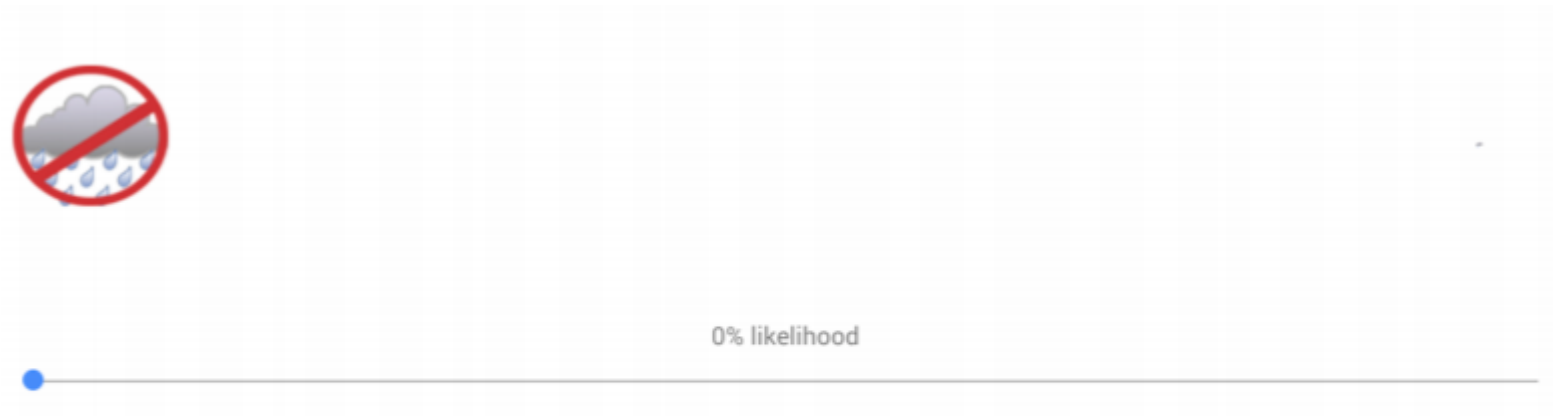

Section D – BELIEFS/EXPECTATIONS

Now I will ask you some questions about uncertain outcomes. In each case, try to think about the whole range of possible outcomes, and how likely they are to occur during the specified time period. As you know, there are many events in our lives that are uncertain. For example, we can guess about the chance it will rain tomorrow, but cannot say for sure it will rain on any given day. The chance it might rain will also depend on the season. For example, in this rainy season (June-October), you might expect that there is a high chance that it will rain tomorrow. But there is no guarantee that it will rain for sure. On the other hand, if I had asked you this question about a day in the dry season (November-May), you might have expected that the chance of rain is very low. But again, completely unexpected rains can arrive even in March! Using this screen, you can express how certain you think these uncertain events might occur (like whether it will rain tomorrow). When the ball is in the middle of the line, it shows you think it is equally likely that it will rain or not rain. As you move the ball towards the rain, you indicate that you are more and more certain it will rain. If you slide it all the way to the right, you are 100% absolutely certain it will rain

[Example of equal likelihood of rain or no rain]



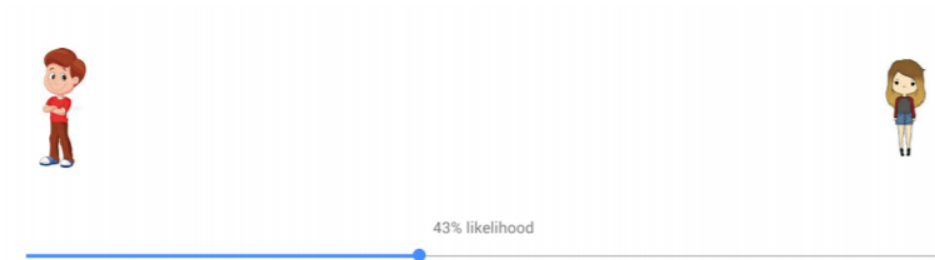
