
- Proportionate to population size (PPS) stratification a) by region and b) settlement type (capital/urban/rural) was performed;

- Random selection of Primary Sampling Units (PSU) within each stratum was performed;

- A random route technique for household (HH) selection was applied (starting point within each PSU /electoral precinct/ provided to the interviewer).

- The upcoming birthday method was used to select the respondent among adults (18+) within each selected HH.

Thus, the general population in the sample frame was divided into 11 strata by the regional criterion (Capital - Yerevan and 10 regions/marzes). At the same time, in each stratum the second level of stratification: urban and rural was made, in order to obtain the urban-rural proportions of the respondents at the regional and country levels. Proportionate stratification (PPS) was applied to the sample, which means that the total number of respondents in each stratum in the sample is replicating the general distribution of respondents by a) strata, and (b) the urban-rural proportion. The same principle of the PPS stratification was applied also within the capital: Yerevan. Ten districts (according to administrative division) were determined as sub-strata within Yerevan. Thus the total



number of respondents in each district of Yerevan was proportionate to the general distribution of adults by these sub-strata.

So, in total 30 (10+10+10) separate sub-strata were developed enabling selection of primary sampling units (PSUs).



By the end of the fieldwork it came out that the gender distribution of respondents is unusually biased (29% male and 71% female). This phenomena could be explained by: labour migration (a typical outflow pattern for men in active working age); higher employment rate among men (lack of availability for an interview); and some share of persons wounded during the 44-day war over Nagorno-Karabakh (September 27-November 9 2020).

Upon consultations with the WVS secretariat it was decided to conduct extra interviews with male respondents in the clusters with less than 20% of share of male respondents. The total number of oversampled interviews with men was very limited - just 39. However, oversampling enabled to end up with a slightly higher ratio – 31% men and 69%-women.







\* The Fieldwork Coordinator was responsible for the overall management and quality control of the fieldwork in Yerevan and the regions. Overall managerial and technical oversight was exercised by the Fieldwork Coordinator and the Program Manager for Data Initiative from CRRC-Armenia. The data was monitored daily using Survey CTO software and the interviewers were being immediately instructed on the issues rising throughout the collection process. In the frames of the data cleaning process back-check calls have been made to correct the discrepancies in the dataset. Throughout this process 10% percent of CAPIs (10 minutes at a random start) were audio recorded and monitored to fix the oversights and further instruct the interviewers.






