Use the following codes to explain each household member's relationship to the MPR/FPR step-by-step.

	Expired/"ex-"	X	Used for household members whose relation to the primary earner is through someone who has expired, e.g., XWM for ex-wife's mother.
	Adoption & Illegal Relation	Z	Describe an illegal relation such as an illegal wife or an adopted son or daughter, e.g., ZY for illegal wife or Z1 for oldest son is adopted.

Examples:

- 1 = MPR / FPR's eldest son
- 1W = MPR / FPR's 1st son's wife
- XW1 = MPR's son with ex-wife. This is the oldest son of the MPR. He has a current wife W living in household and a son with her. That son is 2.
- S6 = MPR / FPR's niece (eldest sister's 1st daughter)
- WM = MPR's mother-in-law (his wife's mother)
- MPR married his sister's daughter (his niece). The wife died and he is married to another woman. His first wife's parents (his sister and brother-in-law) live with him. They are S & SH or XWM & XWF.
- First son's son is 1-1. Use a "-" between so as not to confuse with the number 11.
- NG1 = an acquaintance's oldest son.
