## I. Objectives

This survey was designed to assist the World Bank Group (WBG) in gaining a better understanding of how stakeholders in Turkey perceive the WBG. The survey explored:

- *Overall Context*
- *Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group*
- *World Bank Group's Work and Engagement on the Ground*
- *World Bank Group's Support in Development Areas*
- *World Bank Group's Knowledge Work and Activities*
- *The Future Role of the World Bank Group in Turkey*
- *Communication and Information Sharing*
- *Background Information*

## II. Methodology

From January to March 2020, 827 stakeholders of the WBG in Turkey were invited to provide their opinions on the WBG's work in the country by participating in a Country Opinion Survey. Participants were drawn from the Office of the President, Prime Minister; office of a minister; office of a parliamentarian; ministries/ministerial departments/implementation agencies; Project Management Units (PMUs) overseeing implementation of WBG projects; consultants/contractors working on WBG-supported projects/programs; local governments; independent government institutions; the judiciary system; state-owned enterprises; bilateral and multilateral agencies; public-private partnerships; private sector organizations; the financial sector/private banks; private foundations; NGOs and community based organizations; trade unions; faith-based groups; youth groups; academia/research institutes/think tanks; the media; and other organizations.

A total of 289 stakeholders participated in the survey (35% response rate). Respondents either received the questionnaires via the online survey platform Qualtrics, or they received the questionnaire via mail or email and returned it accordingly.

Every country that engages in the Country Opinion Survey (COS) must include specific indicator questions that will be aggregated for the World Bank Group's annual Corporate Scorecard. These questions are identified throughout the survey report.

The results in this year's Country Survey were compared to those in the Country Survey conducted in FY'17 (response rate was 49%, N=262). Data were weighted to reach the same stakeholder composition in two years, which allows for year comparisons. Stakeholder groups which were not present in both fiscal years were not included in the comparison. Respondents who belonged to the "other" stakeholder category were not included either. As a result, mean ratings, percentages of respondents, and the total number of respondents in both years are slightly different from those of the original data reported in the FY'17 COS report and the non-weighted data presented in appendices A, B, C and E. 


**“Which of the following best describes your current position?”**




#### Geographic Locations

"Which of the following agencies of the World Bank Group do you primarily collaborate/work with in Turkey?" (Respondents chose from a list.)



### III. Demographics of the Sample (continued)

#### Familiarity with the World Bank Group

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey had statistically similar levels of familiarity with the WBG compared to respondents in the FY'17 Country Survey (weighted mean in FY'20 = 6.3; weighted mean in FY'17 = 6.1)<sup>2</sup>.
- **Impact of familiarity:** Respondents' ratings of familiarity with the WBG were significantly, moderately correlated with their agreement that the WBG plays a relevant role in Turkey's development, with their ratings for the WBG's overall effectiveness in Turkey, and with their ratings of the extent to which the WBG's work helps to achieve development results in the country.

(1-"Not familiar at all", 10-"Extremely familiar")





### Perceptions of Economic Opportunity




"Do you think that economic opportunity for citizens in Turkey is ... ?"


"Please describe the direction Turkey is moving in, when considering ... ?"

## IV. Overall Context (continued)

### Development Priority

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the previous FY'17 Country Survey indicated that the most important development priorities in Turkey were “*education*” (58%), “*job creation/employment*” (29%), “*public sector governance/reform*” (20%), “*economic growth*” (20%), and “*private sector development*” (19%).
- “*Judiciary reform*” emerged among the top development priorities, with significant increase from 18% in FY'17 to 31% in FY'20.





- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the previous FY'17 Country Survey indicated that the biggest contributors to poverty reduction in Turkey were “*job creation/employment*” (55%), “*economic growth*” (49%), “*education*” (37%), “*equality of opportunity*” (28%), and “*agriculture and rural development*” (27%).





**"To what extent do you trust each of the following groups to do what is right?"**






**"When economic and/or social reform efforts fail or are slow to take place in Turkey, which of the following would you attribute this to? (Choose no more than TWO)"**









## V. Overall Attitudes Toward the World Bank Group (continued)

### Overall Ratings for Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups

- **Collaboration:** Respondents who collaborate with the WBG had significantly higher mean ratings for the aggregated responses to the twenty-eight COS indicator questions (mean rating = 6.5) compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 5.5). 
Mean Ratings for All Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups on a Scale from 1 to 10

### Greatest Value

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the previous FY'17 Country Survey indicated that the WBG's greatest values to Turkey were “*capacity development related to WBG supported projects*” (51%), “*financial resources*” (31%), and “*policy advice, studies, analyses*” (28%).




**“When thinking about the World Bank Group’s role in Turkey, which activity do you VALUE the most? (Choose no more than TWO)”**

## V. Overall Attitudes Toward the World Bank Group (continued)

### Greatest Weakness

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the previous FY'17 Country Survey indicated that the WBG's greatest weaknesses in its work in Turkey were "*not enough public disclosure of its work*" (21%), "*not adequately sensitive to political/social realities in Turkey*" (20%), and "*WBG's processes too complex*" (19%).
- **Impact of familiarity:** Respondents who had higher levels of familiarity<sup>6</sup> with the work of the WBG in Turkey indicated that the WBG's greatest weaknesses were "*not enough public disclosure of its work*" (31%), "*WBG's processes too slow and complex*" (19%), and "*not willing to honestly criticize policies and reform efforts in the country*" (18%).




**"Which of the following do you identify as the World Bank Group's greatest WEAKNESSES in its work in Turkey? (Choose no more than TWO)"**

### Effectiveness of WBG's Support in Sectoral Areas: Year Comparison<sup>7</sup>




**"How EFFECTIVE do you believe the World Bank Group is in terms of the work it does in the following areas of development in Turkey?"**





### The WBG's Human Capital Investment















### Frequency of Consulting WBG Knowledge Work and Activities




"How frequently do you consult World Bank Group's knowledge work and activities in the work you do?"








**"Which of the following SHOULD the World Bank Group do to make itself of greater value in Turkey? (Choose no more than TWO)"**


**"In addition to the regular relations with the national government, which TWO of the following groups should the World Bank Group collaborate with more in your country? (Choose no more than TWO)"**








**"How do you get most of your information about economic and social development issues in Turkey? (Choose no more than TWO)"**


**"How would you prefer to receive information from the World Bank Group?




"How frequently do you interact with the World Bank Group now in Turkey?"
