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PRELIMINARY 2005/06 LABOUR FORCE SURVEY RESULTS

1. Introduction

“The survey results revealed an overall unemployment rate of 17.6 percent. The male unemployment rate was 15.3 percent while females’ was 19.9 percent”.

This Stats Brief presents results of the 2005/06 Labour Force Survey (2005/06 LFS). The results are therefore preliminary and are subject to change. Data collection was carried out from July 2005 to June 2006. The 2005/06 LFS asked employment questions to people aged 7 years and over. The inclusion of the seven year olds was a request from Department of Labour and Social Security because they wanted to assess and evaluate the extent of child labour (if any) in Botswana.

2. Survey Objectives

The main objective of the survey was to obtain comprehensive data on the status of the labour market prevailing in Botswana.

The sample consisted of 9,720 households that were systematically selected from a fresh list of occupied households prepared at the beginning of the survey's fieldwork (i.e. listing of households for the selected Enumeration Areas).

The sample of the households covered was 9,169 (94 percent of total selected households) households nationally of which 2,623 were from cities/towns, 2,729 from urban villages and 3,817 from rural areas.

3. Major Concepts and Definitions

- Employed Persons – Persons who did some work during the reference period either for payment in cash or in kind (paid employees) or who were engaged in self employment for profit or family gain, and persons temporarily absent from these activities but definitely going to return to them (e.g. on sick leave). Some work was defined as one hour or more in the reference seven days. It should be noted that any economic work took priority over all other activities.
- Unemployed Persons – Persons who were not employed as defined above, who were available for work and took some steps to look for work in the last 30 days.

4. Survey Results

4.1 Total Population

The 2005/06 Labour force survey estimated the population at 1,702,829 persons, of which 798,460 (46.9 percent) were males and 904,369 (53.1 percent) were females (see table 2). This total of 1,702,829 is perceived accurate as it is 1.0 percent less than the projected total population of 1,719,996 for 2006 estimated through our population projection system done in 2005. The number of households was estimated at 515,294 of which 266,331 (51.7 percent) were male headed households and 248, 963 (48.3 percent) were female headed during the survey.

4.2 Employed Population

The total currently employed population was estimated at 548,594, of which 287,303 (52.4 percent) were males and 261,290 (47.6 percent) were females. Major industrial employers were Agriculture (30.9 percent), Retail (14.5 percent), Public Administration (10.9 percent) and Education (7.9 percent). The least number of employees 895 (0.2 percent) were found in Foreign Missions. (See Table 5)

Employment by occupation showed that the most common occupation was Agricultural workers (26.4 percent), followed by Elementary occupation at 18.9 percent and Service workers coming third with 16.9 percent. There are less women working as plant and machine operators (See Table 4)


Of the 548, 594 employed persons, 37,936 are children (aged 7 to 17 years old). These account for 6.9 percent of the employed population. Male Children constitute 60.9 percent of the employed children. Agriculture is the major employer of children with 66.1 percent followed by Retail Trade with 22.0 percent. Employed children constituted 8.9 percent of the children aged 7-17 years (See Table 8). Although the results shows that 6.9 were shown as workers we still need to do further analysis by hours worked to see if these children were really workers or were family helpers.

4.3 Unemployed Population

The total number of the unemployed was 114,422. Distribution by sex shows that the majority of the unemployed were women, 63,546 or 55.5 percent of the unemployed. Quite significant of these female are youth, which is those aged 12-29 years.

The survey results reveal an overall unemployment rate of 17.6 percent. The male unemployment rate is 15.3 percent while that for females is 19.9 percent. Female youth (12-29 years) unemployment rate is 31.8 percent, while that of males is 23.3. The overall youth unemployment rate is 27.4 percent (See Table 9). Table 10 shows trends of unemployment rates from 1991 to 2006.
