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I. Objectives

This survey was designed to assist the World Bank Group (WBG) in gaining a better understanding of how stakeholders in Afghanistan perceive the WBG. The survey explored:

- *General Issues Facing Afghanistan*
- *Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group*
- *World Bank Group's Effectiveness and Results*
- *The Afghanistan Reconstruction Trust Fund*
- *The World Bank Group's Knowledge Work and Activities*
- *Working with the World Bank Group*
- *The Future Role of the World Bank Group in Afghanistan*
- *Communication and Information Sharing*
- *Background Information*

II. Methodology

From March to May 2018, 660 stakeholders of the WBG in Afghanistan were invited to provide their opinions on the WBG's work in the country by participating in a Country Opinion Survey. Participants were drawn from the Office of the President; office of the Chief Executive; office of a Minister; office of a Parliamentarian; employees of ministries/ministerial departments/implementation agencies; Project Management Units (PMUs) overseeing implementation of a project or consultants/contractors working on WBG-supported projects/programs; local government offices or staff; bilateral and multilateral agencies; private sector organizations; private foundations; the financial sector/private banks; NGOs and community-based organizations (CBOs); the media; independent government institutions; trade unions; faith-based groups; youth groups; academia/research institutes/think tanks; and the judiciary branch.

A total of 502 stakeholders participated in the survey (76% response rate). Respondents either received the questionnaire via email and completed it online or they completed the questionnaire with an independent fielding consultant.

Every country that engages in the Country Opinion Survey (COS) must include specific indicator questions that will be aggregated for the World Bank Group's annual Corporate Scorecard. These questions are identified throughout the survey report.

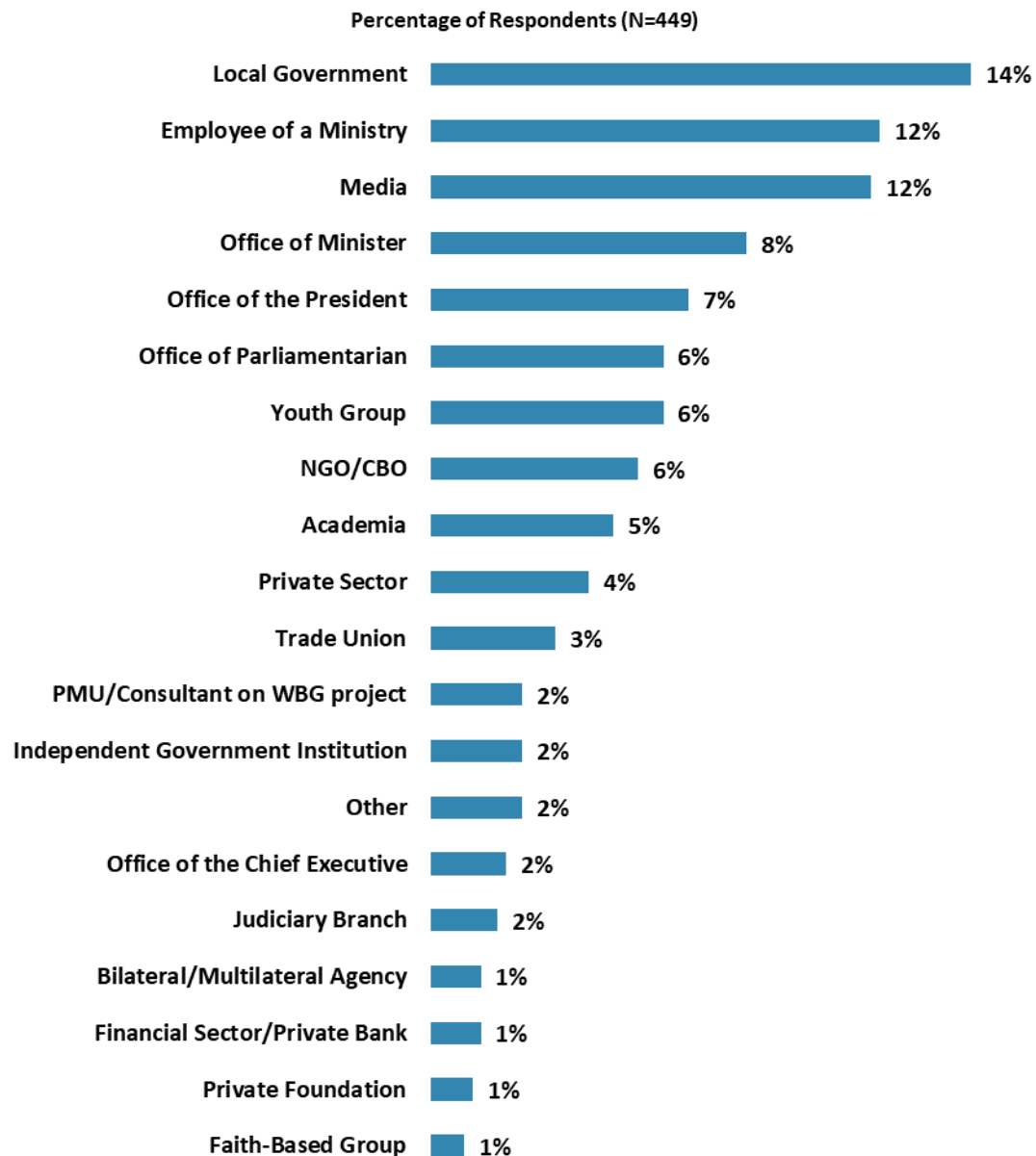
The results in this year's Country Survey were compared to those in the Country Survey conducted in FY'15 (response rate was 91%, N=407). The data were weighted to reach similar stakeholder compositions across both survey years, allowing for more statistically reliable comparisons. Note, stakeholders who identified themselves as "Other" in the stakeholder category options were not included in these comparisons. As a result, mean ratings, percentages of respondents, and the total number of respondents in both years are slightly different from those of the original data reported in the FY '15 COS report and the non-weighted data presented in this report. III. Demographics of the Sample

Current Position

- For all further analyses, the few respondents from the office of the Chief Executive were combined with those from the office of the President; the few respondents from PMUs/Consultants on WBG-supported projects were combined with employees of ministries; the few respondents from the financial sector/private banks were combined with those from private sector organizations; respondents from NGOs/CBOs, private foundations, trade unions, faith-based groups, and youth groups were combined into one “CSO” category; and the small number of respondents from bilateral/multilateral agencies, independent government institutions, the judiciary branch, and other organizations were included in the “Other” category.

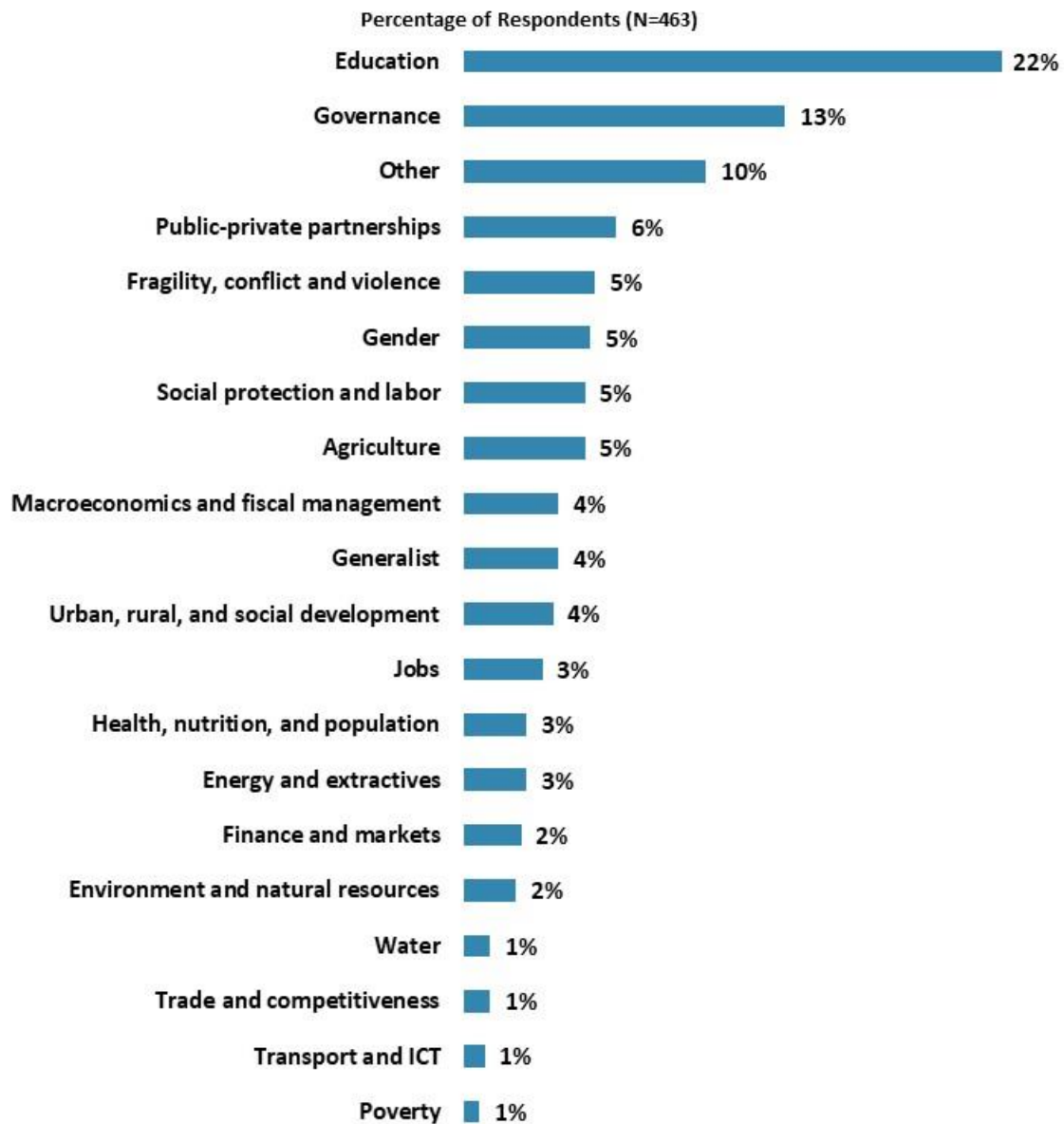


“Which of the following best describes your current position? (Select only ONE response)”

Area of Primary Specialization

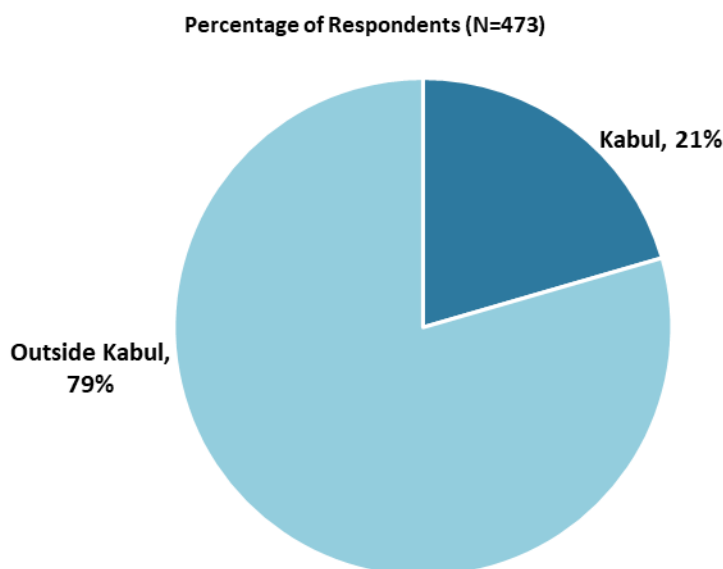

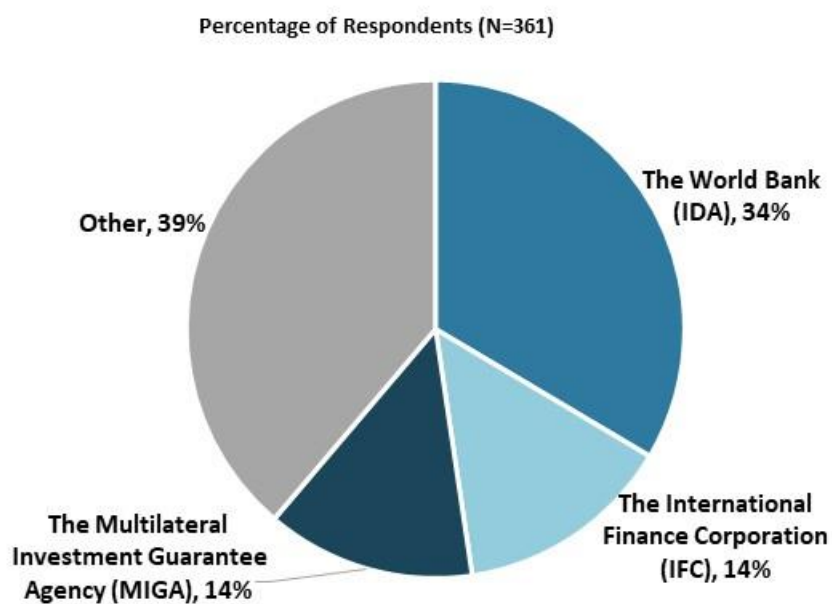

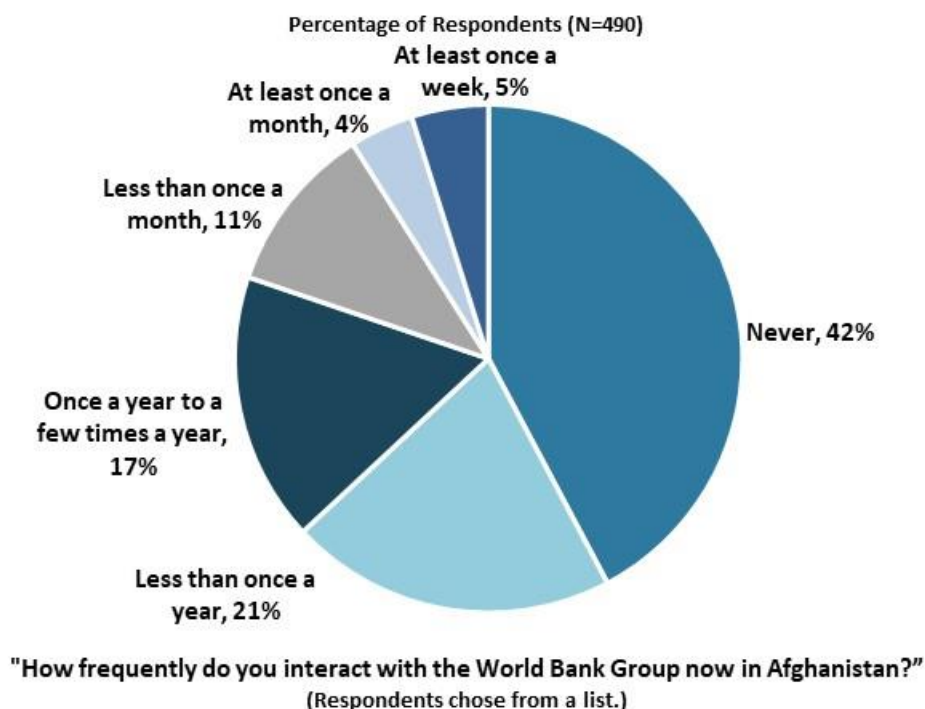
Familiarity with the World Bank Group

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey indicated significantly lower levels of familiarity with the WBG (weighted mean rating = 5.2) compared to respondents from the FY '15 Country Survey (weighted mean rating = 6.0).
- **Stakeholders:** Respondents from the office of a Minister indicated the highest levels of familiarity with the WBG whereas respondents from the office of a Parliamentarian and the media indicated significantly lower levels of familiarity.
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who collaborate with the WBG indicated significantly higher levels of familiarity with the WBG (mean rating = 6.4) compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 5.0).
- **Impact of Familiarity:** Respondents' ratings of familiarity with the WBG were moderately, significantly correlated with their ratings of the WBG's overall effectiveness in Afghanistan and with their ratings of the extent to which the WBG's work helps to achieve development results in Afghanistan.

(1 - "Not familiar at all", 10 - "Extremely familiar")

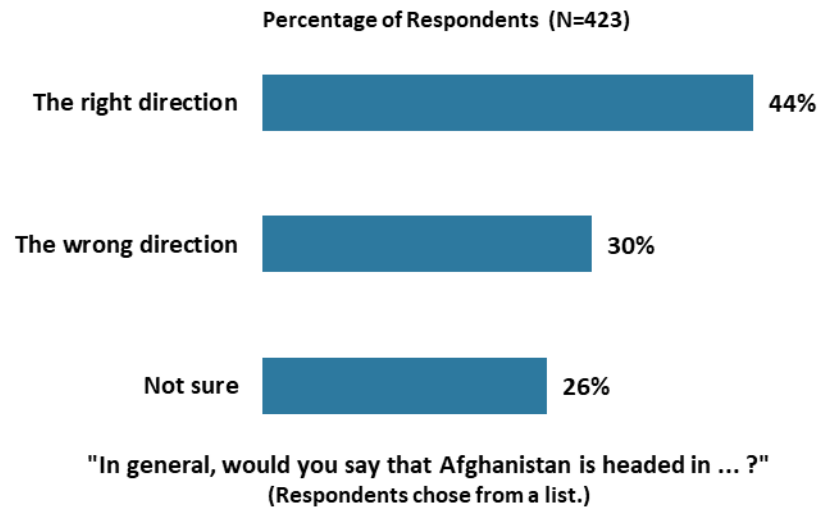

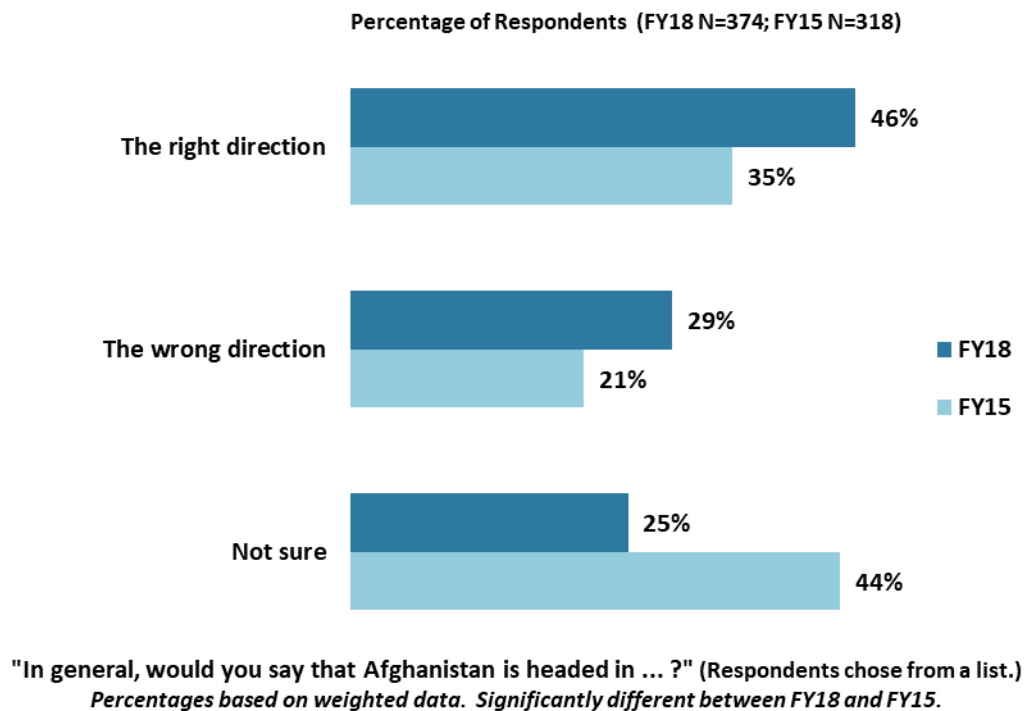

Headed in the Right Direction: Year Comparison

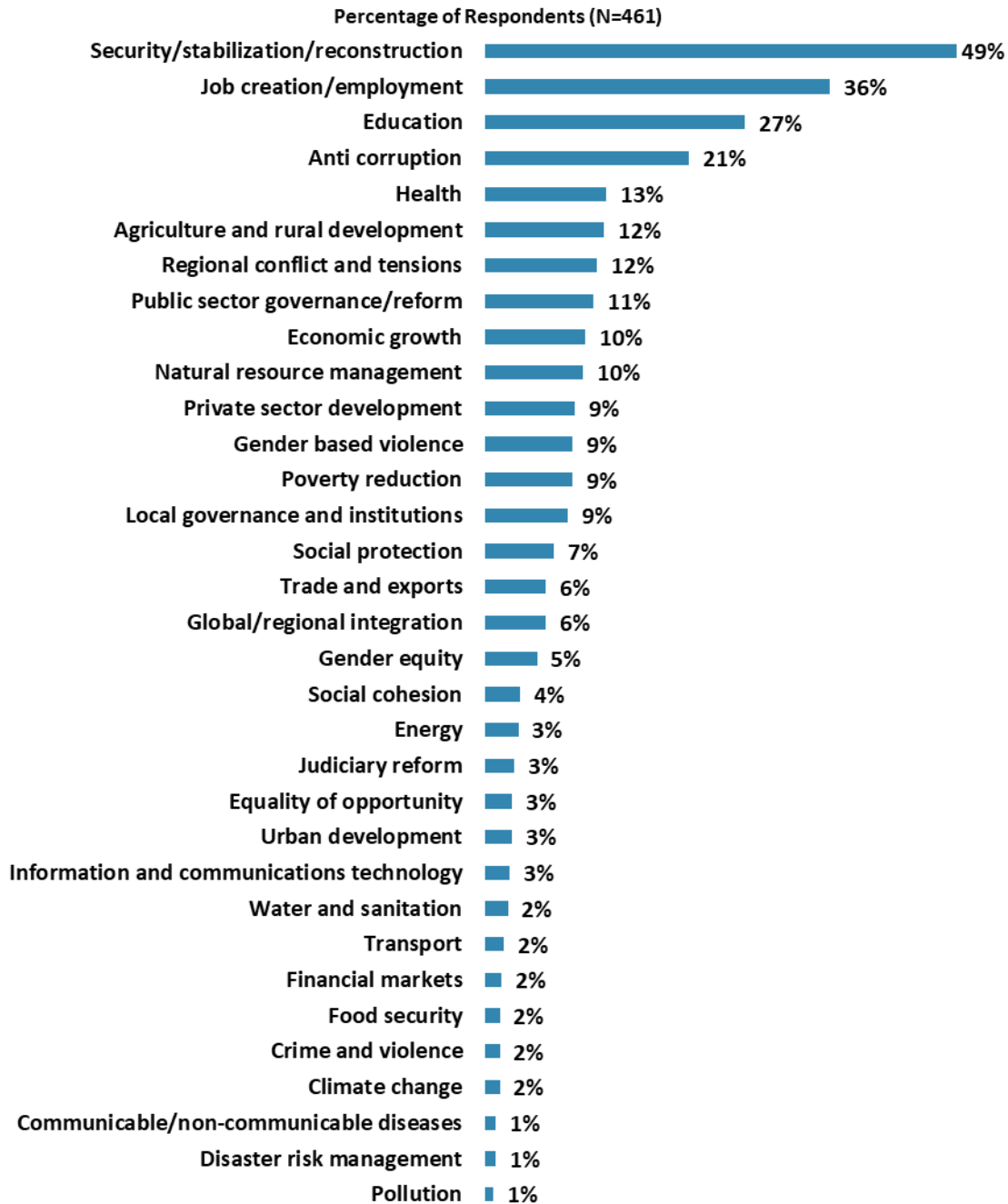

Development Priority

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY'15 Country Survey indicated that the most important development priority in Afghanistan was security/stabilization/reconstruction (74%), followed by education (30%) and anti-corruption (24%).
- Respondents who identified their primary specialization of work as Education (22% of the sample) were significantly *more* likely to indicate education (41%) and *less* likely to indicate security/stabilization/reconstruction (38%) as among the most important development priorities compared to respondents in other areas of work (23% and 52%, respectively).



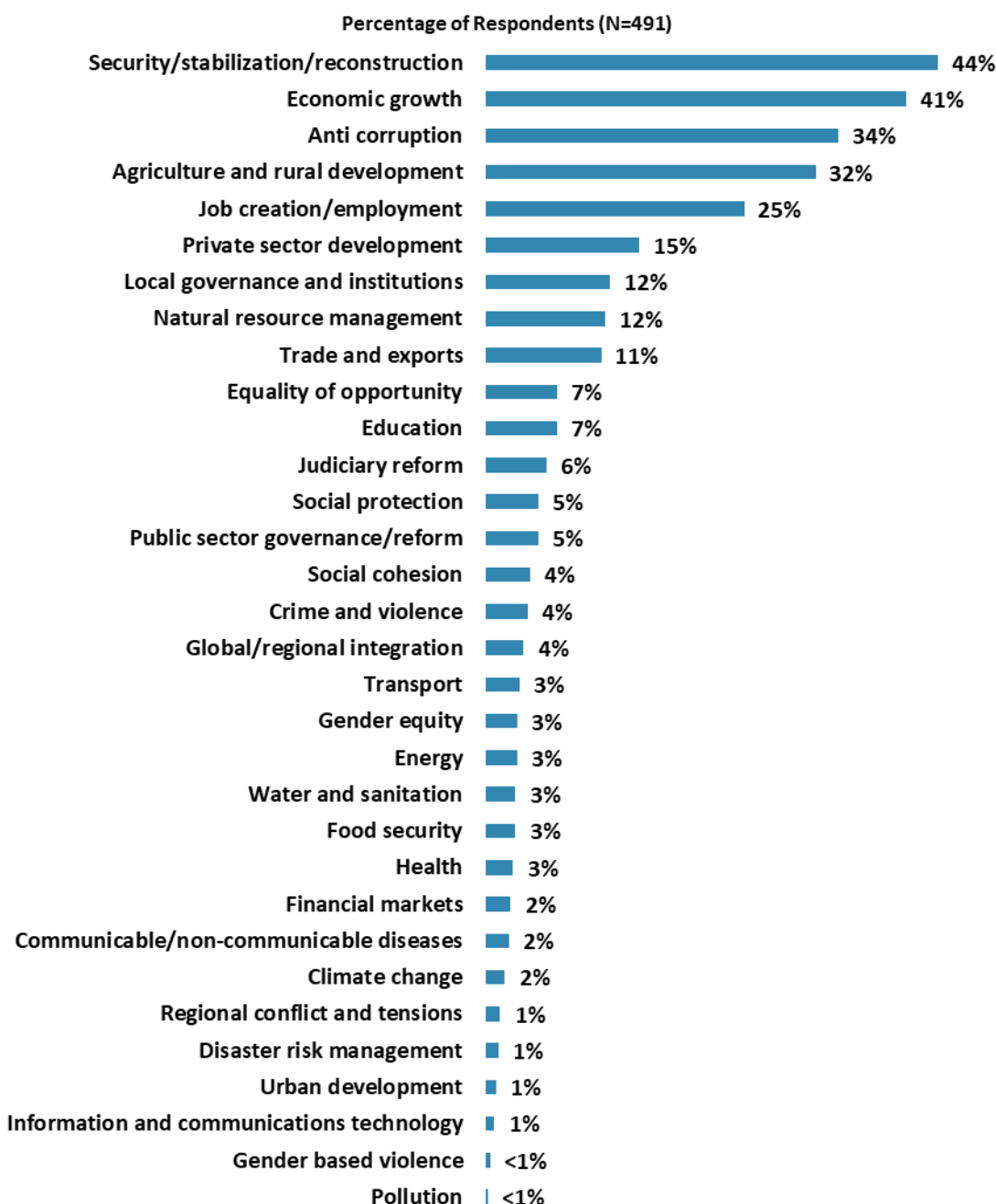

IV. General Issues Facing Afghanistan (continued)

Factors Contributing Most to Reducing Poverty

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY'15 Survey indicated that the largest contributors to poverty reduction were security/stabilization/reconstruction (45%), economic growth (34%), job creation/employment (24%), anti-corruption (15%), and agricultural development (15%).
- Respondents who identified their primary specialization of work as Education were significantly *more* likely to indicate education, public sector governance, and (non)communicable diseases (13%, 12%, and 9%, respectively) compared to respondents in other areas of work (5%, 3%, and 1%, respectively), and *less* likely to indicate economic growth and agriculture and rural development (31% and 22%, respectively) as among the most important development priorities compared to respondents in other areas of work (44% and 36%, respectively).



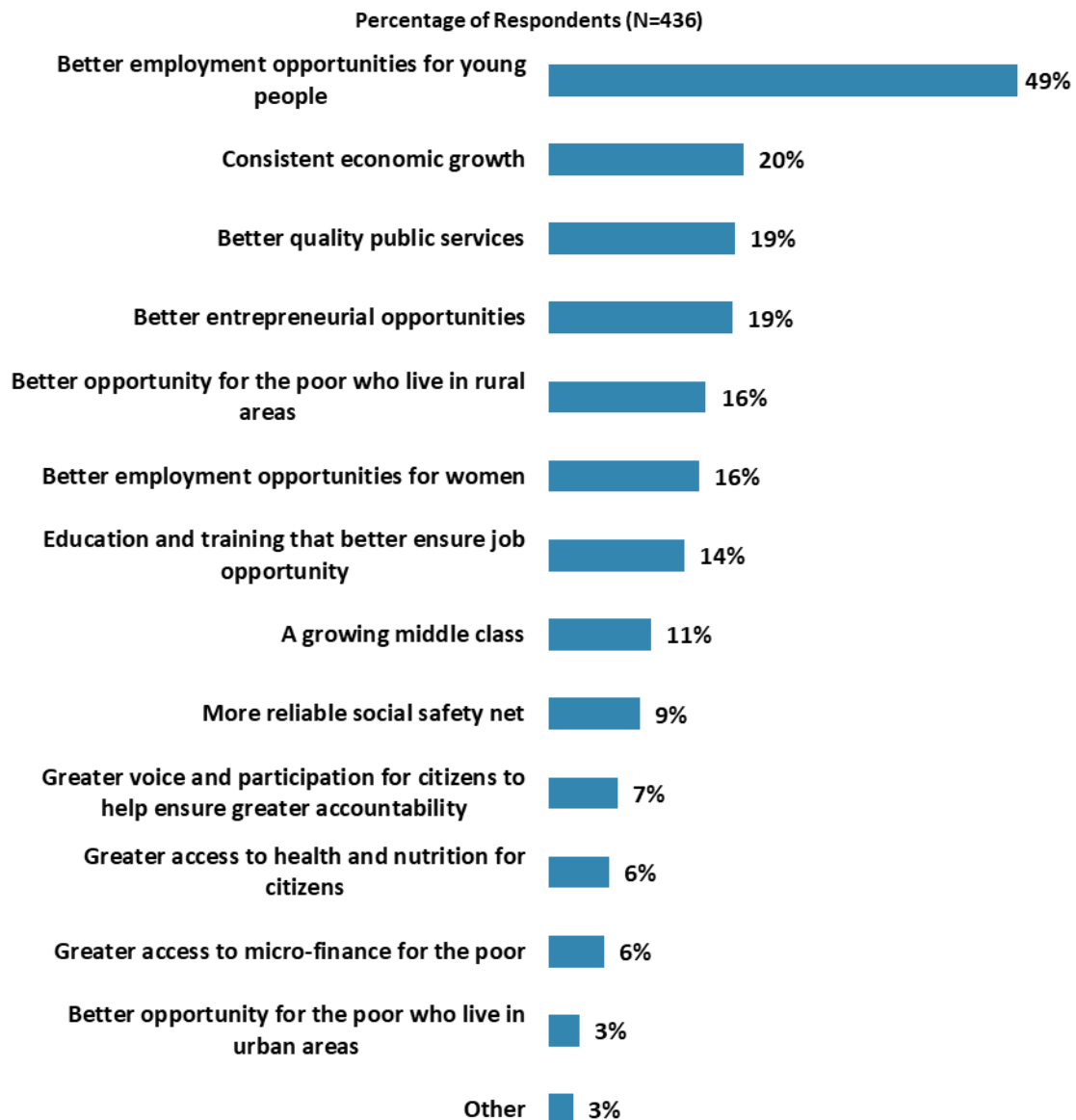

Factors Contributing to “Shared Prosperity”

- **Year comparison:** In the FY’15 Country Survey, respondents indicated that shared prosperity would be best achieved through better employment opportunities for all Afghans (57%), consistent economic growth (44%), and education and vocational training that better ensure job opportunity (24%).
- Respondents who identified their primary specialization of work as Education (22% of the sample) were significantly *more* likely to indicate a growing middle class and greater voice for citizens (18% and 14%, respectively) and *less* likely to indicate better employment opportunities for young people (38%) as indicators of shared prosperities compared to respondents in other areas of work (9%, 5%, and 51%, respectively).

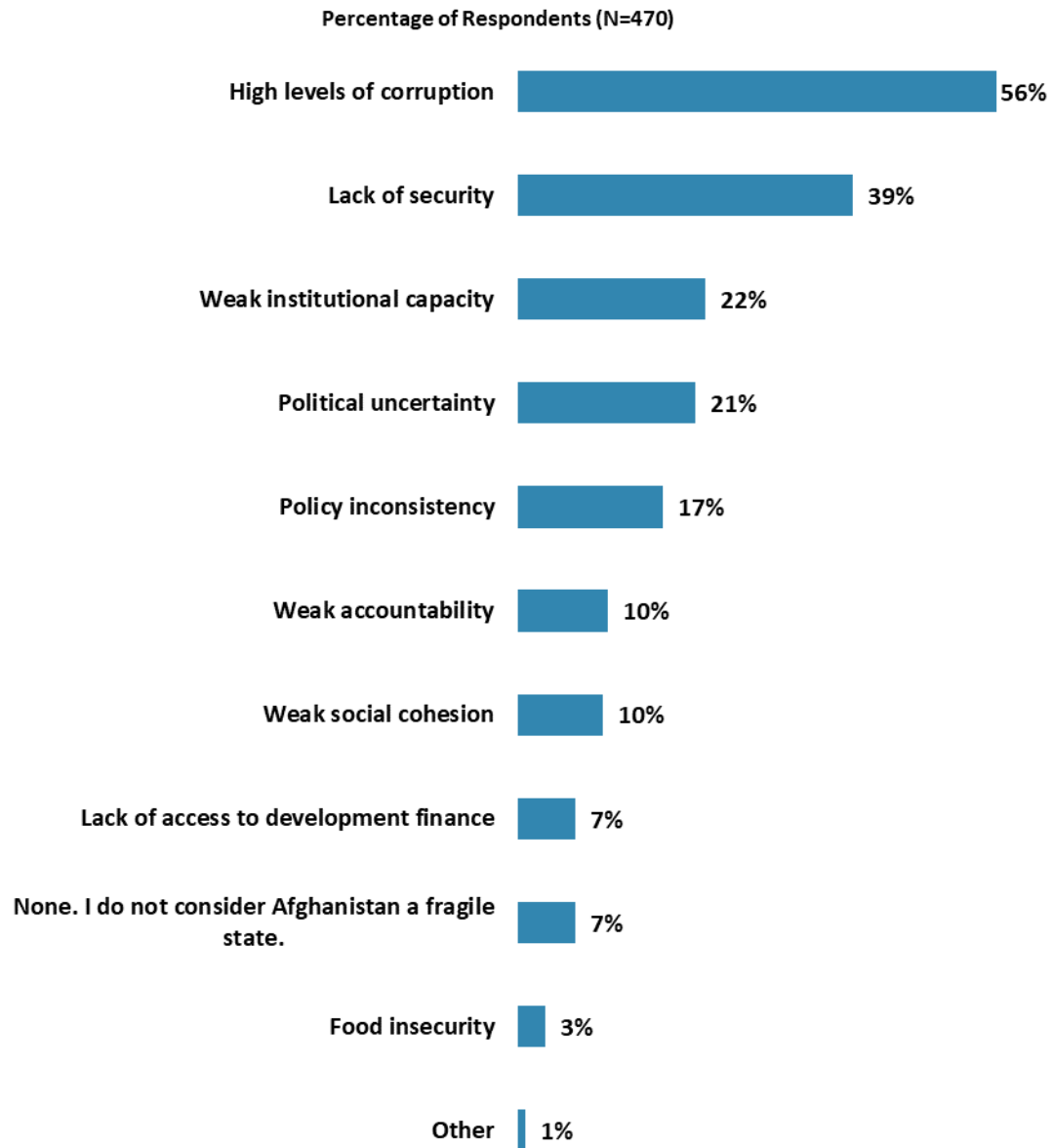

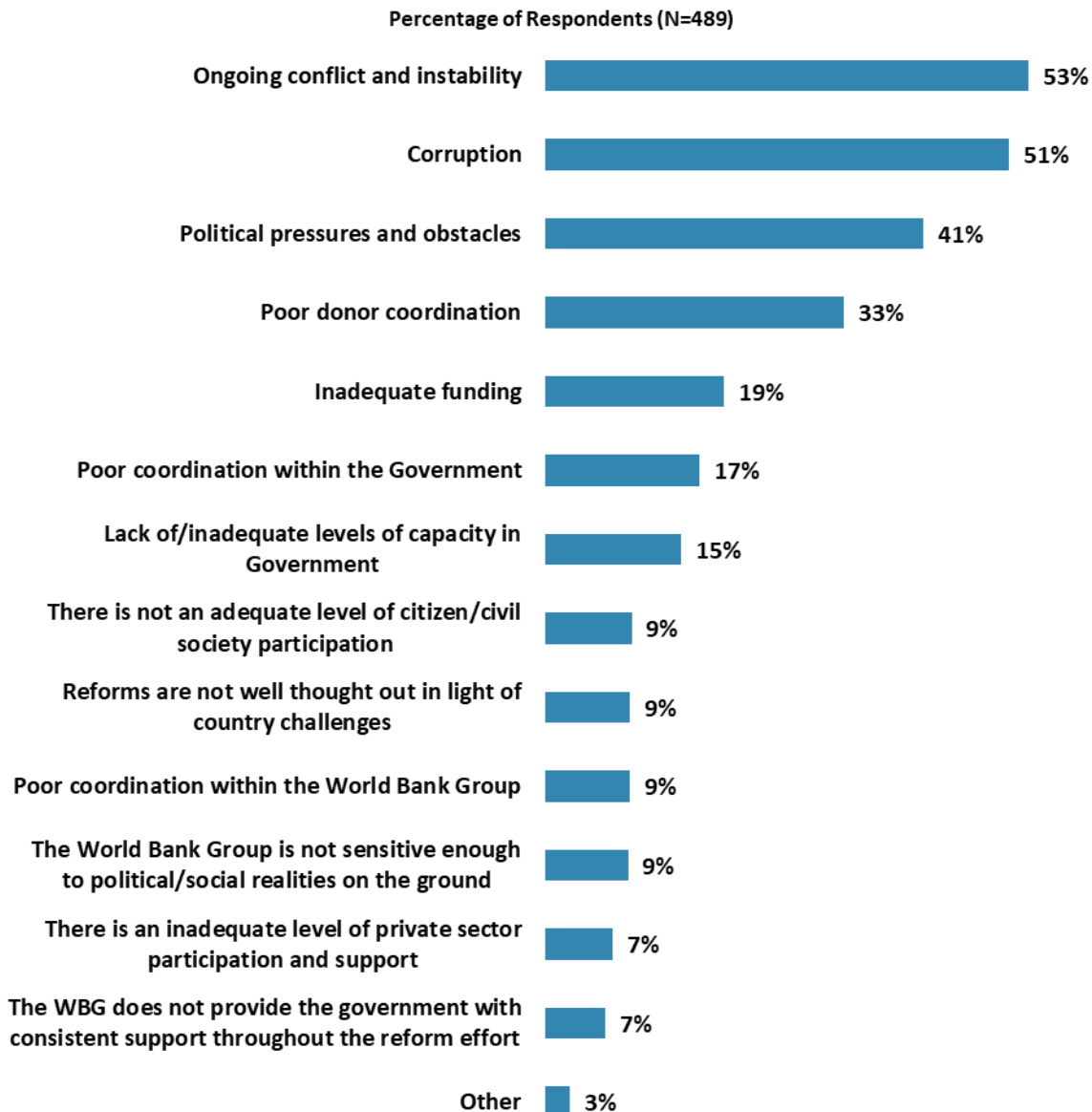
"When considering the characteristics of a fragile state, please identify which of the following best illustrate fragility in Afghanistan? (Choose no more than TWO)"

V. Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group

Attributing Failed/Slow Reform Efforts

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY '15 Country Survey indicated that they attributed slow or failed WBG-assisted reform efforts to ongoing conflict and instability (48%), inadequate levels of capacity in Government (47%), the WBG not being sensitive enough to political/social realities on the ground (36%), poor donor coordination (31%), political pressures and obstacles (18%), and the Government working inefficiently (26%).

The World Bank Group’s Overall Effectiveness (Indicator Question)

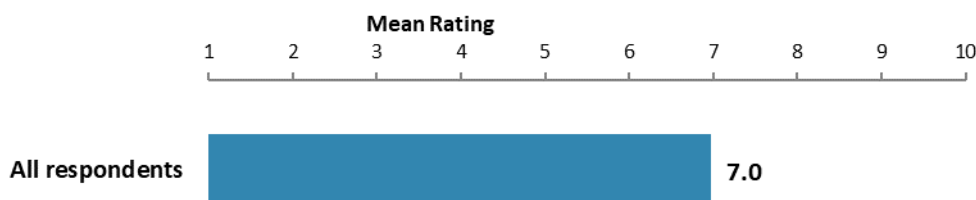
- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year’s Country Survey gave significantly lower ratings for the WBG’s effectiveness in Afghanistan (weighted mean rating = 7.0) compared to respondents from the FY ‘15 Country Survey (weighted mean rating = 7.6).
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who collaborate with the WBG gave significantly higher ratings for the WBG’s effectiveness (mean rating = 8.0) compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 6.8).

Achieving Development Results (Indicator Question)

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year’s Country Survey gave significantly lower ratings for the extent to which the WBG achieves development results (weighted mean = 7.0) compared to respondents from the FY ‘15 Country Survey (weighted mean = 7.4).
- **Stakeholders:** Respondents from the office of a Minister gave the highest ratings for the extent to which the WBG achieves development results in Afghanistan whereas respondents from the office of the President/Chief Executive gave significantly lower ratings.



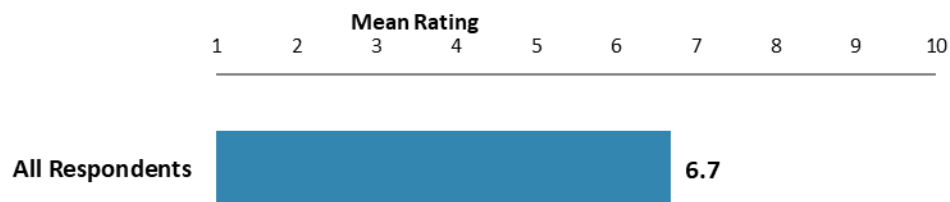
"To what extent does the World Bank Group’s work help to achieve development results in Afghanistan?" (1 - "To no degree at all", 10 - "To a very significant degree")

WBG Staff Preparedness

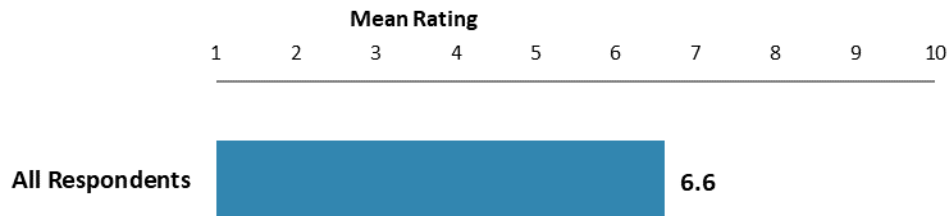
- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey gave significantly lower ratings for the WBG's staff being well prepared (weighted mean = 6.6) compared to respondents from the FY '15 Country Survey (weighted mean = 7.6).
- **Stakeholders:** Respondents from CSOs and employees of ministries/PMUs/Consultants on WBG-supported projects gave the highest ratings for the WBG's staff being well prepared whereas respondents from the private sector/financial sector/private banks gave significantly lower ratings.
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who collaborate with the WBG gave significantly higher ratings for the WBG's staff being well prepared (mean rating = 7.8) compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 6.4).

Building/Strengthening Existing Country Systems (Indicator Question)

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey gave statistically similar ratings for the WBG helping to build/strengthen existing country systems (weighted mean = 6.6) compared to respondents from the FY '15 Survey (weighted mean = 6.5).
- **Stakeholders:** Respondents from the office of a Minister and employees of ministries/PMUs/Consultants on WBG-supported projects gave the highest ratings for the WBG helping to build/strengthen existing country systems whereas respondents from the office of a Parliamentarian, CSOs, and the media gave significantly lower ratings.
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who collaborate with the WBG gave significantly higher ratings for the WBG helping to build/strengthen existing country systems (mean rating = 7.1) compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 6.5).



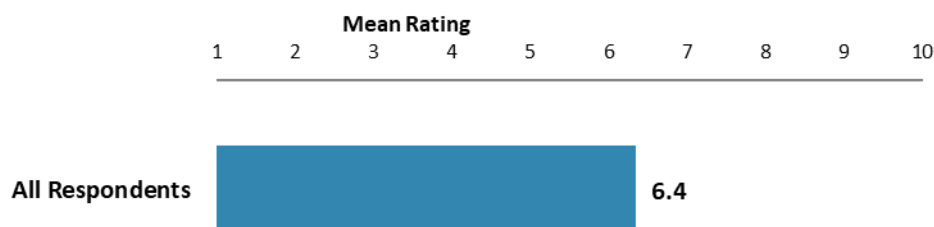
"To what extent does the World Bank Group help to build/strengthen existing country systems in Afghanistan?" (1-"To no degree at all", 10-"To a very significant degree")

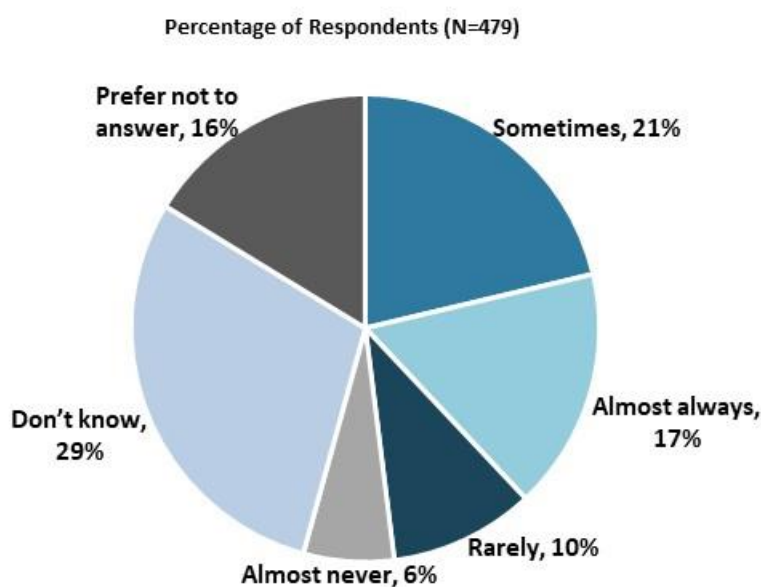
WBG Staffing in Afghanistan

- **Stakeholders:** Respondents from the office of a Minister gave the highest ratings for the WBG being adequately staffed in Afghanistan whereas respondents from the private sector/financial sector/private banks, academia, and other organizations gave significantly lower ratings.
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who collaborate with the WBG gave significantly higher ratings for the WBG being adequately staffed (mean rating = 8.0) compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 5.9).

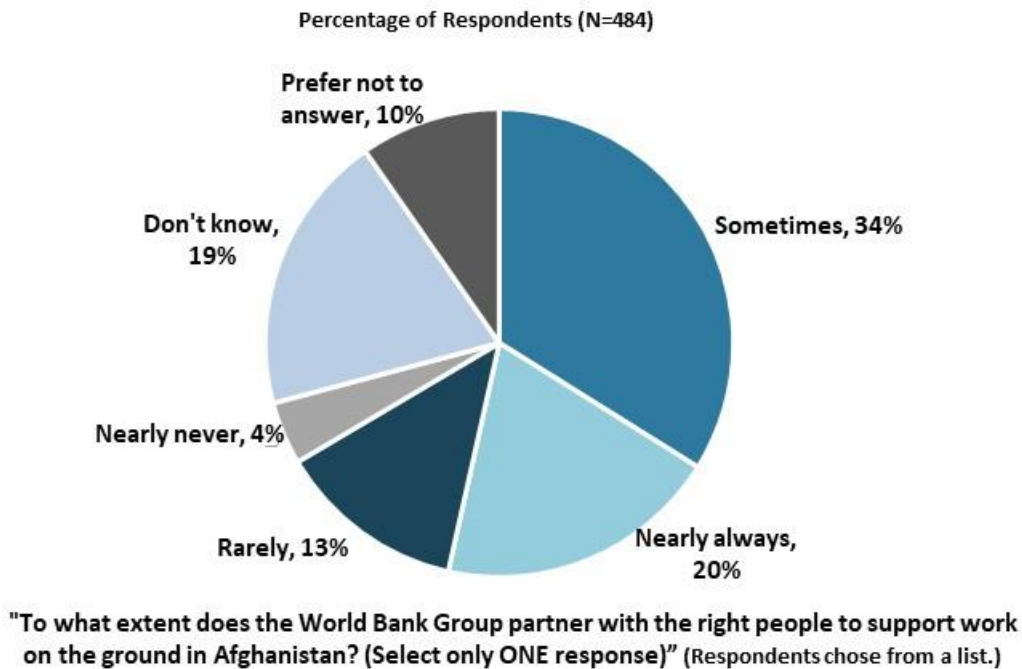

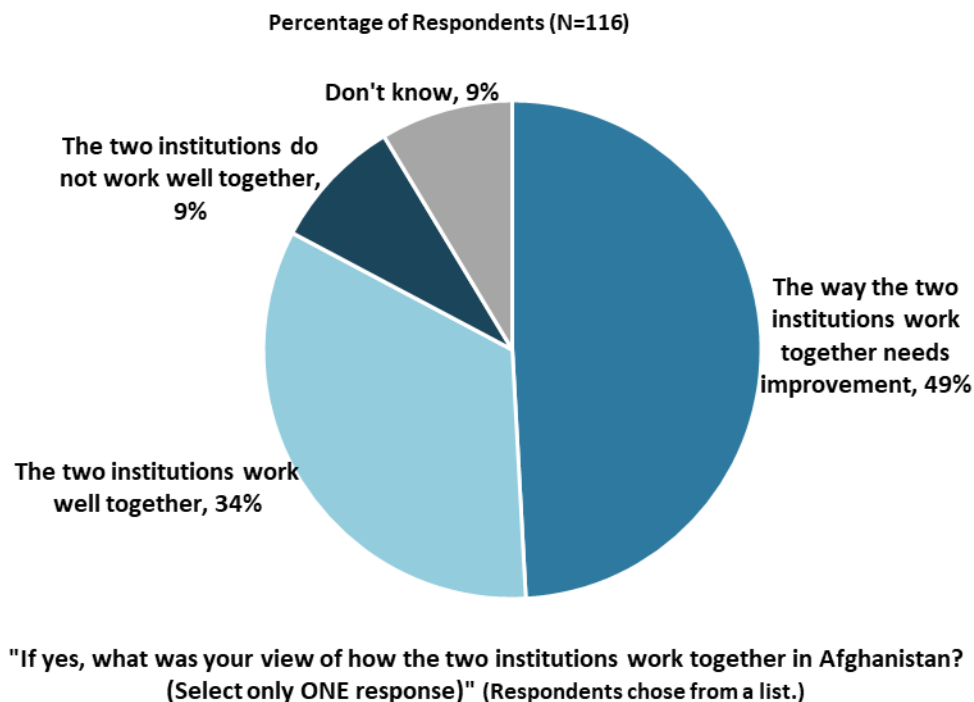

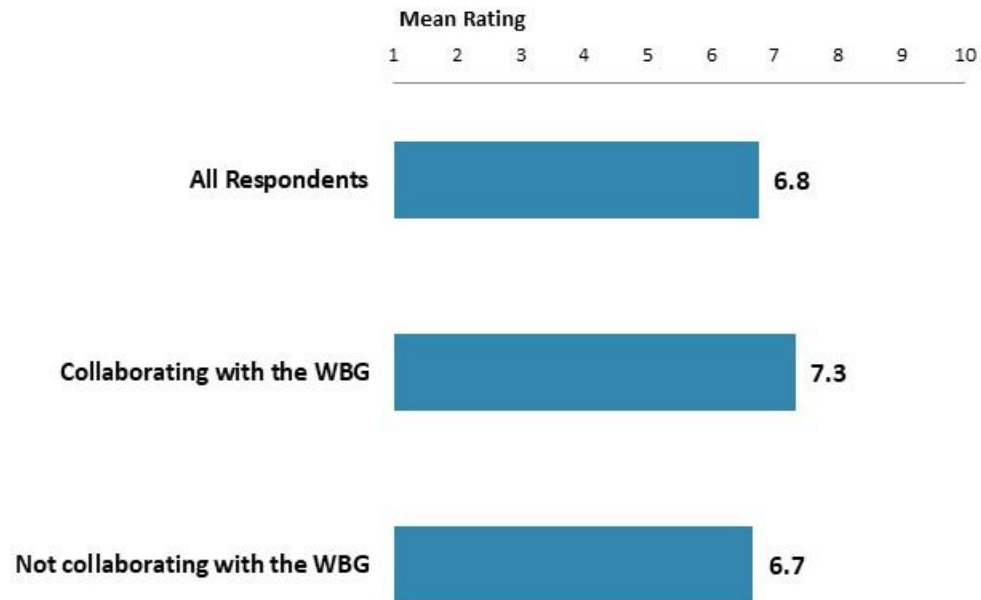

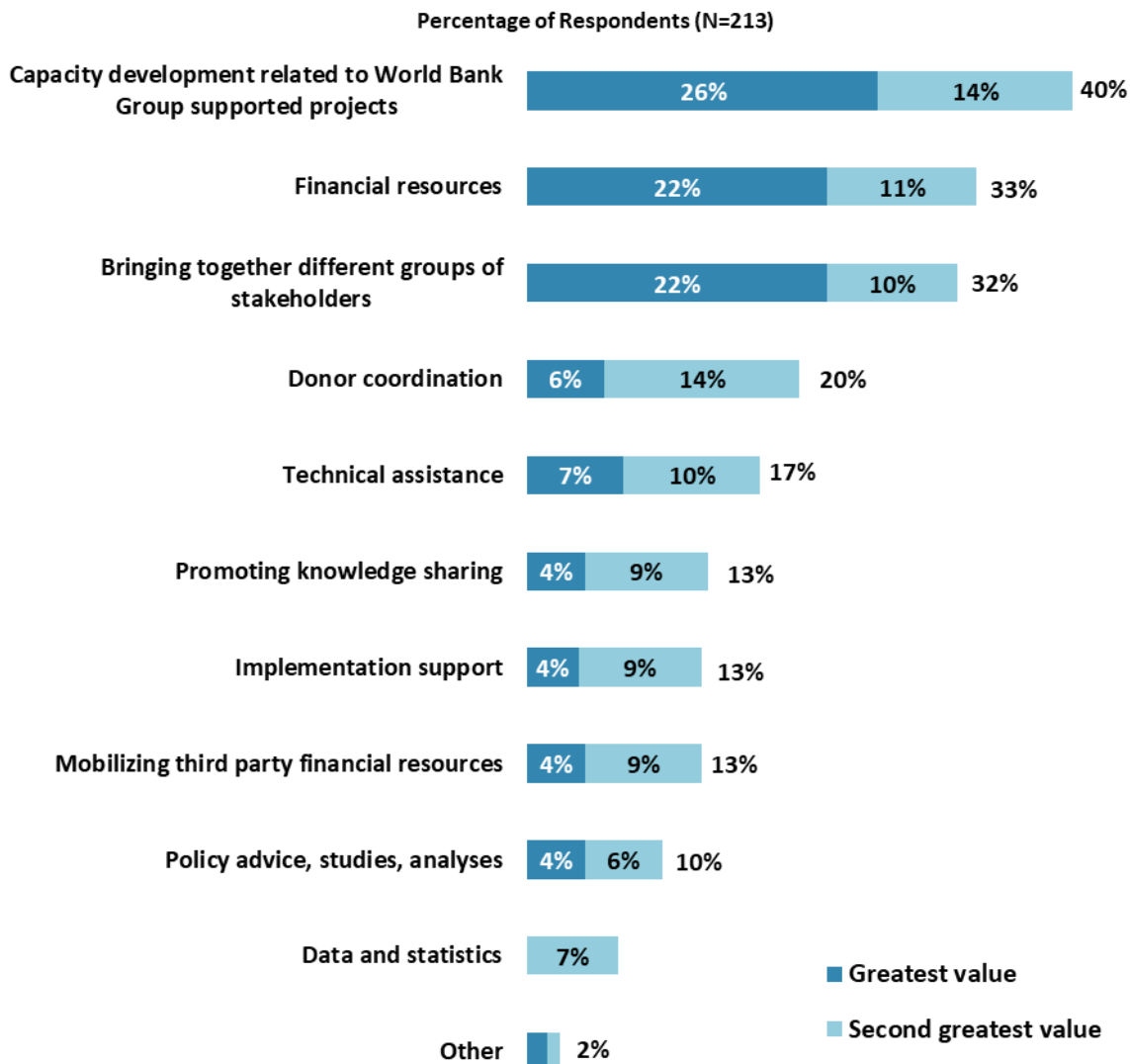
Mean Ratings for All Indicator Questions on a Scale from 1 to 10

Greatest Value

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY '15 Country Survey indicated that the WBG's greatest values were its financial resources (47%), capacity development (37%), and mobilizing third party financial resources (33%).



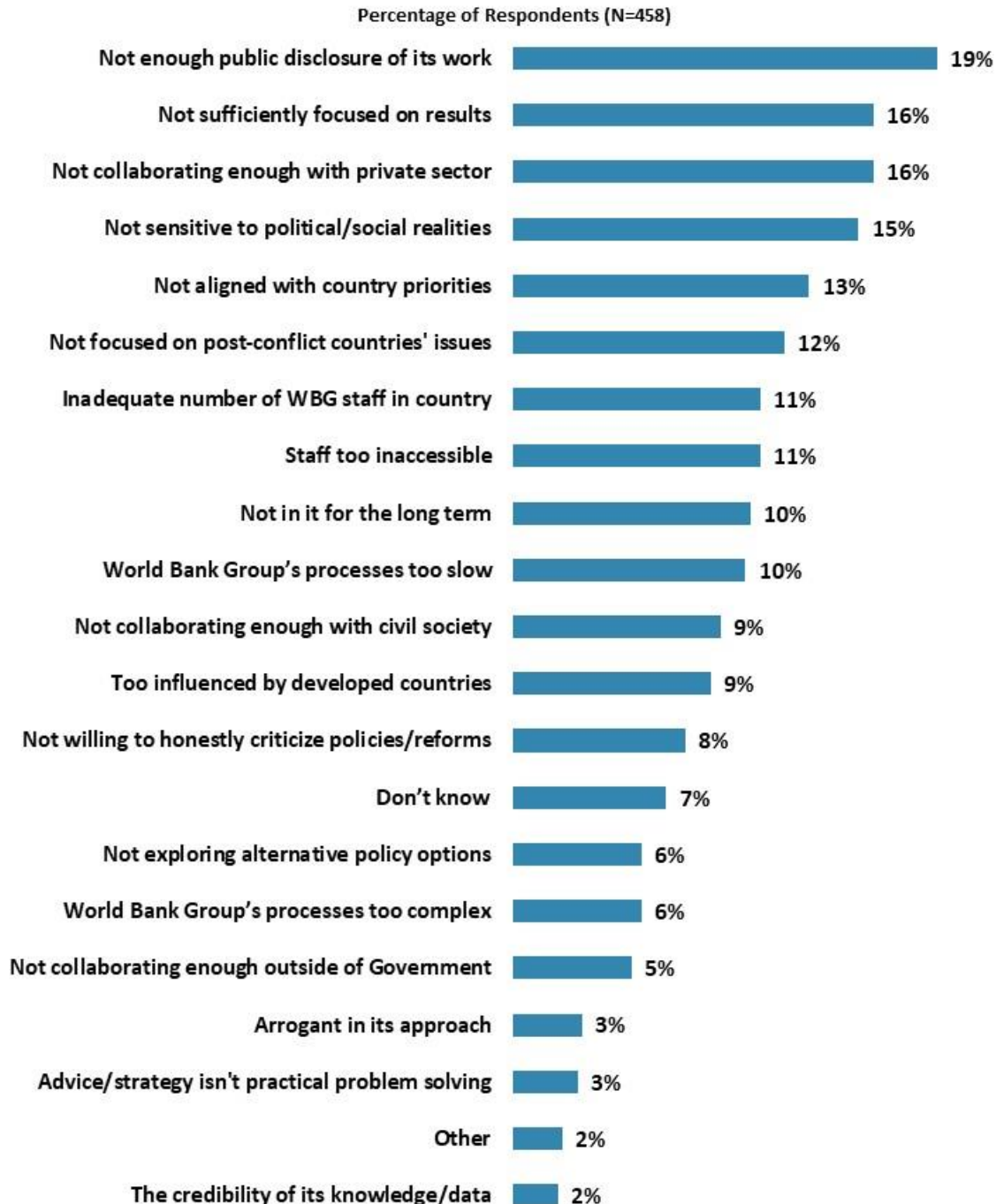

Greatest Weakness

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY '15 Country Survey indicated that the WBG's greatest weaknesses were not being adequately sensitive to political/social realities (18%), staff being too inaccessible (18%), not enough public disclosure of its work (17%), the WBG's processes being too complex (15%), and not being client-focused (15%).

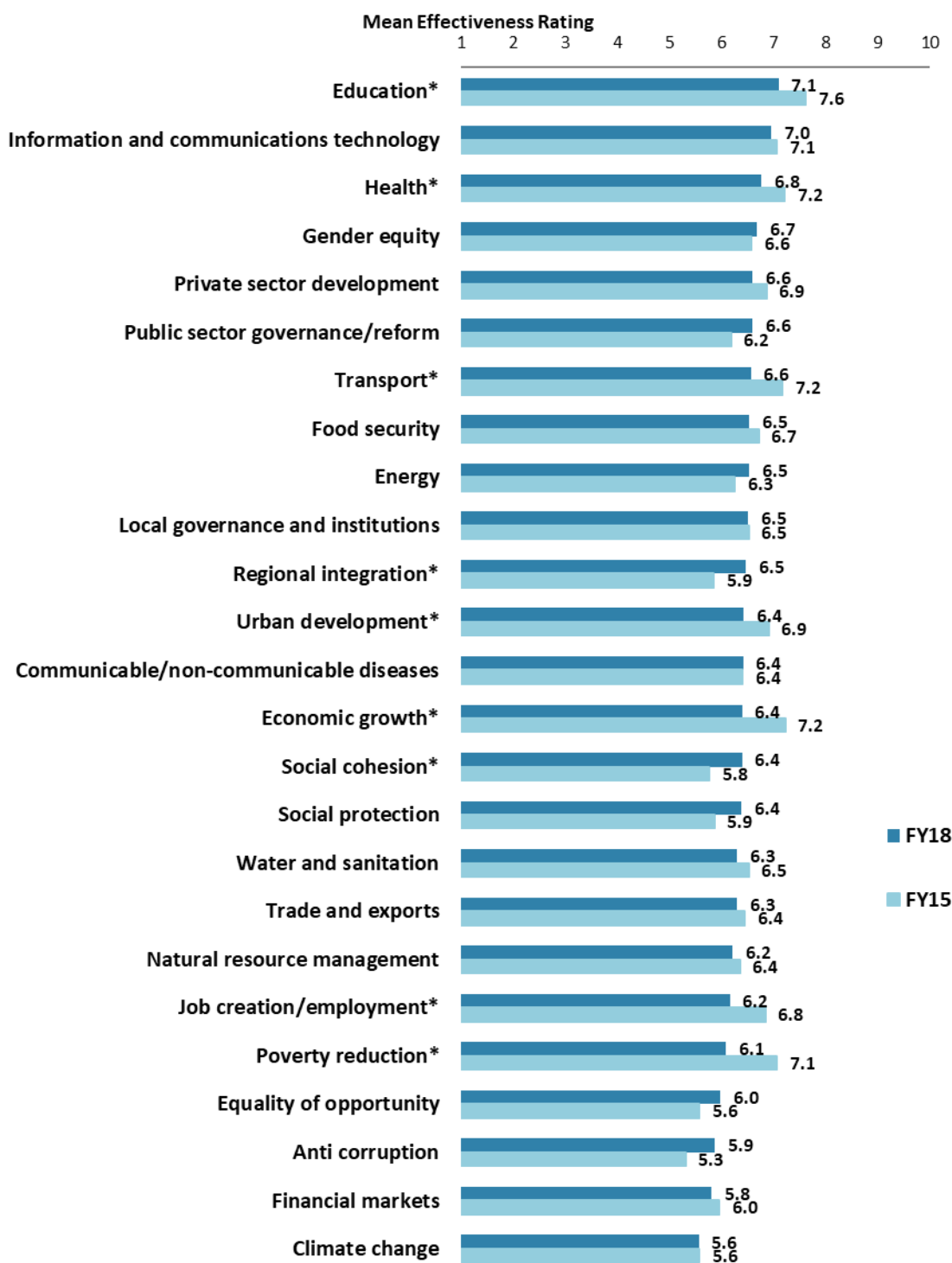

Effectiveness of WBG's Support in Sectoral Areas: Year Comparison

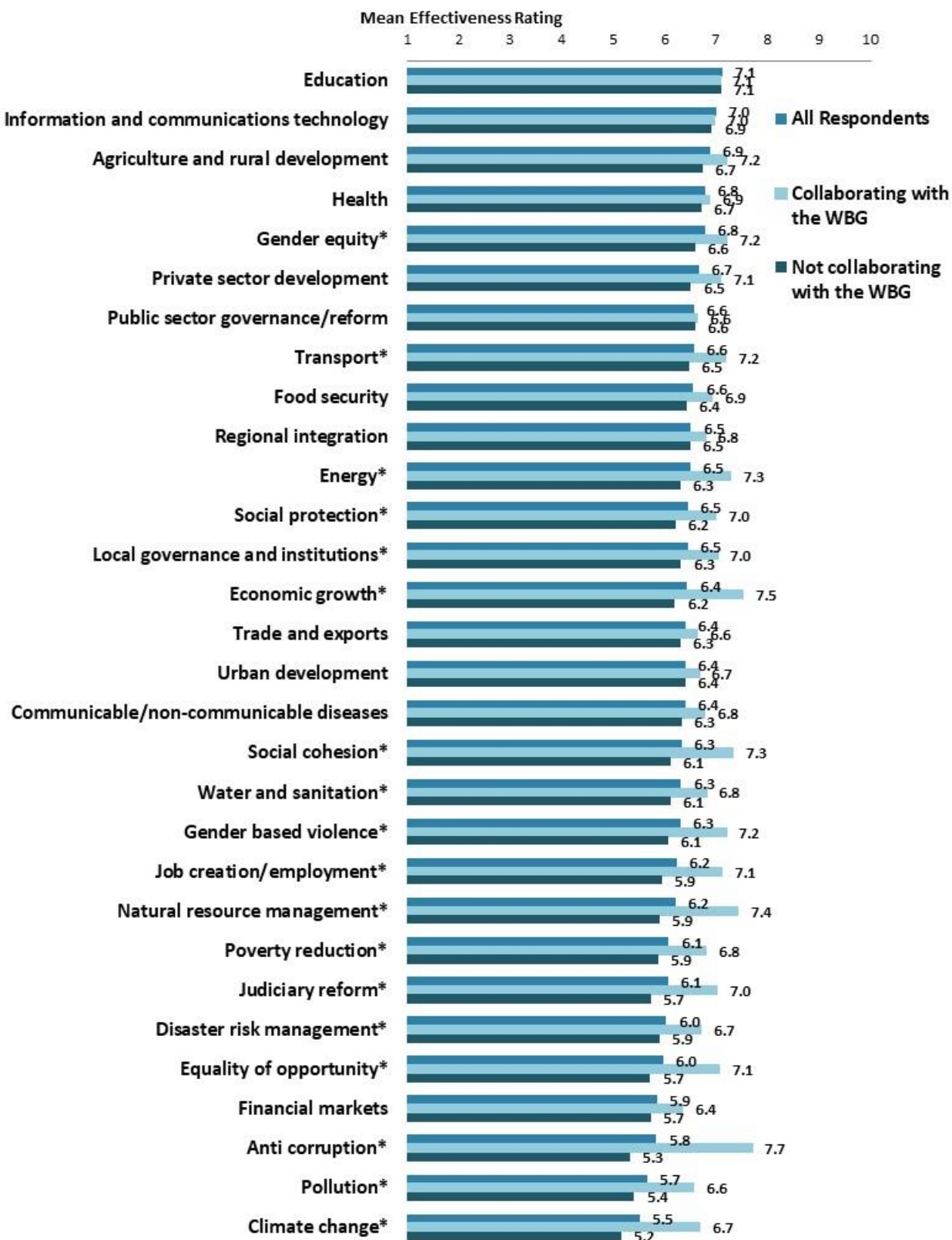

Effectiveness of WBG's Support in Sectoral Areas: Collaboration



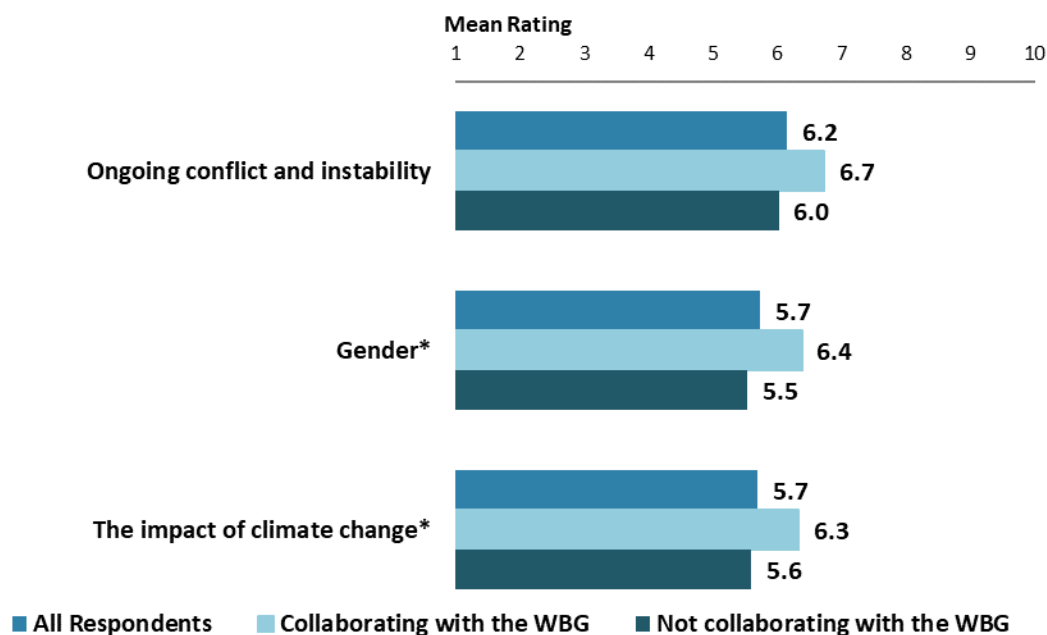

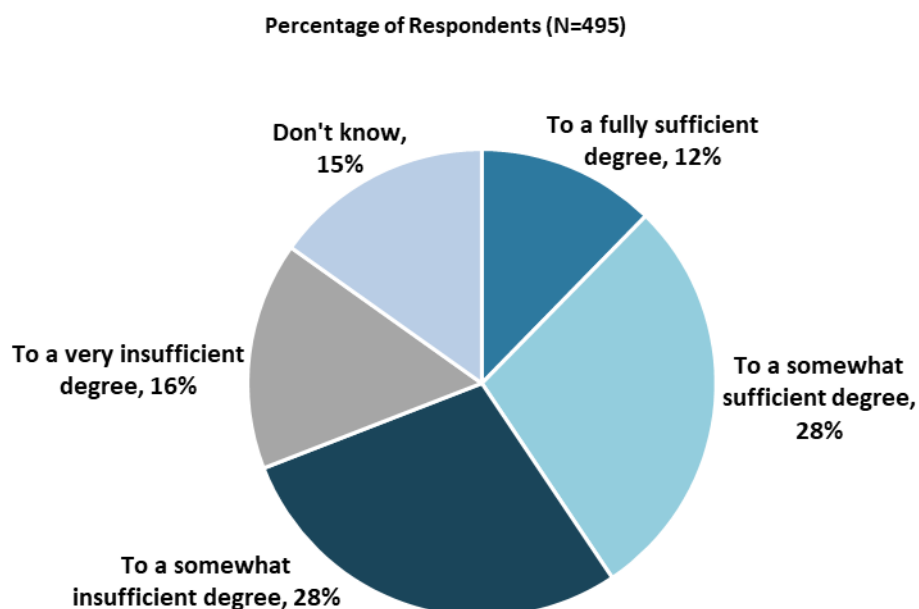

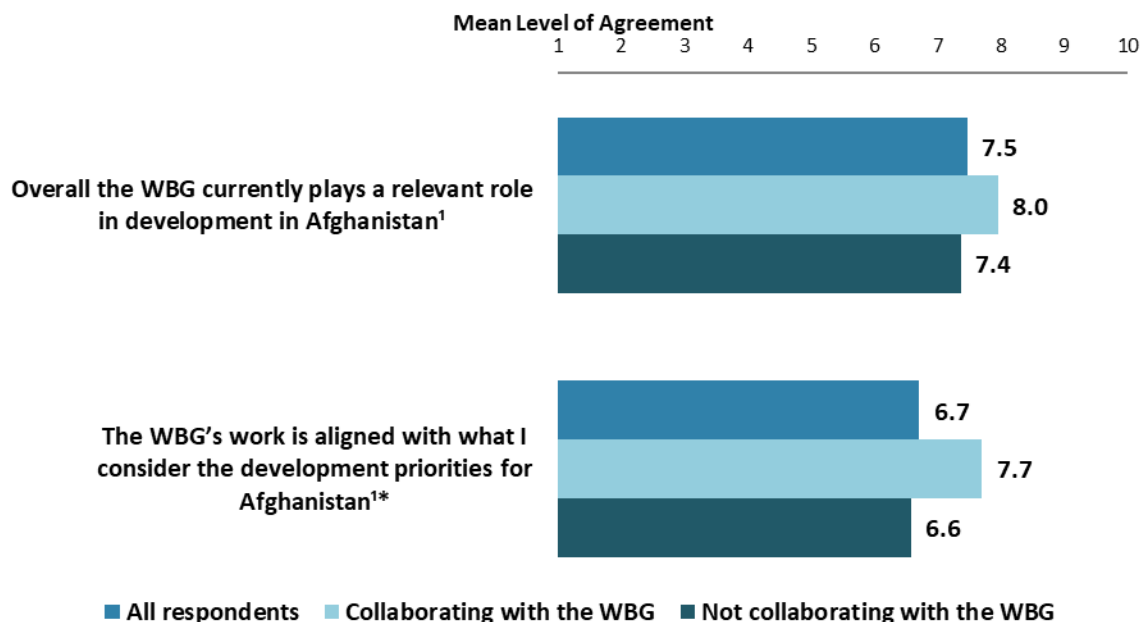
"To what extent do you believe that the World Bank Group's work and support help the poorest in Afghanistan? (Select only ONE response)" (Respondents chose from a list.)

The World Bank Group's Work in Afghanistan

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey had statistically similar levels of agreement that the WBG's work is aligned with their development priorities and that the WBG currently plays a relevant role (weighted means = 6.8 and 7.5, respectively) compared to respondents from the FY '15 Country Survey (weighted means = 6.8 and 7.4, respectively).
- **Stakeholders:** Respondents from the office of a Minister, the office of a Parliamentarian, employees of ministries/ PMUs/Consultants on WBG-supported projects, and other organizations had the highest levels of agreement that the WBG currently plays a relevant role whereas respondents from the office of the President/Chief Executive and the media had significantly lower levels of agreement. Respondents across all stakeholder groups had statistically similar levels of agreement that the WBG's work is aligned with their development priorities.
- **Locations:** Respondents from outside Kabul had significantly higher levels of agreement that the WBG currently plays a relevant role (mean rating = 7.6) compared to respondents from Kabul (mean rating = 6.7). Respondents across both locations had statistically similar levels of agreement that the WBG's work is aligned with their development priorities.



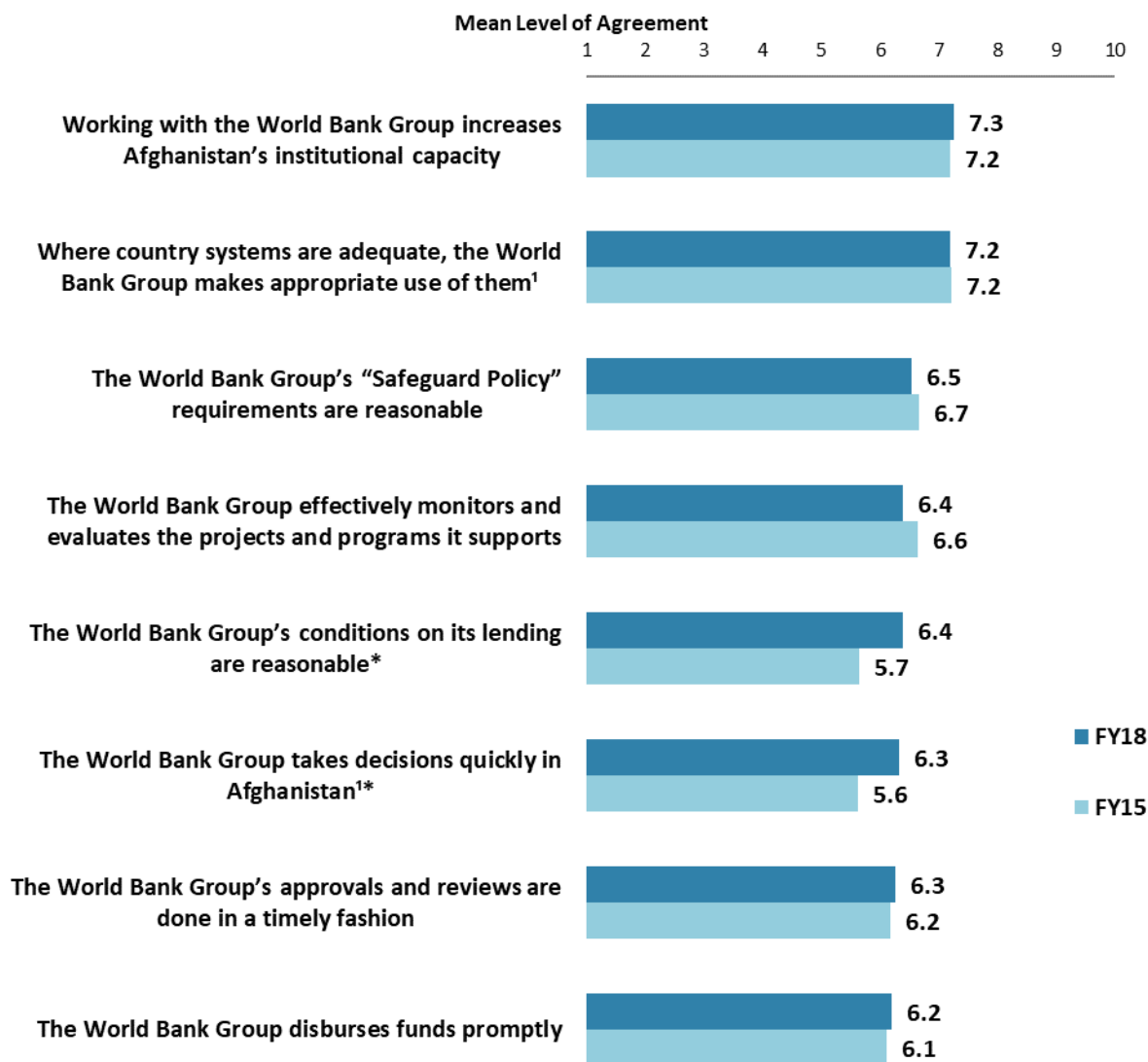
"To what extent do you agree with the following statements about the World Bank Group's work in Afghanistan?" (1-"Strongly disagree", 10-"Strongly agree")

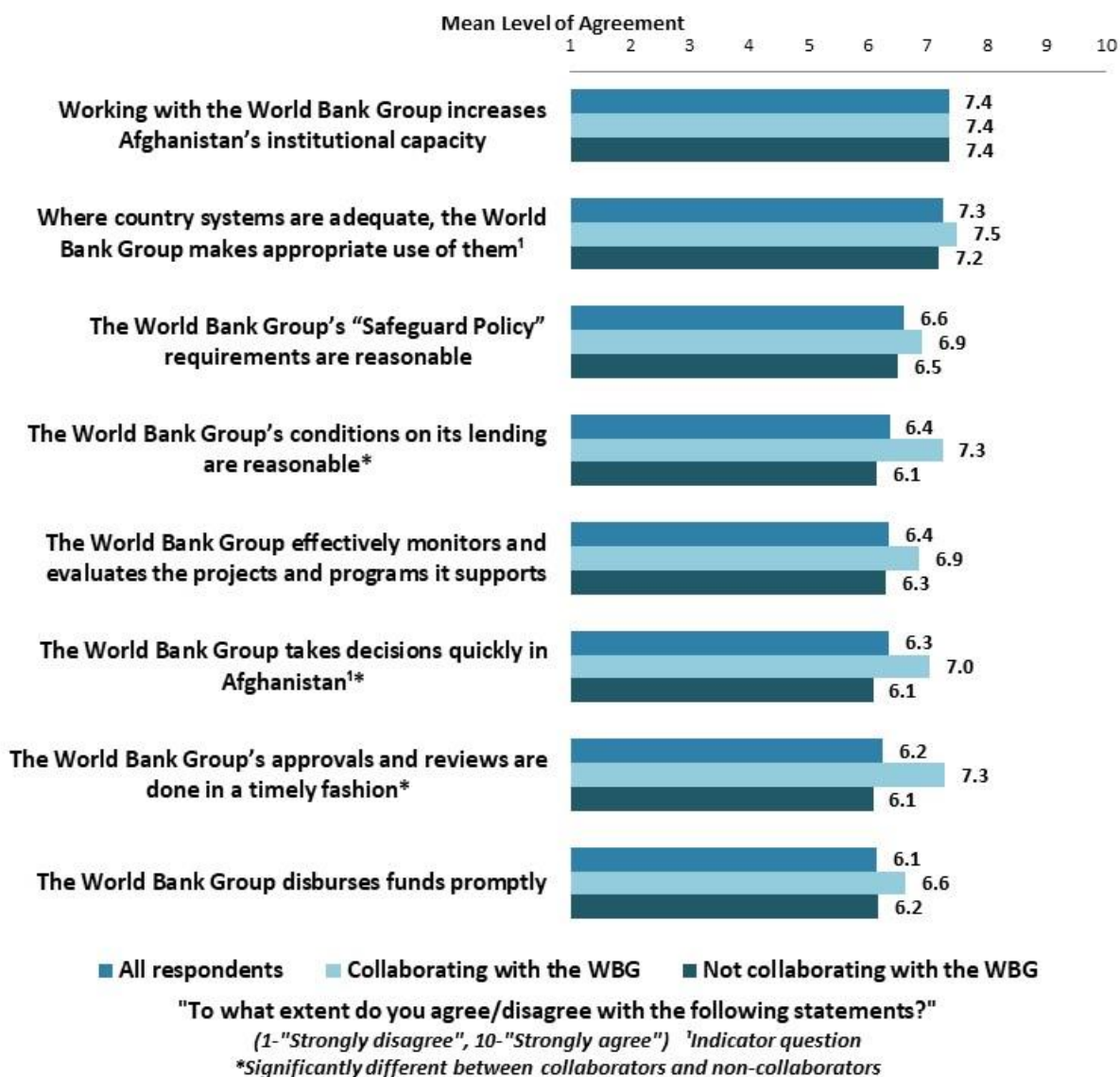
"To what extent do you agree/disagree with the following statements?"

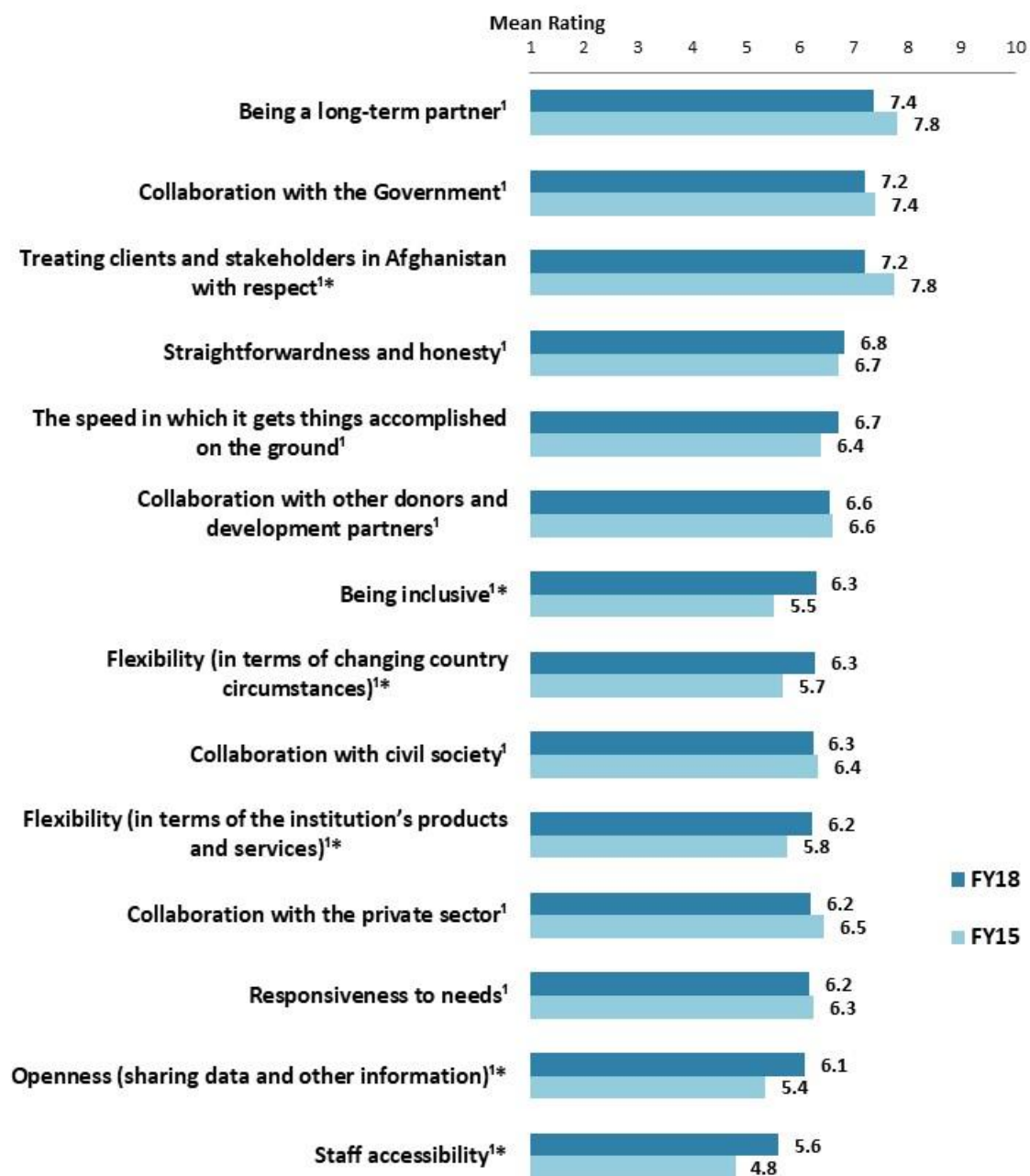

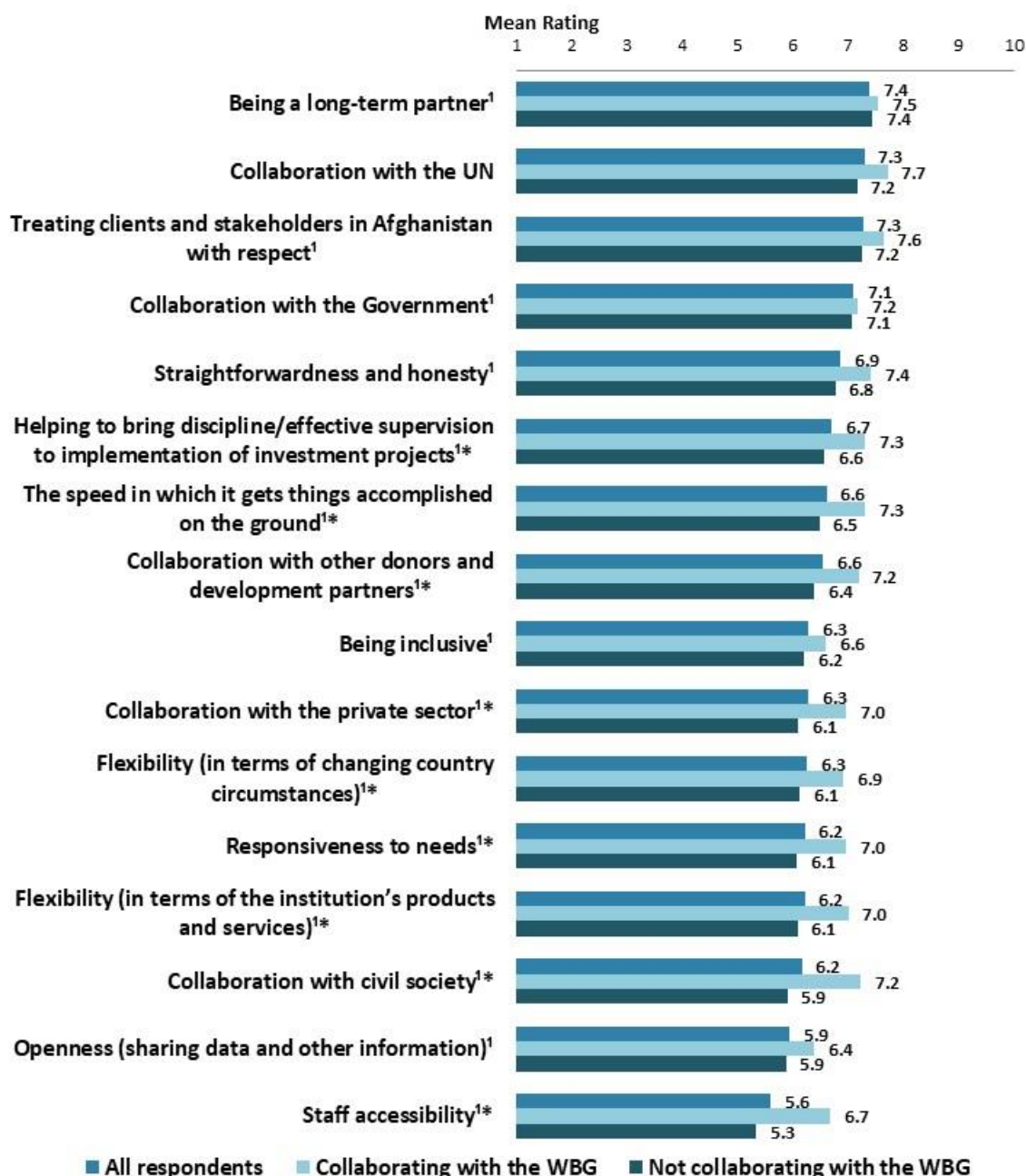

The WBG as an Effective Development Partner: Collaboration

- **Stakeholders:** There were significant differences between stakeholder groups in their ratings of nine aspects. For the most part, respondents from local government gave the highest ratings whereas respondents from the office of President/Chief Executive and private sector/financial sector/private banks tended to give significantly lower ratings. For a complete breakdown of all responding by stakeholder groups please see Appendix B (page 77).
- **Locations:** Respondents from outside Kabul gave significantly higher ratings for the WBG's flexibility in terms of changing country circumstances and collaboration with the UN (mean ratings = 6.4 and 7.4, respectively) compared to respondents from Kabul (mean ratings = 5.8 and 6.7, respectively). 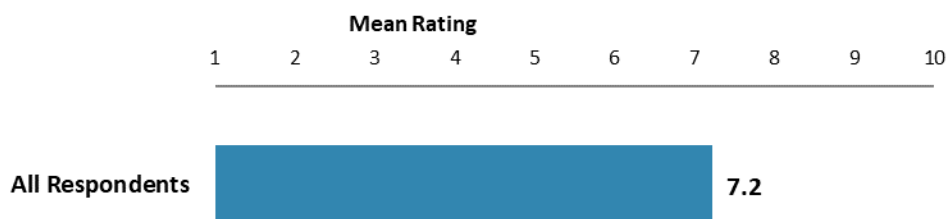

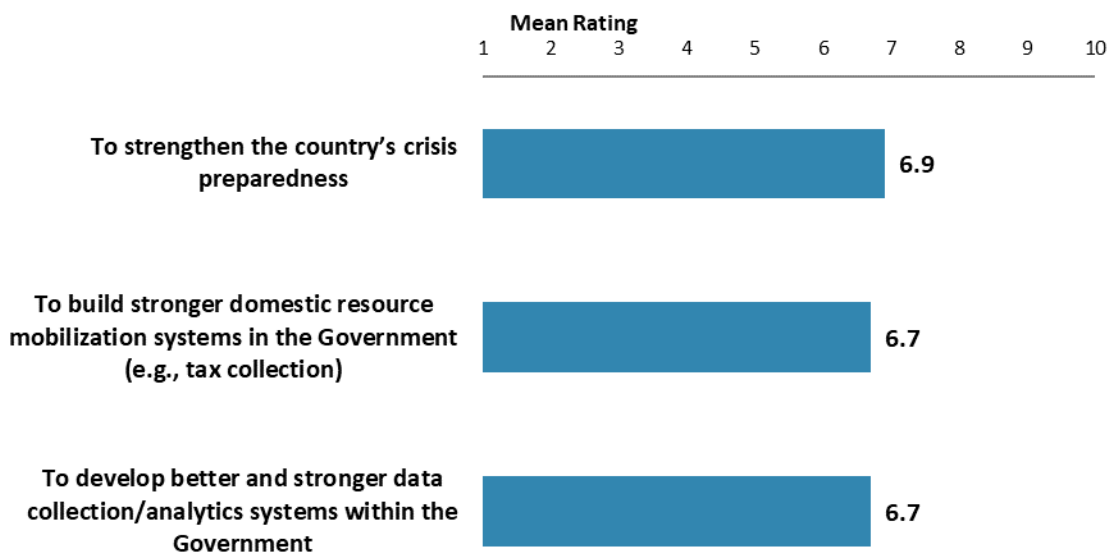

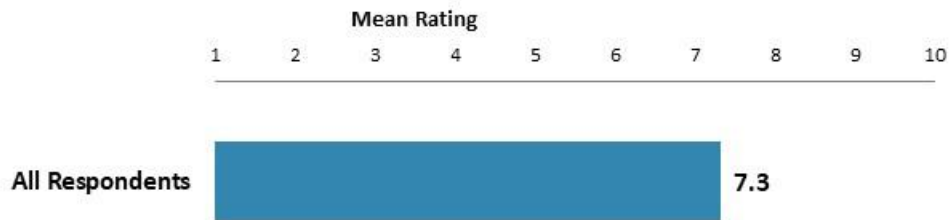


"How effectively does the World Bank Group support Afghanistan's efforts to ...?"

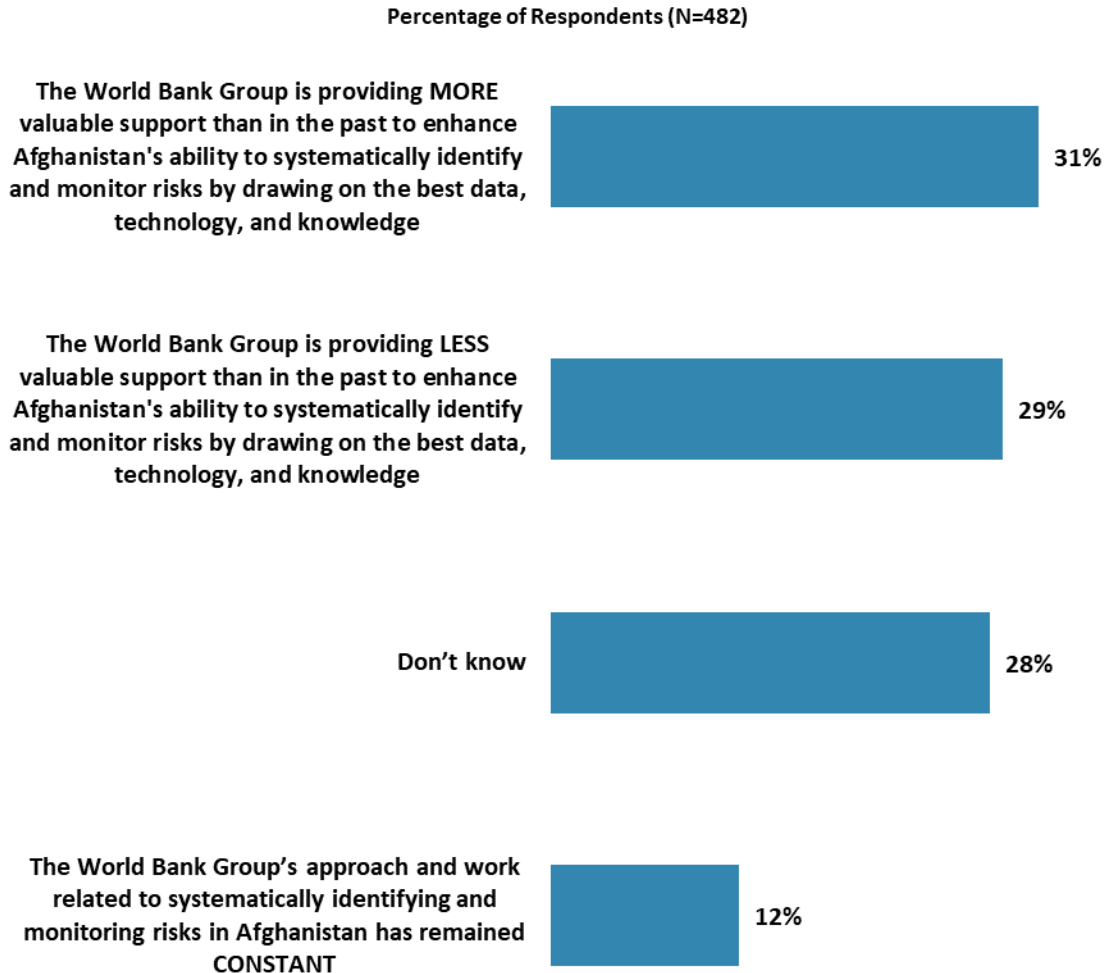

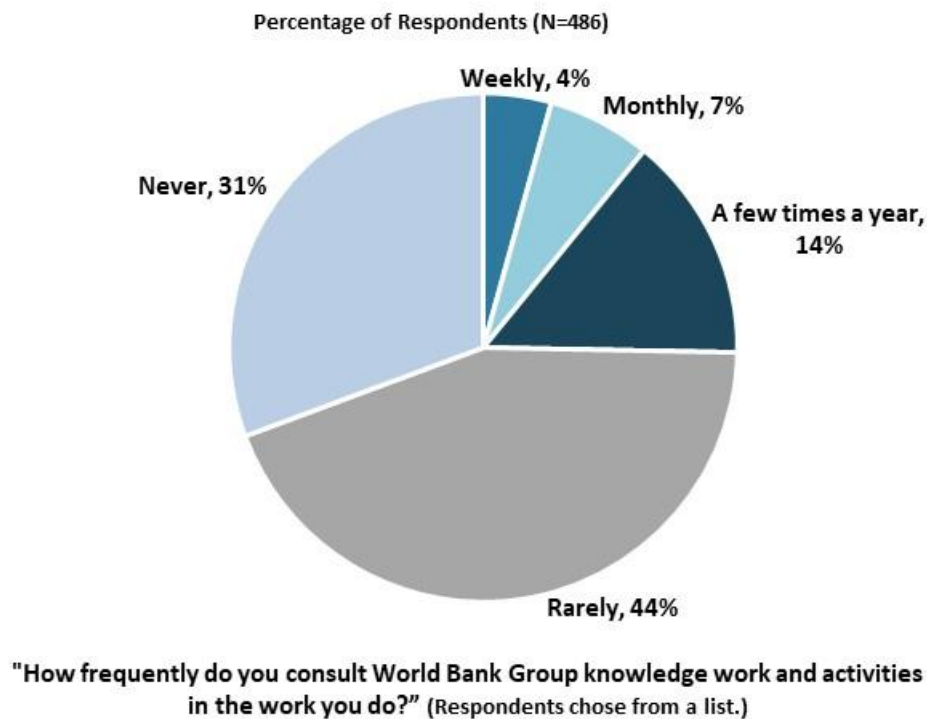
"When considering the World Bank Group's emphasis on risk preparedness and prevention, which of the following statements best describes recent WBG's activities? (Select only one response)"

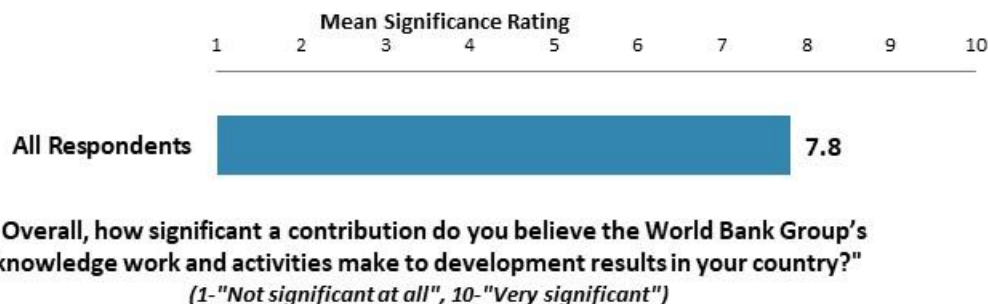
Meeting Afghanistan's Knowledge Needs (*Indicator Question*)

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey had statistically similar levels of agreement that the WBG's knowledge services meets Afghanistan's needs (weighted mean rating = 6.9) compared to respondents from the FY '15 Country Survey (weighted mean rating = 7.0).
- **Locations:** Respondents from outside Kabul had significantly higher levels of agreement that the WBG's knowledge services meets their needs (mean rating = 6.9) compared to respondents from Kabul (mean rating = 5.8).
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who collaborate with the WBG had significantly higher levels of agreement that the WBG's knowledge services meets their needs (mean rating = 8.0) compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 6.5).



Contribution of the WBG's Knowledge Work and Activities (*Indicator Question*)

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey gave statistically similar ratings for the contribution of the WBG's knowledge work and activities (weighted mean rating = 7.8) compared to respondents from the FY '15 Country Survey (weighted mean rating = 7.9).
- **Stakeholders:** Respondents from the office of a Minister, office of a Parliamentarian, and employee of a ministry/PMU/Consultant on WBG-supported projects gave the highest ratings for the contribution of the WBG's knowledge work and activities whereas respondents from academia gave significantly lower ratings.
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who collaborate with the WBG gave significantly higher ratings for the contribution of the WBG's knowledge work and activities (mean rating = 8.5) compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 7.7).

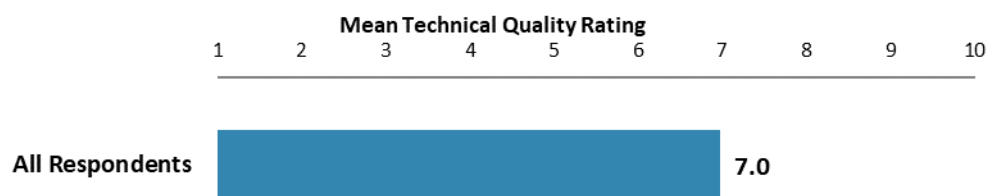

- **Collaboration:** Respondents who collaborate with the WBG gave significantly higher ratings for the technical quality of the WBG's knowledge work and activities (mean rating = 8.2) compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 6.7).

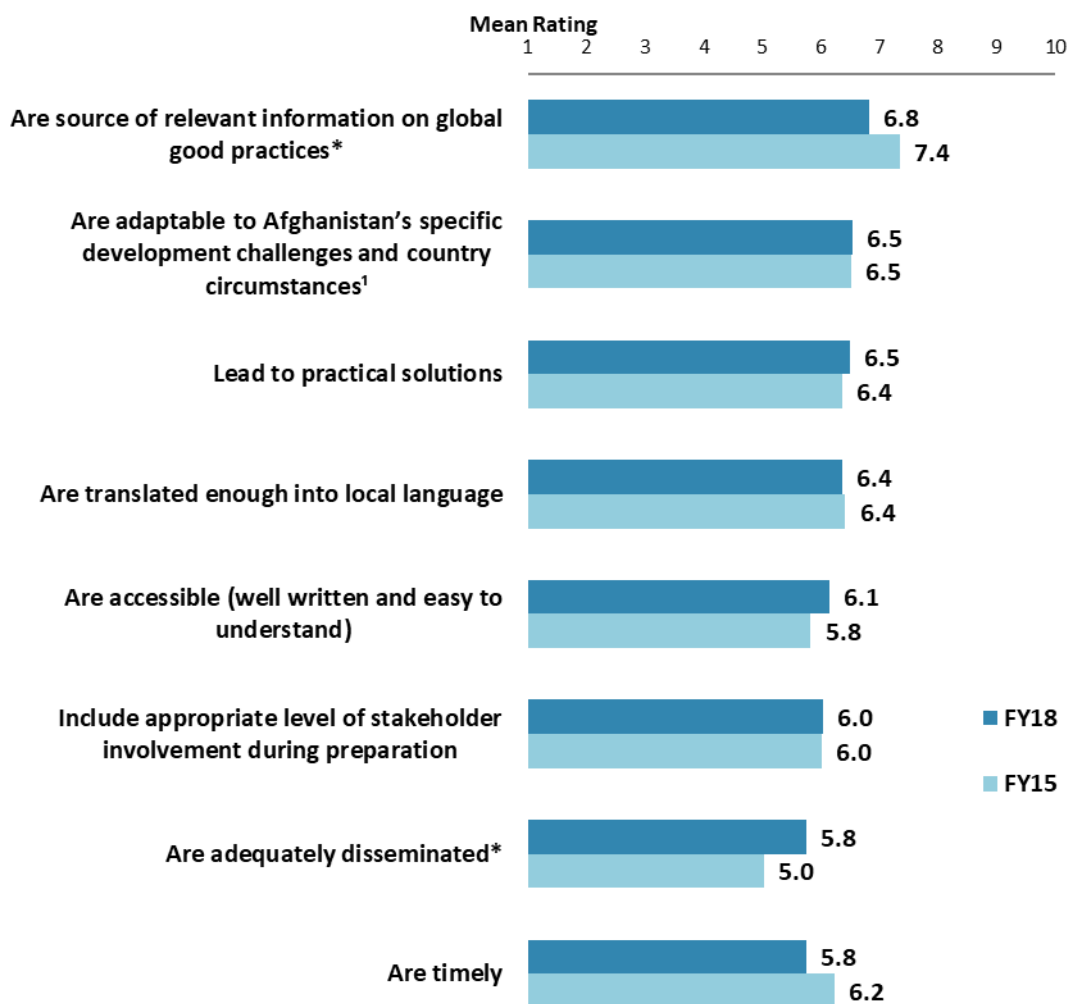


"Overall, how would you rate the technical quality of the World Bank Group's knowledge work and activities?" (1-"Very low technical quality", 10-"Very high technical quality")

Qualities of the WBG's Knowledge Work and Activities: Year Comparison

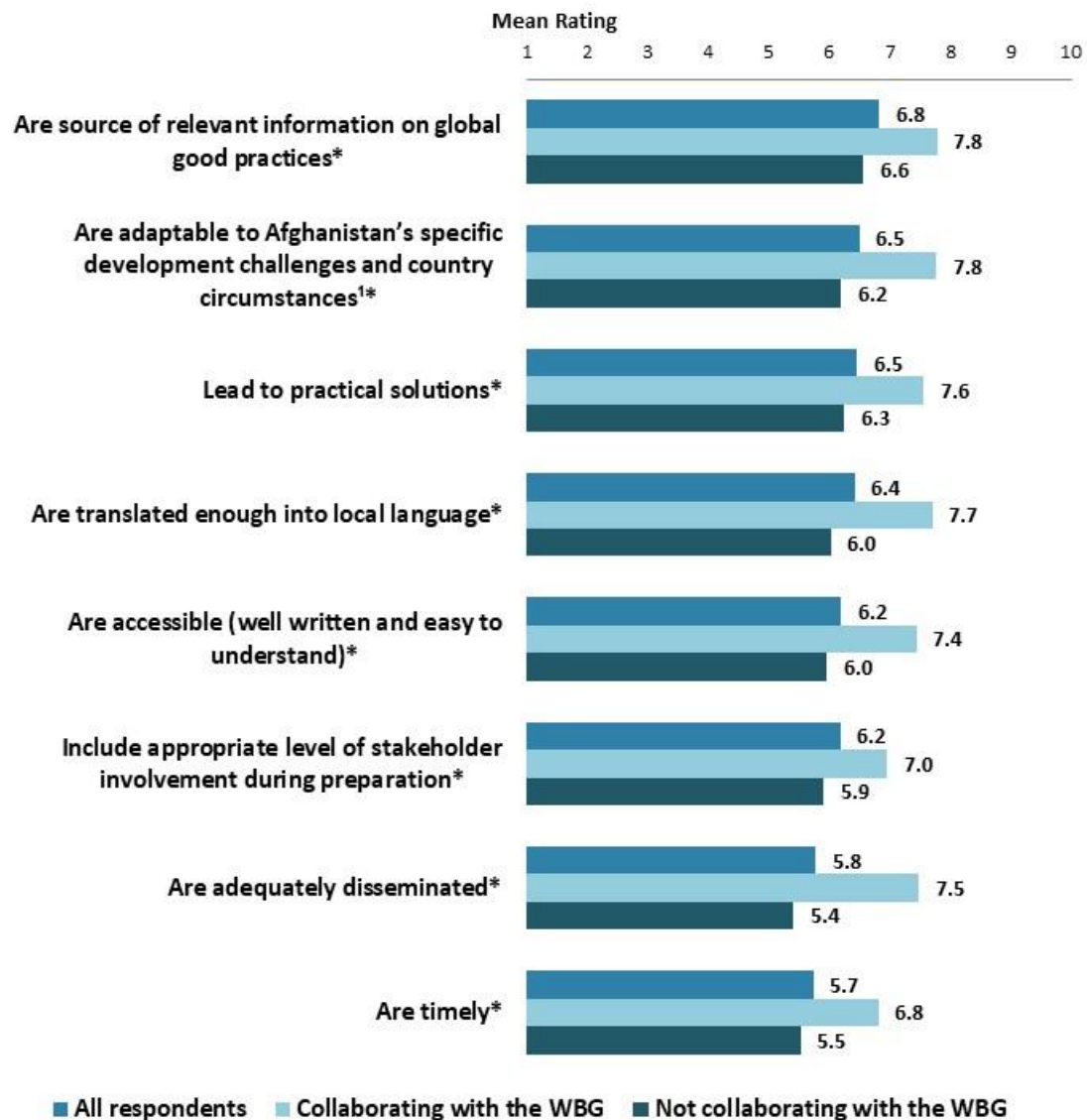

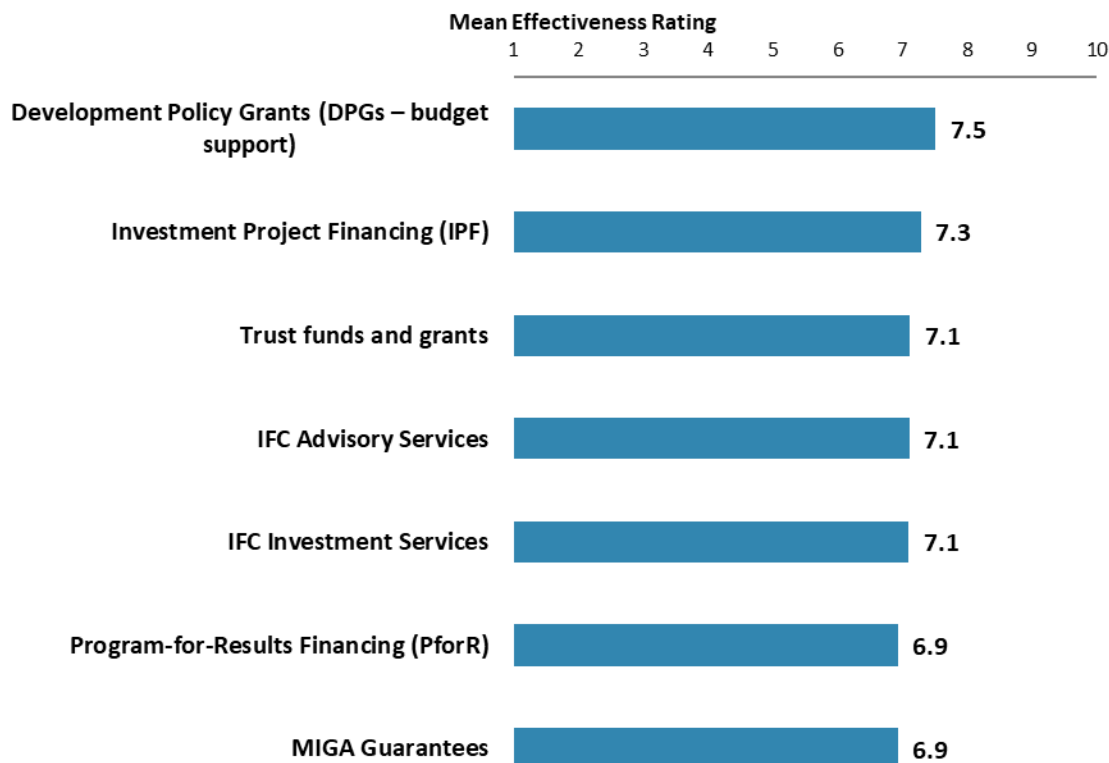
Meeting Afghanistan's Needs for Financial Instruments (*Indicator Question*)

Effectiveness of WBG's Instruments

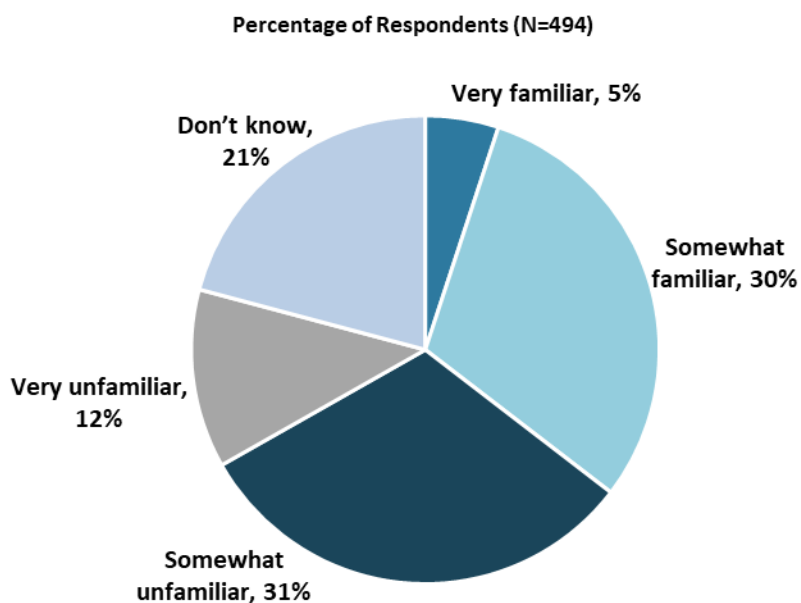

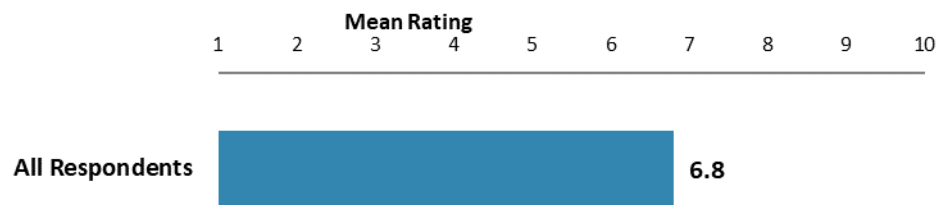

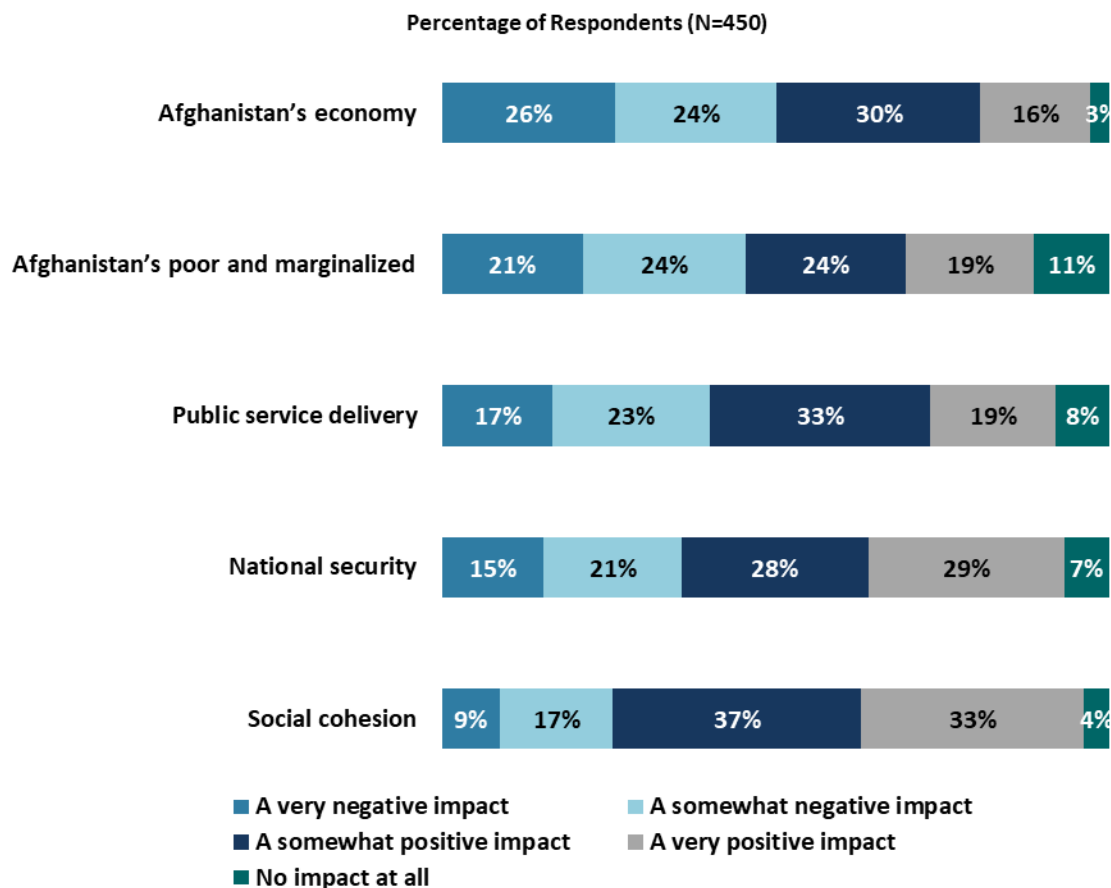

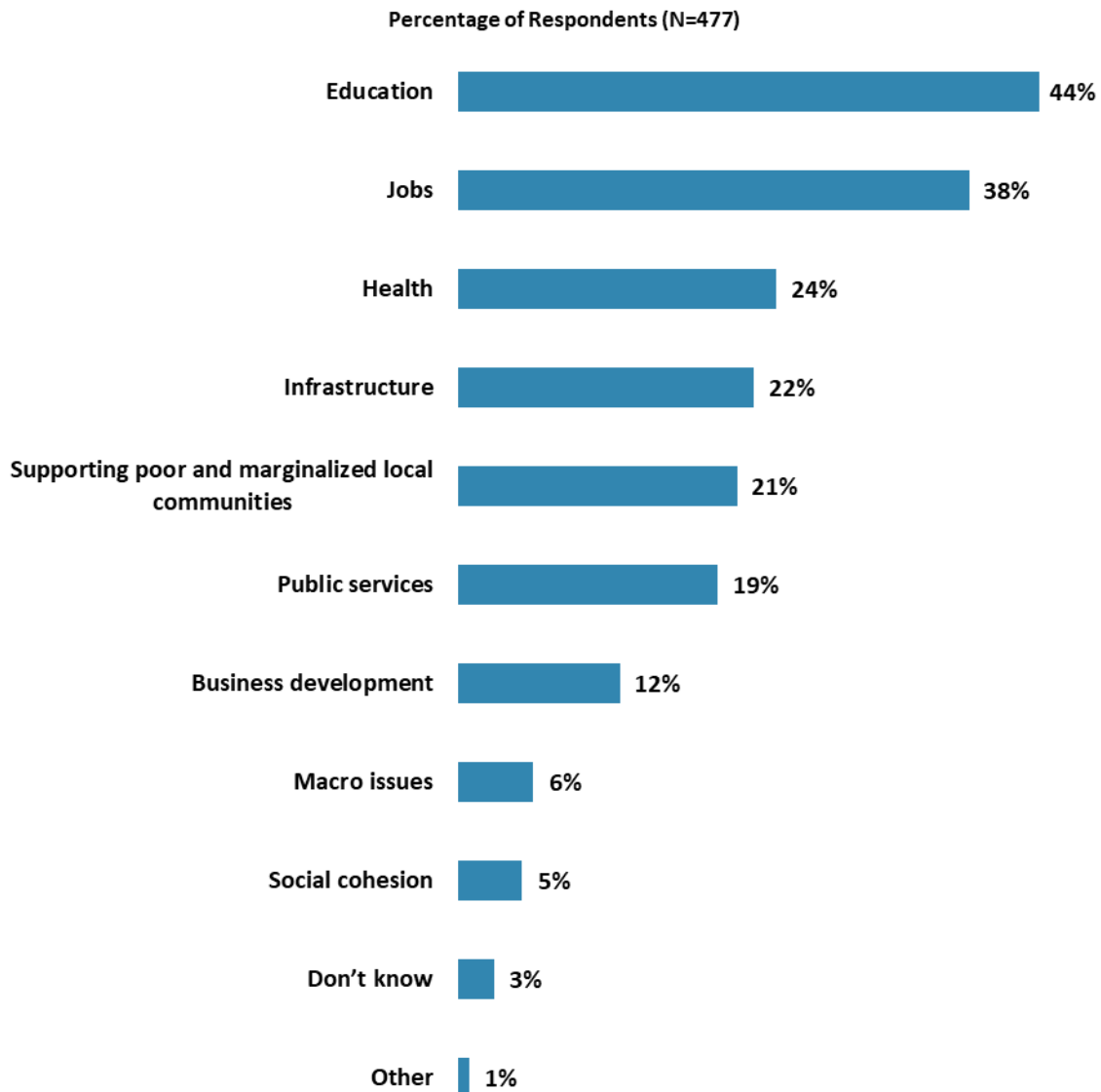

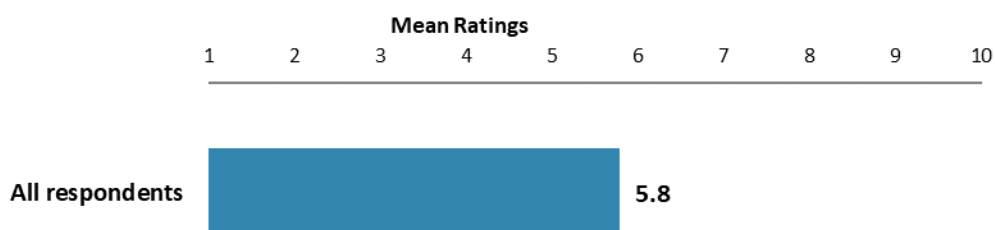

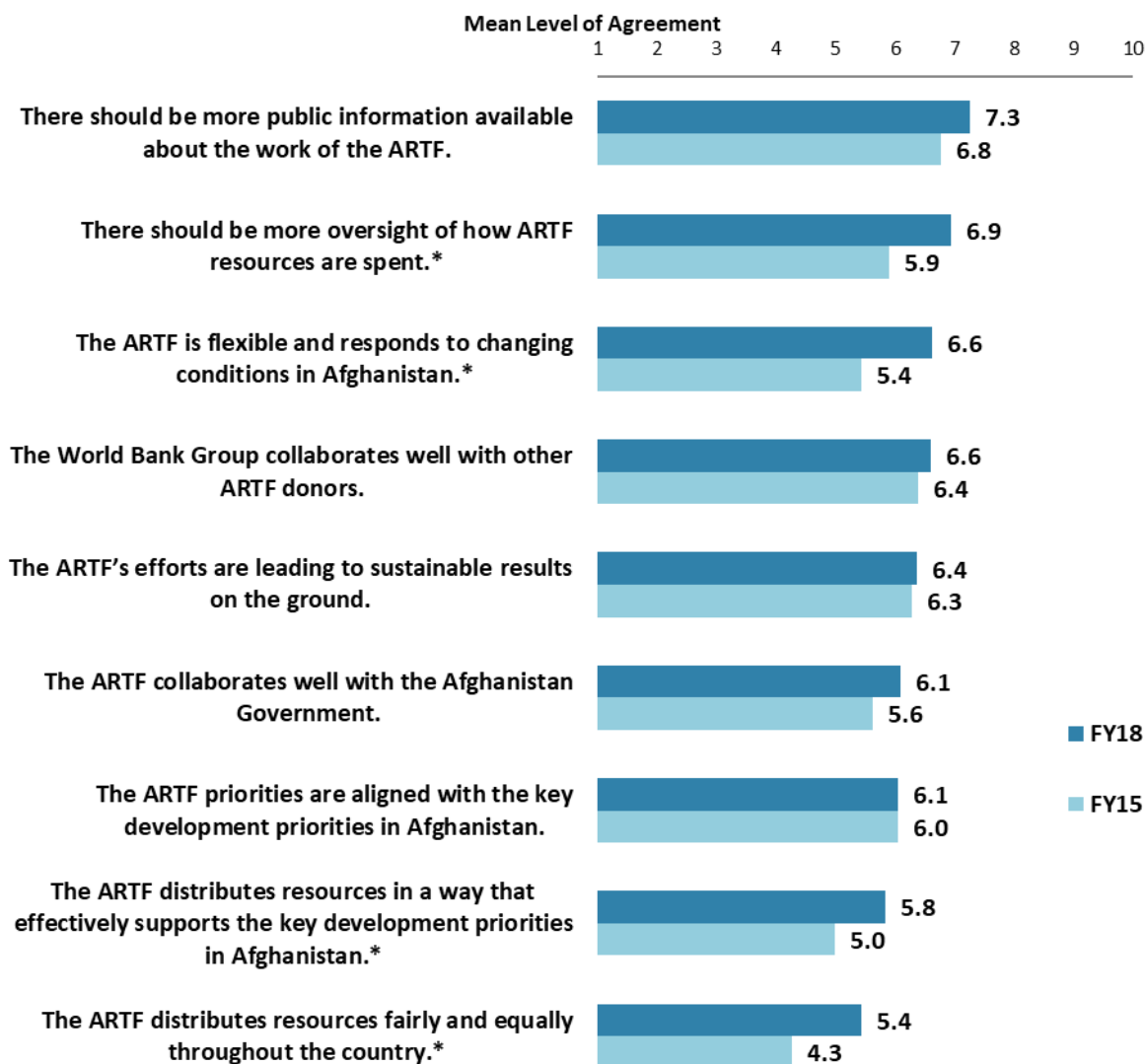


"How familiar are you with the work of the ARTF in Afghanistan?"

Qualities of ARTF's Work: Year Comparison



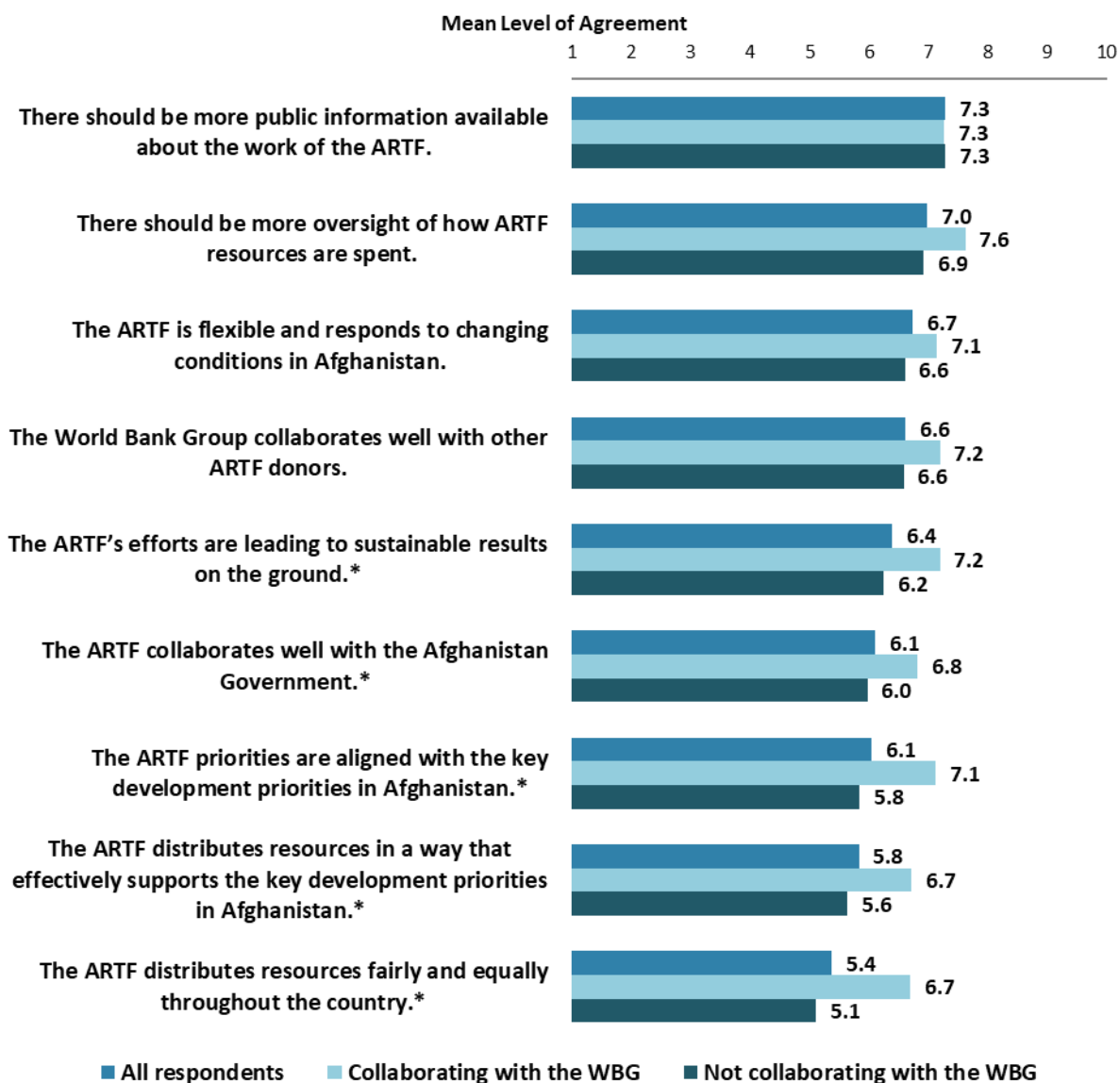

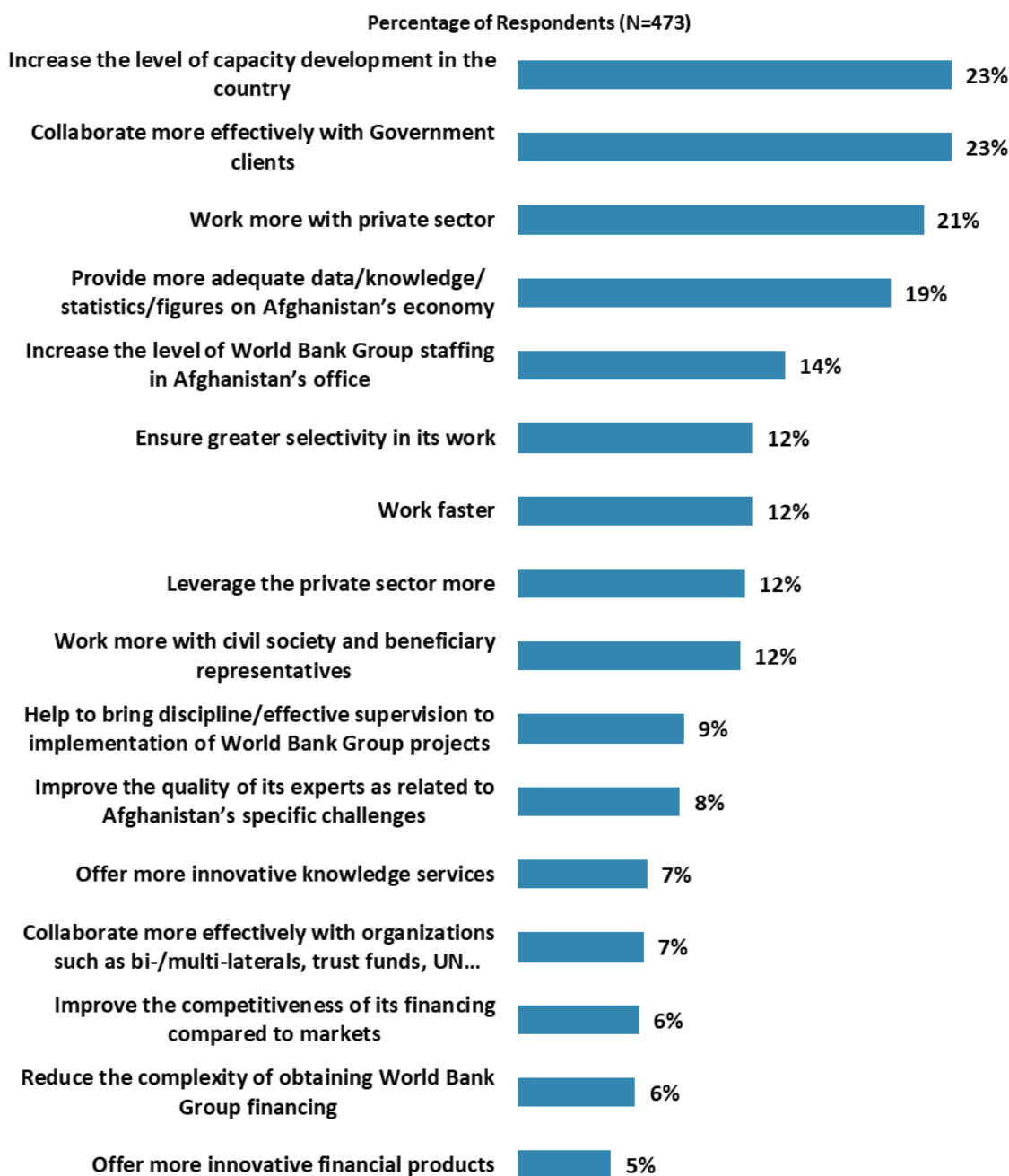

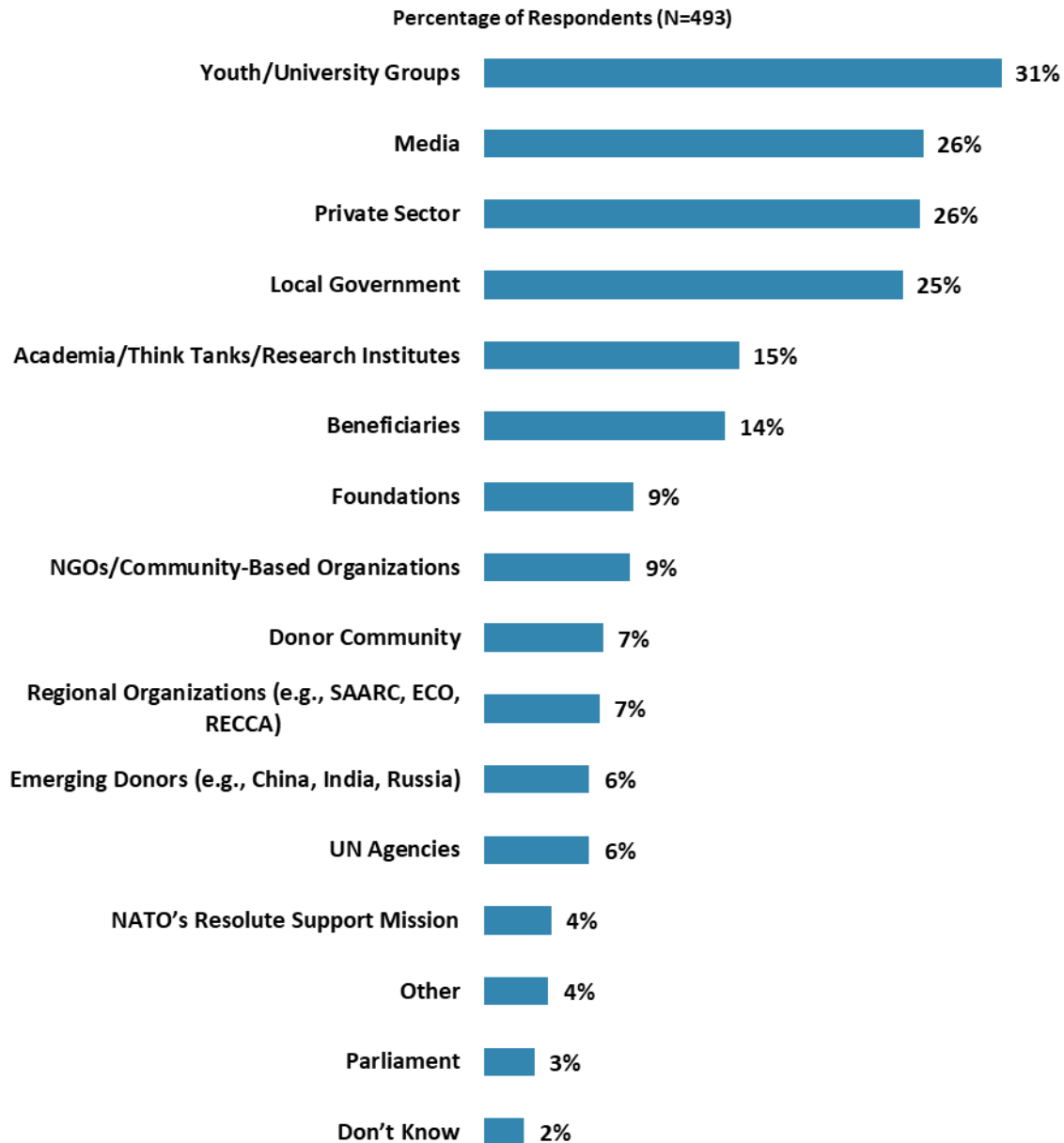

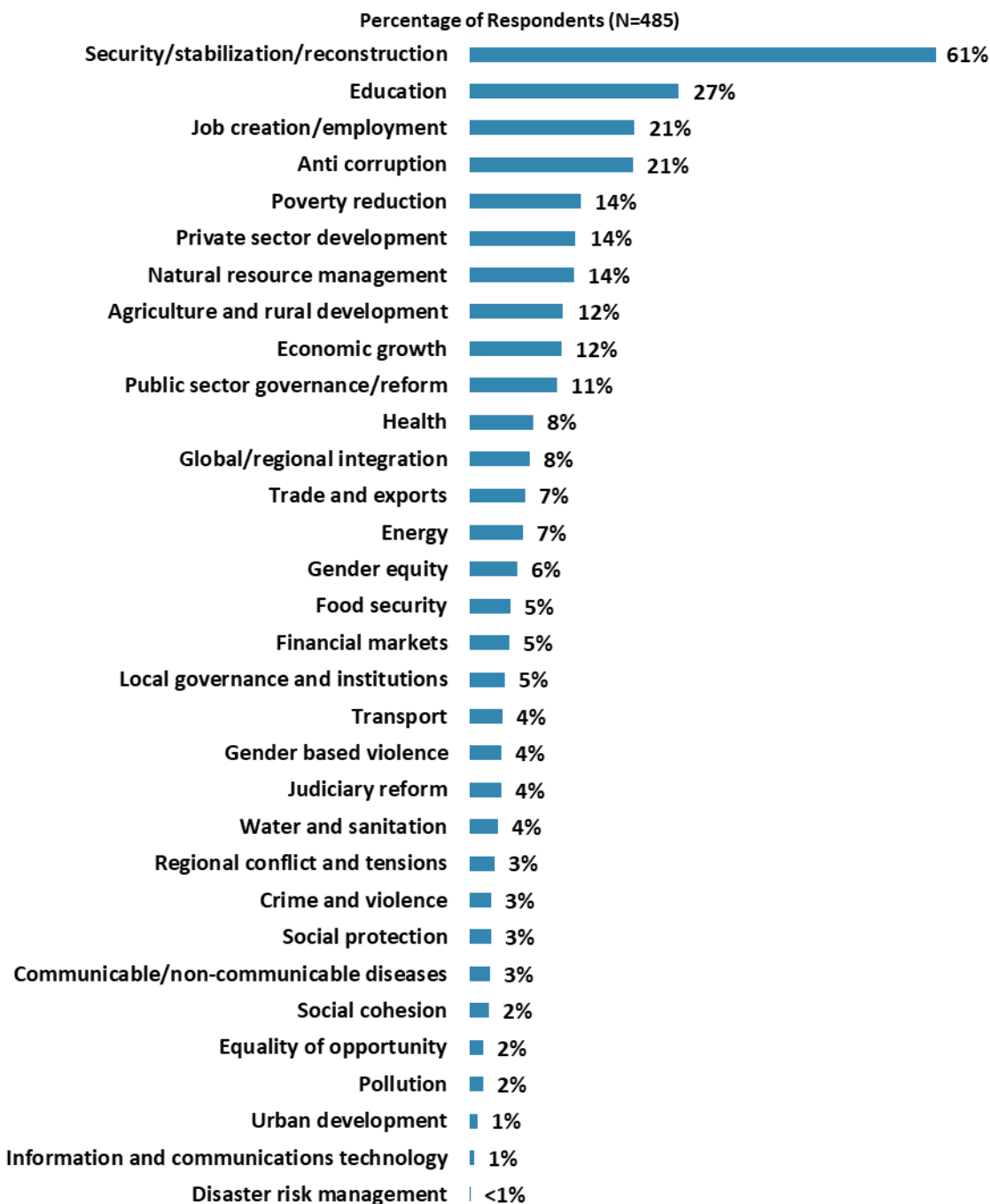

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY '15 Survey indicated that the WBG should focus its resources on security/stabilization/reconstruction (63%), followed by agricultural development (27%), economic growth (26%), education (23%), and energy (21%).
- Education respondents were significantly *more* likely to indicate education and health (36% and 15%, respectively) and *less* likely to indicate security/stabilization/reconstruction and private sector development (44% and 1%, respectively) as areas for the WBG's focus compared to respondents in other areas of work (23%, 6%, 65%, and 19%, respectively).

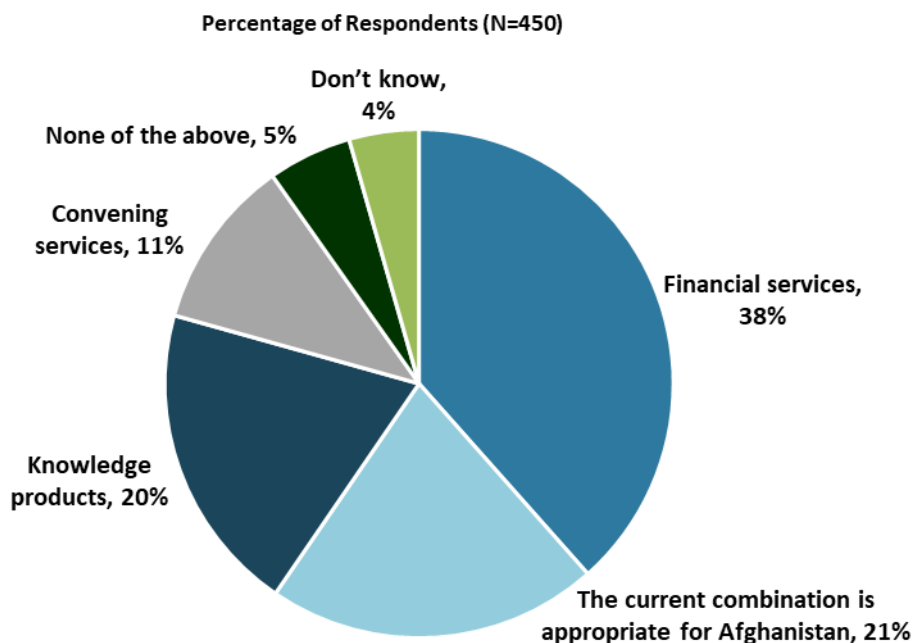

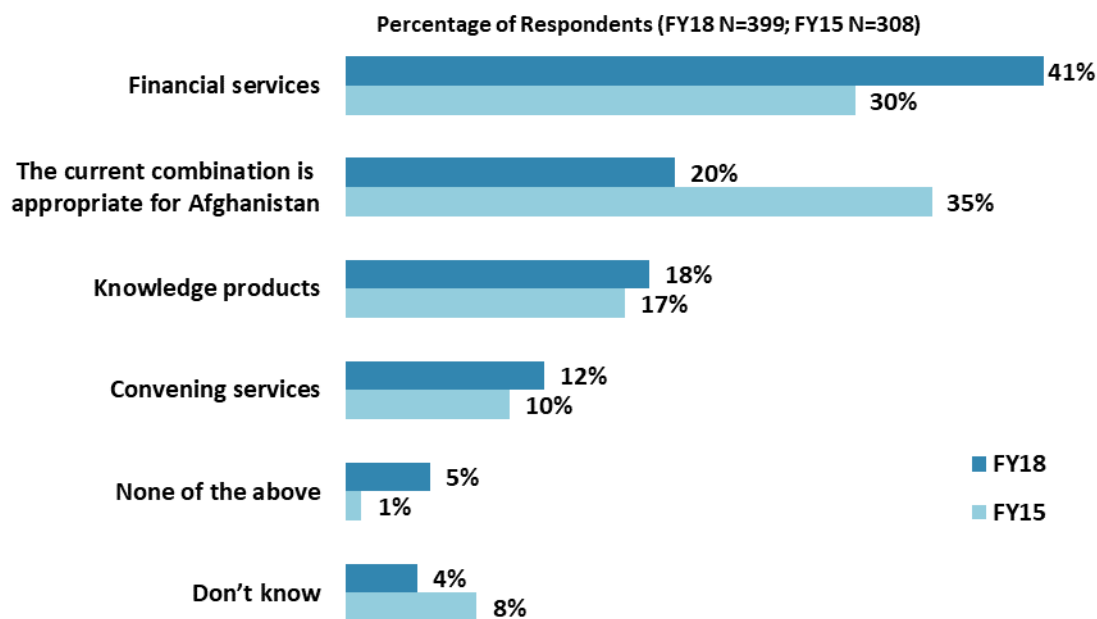

Future Combination of WBG Services: Year Comparison



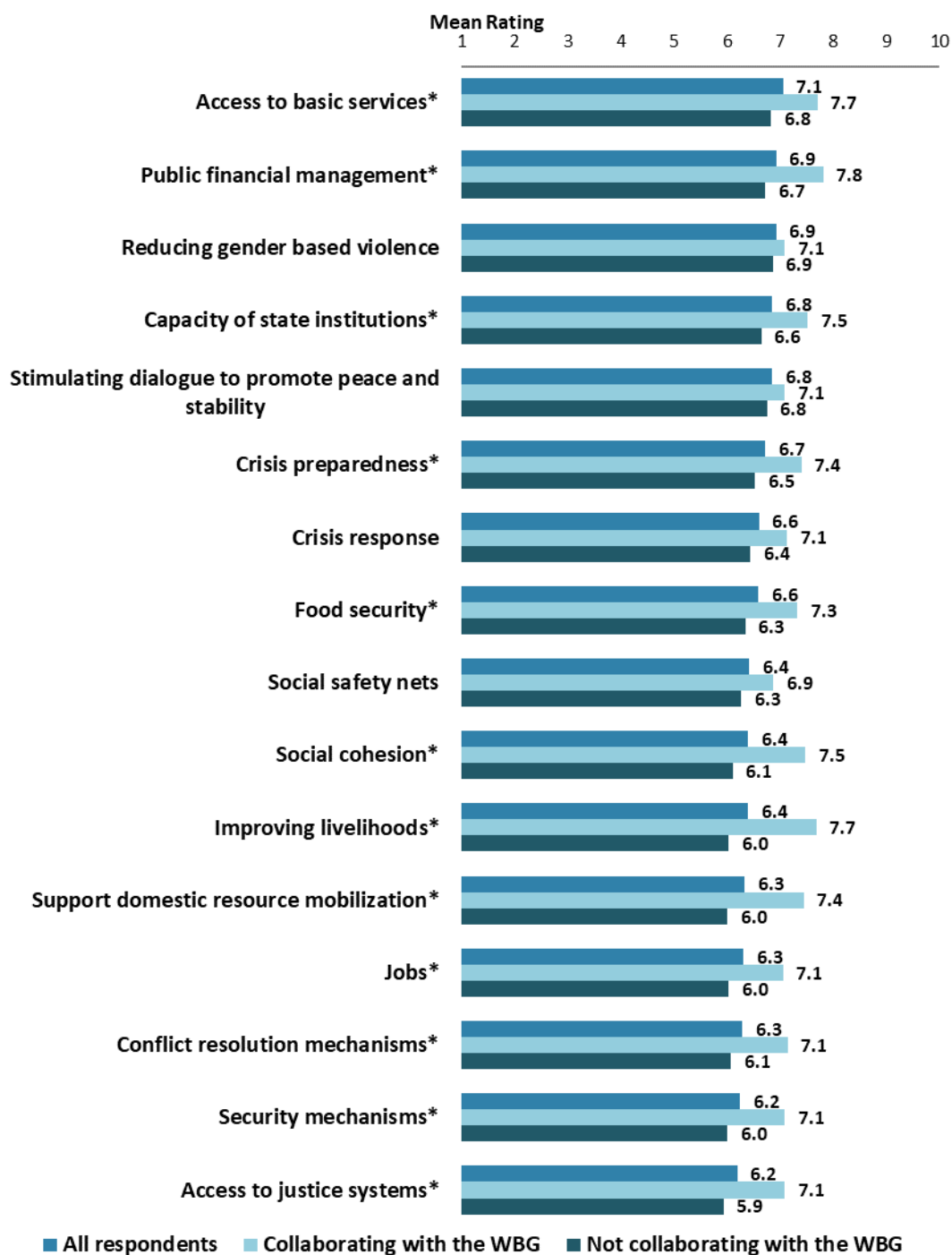

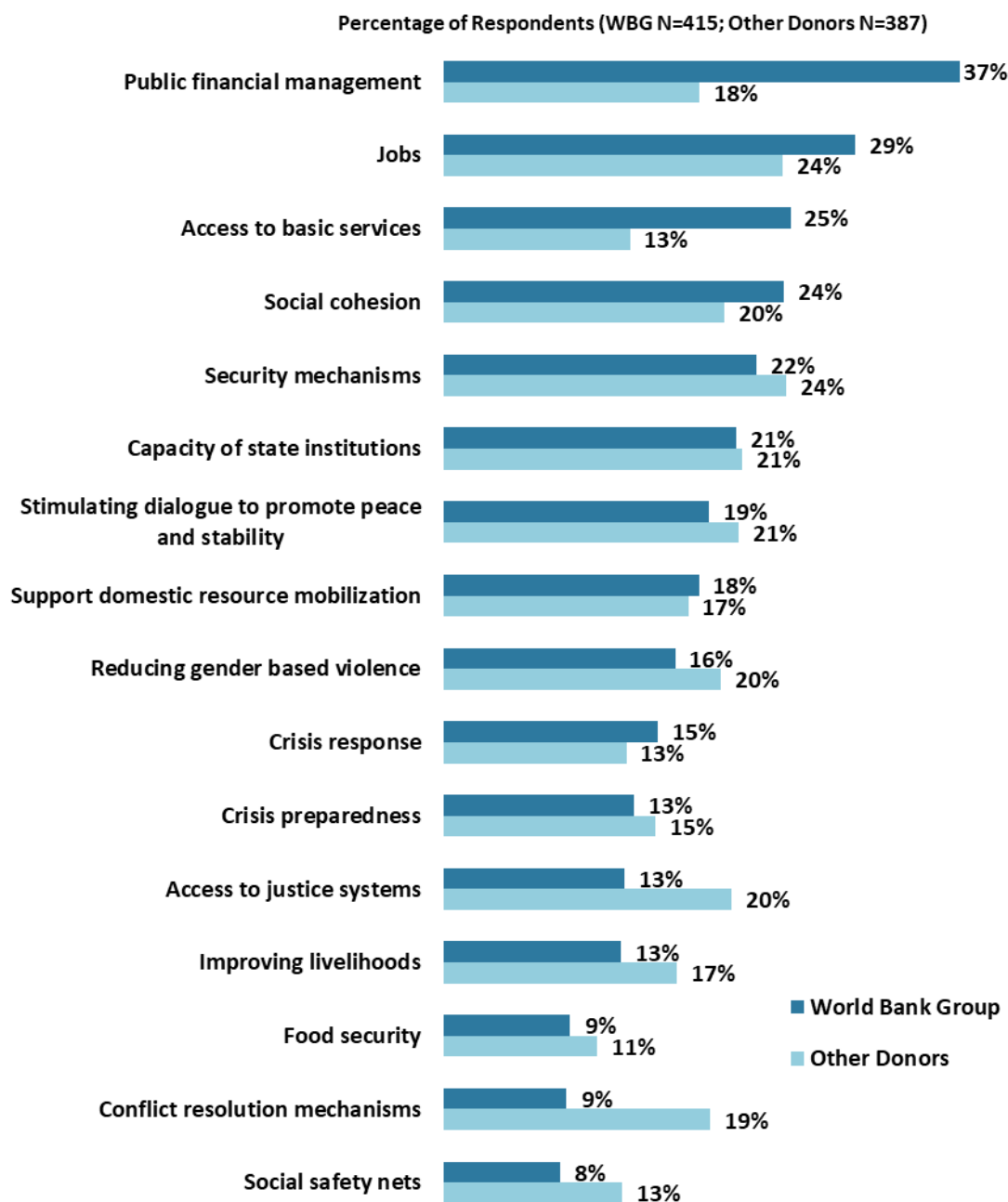
"To what degree does the World Bank Group support with its resources (financial, technical, knowledge and convening power)?" (1-"To no degree at all", 10-"To a very significant degree")

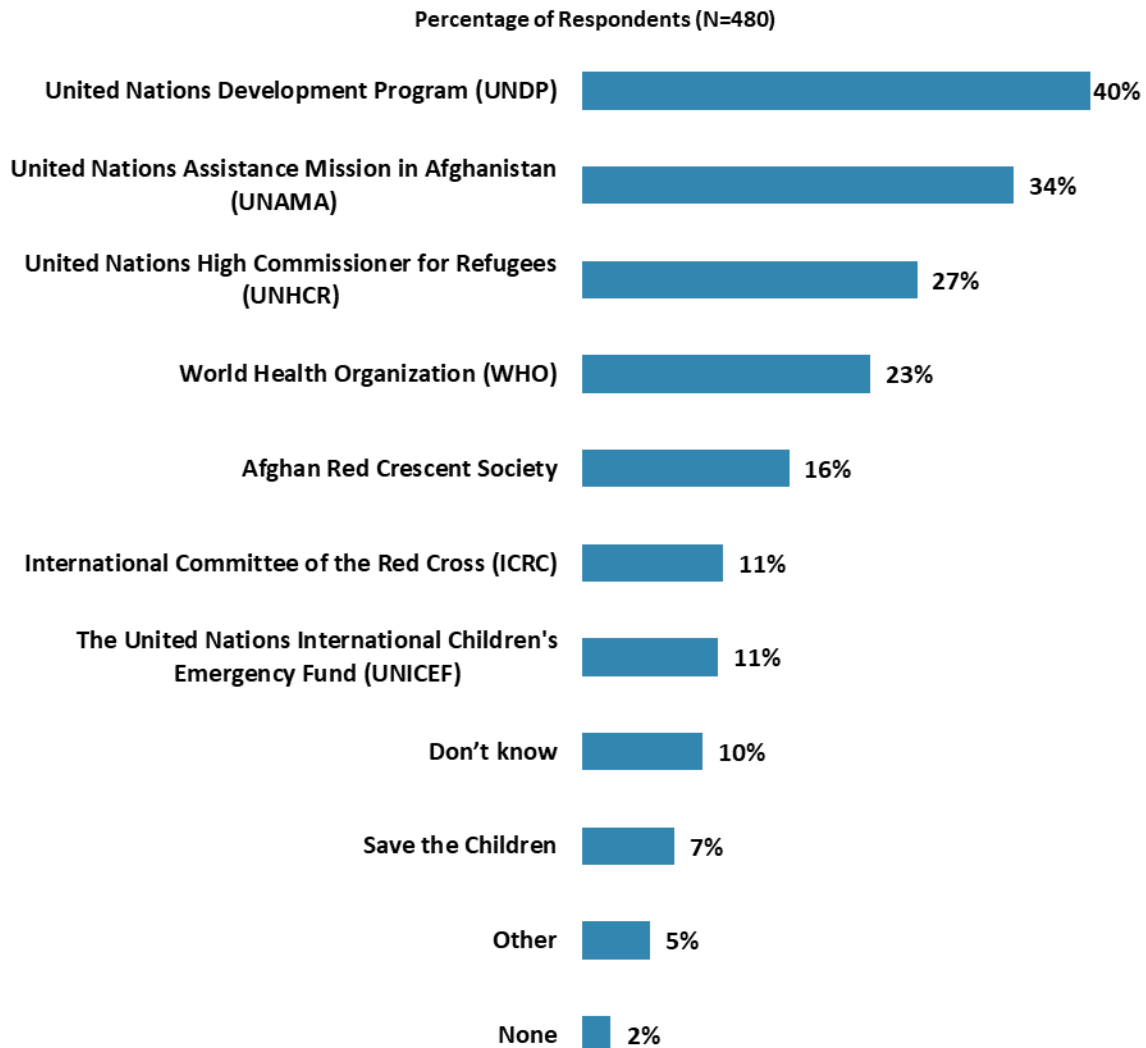

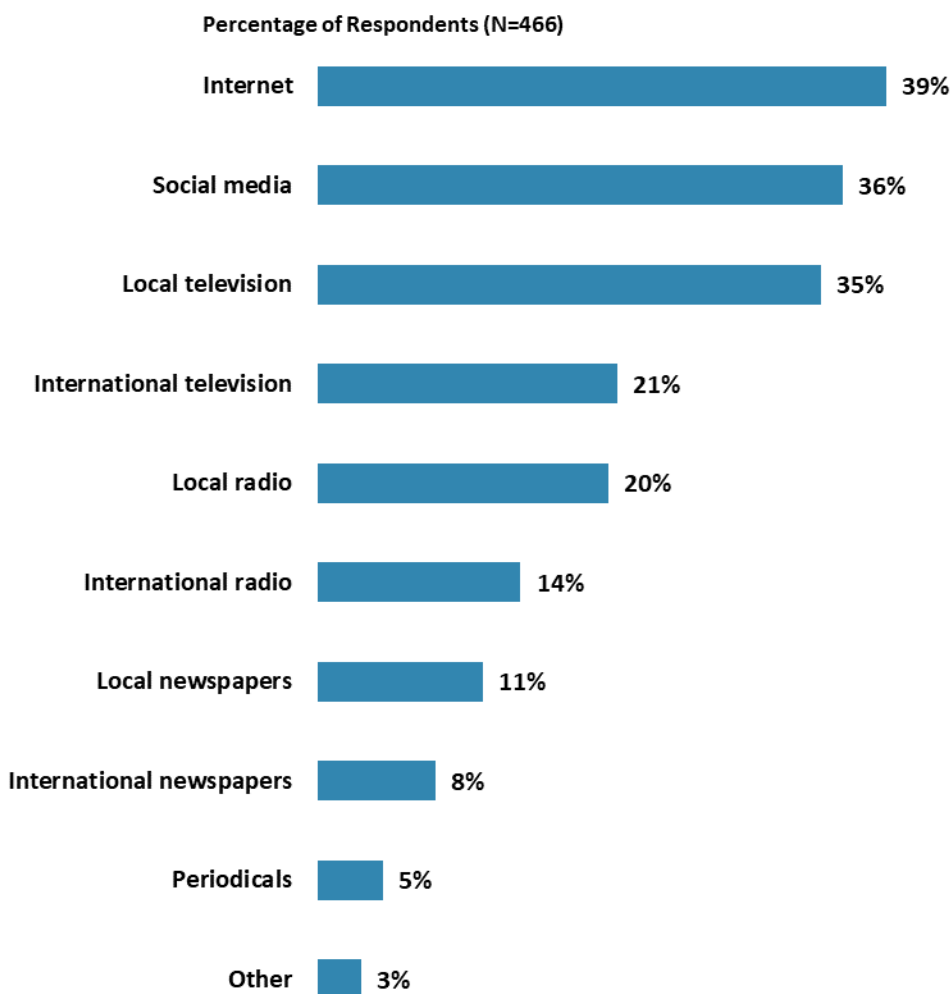

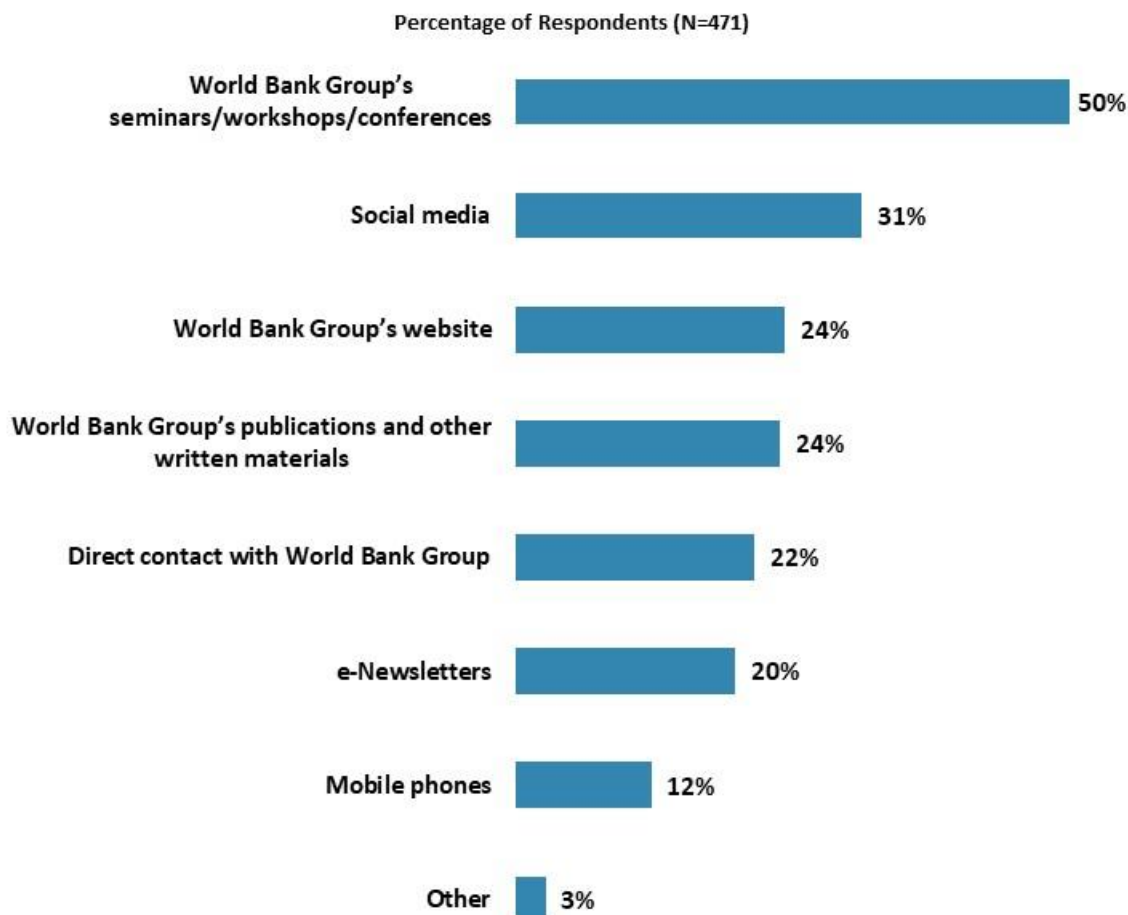
"How do you get most of your information about economic and social development issues in Afghanistan? (Choose no more than TWO)" (Respondents chose from a list. Responses combined.)

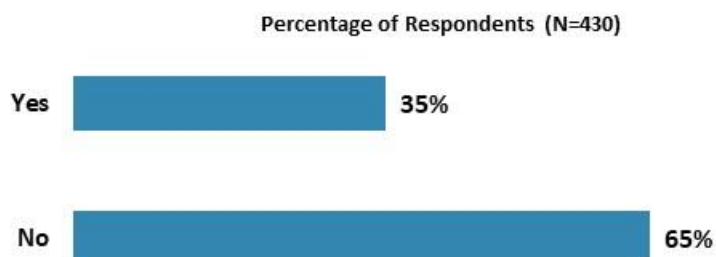
"How would you prefer to receive information from the World Bank Group?

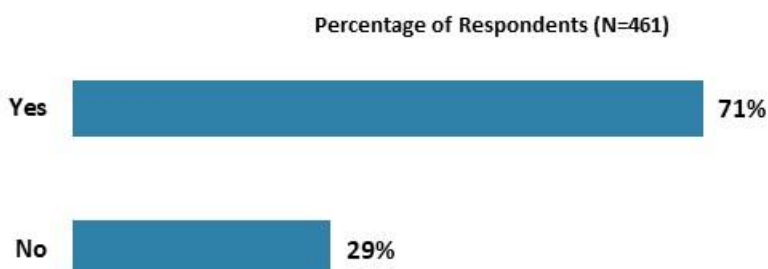

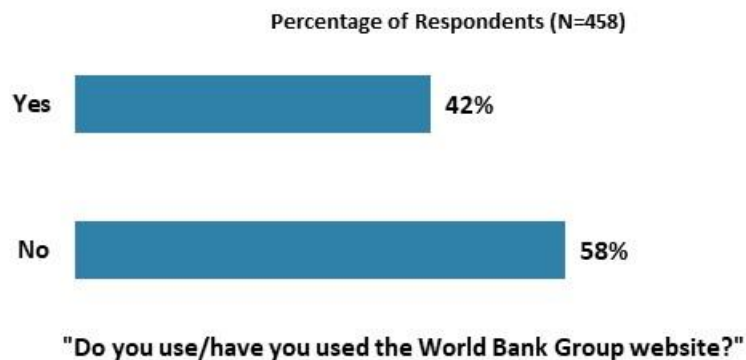
"Do you have reliable access to the Internet?"

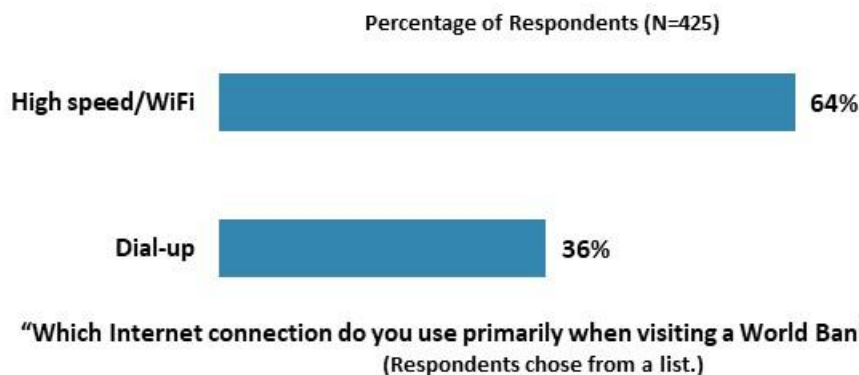

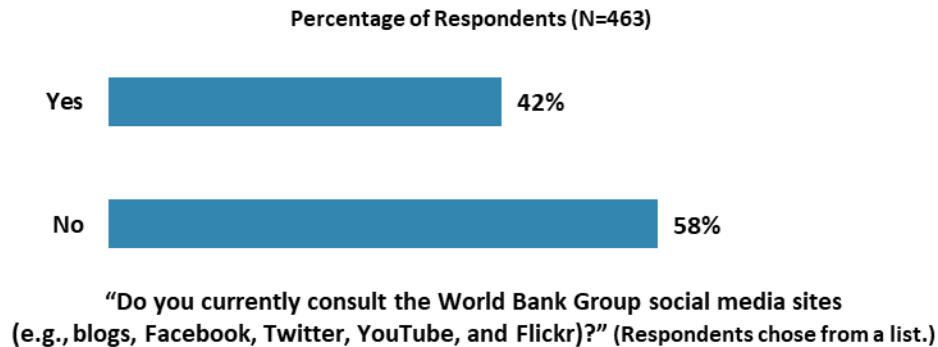




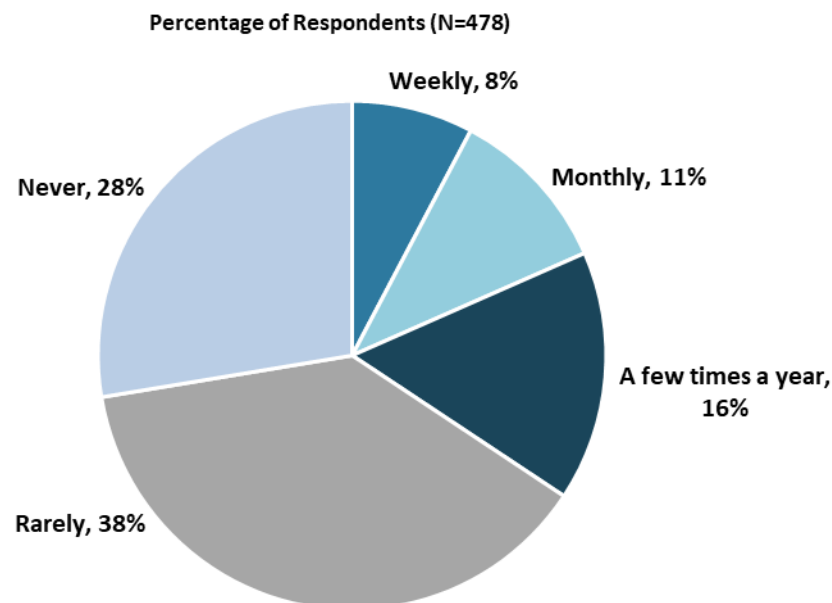

Frequency of Consulting WBG Website/Social Media Channels

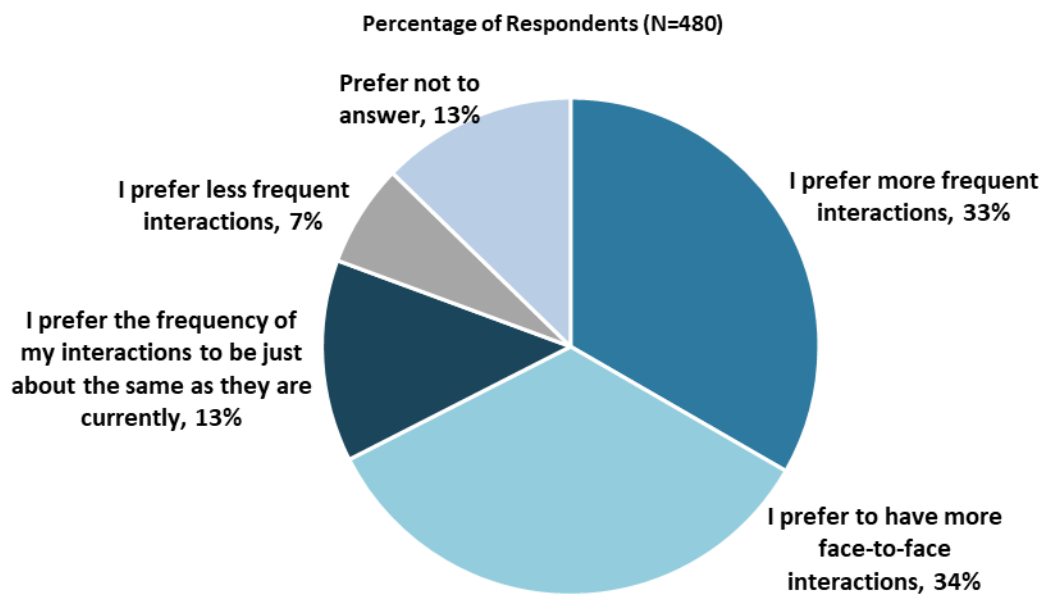


"How frequently do you consult the World Bank Group's website and/or social media channels for information/knowledge that you can use in your work?" (Respondents chose from a list.)

Frequency of Preferred WBG Interaction



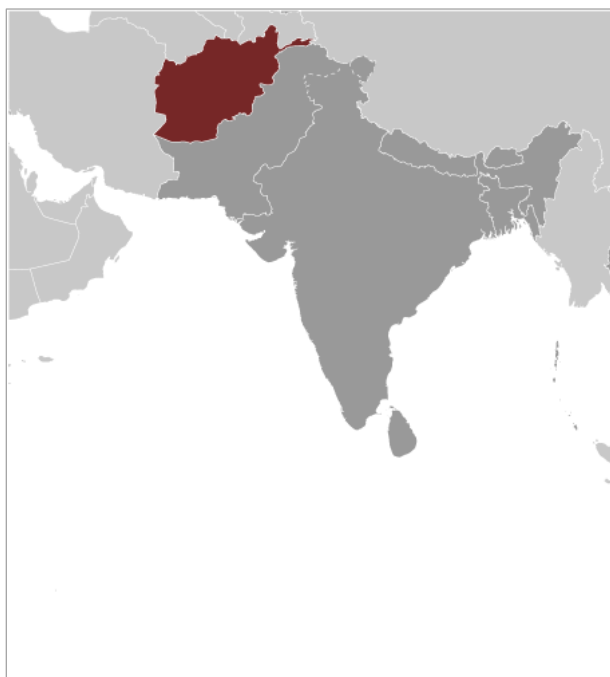
"How much face-to-face access would you like to have with the World Bank Group in Afghanistan?"
