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PREFACE

The Report is on the Core Welfare Indicators Questionnaire (CWIQ) Pilot Survey, which was undertaken by Statistics Sierra Leone from 25 February to 4 March 2007. It embodies the results of data collection and the problems that were experienced during the collection of the data. The main purposes of the CWIQ Pilot Survey were: (a) to test the feasibility of the survey instruments and methodology in preparation for the CWIQ Main Survey to be undertaken on a national scale beginning 1st April 2007; (b) to test the field logistics and make necessary adjustments to the Main Survey logistics; and (c) to detect data processing errors and make necessary adjustments to the training programme for the CWIQ Main Survey with the objective of minimizing data processing errors. In addition the data would be used to test the tabulation plan for the main survey.

The CWIQ survey is designed to produce indicators of social welfare in a cheaper and more regular way to provide instrument for the continuous monitoring of poverty alleviation programmes. The objective of the CWIQ is to provide poverty indicators for monitoring the Sierra Leone Poverty Reduction Strategy. The traditional way of assessing poverty is through consumer expenditure surveys. These surveys are usually very costly and do not take place too frequently. Hence there is a considerable lag in the time the data is collected and made available for use.

It was against this background of need for timely and reliable data that the CWIQ methodology was adopted and developed to collect information on indicators, which measure access, utilization and satisfaction with social services on a single visit to households. The CWIQ design eliminates keyboard entry of data. This makes it possible for data processing to keep pace with data collection. In this respect, timely release of data is achieved in a remarkable way.

The Department for International Development (DFID) provided financial assistance for the CWIQ Pilot and Main Surveys. The World Bank provided technical assistance for the implementation of the two surveys. All this assistance is very much appreciated by the Government of Sierra Leone.

Two SSL Consultants, Mr. Yaw Antwi-Adjei, Data Processing, and Mr. Enock F. Ching'anda, Survey Statistician, worked with the staff of Statistics Sierra Leone Office to implement the Pilot Survey. Mr. James Otto, World Bank Data Processing Consultant joined the team and assisted in processing the CWIQ Pilot Survey data.

CHAPTER ONE – INTRODUCTION

1.1 Scope and Coverage

The CWIQ Pilot Survey was designed to cover all Regions and Local Council areas in Sierra Leone. Two Enumeration Areas were randomly selected in each Local Council (LC). This enabled the coverage of rural and urban areas in the country.

The survey was primarily designed to capture household information on the subject areas A-K listed below. The questions covering each subject area were put together and constituted a survey module. The modules A-K are as follows:

- A - Interview Information
- B - List of Household Members
- C - Education
- D - Health
- E - Employment
- F - Household Assets
- G - Household Amenities
- H - Poverty Predictors
- I - Children Under Five
- J - Maternal Child Health
- K - Agriculture

1.2 Sample Design

In 2004, Statistics Sierra Leone conducted a Pilot Survey to determine the CWIQ suitability as a national poverty-monitoring instrument that could provide benchmark and annual progress information on poverty reduction at an affordable level in Sierra Leone. This Pilot Survey used the generic CWIQ. The present Pilot Survey was conducted to test the feasibility of the newly designed questionnaire that includes other modules that were not tested in the previous pilot. In addition, this Pilot Survey tested the logistics associated with a large scale survey conducted in the whole country as opposed to the two districts (The Western

Area and Kono District), that were used for the 2004 pilot.

The 2007 CWIQ Pilot Survey was carried out on a sample of 570 households located in the 38 survey Enumeration Areas (EAs)/Clusters. The survey was based on a two stage

sampling design using existing Statistics Sierra Leone sample frames and December 2004 Sierra Leone Population and Housing Census, household listings. Two EAs were selected from each LC. It should be stated that some of these LCs are rural areas while some are urban areas. In each LC, the first stage of sampling was a selection of two EA's. At the second stage, 15 households were selected per EA/cluster for inclusion in the sample. The selection included additional households, as substitutes, in each cluster to take into account households that may have moved between the time of the census (December 2004) and March 2007.

1.3 Distribution of Clusters, Local Councils and Households by Region

1.4 Survey Instruments

The main instrument for the data collection was the draft CWIQ. This questionnaire was initially drafted by a Consultant of the World Bank in February 2006. The questionnaire was modified further following consultations that took

place between the World Bank and the Government of Sierra Leone. A technical committee was established by the Government of Sierra Leone that included staff from Statistics Sierra Leone to examine the questionnaire further. A draft Interviewer Training Manual was prepared by the Survey Statistician Consultant soon upon his arrival in Freetown on 13 February 2007. In the preparation of this Training Manual, the Consultant used the CWIQ generic manual and adapted it to the local conditions in Sierra Leone. This Manual served as the main instruction instrument in the training of Interviewers. Also, the Survey Statistician consultant prepared the Draft Supervisors Manual using the CWIQ generic supervisors Manual. Height boards and mother and child weighing scale supplied by SSL, were used to measure the height and weight of children under-5 years respectively. Clipboards were supplied to the field staff for easy handling of the questionnaires while note pads were supplied to enable them take notes on some important aspects of the survey i.e. interview appointments with households, etc.

1.5 Training

A 5-day CWIQ Pilot Survey Interviewer training programme was undertaken in the Conference room of SSL head office in Freetown from 19 to 23 February 2007. The participants were selected from SSL staff. The objective was to train them as enumerators for the Pilot Survey and appoint them as Supervisors for the Main Survey. Also included in the training programme were 6 SSL Data Processing staff that were selected to participate in the verification and data processing of the CWIQ Pilot and Main Survey data. It was considered important for them to participate so that they can undertake their task more efficiently.

The trainees were taken through the general overview of CWIQ, how to complete the questionnaire, mock

interviews and field practices. Since all the trainees were permanent staff of SSL, they were already familiar with field survey operations including interviewing techniques. The training programme also included a demonstration on how to carry out anthropometric measurements of children under-5. The testing of salt for iodine was also demonstrated. Both the mock interviews, that were conducted in the training room and field practice that was undertaken on the fourth day of training, gave the trainees an opportunity to practice filling the questionnaire.

1.6 Fieldwork Arrangement

The fieldwork was conducted using a roving team arrangement. Four teams each made up of 4 Interviewers and one Supervisor were used for data collection. Each team then moved in a roving manner but under the control of the Team Supervisor. Generally, each team covered 10 Enumeration Area's. Thus for the total of 38 EA's enumerated, 20 field staff were used (4 supervisors and 16 interviewers).

On the average, an enumerator conducted 3 household interviews per day. Each enumerator therefore completed on average 24 interviews during the Pilot Survey. The fieldwork was completed within 8 days, 25 February to 4 March 2007.

1.7 Quality Control Measures and Return of Completed Questionnaires:

Apart from the training, two other measures were put in place to control the quality of the data, especially at the data collection stage. The first concerned the work of the supervisors. Apart from coordinating the work of their teams, they also had responsibility for quality control. This they did through direct observation of and assistance given to the enumerators under them and also by

editing or reviewing completed questionnaires before finally submitting them to the SSL head office for data processing. Due to the short period of the Pilot Survey, there was no provision for the completed questionnaires to be transmitted to the SSL head office while the survey was in progress

Two Clusters near Freetown were visited by the Survey Statistician Consultant and he managed to bring to SSL head office, completed questionnaires for two EAs which were handed over to the Data processing team. This supervision trip took place on the fourth day of data collection. Also, the Survey Coordinator visited the other three teams to monitor the survey operation and solve any logistical problems faced by the teams.

1.8 Data Processing System

The key to producing fast, accurate and useful survey results is a well designed, tested and documented data processing system ready to process questionnaires as they arrive from the field.

The CWIQ data processing system resembles a typical survey data processing system with three main steps: data entry, validation and tabulation. However, the CWIQ system has some unique characteristics:

First, the questionnaire has been designed to be processed using optical scanners, eliminating the need for manually keying data;

Second, the system uses a relational database management system (Microsoft Access) to store the survey data instead of text or proprietary file formats; and

Third, the system has been programmed in a general purpose programming language (Microsoft Visual Basic for Applications) instead of a generalized survey data processing package.

A principal objective of the CWIQ is to produce publication ready tables within one month of the end of fieldwork. To achieve this, data processing must begin two days after the start of fieldwork. Thus, data processing is carried out concurrently with fieldwork. This enables the Data Processing (DP) team to send feedback to the interviewers whilst still in the field in order to reduce possible data capture errors from the field.

The DP team is responsible for handling the survey questionnaires from the time they arrive from the field until they are stored in the survey archive.

1.8.1 Data Processing Hardware and Software

The CWIQ pre-test survey data processing centre was set up in the Conference Room of SSL head office in Freetown.

The DP team was made up of six office staff consisted of one programmer and five data entry operators under the direction of the Data Processing Consultant.

The following hardware and software were used:

1. Hardware
 - a) One duplex optical scanner - 15 ppm
 - b) Hp 2015 Laser printer
 - c) One Laptop
 - d) One Desktop computer
2. Software
 - a) TELEform – Automated Data Capture software
 - b) Microsoft Access
 - c) Microsoft Excel
 - d) Visual Basic for Applications
 - e) Adobe Acrobat

The scanner was connected to the Laptop which had the TELEform software as well as the drivers for the scanner.

The CWIQ main database and analysis system was installed on the desktop computer which was also connected to the printer.

Both machines had Microsoft Office 2002 and Adobe Acrobat 7.0 installed.

1.8.2 DP Team Training

The DP team had training in TELEform to enable them design professionally automated survey or census questionnaire using TELEform Designer. During the training each member of the team had the opportunity to modify the CWIQ generic questionnaire, test the auto-export routine and subsequently print the questionnaire for fieldwork.

Printing was done from both TELEform and Adobe Acrobat and covered why Adobe is a better option. The TELEform Print Manager was also introduced as an option when there is the need to pre-print the Page-link field of a questionnaire just like the Reference Number on the CWIQ questionnaire.

The team learnt how to evaluate and verify questionnaires using both TELEform Reader and Verifier.

The team also had training on how to use the CWIQ Data Processing System designed in Microsoft Access and Visual Basic for Applications. This part of the training covered areas such as:

- ❖ Principles of Relational Database Design;
- ❖ Identification of objects/entities in a problem statement using the CWIQ questionnaire as an example;
- ❖ Creating database objects in Microsoft Access;
- ❖ Creating relationships between objects in a relational database;
- ❖ Converting data into the main CWIQ database; and

- ❖ Validating the converted data to make sure that the consistency checks in the questionnaire have been followed.

1.8.3 The Questionnaire

The questionnaire for the pre-test was an adaptation of the generic CWIQ questionnaire designed in the year 2006. The generic questionnaire is made up of modules A-I which together make up the nine page questionnaire.

Two new modules (J and K) were added to the nine page generic questionnaire to make it a fourteen page questionnaire.

Apart from the new modules, there were changes in all the existing modules. For example, questions A.8 and A.9 were moved from the last page to the front page and question D.1 moved from module D to the new module J.

1.8.4 Finalising Pilot Questionnaire

During the interviewer training for the pre-test it became necessary to make changes to the questionnaire to correct wrong skips, wording and also to incorporate hand printing instructions. SSL's logo and address were also inserted on the front page.

After the modifications, the questionnaire was tested to make sure that TELEform Reader will be able to evaluate the returned questionnaires. This was done by scanning a couple of blank questionnaires to make sure that the system can identify the correct template to use for evaluation.

After this, a Portable Document Format (.pdf) version was printed using Adobe Acrobat and given to the commercial printer to print ten copies for testing to make sure that the commercial printer can produce copies for the fieldwork. This became necessary as the automation requires that the

questionnaires are printed according to certain procedures and standards.

The sample copies submitted by the commercial printer for evaluation were filled-in by the data processing team and scanned. Apart from making sure that the commercial printer has the ability to print questionnaires that will be recognised by the automated data capture software, it was also to test the export routines to make sure that the system will send the data to the appropriate fields in the CWIQ temporary database for subsequent conversion into the main CWIQ database for analysis.

1.8.5 Data Processing

Processing of actual pre-test questionnaires started on the third day after the start of the fieldwork. Unfortunately, with exception of the questionnaires from two EAs in the Western Area near Freetown that were received on the fourth day of the fieldwork nothing came in again till a day after the fieldwork had been completed.

The procedure for the field data processing involved:

- ❖ Reception of questionnaire;
- ❖ Data preparation;
- ❖ Scanning and evaluation;
- ❖ Verification and committing;
- ❖ Conversion of data; and
- ❖ Validation of data.

1.8.6 Reception of Questionnaire

The CWIQ Data Processing system is designed to process returned questionnaires EA-by-EA. In other words, each EA is treated as a separate batch.

In view of this approach, questionnaires were received at the data processing

room EA-by-EA with questionnaires for a particular EA put together in a plastic carrying case. When an EA package arrives from the field it is checked and logged in by a member of the DP team using the Questionnaire Arrival Form (See Appendix B).

Among the data entries made on the Questionnaire Arrival Form are:

- ❖ Arrival date;
- ❖ Number of questionnaires in the package; and
- ❖ Number of households.

1.8.7 Data Preparation

Data preparation is the stage in the CWIQ Data Processing where the questionnaires are made ready and put into the optical scanner for scanning and evaluation of the images.

The stage requires that a member of the DP team performs the following:

- ❖ Making sure that all the fourteen pages are present;
- ❖ Making sure that there are no “foreign pages” in the questionnaire. A foreign page is a page in the questionnaire that has a different template number from the expected;
- ❖ Check thoroughly to make sure that each page in each questionnaire has the correct reference number printed on top of all the pages;
- ❖ Manual edit of the cover page (Section A) of the questionnaire;
- ❖ Removal of staple pins and the straightening of the edges of the pages in the questionnaire making them ready to be placed in the automatic document feeder of the optical scanner;
- ❖ Filing of the Scanning Log Sheet (See Appendix C); and
- ❖ Start the scanning process.

After all questionnaire for a particular EA has been scanned and accepted

TELEform Reader will then evaluate the images and subsequently send the batch to the TELEform Verifier for possible verification of questionable responses and final transfer of the data into the CWIQ temporary database (CWIQtemp.mdb) that sits between the CWIQ main database and analysis system and the TELEform data capture software. Verified data was committed or transferred from TELEform into the CWIQtemp.mdb database EA-by-EA. No two EAs were transferred to the same CWIQtemp.mdb database at the same time.

The verifier operator also fills the Verification Log Sheet (See Appendix D) so that everyone in the team knows which batches and for that matter EAs have been verified and committed and the number of households in the EA.

1.8.8 Conversion of Data into the Main Database

Since the two computers used were not networked, flash disks were used to copy the CWIQtemp.mdb database from the laptop and then imported into the main CWIQ database called CWIQData.mdb for all subsequent processing starting with the conversion of the data into the various tables designed in Microsoft Access to hold the responses for the individual modules.

The data in the CWIQtemp.mdb only gets converted after all Conversion errors such as incorrect reference number and wrong EA Numbers (A1) are corrected.

1.8.9 Validation Corrections

The purpose of validation is to produce a survey database suitable for analysis. Such a database must be complete, logically consistent and include documentation of any exceptional conditions present in the data.

The validation program checks the data for each household to insure that:

- ❖ All appropriate questions were asked and have valid responses;
- ❖ No extraneous questions were asked; and
- ❖ Responses are logically consistent.

If the program detects any exceptions, it will prepare an exception report showing the data from the questionnaire and error codes identifying the exceptions. This report is then compared to the questionnaire to determine the reason for each exception. The validation error correction manual lists all possible exceptions with a detailed explanation of the cause and suggestions for correction. In general, the correction process consists of checking the responses in the questionnaire and verifying that they were properly recorded and scanned.

The validation was repeated after the corrections were entered until all errors were eliminated.

1.9 Sample Achieved

Out of 570 household canvassed almost all of the households were successfully interviewed. Of this, the response rate of the original household interviewed is about 85.1%. The non-responses were largely due outright refusal (0.4%) and those not found (14.6%). The percentage not found was high due mainly to the fact that the household list frame was not updated before the pilot survey. The household list was established just before the December 2004 Sierra Leone Population and Housing Census. The interview results and average interview time by sector, region and local council of residence are available in Appendix E Table 1.1.

CHAPTER TWO – PILOT SURVEY EXPERIENCE

2.1 Introduction

This Chapter contains discussions held at the debriefing session which was held on 7 March 2007 at the SSL headquarters. Present at the meeting were the Interviewer's and Supervisor's who participated in the CWIQ Pilot Survey, the Survey Coordinator, Survey Statistician Consultant, Data Processing Consultant and a World Bank Representative. Also present were the SSL Data Processing Assistants selected to undertake the data processing of the CWIQ Pilot and Main Surveys.

2.2 Field Experience

In the area of transport, it was reported by most of the teams that fuel cost was underestimated and that there was need to estimate fuel allocations by taking into account distances and the movement of the team within the District or Local Council areas.

There were no problems in finding accommodation in the rural areas. Problems were experienced in the urban areas particularly regarding the cost of accommodation.

On identifying Enumeration Areas (EAs), the teams found the Geographic Information System (GIS) maps very useful. GIS maps were not provided for some areas and as such it was difficult to identify the EAs for those areas. Some EAs were inaccessible due to lack of bridges or broken bridges and as such the Interviewers had to walk long distances to those EAs. In Bo district, they had to use a boat to access some EAs.

Regarding locating households within the EA, there were no serious problems except in urban areas where no proper street address was indicated. Some households could not be located due to

migration particularly in the diamond mining area. It was estimated that up to 80 per cent of the households were located in most of the areas. In some areas,

households were scattered and as such Interviewers had to walk some distances to reach the household locations.

On publicity, it was emphasised that this was important and should be done for the main survey. It was identified that the radio was one of the most effective ways of publicising the survey at all levels of the community. This would reduce Interviewer difficulties in convincing some households on the objectives of the survey and that the sample was indeed random.

It was stated that the number of households to be interviewed should be kept small. An Interviewer interviewing five households per day was too much while if the number is reduced to three household, an interviewer will be in a position to do a good job.

Transportation of height boards and scales within an EA for recording child's weight and height as required in Section I of the questionnaire was thought to be a problem. This was the case in areas where the households were scattered. A request was made for some allowance to be given for hiring people to carry these height boards and scales. On the number of height boards and scales per team, it was stated that efforts would be made to increase the number of these items.

On replacement of Interviewers that may fall sick in the field, it was stated that provision will be made for some relief Interviewers for the survey in the SSL office in Freetown.

With respect to interviewing time, the agricultural module contributed to the

increase in interviewing time particularly in the rural areas.

On the replacement of households that could not be found in the EA, in most of the areas, replacements did not exceed the number of replacement households. For the EAs where the replacement households were exhausted, the supervisor undertook a random selection of additional households for interview to satisfy the required number of 15 households per EA.

The question of DSA rates during the main CWIQ survey was clarified for the both the Interviewers and Supervisors.

2.3 Interviewers Experience in Filling Questionnaires

a) Inconsistency in the sequence of responses to questions on the comparison of total income or income from sales, land owned, other land used, quantity harvested, etc. was observed on the CWIQ pilot questionnaire. An example was given in the case of questions K.22 and K.15. It was stated that that would be corrected.

b) A request was made to increase the space between bubbles in some questions of the questionnaire.

c) A request was made for the filter instruction in C.1 to stand alone and C.1 to be attached to the question. It was felt that this change would minimise Interviewer errors.

d) The skip instruction in question C.2 was changed from "IF C.2 RESPONSE IS NO GO TO C.10" to "IF C.2 IS NO AND [NAME] IS BELOW 19 YEARS GO TO C.10, ELSE GO TO NEXT PERSON". It was felt that this change would minimise Interviewer errors.

e) In questions C.3, the issue of present education codes and their

equivalences due to the changing education system in the country over time was discussed. It was agreed to include in the Interviewer's manual a table that shows those equivalences.

f) In question D.6, it was agreed to change the response "Self paid" to "Household paid".

g) Question F.8 included the item "Bed". It was agreed to shade the bubble if a household says it has a bed in working condition and not to engage in a discussion about type of bed etc.

h) In question F.14, it was agreed to record the distances in miles to the nearest rounded-up whole number.

i) In question H.2, the household purchase of a gas lighter instead of matches was raised. It was agreed not to conclude the discussion on this topic until it was verified that the Sierra Leone Integrated Household Survey justified the inclusion or substitution of this item. It was later concluded that if the item was becoming popular it can be substituted for matches and that an explanation could be included in the Interviewer's Manual or explained during the Interviewer's training.

j) In question H.3, the household purchase of Paracetamol instead of Aspirin was raised. It was agreed not to conclude the discussion on this until it was verified that the Sierra Leone Integrated Household Survey justified the inclusion or substitution of this item. It was later concluded that this can be included as a substitute for Aspirin. An explanation could be included in the Interviewer's Manual or explained during the Interviewer's training.

k) In question I.8 it was agreed to shade the No bubble for the Don't know response.

l) The Don't know response in question J.5 to change from code 98 to

code 88, to make it easier and maintain similarity with the response to the Don't know response in question J.7.

m) In question I.12, it was agreed to add to the list of responses "Other".

n) In question I.14, it was agreed to add to the list of responses "Other". This was later reversed to remain the same as in the original questionnaire.

o) In question K.34, it was agreed to include lack of finance under code 03 to read "Lack of finance/credit".

2.4 Supervisor's Experience in Checking Questionnaires

a) In printing a number in the box or shading the bubble, some Interviewers were exceeding the boundary of the box or bubble.

b) Some interviewer's had a handwriting problem, an 8 appeared like a 6.

c) Interviewer's had problems obeying the Filter and Skip instructions e.g. question C.1 and C.2.

d) Time of interviewing varied greatly between interviewers.

e) The **REFERENCE NUMBER** was missing on pages of the questionnaires submitted by some Interviewer's.

f) The shading of a bubble did not fill the full bubble and appeared like a dot inside the bubble.

g) There was inconsistency between the under-five child weight and height in one case. The Supervisor undertook to check it and discovered that the child in that case was sick.

h) It was agreed unanimously to introduce the Skip instruction(s) in Section K of the questionnaire to cater for

households that were engaged in Tree or Plant crops only or Owned Animals only and households that were not involved in both Tree or Plant crops and Owing Animals.

i) Problems with questions C.1 and C.2 were highlighted by the supervisors.

j) A good number of Interviewer's forgot to complete questions A.8 and A.9.

k) Although the instruction was given to use the 12 hour clock in the CWIQ, some Interviewer's used the 24 hour clock.

j) Completion of questions E.1 was a problem for some Interviewer's. They completed question E.1 for children under 5, which is wrong.

k) Inconsistencies were observed in the data reported under questions K.6 and K.7

l) Inconsistencies were also observed in the data reported in question B.4 and the Section J MCH information.

2.5 Data Processing

This sections concerns observations made by the CWIQ data processing section at the SSL.

a) The **REFERENCE NUMBER** was missing in most of the questionnaire.

b) Section B, questions B.1-B.4 should be responded to by every single person in the household.

c) The Skip instruction in question C.2 was changed and agreed to by the team.

d) Question C.1 was being asked to everyone in the household when in fact it is meant for persons aged 15 years and above (Adult literacy).

e) Questions D.1 and D.2 are to be asked to everybody in the household. The scanning showed empty bubbles in some questionnaires.

f) Section E: Although not applicable to persons below 5 years, Interviewer's asked the questions to persons below 5 years. One way of avoiding this mistake is to mark those persons eligible to be asked questions in Sections C, E, I, and J once section B is completed. In this connection it was agreed to move the question code E.1 to be aligned with the question **Did [Name] do any type of work in the last 7 days, even if only for one hour?**

g) Question E.6, the classification was adopted from that used in the South African Census. It was agreed to leave it as it is and to include other services such as teachers, health

workers, civil servants, etc. under community services. The classification takes care of the private sector.

h) Sections F, G and H had no serious problems.

i) It was emphasized that in Section I as well as B.4, the age of the child is as at the date of interview.

j) Question I.1 demonstrated hand printing problems of the zero "0".

k) Question I.11, the Skip instruction should remain **GO TO I.13**.

l) It was agreed that in Section A, leading zeros should be included. Except for the **REFERENCE NUMBER**, this should not have a leading zero.

m) It was agreed that Question K.14 should include two additional response codes 5=Boat and 6=Other.

n) It was agreed that responses to question K.22 will be aligned with the

responses to other similar questions i.e. K.15.

o) Question A.8 was not completed by many Interviewer's.

p) It was agreed that in the case of household that refused to be interviewed, Supervisors will have to explain under **Comments** in Section A, page 1 of the questionnaire. The same is true in the case of those households that moved outside the EA, etc.

q) The cancellation of wrong entries in a box or the wrong bubble shaded was explained

r) Some interviewer's left out the shading of AM or PM bubble in question A.9.

s) A demonstration on the way the computer reads numbers, cancellations, etc. was given using a projector.

2.6 Any Other Business

a) It was mentioned that the training for the household Lister's of the 520 EAs of the CWIQ main survey would take place from 12 to 13 March 2007.

b) The Lister's would be despatched to the field soon after training.

c) Interviewer's and Supervisors training for the CWIQ Survey would begin on 19 March 2007 and would last two weeks.

CHAPTER THREE – PILOT SURVEY RESULTS

3.1 Introduction

The results of the CWIQ Pilot Survey were five fold:

A. Finalisation of the CWIQ questionnaire reflecting changes agreed to by the CWIQ Technical Committee;

B. Finalisation of the Interviewer's and Supervisor's Manuals for the CWIQ Main Survey;

C. Contribution to planning and logistics for the CWIQ Main Survey;

D. Training SSL Data Processing Assistants on the scanning and validation of errors.

E. Provide data for the sampled households in the CWIQ Pilot Survey. These data could assist in the testing the tabulation plan for the CWIQ Main Survey.

3.2 The Pilot and Final Questionnaires

3.3 Interviewer's and Supervisor's Manuals

3.4 Contribution to Planning and Logistics for the CWIQ Main Survey

Sections 2.1 to 2.4 of this report contain elements that are useful in further planning of the CWIQ Survey and its Logistics to ensure smooth implementation.

3.5 Training Statistics Sierra Leone Data Processing Assistants

As mentioned earlier, in addition to their participation in the general CWIQ pilot survey training, the Data Processing Assistants were also trained by the Data Processing Consultant on scanning, validation of errors and handling of the questionnaires, etc.

3.6 Data for Sampled Pilot Survey Households

CHAPTER FOUR – PILOT SURVEY RECOMMENDATIONS

- a) Completed questionnaires of the CWIQ main survey should be returned to SSL Data processing section frequently and not wait for the survey to come to an end;
- b) Vehicle fuel allowance should take into account both the distance from Freetown to the District/Local Council and the movement within the District/Local Council;
- c) The SSL GIS Section should ensure availability of EA maps for the selected 520 EAs to ensure easy identification;
- d) The household listing form for the CWIQ main survey should, where there are no street names, include a description of features that would enable easy identification;
- e) To ensure cooperation of households, publicity of the CWIQ main survey was critical;
- f) To enable flexibility in the measurement of children, the number of scales and height boards should be increased;
- g) To include in the Interviewer's manual a table that shows education grades equivalences for the current education system and the previous education systems in Sierra Leone.
- h) A number of questions should be adjusted in terms of changing or adding words or increasing space between bubbles, to reflect pre-test findings.
- i) During the CWIQ main survey training, hand printing, shading of bubbles and filter and skip instructions should be emphasized;
- j) To introduce skip instruction(s) in Module K to take care of those households not engaged in agriculture, those engaged in crop farming only, livestock farming only and both crop and livestock farming.
- k) To reduce scanning errors for zeros, to eliminate the printing of the leading zeros in all Modules except Module A, household member number and in a few selected responses to questions;
- l) Changes made to the Pilot survey questionnaire as described in Chapter two and three of this report should be reflected in the CWIQ for the main survey.
- m) Interviewer's and Supervisor's Manuals for the CWIQ main survey should take into account recommendations on changes to the CWIQ pilot survey questionnaire.
