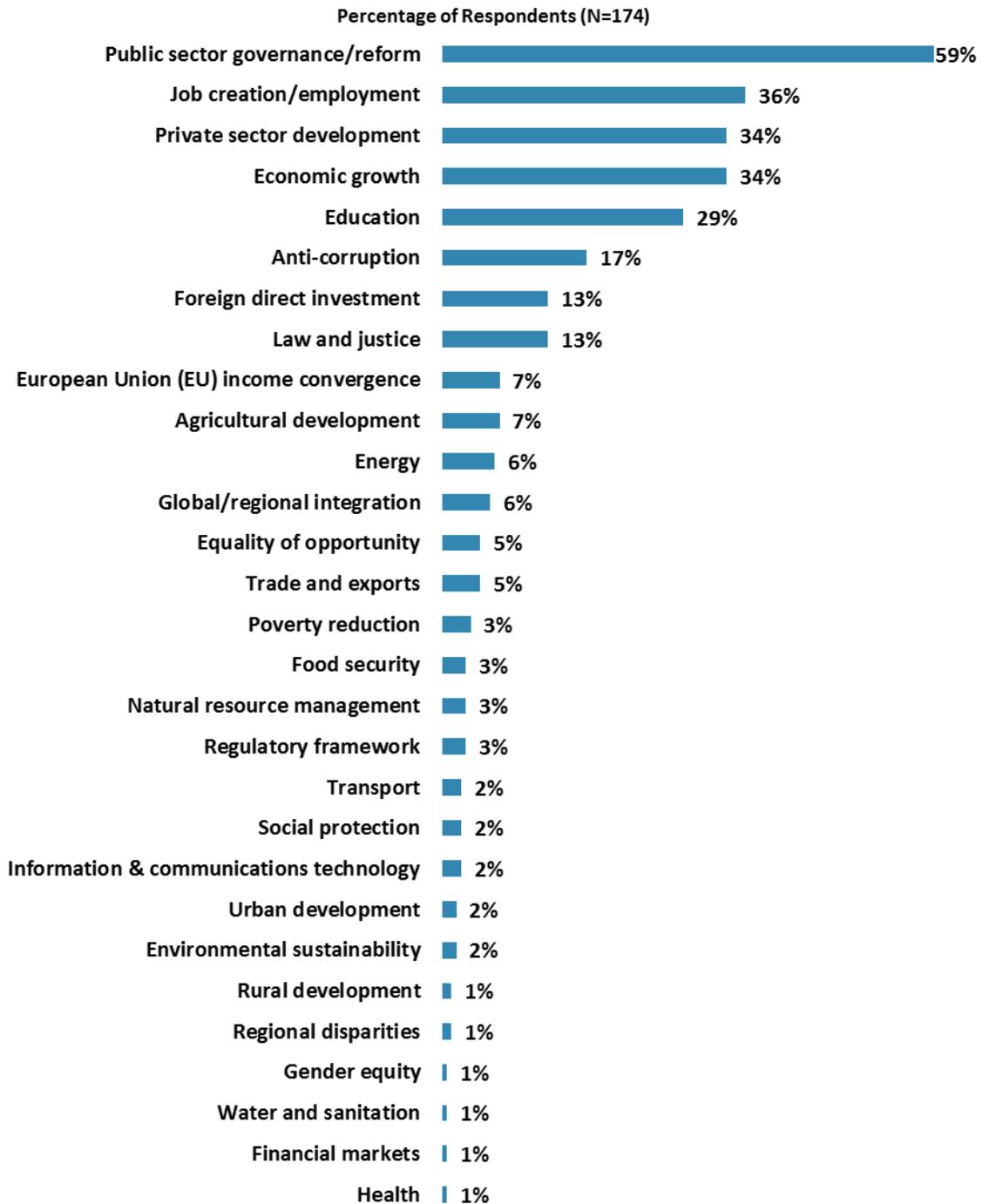

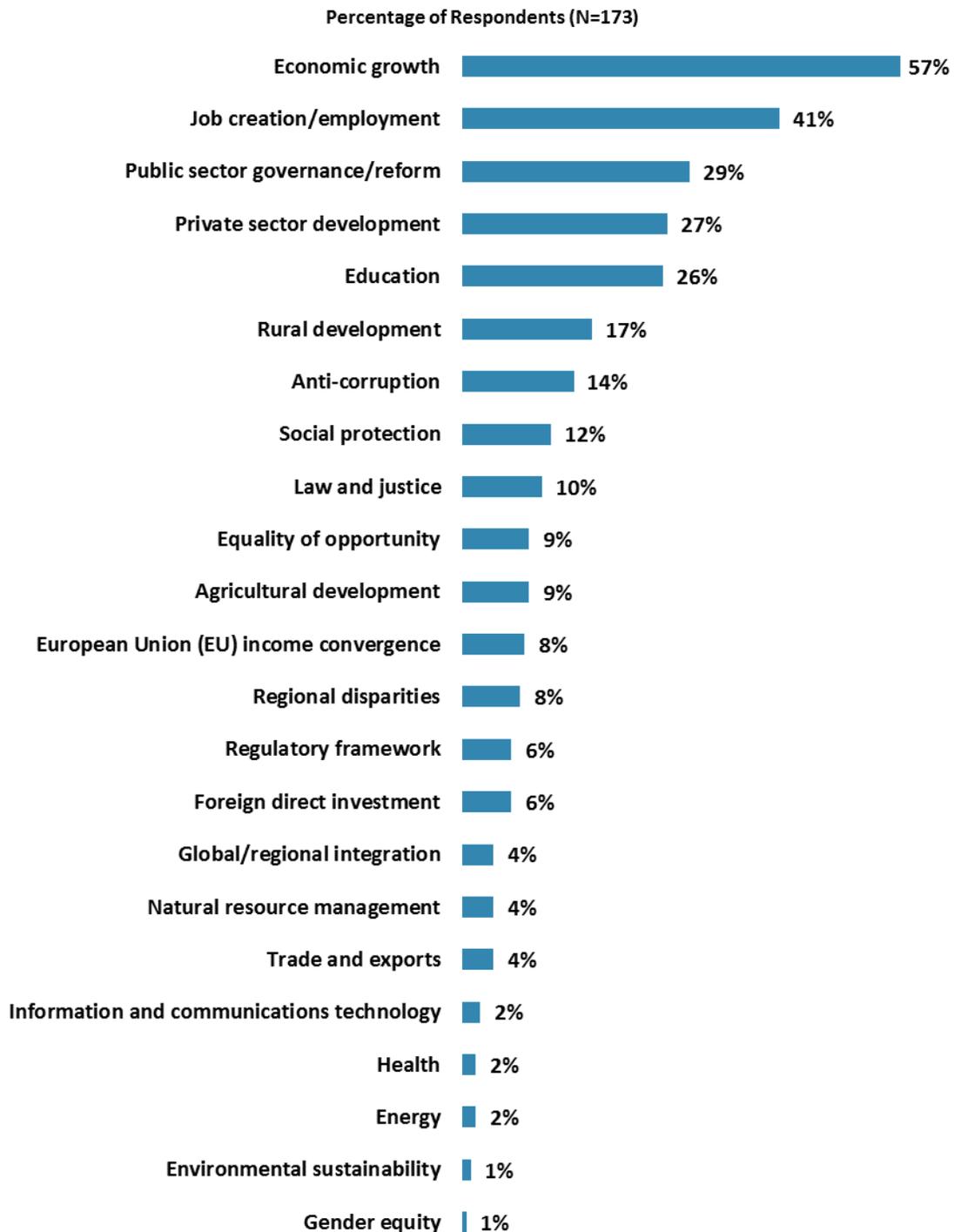

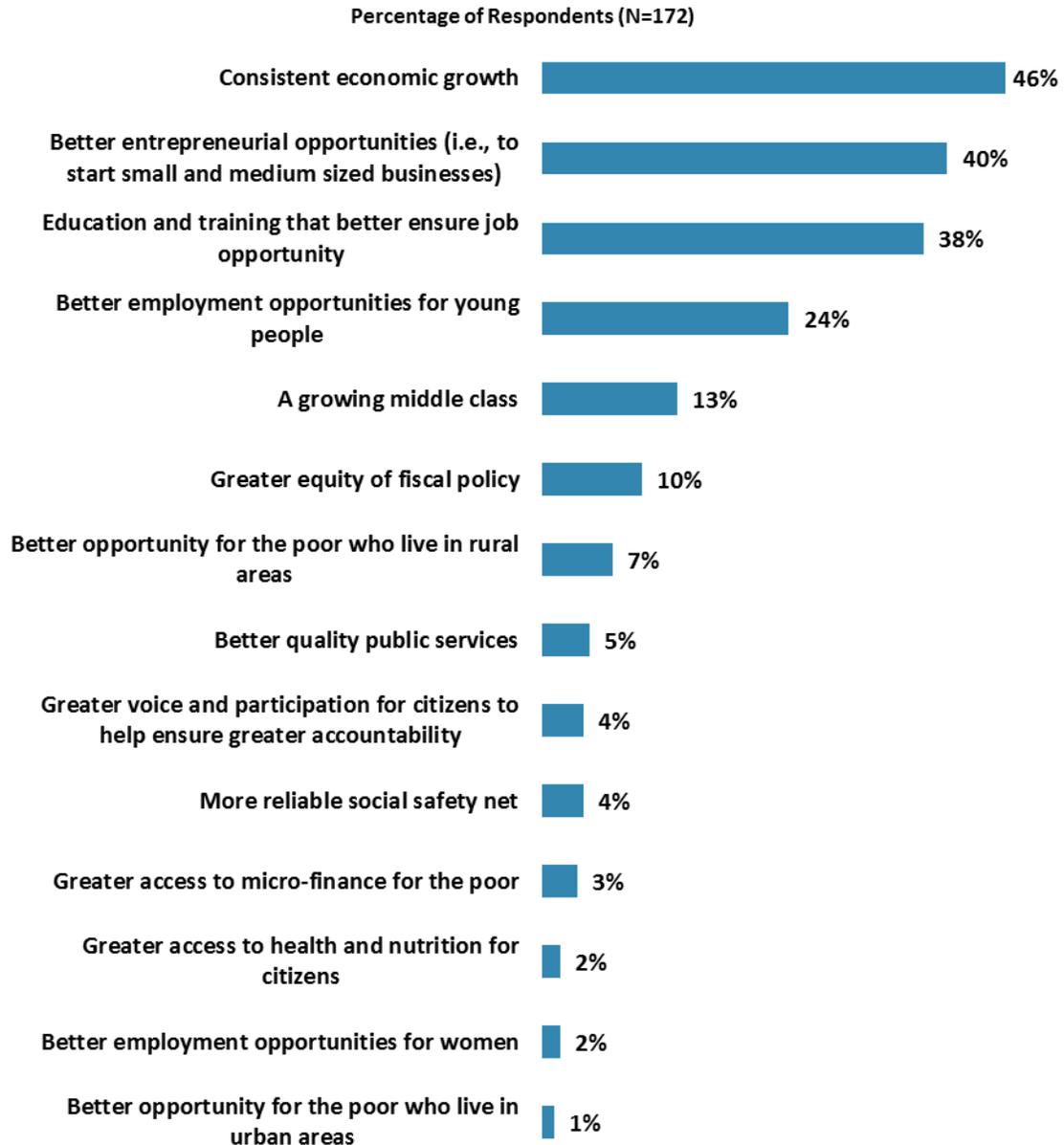

Factors Contributing to “Shared Prosperity”



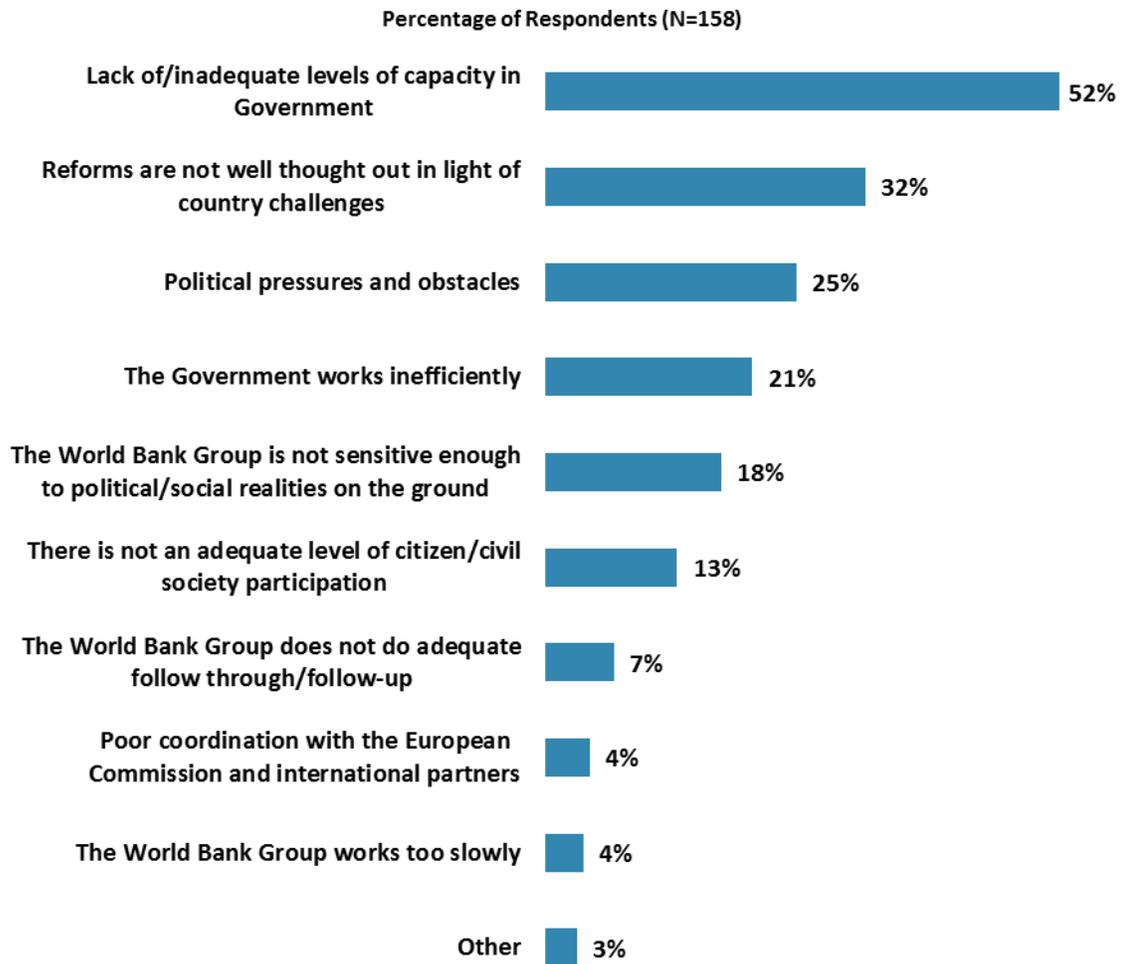
"When thinking about the idea of “shared prosperity” in your country, which of the following TWO best illustrate how this would be achieved in Croatia? (Choose no more than TWO)"

Attributing Failed/Slow Reform Efforts

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY '12 Country Survey indicated that they most often attributed failed or slow reform efforts to lack of/inadequate levels of capacity in government (percentage of respondents = 41%) and reforms not being well thought out in light of country challenges (33%).

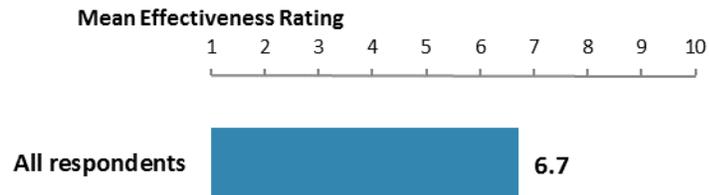

The World Bank Group's Overall Effectiveness (*Indicator Question*)

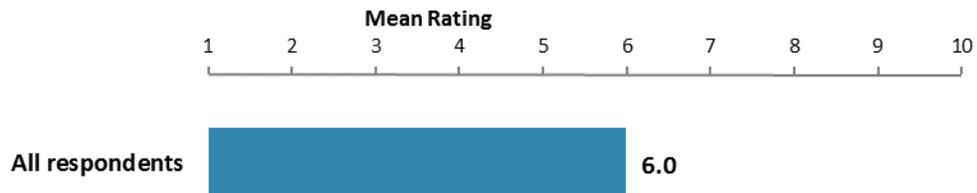
- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey had statistically similar ratings for the WBG's overall effectiveness in Croatia (weighted mean = 6.6) compared to respondents from the FY '12 Country Survey (weighted mean = 6.4)⁴.
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who are collaborating with the WBG gave significantly higher ratings for the WBG's overall effectiveness in Croatia (mean rating = 7.2) compared to respondents who are not collaborating (mean rating = 6.0).

Achieving Development Results (*Indicator Question*)

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey had statistically similar ratings for the extent to which the WBG achieves development results (weighted mean = 5.9) compared to respondents from the FY '12 Country Survey (weighted mean = 6.0)⁴.
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who are collaborating with the WBG gave significantly higher ratings for the extent to which the WBG achieves development results (mean rating = 6.5) compared to respondents who are not collaborating (mean rating = 5.1).

in Croatia?" (1 - "To no degree at all", 10 - "To a very significant degree")**

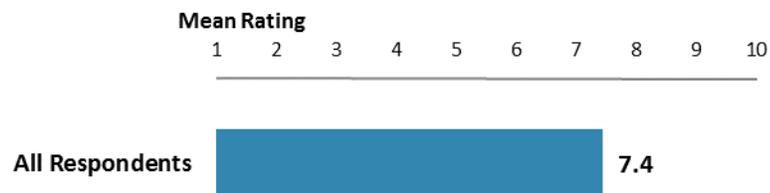

WBG Staff Preparedness

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey had statistically similar ratings for the WBG's staff being well prepared to help Croatia (weighted mean = 7.4) compared to respondents from the FY '12 Country Survey (weighted mean = 7.0)⁵.
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who are collaborating with the WBG gave significantly higher ratings for the WBG's staff being well prepared (mean rating = 7.8) compared to respondents who are not collaborating (mean rating = 6.8).

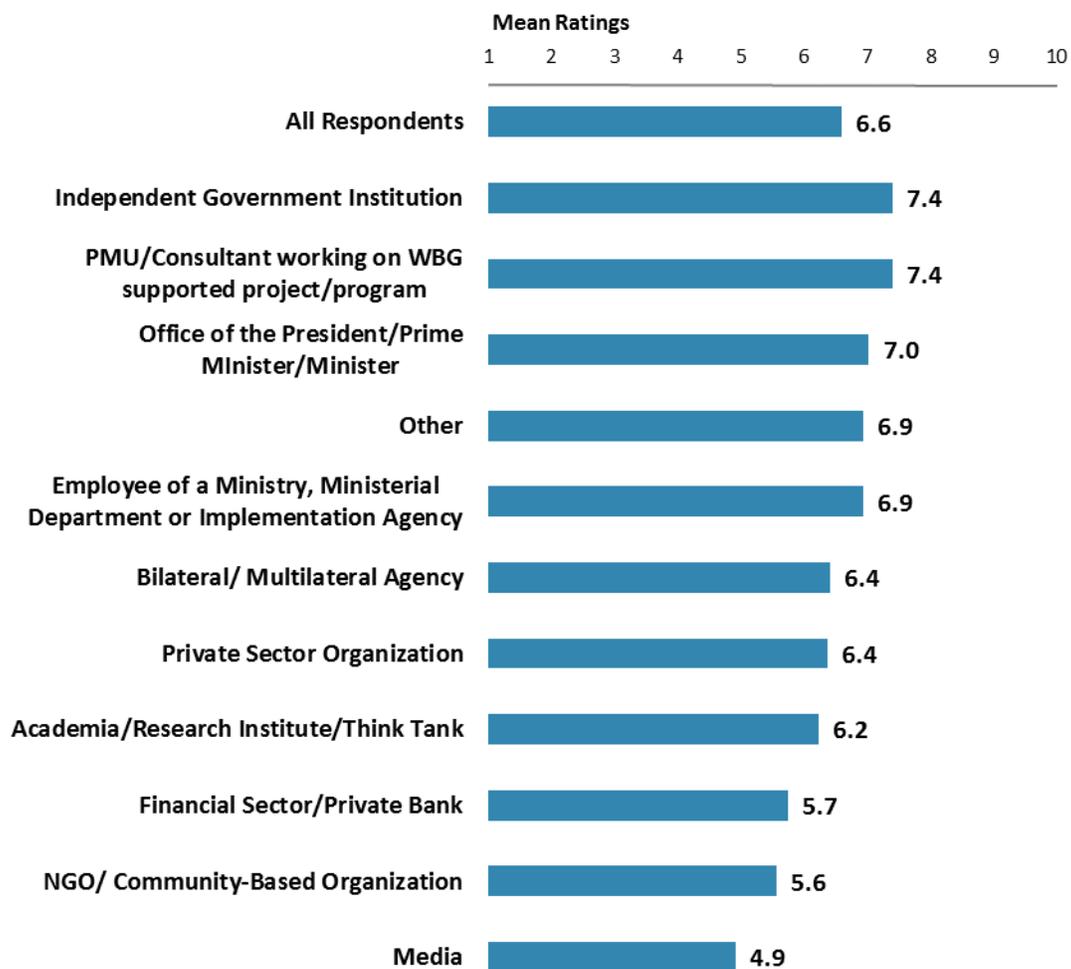

Overall Ratings for Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups

- **Stakeholders:** Respondents from independent government institutions and PMUs/Consultants on WBG-supported projects had the highest mean rating for the aggregated responses to the twenty-five COS indicator questions whereas respondents from the financial sector/private banks, NGOs/CBOs, and the media had significantly lower mean ratings. Responses for individual indicator questions by stakeholder groups can be found in Appendix B (see page 74).
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who collaborate with the WBG had a significantly higher mean rating for the aggregated responses to the twenty-five COS indicator questions (mean rating = 7.1) compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 5.9). Responses for individual indicator questions by exposure to the WBG can be found in Appendix E (see page 121).



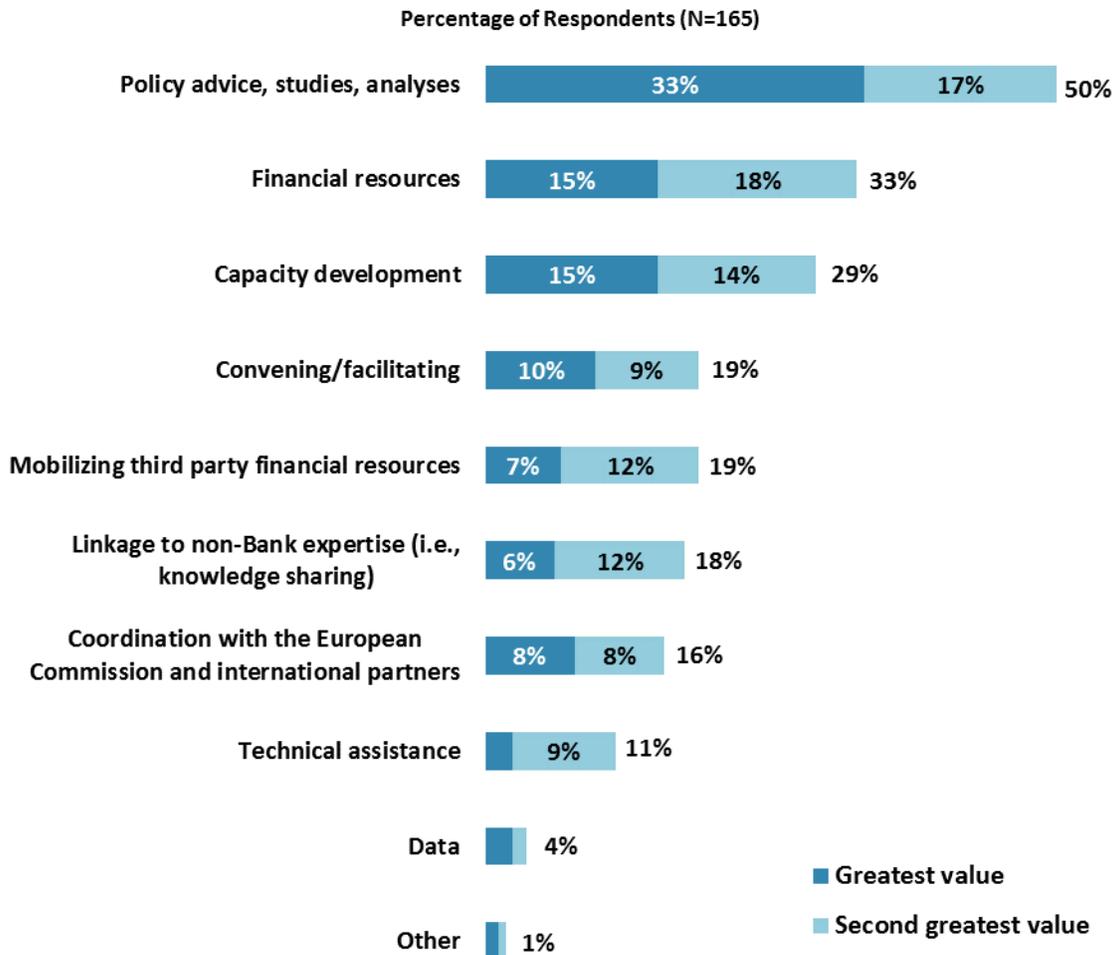
Mean Ratings for All Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups on a Scale from 1 to 10

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY '12 Country Survey indicated that the WBG's greatest value to Croatia was its financial resources (percentage of respondents = 52%) and technical assistance (50%).

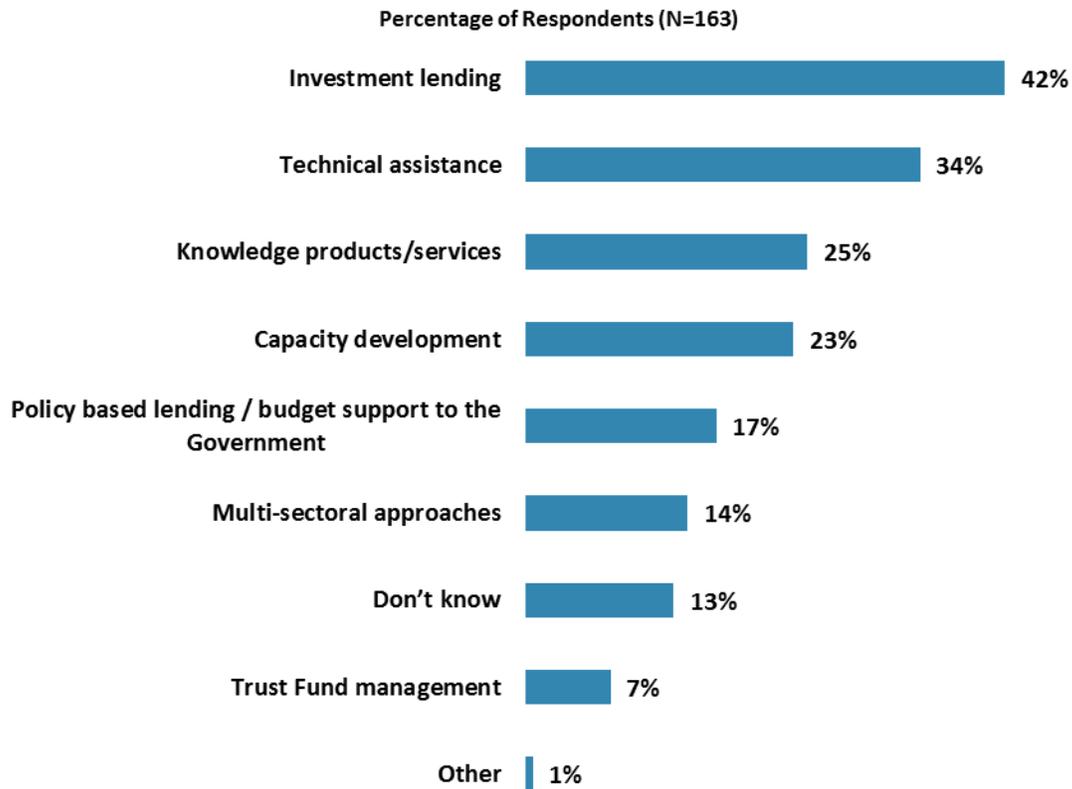

Importance and Effectiveness of WBG's Capacity Building Work

- Stakeholders:** Respondents from independent government institutions gave the highest ratings for the WBG's effectiveness at project implementation whereas respondents from the media gave significantly lower ratings. Respondents from bilateral/multilateral agencies and PMUs/Consultants on WBG-supported projects gave the highest ratings for the WBG's effectiveness at citizen engagement whereas respondents from the financial sector/private banks and the media gave significantly lower ratings.
- Collaboration:** Respondents who are collaborating with the WBG gave significantly higher ratings for the WBG's effectiveness at citizen engagement and policy design (mean ratings = 6.1 and 7.1, respectively) compared to respondents who are not collaborating (mean ratings = 4.7 and 6.1, respectively). In addition, respondents who are collaborating with the WBG gave significantly higher ratings for the importance of the WBG's involvement in project implementation, citizen engagement and policy design (mean ratings = 8.6, 7.8, and 8.6, respectively) compared to respondents who are not collaborating (mean ratings = 7.8, 6.4, and 7.9, respectively).

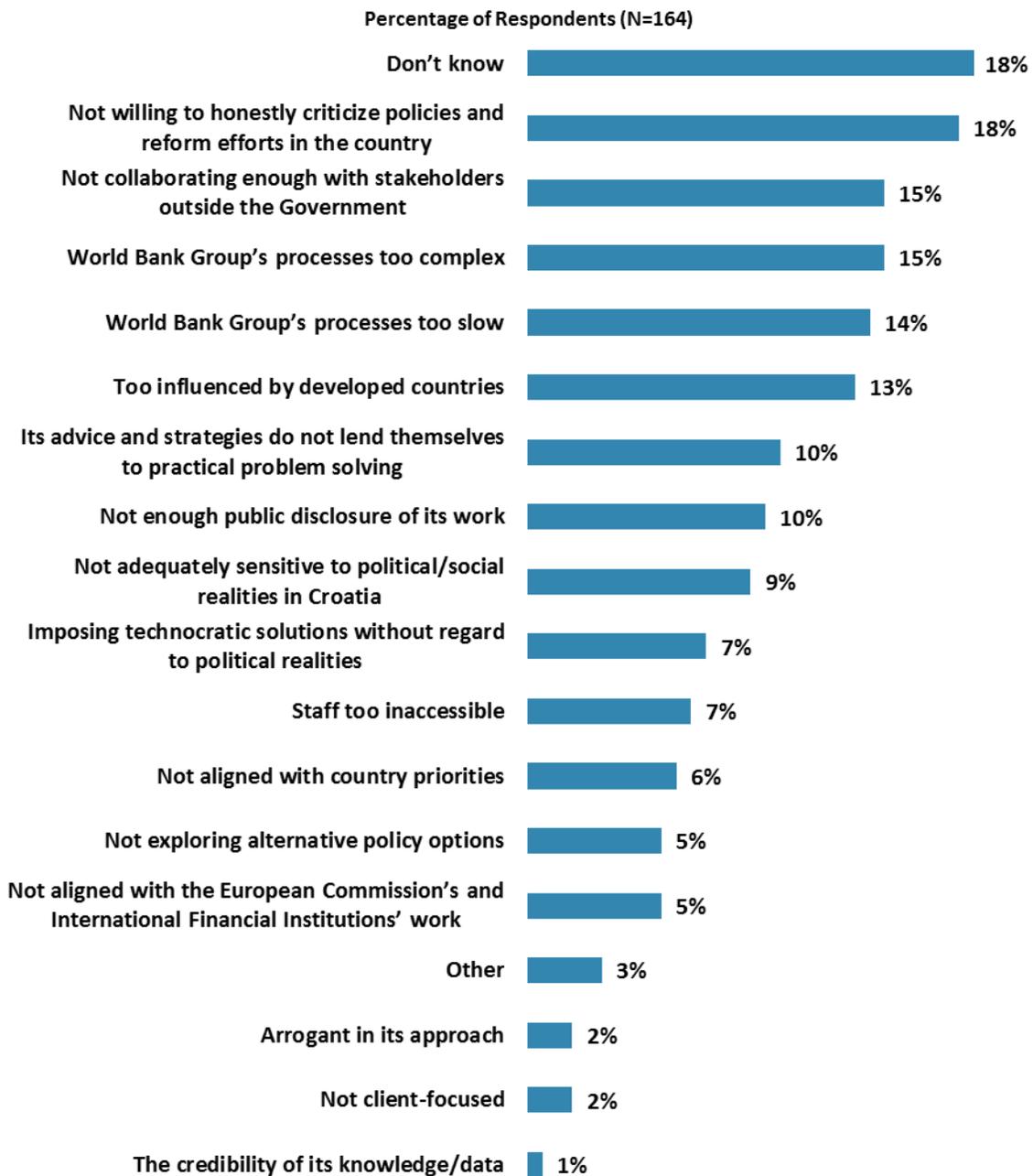

Greatest Weakness

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in FY '12 indicated that the WBG's greatest weaknesses in its work in Croatia were being too bureaucratic in its operational policies and procedures (percentage of respondents = 26%), being too influenced by developed countries (20%), and World Bank Group processes being too slow and complex (20%).

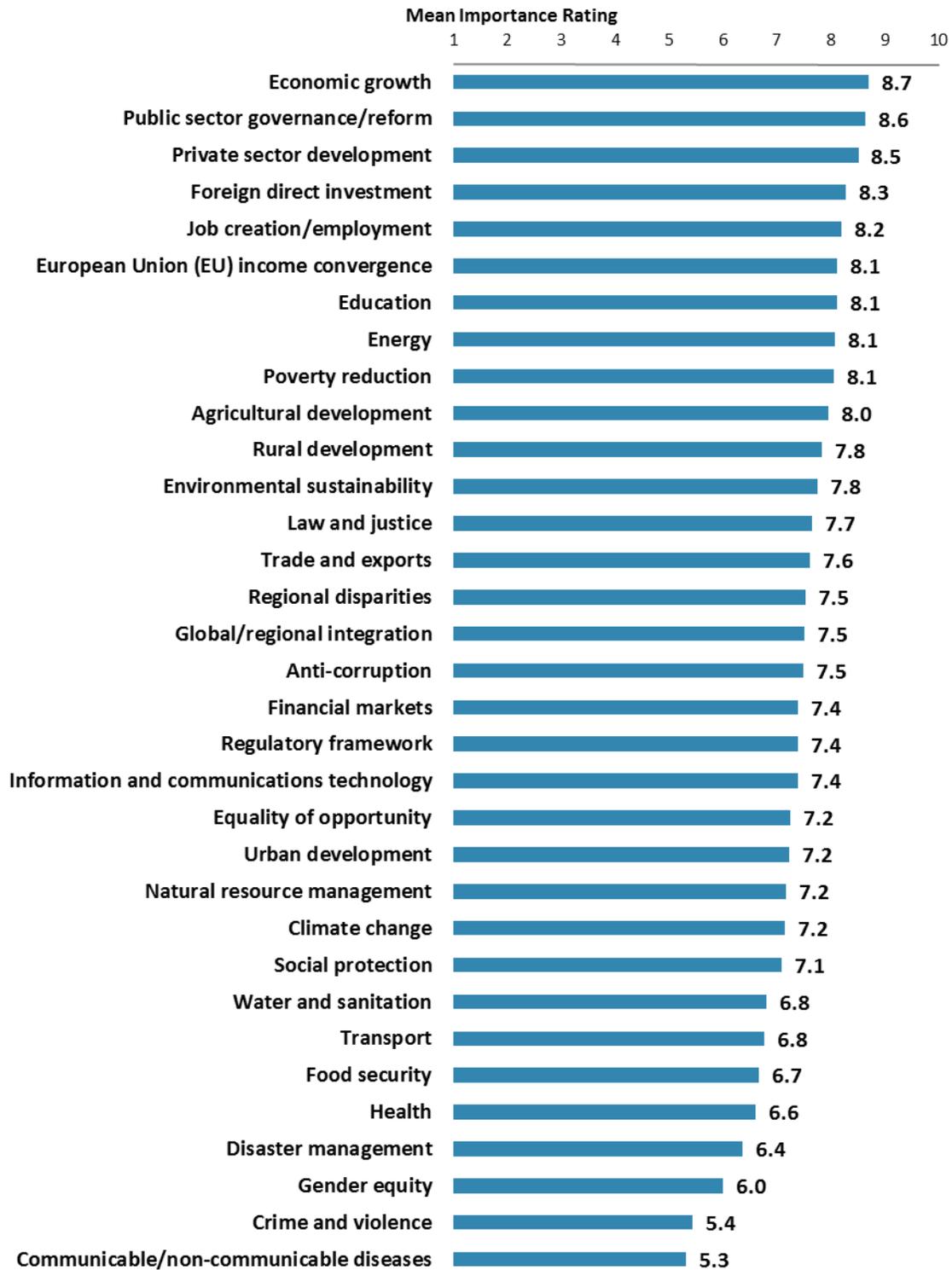

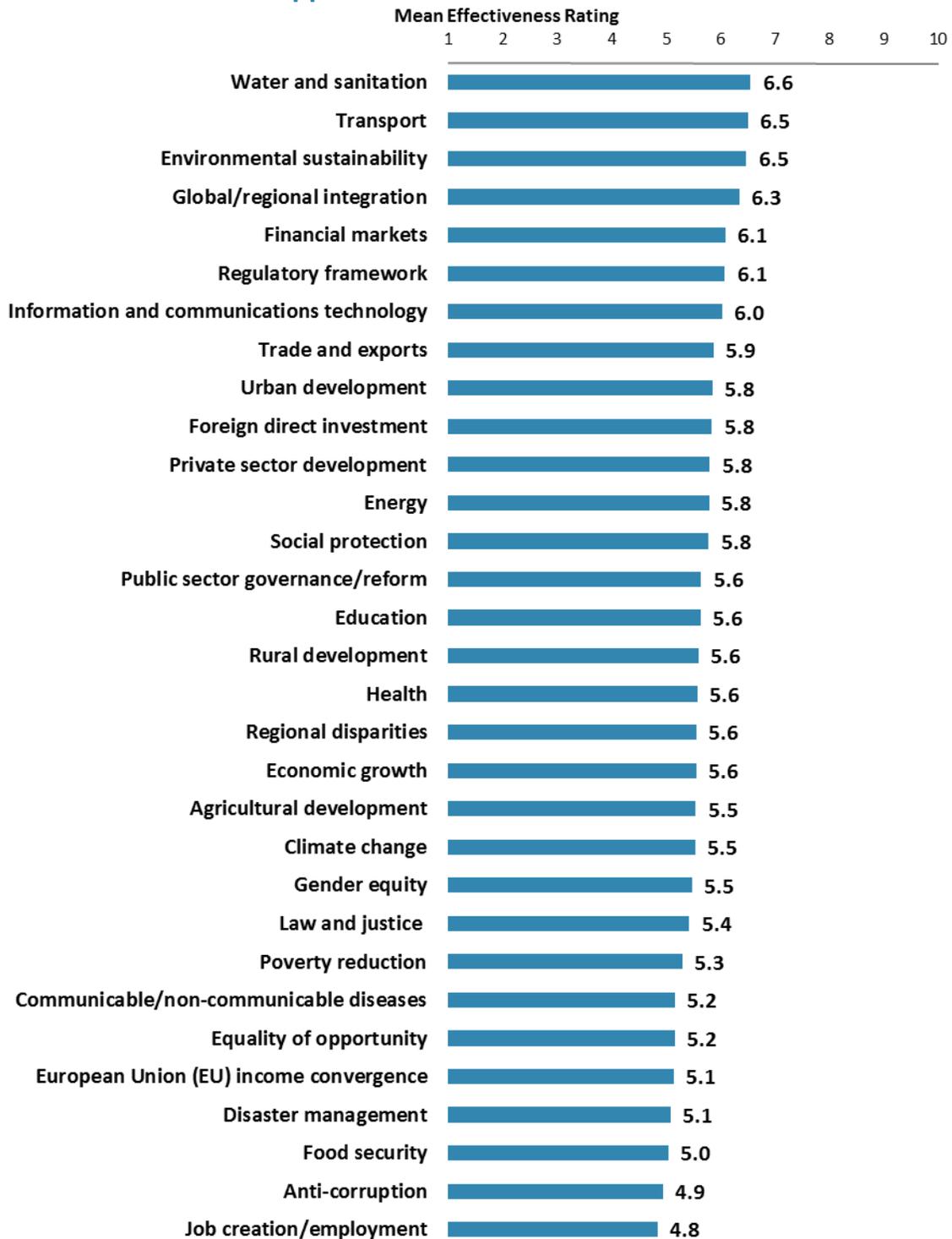

- **Stakeholders:** Respondents from PMUs/Consultants on WBG-supported projects and other organizations had the highest ratings for the importance of information and communications technology and climate change whereas respondents from the financial sector/private banks gave significantly lower ratings. Respondents from the office of the President/Prime Minister/Minister and bilateral/multilateral agencies had the highest ratings for the importance of regulatory framework whereas respondents from NGOs/CBOs gave significantly lower ratings. - **Collaboration:** Respondents who are collaborating with the WBG had significantly higher ratings for the importance of the WBG's involvement in information and communications technology, transport, trade and exports, and EU income convergence compared to respondents who are not collaborating with the WBG (refer to Appendix C, page 99, for a complete breakdown).

Effectiveness of WBG's Support in Sectoral Areas (continued)

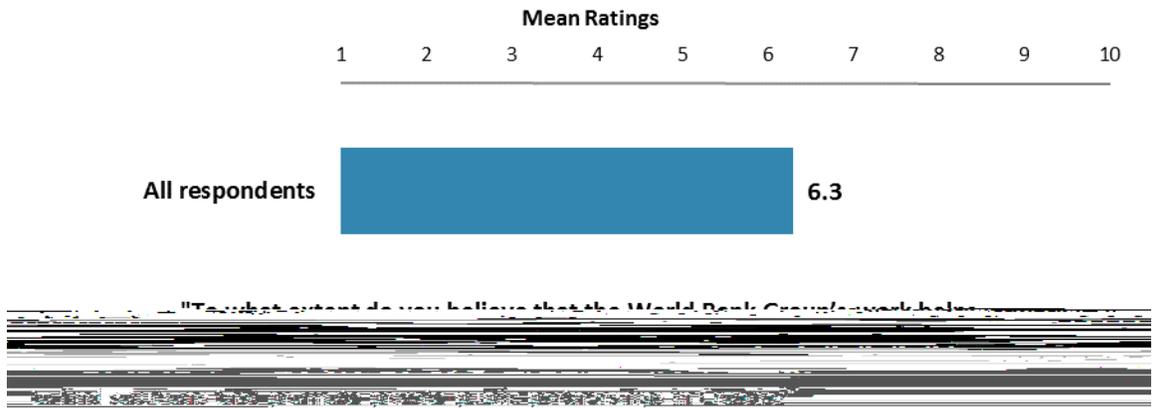
- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey had significantly higher ratings for the effectiveness of the WBG's work in private sector development (weighted mean = 5.7) compared to respondents from the FY '12 Country Survey (weighted mean = 4.8)⁷.
- **Stakeholders:** There were significant stakeholder group differences across seven of these thirty-one development areas (refer to Appendix B, page 74, for a complete breakdown). For the most part, respondents from independent government institutions, bilateral/ multilateral agencies, and other organizations tended to give the highest ratings for the WBG's effectiveness in these areas whereas respondents from the office of the President/ Prime Minister/Minister, the financial sector/private banks, and the media tended to give significantly lower ratings of effectiveness. Those development areas with significant stakeholder group differences were:
 - Urban development;
 - Environmental sustainability;
 - Water and sanitation;
 - Public sector governance/reform;
 - Health;
 - Rural development; and
 - Regional disparities.
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who are collaborating with the WBG had higher ratings for the WBG's effectiveness in all development areas compared to respondents who are not collaborating with the WBG, significantly so for those areas listed below (refer to Appendix C, page 99, for a complete breakdown):
 - Transport;
 - Law and justice;
 - Urban development;
 - Environmental sustainability;
 - Poverty reduction;
 - Private sector development;
 - Foreign direct investment;
 - Water and sanitation;
 - Trade and exports;
 - Economic growth;
 - Energy;
 - Public sector governance/reform;
 - Job creation/employment;
 - Rural development; and
 - European Union (EU) income convergence.

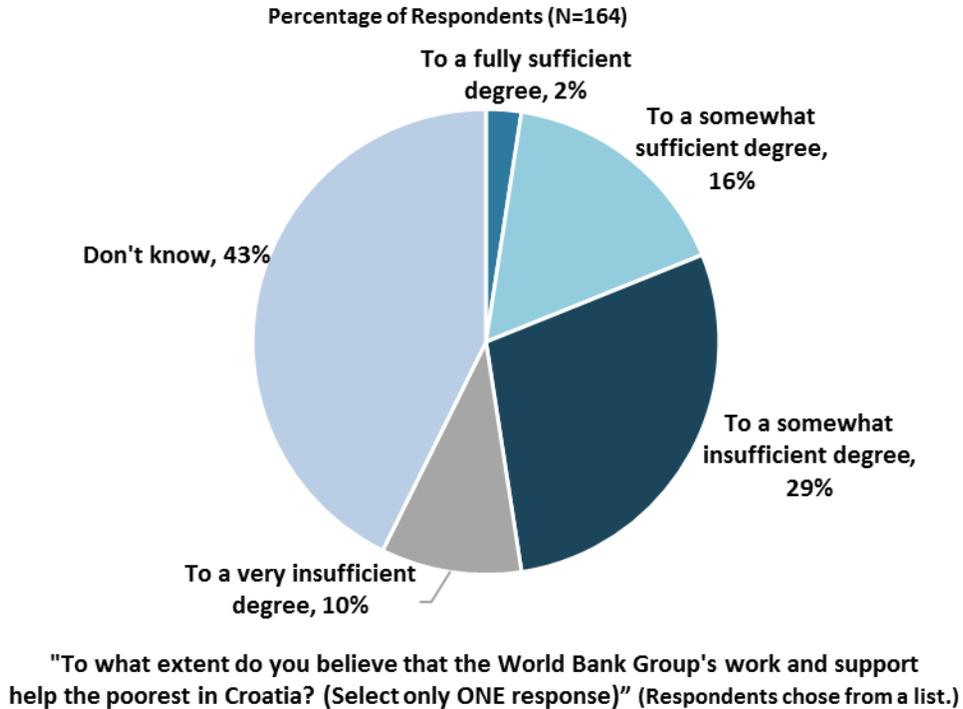

Drivers of Effectiveness

To determine the key drivers of respondents' ratings of the World Bank Group's overall effectiveness and ratings of its ability to help achieve development results in Croatia, bivariate correlational analyses were conducted using respondents' ratings of the thirty-one specific areas of effectiveness.

Correlational analyses, however, are not able to tell us exactly what is causing respondents' ratings of the World Bank Group's overall effectiveness or ratings of its ability to help achieve development results. Rather, these analyses tell us that as ratings of effectiveness in one area increase, respondents' ratings of the WBG's overall effectiveness increase, or as ratings of effectiveness in one area increase, ratings of the WBG's ability to help achieve development results increase. Thus, it can be inferred that respondents' perceptions of effectiveness in one specific area are related to, or drive, respondents' perceptions of the WBG's overall effectiveness or perceptions of the WBG's ability to help achieve development results.

- Overall Effectiveness: Those specific areas with the highest Pearson Product-Moment correlations were determined to be the most closely related to perceptions of the WBG's overall effectiveness, suggesting that ratings of effectiveness in those specific areas are drivers of perceptions of the WBG's overall effectiveness in Croatia. The areas determined to be key drivers from these analyses were:
 - The WBG's effectiveness at trade and exports;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at private sector development; and
 - The WBG's effectiveness at health.

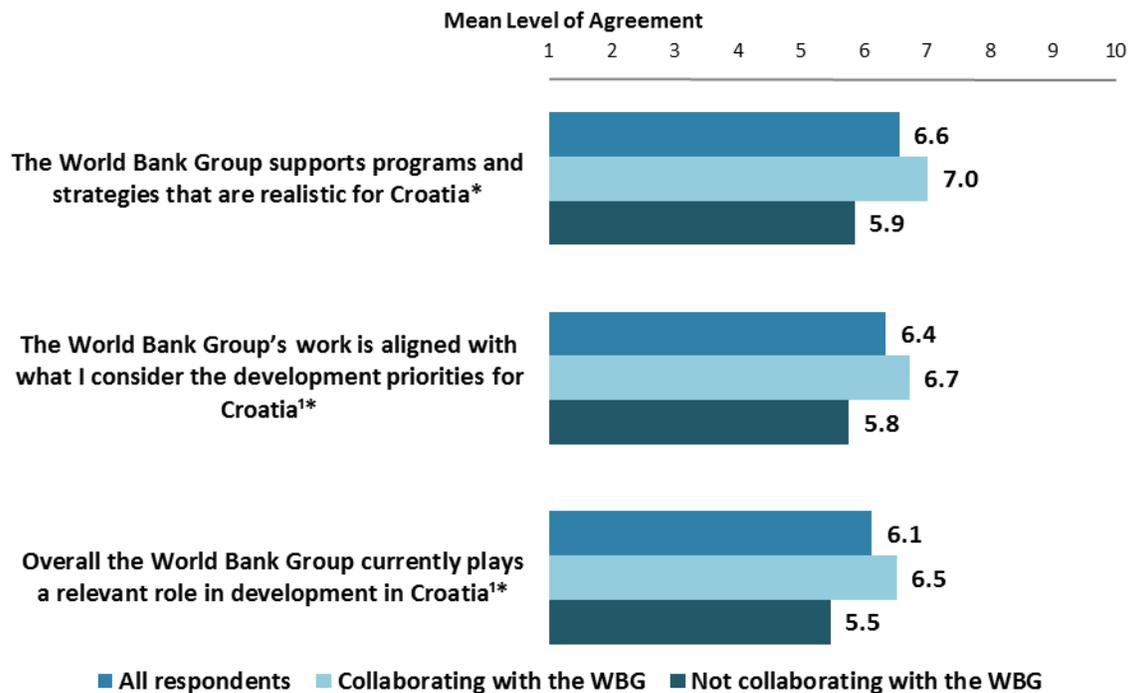
- Achieving Development Results: Those specific areas with the highest Pearson Product-Moment correlations were determined to be the most closely related to perceptions of the WBG's ability to help achieve development results in Croatia, suggesting that ratings of effectiveness in those specific areas are drivers of perceptions of the WBG's ability to help achieve development results. The areas determined to be key drivers from these analyses were:
 - The WBG's effectiveness at law and justice;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at poverty reduction;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at job creation/employment;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at trade and exports; and
 - The WBG's effectiveness at urban development.

The World Bank Group's Work in Croatia

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey had significantly higher levels of agreement that the WBG plays a relevant role in development in Croatia (weighted mean = 6.1) compared to respondents from the FY '12 Country Survey (weighted mean = 5.5)⁸.
- **Stakeholders:** Respondents from independent government institutions and other organizations had the highest levels of agreement that the WBG plays a relevant role in development whereas respondents from the financial sector/private banks and the media had significantly lower levels of agreement.



"To what extent do you agree with the following statements about the World Bank Group's work in Croatia?" (1-"Strongly disagree", 10-"Strongly agree")

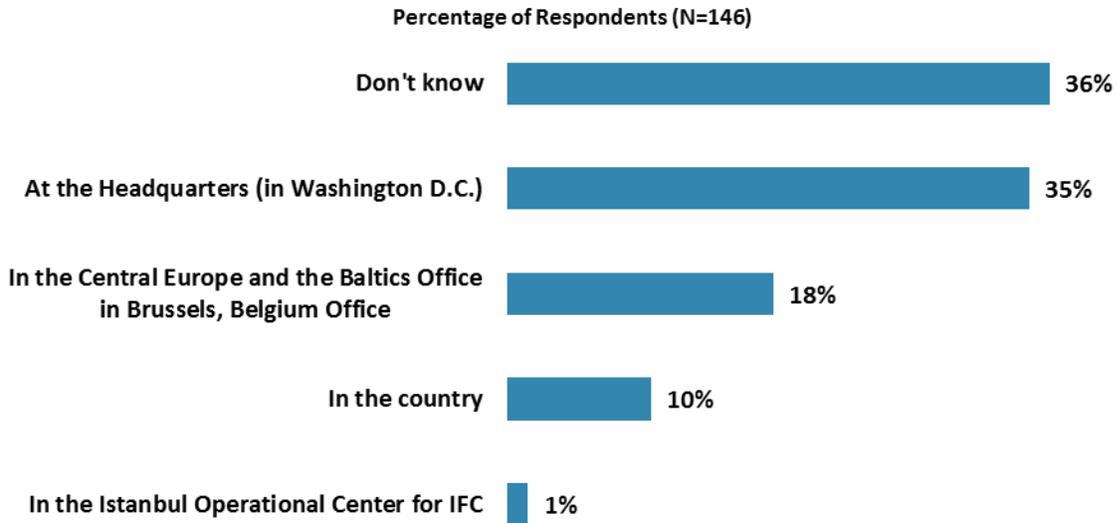

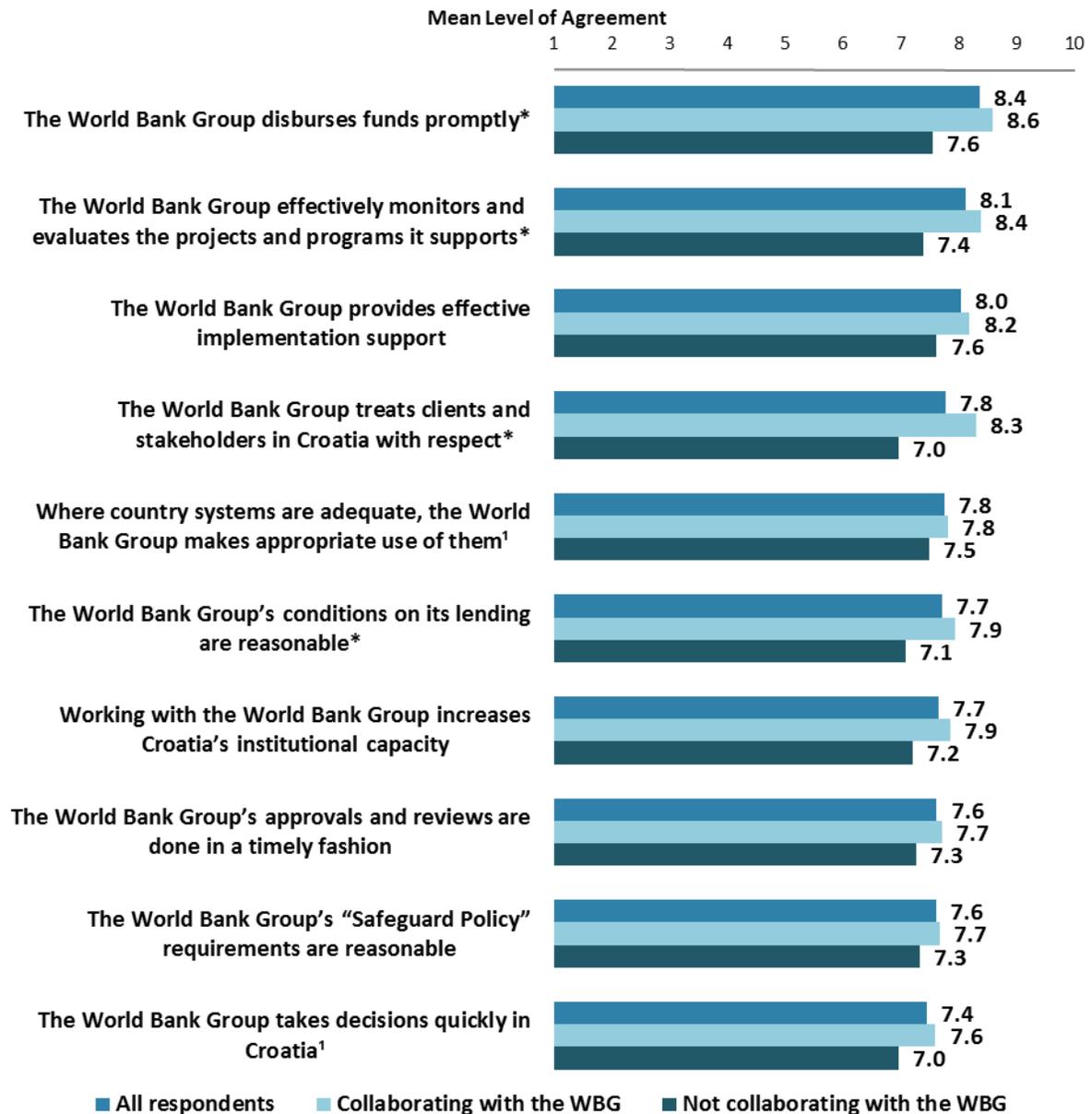
“Where are the World Bank Group's decisions made primarily that support the program in Croatia? (Select only ONE response)” (Respondents chose from a list.)

Overall Perceptions

- **Stakeholders:** Respondents from PMUs/Consultants on WBG-supported projects had the highest levels of agreement that the WBG disburses funds promptly whereas respondents from NGOs/CBOs, the financial sector/private banks, and the office of the President/Prime Minister/Minister had significantly lower levels of agreement.

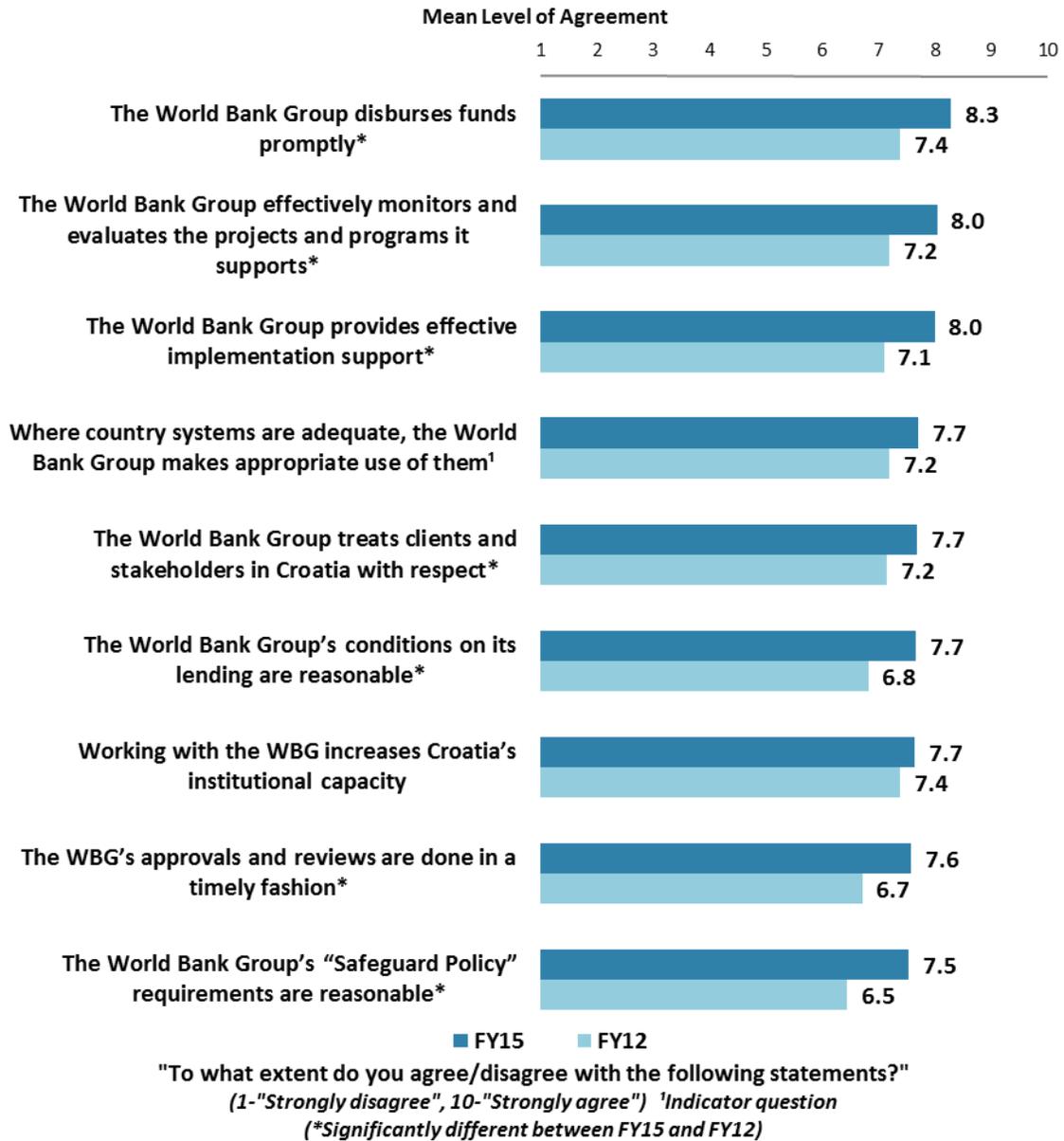


"To what extent do you agree/disagree with the following statements?"

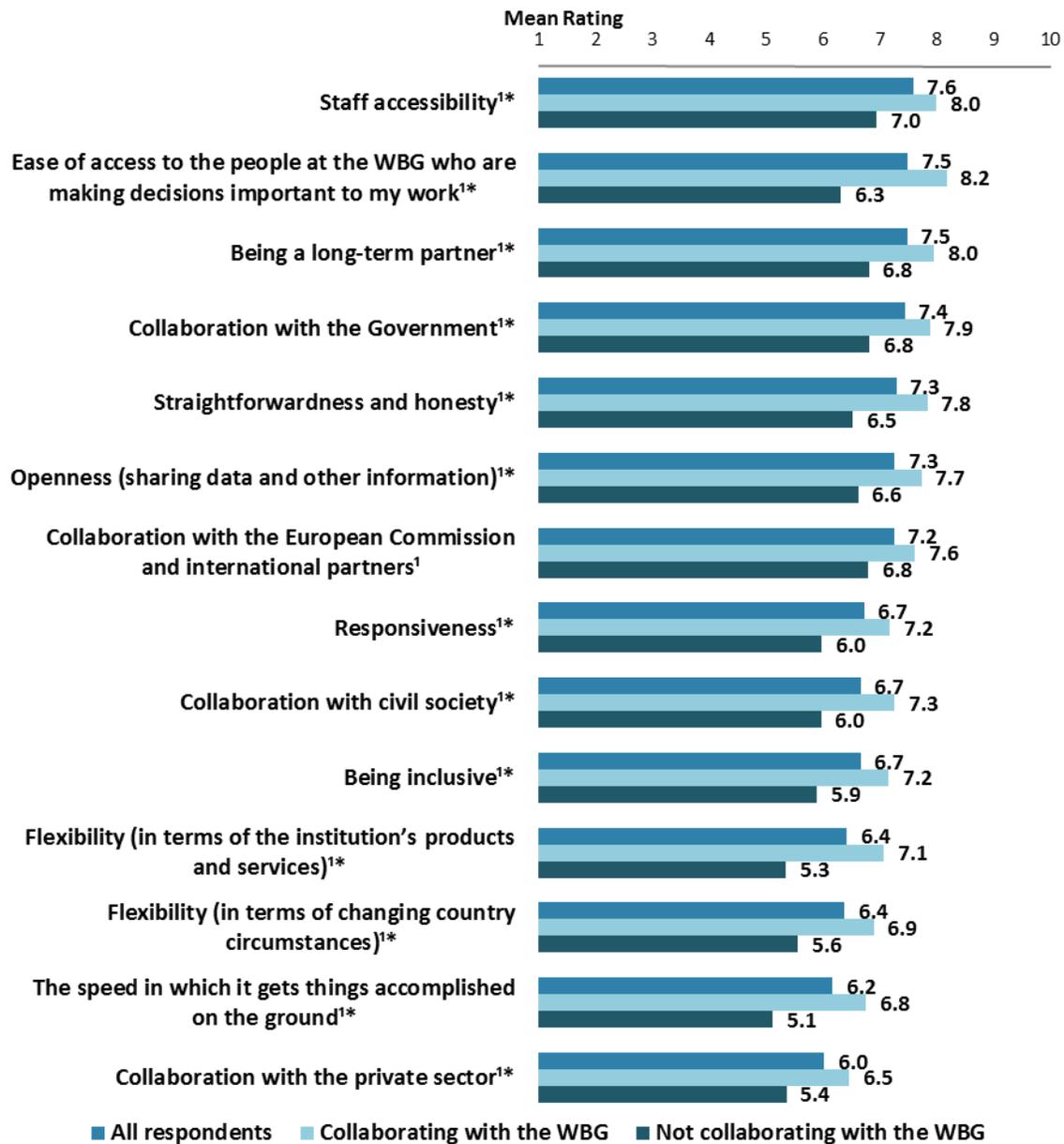

The WBG as an Effective Development Partner

- Stakeholders:** There were significant stakeholder group differences across several of these aspects of how the WBG operates in Croatia. For the most part, respondents from independent government institutions tended to have the highest levels of agreement whereas respondents from the media tended to have significantly lower levels of agreement. 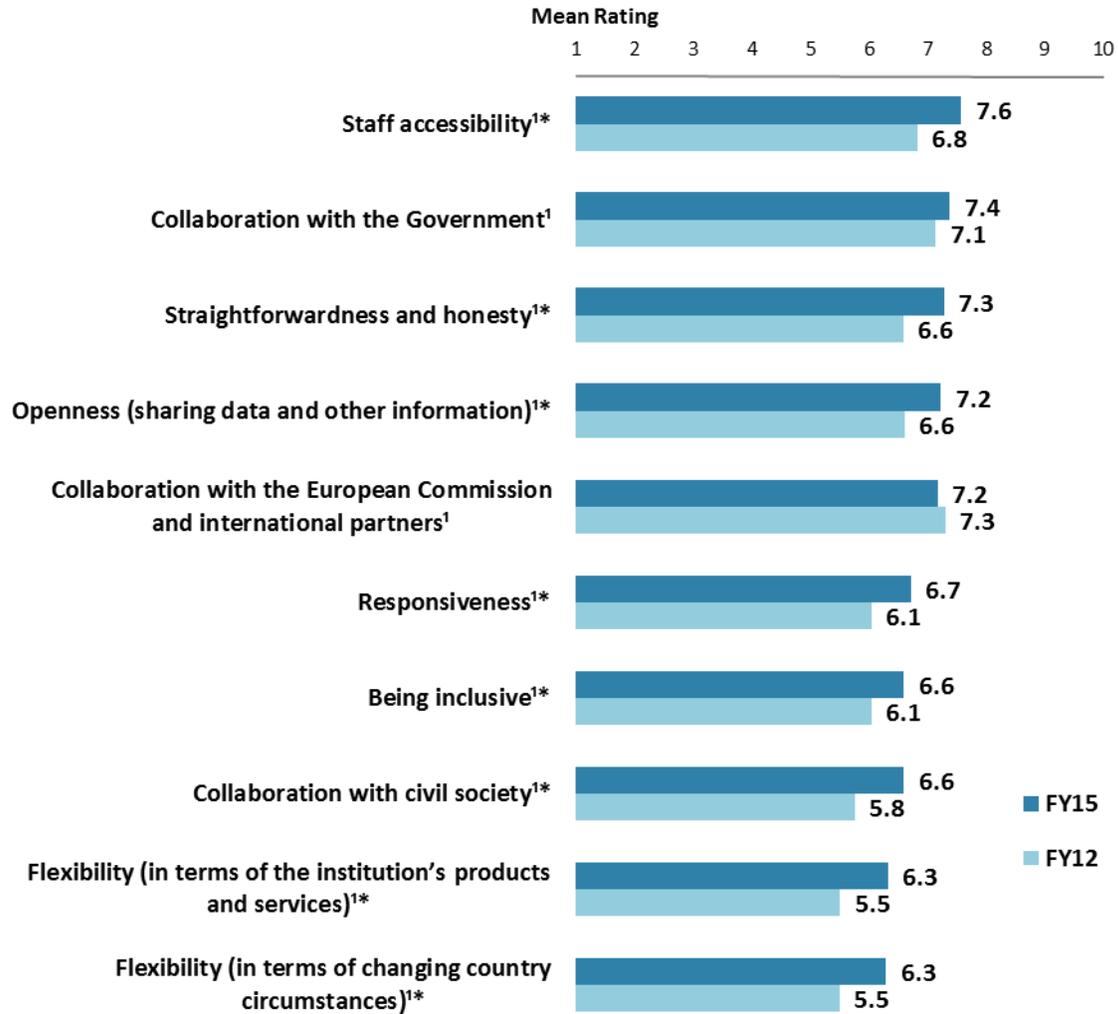


"To what extent is the World Bank Group an effective development partner in Croatia in terms of each of the following?" (1-"To no degree at all", 10-"To a very significant degree")

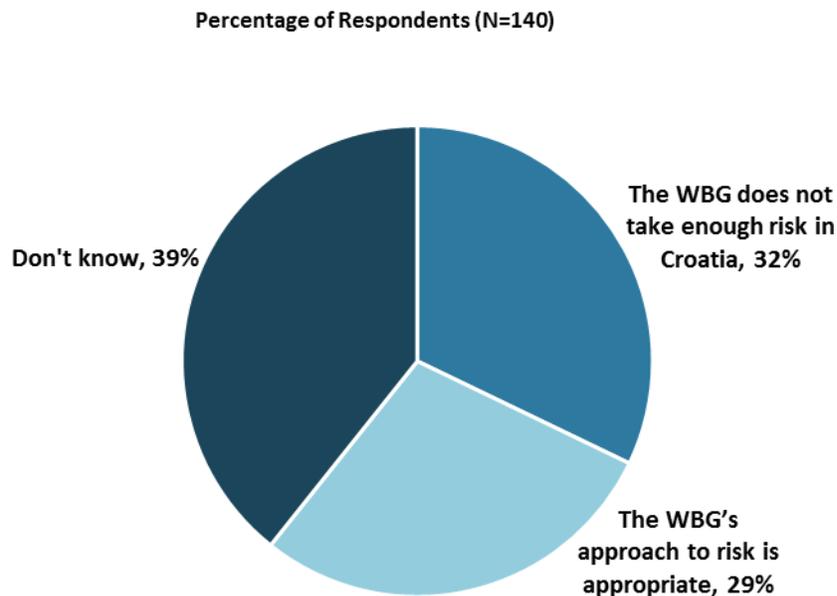
Internal Measuring and Monitoring

- **Collaboration:** Respondents who are collaborating with the WBG had significantly higher ratings that the WBG measures and corrects its work in real time (mean rating = 6.8) compared to those who are not collaborating (mean rating = 5.4).

The WBG's Approach to Risk in Croatia



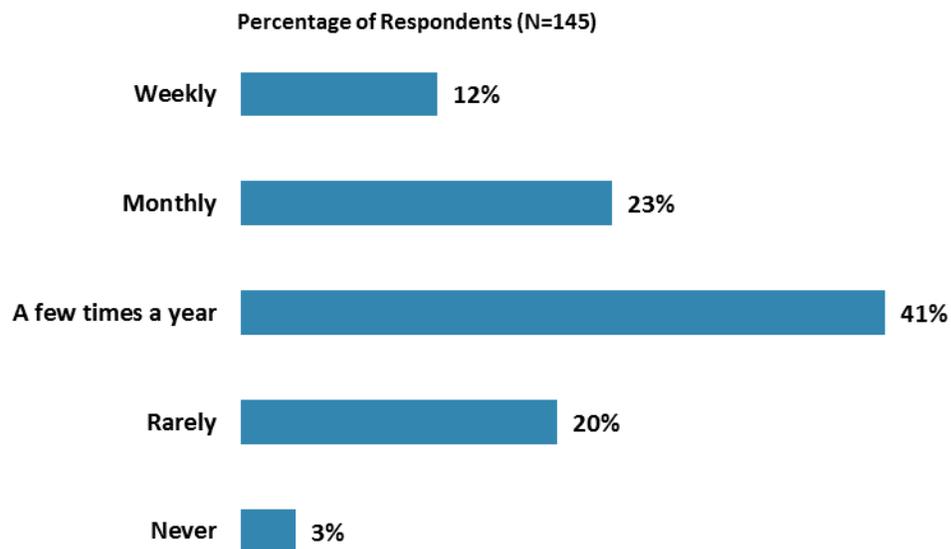

VIII. World Bank Group's Knowledge and Instruments

Frequency of Consulting WBG Knowledge Work/Activities

- **Stakeholders:** Respondents from PMUs/Consultants on WBG-supported projects indicated the most frequent usage of the WBG's knowledge work and activities (percentage of respondents = 69% weekly/monthly) whereas respondents from the media indicated significantly less frequent usage (50% rarely/never).
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who are collaborating with the WBG indicated significantly more frequent usage of the WBG's knowledge work and activities (percentage of respondents = 52% weekly/monthly) compared to respondents who are not collaborating with the WBG (36% rarely/never).

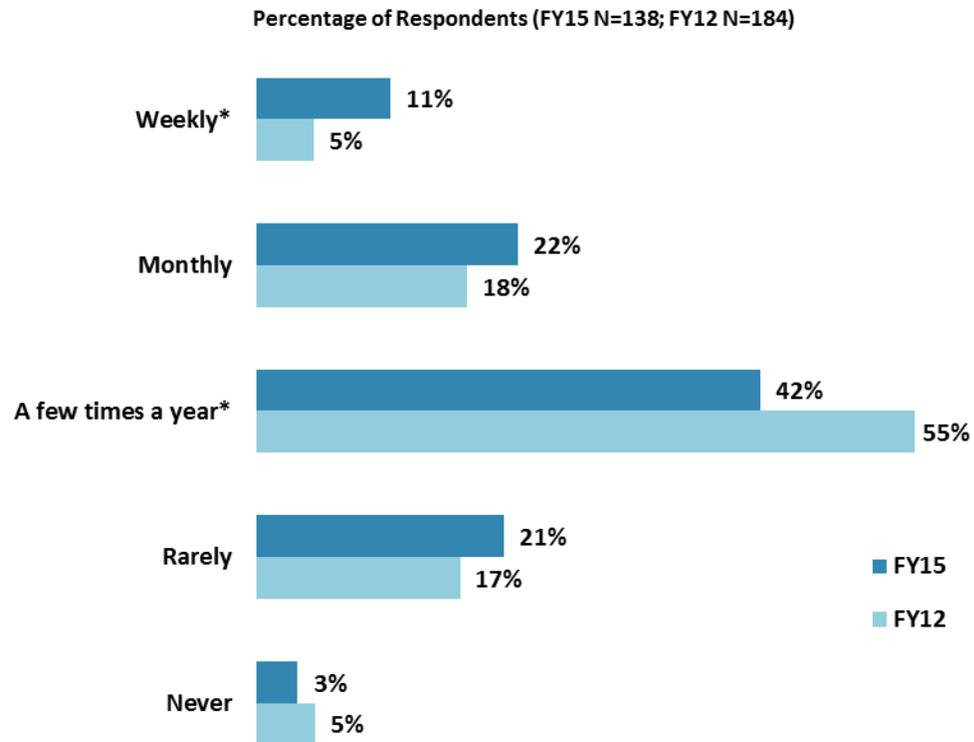


"How frequently do you consult World Bank Group knowledge work and activities in the work you do?" (Respondents chose from a list.)

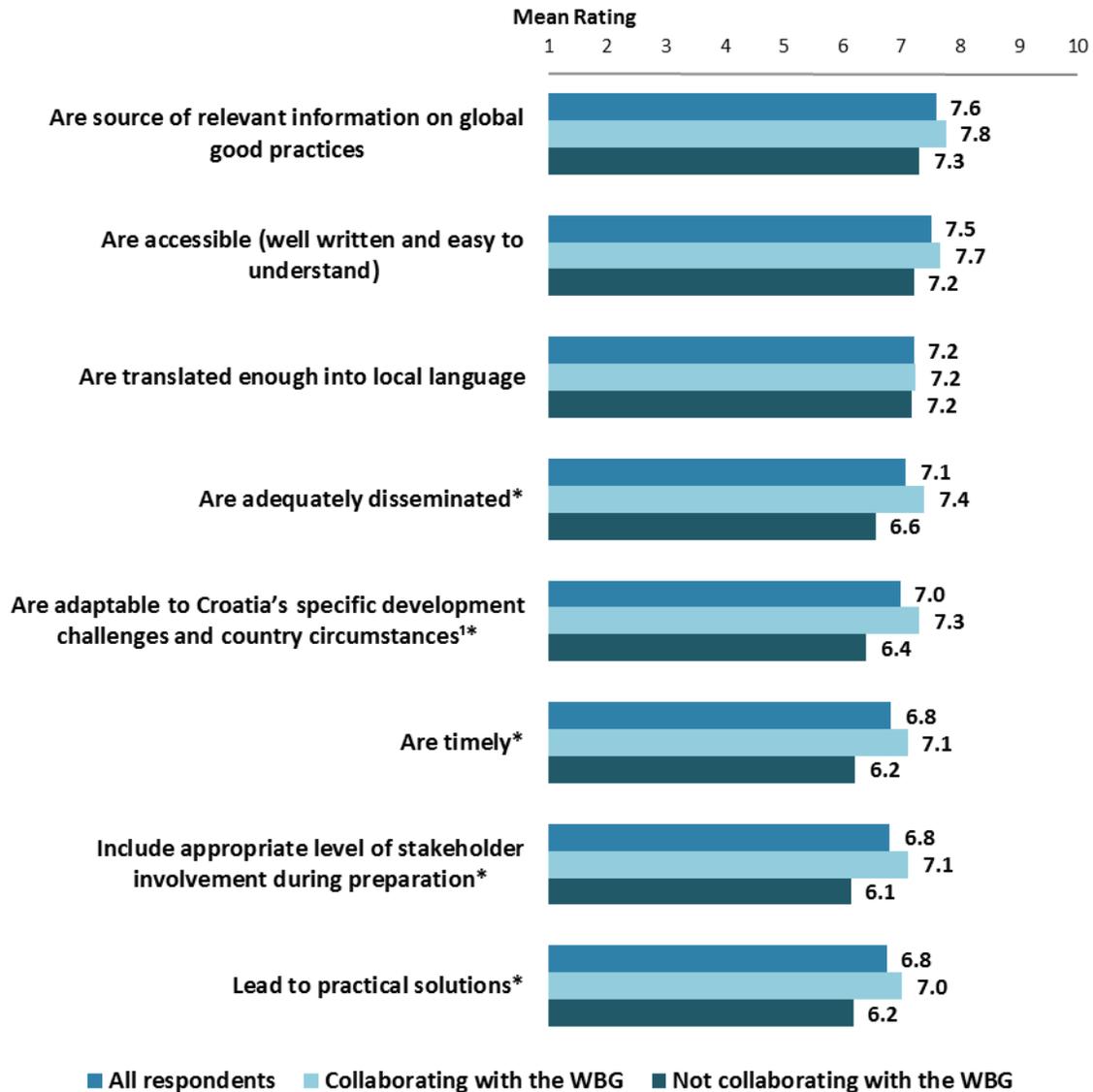

Qualities of the WBG's Knowledge Work and Activities

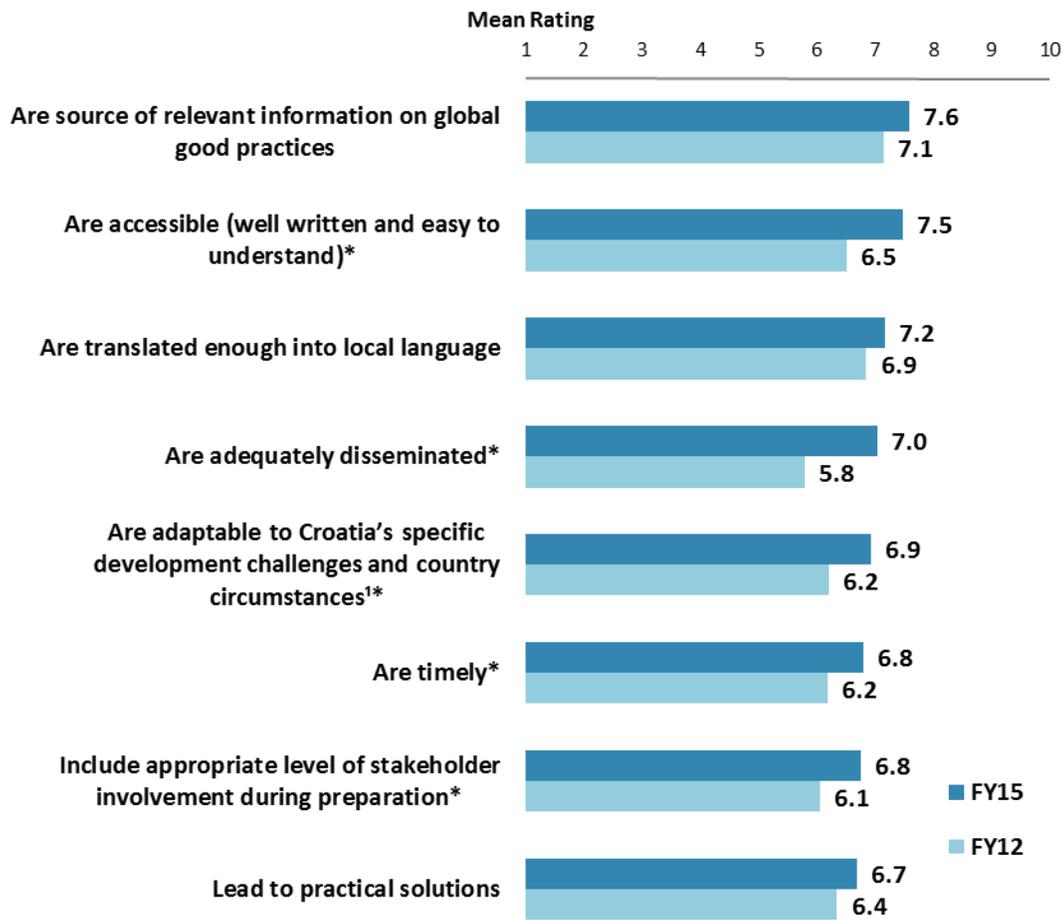


"In Croatia, to what extent do you believe that the World Bank Group's knowledge work and activities?" (1-"To no degree at all", 10-"To a very significant degree")

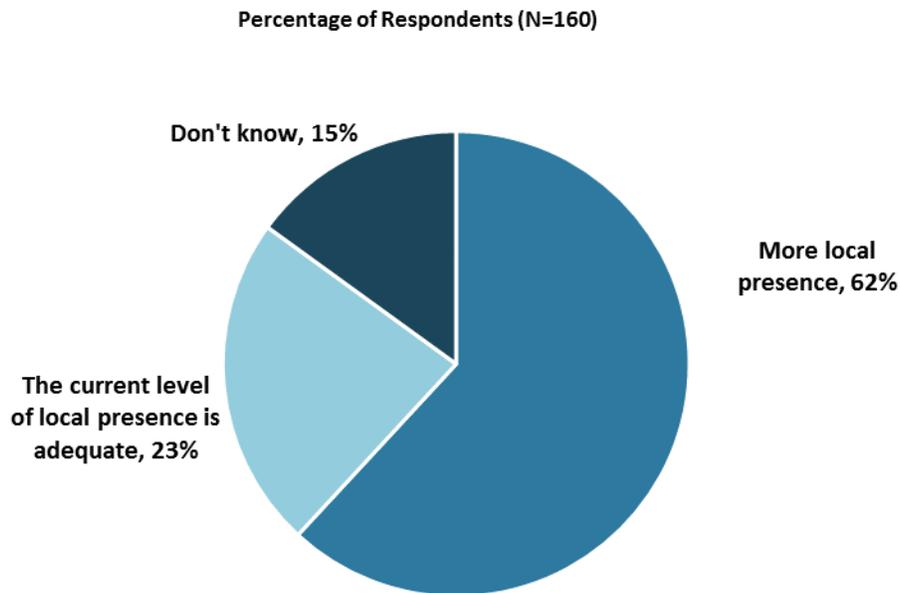

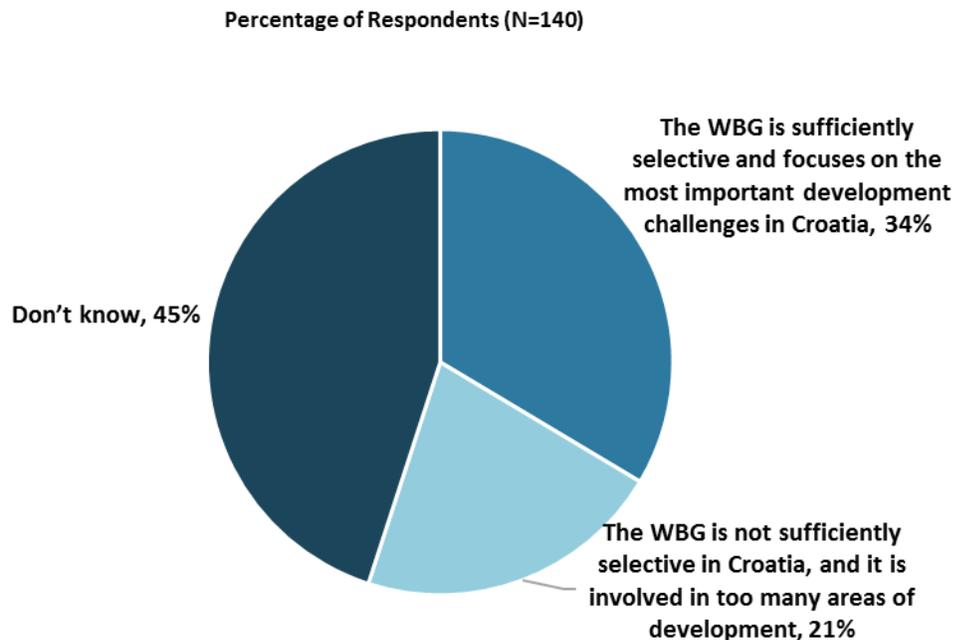

Selectivity of the World Bank Group's Support



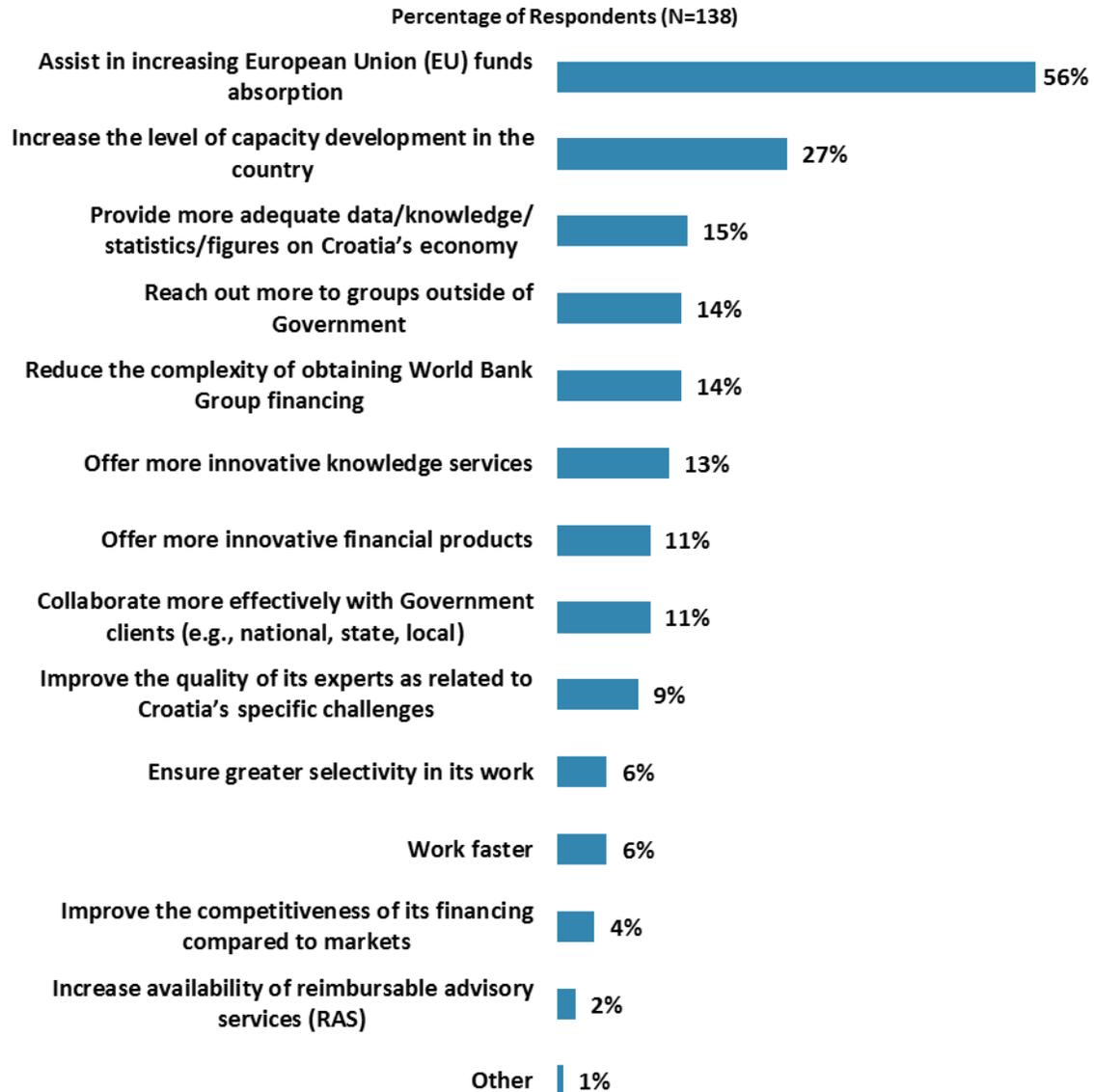
"Which of the following best describes the World Bank Group's support in Croatia? (Select only ONE response)" (Respondents chose from a list.)

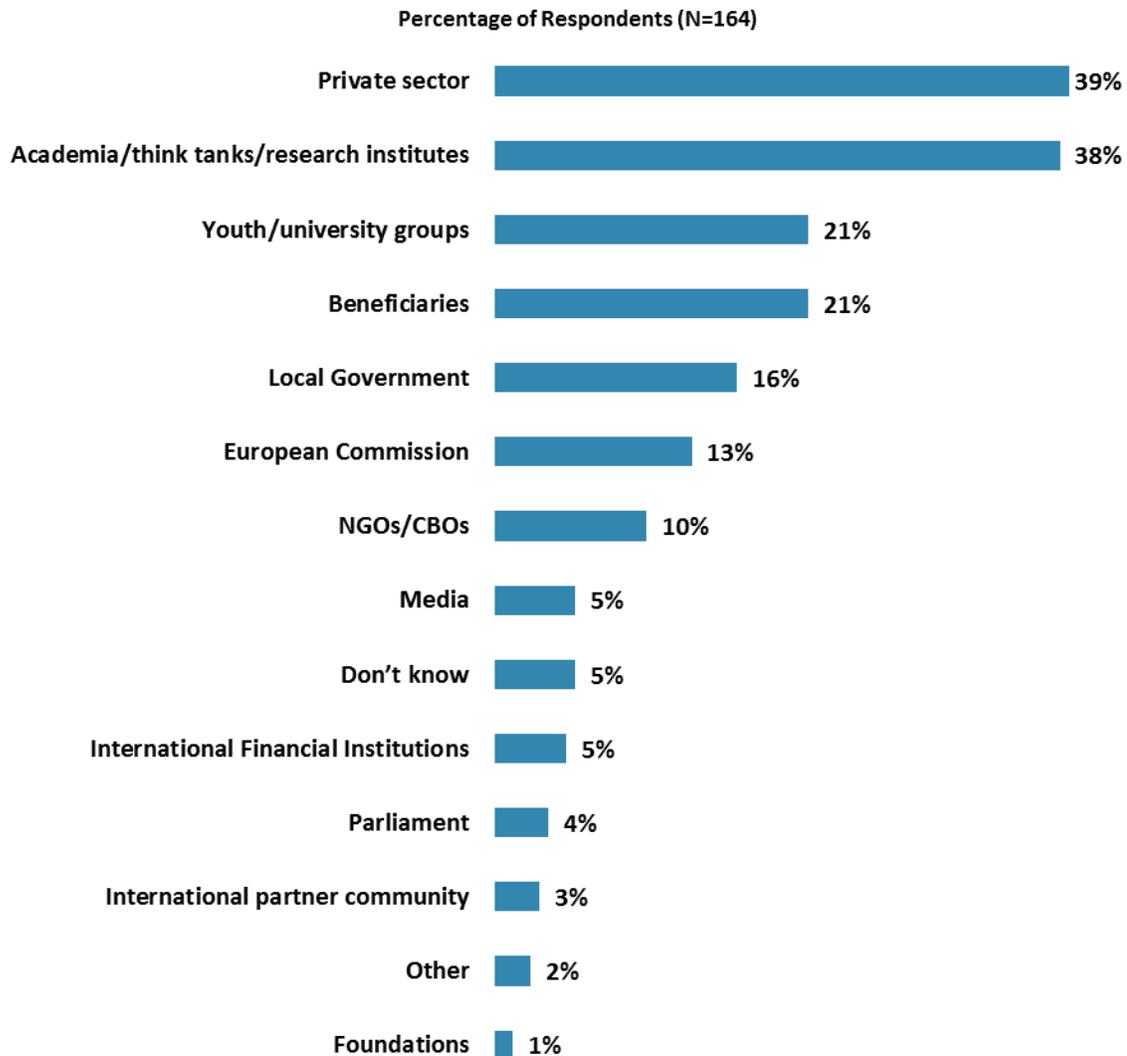

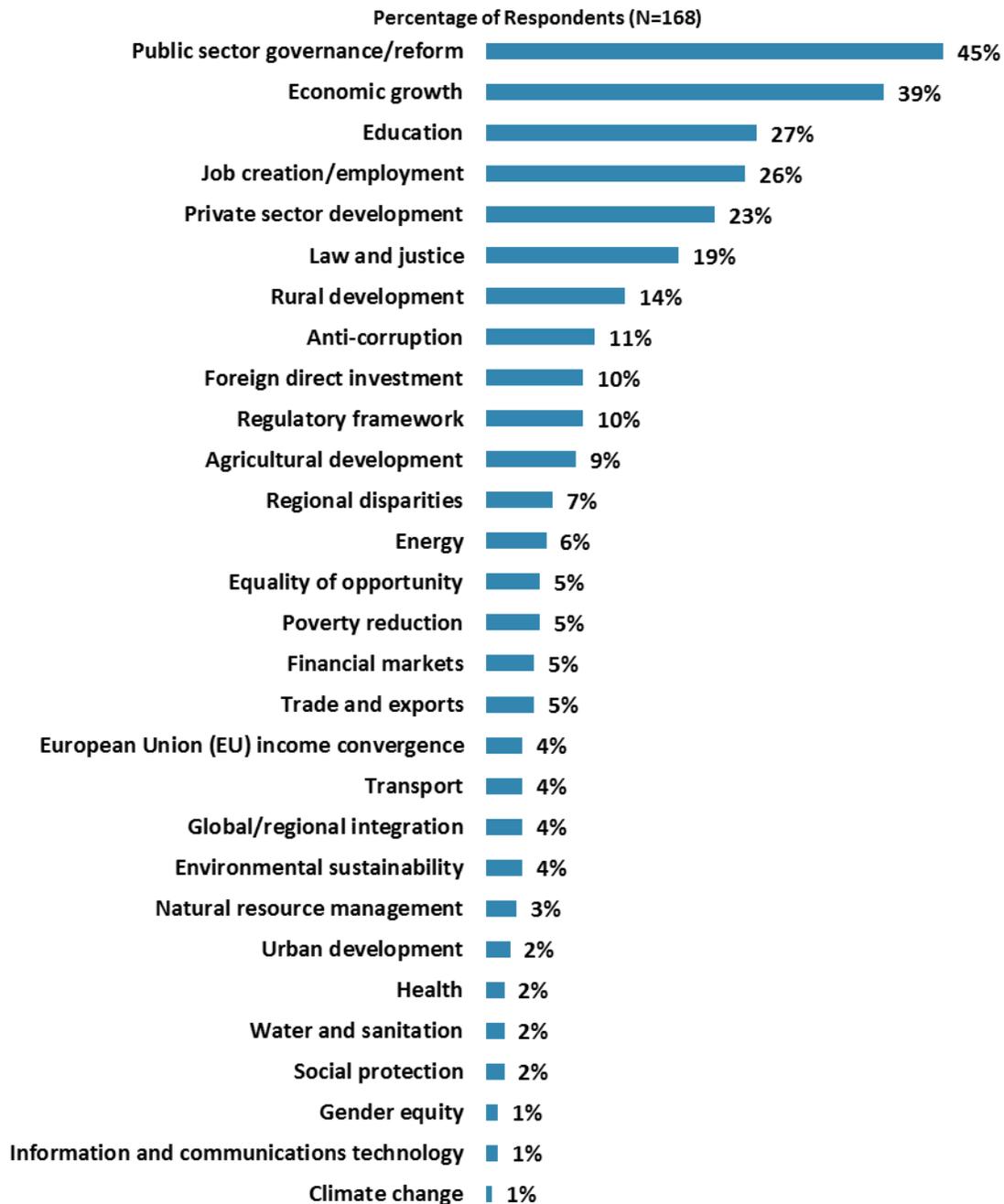

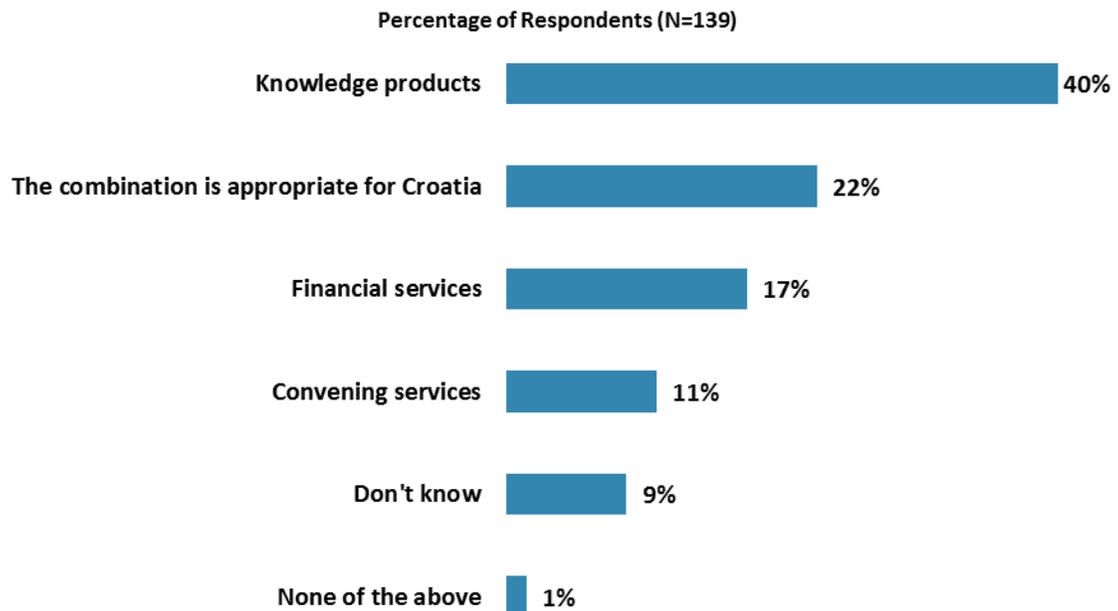

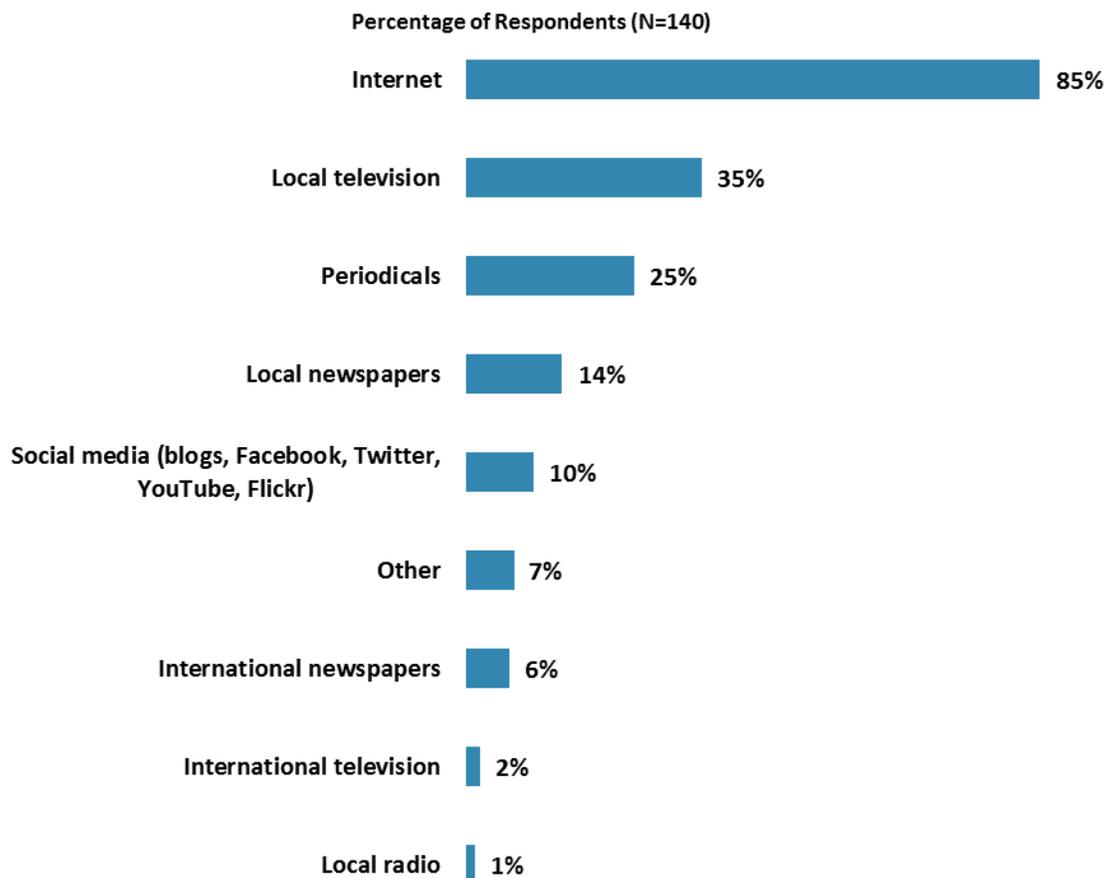

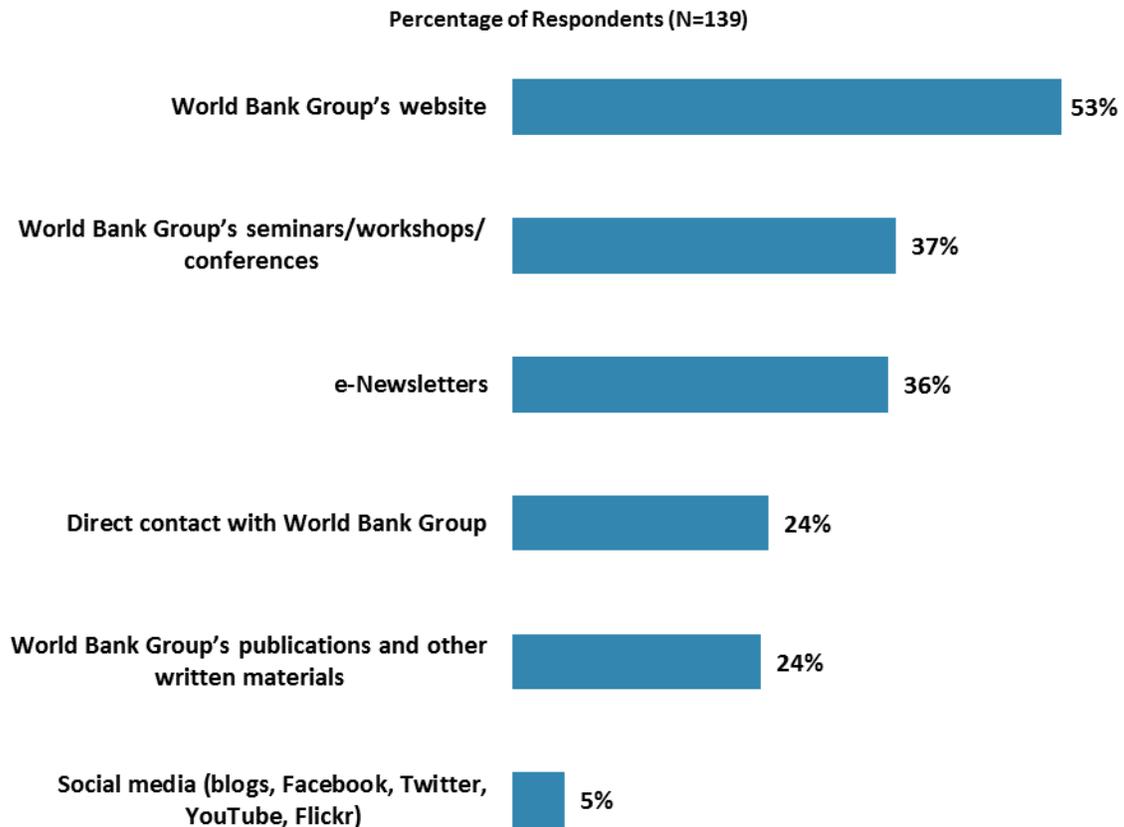
"How do you get most of your information about economic and social development issues in Croatia? (Choose no more than TWO)" (Respondents chose from a list. Responses combined.)

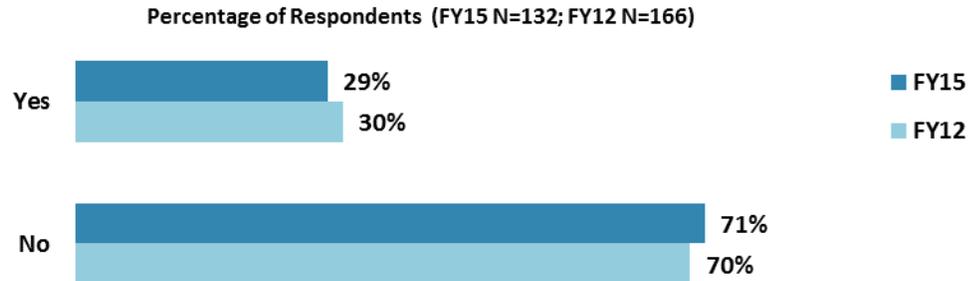


"How would you prefer to receive information from the World Bank Group?
(Choose no more than TWO)" (Respondents chose from a list. Responses combined.)



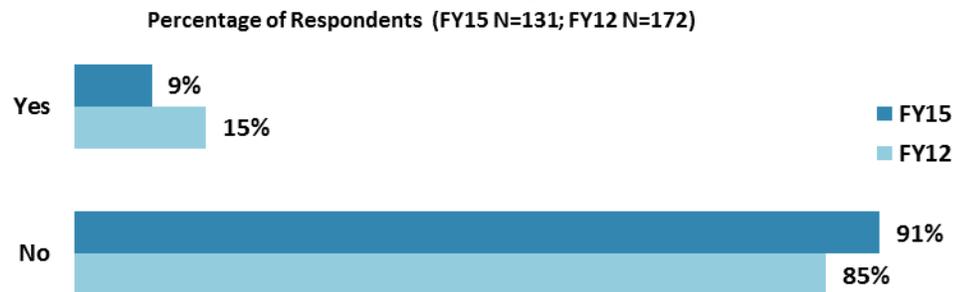

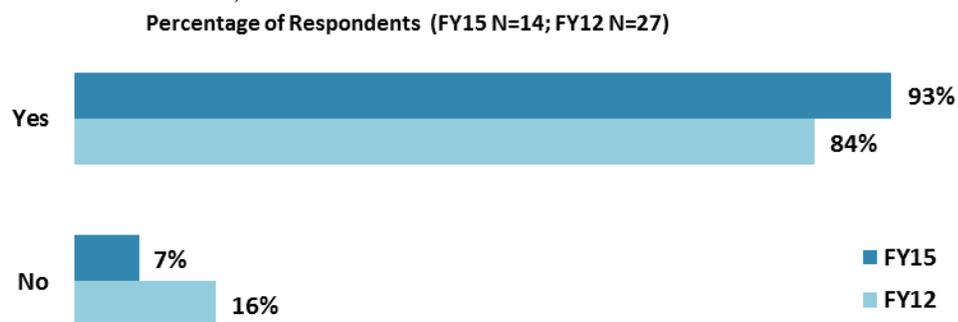
"Are you aware of the World Bank Group's Access to Information Policy under which the Bank Group statistically similar information in its possession that is not on a list of exceptions?"

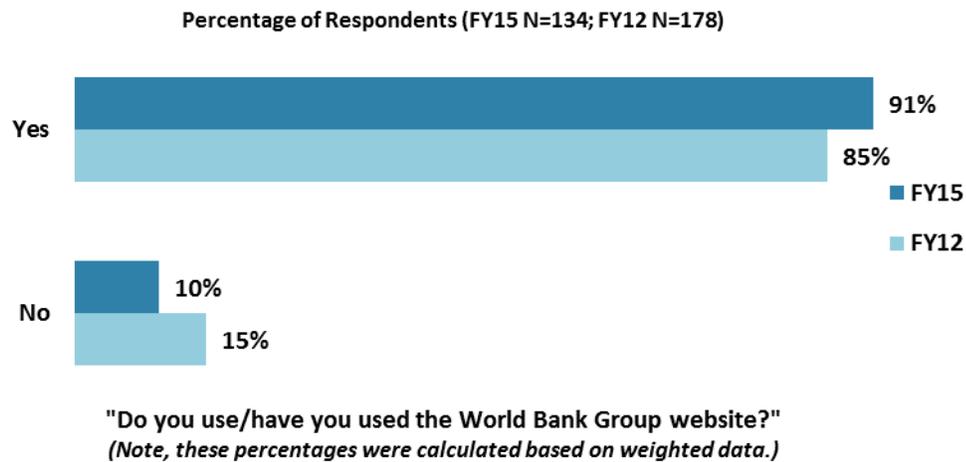

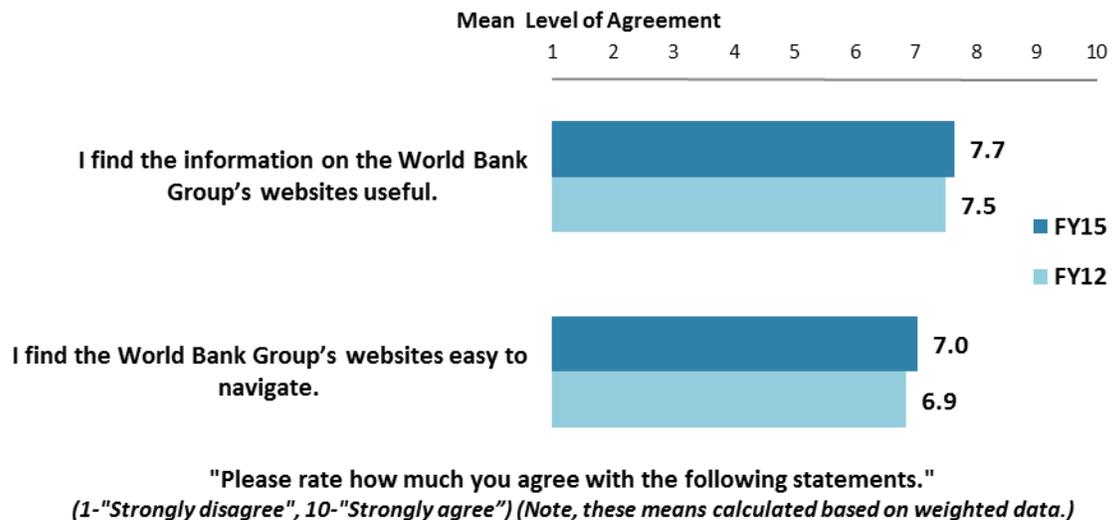

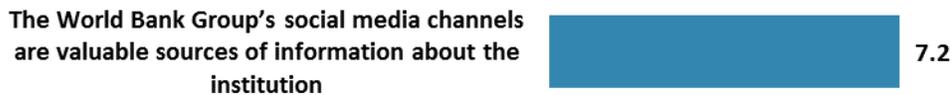
Percentage of Respondents (N=142)

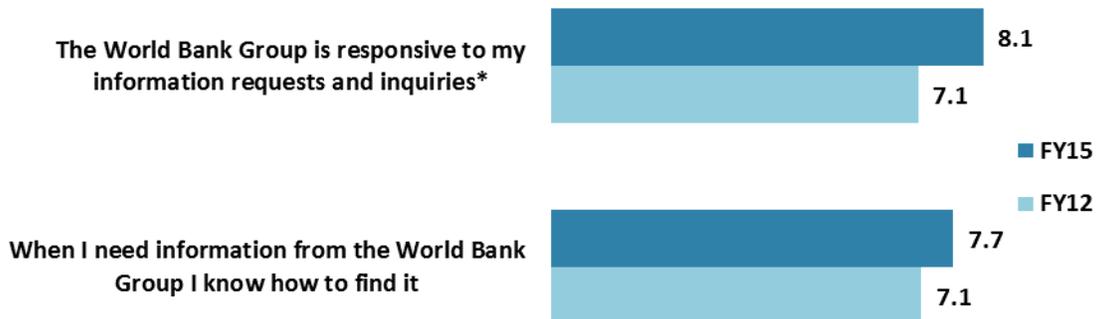
