Clarification to filling the form

To prepare the report, data on the proceeds of the canteen and eatery, number of person-days of catering in the kolkhoz canteen and child-care institutions are used.

Depending on the entity reported, line 4 or line 5 will be filled.

In the line 4 proceeds only for canteen and eatery catering will be shown.

This line will not include money received from the sale of products for table food, waste, etc., as well as from sale of cigarettes, matches, soap, etc.

When a report is prepared for a child-care institution or a milk shop, the line 5 is filled. To obtain data on catering person-days the number of persons eligible for baby-food is calculated on a daily basis in child-care institutions.

Calculated totals shall be summed for a month.

When public catering accounting in a kolkhoz is cost-based, then line 4 is filled, at that, proceeds from canteen catering is recorded kolkhoz-wide.

When accounting in the kolkhoz canteen (field) is maintained by catering person-days or the quantity of portions given (lunches, breakfasts, dinners) without payment,

then line 5 is filled. At that portions are recalculated to person-days of catering based on coefficients: lunch - 0,5m breakfast (dinner) - 0,25.

In the lines 7-10, products used to cook dishes and eatery products are recorded, both through the kitchen, and given from the pantry directly.

Products sold outside for table food, disposed as waste, etc. are not included here.

When workers receive milk and butter for free as special catering from the entity's canteen, such products are not recorded in the report.

All piece-goods, such as rolls, batons, canned food, must be recalculated in kilograms.

The list of food products in the Annex must be used in filling the report.
