FORM 5: DRUG AVAILABILITY CHECKLIST FOR DISTRICT HOSPITALS/HEALTH CENTERS

(Informant department/function: Pharmacy)

Notes:

- The Pharmacy may have more than one drug stores, and surveyors need to check drug availability at all these stores.
- Ask for direct observation where the data are kept and information on the packaging of each listed drug to verify

Data to collect:

- **Available drugs on the day of survey:** Surveyors shall, in reference to the listed drug names, ask the person in charge to show listed generic drugs (or patented drugs, where applicable) available, with concentration (e.g. 200 mg) and dosage form (e.g. tablet) information that exactly matches the smallest listed concentration and dosage form data.
 - + If no generic drugs or patented drugs available meet the above mentioned requirement → Circle 3
 - + If the drugs are available and within the expiry indicated on the packaging on the day of survey → Circle 1. If the drugs are expired → Circle 2.
- **Drug shortage in the last 12 months:** One-on-one interview with the person in charge to verify the above mentioned information
- **Days without drug availability per year:** One-on-one interview with the person in charge to verify the above mentioned information
