## What is a household survey and why is it conducted?

Household survey is carried out as part of governmental statistics, with the purpose of examining the welfare, income and expenditure of households residing in Estonia and identifying any changes and developments. Household surveys have been run in Estonia since the 1930s and this survey is a continuation to the Household Income and Consumption Survey, launched by the Statistical Office of Estonia in 1995.
The results of household surveys help to determine several socially relevant indicators, including the living standard, the consumer price index and the poverty line.
Your household has been randomly selected for the survey. This means that you have been chosen to represent nearly eight hundred similar Estonian households. Your participation will guarantee the success of the survey, and will contribute to the extent to which the problems of your kind of households are acknowledged in Estonia today.
The Statistical Office of Estonia will treat any information you disclose in strict confidence.
The results of the survey will be used only in a generalised form, in accordance with the laws protecting personal information in Estonia.

## For the interviewer

The questionnaire consists of four parts.

- Part A - The structure of the household and general information
- Part B - General information on the members of the household
- Part C - the household's dwelling
- Part D - The immovable and movable property of the household

Part B consists of a table over four pages with one row for every household member (including CHILDREN, AGED PEOPLE AND ABSENT HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS). IF THE HOUSEHOLD CONSISTS OF MORE THAN SIX MEMBERS, USE THE SUPPLEMENTARY SHEETS.
THE MAJORITY OF THE QUESTIONS HAVE READY ANSWER VERSIONS. IF A QUESTION HAS MORE THAN TWO ANSWER VERSIONS GIVEN, A CARD IS MADE FOR FACILITATING THE ANSWERING. AN ICONIC SYMBOL OF A SUN (安) IN THE FIRST COLUMN OF THE TABLE REMINDS YOU OF THE CARD. DRAW THE ATTENTION OF THE RESPONDENT TO THE CARD!
Now we introduce you the rules to be followed in answering the different type of questions in the QUESTIONNAIRE.

1. The largest number of questions have possible answers given as a numbered list in the QUESTIONNAIRE (E.G. A11, B2, C1). FOR EACH OF SUCH QUESTION YOU MUST ASK THE RESPONDENT TO CHOOSE only one version. Exceptions here are questions B16 and C13-C18, where special instructions are given.

- In filling in the part A, C And D, you must encircle the number of the version the respondent chose.
- in part B, write the number of the correct version in this cell of the table, which carries the NUMBER OR NAME OF THE CORRESPONDING HOUSEHOLD MEMBER.

2. Some of the questions (e.g. B3, C9) consist of several sub-questions. These sub-questions are denored by letters ( $\mathbf{a}, \mathbf{b}, \mathbf{c}, \ldots$ ). The sub/Question use the same set of answers written in the heading of the small table. The columns of the table contain the numbers of the listed answers. Encircle THE CORRECT NUMBER IN EVERY ROW. ONLY ONE NUMBER MUST BE ENCIRCLED IN EVERY ROW!

## A. THE STRUCTURE OF THE HOUSEHOLD AND GENERAL INFORMATION

The household consists of persons who share a dwelling, i.e. live at the same address, and use common monetary and/or food resources. Persons belonging to a household are referred to as the members of the household (the members). A household may also consist of one person living alone. Institutional households (persons who live in prisons, monasteries, old-age house etc.) isn't counted to the set of households.

The reference member is an adult member of the household who contributes the largest income to the household.

A person's main dwelling is the dwelling where he/she has, for a considerable period of time, spent most of his/her spare time, including sleeping time. For a married or cohabiting person, the main dwelling is the dwelling where he/she stays for most of the time he/she spends with his/her partner and/or children.

An absent member is a person belonging to the household who temporarily does not share the household's main dwelling, but is still financially related to the other members. A member who lives separately usually does not have a separate non-institutional dwelling of his/her own.
