CHAPTER

INTRODUCTION

1.1 General

Susenas (National Socio-economic Survey) was held for the first time in year 1963. In the last two decades, up to year 2010, Susenas was conducted every year. Susenas was designed to have 3 modules (Module of Household Consumption/Expenditure, Module of Education and Socio-culture, and also Module of Health and Housing) and each module should be conducted every 3 years. Household Consumption/ Expenditure Module of Susenas shall be conducted in year 2011.

To improve the accuracy of data result and in line with the increased frequency of household consumption/expenditure data request for quarterly GDP/GRDP and poverty calculation, data collection of household consumption/expenditure, it is planned that starting in 2011 it should be held quarterly. Each year, collecting data shall be conducted in March, June, September, and December.

In accordance with the 5-year cycle, in year 2012, *BPS* (Central Statistical Agency) shall have planned *Survei Biaya Hidup-SBH* (Cost of Living Survey) with the aim to generate a commodity package and a weigh diagram in the calculation of Consumer Price Index (CPI). Data of food and non-food consumption expenditures as well as household characteristics collected in SBH and Susenas has the same concept/definition, but different implementation time. In order to be more efficient in the utilization of resources of the two surveys and to have a better quality of results achieved, in year 2011 a trial of Susenas and SBH integration shall be conducted in 7 cities (Medan, Sampit, Denpasar, Kudus, Bulukumba, Tual, and South Jakarta).

Poverty data, CPI/Inflation data, GDP/GRDP are BPS strategic data that have to be released on time. Therefore, planning, field preparation, processing, and presentation of data Susenas 2011 activities and trial of integrating Susenas and SBH must be in accordance with the set schedule.

Activities of Susenas 2011 preparation shall be conducted in year 2010, covering activities of workshop/training of chief instructor with the aim to synchronize the perception toward the concept/definition as well as procedure and protocol of survey implementation. National instructor training will also be conducted in year 2010.

This book contains explanations on the implementation of Susenas 2011 that must be followed by the Heads of BPS-Province and BPS-District/City in order that data resulted is of higher quality and in accordance with the set schedule.

1.2 Purpose

In general the development of this manual is intended to provide explanations on 2011 Susenas activities to the Head of BPS-Province and Head of BPS-District/City as the accountable person and executor of 2011 Susenas activities in the regions. Susenas activities discussed in this manual among others are survey methodology, organizing trainings, processing documents, setting schedules, site implementations, site supervisions and processing data.

1.3 Scope

Implementation of 2011 Susenas covers 300.000 household samples spreading in the entire provinces and 497 Districts/Cities in Indonesia, where each quarter as many as 75 thousand households will be distributed. Data of each quarter census result can be presented both at national and provincial levels, whereas data from census implementation cumulative of four quarters can be presented up to the district/city level.

1.4 Type of Data Collected

The type of data collected by Core questionnaire (VSEN11.K) covers:

 a. General description of household members, i.e. name, relation with household head, gender, age, marital status; Information on household members who are victims of crime; Information on household members who travel; Birth certificates information; and Information on household members who attended pre-schools;

- b. Information of birthplace, residence of 5 years ago and the presence of natural mother in the household.
- c. Information on health, among others, covers the health of residents and toddlers;
- d. Information on education of household members aged 5 years and older and also access to internet;
- e. Information on employment activities of household members aged 10 years and older;
- f. Information on fertility for women who had been married and birth control for married women;
- g. Information on housing, among others, covers housing possession, drinking water sources, toilet facilities, etc.;
- h. Other socio-economic information, among others, covering utilization of poverty alleviation program facilities (free health care services, rice for the poor/raskin, health card, credit facility utilization), as well as assets and insurances of household;
- i. Information on communication and information technologies which covers possession of landline phones, cellular phones (HP), total cellular phone numbers and computer possession;

Type of data collected by the questionnaire of Consumption Module (VSEN11.M) covers:

- a. Information on quantities and values of food, drink, and tobacco consumption both from buying and own production or gifts. Consumption on food, drink and tobacco covers 215 commodities divided into 14 groups;
- b. Information on household expenditures for non-food goods covers groups of housing and household facilities, various goods and services, clothing, footwear and headgear, durable goods, tax, collection, and insurance, as well as expenditure for parties and ceremonies. Non-food consumption includes 108 details divided into 6 groups.

1.5 Schedule

2011 Susenas implementation includes various activities conducted in Central BPS and in the regions. Its activity and schedule includes all activities from preparation to publication, as follows:



1.8 Statistic Result

Statistics resulted from Susenas 2011 among others are statistics/indicators of people's welfare, consumption pattern, and household expenditures.

1. Statistic/Indicator of People's Welfare (Kesra)

Kesra Statistic/Indicator that can be formulated from core data collection among others is Number of School Participation, Average Length/Years of School, Literacy Rate (education sector); Number of Sickness (health sector), Average Age at First Marriage, Number of Family Planning Participation (fertility sector); Average of Housing Floor Area per capita, Percentage of Drinking Water Utilization (housing sector); etc.

2. Consumption and Expenditure

Statistic that can be formulated from data collection of consumption model, among others, the average of people's spending detailed by the type of food and non food consumption, the average of people's consumption detailed by type of food, the average of calories and proteins consumption, Gini ratio figure, publication of total poor citizens titled Analysis and Calculation of Poverty Level and also Data and Information of Poverty by Sub-Directorate of Social Insecurity Statistic, Directorate of Social Resilience.

3. Others

1.9 Financing

All costs of survey activities shall be allocated to BPS budget. Details of Central BPS costs are included in *POK* (Operational Guidance Activities) of Sub Directorate of Household Statistic, Directorate of People's Welfare Statistic. Details of regional costs are included in *DIPA* (Budget Implementation Entry List) of BPS-Province and BPS-District/City.
