GENERAL INFO	
R(14)	<b>Having meals</b> means having a main dish (with rice or any other staple food) plus a side dish in regular portion, which is considered sufficient for the household members to do their daily activities. Including snacking/outside dining, such as food stall/restaurant etc.
R(16)	Sample of staple food substitution with lower quality or price: consuming lower price rice or substituting rice with <i>Nasi Aking</i> , sweet potato, cassava etc. Sample of side dish substitution with lower quality or price: substituting meat/chicken with fermented soybean cake or tofu or substituting fish with dried salty fish etc.
R(17)	<b>Transportation expenses etc refer</b> to household transport expenses in one month aside from business needs. If respondent has any difficulty to answer, you could ask the daily/weekly transport expenses which then be converted into monthly transport expenses.
R(18)	Being able to afford the medical treatment is either by personal financing or using the Community Health Protection card, including the transport cost to the health facility. Even if no household member is sick, the respondent still needs to provide their evaluation of their ability to pay for medical cost should a household member gets sick.
R(20)	Payment of the debt to the non-institutional lender is indicated by daily installment or any affordable amount with high rate of interest.
R(22)	A household’s <b>ability to pay for their education expenses</b> can be measured based on the tuition amount they are able to pay during the first semester of education (July 2008 and July 2009). Excluding any new enrollment in higher education level.
R(26)	Graduate is indicated by holding the certificate.
R(27)	<b>Income</b> is an earning per month in forms of money or in-kind, not including debt.
R(30)	<b>A former household member</b> is a person who is no longer a household member because he/she has moved out from the household to work/look for a job. <b>Not including</b> a person who has to move to district/other city/country because of his/her routine job (such as commuter and country border crosser).
R(31)	The recent moves taking place by the former household member back to his/her previous household are due to their job lost since August 2009. A person who has stayed over 6 months or more and a person who stays in the household less than 6 months and has a plan to stay longer than 6 month is considered as a household member.
