Heghine Manasyan is a Doctor of Economics with extensive experience in research, teaching and policy analysis. Her primary areas of expertise include Labor Market, Education, Economic Growth and Development, Poverty and Inequality issues, Political economies of transition, Local Governance, Labor Migration and Remittances; Social Monitoring and Analysis; Public Policy Design and Analysis; Corruption, etc. Dr. Manasyan is an author of over one hundred publications and articles.



Prior to joining the Caucasus Research Resource Center (CRRC)-Armenia in 2002, Dr. Manasyan has actively been involved in projects funded by international organizations (UNDP, WB, WFP, UNICEF, OECD, OSCE, TACIS, etc.) and aimed at strengthening domestic capacity for high quality social science research and education in Armenia. While serving as an Executive Director (August 2002-September 2019) and Director of Research and Development (October 2019-December 2020) at CRRC-Armenia, she was responsible for designing and managing implementation of Center programs, working with Center staff and the Board of Trustee and the Local Advisory Committee members to oversee the data collection, research fellowship, training and other program areas, representing the CRRC and carrying out liaison with local NGOs, academia, and governmental agencies, establishing and managing relationship between the Center and its host university (Yerevan State University). Along with developing, managing and implementing the Center budget, assuring administrative coordination, she was initiating and directing fundraising efforts among prospective donors, overseeing regular production and updates of CRRC-Armenia program reporting, outreach and PR materials.

Since January 2021 Dr. Manasyan serves the CRRC-Armenia as Honorary Director and provides professional services.

Dr. Manasyan's educational background includes studies at the Yerevan State University, State Academy of Management (Moscow), Central European University (Budapest) and Columbia University (New York).

Dr. Manasyan was the PI of the WVS V for Armenia. Currently she is the WAPOR National Representative in Armenia.

CRRC-Armenia, in partnership with CRRC-Georgia and CRRC-Azerbaijan conducts the "Caucasus Barometer" (CB) annual survey, a cross-country survey running in the three countries of the South Caucasus: Armenia, Azerbaijan and Georgia. The survey aims at studying the public opinion of the social, political and economic developments in the region. The first wave of the survey was administered in the capital cities of the three republics in 2004. In 2006, the scope of the survey was extended and since then, the CRRC centers have started to carry out countrywide surveys representative of the whole population. The 2015, 2017 and 2019 waves of the survey were conducted in Armenia and Georgia only.

The survey tools - the questionnaire, show cards, the detailed sampling methodology, the databases (in SPSS and STATA formats) and main findings of the CB can be found on the Caucasus Barometer (<http://caucasusbarometer.org/en/>) website.
