For example, if I ask you, “I like to draw pictures more than I like to write stories” then you must choose one option, which one best describes you: (enumerator read options again)

Enumerator, on the student’s correct use of the scale, congratulate him/her. On the incorrect use of the scale, remind student that they can only choose one option.
