I. Objectives

This survey was designed to achieve the following objectives:

- Assist the World Bank Group in gaining a better understanding of how stakeholders in Myanmar perceive the Bank Group;
- Obtain systematic feedback from stakeholders in Myanmar regarding:
 - Their views regarding the general environment in Myanmar;
 - Their overall attitudes toward the World Bank Group in Myanmar;
 - Overall impressions of the World Bank Group's operations, knowledge work and activities, and communication and information sharing in Myanmar;
 - Perceptions of the World Bank Group's future role in Myanmar.
- Use data to help inform Myanmar country team's strategy.

II. Methodology

Between June and August 2014, 662 stakeholders of the World Bank Group in Myanmar were invited to provide their opinions on the WBG's work in the country by participating in a country opinion survey. Participants were drawn from the office of the President, Prime Minister; office of a minister; office of a parliamentarian; ministries/ministerial departments; consultants/contractors working on WBG-supported projects/programs; PMUs overseeing implementation of a project; local government officials; bilateral and multilateral agencies; private sector organizations; private foundations; the financial sector/private banks; NGOs; community based organizations; the media; independent government institutions; trade unions; faith-based groups; academia/research institutes/think tanks; judiciary branch; and other organizations. A total of 173 stakeholders participated in the survey (26% response rate).

Respondents received and returned questionnaires through the courier service. Respondents were asked about: general issues facing Myanmar; their overall attitudes toward the WBG; the WBG's importance and results; the WBG's knowledge work and activities; the WBG's future role in Myanmar; and the WBG's communication and information sharing.

Every country that engages in the Country Opinion Survey must include specific indicator questions that will be aggregated for the World Bank Group's annual Corporate Scorecard. These questions are identified throughout the survey report.

- A. General Issues Facing Myanmar: Respondents were asked to indicate whether Myanmar is headed in the right direction, what they thought were the top three most important development priorities, which areas the government should focus on, which areas would contribute most to reducing poverty and generating economic growth in Myanmar, and how "shared prosperity" would be best achieved.
- B. Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group (WBG): Respondents were asked to rate their familiarity with the WBG, its effectiveness in Myanmar, WBG staff preparedness to help Myanmar solve its development challenges, WBG's local presence, WBG's capacity building in Myanmar, their agreement with various statements regarding the WBG's work, and the extent to which the WBG is an effective development partner. Respondents were asked to indicate the WBG's greatest values and weaknesses, the most effective instruments in helping reduce poverty in Myanmar, in which sectoral areas the WBG should focus most of its resources (financial and knowledge services), and to which groups the institution should reach out more.

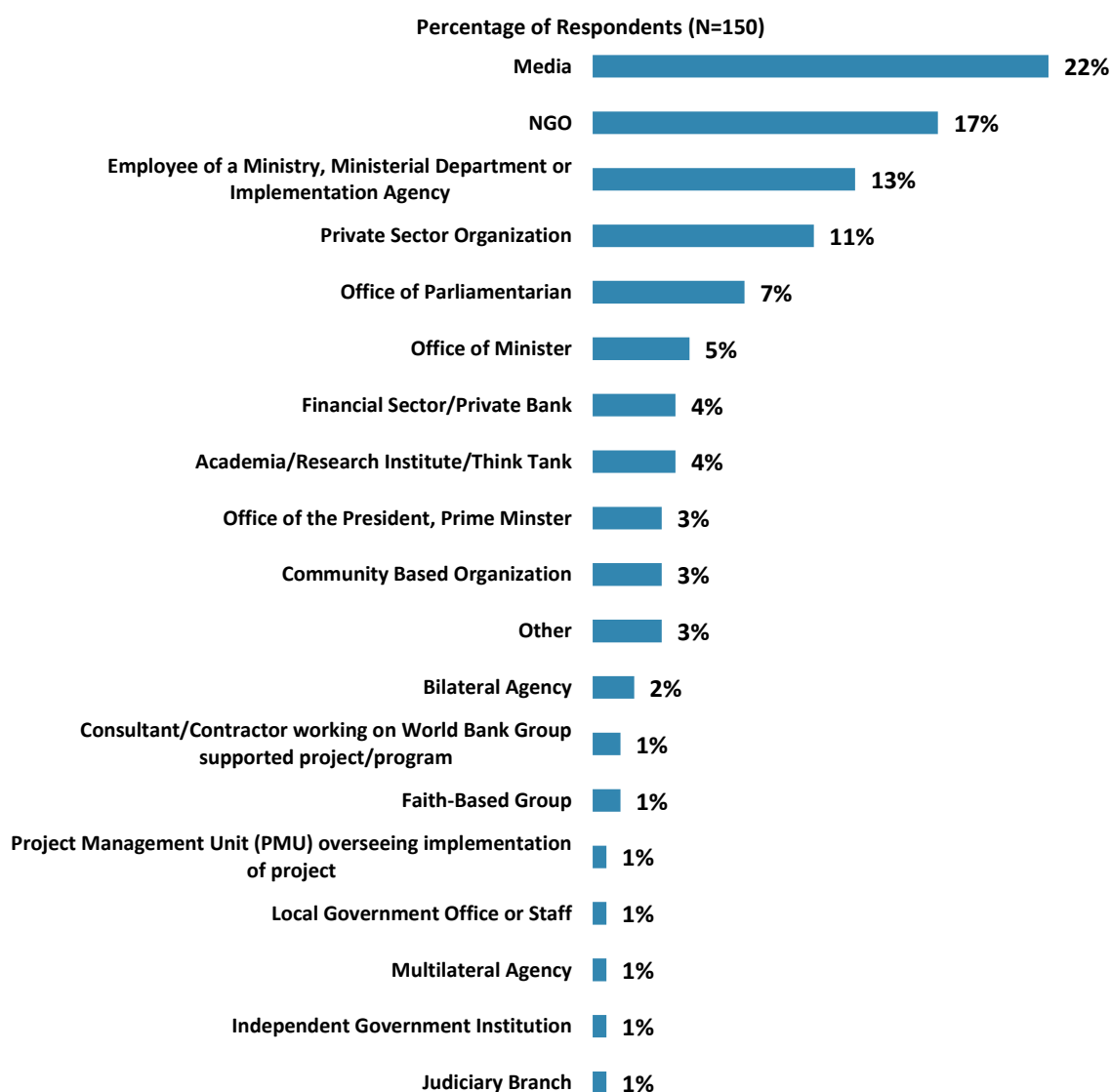
II. Methodology (continued)

- C. Sectoral Importance and World Bank Group's Results: Respondents were asked to rate the extent to which the WBG's work helps achieve development results in Myanmar, the extent to which the WBG meets Myanmar's needs for knowledge services and financial instruments, the importance for the WBG to be involved in thirty five development areas, such as education, poverty reduction, public sector governance/reform, and security/stabilization/reconstruction. They were also asked to rate the extent to which the WBG helps build existing country systems in Myanmar.
- D. The World Bank Group's Knowledge Work and Activities: Respondents were asked to rate the effectiveness and quality of the WBG's knowledge work and activities, including how significant of a contribution it makes to development results and its technical quality.
- E. The Future Role of the World Bank Group in Myanmar: Respondents were asked to indicate what the WBG should do to make itself of greater value in Myanmar and which services the Bank Group should offer more of in the country. They were asked what areas the country would benefit most from the WBG playing a leading role and what areas it would benefit most from other donors.
- F. Communication and Information Sharing: Respondents were asked to indicate how they get information about economic and social development issues, how they prefer to receive information from the WBG, and their usage and evaluation of the WBG's websites. Respondents were also asked about their awareness of the WBG's Access to Information policy, were asked to rate WBG's responsiveness to information requests, value of its social media channels, levels of easiness to find information they needed, the levels of easiness to navigate the WBG websites, and whether they use WBG data more often than before.
- G. Background Information: Respondents were asked to indicate their current position, specialization, whether they professionally collaborate with the WBG, their exposure to the WBG in Myanmar, which WBG agencies they work with, whether they think that IFC and WB work well together, and their geographic locations.

III. Demographics of the Sample

Current Position

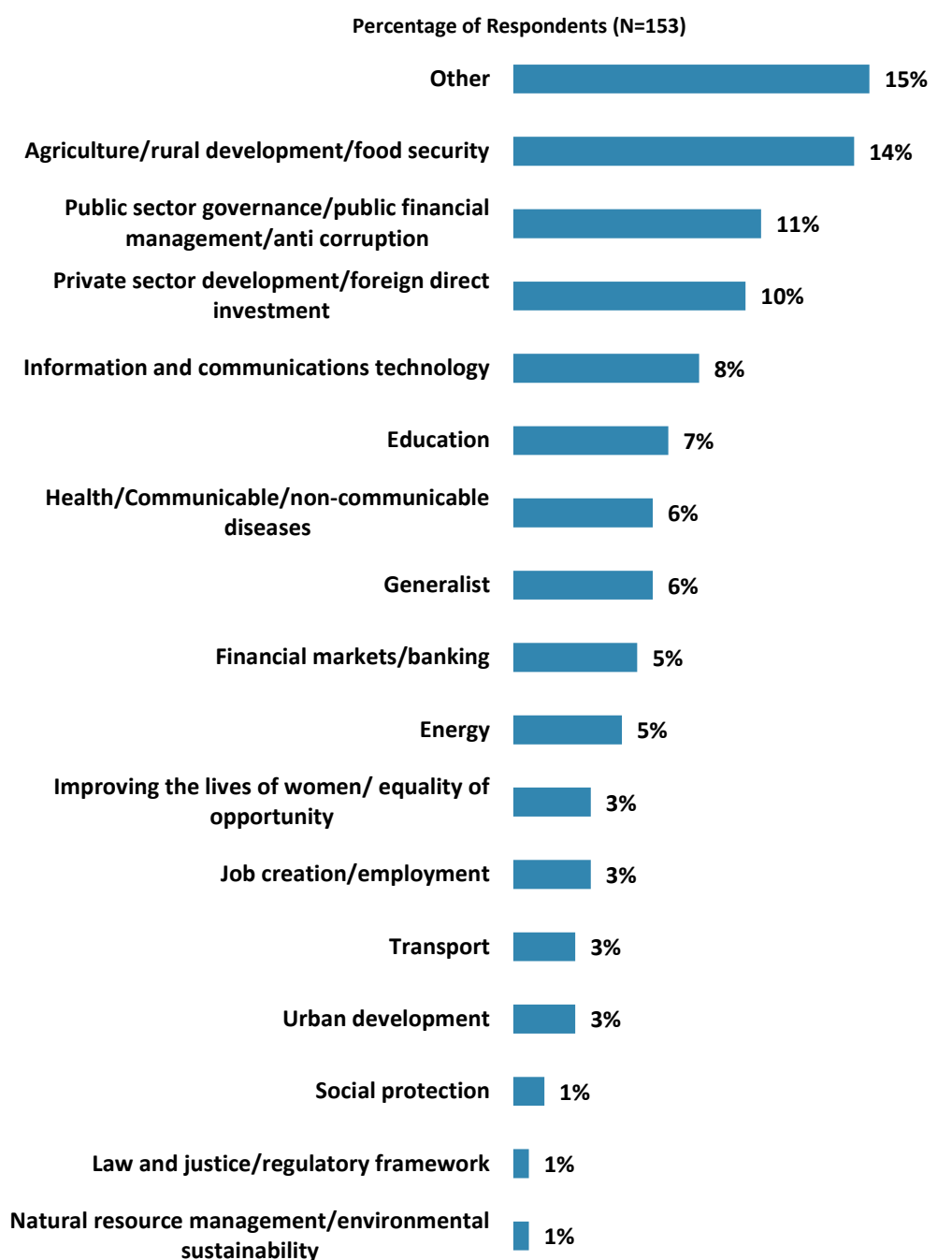
- For further analyses, respondents from the Office of the President, Prime Minister were combined with respondents from Office of a Minister, respondents from consultants/contractors working on WBG projects were combined with those from PMUs and ministries/ministerial departments, respondents from the financial sector/private banks were combined with those from private sector organizations; respondents from bilateral agencies were combined with those from multilateral agencies. Respondents from NGO, CBOs, and faith-based groups were combined into “CSO.” Few respondents from independent government institutions, the local governments, and other organizations were included in the “Other” category. There were no respondents from the private foundations and trade unions.

Area of Primary Specialization

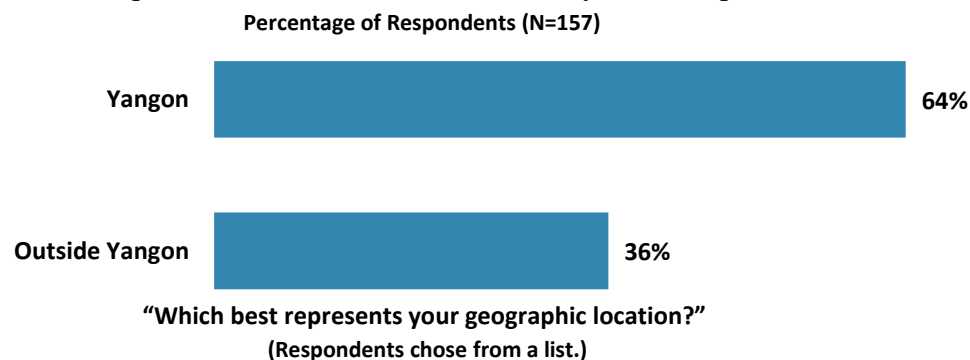


"Please identify the primary specialization of your work." (Respondents chose from a list.)

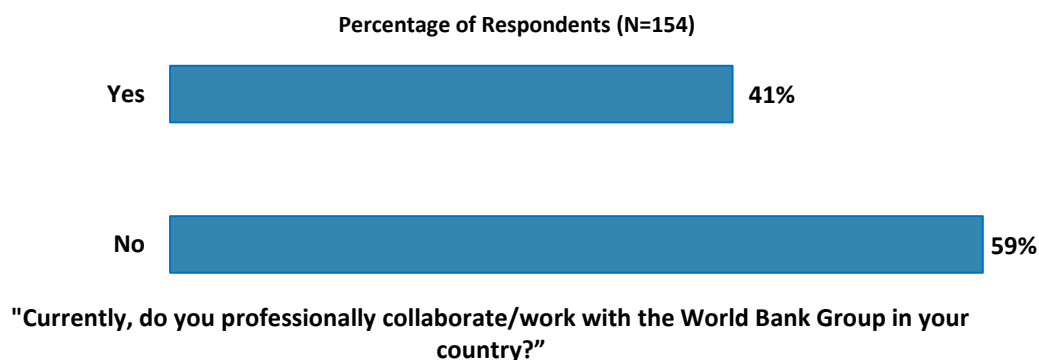
Geographic Location

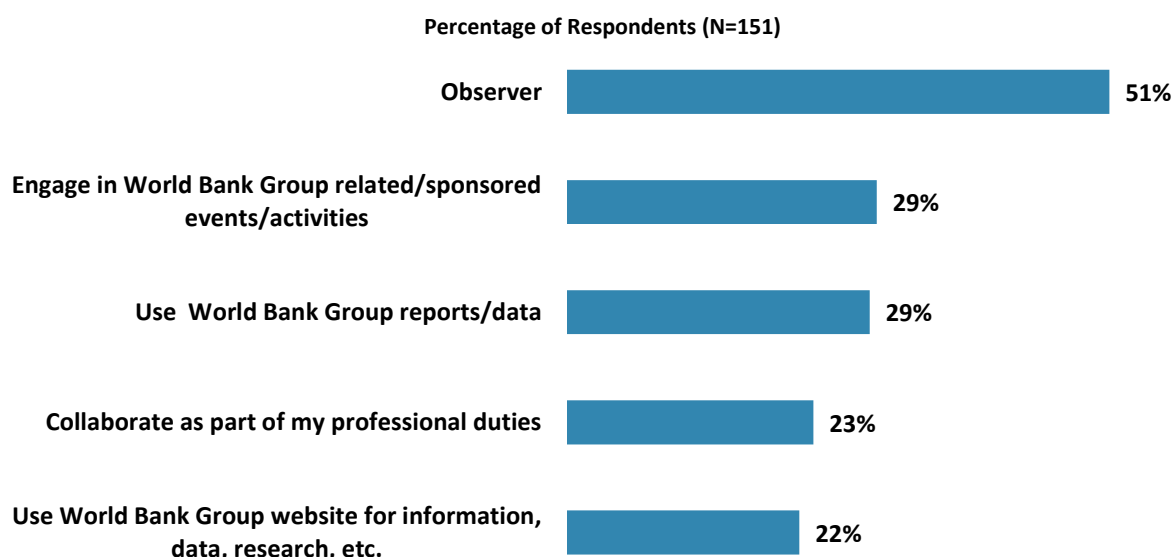
Collaboration with and Exposure to the World Bank Group

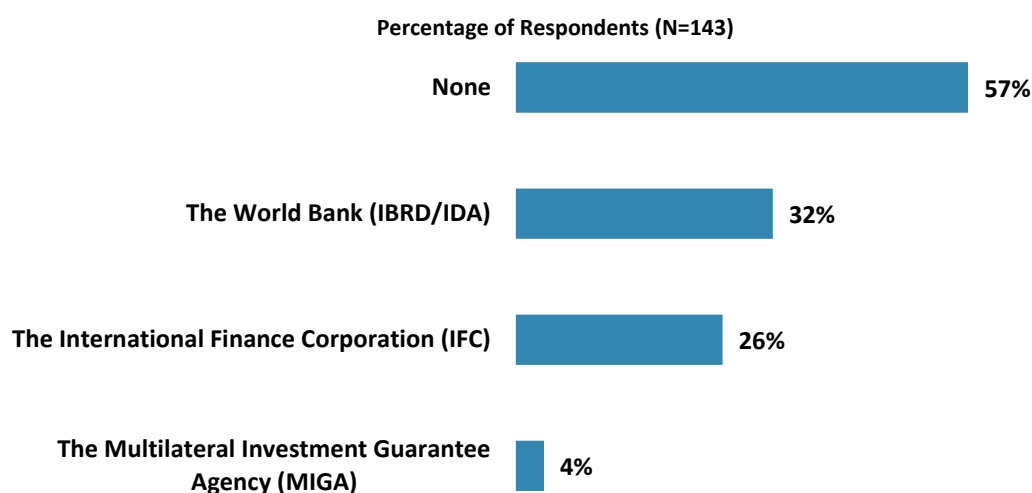

Exposure to Agencies within the World Bank Group

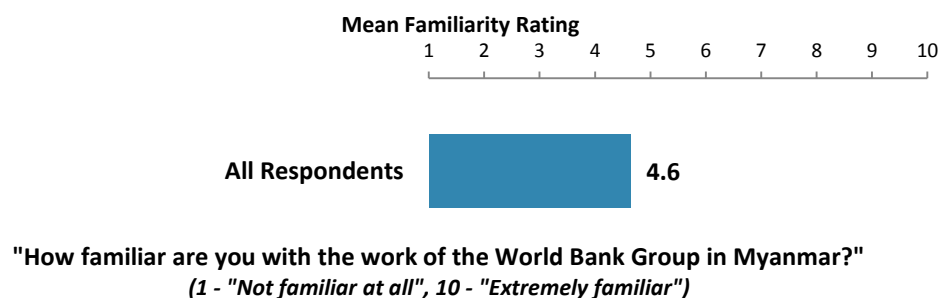


"Which of the following agencies of the World Bank Group do you primarily engage with in Myanmar?" (Respondents chose from a list. Responses combined)

Familiarity with the World Bank Group

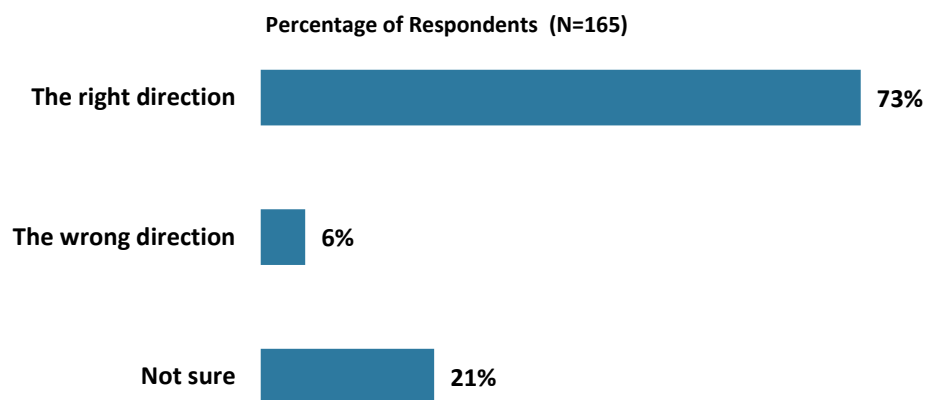
- Respondents across stakeholder groups and geographic locations had statistically similar levels of familiarity with the WBG.
- Respondents' ratings of familiarity with the WBG were significantly, strongly correlated with their perceptions of the WBG's overall effectiveness in Myanmar, and significantly, moderately correlated with their perceptions of the WBG's relevance to Myanmar's development and its ability to help achieve development results in the country.

Headed in the Right Direction

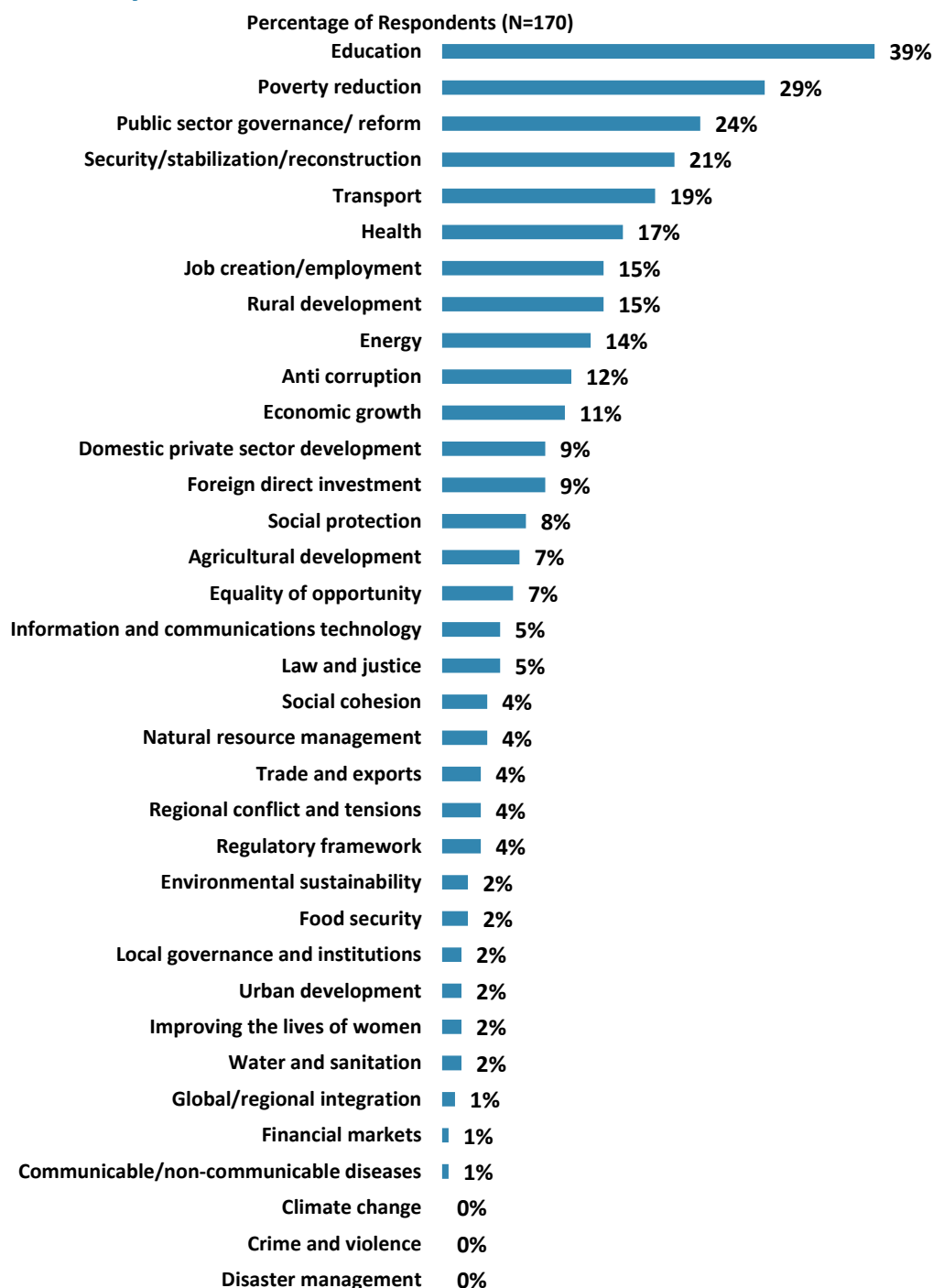
- A majority of respondents across stakeholder groups, geographic locations and levels of collaboration believe that Myanmar is headed in the right direction.

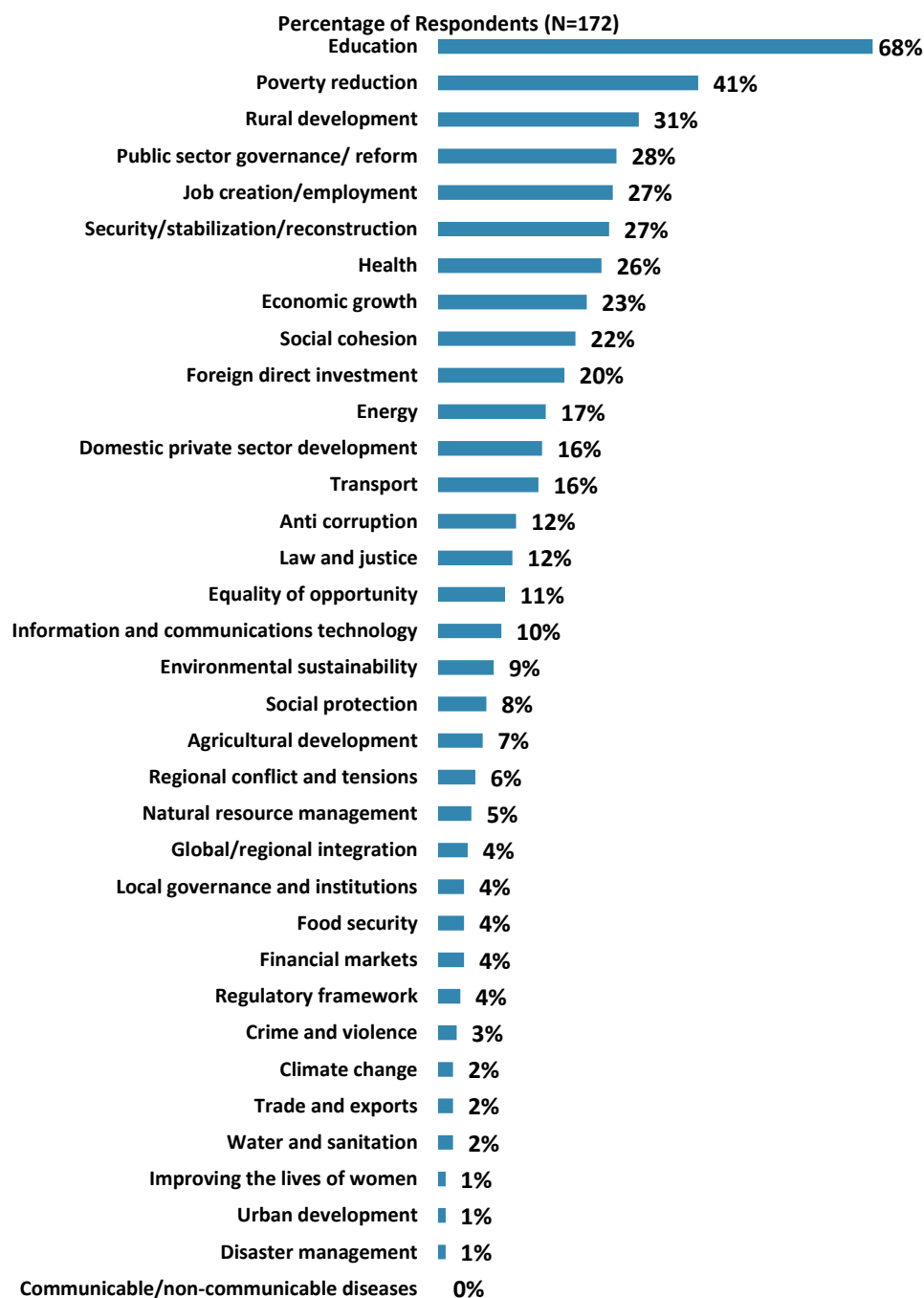

Development Priority (continued)

- Respondents from bilateral/multilateral agencies and academia/research institutes/think tanks were most likely to indicate that “*energy*” is the most important development priority in Myanmar, whereas respondents from the media were significantly less likely to indicate so.
- Respondents who primarily specialize in “*private sector development/foreign direct investment* (10% of the sample)” and other areas were significantly more likely to indicate that “*education*” is Myanmar’s top development priority, compared to respondents who specialize in “*agriculture/rural development/food security* (14% of the sample)” and “*public sector governance/public financial management/anti corruption* (11% of the sample).”

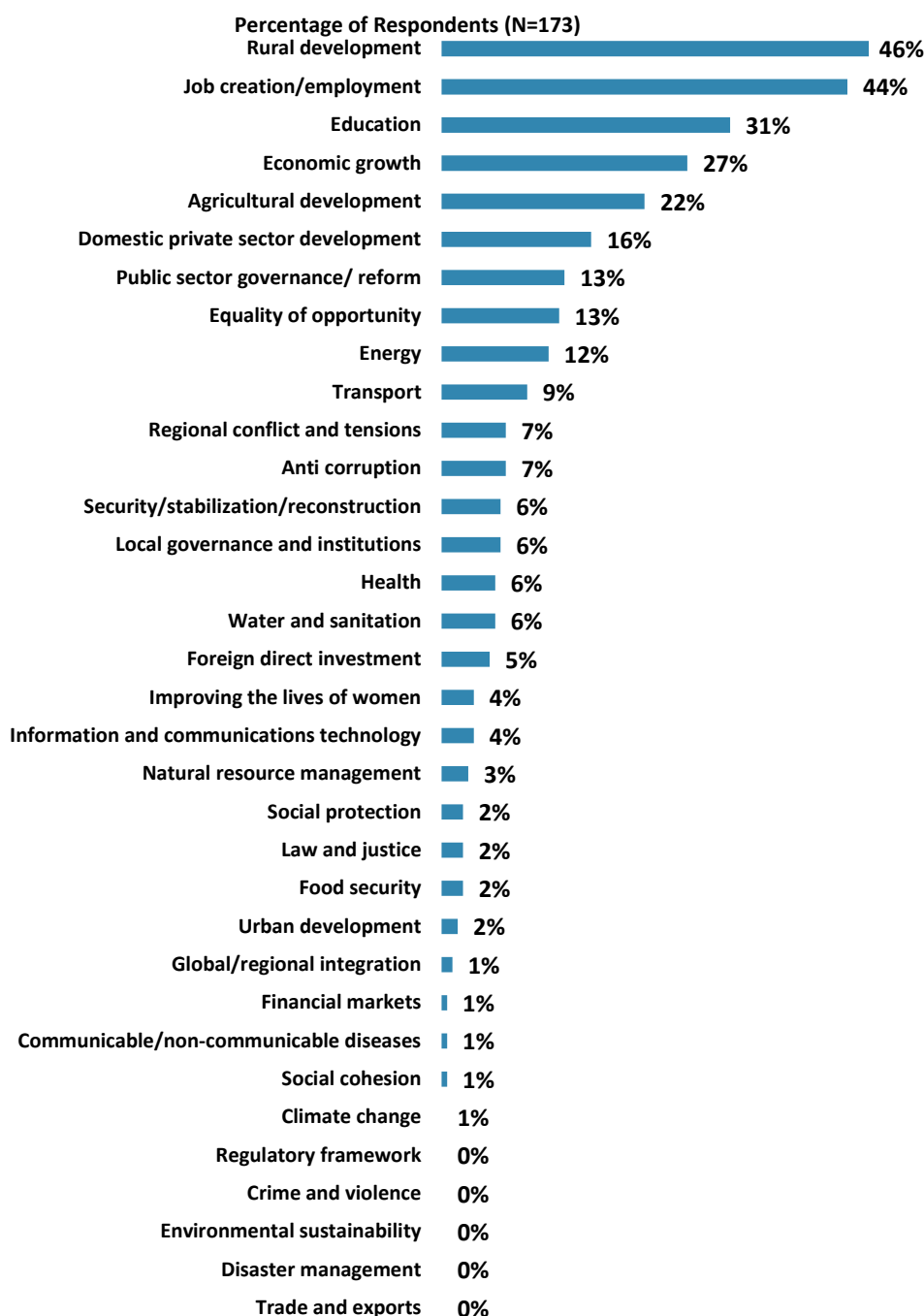

Development Priority for the Government of Myanmar (continued)

- Respondents from academia/research institutes/think tanks were most likely to indicate that “*education*” is the most important development priority for the Government of Myanmar in the near future, whereas respondents from bilateral/multilateral agencies were significantly less likely to indicate so.
- Respondents from the office of parliamentarian were most likely to indicate that “*rural development*” is the most important development priority for the Government of Myanmar in the near future, whereas respondents from academia/research institutes/think tanks were significantly less likely to think so.
- Respondents outside Yangon were significantly more likely to consider “*education*” as the most important development priority for the Government of Myanmar in the near future than respondents located in Yangon.
- Respondents across sectoral areas agreed on the top development priorities for the Government of Myanmar in the near future.

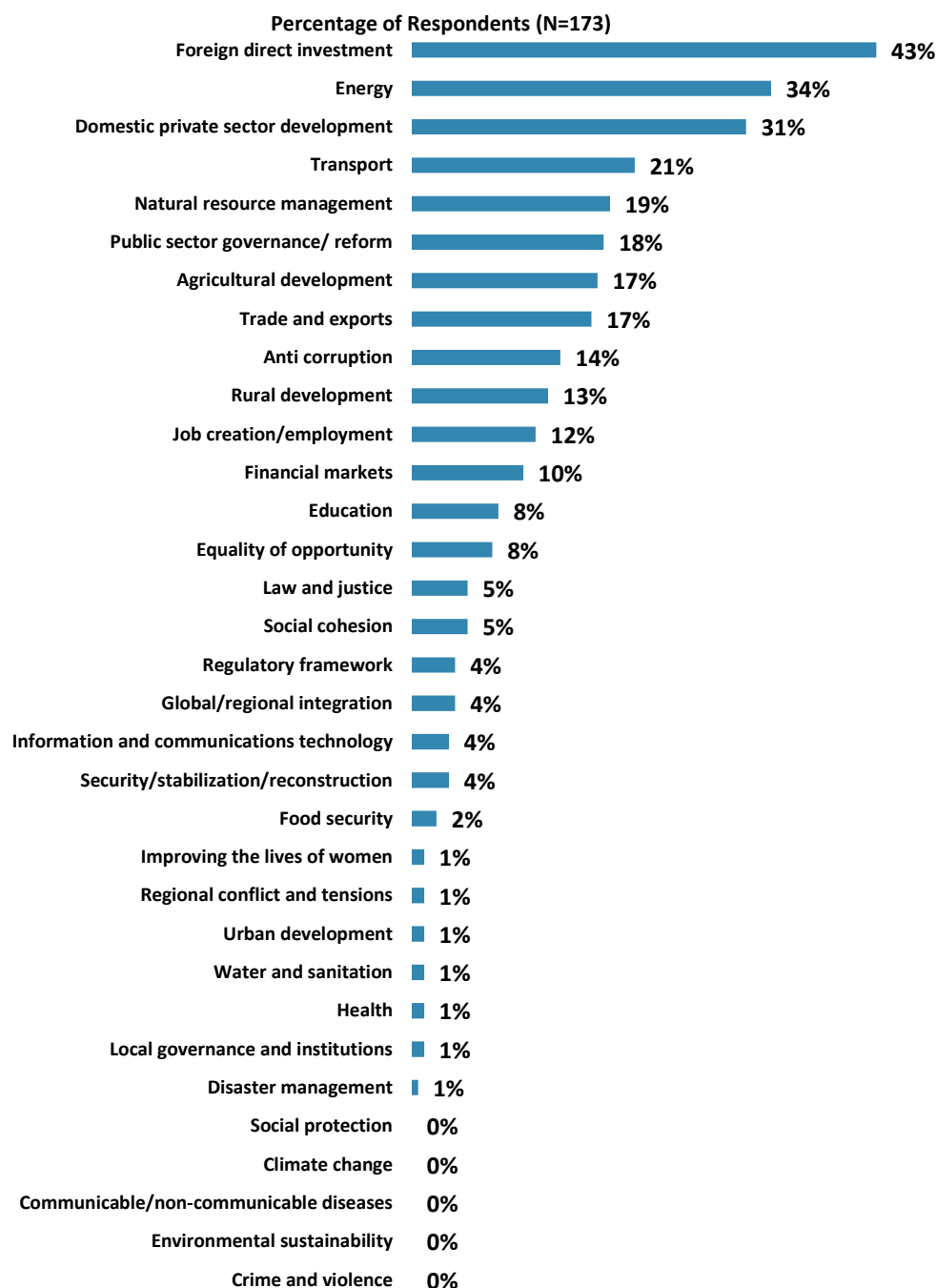

- Respondents across stakeholder groups all agreed that “*rural development*,” “*education*,” and “*job creation/employment*” are the greatest contributors to reducing poverty in Myanmar.
- Respondents outside Yangon were significantly more likely to indicate that “*rural development*” is the greatest contributor to reducing poverty in Myanmar than respondents located in Yangon.
- Respondents across sectoral areas agreed on the top contributors to reducing poverty in Myanmar.

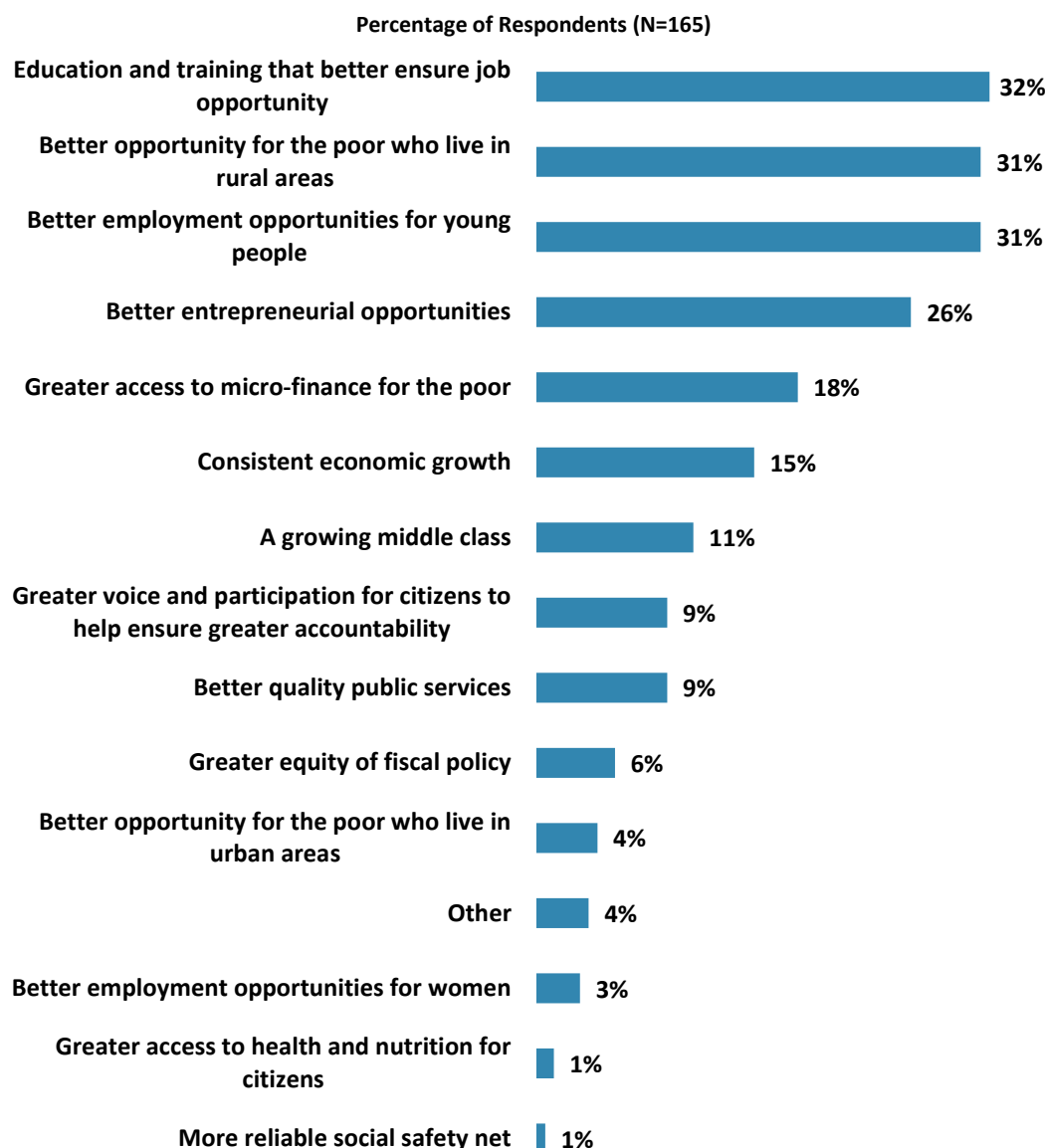
What Would Contribute Most to Generating Economic Growth (continued)

- Among the perceived top contributors to economic growth, respondents from the Office of parliamentarian were most likely to indicate that “*transport*” would contribute most to generating economic growth in Myanmar, whereas respondents from academia/research institutes/think tanks were least likely to say so.
- Respondents across geographic locations agreed on the top contributors to economic growth in Myanmar.
- Respondents across sectoral areas also agreed on the top contributors to economic growth in Myanmar.

Factors Contributing to “Shared Prosperity”

- Respondents across stakeholder groups and geographic locations agreed on the top areas of effort through which “shared prosperity” would be achieved in Myanmar.

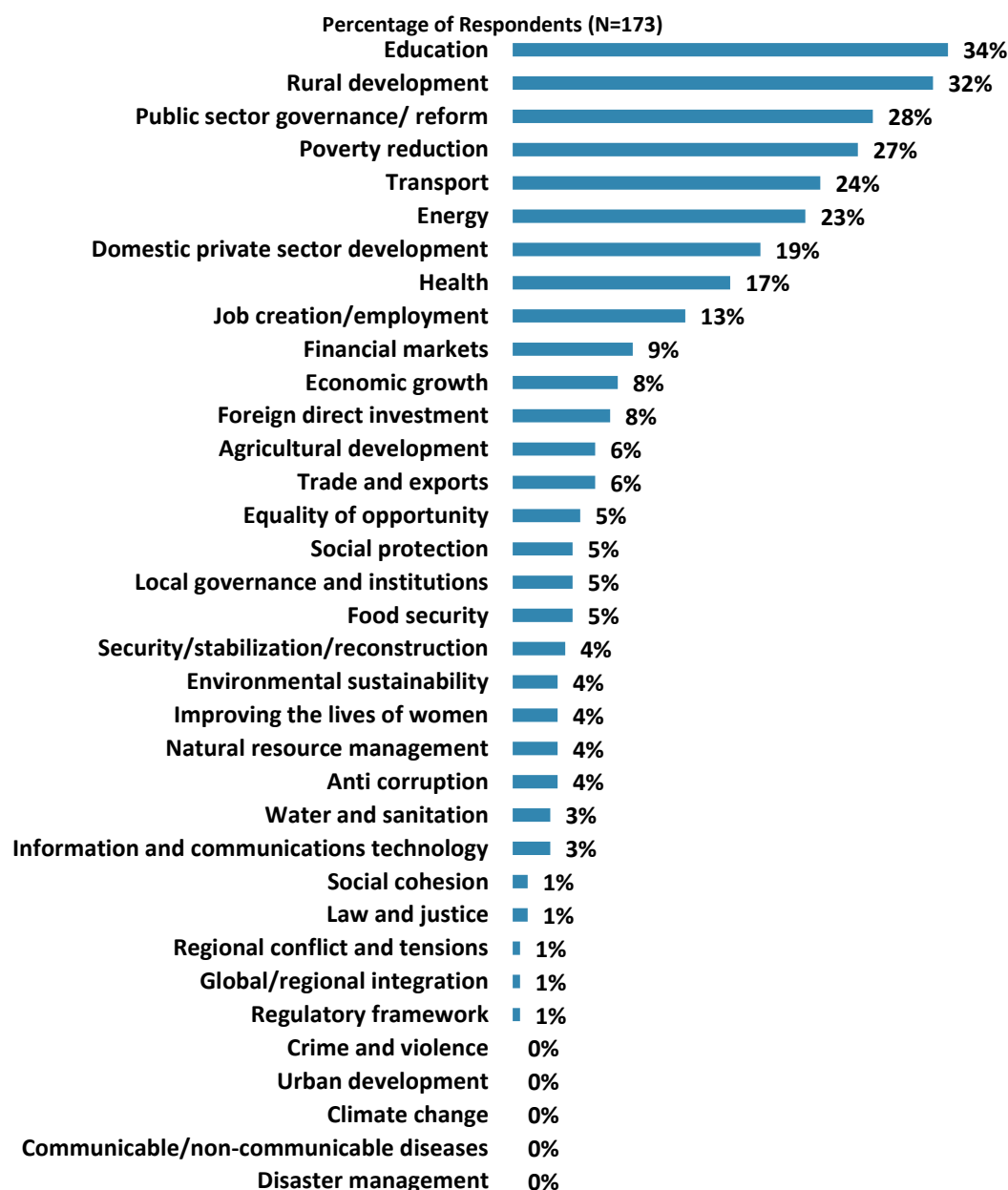

Where the World Bank Group Should Focus its Resources (continued)

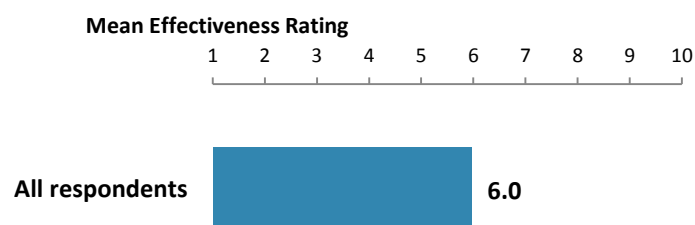
- Respondents across stakeholder groups, geographic locations, and sectoral areas agreed on the top areas where they think the WBG should focus its resources.
- It is worth pointing out that respondents who collaborate with the WBG were significantly *less* likely to think that the institution should focus on “*education*,” compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG.
- In addition, respondents who collaborate with the WBG were significantly *more* likely to think that the institution should focus on “*public sector governance/reform*” than respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG.

V. Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group (continued)

As noted in the “Methodology” section, the indicator questions referred to throughout the survey report are questions that are asked in every country that engages in the Country Opinion Survey. These will be aggregated for the World Bank Group’s annual Corporate Scorecard.

The World Bank Group’s Overall Effectiveness (*Indicator Question*)

- Respondents across stakeholder groups and geographic locations had statistically similar ratings for the Bank Group’s overall effectiveness in Myanmar.
- Respondents who do and do not professionally collaborate/work with the WBG had statistically similar ratings for the Bank Group’s overall effectiveness in Myanmar as well.

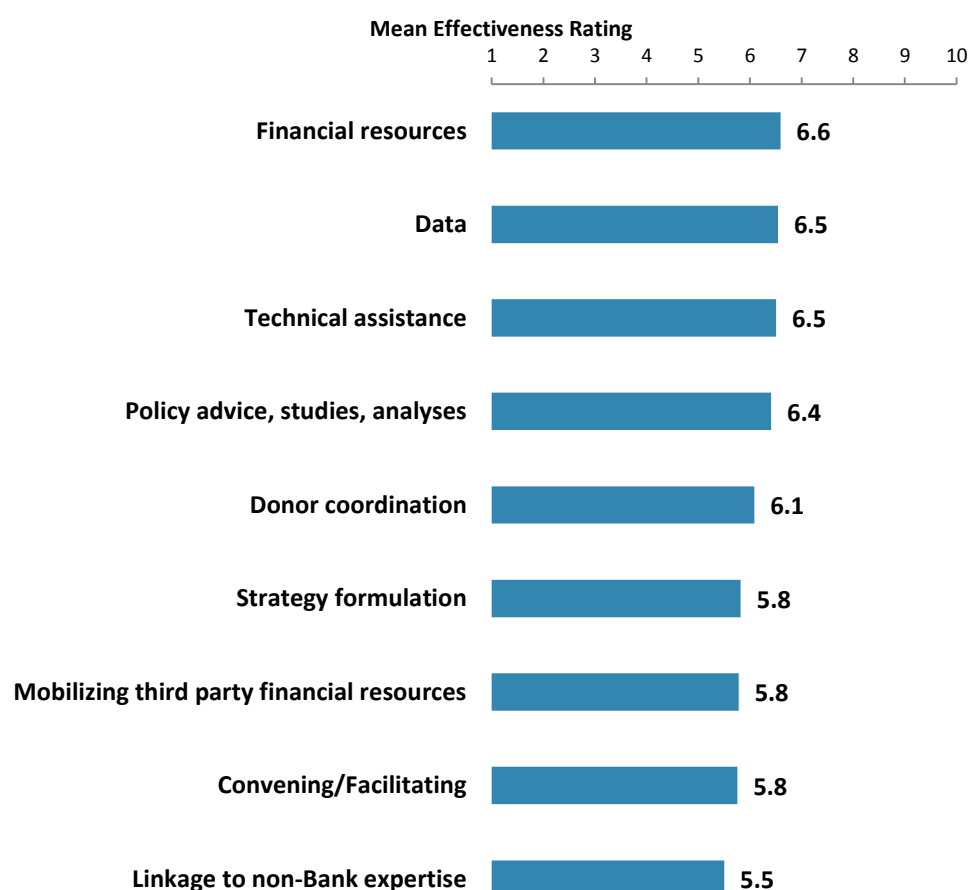


"Overall, please rate your impression of the World Bank Group’s effectiveness in Myanmar."

V. Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group (continued)

Effectiveness of the WBG Activities

- Respondents from the Office of President/Prime Minister/Minister had the highest ratings for the effectiveness of the WBG's activities in "*mobilizing third party financial resources*" and "*linkage to non-Bank expertise*," whereas respondents from bilateral/multilateral agencies had significantly lower ratings.
- Respondents outside Yangon had significantly higher ratings for the effectiveness of the WBG's activities in "*technical assistance*" than respondents located in Yangon.
- Respondents who do and do not collaborate with the WBG had statistically similar ratings for the effectiveness of the WBG's activities in all the following areas.

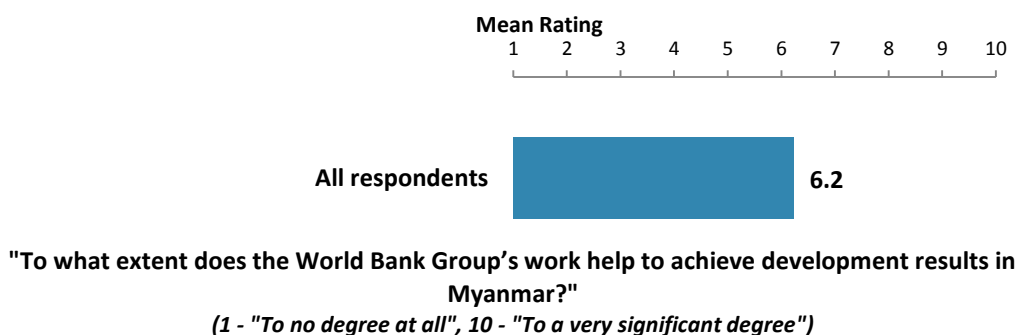


"How effectively do the World Bank Group's activities below support Myanmar's efforts to achieve development results? "

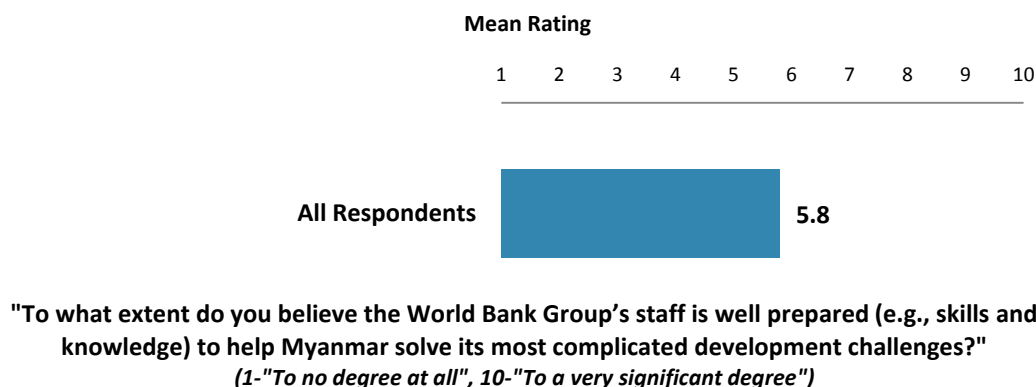
Achieving Development Results *(Indicator Question)*

- Respondents across stakeholder groups and geographic locations had statistically similar ratings for the extent to which the WBG's work helped to achieve development results in Myanmar.
- Respondents who professionally collaborate/work with the World Bank Group had significantly higher ratings for the WBG helping achieve development results in Myanmar, compared to respondents who do not professionally collaborate/work with the WBG.



Staff Preparedness *(Indicator Question)*

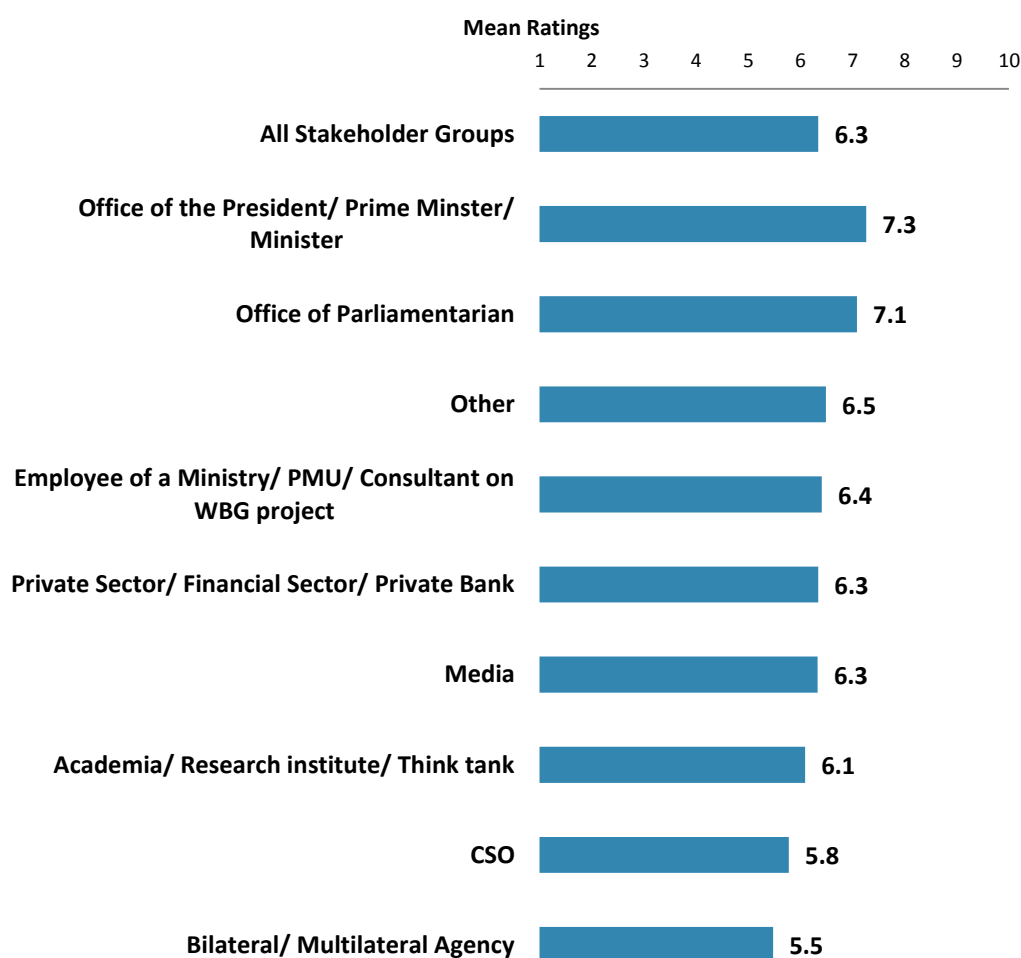
- Respondents across stakeholder groups and geographic locations had statistically similar ratings for the extent to which the WBG's staff is well prepared to help Myanmar solve its most complicated development challenges.
- Respondents who do and do not professionally collaborate/work with the World Bank Group had statistically similar ratings for the extent to which the WBG's staff is well prepared to help Myanmar solve its most complicated development challenges as well.



V. Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group (continued)

Overall Ratings for Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups*

- Respondents across stakeholder groups overall had statistically similar responses to twenty five indicator questions.
- Respondents who professionally collaborate/work with the WBG tended to give significantly higher ratings (6.8) for twenty five indicator questions than respondents who do not professionally collaborate/work with the WBG (5.9).

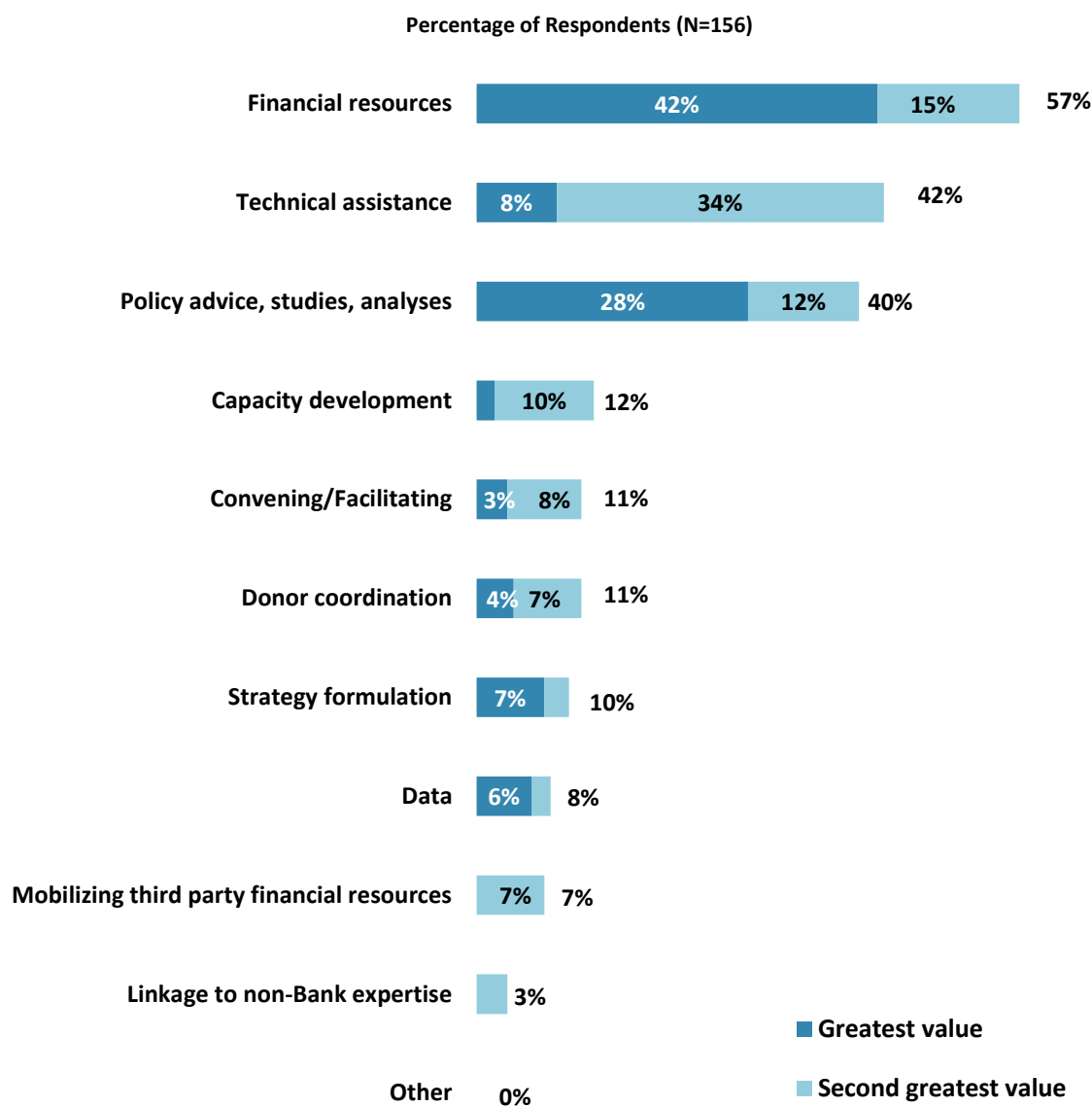


Mean Ratings for All Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups on a Scale from 1 to 10

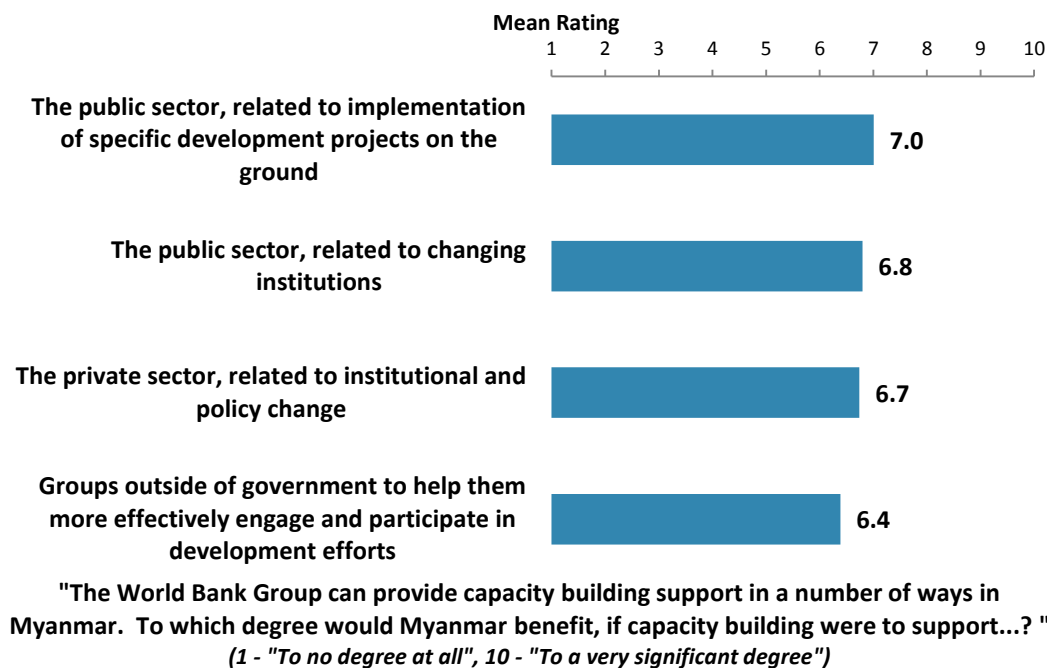


"When thinking about the World Bank Group's role, which activity do you believe is of greatest VALUE and which activity is of second greatest value in Myanmar?"

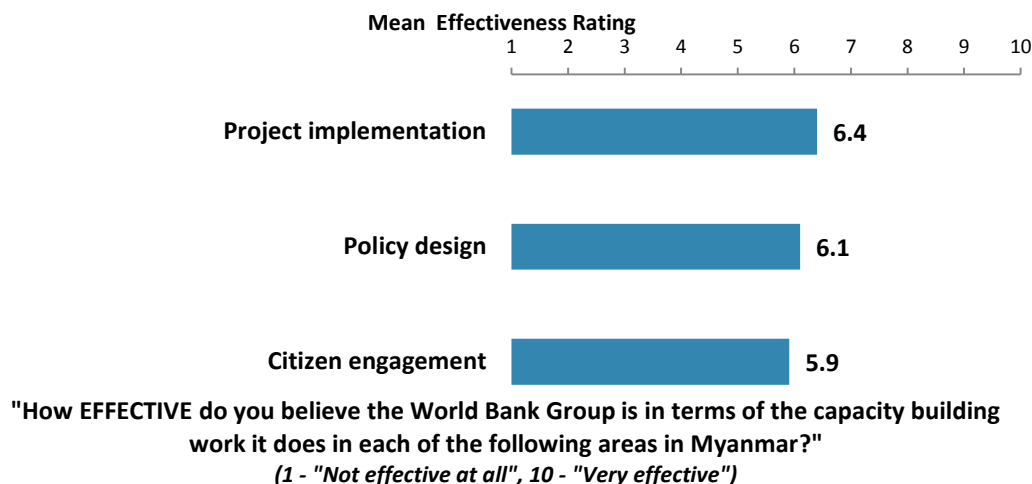
- Respondents across stakeholder groups and geographic locations gave statistically similar ratings for the extent to which Myanmar would benefit, if capacity building were to support all four areas below.

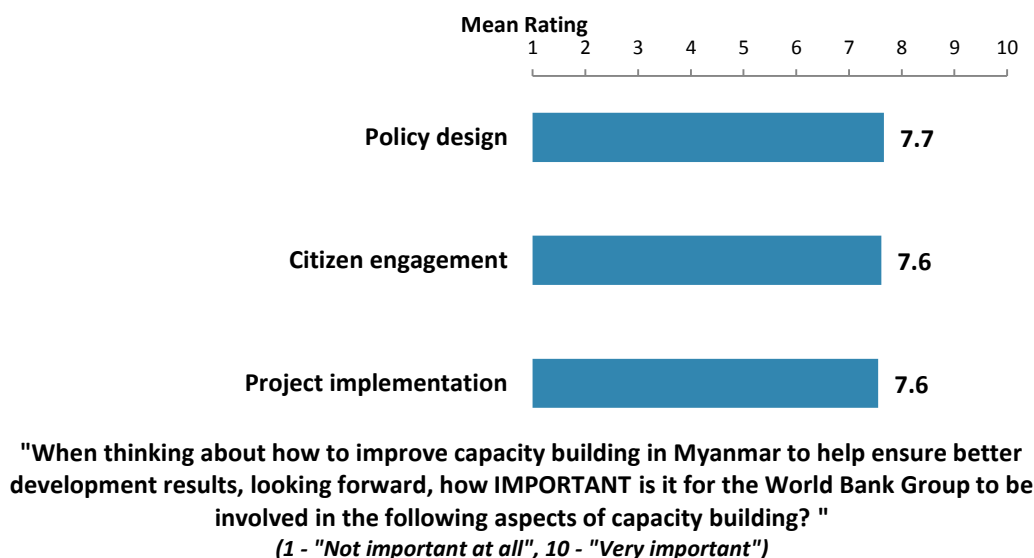
Effectiveness of WBG's Capacity Building Work

Importance of WBG's Capacity Building Work

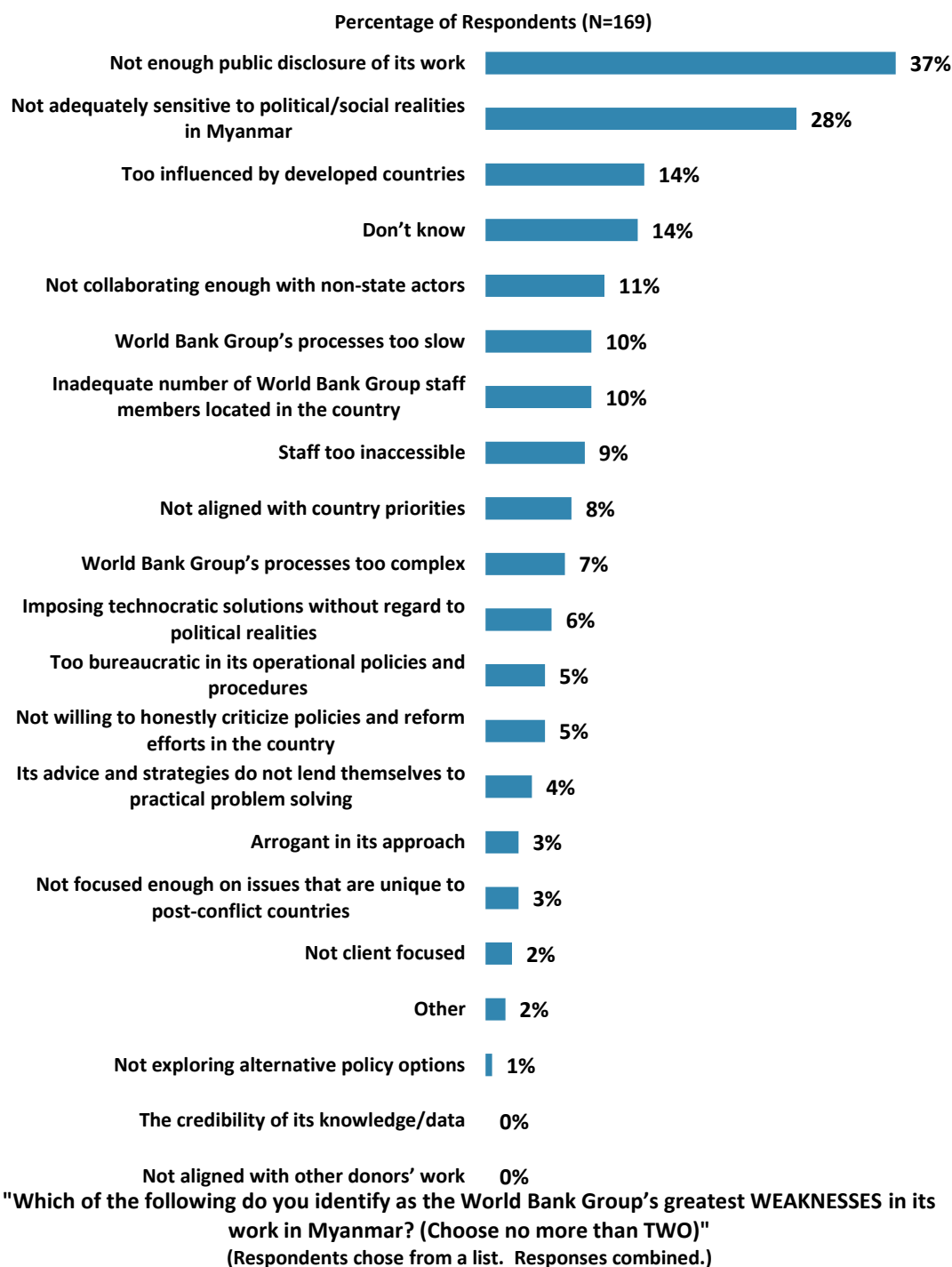
- Respondents across stakeholder groups and geographic locations had statistically similar ratings for the importance of the WBG being involved in all three areas of capacity building.

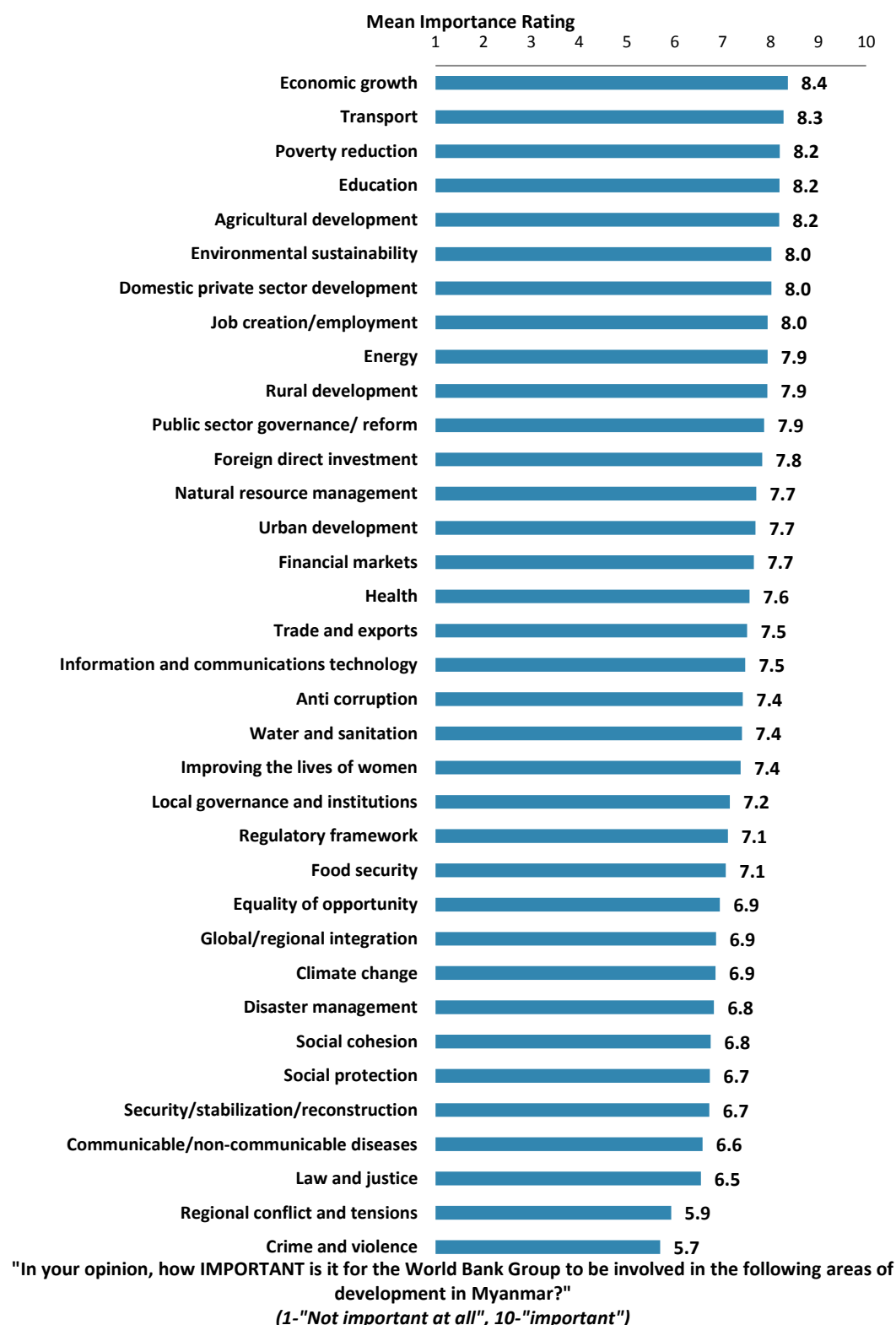
Greatest Weakness

- Respondents across stakeholder groups, geographic locations, collaborators and non-collaborators with the WBG all agreed that “*not enough public disclosure of its work,*” “*not adequately sensitive to political/social realities in Myanmar,*” and “*too influenced by developed countries*” are the institution’s greatest weaknesses in its work in Myanmar.

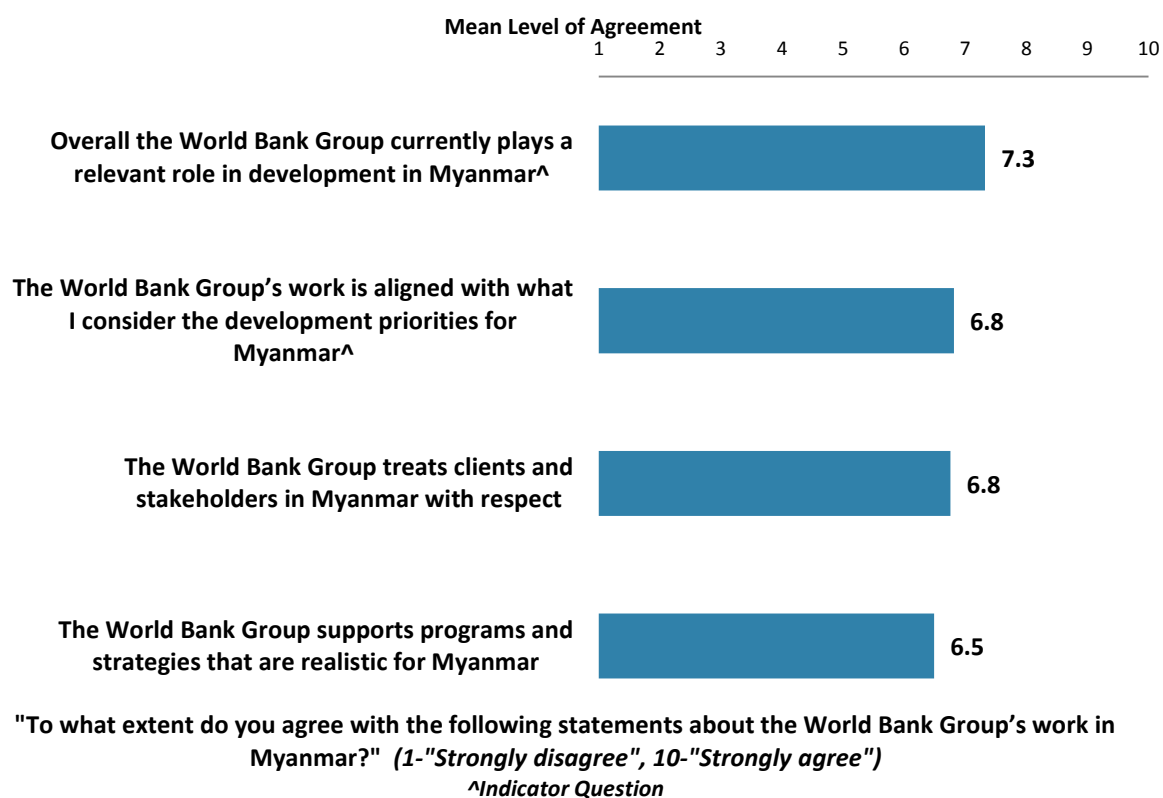
Importance of Sectoral Areas (continued)

- Respondents from the office of parliamentarian gave significantly higher ratings for the level of importance of “*foreign direct investment*” compared to respondents from other stakeholder groups.
- Respondents across geographic locations gave statistically similar ratings for the level of importance of all the sectoral areas.
- Respondents who do and do not professionally collaborate with the WBG gave statistically similar ratings for the level of importance of all the sectoral areas.

The World Bank Group's Work in Myanmar

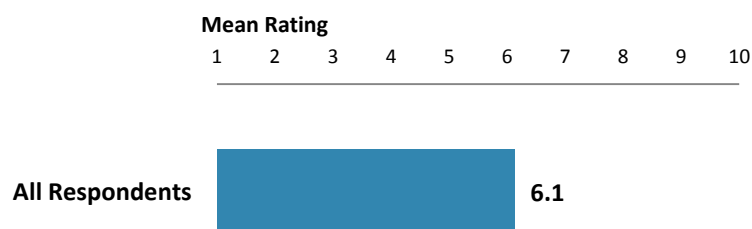
- Respondents across stakeholder groups and geographic locations had statistically similar levels of agreement with all of the four statements below including the indicator statements.
- Respondents who professionally collaborate/work with WBG tended to have significantly higher levels of agreement with almost all statements below compared to respondents who do not professionally collaborate/work with WBG, except for the statement “*overall the WBG currently plays a relevant role in development in Myanmar.*”

Strengthening Existing Country Systems

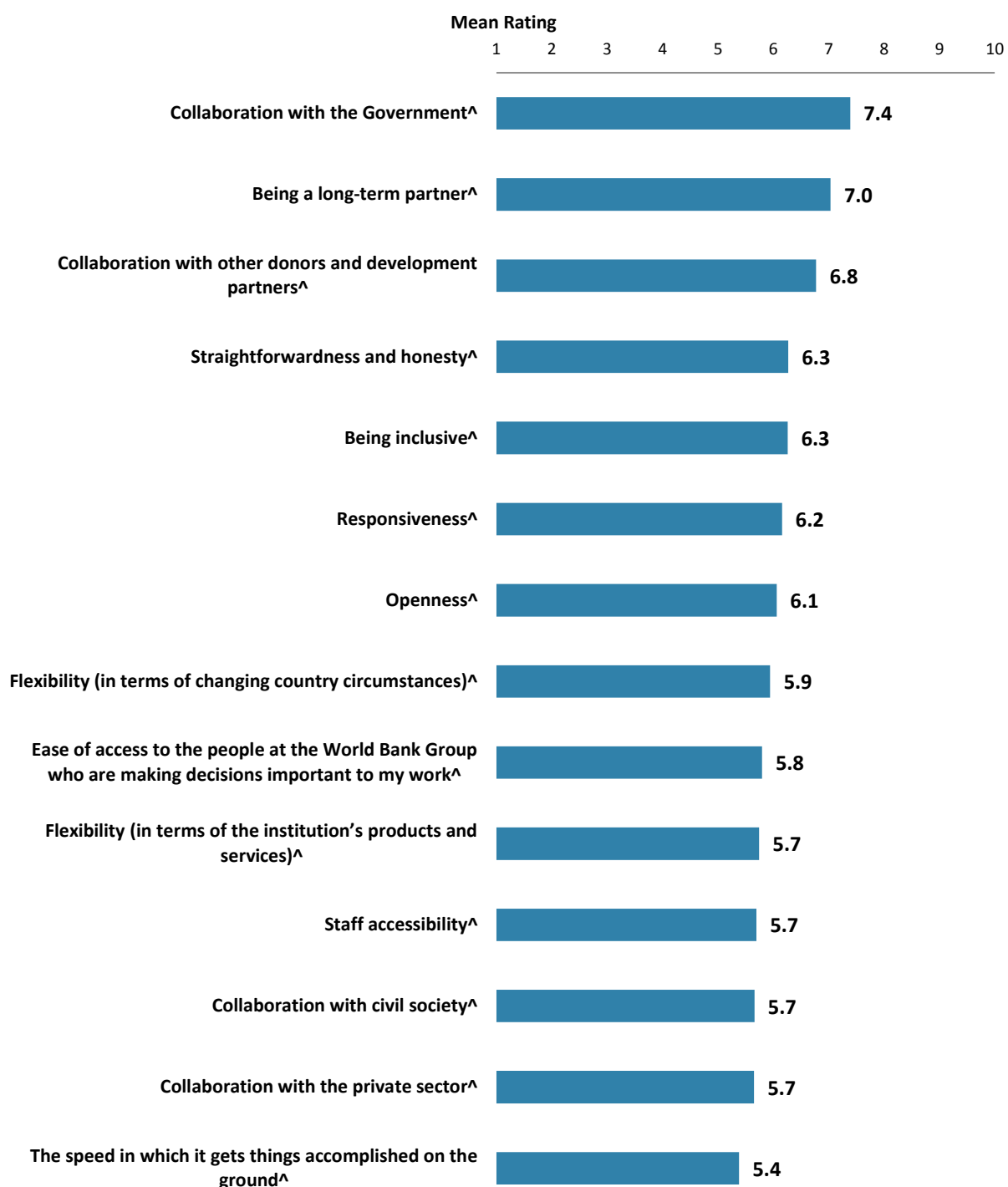
- Respondents across stakeholder groups and geographic locations gave statistically similar ratings for the extent to which the WBG helps build/strengthen existing country systems in Myanmar.
- Respondents who professionally collaborate/work with the WBG gave significantly higher ratings for the extent to which the WBG helps build/strengthen existing country systems in Myanmar, compared to respondents who do not work with the organization.

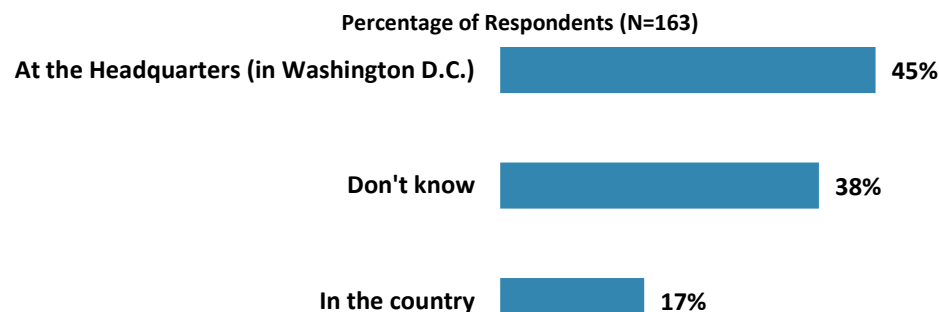
The World Bank Group as an Effective Development Partner (continued)

- Respondents from the Office of President/Prime Minister/Minister tended to give the highest ratings for the “*flexibility in terms of the institution’s products and services*” and “*flexibility in terms of changing country circumstances*”, whereas respondents from the bilateral/multilateral agencies and CSOs tended to give significantly lower ratings.
- Respondents across geographic locations gave statistically similar ratings for all of the qualities of the WBG as an effective development partner.
- Respondents who professionally collaborate/work with the World Bank Group gave significantly higher ratings for all of the qualities (except for “*straightforwardness and honesty*”) than respondents who do not collaborate with the institution.

Making Decisions about the WBG Program in Myanmar

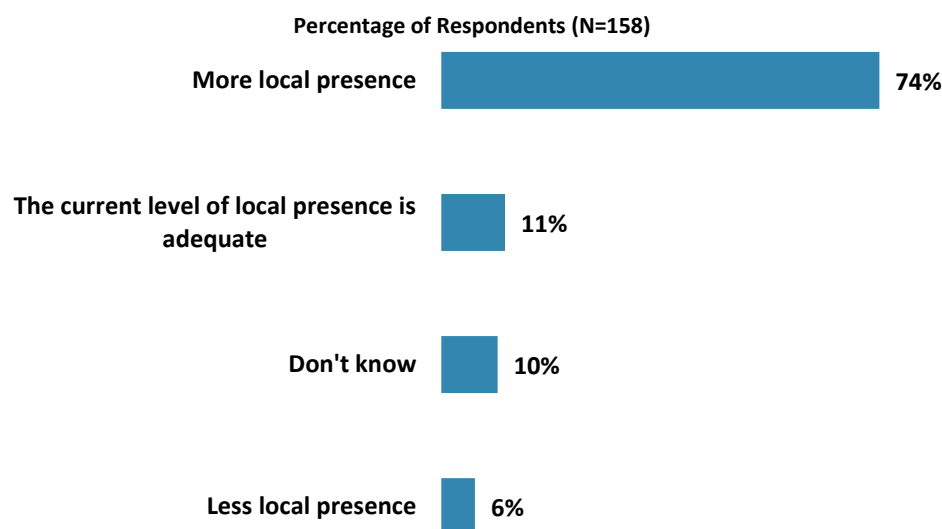
- Respondents who collaborate with the WBG were significantly more likely to think that the WBG's decisions are primarily made at the Headquarters in D.C. than respondents who do not collaborate with the organization.

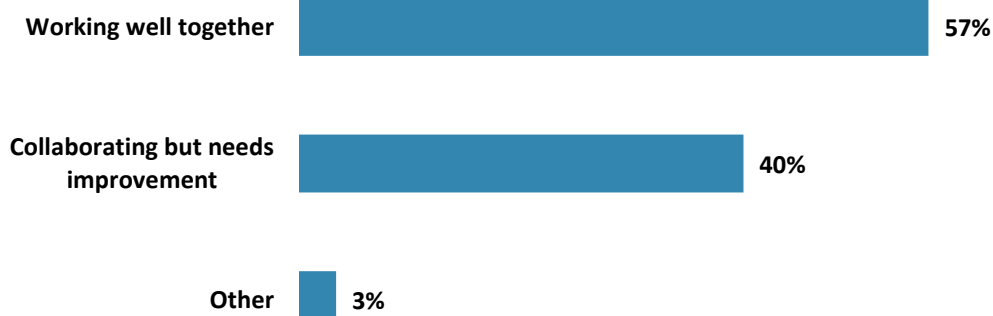
IFC and IBRD Working Together

“Do your projects involve both the World Bank and IFC?”

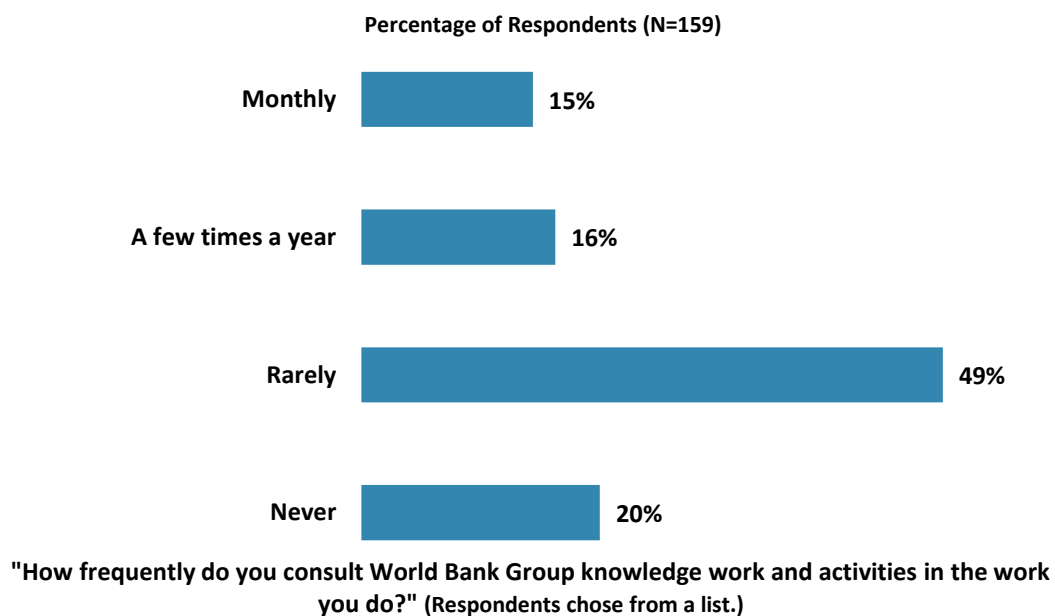
Percentage of Respondents (N=30)

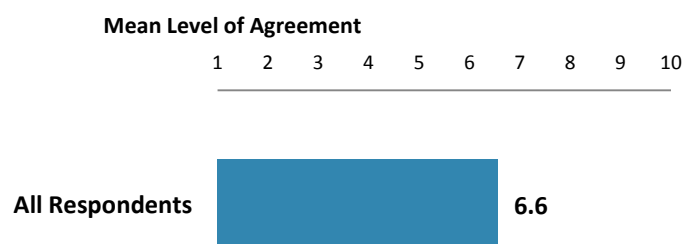
Frequency of Consulting WBG Knowledge Work and Activities

- Respondents across stakeholder groups had statistically similar levels of agreement that World Bank Group meets Myanmar's needs for knowledge services.
- Respondents who do and do not professionally collaborate/work with the WBG had statistically similar levels of agreement that World Bank Group meets Myanmar's needs for knowledge services.
- Respondents who are located in Yangon were significantly less likely to believe that the WBG's knowledge services meet Myanmar's needs.

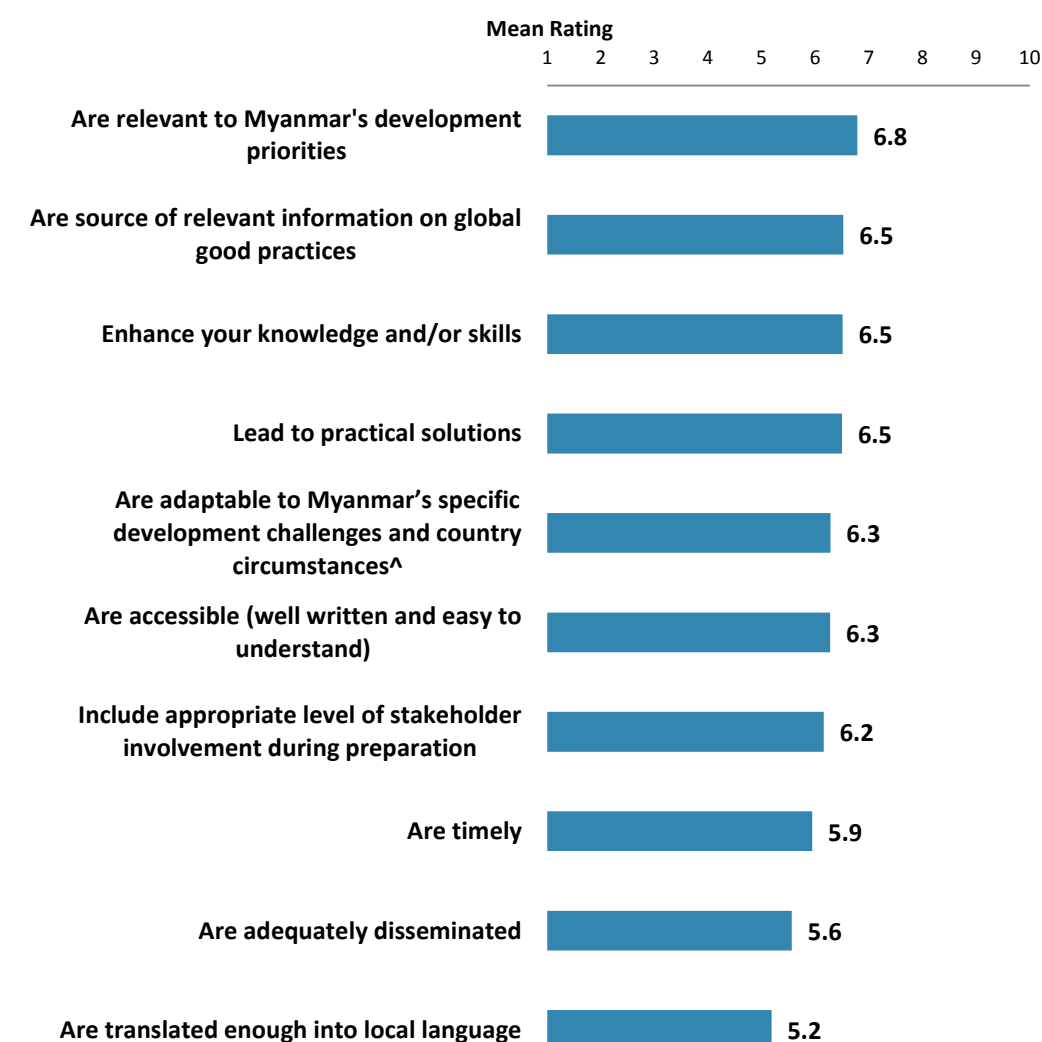


"The World Bank Group meets Myanmar's needs for knowledge services"

- Respondents across stakeholder groups gave statistically similar ratings for all of the following qualities of the WBG's knowledge work and activities.
- Respondents outside Yangon had significantly higher ratings for two qualities of the WBG's knowledge work and activities ("*being source of relevant information on global good practices*" and '*enhancing your knowledge and skills*') than respondents located in Yangon.
- Respondents who collaborate with the WBG gave significantly higher ratings for all of the following qualities of the WBG's knowledge work and activities compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the organization.



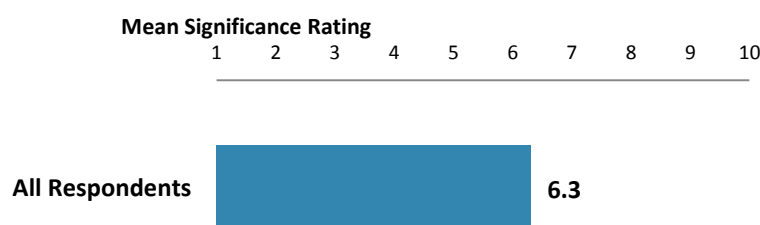
"In Myanmar, to what extent do you believe that the World Bank Group's knowledge work and activities:" (1-"To no degree at all", 10-"To a very significant degree")

- Respondents across stakeholder groups and geographic locations had statistically similar ratings for the significance of the contribution that the WBG's knowledge work and activities make to development results in Myanmar.
- Respondents who professionally collaborate/work with the WBG had significantly higher ratings for the significance of the contribution that the WBG's knowledge work and activities make to development results in Myanmar, compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the institution.

Technical Quality of the WBG's Knowledge Work and Activities *(Indicator Question)*

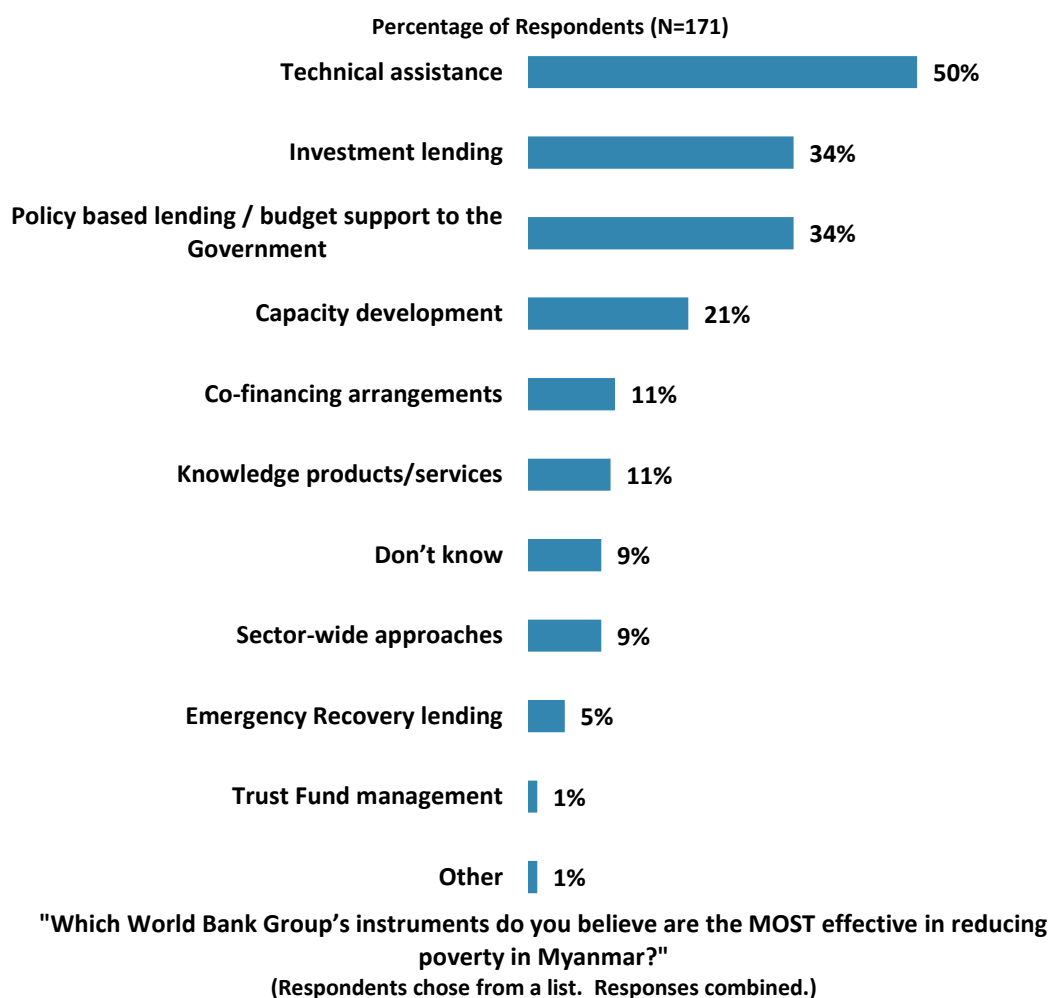
- Respondents across stakeholder groups gave statistically similar ratings for the technical quality of the WBG's knowledge work and activities.

- Respondents who professionally collaborate/work with the WBG had significantly higher ratings for the technical quality of the WBG's knowledge work and activities, compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the institution.

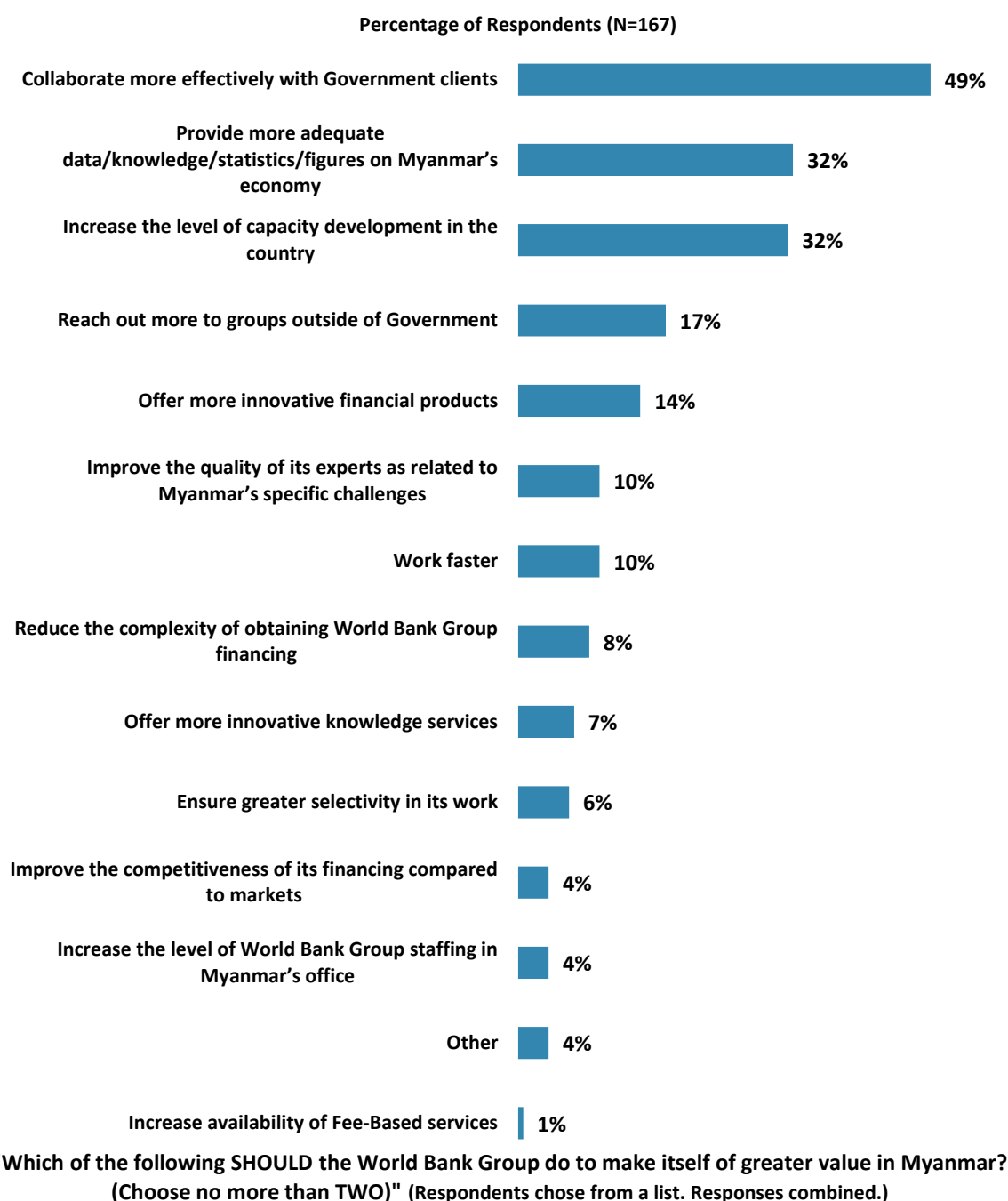

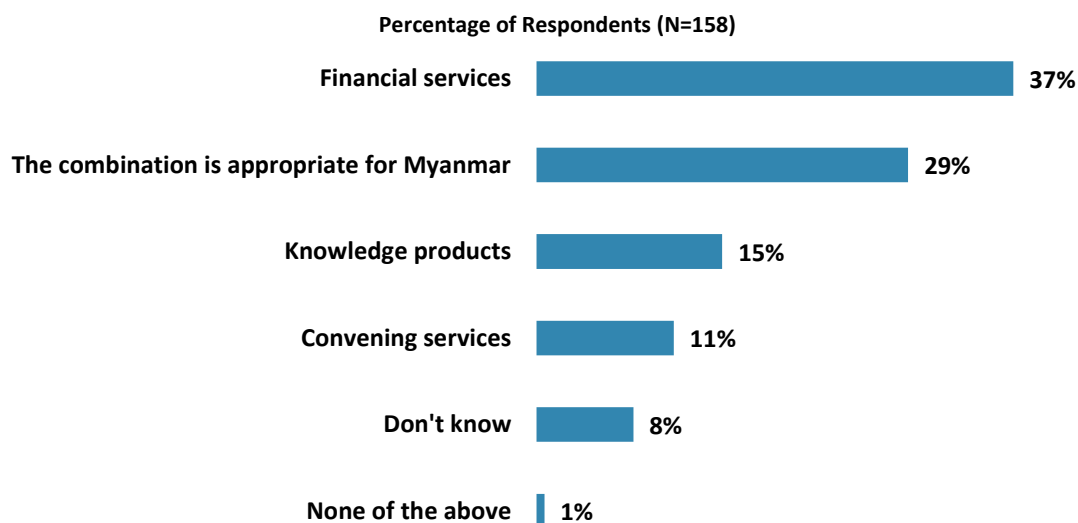

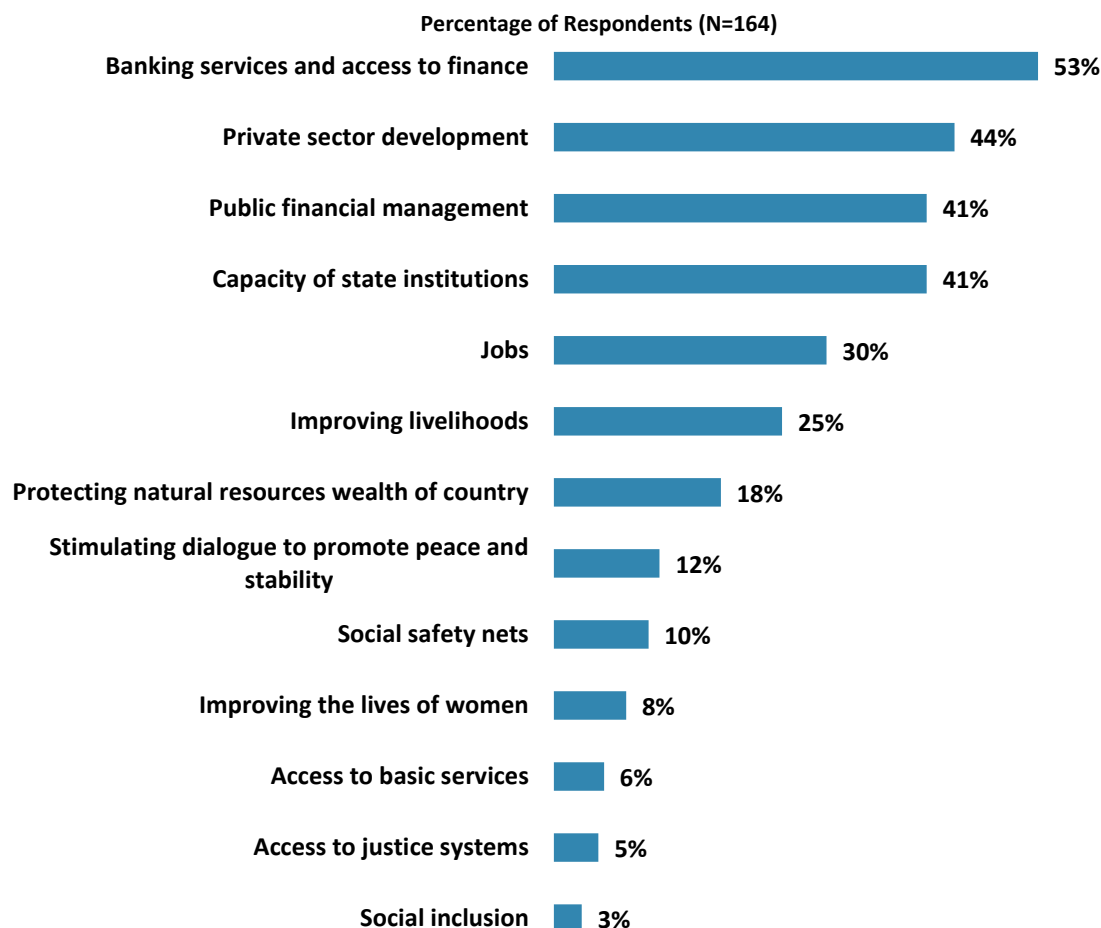

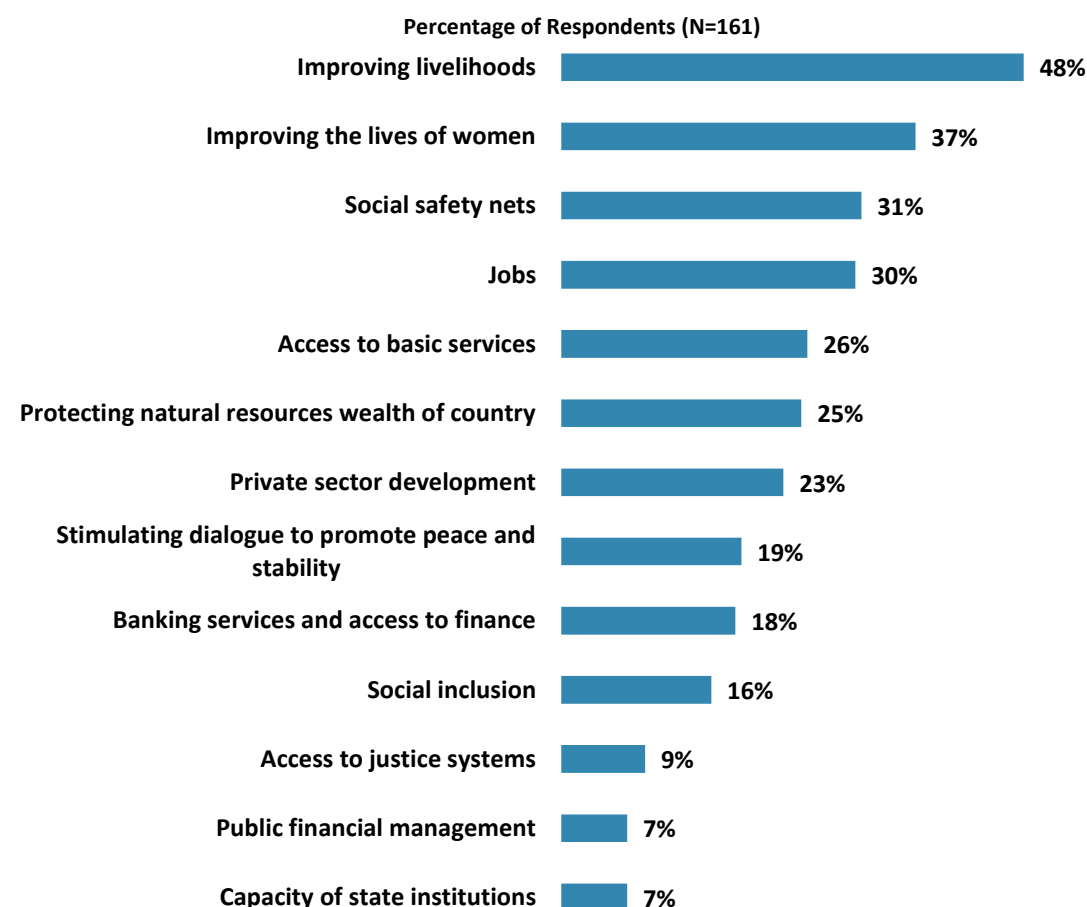
"Which THREE areas below would benefit most from the World Bank Group playing a leading role among international partners Myanmar?"

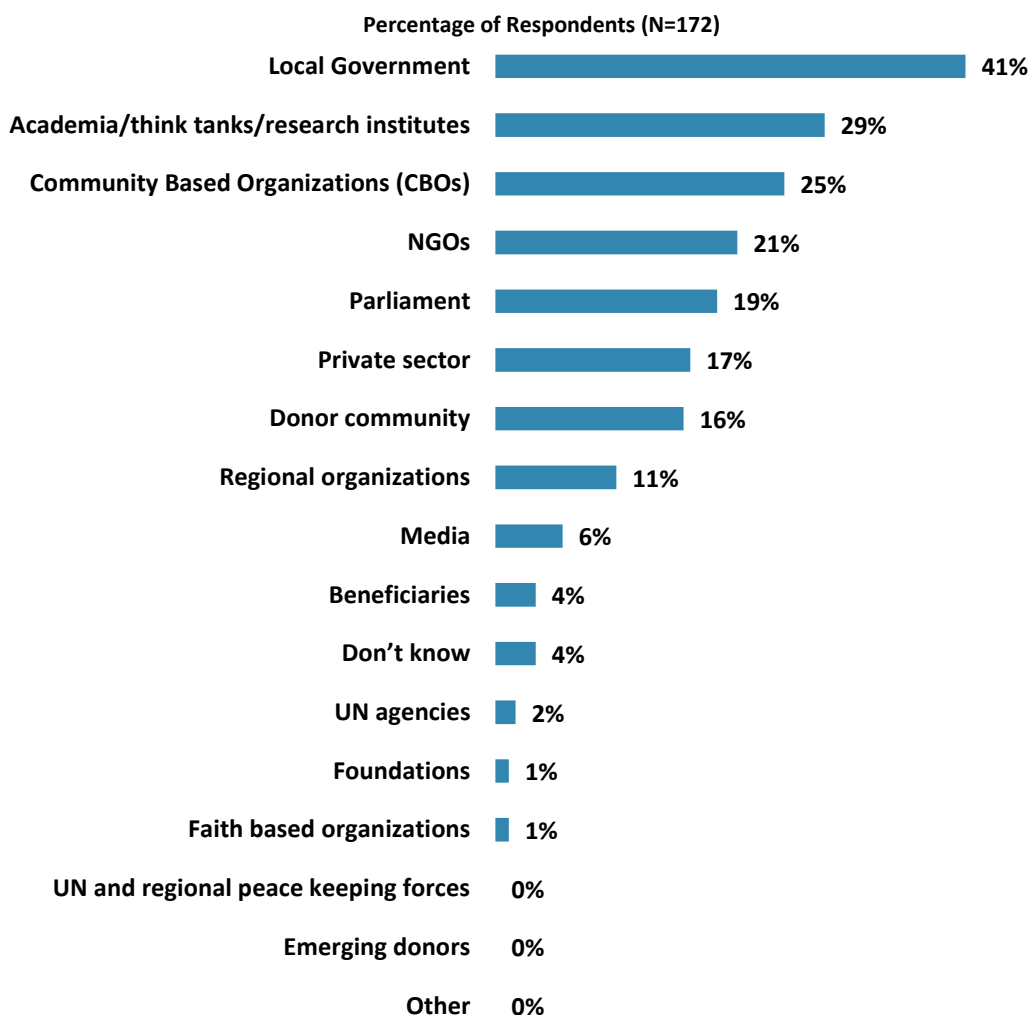


"Which THREE areas below would benefit most from other donors taking the lead in Myanmar?"

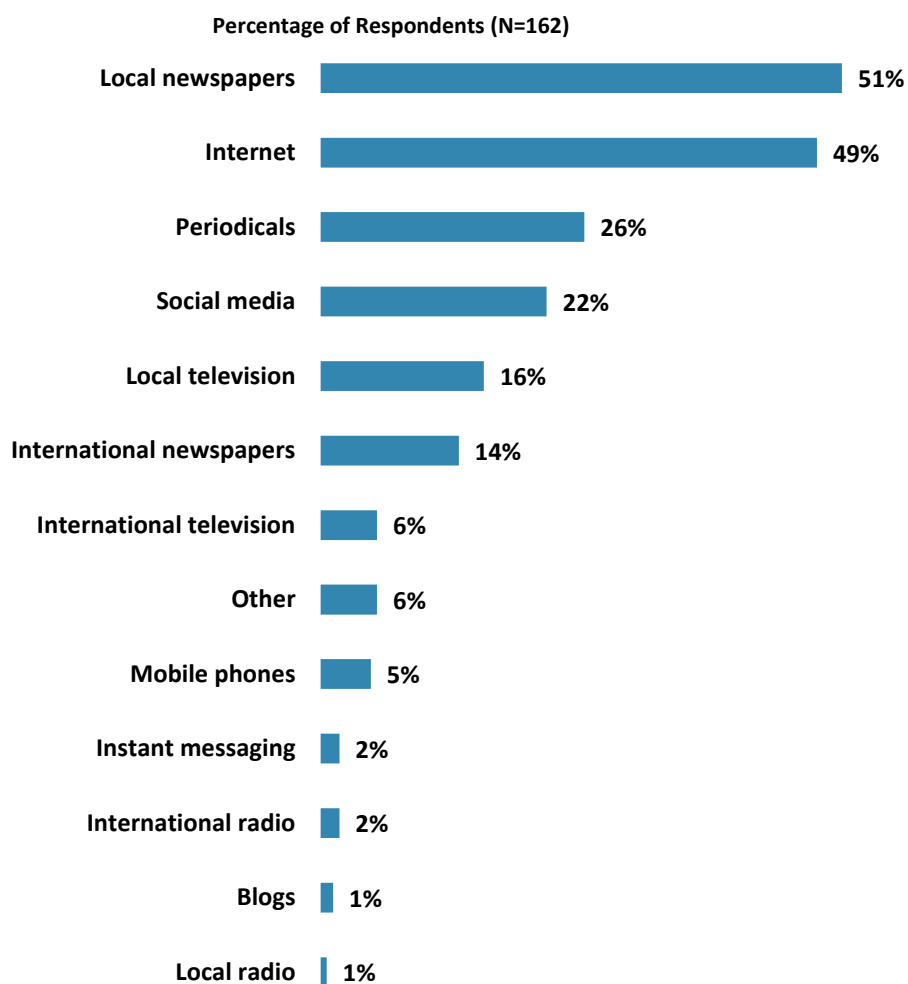

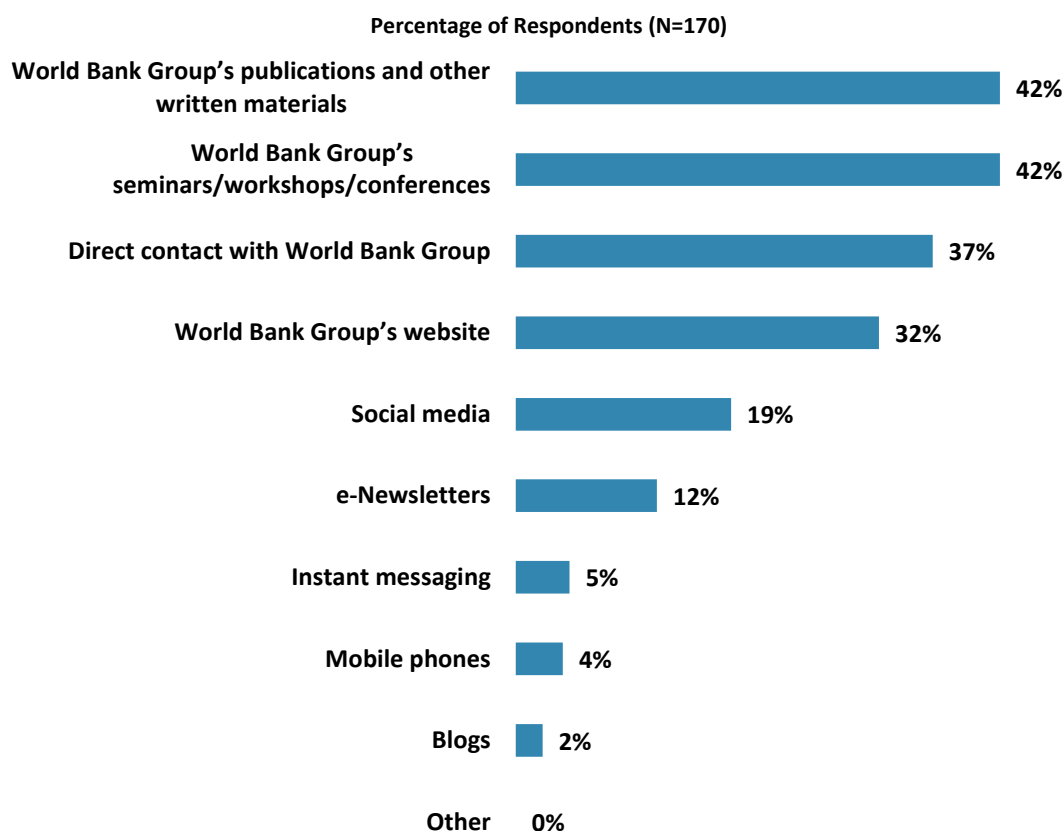


"How do you get most of your information about economic and social development issues in Myanmar? (Choose no more than TWO)"

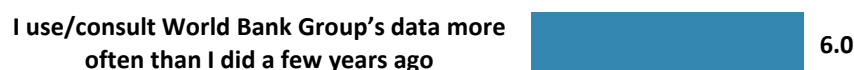

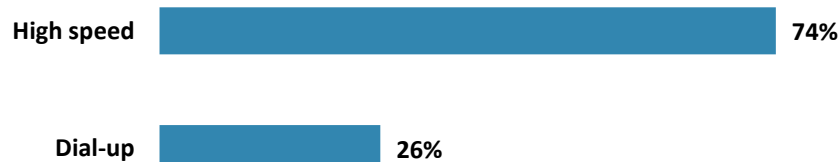
Internet Access

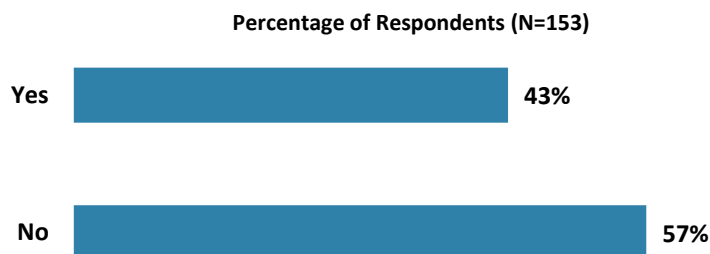


"Which Internet connection do you use primarily when visiting a World Bank Group website?"

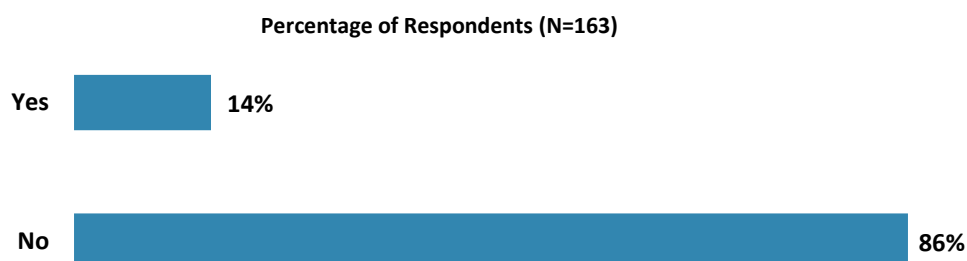

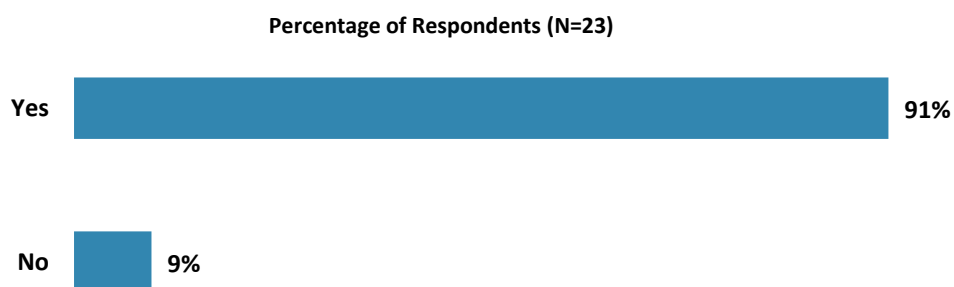

"Do you use/have you used the World Bank Group website?"



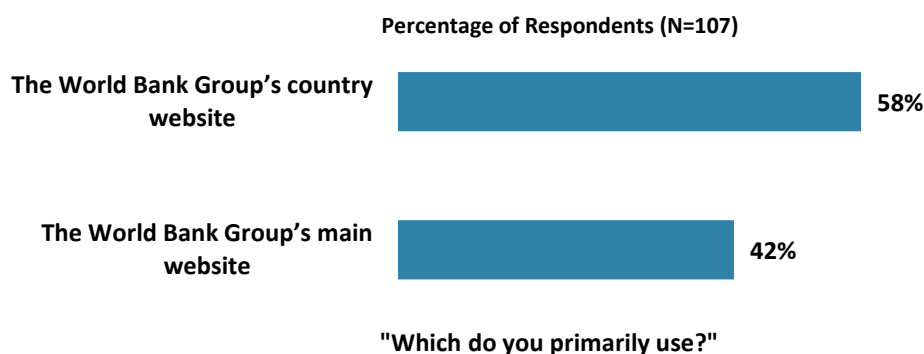
"Have you requested information from the World Bank Group on its activities in the past year?"



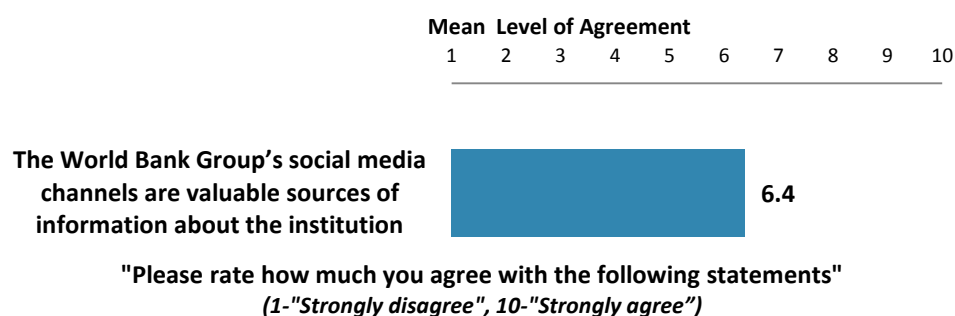

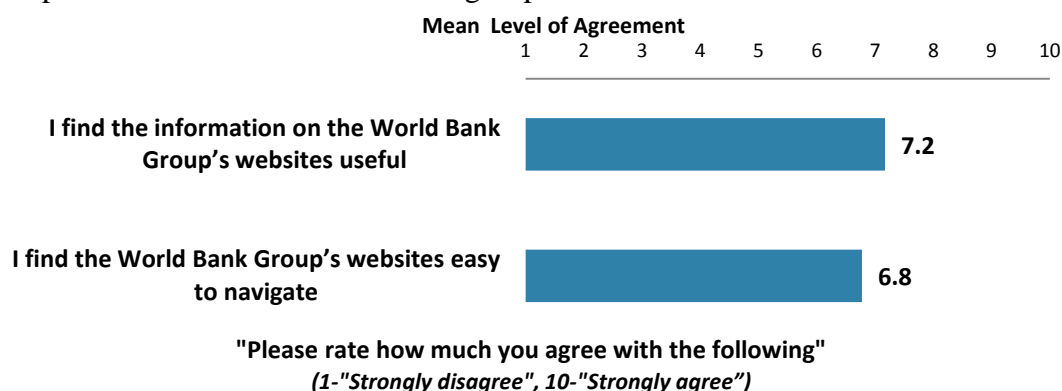


Evaluation of WBG's Social Media Channels

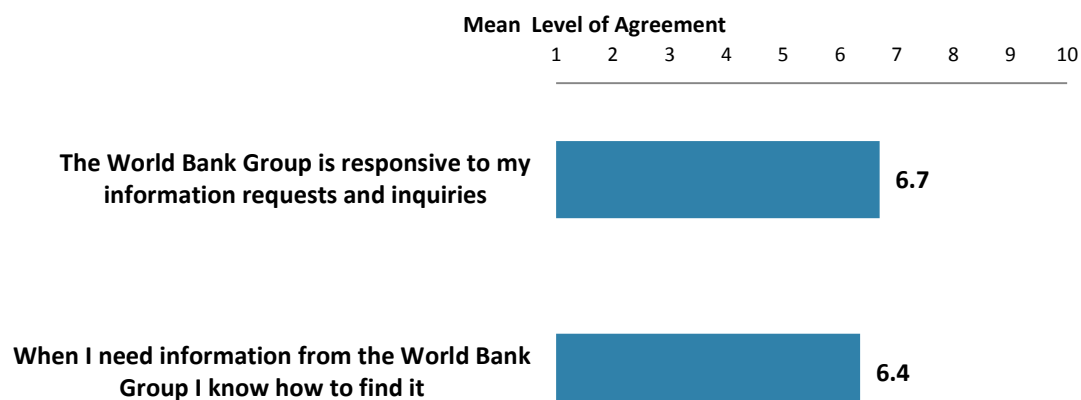
