Subject: Transparency Statement of Evaluation Data and Results for CABO VERDE WATERSHED MANAGEMENT AND AGRICULTURE SUPPORT

As per MCC guidance on responsible data management¹, and following A2F CONSULTING's requirements for responsible data management, the farmer data associated with this evaluation is available for public use; however, the trader data is not available for public and/or restricted access use.

Both surveys used a consent form that promised, "*Any information you provide that can identify you will be kept strictly confidential*". Due to the small sample size of the trader data, and the large number of identifying data points, a complete de-identification of the data was not possible. Therefore, the trader dataset cannot be released for public use. Access to the identifiable data is restricted due to the strict confidentiality condition of the dataset.

The farmer data has been de-identified to prevent re-identification of the respondents and can be released for public use. We confirm that the data and code package provided facilitates meaningful reproducibility of some of the evaluation results in the Interim/Final Report.
