FOREWORD

This report has been generated from the results of the Integrated Farm Household Survey (IFHS) which collected important benchmark characteristics of farms and farming population in the country. The IFHS, with reference period July 2002 to June 2003, covered 5,920 farm households nationwide except in Batanes and Lanao del Sur. It utilized a two-stage stratified sampling design with provinces as the domain and the barangays and farm households as the primary and secondary sampling units, respectively. The sample barangays were drawn from the 1999 Barangay Screening Survey of the Bureau of Agricultural Statistics and were set at 6 for small provinces and 9 for large agricultural provinces. For each sample barangay, 10 sample farm households (i.e. those households with at least one member engaged in agricultural activities) were randomly selected using the 2000 Census of Population and Housing of the National Statistics Office.

This report puts together the statistical data that can characterize the **socio-economic conditions of farm households in CAR**. To enhance appreciation and understanding of the regional condition, the national level data are included in the presentation of statistical tables. Other details of data regarding the region are contained in the IFHS main report entitled "Socio-Economic Characteristics of Farm Households in the Philippines".

HIGHLIGHTS

Household Characteristics

- In CAR, the average size of farm households was 5.17.
- Majority or 88.20 percent of the household heads were males. The average age of household heads was 49 years.
- About 93.81 percent of household heads had formal education. Those who finished primary education comprised 12.68 percent. High school graduates accounted for 12.98 percent while 7.67 percent were degree holders.
- Farming was the main occupation of 87.23 percent of household heads. Palay farmers represented 76.28 percent of the household heads.
- Among household heads, 10.91 percent were members of organization on multi-purpose cooperative and 5.60 percent on community development.

Farm Characteristics

- Majority or 95.58 percent of the households were engaged in crop farming while 81.71 percent were in livestock and poultry raising.
- Average number of farm parcels operated by farm households was 2.68.
- Lease/rented farm parcels comprised the biggest average farm size of 0.52 hectare. Owned and tenanted farm parcels averaged 0.40 hectare and 0.48 hectare, respectively.
- More than half or 52.40 percent of total farm parcels were irrigated. Of these farm parcels 55.88 percent were serviced by communal irrigation system.
- The average inventory of farm investments was valued at P24,447. Average inventory on farm machineries accounted for 55.36 percent.

Farm Enterprise

- All farm households planted palay during the reference period. Another 62.96 percent of all farm households had grown other temporary crops while 44.14 percent planted corn.
- Backyard raising of livestock and poultry was more common among households.
- Households engaged in inland fishing accounted for 89.47 percent while those involved in gathering of shells, aquarium fish, etc., comprised 18.42 percent.

Income and Expenditure Patterns

- Annual income of households averaged P127,067. Of this amount, almost 56 percent were derived from farming. Non-farm income contributed only 29.26 percent. The remainder was derived from off-farm activities and other sources like pension, etc..
- About 87.69 percent of farm income of households were derived from crop farming. Livestock and poultry raising contributed only 11.05 percent.
- Of the total income from crop farming, 43.24 percent were derived from growing temporary crops while 36.62 percent came from growing palay.
- By enterprise, net returns in palay production stood at P33,304, P890 in livestock and poultry raising and P161 in capture fishing and aquaculture.
- Food expenditures accounted for the biggest percentage of household expenditures at 42.23 percent followed by farm expenses at 31.43 percent.
- Cereals and meat and meat preparations shared 28.02 percent and 28.10 percent in the total food expenditures, respectively. The remainder was spent for other food items.
- Recurring expenses comprised 11.43 percent of the total household expenditures while non-recurring expenses accounted for 14.91 percent.

Credit Information

- Of the total farm households, 24.19 percent availed of loans worth less than P100,000. About 59.04 percent of borrowers availed loans for agricultural production.

Access to Government Program

- Majority or 59.59 percent of farm households were familiar with government programs in crop farming. Awareness on programs for livestock and poultry raising was cited by 16.22 percent of farm households.
- Households that were benefited with programs on crop management comprised only 10.49 percent of all farming households. About 4.69 percent were recipient of animal dispersal program.
