<p><i>Level of presentation: India / State / District / City</i>  <i>New Table in 2001 Census</i></p> <p>This table gives the cross classification of households by the number of married couples and the number of dwelling rooms available with the household; total number of married couples and the number of married couples having independent sleeping rooms. Households are classified into six types according to the number of married couples present in the household. These are: households with no married couple (none), 1 married couple, 2 married couples, 3 married couples, 4 married couples and 5 or more married couples. These households are further grouped according to the number of dwelling rooms (no exclusive room, one room, two rooms, three rooms, four rooms and five rooms or more), total number of married couples and number of married couples that have independent room for sleeping. This is a new table that gives an idea of the privacy available to the married couples. These data were not collected for institutional households and as such institutional households are not included in this table. The data in this table are presented for total, rural and urban areas separately.</p> <p>The city level data are available only in electronic format.</p>
