FY 2024 Paraguay Country Opinion Survey Report

The Paraguay Country Opinion Survey is part of the Country Opinion Survey Program series of the World Bank Group. This report was prepared by the Business Intelligence (BI) team, led by José De Buerba (Senior External Affairs Officer) and Svetlana Markova (Senior External Affairs Officer). 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Objectives

This survey was designed to assist the World Bank Group (WBG) in gaining a better understanding of how stakeholders in Paraguay perceive the WBG. The survey explored the following questions:

- 1. Overall Context:** How familiar are stakeholders with the WBG? How much do they trust the WBG?
- 2. Key Indicators:** What opinion do key stakeholders have of the WBG regarding its effectiveness, relevance, alignment with Paraguay's development priorities, and other key indicators? Are opinions improving or declining?
- 3. Development Priorities:** What areas of development are perceived to be the most important? Have the priorities changed over the past three years? How effective is the WBG perceived to be in these areas?
- 4. Engagement on the Ground:** How is the WBG perceived as a development partner in Paraguay? Are opinions improving or declining?
- 5. Financial Instruments and Knowledge Work:** What do key stakeholders value the most regarding the WBG's work in Paraguay? What opinion do key stakeholders have of WBG financial instruments and knowledge products? Are opinions improving or declining? What are stakeholders' suggestions for improving WBG's effectiveness?
- 6. Communication and Outreach:** What are the preferred communication channels? Are there differences among stakeholder groups in terms of preferred channels?
- 7. Message Recall:** What key topics do stakeholders recall when the WBG communicates? Is there a relationship between message recall and views of the WBG's work?



Methodology Overview

■ Fielded June – October 2024

- 507 potential participants were asked to complete a mostly quantitative survey
- Respondents completed the questionnaire online or on paper
- List of names provided by the WBG country team and supplemented by the field agency
- Process managed on the ground by the field agency

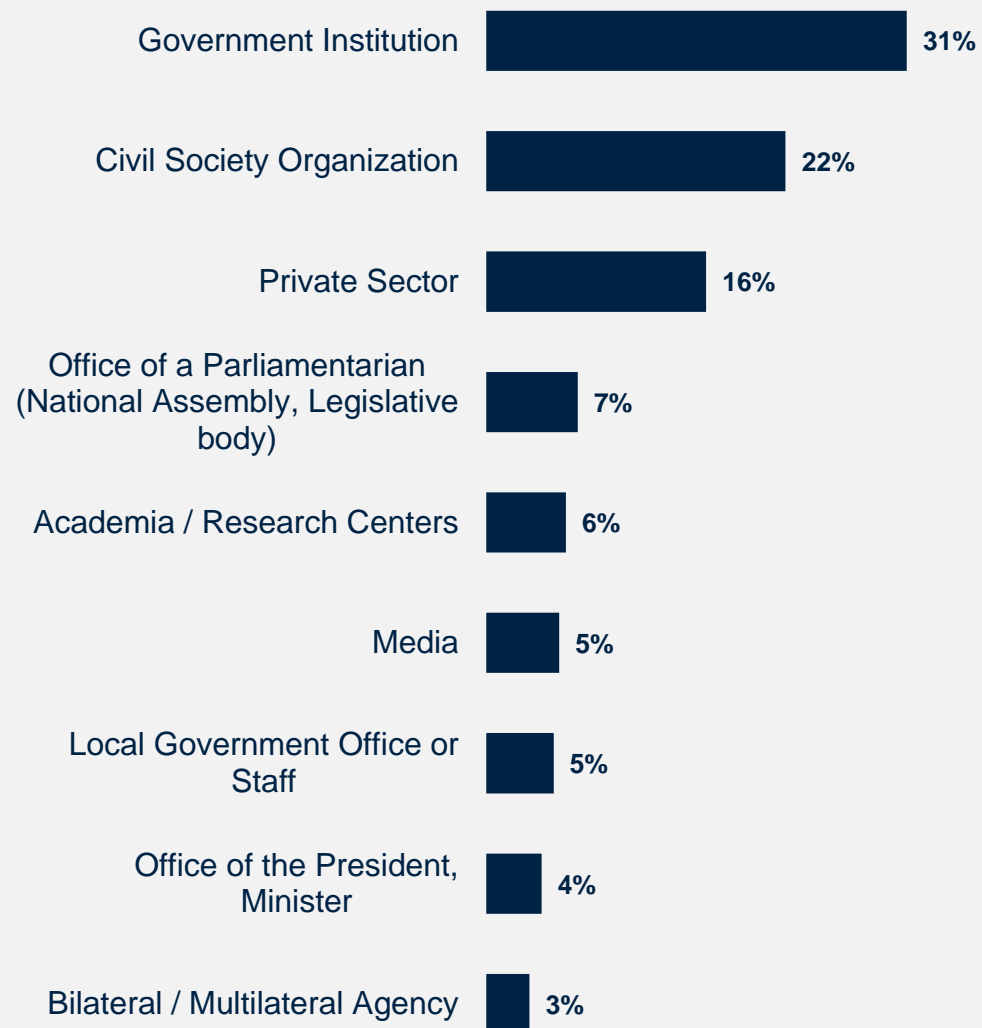
■ 221 participants (44% response rate)

- 90% from the Capital and Central Department
- 18% currently collaborate with the WBG

■ Compared to FY21 Country Survey

- 283 participants (50% response rate)
- Respondents completed the questionnaire online or on paper
- 24% collaborated with the WBG

Overall Context

“... although the World Bank Group has excellent tools, the implementation in public policy is ineffective, but this is independent of the group itself. I also suggest that certain platforms for civil society participation seem very closed off. However, this, again, does not depend on the group itself. Therefore, I recommend that the World Bank Group improve the monitoring of its policy implementation by establishing more robust monitoring and evaluation systems, including independent audits and regular assessments. Additionally, it is essential that civil society participation platforms be more accessible and open. The World Bank Group could foster an inclusive environment that allows for greater participation from diverse social groups, ensuring their voices are heard and considered in policy formulation and evaluation. Thank you for the work you do in the country; I know it is challenging.”

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In your opinion, what is the most important thing the WBG could do to increase its effectiveness in Paraguay? (N=104)

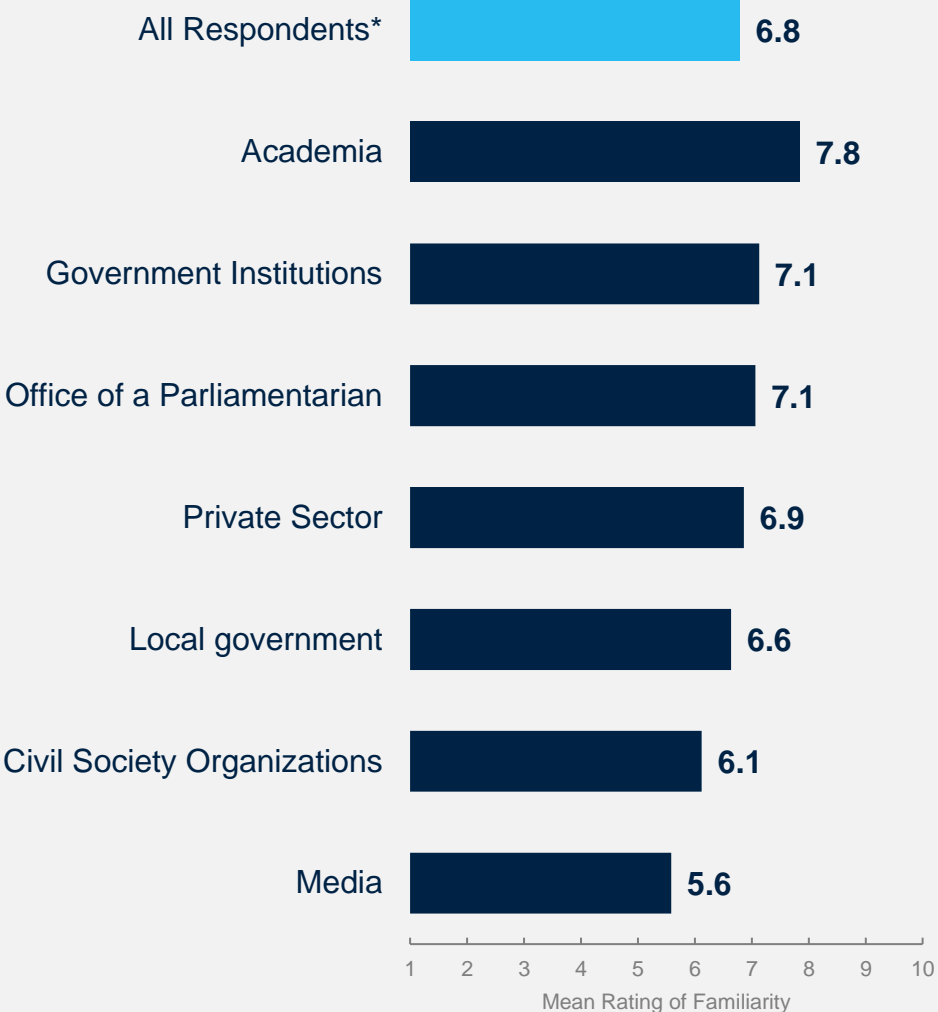
Familiarity with the World Bank

- Comparison of FY21 and FY24:** Respondents in this year’s Country Survey reported significantly higher levels of familiarity with the World Bank Group than the respondents in the FY21 Survey:

Mean familiarity: **FY24 = 6.8**
FY21 = 6.0

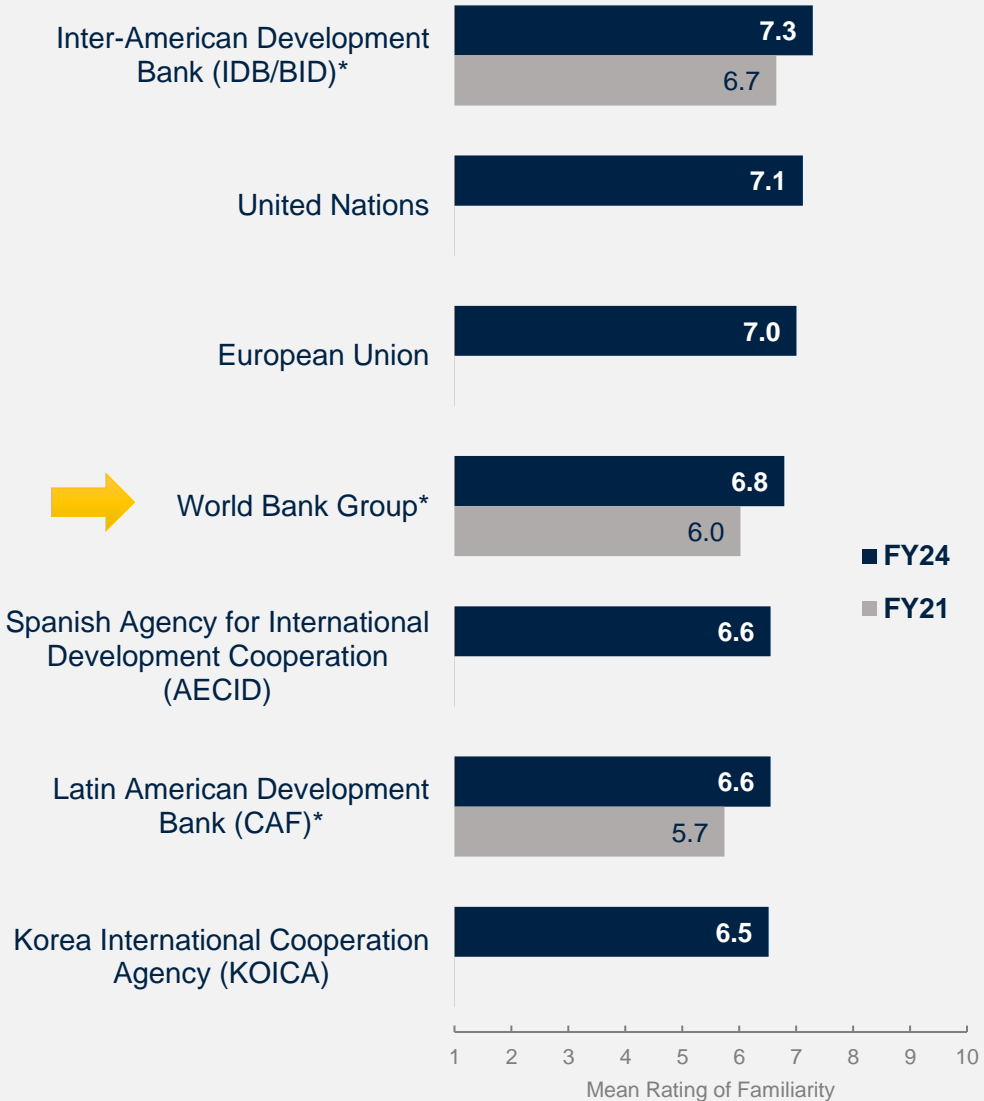
- Collaboration with the WBG:** Respondents who indicated that they collaborate with the WBG reported significantly higher levels of familiarity with the institution’s work:

Mean familiarity: **Collaborate with WBG = 7.9**
Do not collaborate = 6.6



Stakeholders Most Familiar with the IDB

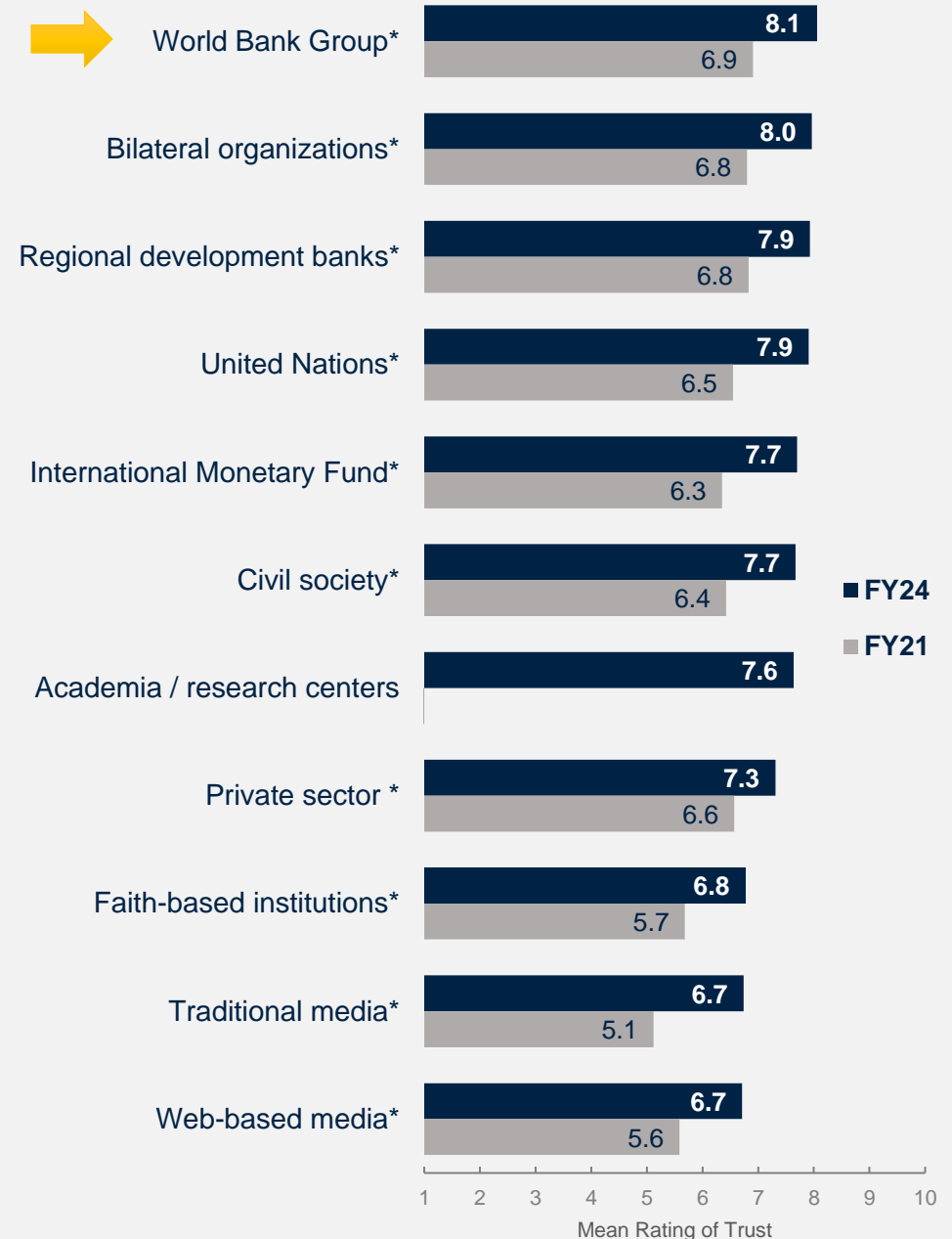
- Respondents in this year's Country Survey were asked to indicate their familiarity with the work of several international organizations in addition to the World Bank Group. Of these organizations, respondents in Paraguay indicated the highest levels of familiarity with the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB/BID) work, followed by the United Nations (UN) and the European Union.



The WBG is the Most Trusted Institution

Respondents in Paraguay rated the WBG, bilateral organizations, regional development banks, and the UN as the most trustworthy institutions.

Despite significantly improved ratings compared to the FY21 survey, the **faith-based institutions** and **media** were among the least trusted institutions studied.

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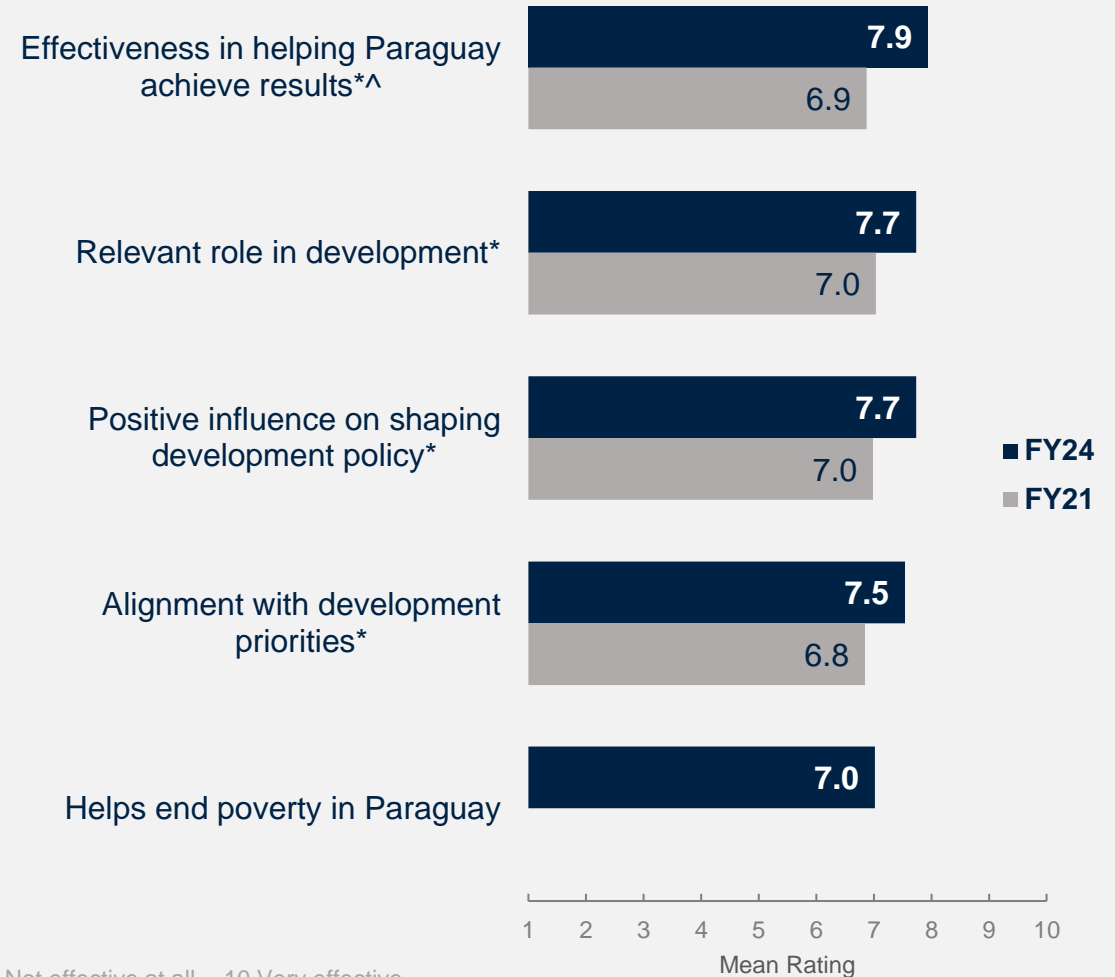


In your opinion, what is the most important thing the WBG could do to increase its effectiveness in Paraguay? (N=104)

Ratings for Key Performance Indicators Improved Significantly

In FY24, respondents gave the highest ratings for the WBG's effectiveness in helping Paraguay achieve development results, which has significantly improved compared to FY21 results.

The ratings for WBG's **relevance** to development in Paraguay, its **positive influence** on shaping development policy, and its **alignment** with the country's development priorities have also increased significantly compared to the previous survey.

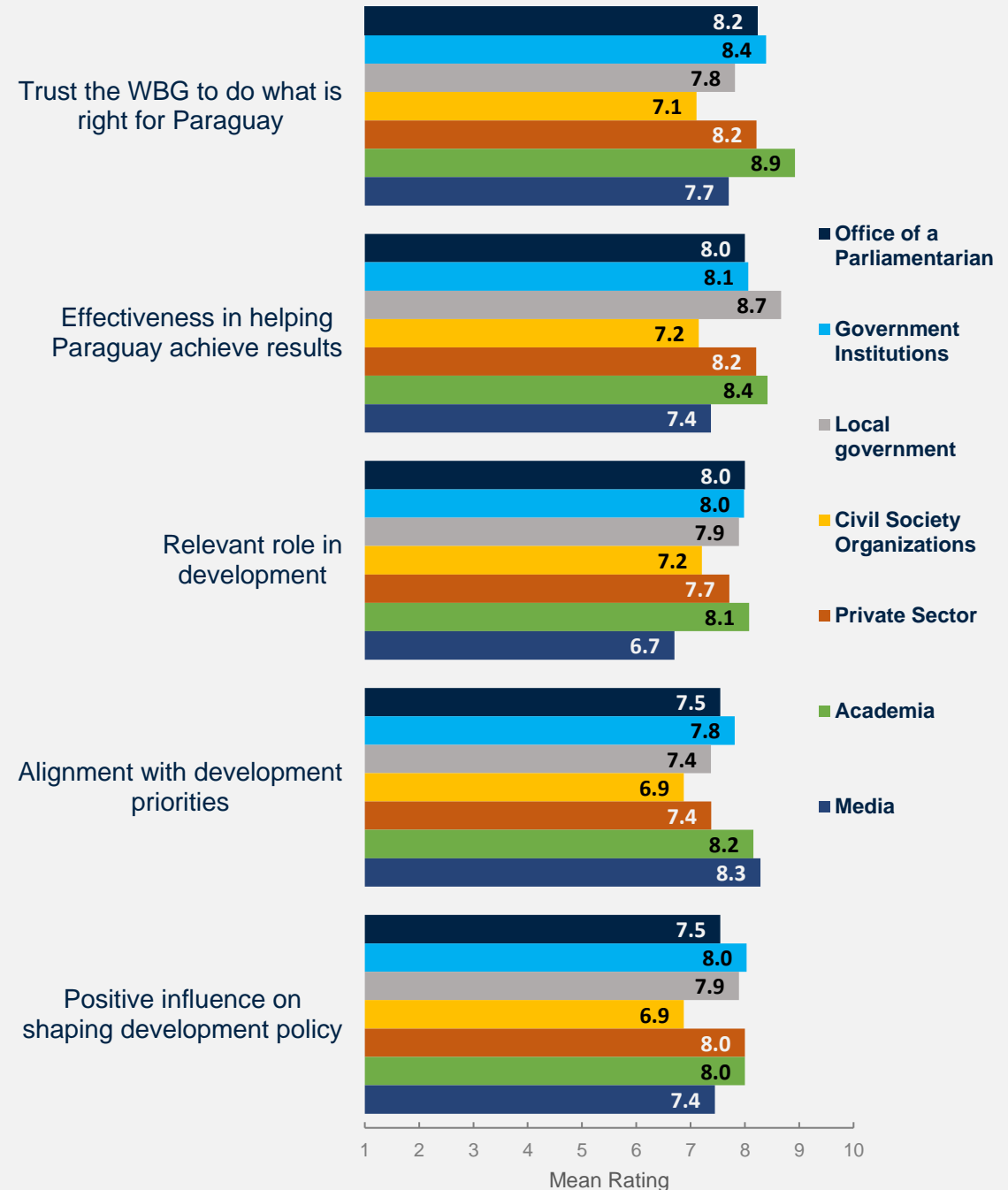

Stakeholders from Academia and Government Institutions Have Most Positive Perceptions of the WBG

Comparisons of ratings for key performance indicators between stakeholder groups show that respondents from **academia** have the highest ratings for the WBG's work across all KPIs. Respondents from **government institutions** are also very positive.

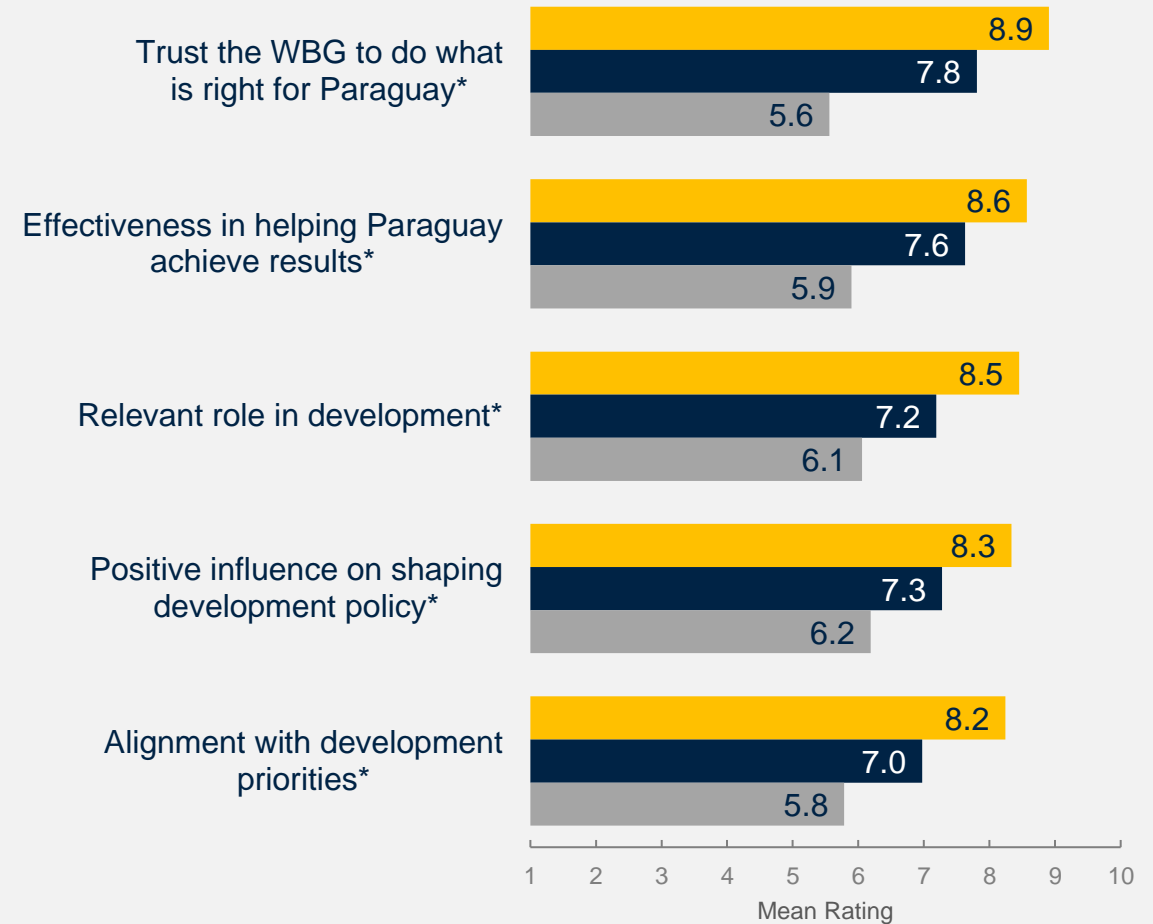
While respondents from **civil society** organizations tended to be more critical of the WBG's work, the difference in ratings hasn't reached a statistically significant level.



Familiarity Leads to More Positive Perceptions

Comparing ratings of key performance indicators among respondents highly familiar with the WBG (ratings of 8-10 on a 10-point scale) and those with little familiarity with the WBG (ratings of 1-4 on a 10-point scale), one can see that the more familiar stakeholders are with the WBG, the more positive their perceptions of it and its work are.

Meaningful engagement and outreach can continue to increase positive perceptions.



How familiar are you with the work of the WBG in Paraguay?

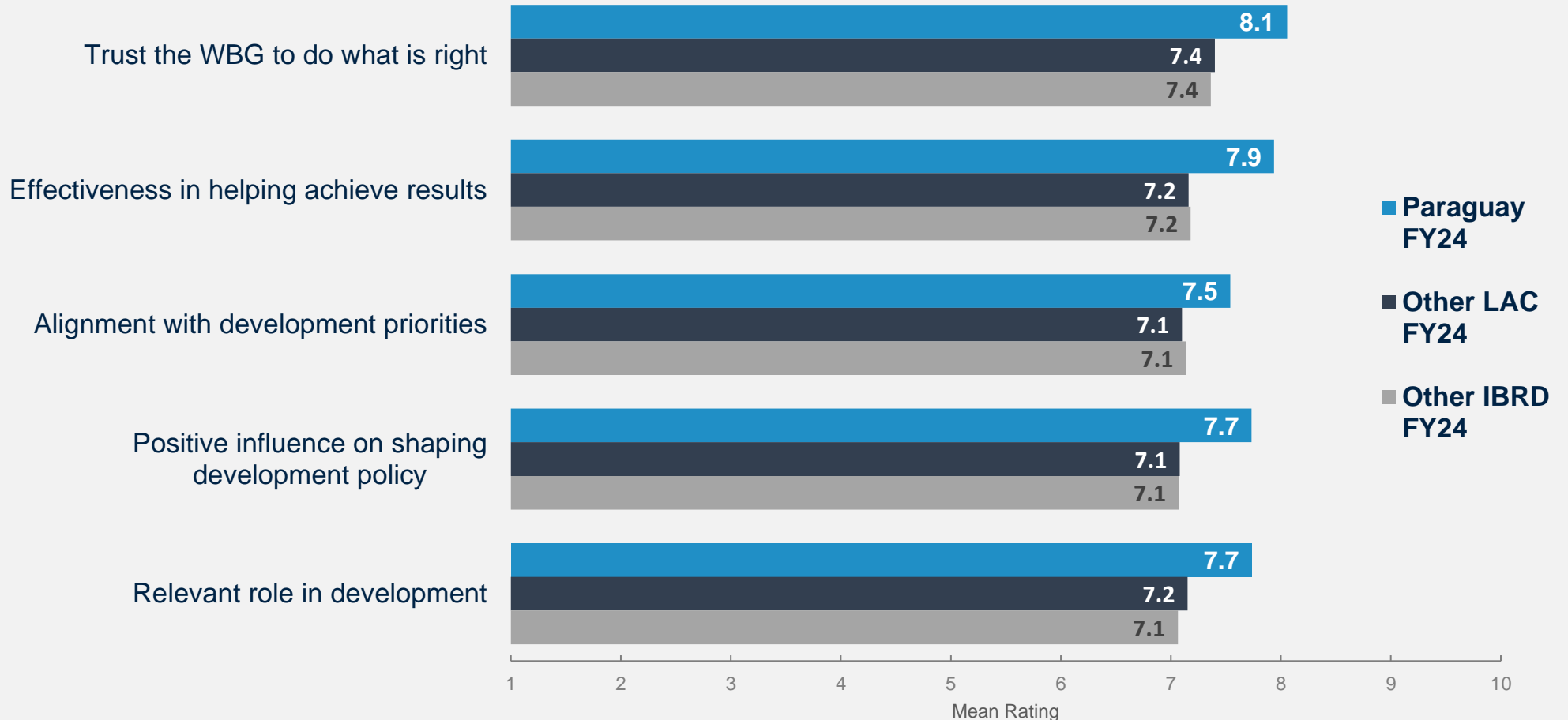
■ High Familiarity (8-10) ■ Some Familiarity (5-7) ■ Low Familiarity (1-4)

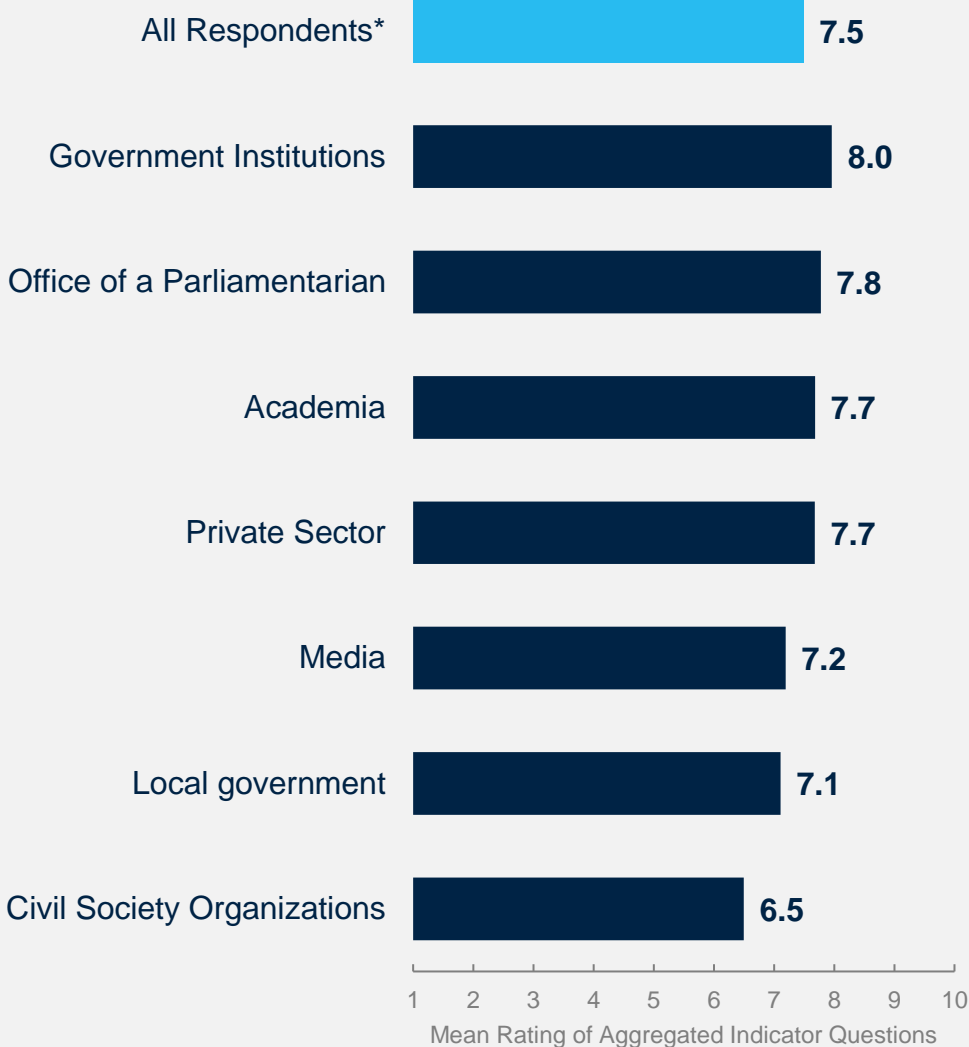

Respondents from government institutions had the highest mean rating across the aggregated responses to the nineteen COS indicator questions, whereas respondents from civil society organizations had significantly lower ratings.

WBG: Focal Development Areas

In FY24, stakeholders wanted the WBG to focus its resources on **education and skills**, **transport infrastructure**, and **economic growth, trade, and investment**.

Respondents in this year's survey considered **transport infrastructure** a much greater priority than in the FY21 survey (7%).

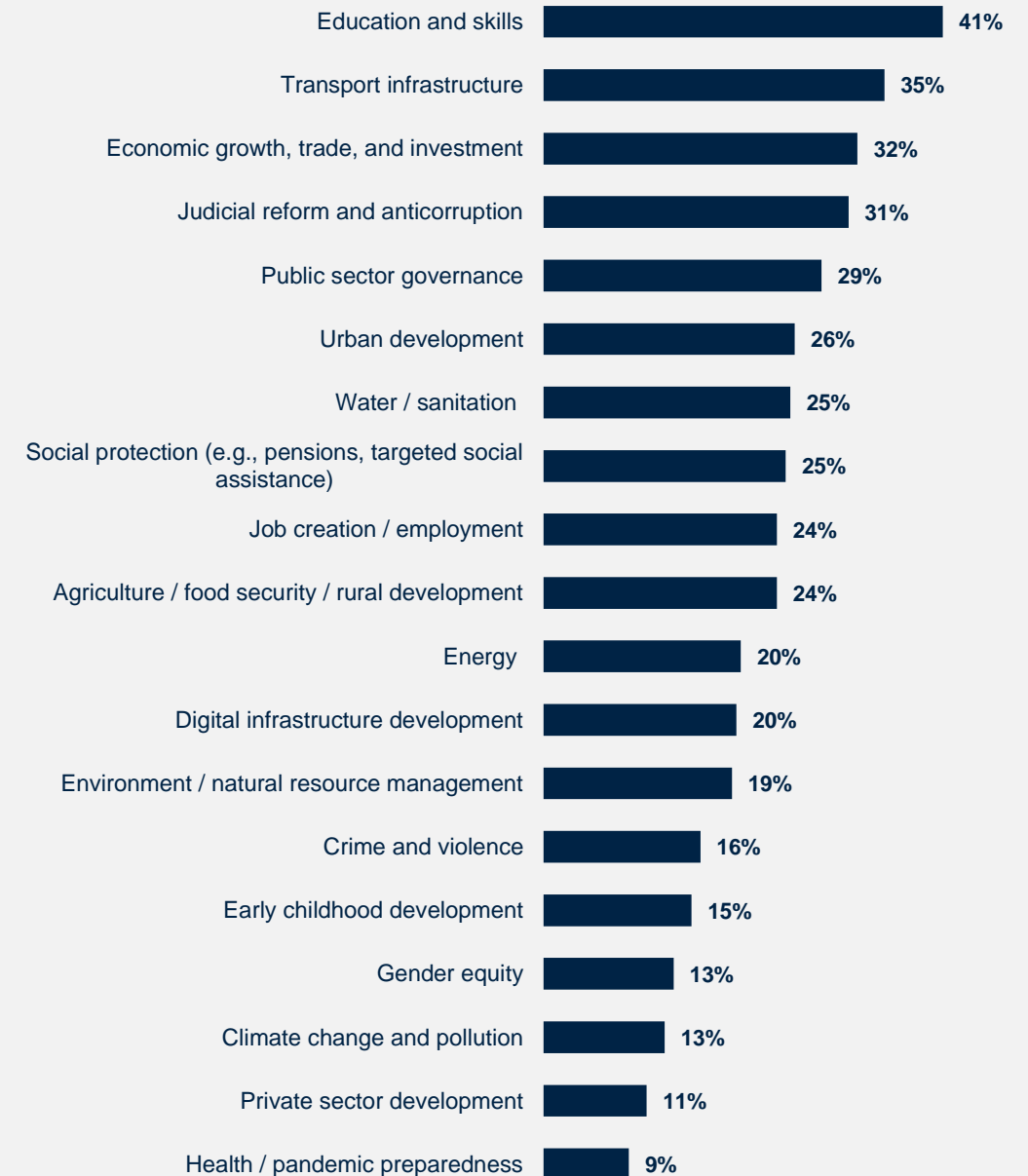

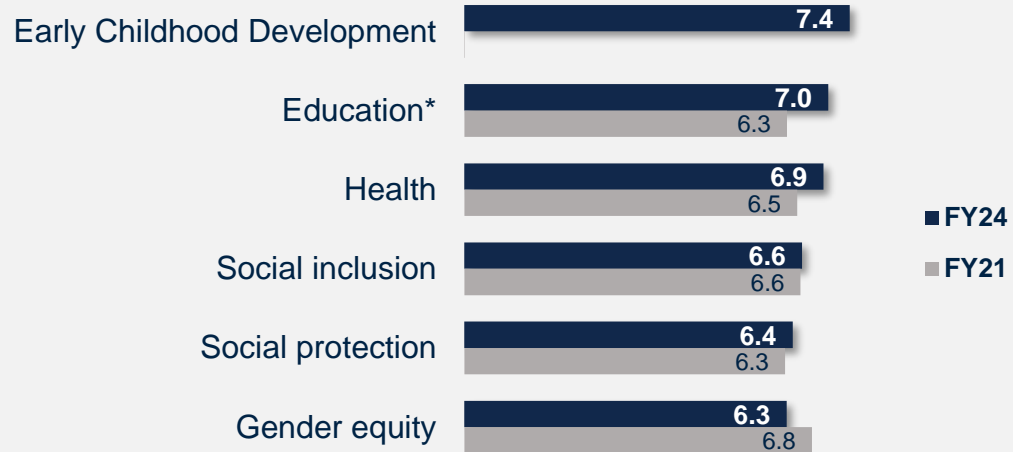

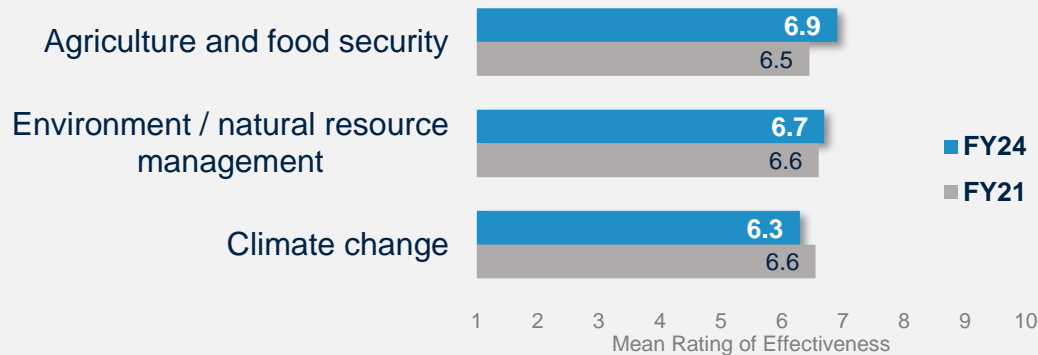
Effectiveness of WBG's Sectoral Support

The WBG's work in **early childhood development** received the highest effectiveness ratings. Of note, the effectiveness of WBG's support in many sectors has improved since FY21, significantly so for **education** and **trade and integration**.

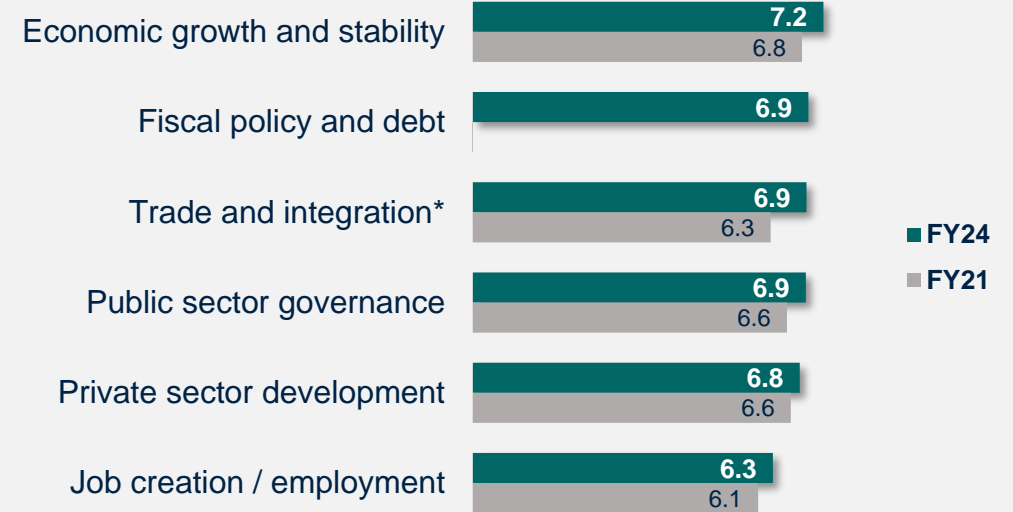

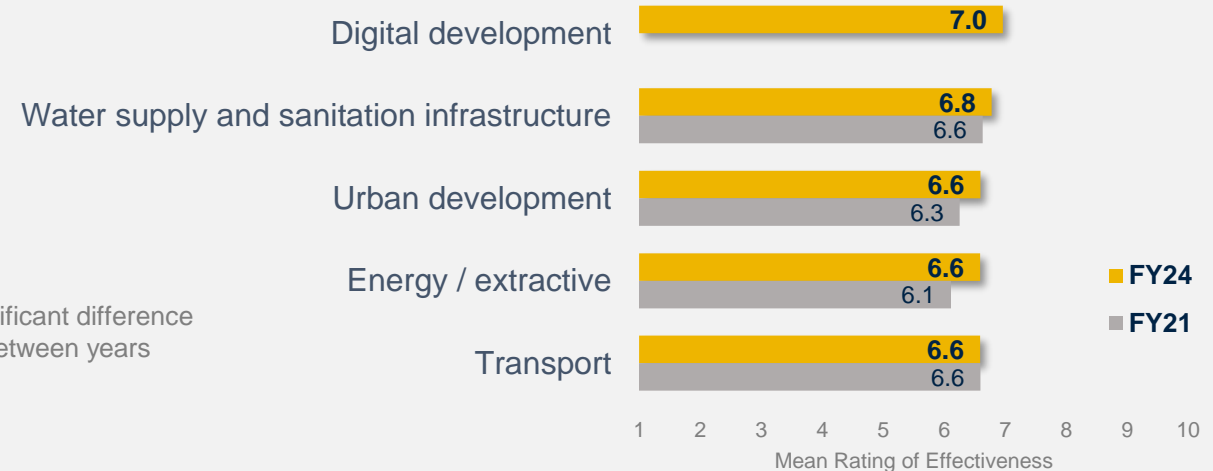

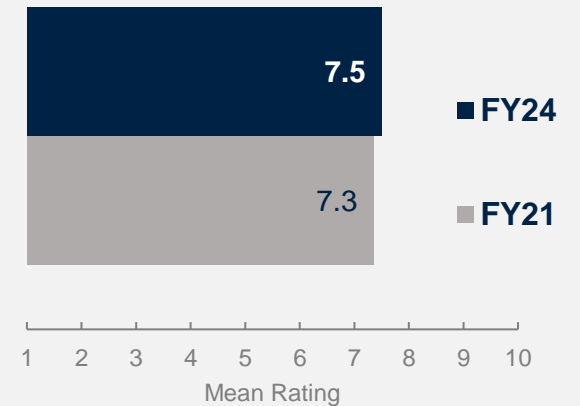


How **effective** has the WBG been at achieving development results in each of these areas in Paraguay? Scale: 1 Not effective at all – 10 Very effective

High Ratings for the 'Paraguay Ahora' Platform's Relevance to Social Capital in Paraguay, Except Among Civil Society Stakeholders

Although most respondents rated the relevance of *Paraguay Ahora*, the WBG-supported platform for facilitating policy dialogue among young leaders in Paraguay, favorably, **civil society representatives** were notably more critical, assigning an average score of 5.8.

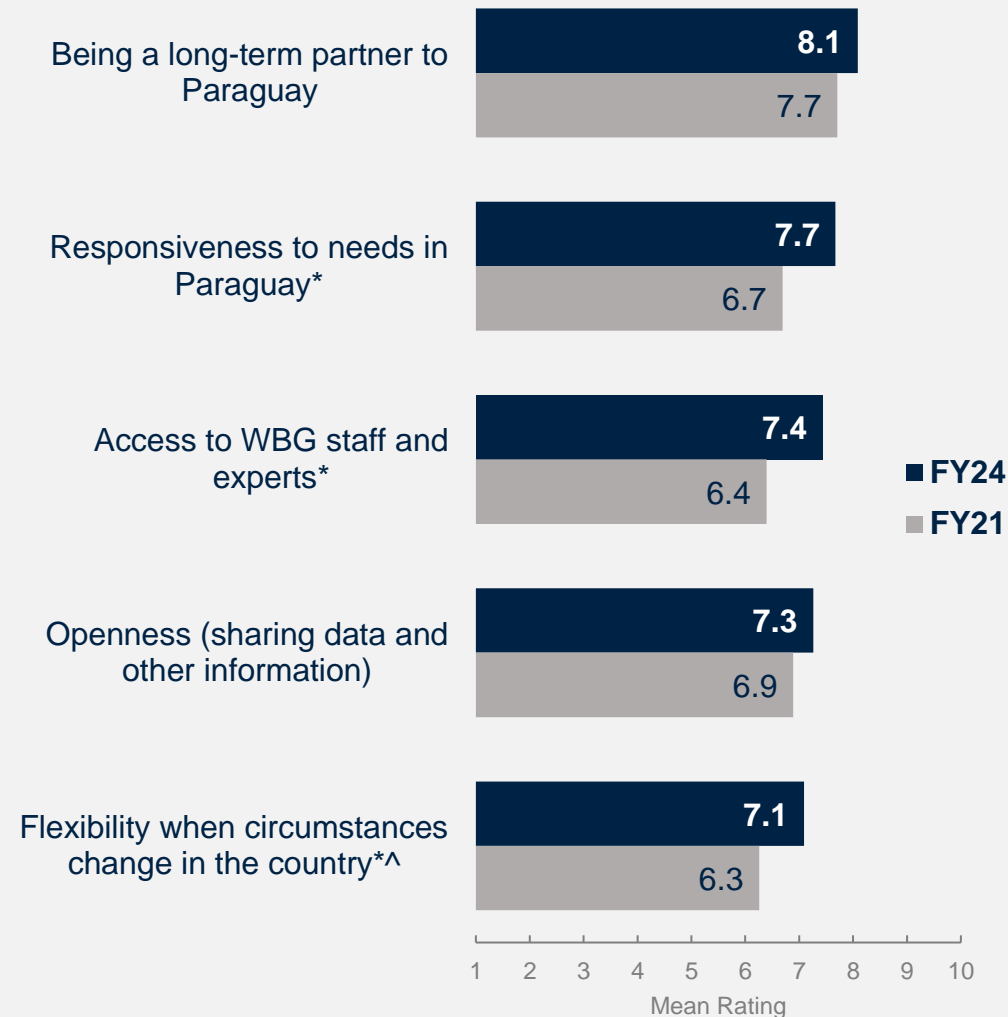
The WBG Increasingly Seen as an Effective Partner

In FY24, respondents continue to perceive the WBG as a **long-term partner** with significantly improved **responsiveness, accessibility, and flexibility** ratings.

The WBG has logically given much weight to working with the public and private sectors, but other similar organizations (CAF and IDB) have good experiences in multisectoral work that could be replicated by the WBG. In addition, the IDB has good experiences in supporting science and research that could be replicated.”

The WBG Collaborates Effectively with Government

In FY24, perceptions of the effectiveness of the WBG's collaboration with various stakeholder groups have improved significantly. Respondents believed that the WBG effectively collaborates with the national and local governments.

However, respondents gave relatively lower ratings for the WBG's collaboration with the media. In addition, despite the overall increase, respondents from civil society gave significantly lower ratings for the Bank's collaboration with their group (mean=6.3)

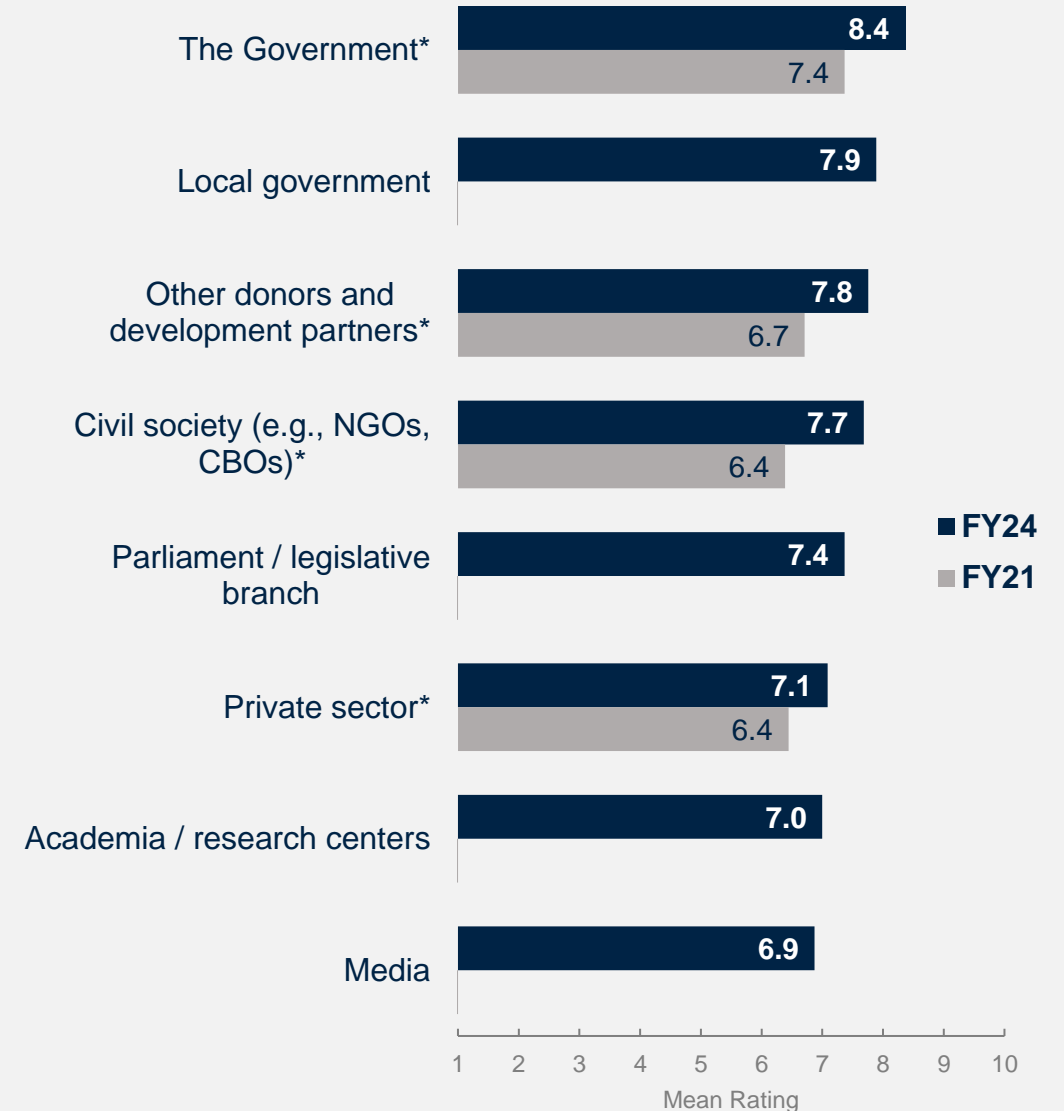

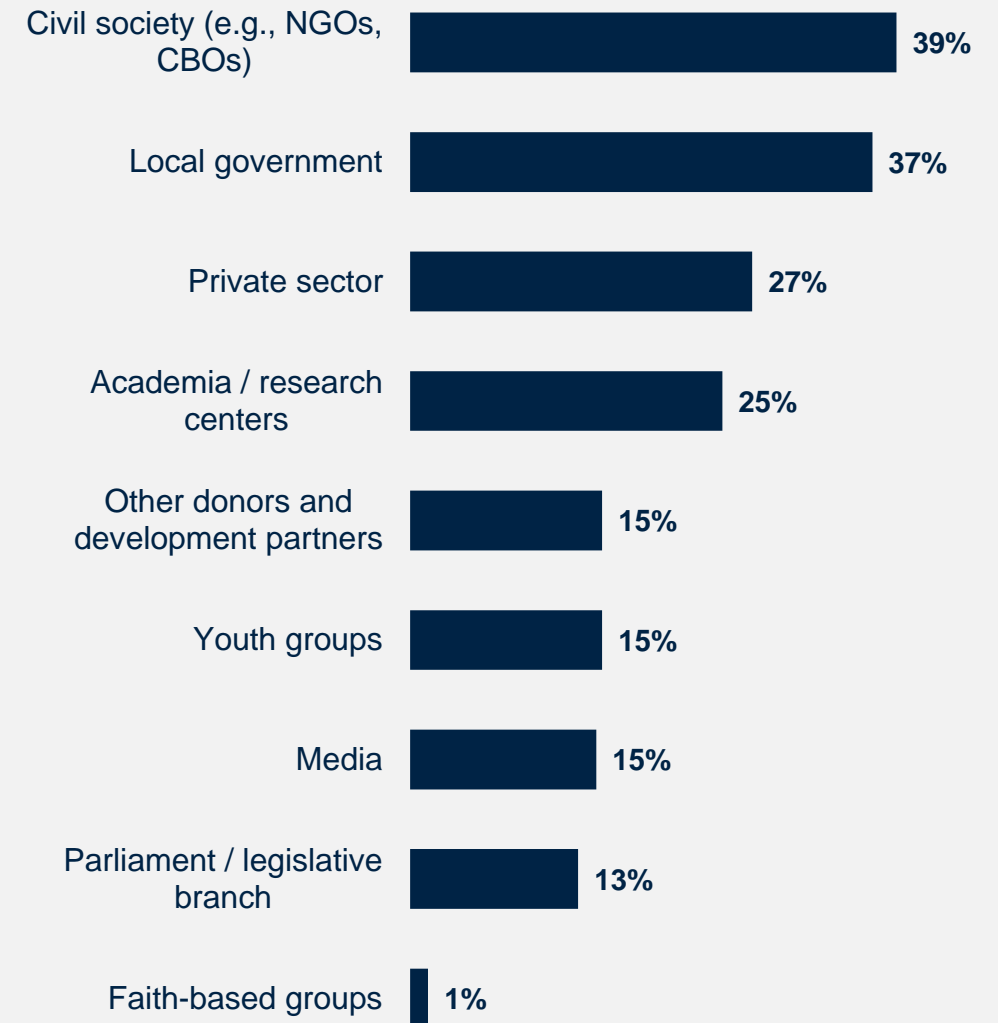
Stakeholders Want the Bank to Collaborate More with Civil Society and Local Government

Respondents in this year's survey indicated that the WBG should collaborate more with **civil society** and **local government** and its partnership with the national government. A quarter of the respondents welcomed more collaboration with the **private sector** and **academia**.

"It should have a better link with civil society organizations that are closer to the target populations to improve its diagnosis and facilitate the implementation of its social projects. Currently, its management is very focused on the government that develops projects within a welfare model - clientelist and very distant from the reality of the context."

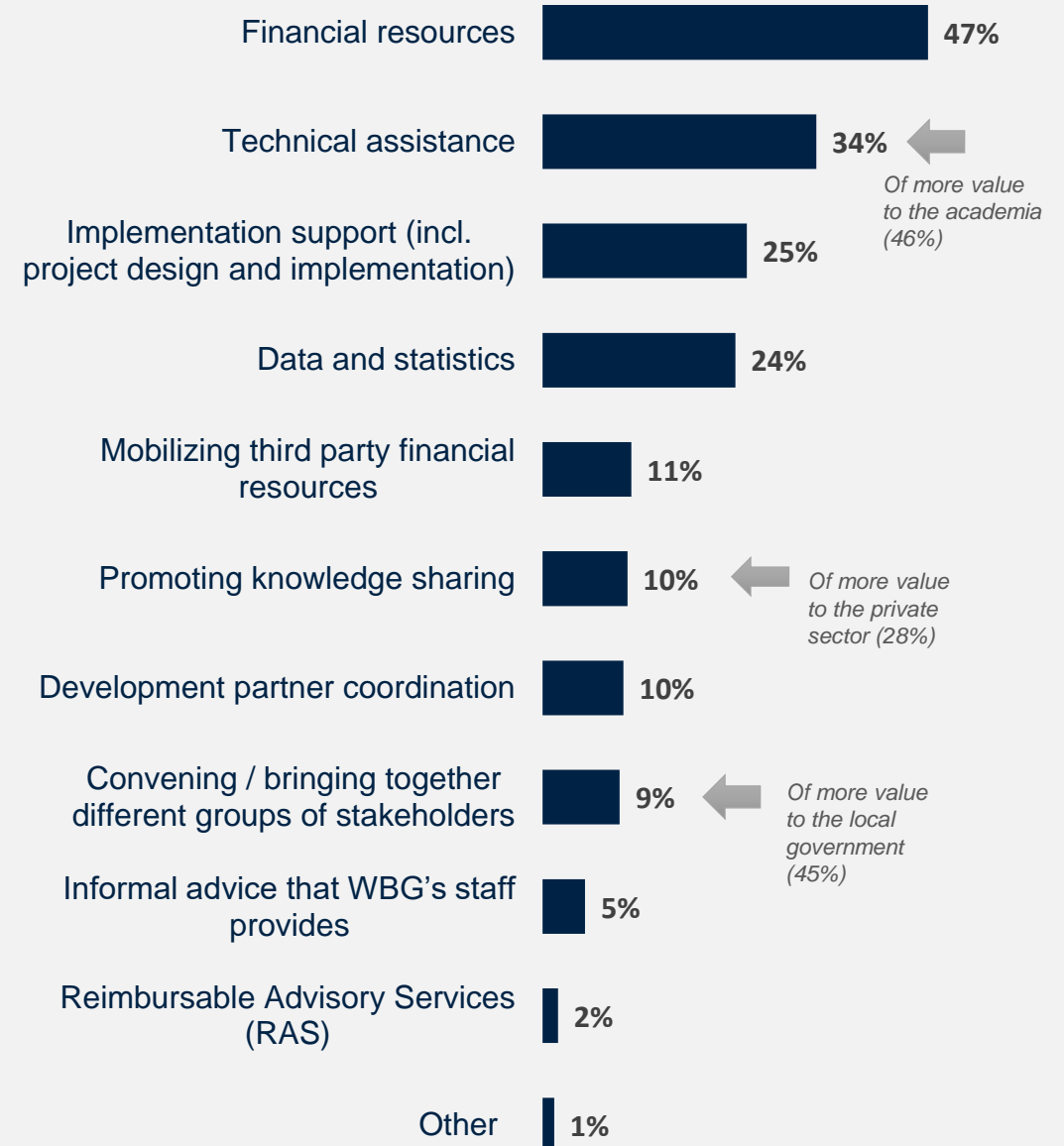

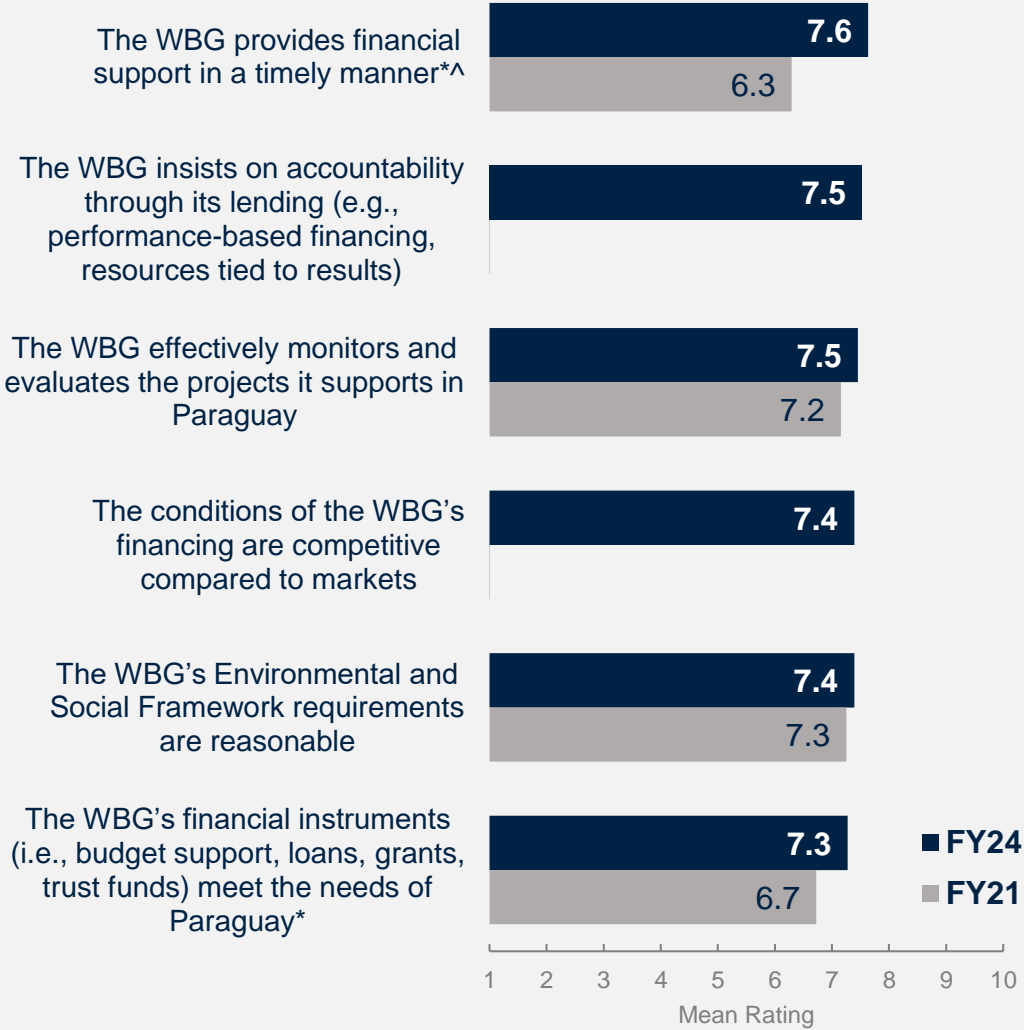
WBG Provides Timely Financial Support

Regarding the WBG’s financial instruments, respondents reported a significantly higher level of agreement that the WBG provides financial support in a timely manner and that its financial instruments meet Paraguay’s needs compared to FY21. The ratings for other statements on the WBG’s financial support and instruments remained positive as in FY21.

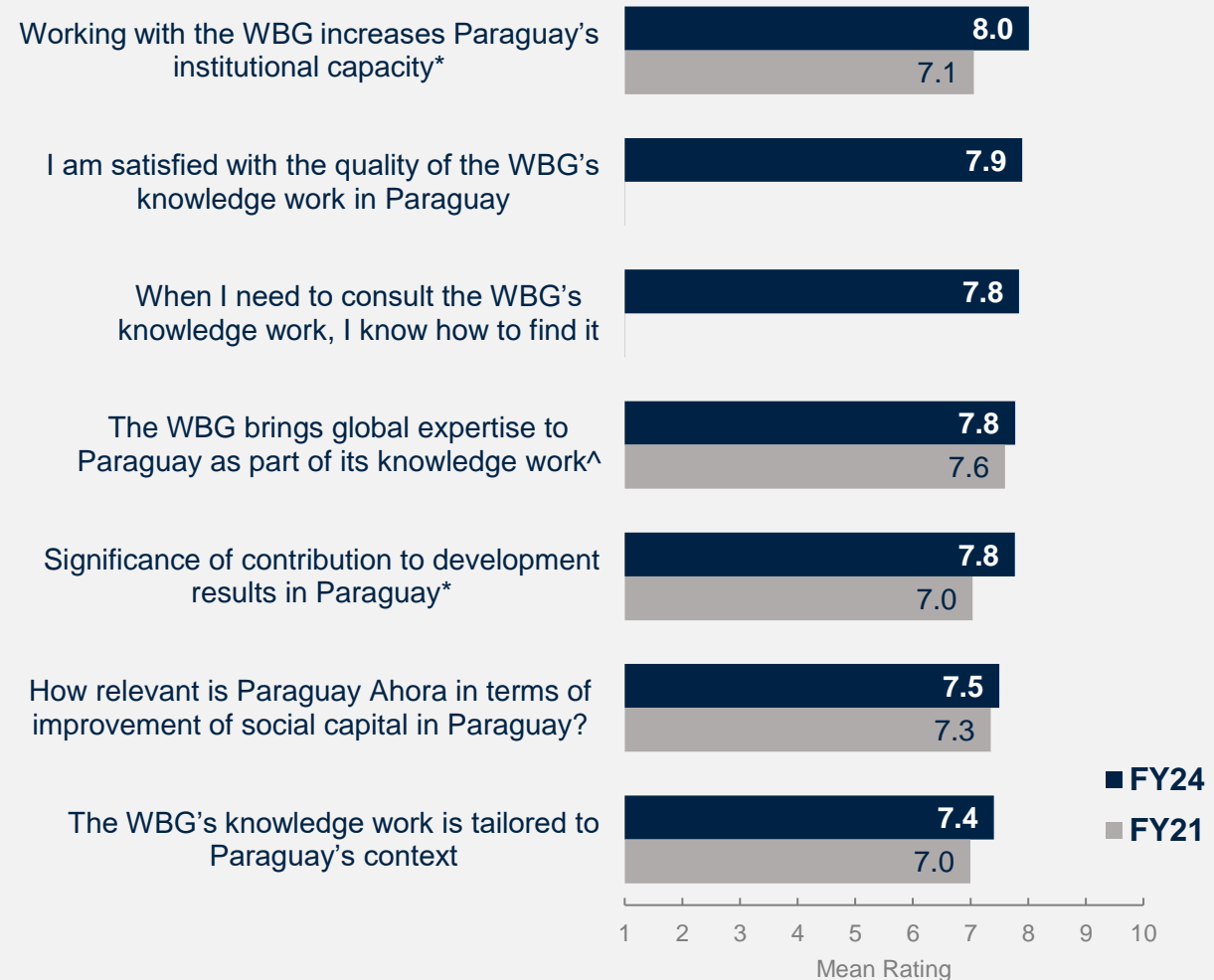
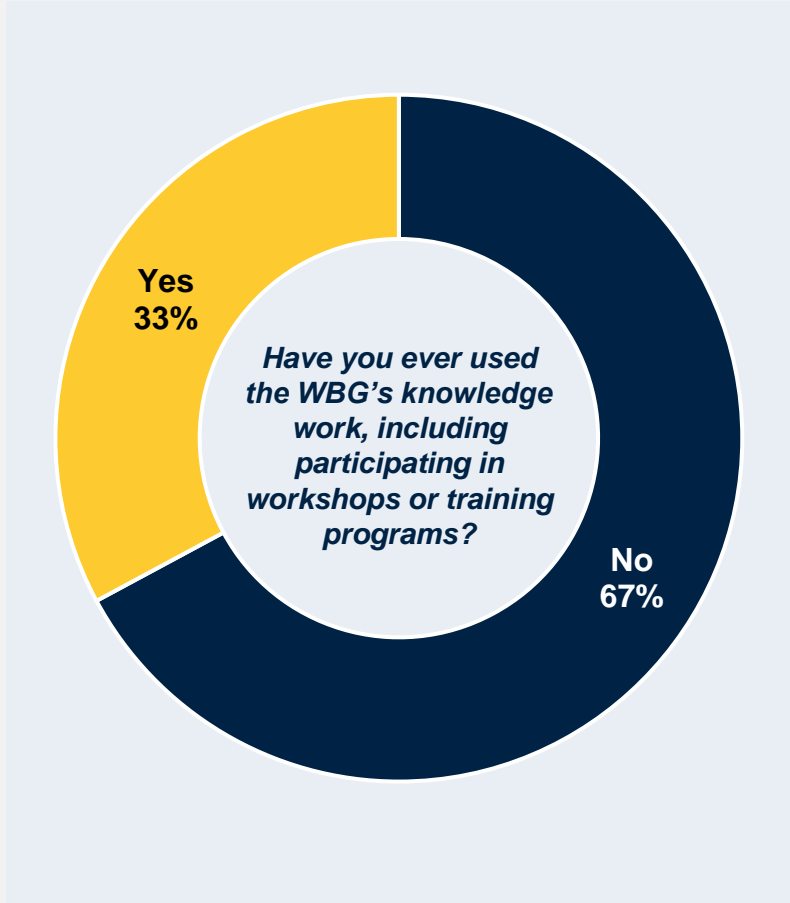
Of note, media respondents gave significantly lower ratings for the WBG’s financial instruments meeting the country’s needs (mean = 5.7), and respondents from civil society organizations reported significantly lower ratings for WBG’s financial support being timely (mean = 6.3).

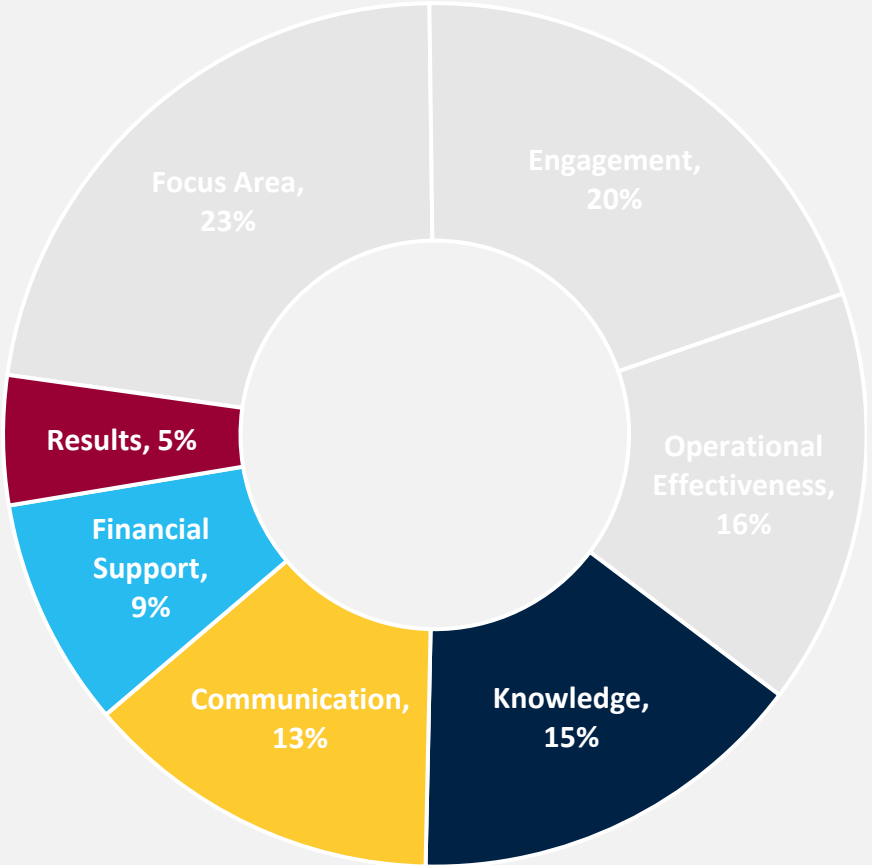

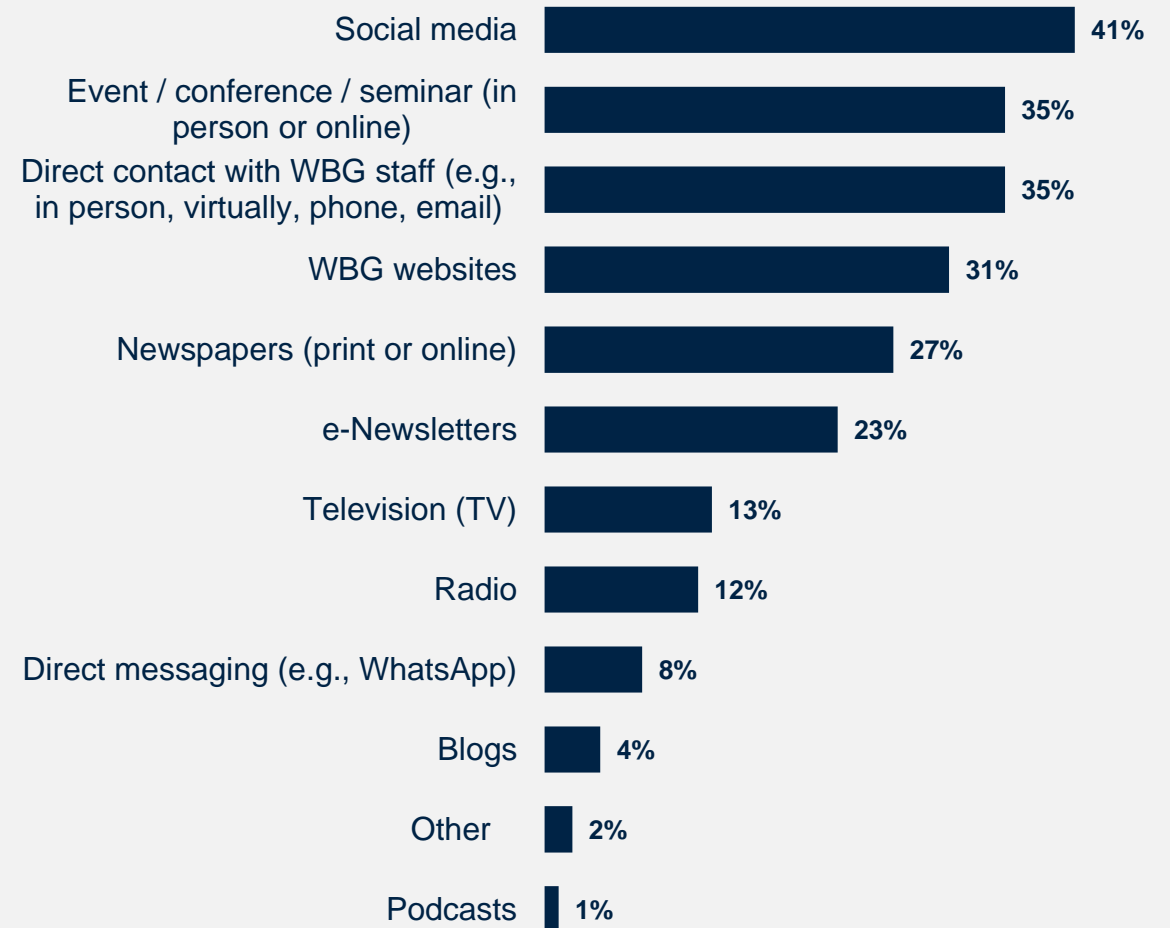
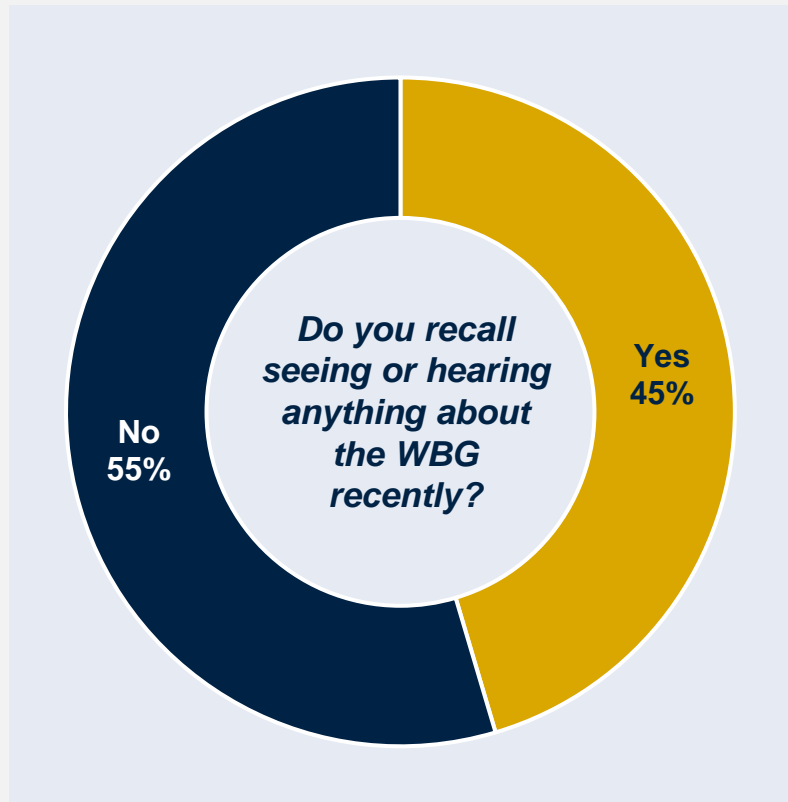
Social Media and Events were the Most Preferred Ways for Receiving WBG Communication

45% of Respondents Recalled Information about the WBG Recently, Most Often Through Social Media and Events

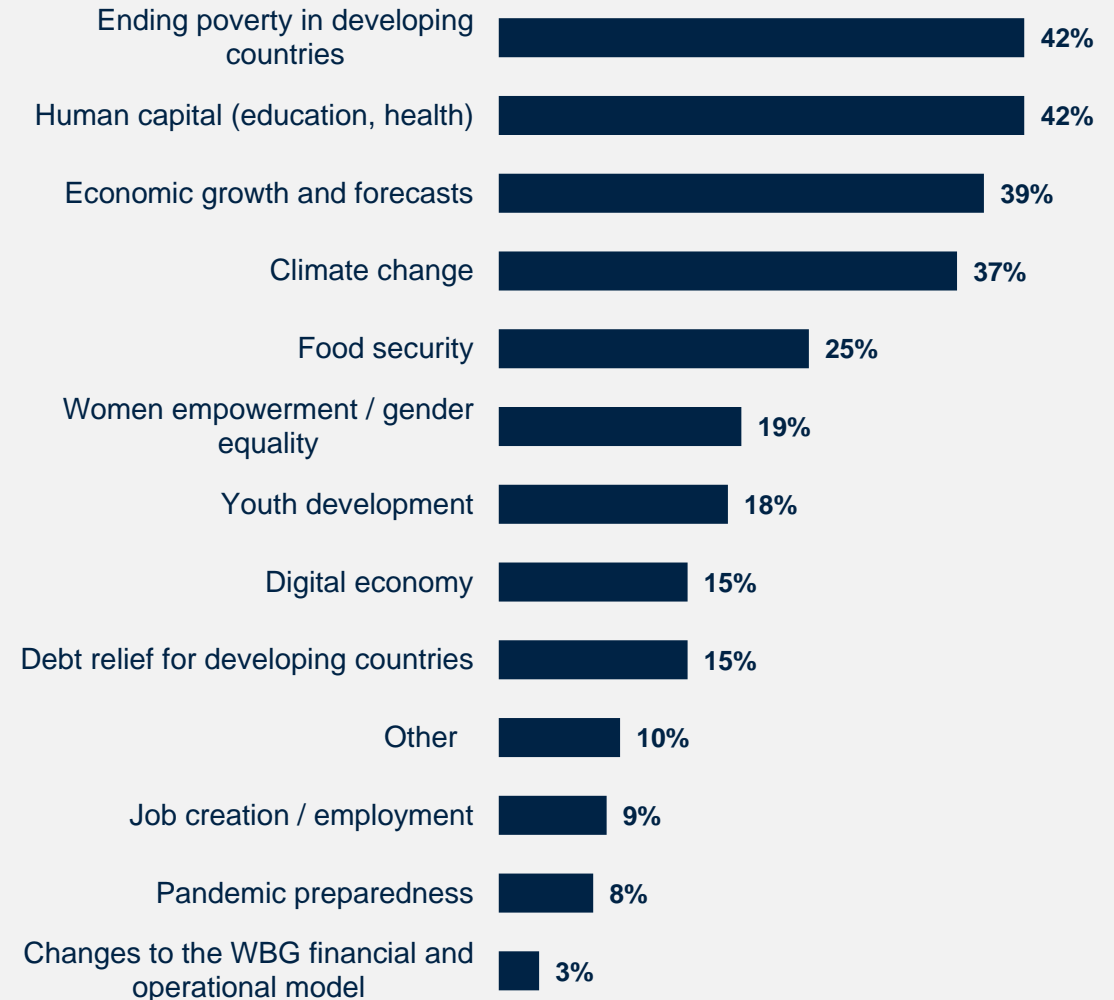
45% of respondents recalled hearing or seeing something about the WBG recently. Respondents most often reported seeing/hearing about the WBG through social media, event/conference/seminar (in person or online), and direct contact with WBG staff.



WBG's Work on Ending Poverty and Human Capital were the Most Commonly Recalled Topics

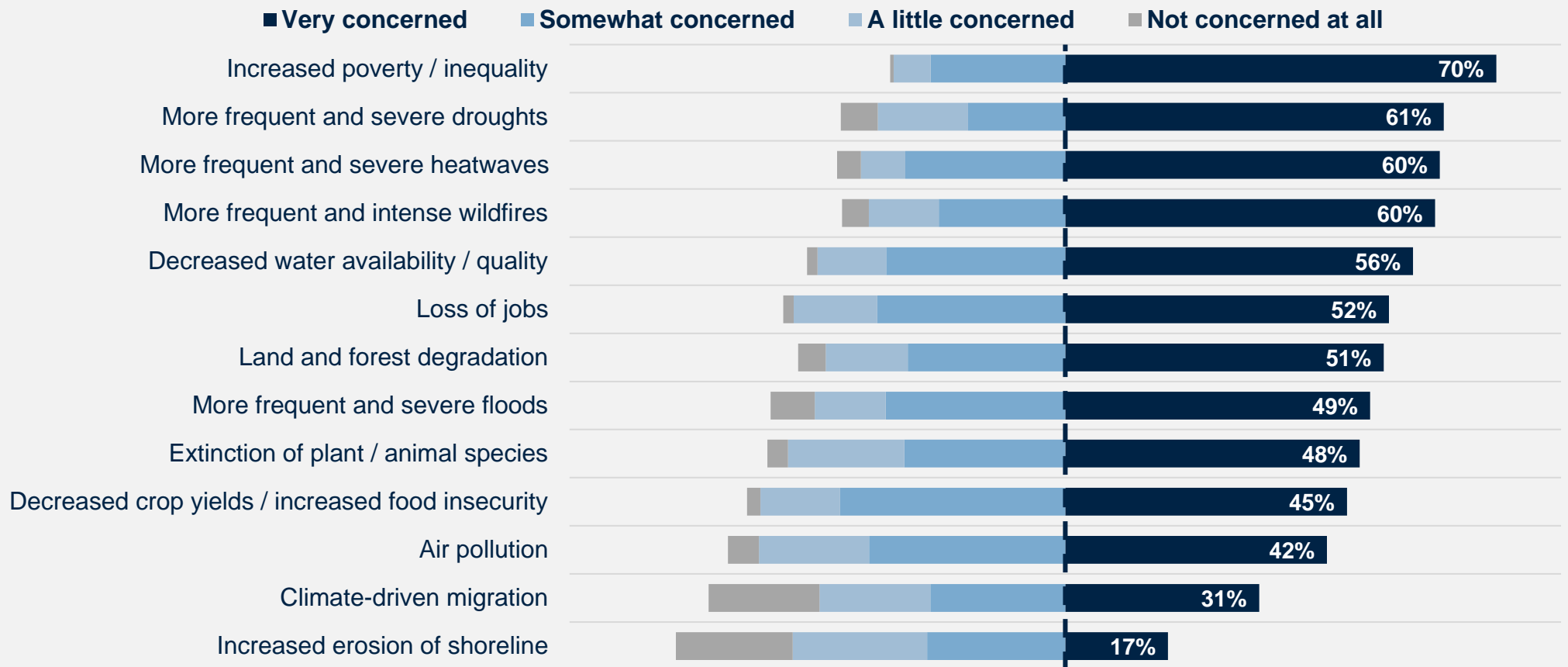
Respondents most frequently recalled WBG's work or research on **ending poverty** in developing countries and **human education**, followed by **WBG's economic forecasts** and **climate change**.

- All respondents from academia recalled WBG's work on climate change.



Climate Change Communications can be More Impactful when Related to Stakeholders' Top Concern: Increased Poverty and Inequality

Over two-thirds of the respondents were **very concerned** about the increased poverty/inequality regarding the potential impacts of climate change in Paraguay. **More frequent and severe droughts, heatwaves, and wildfires** were also of great concern to respondents. These key areas of concern should be considered to make communications about climate change more impactful.

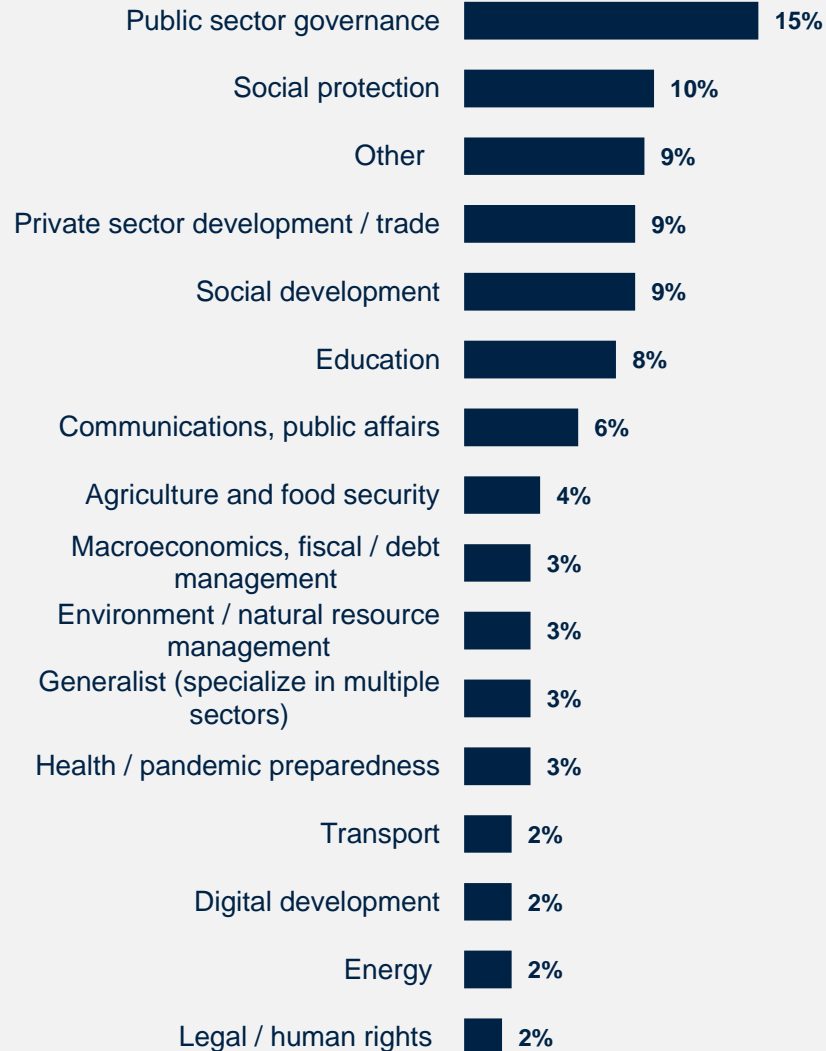

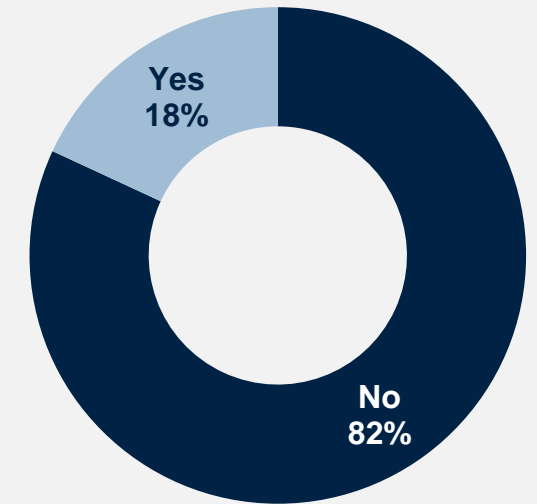

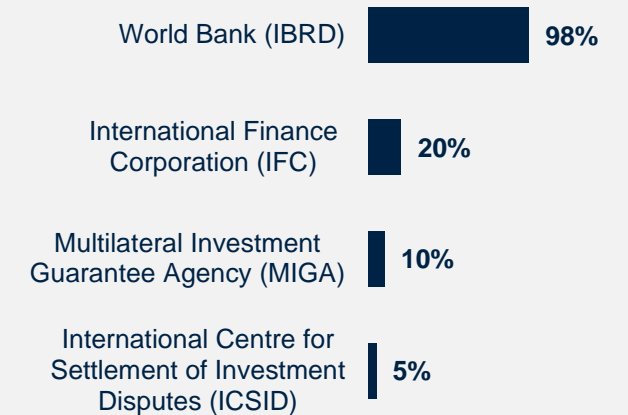
What is the primary specialization of your work? (N=205)



Do you collaborate/work with the World Bank Group (WBG) in Paraguay? (N=221)

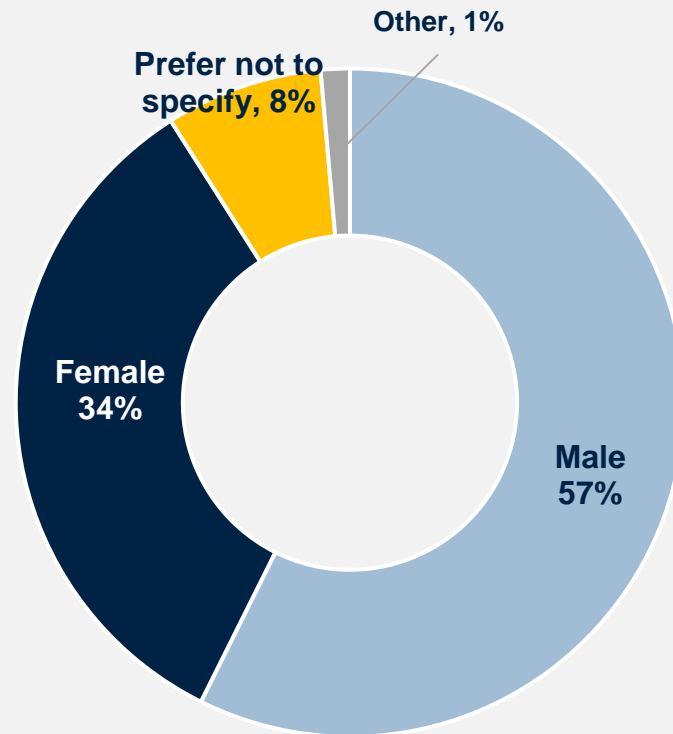


Which of the following WBG agencies do you collaborate/work with in Paraguay? (N=40)

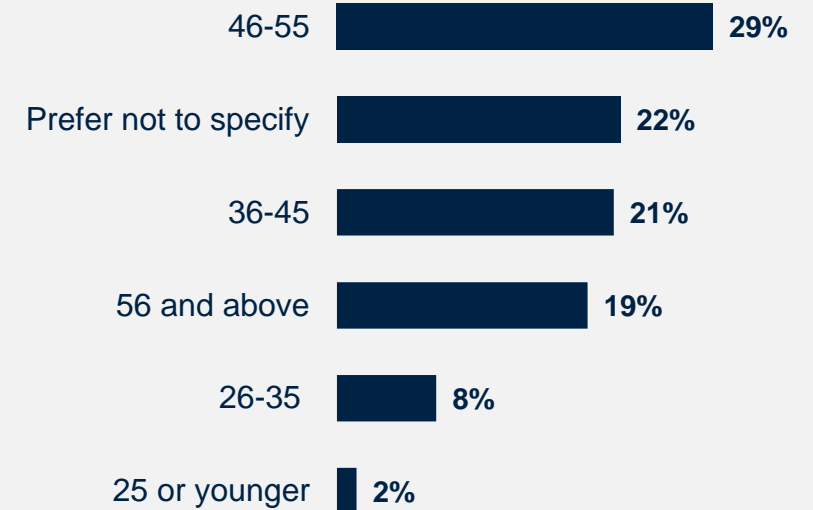

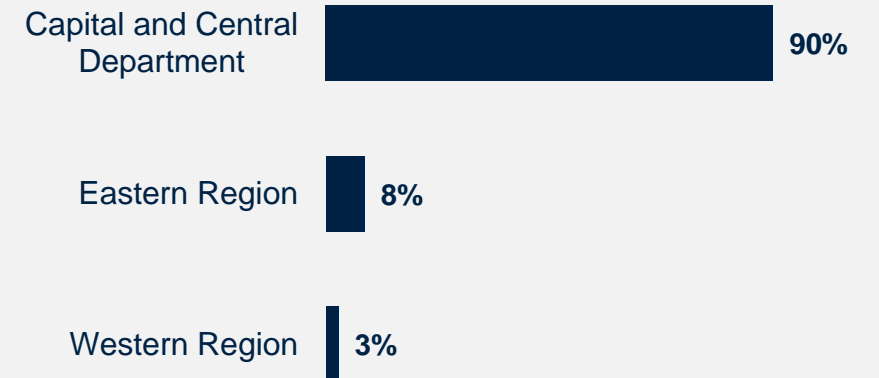
What is your gender?

Detailed Methodology

From **June to October 2024**, a total of 507 stakeholders in Paraguay were invited to provide their opinions on the WBG’s work by participating in a Country Opinion Survey (COS). A list of potential participants was compiled by the WBG country team and the field agency. Participants were drawn from the Offices of the President, Prime Minister, Minister, and Parliament, government institutions, local governments, bilateral or multilateral agencies, the private sector, civil society, academia, and the media.

Of these stakeholders, **221 participated in the survey (44% response rate)**. Respondents completed the questionnaire via an online platform or on paper.

This year’s survey results were compared to the FY21 Survey, which had a response rate of 50% (N=283).

Comparing responses across Country Surveys reflects changes in attitudes over time as changes in respondent samples, changes in methodology, and changes to the survey instrument itself. To reduce the influence of the latter factor, only those questions with similar response scales/options were analyzed. This year’s survey saw a greater outreach to and/or response from civil society organizations and government institutions but a slight decrease from the private sector and academia. These differences in stakeholder composition between the two years should be considered when interpreting the results of the past-year comparison analyses.

Key statistically significant findings (tested at the research standard of $p < .05$) are noted throughout the report.
