TITLE: Evaluation of the Regional Study and Resource Center Activity

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1. Purpose

- 1.1. Hello. You've been asked to participate in an evaluation of the Regional Libraries. The purpose of the evaluation is to learn about how people are using the Regional Libraries. The results will be used to inform future work of the Namibia Library and Archives Service, the Namibian Government, and the United States Government. The evaluation is also being conducted for research purposes so that a wider audience can learn from the experiences of this project.
- 1.2. The study is funded by the Millennium Challenge Corporation (or MCC), an American foreign aid agency, and is being carried out by the Technology and Social Change Group (or TASCHA) with help from Sustainable Development Africa (SusDAf).
- 1.3. You are being asked to participate in a panel study because you have used the Regional Library, and we would like to learn about your experiences there as a student.

2. Procedures

- 2.1. Your participation in this study is entirely voluntary.
- 2.2. If you choose to participate in a panel study, you will be asked questions about why you use or don't use the Library, what you do when you visit, and if the Library helps you perform better at school. Additionally, you will be asked for your thoughts on the questions we asked you.
- 2.3. You will be asked to complete an interview and a survey. The interview will take no more than 30 minutes. The survey will take no more than 15 minutes. Both will be conducted here at Regional Library. Both may be audio recorded, but names will not be put into the transcriptions and the audio files will be encrypted.
- 2.4. You can choose to complete these activities in any one of these four languages: English, Oshiwambo, Afrikaans or Otjiherero.

3. Potential Risks and Discomforts

- 3.1. If you volunteer to participate in this study, possible burdens may include discomfort with questions about your school grades, attendance, or related information. You may choose to skip any question you may not be comfortable answering not answer any question, or leave at any time. If you choose not to participate, it will not impact you negatively, and we will not disclose it to anyone.

4. Potential Benefits to Subjects and/or to Society

- 4.1. You will not benefit directly from participating in this research. The primary benefit of this evaluation will be its contribution to knowledge that supports the Regional Libraries and similar activities in other countries. You will not be paid for participating in this study.

5. Confidentiality

- 5.1. The information you provide during this session will be kept strictly confidential to the extent permitted by law. The files will be kept in a secure location where only the researchers in this study will have access to them indefinitely, to the extent permitted by law.
- 5.2. After the research is completed, TASCHA and MCC will remove any identifying information from the transcripts and notes – such as names, dates, and specific locations – so that these sources may be made available for other researchers to use. TASCHA and MCC will require others who request access to this information to agree to use it for research purposes only and not to share this information with anyone else.
- 5.3. If for any reason TASCHA needs to share your data with another organization, such as MCC, TASCHA will review the information you have shared to remove all personal identifiable information, including names and any combination of variables that could reveal your identity (e.g. job titles, dates, specific locations) prior to providing access.
- 5.4. The research team cannot guarantee the confidentiality of materials sent by e-mail.

6. Uses of the Information

- 6.1. The information we receive from you will be used for research purposes only. The final study that summarizes this research may contain quotations from the sessions we conduct, but the TASCHA team will make every effort to ensure that no one can be identified using these quotations.
- 6.2. Results of this evaluation will appear in reports that will be distributed to stakeholder organizations and be made publicly identifiable. However, your identity will be kept anonymous in all public-facing reports and quantitative datasets.

- 7.1.
